

# Annual water quality report released

Elevated levels of trihalomethanes found; DPW working to remedy issue

#### BETHLEHEM — In

order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the state and the Environmental Protection Agency prescribe regulations which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. To comply with state regulations, the town Department of Public Works issues an annual report describing the quality of drinking water consumed by town residents.

Last year, DPW conducted tests for more than 80 contaminants. While 27 of those contaminants were detected, only one was found at a higher level than regulations allow. Bethlehem's water exceeded the drinking water standard for total trihalomethanes (TTHMs), which are chemicals, including chloroform, that are created when chlorine used to control microbial contaminants in drinking water react with naturally occurring organic matter in water systems.

According to the 2017 Water Quality Report issued by the town, DPW is working to rectify the problem by performing increased levels of distribution system flushing and designing improvements to one of the water treatment plants that should result in a reduced amount of the TTHMs being formed in the distribution system.

"We are working closely with the EPA and NYS and Albany

County Departments of Health to correct this violation," reads the report. "We are currently designing improvements at the Clapper Road Water Treatment Plant that will allow us to remove more natural organic matter from the water and relocate the point of chlorine addition to the end of the drinking water treatment process. This will result in a significant reduction in the formation of trihalomethanes in the distribution system and get us into compliance with the state regulation."

While some contaminants, such as barium, chloride and copper, were found at lower levels, the only sampling found to exceed state-mandated levels has been trihalomethanes found at the sampling site at Wemple Road. Disinfection by-product (such as TTHMs) samples are taken quarterly at four sampling stations throughout the town, said Commissioner of Public Works George Kansas, and the Wemple Road station is the only one to be found noncompliant.

Through an agreement with nearby Air Products and Chemicals Inc. on River Road in Glenmont, a dead end pipe at that location will be extended. According to Kansas, stagnant water can also result in higher levels of trihalomethanes and the extension should also help to reduce those levels.

The EPA provides the following health effects information on trihalomethanes: "Some people who drink water

containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous systems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer."

Water Quality Reports going back as far as 2008 can be found on the town's website at www.townofbethlehem. org, by clicking on the Water Quality link on the left side of the page. Additional information regarding contaminant levels and the dangers posed by those contaminants, as well as tips for conserving water, can also be found within the reports.

The Bethlehem Water District serves approximately 35,000 people through 11,582 service connections. The system has over 220 miles of water mains and approximately 1,670 hydrants for fire protection. It also includes several water storage tanks with a combined capacity of 15.2 million gallons.

# Secure drug disposal now available at Four Corners Pharmacy

**DELMAR** — The Bethlehem Police Department has announced a partnership with the Four Corners Pharmacy on a new initiative in the fight against the current opioid epidemic.

The Four Corners Pharmacy, located at 360 Delaware Ave. in Delmar, has installed a secure drug disposal box. This box allows people to dispose of unwanted and unneeded prescriptions and controlled substances in a manner that is both anonymous and safe for the environment. It is as simple as walking into the pharmacy and placing the pill bottles in the disposal bin.

"No community is immune to the plague of the opioid epidemic," said Bethlehem Police Commander Adam Hornick, "however, working with our business partners and community, we can work on all angles of this crisis. Giving the community a safe and free method to dispose of prescriptions and controlled substances is yet another avenue to getting these substances off the streets. Prompt and proper disposal reduces the risk of theft or improper use of these substances.

"The efforts of the Four Corners Pharmacy are paramount to the success of community involvement in dealing with this issue that is straining many aspects of our society," he added. "We thank them for their dedication, and resources during this time."

Everyone may participate in the program, which is free and anonymous. While it is not required, individuals disposing of prescriptions in their original containers are encouraged to remove identifying information from the label. Both controlled and non-controlled substances will be accepted.

The pharmacy is open Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m., and on Saturday and Sunday, from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m.

## Man arrested for DWI

**SELKIRK** — Bethlehem Police arrested Thomas Andrew Moore Jr., 30, of Clarksville on Saturday, June 30, on two counts of misdemeanor DWI.

Moore was reportedly responsible for reckless driving on Route 9W, Church Road and Clapper Road.

According to reports, the vehicle was stopped in the area of 217 Clapper Road, after reaching speeds of approximately 55 mph in a 30 mph zone. Police say they not only noticed an odor of alcoholic beverage on Moore's breath but that his eyes were also watery and bloodshot. Following the administration of standard field sobriety tests, Moore was found to have a BAC of 0.15 percent.

