

NYSP remembers fallen troopers

New York State Police remembered officers who lost their lives in the line of service during an annual Memorial Day service on Wednesday, May 30. The service honors the memory and service of the 141 New York State Police officers who have lost their lives in the line of duty since



J. Burroughs Sr.; Trooper Joel R. Davis; and Trooper Michael J. Anson.

Burroughs entered into service retirement from the New York State Police after 28 years of service on July 31, 2011. On May 25, 2016, Burroughs passed away from an illness stemming from his assignment at the World Trade Center site following the terrorist attack on September 11, 2001.

Davis was killed on July 9, 2017, when he was shot responding to a domestic disturbance.

Anson died January 2, 2018, from cancer stemming from his assignment to the World Trade Center Site, following the terrorist attacks on September 11, 2011.

State Police Superintendent George P. Beach II also commended and recognized 18 individuals and one Division unit for bravery, investigative persistence, police education, traffic safety, community service and overall exceptional contributions during the New York State Police Annual Awards Day Ceremony that took place immediately after the Memorial Day service.

Two hurt as car plows into shop

ELSMERE — A 79-year-old woman crashed into the Dunkin' Donuts shop on Delaware Avenue Friday, June 1, at around 2:30 p.m. sending two teen customers to the hospital.

Bethlehem Police Cmdr. Adam Hornick said the two injured were seated at a table when the woman crashed through the glass windows on Medical Center Hospital. the Lincoln Avenue side of the shop, coming to rest completely inside the

One person, a 16-year-old female, was trapped under the car but was able to free herself. The second, an 18-year-old female, was treated at the scene with serious, but not lifethreatening, injuries.

The driver of the 2016 Honda CRV, who police initially said was 80 years old, was not injured and refused medical treatment. She was cooperating with the investigation, Hornick said, before she went home.

Police are not releasing her name at this time, only that she is from

There are witnesses who saw the accident from the outside, Hornick said, and there is video. What caused the car to propel into the building, though, has not yet been officially determined.

"It sounded like a tree fell on my house," said Lincoln Avenue resident Kathy Stipe. "At first I thought it was my house because a tree fell on my house years ago and it sounded the same way. But, when I came down, the police cars were here in a hurry, and there was glass all over the place and the car was inside and they brought two people out in a stretcher."

The 232 Delaware Ave. store will remain closed pending a structural evaluation.

Where Eagles soar

Delmar Boy Scout Troop 58 recognizes four more who have achieved the organization's highest rank

BETHLEHEM — Four Boy Scouts from Troop 58 in Delmar have achieved the organization's highest rank, a feat accomplished by only an estimated 4 percent of scouts nationwide. Sean Leslie, Andrew DeCandia, Jeffrey Hansen and Jacob Kantrowitz were publicly recognized for achieving the rank of Eagle during a semi-annual Court of Honor Ceremony on Saturday, May 26.

A major focus of the Boy Scouts of America organization is community service, especially for those who aspire to its highest ranks. Each boy is expected to not only learn a variety of skills, but also share his knowledge and use it in service to his community.

In order to earn the rank of Eagle, scouts must identify a need in their community, develop a project to address that need, and then gain approval, implement and direct that project. Projects are completed with the help of other troop members and volunteers, giving the Eagle applicant an opportunity to practice leadership as well as share the skills and knowledge he has acquired, while also benefiting his community.

Leslie dedicated his Eagle project to the First United Methodist Church of Delmar. After the church completed a renovation that added a handicapped accessible entrance, Leslie created signage directing members and visitors to the new entrance. He, and the 23 scouts who assisted him, also constructed dry wells to divert rainwater from the church's thrift shop and did extensive landscaping on the property.

Hansen worked to benefit the

Bethlehem YMCA's summer camp program. With the help of fellow scouts, he built 13 wooden benches to replace aged and rotting seats, renovated and expanded a stage, and raked and cleared both the campgrounds and camp activity areas.

"Watching Jeff go through this process since he was a very young cub scout, I've been able to see the skills that he has developed, how he has grown and matured and the incredible experience he has had as a scout," said Mark Hansen, Jeff's father and a troop committee member. "I was fortunate enough to share in many of those experiences. And they've really helped him to grow into an outstanding young man."

Kantrowitz worked on the trails at the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy for his Eagle project. He leveled ground, and repaired or built bridges along the trail with the help of 30 volunteers from Troop 58 as well as from Troop 75 and members of Christian Brothers Academy. The project gave Bethlehem High School students access to an outdoor classroom directly across the street from their school.

For his Eagle project, DeCandia collected 1,273 children's books to place in six little free libraries he built to help the nonprofit Grassroots Givers expand access to books for children in lower-income areas. "I wanted to do something little more construction-based," said DeCandia, noting that his fellow scouts had opted to focus on the outdoors. "And there was also an education component to it that I liked."

According to DeCandia, the most challenging part of these projects can be simply coordinating all those who donate their time, effort and resources. He didn't expect the amount of volunteers who

showed up on the first day of constructing the little libraries at the First United Methodist Church, which allowed him to build the cases on its property. "I expected seven or eight people to show up," he said. "And there were closer to two dozen, along with their parents. We got much more done on that first day than I thought we would."

DeCandia joined the troop because his father, the troop's current Scoutmaster, was an Eagle Scout before him and his family, he said, "expected no less of me."

"I was happy to follow in my father's

footsteps," DeCandia said. "And work to become an Eagle Scout like him."

The process of advancing through all six ranks—Scout, Tenderfoot, Second Class, First Class, Star and Life—to achieve Eagle takes considerable perseverance, as every Eagle knows.

