# Woman charged with Delmar OTB stabbing killed

Daise was fatally shot in unrelated incident two days before court date

ALBANY — Two days before she was set to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on assault charges for reportedly stabbing an unknown man in the parking lot of the Delmar OTB in Delaware Plaza, Nahjayyah Daise, 21, of Albany, was shot and killed by her ex-boyfriend while driving down Erie Street in Albany.

According to reports, Larnell Kennedy, 22, shot Daise three times in the head before exiting the vehicle and chasing it down Erie Street at around 3 p.m. as he tried to run across



June 3. The car eventually hit a utility pole and Kennedy

witnessed

trying to put Daise into the trunk before giving up and running over her body as he attempted to flee the scene in the vehicle. After being boxed in by another vehicle, he then attempted to flee the scene on foot and was hit and killed by an SUV

on Sunday, Interstate 90 near exit 6A.

While police believe they located the murder weapon next to Kennedy's body, but authorities have not yet learned why he shot Daise. The two reportedly had an on and off relationship for a number of years, but no known history of domestic violence.

On Thursday, May 3, Daise was charged with the OTB assault and scheduled to return to court on Tuesday, June 5. Other information about either of the deceased has not been made available.

# Pair of women arrested on drug charges

Thursday, June 7, at 6:10 p.m. Bethlehem Police investigated a report of a person acting suspiciously in the area of Delaware and Elsmere avenues in Delmar.

Upon arrival, police reportedly not only located a female seated in a car but also and observed evidence of crack cocaine usage in plain view. It was also determined that the operator of the vehicle, Danielle L. Lake, 37, of Richford, Vermont, was wanted by Albany Police on a bench warrant. She was taken into custody by Bethlehem Police.

A subsequent search warrant was executed at the residence of 269 Delaware Avenue in Delmar, where police located and seized 5.7 pounds of marijuana, 228 Oxycodone pills, 11 individual decks of heroin, eight Methadone pills and three rocks of crack cocaine.

Also arrested in the residence was Alycia M. Rafuse, 24, of Delmar.

Both Lake and Rafuse were charged with two felony counts of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the third degree; one felony count of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the fifth degree; one felony count of criminal possession of marijuana in the second degree; and one misdemeanor count each of criminal possession of a controlled substance in the seventh degree and criminally using drug paraphernalia.



Both Lake and Rafuse were arraigned in Town of Bethlehem Court by Judge Ryan Donovan. Rafuse was remanded to the Albany County Jail in lieu of \$15,000 bail, while Lake was remanded to the Albany County jail in lieu of \$20,000 bail. Both Lake and Rafuse are scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Court on Tuesday, June 12 for preliminary hearings.

The investigation is continuing and anyone with information on these two subjects is asked to contact Bethlehem Police at (518) 439-9973.

# So long and thanks for all the wine

Former Twisted Vine chef focuses on new personal catering business

**DELMAR** — Chris Torncello, the chef who helped found Twisted Vine, has left the wine bar to pursue a job in personal catering.

"I just wanted to get out of the nightlife part of the service industry," said the 32-year-old Torncello, explaining that he was recently engaged and hoped to have more time to spend with his fiancee.

In 2015, Torncello opened the wine bar with co-owners Daniel Casey and Brendan McCann, the duo that also owns Perfect Blend Cafe and Bakery just around the corner from Twisted Vine, which is located at 384 Kenwood Ave. in Delmar.

"It's such a small place," Torncello said of the wine bar. "It was tough with three people and so I just chose to walk away amicably and leave it in those guys' very capable hands."

He has since opened a personal chef business called Traveling Chef 518. "I do in-home, custom meal planning for people, private dinner party events in the home and private cooking classes. I also do private dinner party/cooking classes, where you can have a few friends over and I'll walk the group through a cooking class in your house."

To open this new venture, Torncello went through the U.S. Personal Chef Association to get set up as a sole proprietor, get registered and figure out taxation and insurance. "It's been a really helpful tool for me," he said.

While it's all still very new, Torncello

said he does have some jobs already lined up for this summer. He'll be cooking dinner for a sorority house six days a week. "It'll be nice to be done by 5:30 p.m.," he said.

With an uncle, Daniel Darves-Bornoz, who owns Provence in Albany and Milano in Latham, and who also ran a catering company for a while, Torncello said he has always been around food and food service. "I grew up doing odd jobs. Dishwashing, delivery driving, things like that. Then I started working in kitchens." Eventually, he said, he went to Schenectady County Community College, enrolling in its lauded culinary arts program.