Moore admitted to consuming three to four Twisted Teas earlier that evening.

He was placed in custody and charged with two counts of misdemeanor DWI,

in addition to a misdemeanor charge of unlawfully fleeing from a law enforcement official, and the traffic infractions of failing to use designated lane, refusing to take breath screen, and speeding.

His arraignment for all of the charges was scheduled to take place on Tuesday, July 17.

# Woman charged with fraud

**DELMAR** — Bethlehem Police arrested Brianna Thornton, 19, of Corinth on Tuesday, June 26, for felony criminal possession of a forged instrument in the second degree.

Thornton allegedly cashed a fraudulent check at the Hannaford Supermarket in Delmar on Monday, April 16.

According to reports, Thornton was identified through video footage and police conducted an interview at her place of residence.

She was taken into custody and charged with the felony as well as misdemeanor petit larceny.

Thornton was arraigned and released under supervised probation. She was scheduled to appear in court on Tuesday, July 17.

# Man faces multiple charges

GUILDERLAND — Shortly after 3 a.m. on July 11, state troopers stopped Zachary J. Tanzman for traveling almost 40 mph over the speed limit on Western Avenue in the.

Subsequent to standard field sobriety tests, he was arrested for DWI and taken to SP Guilderland where he was determined to have a BAC of 0.16 percent

Tanzman was charged with misdemeanor DWI, resisting arrest, unlawful possession of marijuana, disorderly conduct and aggravated unlicensed operation of a vehicle. He was arraigned in the Town of Guilderland Court and remanded to Albany County jail.

# Man charged with DWI

GUILDERLAND — State troopers reportedly stopped Blake Saunders early Sunday morning for multiple traffic violations on Western Avenue.

During an interview, officers say he displayed signs of intoxication and, subsequent to standard field sobriety tests, was arrested for DWI. He was taken to the state police station in Guilderland, where he was reportedly determined to have a BAC of 0.08 percent. He was charged with misdemeanor DWI and released on tickets made returnable to the Guilderland Town Court at a later date.

Standing in front of dedicated benches and several pieces of equipment on which trail users can now do various types of exercises, McCoy said, "We have to encourage people to live a healthier lifestyle." He commented specifically on the cultural attachment to technology that often hinders youth and adults from getting outside and walking, running or biking, and emphasized the success of the rail trail, which saw more than 200,000 users last year.

The county, in cooperation with the

Town of Bethlehem and the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy, has been looking at ways to improve the trail for more users, the last section of which was paved this summer. Both bike repair stations and sunscreen are available along the trail, and CDTA Cycle! bikes are available to rent on the south end of Pearl Street in Albany.

Now, there are also three workout stations between Bethlehem and Voorheesville, outfitted with simple equipment such as pull-up bars, stepping stairs and a slanted "body curl" station.

MHLC has also implemented a bench program, selling cedar benches that can be dedicated to a loved one for \$500 that will be placed along the rail trail for users

to take a break, relax and enjoy their surroundings. Details can be found on the MHLC website, under the Rail Trail tab.

"The sky is the limit," said County Legislator Joanne Cunningham, who represents central Delmar, where one of the fitness stations is located (behind the Bethlehem Veterans Memorial Park). According to Legislator Lucille McKnight, who represents the district in Albany where the rail trail begins, there has been talk of adding little free libraries along the trail so users can have a seat and read a book on a nice day.

The county legislature is also working to allow trail connections to local businesses, beginning with Bliss Juice Bar in Delmar, which is expected to open later this summer.

"We're working to expand our view of the rail trail from being a corridor through town to being an integral part of town," said Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven. "For example, {we]want maps or signs or apps that showcase the great restaurants and shops near the rail trail so more users visit our businesses. And we want more connections between the rail trail and surrounding streets to make it easier for people to get on to the trail – and also off from it."

Calling the rail trail a "tremendous resource in the community and a great way for people to get out and enjoy nature and connect with other people," MHLC Director Mark King said, "It's a place where people can really enjoy the great environment that we live in."

"This has exceeded every expectation

in terms of use, in terms of increased property values, in terms of economic development," said state Assemblymember Patricia Fahy. Noting that the success of the Albany County rail trail has helped to spur other similar trails around the state, including the Empire State Trail, Fahy said she hopes to see those trails increasingly connected to each other. She said she has already secured grant money to connect the trail to the Hudson River.