After joining and satisfying a few simple requirements for the Scout badge, the first three ranks can be earned in a relatively short period of time. After First Class, the advancement to Star, Life, and Eagle present additional challenges and opportunities that require demonstrating leadership skills and serving others. Certain badges and accomplishments, as well as time spent in troop service, are required for rank advancement and must be signed off on by the scoutmaster or an assistant scoutmaster.

The required Eagle project must be approved and certain requirements must be met. After reaching Eagle, scouts may continue to work on merit badges, For every five additional merit badges plus three months of active participation in the Troop a scout may earn an Eagle Palm.

Vets tend to memorials

Scores of veterans travel to Washington to wash memorials

GLENMONT — A weekend in Washington, D.C. can mean time spent at the Smithsonian, or taking in the sight of cherry blossom trees lining the banks of the Potomac: A family's visit to the seat of our nation's government. For war veterans, it's a pilgrimage of a different sort, defined by honor.

Each weekend, from spring until winter, volunteers gather at the Vietnam Veterans Memorial. They meet in front of the stark ebony stone, so dark and polished, their own image is reflected back like a near-flawless mirror. Most of the volunteers are war veterans intending to pay homage to fallen friends, brothers and sisters. They wake up in the early dawn, hours before visitors arrive, to wash off the dust, pollen, and the fingerprints of the nearly 100,000 visitors who arrive each week; many of whom had come to mourn.

Volunteers take soap and water and gently scrub the stone. The act of washing the memorial, one local veteran described, is "emotional."

Ed Czuchrey, an Air Force veteran and a member of the Patriot Guard Riders, has done it before. "Most of them have been there and seen it before," said Czuchrey, "but the rest of them, all inclusive, are going to be proud; proud to be able to do what they're doing, and I'm proud to see them doing it."

More than 50 U.S. military veterans, Gold Star and Blue Star families boarded a bus early Friday morning, June 1, on a special mission to Washington, D.C. to clean the Vietnam Memorial and Korean War Monument.

"Our detachment is honored to be a part of this special trip to honor our fallen brothers and sisters," said William Keyes, Commandant Capt. Wm. Dale O'Brien Detachment, Marine Corps League and Vietnam Veteran." Even though many of us have been to DC before, this is the first time any of us have will have this honor and privilege of paying special respect."

Premiere Transportation, Trustco
Bank and TALK 1300 AM sponsored a
60-passenger luxury bus — the same used
by the Arena Football League's Albany
Empire players — for the six-hour trip to
the Nation's Capital.

For Melody Burns, associate member of the Capt. Wm. Dale O'Brien Detachment Marine Corps League, the trip is the end result of an exhausting three-year effort.

"I was beginning to give up hope we would ever receive a date, after three years and numerous phones calls, I was surprised to receive the call with a date," said Burns. "I was calling everyone I knew in



Washington to see if they could help."

Burns said it will be a "great honor" to clean the memorial with Vietnam War Veterans. But, she said, not all of the volunteers are veterans of that war. Volunteers will include all sorts of veterans, and Gold Star and Blue Star families, too.

One such veteran said he and his daughter are making the trip to provide support.

"We're with these guys here — combat vets, Vietnam vets, Korea vets, Gold Star mothers — and this is for them," said Scott Dilcher, a U.S. Marine veteran, who was joined by his daughter, Heather. "We're here to support them."

The group's itinerary included an initial stop at Arlington National Cemetery to witness the changing of the Guard. That was to be followed by an overnight stay before reporting to "The Wall" at 6 a.m. the next morning, where they expected to spend three hours cleaning both the



For Gold Star father Bob Roberts the trip was a way to remember his daughter, Kristie. His daughter was a medic in the Army National Guard and is one of 22 veterans who are estimated to die by suicide each day. The number, which references a 2012 report by the Department of Veterans Affairs, has since been a rallying cry to provide better support for veterans.

"We're carrying on Kristie's legacy, my wife and I," Bob said, describing his daughter as being "service oriented" and "community-minded." Since she died six years ago, Bob and his wife Cindy have been working behind the effort to bring better awareness to the issue. Being around fellow Gold Star families, he said, is "therapeutic.

"For me, it's almost as if we're going to the cemetery to visit Kristie. It's our ability to tend to the veterans who have passed."

DA seeking input on marijuana laws

Albany County DA to hold series of community meetings to consider marijuana policies and how to best end "the War on Pot"

ALBANY — County District Attorney David Soares, through a series of public meetings and an online survey, is looking for input on new procedures and policies related to the enforcement of marijuana laws in this state.

In addition to attending the public meetings, Soares is asking residents to take an online survey.

"There is a lot of debate happening, not only in our state but across the country. Canada is on the verge of discussing decriminalizing as well as market regulation," Soares said. "We have neighboring states like Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, Massachusetts." New Jersey is also discussing both market regulation and decriminalization. He expects that New York will soon follow.

As DA's have done in the past, including when the state was going through the political and at times overly bureaucratic process of rolling back the so called draconian Rockefeller Drug Laws, Soares said he plans to exercise "prosecutorial discretion" when it comes to drug laws.

He hopes to define what that means by July.

Two things he said, are goals: keeping the roads safe and seeking treatment rather than incarceration for some cases.

He also said the dollars associated with the illicit marijuana is in the neighborhood of \$3 billion and with market regulation New York City could get at least \$400 million in revenue. A critical part of any marijuana law reform, though, is a portion of those monies should go back into the communities.