"It's a really amazing program," Torncello said. "I can't speak highly enough about it."

After graduating in 2009, he went to work for Casey and McCann at Perfect Blend. Years later, the three decided to open Twisted Vine together.

"It's really hard to walk away from something that you've put so much time and effort into but, at the end of the day, you really have to do what's right for your own mental health and quality of life," said Torncello. "I miss it a ton. There was

so much I still wanted to do there. But I'm really happy. It's nice to be able to enjoy life a little bit more."

He's not worried about his former partners, however. Casey, he said, went to culinary school at Johnson and Wales in Rhode Island. "So he's kind of taking the reins and controlling the kitchen and the line cooks that I trained there are handling everything, I'm sure."

Torncello said he learned "a ton" from his erstwhile partners while working for them at Perfect Blend, especially in terms of baking.

Ultimately, Torncello wants to run a full-blown event catering business. "I see this as kind of a stepping stone. I don't need to have a brick and mortar business just yet and won't have to take out the loans to pay for that sort of thing." He hopes that his reputation will help him to land the kind of "gigs" that will help him realize that dream.

"I'm really into what's categorized as the New American style," he said, when asked what cuisine he prefers to prepare. "Taking classics and using fresh seasonal ingredients to recreate them. It's really focused in on that farm-to-table aspect too, which is really popular right now. And vegetarian cooking. That's a huge thing right now, too. I think those are the styles I would really like to focus on."

Tornccello will be will be the featured chef at the Cheese Traveler's Friday night cookout on June 29, where he will create the menu. Anyone else interested in hiring Torncello can reach him through his website at www.travelingchef518.com, where he also writes a food and wine blog.

# **Substation snags**

Planning Board and fire district disagree on sidewalk, color of proposed south station

GLENMONT — A proposed Elsmere Fire Department South station at the corner of Feura Bush and Wemple roads would not be manned, nor would it be used as a community space, according to project representatives who spoke with the Town Planning Board on Tuesday, June 5.

When the project was initially proposed in February, town planning staff requested that a sidewalk be included in the plan to build a 4,608 square-foot firehouse "sub-station" on the 1.4-acre property. Noting that the fire district cited current and future development growth as a reason for needing the new station, town planners suggested that a sidewalk would benefit the growing community, as well as anyone visiting the station for community events.

Senior Planner Leslie Lombardo pointed out that fire stations generally serve as public meeting places and seemed unconvinced that it would never be used for that purpose. "Even though the fire district has indicated that they will not hold community events at the site, staff thinks that maybe in the future it could be a possibility" she said, "since they have talked about wanting to recruit volunteers from this area of town." She said building a connecting sidewalk would be good planning practice.

During the Planning Board's June 5 meeting, Tim Hannigan, the attorney representing the Elsmere Fire District, argued that existing sidewalks on the opposite side of Wemple and Feura Bush roads should be adequate for the neighborhood. He added that it could be dangerous to encourage pedestrians to walk on Feura Bush Road directly in front of the station, as that's where firetrucks would deploy from when answering calls.

Hannigan, a volunteer firefighter with the district himself, repeatedly stated that the fire district has no intentions of utilizing the station as a community space.

"This is not a community building in the traditional sense that our firehouse at 15 West Poplar is," he said. "Another important note is that it is an unmanned firehouse. So, even if someone did come to the front of the apron, where we don't want people to be, there would be no one there to answer the door.

"This is, for all intents and purposes, a

garage to better position apparatus so that our members who live on that side of the bypass can get there faster and respond to calls faster on that side," he said, explaining that the current station at 15 West Poplar is better equipped to host any potential community events than the new station will be.

Hannigan also added that additional construction costs would be prohibitive, citing the recent Trump-imposed tariffs on imported metals that he claimed have already added 25 percent to the cost of the project.

Town Planning Director Rob Leslie agreed that a sidewalk would be unwarranted if there were to be no community events at the new station, but said if that were not the case, he would prefer to see a sidewalk.

While Michael Moore, counsel to

the planning board, suggested looking at possible language to effectively bind the district against using the station for such purposes, Hannigan balked at the idea of being barred "in perpetuity" from any course of action. He did say, however, the district might be open to the idea of providing additional safety measures in the case of any public events, an idea that Chairman John Smolinsky said seemed to address all concerns and was worth looking into.