"This really is a regional asset," said Legislator Bill Reinhardt of Bethlehem, talking about possibly connecting the rail trail to trails in Rensselaer and Guilderland. Reinhardt also made a special point to thank the MHLC volunteers who work to keep the trail safe and clean.

McCoy commended the county departments of Public Works and Parks and Recreation for the work they have done, thanked Fahy for securing funding that helped build the trail, and thanked the county legislature for supporting the project as well. He thanked VanLuven and the Bethlehem Town Board, as well as ART, the group that is working to bring art to the rail trail.

"We're trying to enhance it for everyone," said McCoy. "People that just want to take a stroll; someone that wants to take their little kids and get them tired so they take a better nap; people that want to ride their bikes or roller blade."

During the 20-minute press conference, trail users went by on foot, pushing strollers, riding bikes and, in one case, on a motorized scooter with giant tires.

# 'Conversion therapy' for minors banned

**ALBANY** — The Albany County Legislature voted on Monday, July 9, to prohibit the use of "conversion therapy," the practice of using modification therapy to attempt to influence an individual's sexual orientation, on minors.

The legislation, Local Law E for 2018, prohibits anyone from offering or providing "conversion therapy" services regardless of whether they are spiritual or psychological—to anyone under the age of 18 in Albany County.

"Passing this Local Law sends an important message to LGBTQ youth in Albany County," said Bryan Clenahan, the Guilderland Democrat who introduced the legislation. "You are valued for who you are, no matter how you identify or who you choose to love, and so-called therapies that teach otherwise are abusive and have no

According to the American Academy of Child and Adolescent Psychiatry, there is "no evidence to support the application of any 'therapeutic intervention' operating under the premise that a specific sexual orientation, gender identity, and/or gender expression is pathological. Furthermore, based on the scientific evidence, the AACAP asserts that such 'conversion therapies' (or other interventions imposed with the intent of promoting a particular sexual orientation and/or gender as a preferred outcome) lack scientific credibility and clinical utility. Additionally, there is evidence that such interventions are harmful.'

The American Psychological Association, the American Psychiatric Association and the American Medical Association have also denounced the practice as ineffective and potentially harmful. Local Law E states that shame,

rejection and psychological abuse are often employed in the attempt to influence the sexual orientation or gender identity of those undergoing "conversion therapy."

All but two legislators voted in favor of the law. Dan Hogan (R-Latham) was

absent and Ralph Signoracci (D-Cohoes) voted against it.

"I applaud the sponsor and all those who voted for it," said Signoracci. "And I'm certainly not in favor of those kinds of practices. But it's something I think should be done on a state level." He said that one could simply cross the county line, adding that he also feels that issues such as paid sick leave should be done statewide and do not fall under the county's purview.

In 2016, New York state banned insurers from covering the practice and prohibited mental health facilities from subjecting minors to it. In a statement, Gov. Andrew Cuomo called "conversion therapy," "a hateful and fundamentally flawed practice that is counter to everything this state stands for... We will not allow the misguided and the intolerant to punish LGBT young people for simply being who they are."

# McCoy elected president of national association

**ALBANY** — County Executive Dan McCoy was elected to serve as president of the County Executives of America (CEA) at its annual conference in Nashville, Tenn., which coincided with the National Association of Counties conference, on Sunday, July 15.

"Dan McCoy becomes president of County Executives of America when our Association and the American people truly need the kind of dedicated service and leadership that he brings to the organization," said County Executives of America Executive Director Michael Griffin. "His vision and energy exemplify what is necessary for the success and sustained growth of this country and will continue our collective endeavor to represent the people in a fair and just effort to bring to America the society it deserves."

"The purpose of the CEA is to help local governments do the people's business and exchange policy ideas that are proven to work," said McCoy, who has served

as first vice president for the last two years. "I am proud of the programs we are implementing in Albany County that are keeping our neighborhoods safe, creating jobs, tackling the opioid crisis and creating better opportunities for those who need it most. As president, I look forward to sharing our successes with and learning from our many distinguished members across the country."

# **County Exec earns praise** for licensing program

ALBANY—Albany County Executive Dan McCoy accepted the National Association of Counties (NACo) 2018 Achievement Award for the "innovative and effective" Probation Driver's Licensing Program during the association's annual conference in Nashville, Tenn. this past

The award was presented in the category of Human Services for helping those serving probation to find employment by enabling them to obtain driver's licenses.