"If you end the war on pot, then we

have to begin reconstruction into the communities that have been the most aggressively hit by the war on pot which means those dollars have to be re-invested in building those communities and reinvested to provide job opportunities for the young people who have been deprived marijuana as a market option," he said. "If we do nothing ... those people who are still looking to earn on the corners will still be earning on the corners except what they will be distributing is a much more

lethal drug and that is something we can combat immediately. Give a kid a job and create job opportunities and they will get off the corners."

Prior to whatever the state does, he said, he will look over the cases that have been prosecuted and provide opportunities, to the extent the law enables, for expungement and sealing of records.





Plenty of comments about proposed paid sick leave law

Over 40 residents speak during public hearing in May; measure remains in committee

ALBANY — Scores of people showed up to speak about a proposed county law that would require employers to offer paid sick leave to employees who work more than 80 hours in a given year during a public hearing on Tuesday, May 29.

Sentiment was roughly evenly divided: workers and advocates favored the law, saying it would promote public health and ensure that lower-income workers wouldn't face financial catastrophe if they become ill; while business representatives and nonprofits were opposed on the grounds that the additional financial burden would be untenable.

Local Law "C" for 2018 would let a worker employed in Albany County for more than 80 hours in a calendar year earn one hour of sick time for every 30 hours worked. For businesses with more than 10 employees, workers would be entitled to earn up to 72 hours and, for businesses that have between six and 10 employees, workers would earn up to 40 hours of paid sick time annually.

For very small businesses, those with five employees or fewer, the process is more gradual: workers would earn up to 40 hours of unpaid sick time in the first year; 12 months after the law goes into effect, they would be entitled to 24 hours of paid and 16 hours of unpaid sick time; after 24 months, the employee would be entitled to 32 hours of paid and eight hours of unpaid sick time; and 36 months after the law goes into effect, they would be entitled to earn and use up to 40 hours of paid sick

In all cases, employers can opt to offer employees a higher limit. Additionally, any unused sick time would roll over to the following year, unless the employer opts to pay the employee for that unused time. The law does not apply to those who are covered by a collective bargaining agreement.

Employees would be entitled to use their time to care for themselves or their family (including "any individual related by blood or affinity whose close association with the employee is the equivalent of a family relationship") through sickness, injury, diagnosis, a health "condition" or

could also use accrued sick leave when they or their family member's place of employment closes due to a public health emergency or when either has been the victim of domestic or sexual abuse or human trafficking, including time to meet with attorneys, relocate or file legal reports. Sick time can be used in the "smallest time increments that the employer's payroll system uses to account for absences or other

Legislator Paul Burgdorf, (R-Colonie) said if the bill were passed it would be "creating a major disincentive for new businesses to locate to Albany County" and would "contribute to the demise of small businesses and cuts in services provided by not-for-profits."

"We have no business mandating private sector employee benefits and making Albany County businesses and not-for-profits uncompetitive with other jurisdictions," Burgdorf said. Citing testimony at the hearing, during which David Brown, president and CEO of Capital District YMCA, stated that his organization—which operates four YMCAs, 18 afterschool programs, seven camps and an early-childhood center-would face an additional \$500,000 in expenses annually. He characterized the law as a mandate that would "kill jobs, services and small business growth."

Following the public testimony, Legislative Chair Andrew Joyce said that the legislation would have to be "tweaked" before it comes to the floor for a vote by the full body. "I'm in discussion with the sponsor and activists on a broader exemption for small businesses and certain nonprofits," he said. "It definitely needs tweaking. Maybe even another public hearing.'

Legislator Bill Reinhardt (D-Bethlehem), who is listed as a sponsor on the bill, said that he would not be opposed to the law "being slightly tweaked" if that were what is needed for it to pass.

"The devil is often in the details," he said. "This is one of those cases where there are good arguments on both sides. Obviously, the businesses have a perspective and are concerned about their bottom lines. I tend to view the priority as the health of the workers and the public health

while receiving preventative care. They associated with those who can't afford to be fired and so they go to work sick, perhaps they're handling food. We've seen a lot of information about those public health aspects."

> Reinhardt also said it was the right move for a modern economy. "I do think it ultimately needs to be a widely applied law so that it's an equal playing field for everybody," he said, suggesting, however, that implementing the law locally will level the playing field for those employers in Albany County who already offer paid sick leave, "because they feel it's the right thing to do."

In Bethlehem, business owners are divided on the issue, according to Chamber of Commerce President Jennifer Kilcoyne. She said small business owners were more concerned about how they would be affected by the proposed law, while larger business owners either already offer paid sick leave or would be better able to absorb the additional cost.

According to a 2013 study cited in the legislation, 40 percent of workers in Albany County do not have access to paid sick leave. Per federal census data, as many as 65,000 workers in Albany County could gain access to earned paid sick time. If passed, Albany County would join two other counties, 31 cities and 10 states in the adoption of a paid sick leave law.

The proposed law is currently being considered by the Law Committee and will be a topic of discussion during its next meeting on Wednesday, June 27.

"I expect that there will be a fair amount of discussion about it, given the volume of speakers and range of views expressed at the public hearing," said Tim Maniccia, Joyce's chief of

The earliest a vote might take place is on Monday, July 9. If adopted, it would go to the office of Albany County Executive Dan McCoy, who will hold another public hearing before vetoing the bill or signing it into law. If he signs, it would become effective 180 days later. In the case of those under a collective bargaining agreement, the law would become effective upon termination of said

V'ville set to adopt comprehensive plan

Village residents will have one final chance to weigh in on community planning priorities before plan goes to county for approval

VOORHEESVILLE—The Village Board of Trustees will hold its second and final public hearing on a proposed Comprehensive Plan on Thursday, June 7, at 7 p.m., at the village firehouse at 12 Altamont Road. This hearing will be the last opportunity for village residents and business owners to comment on the updated draft plan before it is officially adopted by the board.