Hannigan also answered questions about the color of the proposed building, which the Elsmere Board of Fire Commissioners changed at the behest of the only resident who raised concerns. Board members seemed critical of the building's appearance and how well it would fit in to the surrounding

# ART seeks artist

Art on the Rail Trail looks to add another masterpiece to enhance trail

#### BETHLEHEM —

Art on the Rail Trail is looking for the second artist to produce public art for placement along the Albany County Helderberg Hudson Rail Trail—and initial applications are due by the end of Monday, June

The first ART mural, created by Andrea Hersh, was dedicated at 90 Adams St. last year and depicts fanciful green rolling hills and trees, dotted by pink flowers under a vibrant blue sky.

"Our ideal project would create another iconic mural that becomes a landmark for both locals and visitors enjoying the Rail Trail," said Amy Griffin, volunteer ART committee member. "It's a challenging space with lots of potential and we hope to see some creative proposals for the best use of the space."

Art on the Rail Trail is a new initiative designed to bring public art installations to the Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail. It was spearheaded by Bethlehem community members who believe it will add to quality of life in trail-adjacent areas, beautify the ninemile trail and create a sense of community ownership. A committee was formed in late 2016 and quickly joined forces with the Mohawk-Hudson Land Conservancy to realize a collaborative vision.

While all artists are welcome to apply, ART specifically encourages those who work in public art, murals and mosaic. Artists, designers, studios, and teams may submit multiple concepts for the project, and artists from any location are encouraged to apply. However, preference will be given to Capital District artists and those living within a 100-mile radius from the Town of Bethlehem.

The selection committee will judge proposals based

- Quality, originality, and appeal of the concept;
- Concept's appropriateness for the site;
- Artist's proven capacity for timely completion of the project.

Finalists will be announced in early July.

The selection committee will choose up to three finalists to make a public presentation in mid-July and the chosen winner will

receive \$5,000 to complete the project, hopefully by the fall.

Application Deadline: Initial applications are due at or before 11:59 p.m. on Monday, June 18.

Guidelines: Town Zoning requires that text should take up no more than 3 percent of the overall design. Although this is a public space and work should be suitable for all ages, all styles and themes will be considered.

Pier measurements:

Width varies from seven feet and three inches at top-of-footing to five feet and three inches at bottom-of-cap beam. Each pier total height is approx.

Artists should include in the design how many and how much of the piers they will cover. There are eight piers in total. There is a photo of the piers on the website at www. mohawkhudson.org/ART

- Five to 10 representative digital images of your work
- A written proposal (up to 750 words) with initial imagery to demonstrate your concept for the space.

# The Empire loses a thriller

**ALBANY** — In a battle for first place in the Arena Football League, The Empire lost on Saturday, June 9, 59-56 after the Baltimore Brigade kicked a field goal with five seconds left on the clock.

It was a back and forth, thriller of a game in front of a crowd of nearly 9,000, with the teams playing even after the first quarter and then tied at 28 at the half. Albany outscored the Brigade in the fourth, 21-17, but did not have time to get off a play after the field goal except for the return.

Brigade quarterback Randy Hippeard threw for 270 yards and eight touchdowns and was named the game MVP award. Brigade receiver Brandon Thompkins had 17 receptions for 159 yards and three touchdowns to earn Offensive Player of the Game honors. Empire's Brandon Stephens was named Defensive Player of the Game with 11.5 total tackles.

With four games left in the regular season in the AFL's return to Albany, The Empire snap a five game winning streak and fall to second place with a 5-3 record. The Brigade are in first at 6-2.

Albany will next play Philadelphia Soul on June 16 at the Times Union Center.

# Trail opens only to close again

A wallet containing the information of Guilderland resident Bruce Decker was reportedly retrieved from the body. Tests, including an autopsy, will be done to properly identify the victim and determine the cause of death.

Local authorities started an extensive search of the Indian Ladder Trail in February, after Decker's white sedan was found parked near the Paint Mine hiking trails. The search began on Feb. 22 and by March 2, six state agencies — including 40 members of the Department of Correctional and Community Services Emergency Response Team, Albany County Sheriff's Department, eight Albany County fire departments and 12 volunteer search and rescue teams — contributed 4,487 hours to the search.

The search operations included 2,442 acres of intensive searching, 502

acres of extensive searching, 56.7 miles of trails, 355 acres of drone searching and 4.5 square miles were searched by a State Police helicopter. K9 units and drones were also used.