"The Probation Driver's Licensing Program gives those who only want to get back to work a second chance by helping them secure long-term employment," said McCoy. "Albany County was the first municipality in the state to implement an educational program like this and I am so proud that we are being recognized today as a national leader that other localities can emulate."

Residents ordered by the court to serve

terms of probation may find it hard to obtain employment for a variety of reasons, not the least of which is not having a driver's license. The five-hour pre-licensing course is available to probationers of all ages and ethnicities who did not previously have the opportunity to obtain a driver's

"Probationers are far more likely to reoffend and wind up back in the criminal justice system if they do not have adequate job prospects," said Albany County Department of Probation Director William Connors. "Not only does this important program break that cycle of recidivism, but those with a license are often able to find better paying jobs than those without one so I commend County Executive McCoy for spearheading this effort."

Since its implementation, the program has seen 31 individuals take the course. Ten have received a New York State Driver's License and 19 have found employment.

# A shake up in Albany County IDA

New IDA appointments signal shift in approach to economic development in Albany County, says legislative chair

**ALBANY** — County legislators approved a series of appointments to various committees, most of which were uncontested, during their monthly meeting on Monday, July 9.

The replacement of Legislator Gary Domalewicz, D-albany, who chaired the county's Industrial Development Agency for 12 years, however, caused some conversation and was opposed by three members, including Domalewicz himself.

According to Chairman Andrew Joyce, D-Albany, the decision for the change was a desire to approach economic development differently.

"There's been a distinct lack of effort and imagination on economic development and sustainability in Albany County," he said. "I've been hearing the word 'can't' frequently in regards to what's possible."

Four newly appointed members, including Legislator Joe O'Brien, D-Colonie, will be joining three existing members as Domalewicz and outgoing IDA member Gene Messercola leave.

"It's my hope," said Joyce, "that he and the rest of the board, both old and new, can help us rethink the IDA's role."

The Albany County IDA is a not-for-profit public benefit corporation of New York state. Its primary goal is to encourage economic growth and expansion through financial incentives, thus advancing the job opportunities, general prosperity and economic welfare of county residents. This is accomplished by offering businesses financial incentives in the form of tax-exempt and taxable bonds to cover the cost of construction, rehabilitation, and equipping for a wide range of commercial and industrial projects.

IDA-approved projects are exempt from sales and mortgage recording taxes, and real property tax abatement can also be offered. These exemptions enable the IDA to lower the cost of undertaking and financing a project.

"The Albany County IDA needs to be as open and transparent as possible," said

O'Brien. "Other IDAs in the area provide much more information to the public. And not just regarding the activities the board takes. They also share information about the investment opportunities that exist in Albany County. So should we."

"That's the most ridiculous thing I've ever heard," said Domalewicz, calling O'Brien "inexperienced."

"We have everything on our website," Domalewicz said. "Everything. We are more open than any IDA in the state. We have never gotten a letter from the [Authorities Budget Office] in the state comptroller's office; we've always filed everything on time; and we have everything online."

Legislator Alison McLean Lane, D-Colonie, said she would tend to agree. "After Colonie had a bad audit from the ABO," she said, "I took a very close look at our IDA and it has never received a single negative audit from ABO/OSC. It has filed all the state-required reporting and publishes all their documents on the website.

"These IDAs are under significant state scrutiny now because they deal with significant public funds," she said.

According to the Office of the State Comptroller, provisions of the General Municipal Law require each IDA to establish a uniform tax exemption policy with input from affected tax jurisdictions and to provide guidelines for claiming real property tax, mortgage recording tax and sales tax exemptions.

Domalewicz said current leadership in the Legislature wants to spend the \$2.7 million in reserved funds on projects that the state comptroller does not allow, and his replacement is an attempt to sidestep existing obstacles.

"They're thinking they want to spend it on different projects to promote themselves around the county," he said. "Which you can't do. The way the IDA funds are spent are dictated by the ABO."

Domalewicz said that the funds have accumulated over the years through fees on projects the IDA has undertaken but were never spent because of state regulations.

"Every time we went to spend something, I would get an opinion from my counsel and he would contact the ABO to see if we could do it and there were a couple of times that we couldn't do it and had to say no—and that upset a few people. That's what this is all about."

He lamented failed state legislation that would have enabled the IDA to offer loans and grants to business projects, which he said would have made it easier to spend the accrued funds.