According to village officials, "The Comprehensive Plan is a road map for the Village that identifies steps and actions that the Village may take over time to enhance its quality of life. It is not regulations or laws. The Plan sets the considerations that will inform discussions and decision-making at many different levels in the Village."

The plan was developed in response to concerns about the direction of future growth and development in the village and a noted lack of cohesive guidelines

for influencing such things. A planning process directed at South Main Street in 2015 recommended the development of a formal village-wide "Comprehensive Plan," which began in 2016. (Much of the Main Street Master Plan has been incorporated into the comprehensive plan.)

Pushback against two proposed commercial projects served as the primary impetus for a moratorium against all commercial building that was imposed in June 2017, until a comprehensive plan could be completed.

A formal comprehensive plan accomplishes multiple things:

- Achieves overall community consensus regarding vision, goals, and strategy for the future of the village;
- Establishes guidelines for bodies of leadership to consider when approving projects or passing laws;
- Increases access to state grant funding, which often requires a formal comprehensive plan to ensure that funding is spent "in pursuit of a

well-defined public goal;"

• Provides a comprehensive compendium of data, maps, and details about current conditions in the village.

"The Village Board intends to use this plan as a checklist of actions as well as a roadmap for establishing policies and programs," reads the draft plan dated May 2018. "The Planning Board and Zoning Board of Appeals should also refer to the Plan when reviewing projects to ensure consistency with community goals. Landowners and businesses can use the Plan to better understand the resources and conditions in the Village as they make personal decisions about individual properties."

After a year and a half of gathering community input and a review process conducted by a Comprehensive Plan Steering Committee and the Board of Trustees, the draft plan identifies the village's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats—and presents strategies to "maintain the strengths, fix the weaknesses, take advantage of opportunities, and prevent threats from occurring."

Some of its major recommendations include (but are not limited to):

- Implementing streetscape improvements as detailed in the 2015 "All Aboard Main Street Revitalization Plan."
- Updating of stormwater planning, instituting methods to mitigate flooding, and further protecting water quality and recreation in the Vly Creek;
- Adding more flexibility to allow for use of two-family homes in more districts, additional mixed-use buildings on South Main Street, and accessory apartments;
- Using the conservation subdivision design method to ensure that new, major subdivisions include protection of open spaces and the environment in the Residential A district;
- Planning for capital improvements on a five-year rolling basis;
- Evaluating sewer expansion to

South Main Street locations; and

• Updating zoning and subdivision laws "to foster new development that is consistent with community character, ensure that business districts are sensitive to different needs in different locations, adjust lot dimensions and development standards so new development will match existing neighborhood character, limit heavy industrial uses, limit new multi-family uses to a proposed new mixed use (business and residential) zoning district near Foundry Road with strict development standards, and protect wetlands, floodplains, and other natural resources."

A strategy for implementation is also included in the plan. Strategies, listed by theme— Community Character, Environment, Walkability/Linkage, Business Development, Housing Opportunities, Infrastructure, Village Capacity, or Recreation/Community Event Access and Improvements—give a target date for completing each and identify the village agency or organization best able to provide leadership for that action. The strategy "matrix" is intended to help organize the implementation of the plan over the next 15 years and allow the community to observe progress.

Once the plan is adopted by the trustees, it will be sent to the Albany County Planning Board for review. An environmental SEQRA process also needs to be completed. If additional considerations are raised as a result of either, further tweaking of the plan may be required.

The May 2018 draft plan has been posted on the village website. Hard copies are available for review in both the Village Office and at Voorheesville Public Library.

Town to collect yard waste

BETHLEHEM — From May to October, properly prepared yard waste is picked up by the town Highway Department and is composted at the town's compost facility.

Yard waste must be placed in reusable containers or paper bags. Brush and branches under four feet in length should be piled neatly along the sides of the road, not so high or so wide as to obstruct roadways or line of sight and not in the roadway itself.

Acceptable items include leaves, grass and hedge clippings placed at curbside in reusable containers or in biodegradable paper bags not over 50 pounds per container, as well as brush and branches under four feet in length stacked neatly at curbside. No other items or materials are accepted, and all non-conforming items will not be collected. No brush or trees from private contractors will be accepted.


Athletes head to the states

Mass. man found with drugs, illegal gun

COEYMANS—On Monday, May 28, at approximately 9:24 a.m., State Police stopped a vehicle on I-87 for a speeding violation. During the trooper's investigation at the scene probable cause to search the vehicle and its occupants was established. The driver Norberto M. Carrasquillo, age 25, of Westfield, Mass., was found to be in possession of approximately 3.5 grams of marijuana and a loaded Taurus Model #709, 9mm handgun. He was taken into custody, transported, and processed at the state police station in Albany, where he was subsequently charged with: criminal possession of a weapon in the second degree, a class C felony (loaded handgun); unlawful possession of marijuana, a violation; vehicle and traffic violation.

Carrasquillo was arraigned in the town of Coeymans Court and remanded to the Albany County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 cash or bond.

Man arrested for fraudulently receiving \$25K in workers comp

RAVENA—The New York State Police Bureau of Criminal Investigation unit stationed in Latham arrested 44-year-old Chad Ledney of Ravena, for the class D felonies of third degree grand larceny and third degree insurance fraud as well as two counts of the class E felony of falsifying an insurance claim application.