The search for the 71-year-old was officially called back on March 1, after a Noreaster dumped nearly two feet of snow on the park.

The park reopened the trail once the body was cleared on Sunday.

The New York state Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation spent several days in recent weeks clearing loose rocks from the cliff side above the more than two miles of hiking trail. The effort involved staff members chipping at the cliffside suspended in the air in rope and harness. More staffers were tasked with clearing the debris from the trail. The maintenance was a direct response to a July accident that left an Albany woman paralyzed after she was struck by falling rock.

The popular footpath has been a tourist attraction for generations. More than 300,000 people visit Thacher Park every year. It was etched into the soft limestone on the cliff side of the Helderberg Escarpment after the last Ice Age, more than 13,000 years ago, when glaciers scraped across upstate New York. It has long been a place of interest for both nature lovers and history buffs, providing picturesque views of both the Hudson and Mohawk valleys. Hikers who have traversed the trail are rewarded by small caves and cascading waterfalls within and above the nooks and crannies of its surface.

neighborhood, However, Elsmere Fire Chairman John Brennan informed the Planning Board in a memo that the design represented hours of work to select an affordable and functional design. "Therefore," he wrote, "the design presented is the final design."

"Does this board intend to pick the color of the firehouse," asked Hannigan, when he was told that he should have provided color options. He noted that the fire district is a municipality and

suggested that the role of the Planning Board is different when involving other municipalities than when dealing with privately owned businesses.

"The ultimate authority will rest with the Board of Fire Commissioners," he said.

In his memo, Brennan also explained that project cost limits meant that the station will not be a brick and mortar building. While the concerned neighbor might prefer those materials, if constructed, the proposed structure will be built using metal.

"The Board carefully considered its fiduciary responsibilities to the taxpayers of the Fire District when developing plans for the fire station and determined that a

metal building was the type of building best suited to meet Elsmere Fire District's needs for a host of reasons."

Hannigan expressed concern that cosmetic concerns were holding up the process and would end up costing taxpayers more money. "Every time we print up a new set of plans, or even change them electronically, it's costing money," he said. "We're talking about a public safety building," he said. "And the hold-up is the

The town is still waiting to hear back from the state Department of Transportation regarding its approval to add a new curb cut to Feura Bush Road, which is owned by the state. Additionally, the applicant still needs to respond to comments made by town engineering staff, regarding things like stormwater management.

According to Lombardo, once those comments have been addressed by the Elsmere Fire District, its representatives will go back before the Planning Board to secure approval.

"In the meantime," said Smolinksy, "we'll work on the color issue and, hopefully, when this is ready to come back, we'll have some resolution."

# Music excellence

"This would not have been possible if we didn't have such great colleagues before us who worked to make the program so well received and recognized," she explained. "Even the staff here who support the students in coming to music lessons and those who provide support behind the scenes; it's a huge group effort."

This is the first time the district has received the honor, which is awarded on an annual basis. The teachers decided to pursue the application process after Superintendent Brian Bailey sent them an email with the NAMM logo and simply typed, "I want one of these."

"I knew right there and then we were finally going to take the plunge and [apply]," she said.

She and Fatuzzo spent several hours over a matter of weeks completing the application, adding that all of the information had to be gathered before it could be submitted; NAMM does not allow award applicants to submit partial applications.

"NAMM wanted to know how we utilized the resources we had, regardless of how much money we were given," Fatuzzo said. "It's not about having the biggest budget or the best equipment."

Fatuzzo recalled that the application featured a lot of database-driven questions, such as how many students are enrolled in the school, how many students participate in music classes, band and chorus, and how many students receive free and reduced lunches, among others.

"I had most of the resources already," McLoughlin said. "I did have to contact some other district resources for some percentages and figures, but a lot of the information about what the four schools offer was readily available to me."

Bailey is proud of his students' accomplishments and the district's recognition, he said in an emailed statement.

"The NAMM award for being one of the 583 Best Communities for Music Education in the United States comes to RCS on the tail end of a year's worth of noteworthy musical accomplishments by our staff and students," he wrote. "This year marked our acceptance to participate in music festivals with the Suburban Council schools, gold and silver NYSSMA medals for our performing ensembles, an excellent production of 'Sister Act' with multiple regional awards for our cast members, and concert after concert that demonstrated the virtuosity and vibrancy of our music program. RCS could not be prouder of the ongoing accomplishments of our musicians."