"The Albany County IDA needs to work harder and smarter to identify investment opportunities in areas where no local IDA exists," said O'Brien. "We should not be looking to duplicate the effort of any of the seven local IDAs in Albany County. But we should be working very hard to identify investment and development opportunities outside those seven areas. Finally, we need to work with the county executive on moving the county forward on business development."

According to Joyce, the other three members that were appointed represent areas that have no local IDA. The

new members are: Marlene McTigue of Coeymans Hollow, a multi-media consultant for Columbia-Greene Media; Douglas Roether of East Berne, a "semi-retired" electrician who currently serves as an associate director at a private venture capital group and manages and invests in real estate; and Anton Dreslin of Voorheesville, an IT director for the state and vice-president of Bank of America.

"Excuse making, political games have held us back from our full potential for far too long," said Joyce. "It's time for a new approach."

Domalewicz said he was opposing the appointments because there was no labor representation. "On the IDA we've always had a member for labor on that board," he said prior to the vote. "I don't see anybody from labor on this board tonight. Labor will not have a voice at that table for the first time that I can remember."

Joyce responded that he had asked Legislator Doug Bullock, D-Albany, who co-chairs the Labor Task Force, to reach out to the labor community for input regarding the changes the IDA is undergoing. He also noted that IDA member and Legislator William Clay, D-Albany, has a background in labor.

A number of members thanked Domalewicz for his service on the IDA before the body voted to approve the appointments. McLean Lane and Joanne Cunningham (D-Delmar) joined Domalewicz in opposing the appointments.

"I wanted there to be a labor representative on the IDA," said McLean Lane.

Domalewicz still serves as chair of the Albany County Capital Resource Corporation, which works solely with non-profits and has \$1.5 million in reserve funds. "When I first got there they had \$5,000," he said of the CRC and IDA. "I turned it into \$4.2 million."

Records on the IDA website are only available as far back as 2012, but show that the public benefit corporation had \$802,369 in net assets at the end of that year.

The winner of that game will play in the regionals beginning on July 24.





For those who use the Albany County Helderberg Hudson Rail Trail, it has become another means by which to live a healthier lifestyle. To be a 46er

(Actually, there are only 42 above the storied 4,000foot threshold. The other four's true stature was discovered when surveying equipment became more sophisticated. But the 46ers are steeped in tradition, and you can almost hear the old timers: "If I had to go up Cooch, that young fella has to, too." Cooch, formally known as Couchsachraga, is the most remote, the muddiest and one of the most despised tree-lined peaks of the 46 and perhaps the entire world.)

There is a party planned for Friday, Aug. 3 through Sunday, Aug. 5 to commemorate those three groundbreaking gentlemen and to celebrate the nearly 11,000 who survived the thick, sticky mud, the miles of unmarked trails, the mud, the black flies, the mud, the unpredictable, erratic weather, the mud, the long, long days, the mud, some pretty hairy rock scrambles and otherwise rugged terrain — and the mud.

It can get pretty sloppy, but as any conscientious hiker worth his boots will say – "you go through it not around it." Going around it will just make the bog bigger, the trails wider and accelerate erosion.

So, you get a good pair of boots and go through it. The reasons people go through it, though, are as varied as the trails.

"We all have different reasons for it, and people who don't hike can appreciate it, but they don't really understand it," said Blake Cortright, who interviewed dozens of hikers for "The 46ers," a documentary he fimed

For some it's a healing thing. Nature does wonders to mend a broken heart, or a broken life, and sitting on top of Gothics eating a PB&J has a way of putting things in perspective. For others, it's more spiritual. Others may just like walking in the woods.

For others, No. 46 might represent a checkmark on a bucket list. Or a healthy activity to share with friends or family or as a way to meet new people. Or maybe just the quest for a decent selfie to post on social media. And there are those with motivation driven by ego and "peakbagging.

Or, maybe, simply to satisfy a sense of adventure. "Because they were there" is trite, but it very well could, and probably does, apply to some of the nearly 11,000

Of course, there are the views. Some are just

spectacular, and words cannot do them justice. But it can't be just that either. After walking hours and hours over miles and miles, some summits offer nothing more than a gold and brown sign tacked onto a tree designating the spot as somehow more special than the spot before.

#### The 46ers

Outside of a one-on-one chat with a 46er, why someone does all 46 is a trivial discussion. What the 46ers stand for is not.