Ledney was arrested after an investigation reportedly revealed that he submitted falsified records to the NYS Insurance Fund in order to received workers compensation benefits totaling \$25,500.69, which he was not entitled to. Ledney allegedly received the fraudulent payments between July 23, 2015 and July 18, 2017.

He was processed in Latham and arraigned in the Albany City Court where he was released to reappear at a future date

'Grandparent Scam'

The New York State Police are reminding the public about the often used "Grandparent Scams," as reports of these

types of scams are beginning to surface once again.

These common scams involve unknown individuals calling older or elderly people and pretending to be a relative of the victim, usually a grandson or granddaughter. The caller starts out the call by stating "Grandma?" or "Grandpa?" which in turn usually elicits a response from the victim citing the name of a grandson or granddaughter. The unknown caller then feeds from this info and pretends to be that relative while reporting that he or she has been involved in some sort of criminal issue or a motor vehicle accident and requests money be sent to help the situation in the form of bail money, medical bills or repairs to a car.

The requested money amount is sometimes wired to the scammer outside the United States or requested in gift cards from a certain store or type of card and the "grandchild" requests that the victims not contact his or her parents and report the situation so as to not be in trouble or to avoid embarrassment. Incidents of this nature usually result in the victim losing thousands of dollars.

State Police advocate that anyone who receives such a call should ask questions that an imposter would not be able to answer correctly, such as the date of their mother's birthday or the city they were born in and also to call the family of the person who is allegedly seeking assistance to check on the legitimacy of the request. Any call should also be reported to officials immediately.

The most recent incident was in Saratoga County and involved the caller pretending to be a grandson involved in a motor vehicle accident and DWI arrest. The caller was convincing enough that both grandparents believed him and called a suggested number of an alleged attorney who then directed them to purchase gift cards on three separate occasions and relay the card numbers and access codes for redemption of the cards in order to pay for court and attorney fees. The victims were scammed for \$11,000 and called police after a fourth request was made for an additional \$4,000.

Officials ask that if you have been the victim of a scam or attempted scam, report the incident to your local law enforcement or State Police barracks.

Happy 225 years

Most locals are familiar with the history of the Slingerland family, which not only built the oldest standing home in the eponymous hamlet and was instrumental in bringing a railroad through town, but also established a post office and implemented a water system that served multiple municipalities. Many are also aware of Nathaniel Adams, who served as Delmar's first postmaster in 1840 and constructed the historic house which bears his surname.

It is important to note, however, that the individuals who helped shape the town into what it is today played important roles years before Bethlehem was actually founded.

Sgt. James Selkirk, for whom the hamlet of Selkirk is named, was a revolutionary soldier whose discharge from the Second Regiment of New York was signed by George Washington only months before the war ended in 1783.

The Haswells, who rented 300 acres near the present-day Haswell Farms development on Feura Bush Road from the local patroon (Dutch landowner), did not fight in the Revolutionary War. Instead, they supported the fight for independence by contributing financially to the effort, according to a relative who was still farming the land in the 1960s. A home built by William Haswell in 1820 still stands at the entrance to Haswell Farms today.

A plaque at the entrance of Mount Pleasant Cemetery in South Bethlehem indicates the gravesite of Patrick Callanan, who served with the Third Regiment of the Albany County Militia during the Revolution. Fifty-nine years after his death in 1824, Peter Callanan, Patrick's great-grandson, founded the Callanan Road Improvement Company, which ultimately became Callanan Industries—which continues to operate in South Bethlehem today. Callanans Corners and the Callanan quarry also owe their names to this early Bethlehem family.

According to Town Historian Susan Leath, there are eight signs scattered around town marking the graves (or approximated graves) of 18 Revolutionary War veterans who "mustered" out of present-day "Looking back across 225 years is a great reminder that we're a living part of history. Bethlehem. In a 165-page history of the town, published in 2016, she investigates historical records, old photographs and correspondence, recorded interviews and living relatives to piece together a series of essays about the town's history—not only from a military perspective, but from a host of other viewpoints as well, such as cultural, industrial, commercial, and educational.

On Sunday, June 10, from 1 to 4 p.m., the Bethlehem Historical Society will celebrate the town's 225-year existence during its annual ice cream social at the Cedar Hill Schoolhouse Museum (1003 River Road in Selkirk). Anyone with an interest in local history is invited to stop by and check out the museum's exhibits, one of which includes more than a dozen wedding dresses from the 1860s through the mid-20th century. Matrimonial items from notable local families are also on display. Another exhibit plots all of Bethlehem's 15 one-room schools in 1866 and includes photos of students as well as the buildings, several of which are still

Leath and other local history enthusiasts will also be on hand to share the stories of the bygone residents, buildings and influences that made Bethlehem the community it is today.

Other opportunities to explore the town's history of Bethlehem include walking tours of its historic cemeteries and a history kayak paddle on the Hudson River.

"Looking back across 225 years is a great reminder that we're a living part of history," said Town Supervisor David VanLuven. "The town has changed so much over the last two centuries. What roles will each of us play in shaping what Bethlehem will look like 100 or 225 years from now?"

Finding Balance A tea house in rural Hillsdale will offer a series of unique 'talk and a dinner' events

HILLSDALE — The Harlem Valley conceals many secrets one would not expect in rural Columbia County.