# How do the students feel?

The students are thrilled that their achievements are being recognized, McLoughlin said, adding they have been getting a lot of good news lately.

"Before the award, the high school was accepted into the Suburban Council Music Festival, which is basically another festival like All County and All State where [the students] can go and compete for scores," she said. "This organization is filled with bigger schools [that] have intensive music programs, so we are finally showing what RCS has to offer."

While RCS' student body totals just under 2,000 students in all four schools as of 2016, Fatuzzo said the high school music program boasts 200 students, adding that number was approximately one-third of the high school student body.

The music program's recent advancements and recognition have encouraged both Fatuzzo and McLoughlin to stay true to its tried and tested methods

"It's just that stamp of approval," McLoughlin reiterated. "We are going to move forward and hopefully bring some new faces in."

According to current rosters for the 2018-19 school year, McLoughlin will have 136 students, the most she's had since she started teaching at the high school.

"There are 115 students currently showing up

on full chorus days," McLoughlin said, citing the school's every-other-day scheduling system. "This is the biggest I've had."

Fatuzzo added his band is sitting at 76 players and no longer fits on the auditorium stage, where it rehearses and performs, comfortably.

"We hope this award will encourage those who haven't come to see a concert or a drama production to take a seat and hear what we can do," he said. He also hopes the award will attract prospective teachers to the district when positions open up.

"We have a great program here with such qualified teachers and caring staff," McLoughlin said, adding she, too, hopes that the award will entice future faculty members who want to be a part of the community to apply.

"The reason why we believe this is so successful is not just because music is known to boost test scores and be such a beneficial part of education," she continued, "but because this is a space where all of our students can come and be truly, totally themselves without judgment. We want to provide a safe space and an open dialogue with each and every student we have, and I think they know that."

Fatuzzo agreed with McLoughlin.

"Music education teaches discipline, organization and critical thinking in ways that can carry over to the classroom and vice versa," he said. "It's a group effort."

In addition to RCS, the NAMM Foundation also recognized these local school districts: Ballston Spa, Burnt Hills-Ballston Lake, Guilderland, Mohonasen, North Colonie, Schenectady, Shenendehowa and South Colonie.



# Climbing the mountain

Aside from the appearances of The Allman Brothers Band, of which Mountain Jam co-founder Warren Haynes is the guitarist, headliners had included Tom Petty and Led Zeppelin's Robert Plant. Neither one necessarily fit Radio Woodstock's AAA format, but the name power didn't hurt.

The three-day festival on Hunter Mountain seldom suffers from a lack of attention. Since kicking off with its first event in 2005, it has been considered one of the best festivals in the region — and, certainly the best of its kind in upstate New York.

This year, the lineup does not include the out-ofplace big name. It's done away with booking artists who have climbed the mountain and reached the top, and focused on those bands who continue to climb. The festival still includes recent successes with names familiar to alternative fans. Grammy Award winners Sturgill Simpson, Portugal. The Man, Josh Tillman, and The War on Drugs headline with recent Grammy nominees alt-J and The Decemberists. The breadth of the lineup includes names that have performed in local venues, Chicano Batman, The Other Brothers, Turkuaz and The Felice Brothers — all of whom have played in the Capital District within the past year. The largest commercial success among them all would be Sunday's headliner Jack

Johnson strumbed his acoustic guitar into mainstream households with his 2002 hit "Flake." Since then, he's garnered several accolades, taking home awards from ESPN and Surfer Magazine, of all places. He later earned a Grammy nomination, but never took away the trophy. As upside down that may be, don't let the feeling go away that this coming weekend will make for an amazing live

Serving as perhaps the best example of the Capital District's vibrant music scene is the inclusion of three local artists on this year's bill.

## **Sydney Worthley**

Sydney Worthley has continued to impress people since dropping her debut album "Strong" last September. Her polished CD featured her versatility as both a performer and songwriter, flowing from pop to folk, and rock to country through each of its 14 tracks. In the span of a year, she's gone from the local stage at Albany's Tulip



Festival to one of Hunter Mountain's three stages at Mountain Jam. In between that time, she's earned airtime on radio stations throughout the region, performed at Songfest last month, and is scheduled to precede her appearance at Hunter with a show at this week's Rockin' on the River in Troy. All of this, while juggling with her studies at Voorheesville High School. Worthley said she's "not nervous" as she approaches her Sunday appearance at Mountain Jam.





ust about anything can be cooked over an open flame. No matter the type of grilling they're using, cooks who prepare meals over an open flame can't help but notice the distinctive flavor that's unique to grilled foods.