"The club is dedicated to protection of the Adirondack environment, to education in Adirondack wilderness ethics, and to participation in work projects in cooperation with the state Department of Environmental Conservation to meet these objectives," according to its mission statement.

The Adirondack Park encompass six-million acres. It is the largest publically protected park in the lower 48 states by a long shot. It is bigger than Yellowstone, The Everglades and Grand Canyon National Park combined. But it's the high peaks that are the big draw and the core of those — Marcy and the Great Range — are the biggest draw of all.

Whatever the reasons, more people are flocking to the high peaks than ever before. And more people are doing all 46. In 2017, 735 were admitted into the 46ers club, breaking the previous record set in 2016.

Unfortunately, of the thousands and thousands who don't have any intention of completing all 46 but still hike the Adirondacks, there are some who just don't know how to treat what is a national treasure right in our backyards.

Leave No Trace — a responsible hiker's mantra — by an abundance of ego and/or lack of anything remotely civil, is routinely ignored by many.

Conservation efforts, like whether to allow access to the 20,758-acre Boreas Pond Tract with public roads, are being debated rather than classified preserved.

The 46ers are growing at a time when stewardship is needed most.

But, as the saying goes, "It's easier to become a 46er than to be one.'

Trail maintenance, especially the unmarked trails that are cared for by the DEC, lean-to construction, repair and maintenance, trailhead stewards to inform people of what they are getting into and to answer questions and general advocacy and education are all part of being a 46er. Countless hours are volunteered by members for the lofty goal of preserving the Adirondack experience.







tir-fry is a dish many people, adults and kids alike, seem to love. That popularity is perhaps because no two stir-fry dishes ever seem to be the same or because stir-fry dishes encourage cooks to take chances with ingredients.

Those who want to experiment with a tried and true stir-fry success might want to try Michelle Dudash's recipe for "Orange Peel Beef & Broccoli Stir-Fry With Brown Rice" from her book, "Clean Eating for Busy Families" (Fair Winds Press).

# Orange Peel Beef & Broccoli Stir-Fry with Brown Rice

#### Ingredients — Serves 4

#### For Sauce:

- 2 tablespoons reduced sodium soy sauce
- 1 tablespoon plus 2 teaspoons rice vinegar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- 2 teaspoons honey
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 1/4 teaspoon Chinese 5-spice powder (or 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon and 1/8 teaspoon each ground fennel and cloves)
- 1 tablespoon dark sesame oil

#### For Stir-Fry:

- 51/2 cups bite-size broccoli florets
- tablespoon minced garlic
- 1 tablespoon minced ginger (or 1/2 teaspoon ground ginger)
- 1/8 teaspoon salt
- pound flank or flat iron steak, or top sirloin, thinly sliced against the grain in 11/2-inch pieces
- 1 tablespoon expeller-pressed grapeseed or canola oil
- orange, 2 teaspoons grated zest, inner segments sliced

- 2 teaspoons sesame seeds
- 3 cups cooked brown rice

#### **Directions**

To make the sauce: Stir together all of the sauce ingredients in a small bowl and set aside.

To make the stir-fry: Heat a large frying pan or wok over high heat, add 1 cup of water and bring to a boil. Add broccoli, reduce heat to a low boil and cover with a lid or piece of foil, leaving a gap for steam to escape. Steam for 5 minutes until almost fork-tender. Move broccoli to a plate, reserving cooking water in another container.

In a medium bowl, sprinkle garlic, ginger and salt evenly over the beef. Scrape the pan clean, place it on high heat and add the oil. When the oil is shimmering, add the beef in an even layer and cook for 2 minutes undisturbed until brown. Toss with a wooden spoon to break up the pieces, reducing heat to medium-high as needed. Add orange zest and sesame seeds and cook until beef is done, another 2 minutes. Swirl in the sauce, add broccoli and stir-fry to reheat. Add a splash of reserved broccoli water if mixture seems too dry. Serve hot and garnish with orange segments.

# Breathe easy

Clean indoor air can help reduce asthma attacks

# **Allergens**

Allergens such as mold, dust mites, pet dander and fur, and waste from insects or rodents thrive in many homes. Ensuring indoor air quality is high can cut back on the amount of allergens in the air. People with asthma can invest in an air purifier and vacuum regularly, being sure to use a HEPA-equipped appliance. Routinely replacing HVAC system filters can help prevent allergens from blowing around the house. Also, frequent maintenance of HVAC systems will ensure they are operating safely and not contributing to poor indoor air quality.