Some of the border towns that skirt along the New York state line were once a part of the Massachusetts Commonwealth, but the region proved to be too difficult to manage. The communities were often forgotten or neglected by Boston. It had made for a great

place to duck away from the law. There were often unsanctioned, bare-knuckle boxing matches that drew hundreds to Boston Corners. Locals still talk about how a fight between Yankee Sullivan and John Morrissey caused a riot to spill into neighboring Millerton, though no one remains alive who actually witnessed it in 1853. It later helped Congress approve the valley's cession to New York, restoring balance to the region.



Upgrading comfort



Proctors to replace MainStage seats and add new hearing loop system

SCHENECTADY — Proctors will continue its ongoing restoration, renovation and modernization with a complete replacement of MainStage seats and the addition of a new hearing loop.

Over the past few years Proctors has updated its marquees, completed an ambitious restoration of its MainStage auditorium, and renovated the third floor of the original Carl Co. into the Adeline Graham Theatrical Training and Innovation Center—all of this on top of a massive 2005 expansion of the stagehouse and creation of the GE Theatre, Robb Alley and second floor administrative spaces.

Now, in response to audience surveys, Proctor will replace more than 2,500 of its existing seats with comfortable, state of the art seating.

"We are always aiming to improve the Proctors experience," said CEO Philip Morris. "Past improvements in this regard have been cosmetic at best, replacing cushions and fabric, rather than the old seats themselves. The current ones are at the end of their natural lifespan. It's time to do this."

The project, from fabrication to installment, will be manned by the leading theatrical purveyor, Irwin Seating Company of Grand Rapids, Mich.

"Irwin is the prime restoration seating company in the world," said Proctors Operations Director Dan Sheehan.

"Our new seats are Cadillacs! Better foam, better cushions, modern technology—our audiences will be very

Sheehan notes that the seats will be historically appropriate, with wooden backs and attractive charcoal grey and gold end standards facing the aisles and matching the carpet. Additionally, the seats will be wider, starting at 19 inches as opposed to the current 17. Handrails will be installed throughout the balcony, just as handrails were added to GE Theatre seating system in

The \$1.7 million project will take approximately seven weeks to complete, with the hearing loop installed between removal of the existing seats and installation of the new system, which includes fixed seats in the boxes to the left and right of the MainStage.

The final planned show before renovation is a Saturday, July 21 performance by YouTube stars Daniel Howell and Phil Lester. Audiences will be introduced to the new seats with the tour launch of the Broadway musical "Anastasia," from Tuesday, Oct. 9 to Sunday, Oct. 14.

The loop will offer much improved clarity for persons with hearing loss who wear telecoil-or

> T-coil—equipped hearing aids, and work as a welcome addition to the theatre's current FM-based system, delivering a high-fidelity hearing assist signal to every section of the MainStage auditorium.

perfect fit for This aspect of the project will historic Proctors be handled by the Rochester-based Hearing Loops Unlimited, led by architect, hearing aid user and hearing loop designer Dan Bataille, who created similar systems for Capital Repertory Theatre in Albany and for The Addy theatre at Proctors.

> Seed funding for the seats and hearing loop comes from a \$500,000 New York State Council on the Arts grant administered through the Regional Economic Development Councils.

"The remainder," said Relationships Director Dan Hanifin, "is being raised through donors and friends of the theatre, including individuals and corporations who understand how important this endeavor is to Proctors."

A number of emblemed armrests from existing seats will be made into a sculpture for display at Proctors, with all original donors honored on a digital roll call. The new armrests feature a recessed plate, and these will be available for naming at \$500 with a 20-year lease.

The majority of existing seats are past use and will be retired. Due to the limited number of end standards, with two needed to create a standalone chair, only a few seats will be made available for souvenir purchase; and patrons may contact the Relationships Department at Proctors for more information.

"I can't wait to hear the response following Anastasia," said Morris. "Proctors just gets better and better.

Albany native living on Hawaii says don't cancel your vacation

HAWAII — Much ado has been reported on the eruption of Mount Kilauea on the main island of Hawaii.

National news services have provided daily updates with alarming detail describing families losing their homes, lava spills knifing through the terrain. Last weekend, it was reported that the damage could be viewed by satellites up in space.

But, don't go cancelling your vacation just yet.

Becky Leonard Ringler, a Delmar native now living on Hawaii, said the national news coverage is developing into a "pet-peeve."

"I don't know why it does that," she said. "It's driving me insane."

Ringler owns Simple Kona Beach Weddings with her husband Matt. The two organize and facilitate beach weddings, and have done so since moving to Hawaii four years ago. The dreamscape business has flourished over time. The author happily said it has taken her away from writing. But, over the past month, she has commonly received phone calls from panicked brides planning to arrive from

"I keep getting phone calls from brides who are freaked out asking if it's okay," she

Hawaii was formed millions of years ago through volcanic activity. Mount Kilauea itself has had molten rock flowing from it for 35 years. However, the situation escalated for local residents when it suddenly erupted on May 3. Since then, approximately 2,000 residents are homeless, and about 75 homes have been destroyed. It is the most serious eruption for this volcano in several years.

The state of Hawaii consists of eight islands. The main island is more than 4,000

square miles. Mount Kilauea is on the far southeast corner. The area impacted by the latest volcanic activity is aptly named Volcano Country. Whereas the median price for real estate in Hawaii runs over half a million dollars — the price of living is notoriously high as well — the New York Times interviewed one Volcano Country family who bought a home and 100 acres for \$100,000. People purchase the property with the understanding their neighbor is known for her volatile nature.