Trying something new this grilling season can open cooks' eyes to a host of flavors they might not instantly associate with grilling. The following recipe for "Ginger Soy Chicken Breasts" from Eric Treuille and Birgit Erath's "Grilling" (DK Publishing) is one such meal that can open cooks' eyes to the many wonderful foods that can be cooked over an open flame.

#### Ingredients — Serves 4

- 2 tablespoons grated fresh ginger
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 2 tablespoons dark brown sugar
- 2 teaspoons sesame seeds
- 2 teaspoons toasted sesame oil
- 1 tablespoon medium dry sherry
- 1/2 cup soy sauce
- 4 boneless chicken breast halves, slashed (see below)

Salt

Black pepper

1 recipe Cilantro Coconut Sauce (see below), optional

#### Directions

Combine ginger, garlic, sugar, sesame seeds, sesame oil, sherry, and soy sauce. Add chicken and toss to coat evenly. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes, turning once. Grill according to instructions below. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Serve hot with Cilantro Coconut Sauce (optional).

To slash chicken breasts: With a sharp knife, cut 3 parallel slashes through skin, about 1/4-inch deep.

Outdoor grill: Grill skin-side down on medium-hot coals until crisp, about 7 minutes. Turn and continue grilling until chicken is opaque with no trace of pink, another 5 minutes.

Indoor grill: Preheat broiler. Broil skinside up until skin is crisp, about 7 minutes. Turn and continue cooking until chicken is opaque with no trace of pink, another 5 minutes.

#### Cilantro Coconut Sauce

### Ingredients — Makes 2 1/8 cups

- 1 handful cilantro leaves
- 1 handful fresh mint leaves
- 4 garlic cloves, crushed
- 1 green chile, seeded and chopped
- 1 avocado, peeled, halved and pitted
- 1/2 teaspoon grand cumin



1 teaspoon sugar

3 tablespoons fresh lime juice

11/2 cups coconut milk
Salt

Tabasco sauce

#### **Directions**

Place cilantro, mint, garlic, chile, avocado, cumin, sugar, lime juice, and coconut milk in a food processor or blender; pulse to a purée. Add salt and Tabasco sauce to taste. Cover and refrigerate for 30 minutes to allow flavors to blend. Serve chilled.

Cooks note: To avoid discoloration, store in a bowl with plastic wrap, pressing directly on the sauce to prevent contact with air.

and stress associated with being an emergency responder can sometimes be overwhelming, and it's times like that when emergency responders need help.

Comprehensive statistics on stress-related medical conditions among first responders are difficult to tabulate because many incidents go unreported or unshared. However, pressures of the job and post traumatic stress disorder, or PTSD, can take its toll on paramedics and law officials. EMS World reports that, between January and September of 2014, the United States had around 58 documented fire/ EMS suicides. In Canada, 25 first

committed suicide in a five-month period in 2014. Addressing

the stress of being an emergency responder can help responders and their families better cope with the pressure and stress of the job. The National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health recommends that all workers involved in firstresponder activities should help themselves and others to reduce the risk of stresswith the demands of the job. These symptoms may include:

- · Changes in sleeping patterns
- Passive or fatalistic behavior
- · Frequent conflict and argumentative behavior
- Limiting social networks and general withdrawal
- · Poor problem-solving abilities
  - Poor concentration
  - Inability to rest
- Self-medicating with alcohol


Hudson Bike Trail. It is a 36.7 mile trail perfect for running, walking, or biking.


#### **Music & Theatre**

# Komrads' 'Resistor'

efore I start this review let me disclose that I am not well versed in electronic music; my expertise lies within metal. So, I will be reviewing this album from that perspective and will be comparing

elements of songs to other groups in an attempt to best review the album.

The first track, "Resistor," is full of industrial glitchy instrumentals accompanied by drums in the back leading the beat. A little after halfway through, vocals start chanting about the resistance. "Resistor" is definitely a great intro track, while the second track "Midnight Sun" was an abrupt change from "Resistor", with its slow paced and droning styled vocals and notes that echo.

"Prom Dress" was one of my favorite tracks with vocals that are reminiscent of Marilyn Manson and Element A440 and has a rock sorta sound to match. Any fans of Manson style vocals should take a look.

"Petra" felt like an experiment that was attempting the same thing as some doom metal projects with what sounds like a few bass strings and a deep bellowing whisper that is a departure from the rest of the tracks.

"Sick Boy" instantly reminded me of "Plur Police" by Knife Party. It's full of those edm sounds that I have no clue what they're called and had humorous lyrics like "why you bring him to this office can't you see he's too big" and "can you do one thing for me?" This track should definitely be a top

contender for a single if Komrad decides to release any singles.

Overall this has more of a rock and roll sound than a metal sound but that's not a bad thing- I enjoyed multiple tracks. I don't know who recommended this to me, but my electronic music tastes are limited to Knife Party and Master Boot Record, so if you are into either of them you might enjoy this album.

# Jon Lewis Band's 'Get Wild Somewhere'

veryone loves rooting for the hometown star to catch a big break. Rochester's very own Jon Lewis Band's latest offering "Get Wild Somewhere" has the potential to expose them to their widest and most diverse audience yet. It has nothing to do with luck though. The eighth album they've recorded in four years stands solidly on each of the five member's passion, dedication, friendship and, most importantly, talent.

The band's namesake is on lead vocals and rhythm guitar, accompanied by Dave Drago on bass, Jake Walsh on drums, Shawn Brogan on lead guitar and Alex Northrup on keys. With more time spent traveling to Los Angeles to record than actually spent in the studio, "Get Wild Somewhere"s classic sound was accomplished through the use of vintage recording gear. All ten tracks were written

with the intention of being played and recorded live.

"We didn't want to do overdubs or try to manipulate our sound too much," said Lewis. "That made it possible to record in a shorter period of time and also enabled us to make something that showcases all of our individual strengths."

Fueled by adrenaline, backed by fans who crowdsourced over \$2,000 to support the band's trip to L.A. to record, and fed by the largest pizza they've ever seen (it had to be delivered through the loading dock door), "Get Wild Somewhere" has a polished, timeless sound that could only be done justice with vinyl.

Written by Lewis and produced, mixed and mastered by Drago in his 1809 Studios in Macedon, "Get Wild Somewhere" tears onto the scene with the catchy opening track "Jerry My Berry." Borrowing from the piano track that was used in famous recordings like "Werewolves in London" and "Summer

Breeze," combined with a catchy chorus, driving beat and melodious guitar licks, "Jerry My Berry" kicks the album off on an energetic note.

The following track, "Charity," is a beautiful opus with rich vocal harmonies complimenting mournful wails from Northrup's organ.

"You Don't Wanna," the third offering on the album, has a Beach Boys, surfer rock vibe to it. The clavinet introduces listeners to a an easy, breezy, likeable song that encapsulates the vintage vibe.

The rough riding "Cinnamon Only," carried by a driving lead guitar, is the first song on the album to have a full-length video to accompany it. Lewis created the video over one month's time entirely with colored papers and sketches

"I draw and cut out the characters, then photograph/animate them against a green screen, then I put all the layers together to create something I like to call 'Paper World," he explains, "The plot and story completely unfolded as I continued to work, just letting the song dictate the imagery."

The album's closer, "So Familiar," is a gorgeously dark and stormy, mostly instrumental, song that hits to the core.

"Get Wild Somewhere" is the sound of five friends pouring their hearts out and having the time of their lives producing fresh, original and crush-able jams, heartfelt ballads and indie rock. Each song comes together effortlessly and stands on its own, as if just waiting to be born.

# The Tins' 'The Tins'

on't judge a book by its cover, so they say. But what about an album? In the case of the self-titled album from the Buffalo trio The Tins, you can judge the cover all you want, but you definitely should listen.

At a passing glance, the cover is just a painting of the band's members: keyboard player and vocalist Mike Santillo, drummer and vocalist Dave Muntner, and guitarist and vocalist Adam Stanley. But, to any readers of *Rolling Stone* magazine in the '90s, the style will feel quite familiar. That's because it's the work of Philip Burke, whose art donned the magazine's covers for nearly a decade. Burke, too, is from Buffalo; as is the album's producer, Goo Goo Dolls' Robby Takac. So, The Tins have the backing of some historical talent in their hometown.

Burke's cover, familiar as it is, is sprinkled with bold surprises. Bright and unnatural color combinations jump out of the frame, figures that seemed normal at first glance ooze with distortion on further examination, and hidden shapes emerge from nowhere the longer you stare.