For the remaining inhabitants of the island, it's life as usual. Becky said local news may include a 60-second clip on the latest development, but done so without any pretense or drama. Perhaps as less dramatic as the sports report, she said.

"It's kind of like when people freaked out when there was all that flooding in Houston," said Becky, "and people worried about people in Austin... it's far away."

Nonetheless, Becky said she has observed the cancellation of one or two cruises. Whether it be related to the volcano is unconfirmed. Alaska Airlines had reportedly halved its usual roundtrip fare to Hawaii last month. That discount, however, has since been rescinded.

Outside of the relative few who decided to live near the volcano, baring something catastrophic, Becky said life is normal.

"No. This is a big island," she said. "We're not all on fire."

Finding balance

The valley remains nearly as rural as it was generations ago, with sprawling pastures for dairy farms running the length of both New York Routes 22 and 23. Stop where the two roads intersect and you'll be in Hillsdale. The tranquility of its rolling hills has attracted urbanites from bustling cities to pick up and move here. Sprouted between the farms lands, the vegetable stands and sunflowers stands a few store fronts influenced by varied backgrounds not akin to the neighborhood.

Carrie Chen and Stanley Cohen opened Casana T House next door to the historic Mount Washington House on Route 23 last September. Within is a sense of balance where how you define the store depends on your perspective. For example, Cohen sees it as a place to grab a cup of coffee or espresso. For Chen, it's one of the few places you can find exquisite teas from China and Japan — and learn how to brew them properly. Not the mention, it's the only place you'll find an authentic Asian meal in town.

"When Stanley and I moved here four years ago," Chen said, "we met many talented neighbors so I decided to have the T House not only serve good food, but to expand the conversations we found ourselves having about work, art and life with the people we were meeting in this community."

The restaurant will soon serve as the setting for a summer series that features arts, lectures and special dinners. It starts

with a free lecture featuring arm critic and biographer Jed Perl, who will lead a discussion on noted 20th century sculpture Alexander Calder, on Sunday, June 10. The discussion will include Cohen in the conversation about the three-dimensional artist, whose art can be viewed at the Empire State Plaza in Albany. Perl only recently completed a nation-wide book tour in conversation with Sandy Rower, Calder's grandson. Cohen, who was Calder's long-time friend, neighbor and legal advisor will step in for Rower this

Every weekend for 10 years, Cohen said he had spent in Calder's company. Often times, they were not alone. He said he felt like he was "small potatoes," as the artist hosted drop-ins with author and orator Christopher Hitchens, comedic actor Sid Caesar, "Death of a Salesman" author Arthur Miller, and "Shoah" documentary filmmaker Claude Lanzmann.

"I was probably too young to recognize or understand that he was an important figure in 20th century art," said Cohen. "It was only over a period of time when I attended some of the retrospectives, and I saw his works from the 20s on, did I realize his importance."

Calder was 40 years Cohen's senior. By the time the two met, Calder was already a world acclaimed artist. The lawyer said he would not dare involve himself in conversation about art. Instead, the two bonded over politics. Calder famously refused the Presidential Medal of Freedom from U.S. President Gerald Ford, out of protest over the Vietnam War. "Often, our talk was about politics," said Cohen. "It was the height of the Vietnam War and we were among the early demonstrators, and that's what consolidated my relationship with him.'

Cohen intends to exhibit his personal collection of Calder's work — including a mobile in which he is famous for producing during the June 10 event.

The summer series at Casana T House will resemble those drop-in dinners — intellectuals sharing thoughts over a special dinner. The lecture is free. The dinner afterwards will cost \$30. Reservations are required, as seating is limited to 40 people.

hickpeas are loaded with protein and fiber, making them a healthy addition to just about anyone's diet. For those who want the nutritious pack chickpeas can provide but are worried that chickpeas fall short in the flavor department, you can enjoy the best of both worlds by cooking up the following recipe for "Spiced Chickpeas" from "Crossroads: Extraordinary Recipes from the Restaurant That Is Reinventing Vegan Cuisine" (Artisan) by Tal Ronnen, Scot Jones and Serafina Magnussen.

Ingredients — Serves 4 Spiced Chickpeas

- 2 cups dried chickpeas (garbanzo beans), soaked overnight in cold water, or two 15-ounce cans chickpeas, drained and rinsed
- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1 teaspoon red pepper flakes
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 6 tablespoons grapeseed oil
- 1/2 shallot, minced
- 2 garlic cloves, minced

Juice of 1/2 lemon

- 1 tablespoon dry sherry
- 1 cup Scoty's Marinara Sauce (see below) or store-bought sauce

Chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

Directions

Preheat the oven to 425°F. Combine the chickpeas, cumin, red pepper flakes, cayenne, salt, and black pepper in a mixing bowl, drizzle with 1/4 cup of the oil, and toss to coat. Spread the chickpeas out on a baking sheet in a single layer and roast, shaking the pan from time to time, for 20 to 25 minutes, until the chickpeas are firm and dry. Set aside to cool. (The roasted chickpeas can be prepared a couple of hours in advance, covered, and held at room temperature.)

Put a large sauté pan over medium heat and add the remaining 2 tablespoons oil. When the oil is hot, stir in the shallot and garlic and cook, stirring, until soft, about 2 minutes. Add the chickpeas, tossing to heat through. Stir in the lemon juice, sherry and marinara sauce and cook, stirring, until the chickpeas are well coated and the sauce is hot, about 2 minutes.

Mound the chickpeas in a shallow serving bowl, top with chopped parsley and serve warm.

- 2 28-ounce cans whole tomatoes, preferably San Marzano
- 3 tablespoons extra-virgin olive oil



MUSIC REVIEW

The Sea The Sea's 'From The Light'

lot has changed for The Sea the Sea since the release of their first album, "Love We Are We Love" in 2014. The debut album received high praise for its folk-acoustic basis that allowed the beautiful vocals of the original duo, what Huffington Post

refers to as, "two of the loveliest male-female voices you might ever hear this or any other year," to truly shine. The same praise is just as easily applicable to their sophomore album, "From The Light," which certainly does not disappoint on the vocals. The band, originally an acoustic-folk duo act featuring Chuck and Mira Costa, has grown to now include Cara May Gorman on vocals and synthesizer,

and Stephen Struss on drums and percussion.

This album stays true to their folk roots, but shows how their sound has matured by adding a whole new spectacular layer of production and instrumentation that serves not to hide, but compliments their stunning vocals even more. With the group's introduction of reverb-heavy electric guitars, the dream-like production done by Troy Pohl, and by lacing almost every line with their signature harmonies, making every coming one as chillingly beautiful as the last, this album is a piece of art through and through, and is certainly a display of their musical growth as a group.

The opening track, "Everybody," is the perfect invitation for the listener to enter this album. Opening with mesmerizing swirling sounds, as soon as the vocals join this dream sequence in stunning harmony, the song practically extends a hand connecting the musicians with the listener. The lyrics immediately dive into the album's themes of the duality of human nature, accepting our differences, and fostering positivity amidst hard times that the group explores. It addresses the inescapable human fallibility we all face as somebody in this population of "everybody." The hypnotizing simplicity of the piece transforms as the sound thickens. Percussion is layered onto a quicker beat, and an electric guitar takes center stage before the song strips back down to its original simplicity. Without a hiccup, it then leads right into the next song, one of the notable singles off the album, "Bang Bang Bang." "Everybody" is a stunning opener and preview of what is to come

from the album. It shares the driving questions, has the dreamy production highlighted in other songs such as "All Go Right," and hints at more upbeat songs like "Phototrophic."

The title track, "From the Light," takes its time building up, layering sound on top of sound, with the reverb allowing each to swim between your ears in anticipation for the next addition. It starts off with simple percussion and works its way into an explosion of instrumentation and vocals. The repeating lyrics circle back, creating a beautiful push and pull dynamic between good and bad, mimicking the tendency to sway back and forth between the two within human nature.

The ballad "Good for Something," was inspired by Chuck's grandfather's often repeated mantra stated in the above quote, which is now immortalized within the lyrics of the song. The echoing melodic guitar and lyrics make this track a stand out song on the album and a happy ending to the story the album tells: focusing on the positive even in trying and confusing circumstances.

For as much as the sound itself is a breath of fresh air, so is the obvious social commentary throughout "From the Light" and the optimistic outlook it takes on recognizing that we are all human, but ultimately choosing to focus on the good in that.

MUSIC REVIEW

TJ Foster's 'First Person'

nyone who's ever questioned their purpose (so all of us) will relate to the sentiments laid out in TJ Foster's recent release First Person, Volume One. The album unfolds like a diary decorated with a mix of acoustic guitar, piano, harmonica and occasional drums. Each song explores the obstacles that emerge as people struggle with defining their own identity and finding their place in the world.

The lyrics won't shock the ear with poetic potency but Foster's words will validate the listeners' own questioning of self. The first track, "I Don't Know," sets the tone for the album with modest guitar elevated by strong vocal harmonies. The title offers a simple and honest response to the questions that escape our grasp. "57" wrestles with the desire for human connection but hauntingly echoes the chorus "Should I just be alone." The melancholy ensues with "Basement," which details a few of the emotional hardships Foster has experienced including losing a friend to suicide and dealing with his parents' divorce.

"An Ode to my Twenties" surprises the listener with the most upbeat tune on the album, recounting important milestones

including graduation, getting married, having two kids, getting a first tattoo, and perhaps most notably, finding a taste for wine. It may seem like a minor adult accomplishment, but detecting the subtle nuances in a glass of merlot is an ability often lost on younger drinkers. In "Upside Down," Foster almost whispers the line "I may act like I'm awake, but I'm perpetually dreaming." It speaks to the human tendency to be caught up in our thoughts and not actively participating in our own lives, too busy focusing on the negative to revel in the positive.

Though First Person, Volume One offers no comforting solutions to the numerous existential questions it poses, perhaps comfort can be found in the questions themselves, as they are familiar to many of us. The album is available for purchase at tjfoster.bandcamp.com/releases.



- garlic cloves, minced
- carrot, finely grated (about 1/2 cup)

Kosher salt and freshly ground black pepper

1/2 teaspoon red pepper flakes

Pinch of baking soda

- fresh basil leaves, chopped
- tablespoon butter

Directions

Working in batches, put the tomatoes, along with their juice, in a food processor or blender and puree until semi-smooth; you want a little bit of chunky texture. Put a medium pot over medium heat and add the oil. When the oil is hot, add the onion, garlic and carrot; season with salt, black pepper and the red pepper flakes; and sauté until the vegetables are soft, about 10 minutes.

Add the pureed tomatoes, stirring to combine, and bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to medium-low and simmer, uncovered, until the sauce thickens, about 45 minutes. Season the sauce with more salt and black pepper, to taste. Remove from the heat, stir in the baking soda, making sure it dissolves, and add the basil and the butter substitute.

Once cooled, the sauce can be refrigerated covered for up to 3 days or frozen for up to 2 months.