Likewise, the music inside the package, familiar at first, is packed with surprising twists and turns and exciting splashes of color that push it past the ordinary. The rock trio lays out interesting enough rock tunes at their base, with bits of psychedelia, new wave and folk mixed in, and just the right amount of melody and hook to reel the listener in closer. That's

when the colors and shapes start to pop, turning the interesting into the exciting.

Santillo's keys carry the first pair of songs. Immediately, a bubbling and floating organ joins Muntner's driving beat on "Hear Me Out," then returns with an 8-bit sounding flurry near the song's end. His sound gets crunchier and a bit reminiscent of Genesis next in "Oh My God." Stanley's guitar picks up the next two, with a catchy Death Cab for Cutie-esque head bobber in "Sundried Mind" and the '80s-style rocker "Jigsaw Queen" that bursts with colorful zigs and zags throughout. Bruce Springsteen's classic "State Trooper" gets updated with a dark underbelly of keyboard swirls and an exhilarating post-scream rock out. "A Minute of Your Time" seems standard at first, but slows to reveal a watery guitar jam, and later again opening up to a suspenseful building finish. "Mountain Song" is what it says, a mountain of a song, a straight up power rocker with loud crunching guitars, pounding drums and big three-part harmonies. But it, too, is not without surprises, as it repeatedly dips into atmospheric interludes.

What does it all mean?! According to Stanley, the songs stand as a singular unit, "about feeling stuck, the need for freedom and escape." But more importantly, it's about making people dance. "What good is this if you can't groove to it, you know?" The Tins' eight tracks clock in at a bit over 30 minutes. Perfectly situated to throw it on repeat, surely cracking with new discoveries on each listen.

At the time, these two also juggled between a burgeoning music career and continuing their academic studies. Both have since graduated from Harvard University. Chris, however, did so after the band earned its first Top 40 single when "Red Stops Traffic" broke through Billboard's AAA chart last December. The band is working on a new studio album, and is scheduled to play two sets this weekend. Things are likely to get a bit funky once the band takes the festival's main stage on Sunday. Bridge Road Entertainment, the band's management outfit, teased fans with a picture of Beau Sasser rehearsing with the band last week.

The Arndt's blossomed from playing local fairs to traveling the country within the span of a few years. Chris said it's difficult to see the growth from his and his sister's perspective.

"We've talked about how it's really weird, because when you're in it, you don't really notice that things are changing," he said. The surrounding environment has changed little in the

past four years Jocelyn and Chris have played under (and with) manager (and drummer) David Bourgeois. "It's my inclination to think that we are where we were four years ago," he said, adding that there was no one moment to define a threshold signifying the band's rise in popularity. "But, at the sametime, you take a step back. Four years ago, we weren't played on any radio stations and now we're played on 200 across the country."

Yesterday, people were quick to compare Jocelyn to Grace Potter. Jocelyn's vocal range is more dynamic. She goes lower. It's reminiscent of one Kozmic Blues artist out of Texas. However, being described along with Potter still makes Jocelyn smile. She had her chance to speak with her at Mountain Jam in 2015. She didn't take it.

"I had this weird thing in my brain," she said. "I wanted to meet Grace Potter, but I wanted it to be as artistic equals. [She laughs.] I have this vision in my head that someday I'll meet her and she'll know my music just as well as I

know hers. Or, at least know of it."

#### **Sean Rowe**

Nestled within the Catskill Mountains, Hunter is a place New Yorkers go to escape civilization. The town boasts of two villages, Hunter and Tannersville, with a combined population a shade over 2,000 people — half of the number of graduate students at the University at Albany.

That still may be too populated for Sean Rowe.

Rowe is a bit of a mountain man. He's known for setting out into the woods, camping and foraging for food. In fact, he just launched a web series titled "Can I Eat This?," where he combines this love with his passion for music. Men's Health followed him on such an exhibition for a 2012 feature. Now, Rowe is taking friends out with him. In a trailer video he released last month, he appears with Arielle O'Keefe of Girl Blue. His intimate interaction with nature is akin to the private living room concerts Rowe is also known for.

"I don't normally play in apartments," he said, "because I have equipment. I mean, I have. And, the cops would come. [Laughs.]... I think that, in terms of a public show, in a venue, 200 is awesome. In a club, that's intimate. You can see everybody. You can see the end of the room. I love that. That's my favorite, actually, because you get the energy from the number of people who are there, plus the people in the back can still really hear you."

This weekend, his next living room will be expanded to the base of the Catskill's second largest mountain.