Mold can be mitigated by reducing moisture in a home. Moist environments

in the kitchen and bathroom may promote mold growth. Ventilation is key to keep mold at bay.

## **Tobacco smoke**

Thirdhand smoke, or THS, may be unfamiliar to many people. A 2011 report published in Environmental Health Perspectives says THS is an invisible combination of gases and particles that can cling to clothing, cushions, carpeting, and other materials long after secondhand smoke has cleared from a room. Studies have indicated that residual nicotine levels can be found in house dust where people smoke or once smoked. Studies have indicated that smoke compounds can adsorb onto surfaces and then desorb back into air over time.

Keeping tobacco smoke out of a home can improve indoor air quality and personal health.

#### **VOCs**

Volatile organic compounds, or VOCs, are gases released from commonly used products. These can include paints and varnishes, cleaning supplies, air fresheners, new furniture, and new carpet. People with asthma may find that VOCs can trigger attacks. Airing out items, reducing usage of products that are heavily scented and choosing low- or no-VOC products can help. Making cleaning products from baking soda, vinegar and liquid oil soap also can keep indoor air quality high.

Homeowners who plan to renovate their homes can consider using the appropriate specifications for HVAC systems to promote good indoor air, as well as address any other potential problems that may be compromising indoor air quality.

# Florence And The Machine's 'High As Hope'

'High as Hope' takes Florence and the Machine back to its classic sound

lorence and the Machine released its newest album "High as Hope" on June 29 and it feels like a blast from the past, still holding that classic Florence and the Machine sound known and loved by fans. This fourth studio album by the them was released by Republic Records and Virgin EMI Records. Being a big Florence and the Machine fan, like many others, I waited to see what this new album would hold with a slightly skeptical eye. Not having been as impressed with its 2015 album "How Big, How Blue, How Beautiful" as much as I would have hoped, I wasn't sure how the new album would sound, but to my delight it didn't disappoint in the slightest.

The ten song album, which was produced by Welch herself along with Emile Haynie, had a very minimalistic feel to it that grounded it. The album started with the song, "June" which has these lines that say, "And you're so high, you're so high, you had to be an angel/ And I'm so high, I'm so high, I can see an angel" which immediately tells the listener what this album is about. It's about struggle, it's about belief or lack thereof, it's about love, it's about drugs. The song then moves on to one of its singles, "Hunger," which focuses on all these points. It talks about Welch's struggle with an eating disorder and has the lines saying, "We all have a hunger" over and over, showing that every person has some struggle in their life. For her, it was an eating disorder but it could it be something different for someone else.

Her voice leaves the listener with this aching feeling of knowing that's what pain suffered in solitude feels like. It's a pain we all know but seldom talk about.

I could talk about each song in this much detail but then you would be left with a very long article so I'll just talk about two more songs. The first song is "Big God" which was the other single off of the album and has the iconic lines, "You need a big god/Big enough to hold your love/

You need a big god/ Big enough to fill you up." This song really pulls into this minimal feeling of the album, having the bass notes of a piano following it for half of the song before the rest of the ensemble comes in. But even this ensemble is a minimal one. This song, just like the others, has this continued theme of struggle and belief or lack thereof.

The other song which needs to given some proper attention is "No Choir" which is the last song on the album. It starts by saying, "And it's hard to write about being happy/ 'Cause the older I get/ I find that happiness is an extremely uneventful subject/ And there will be no grand choirs to sing/ No chorus will come in/ About two people sitting doing nothing," which really stuck out to me as a listener. The song has this very melancholy emptiness to it which I believe is this acceptance that the whole album rounds back on. It's an understanding that happiness doesn't feel as great as sadness feels awful. That struggle, belief or lack thereof, love, drugs they all make an impact on us and it's what we do with that impact that matters.

Overall, I thought this was the best album Florence and the Machine has had since Between Two Lungs. It manages to keep an authentic Florence and the Machine sound with a more grown up set of topics. And it does this well, keeping itself well rounded between upbeat and mellow songs. The minimalist tracks throughout builds on this authenticity of the lyrics. It doesn't need to be big and flashy to get it's point across. In fact, being flashy would most likely only distract the listener from the main messages. # Harsh Armadillo's 'Bite'

'Bite,' the first in a two-part EP, was recorded at Iron Wax Studios with Alan Evans

he first 'Bite' sinks raw into your gums, perking your ears with sound. Harsh Armadillo's latest four-track EP release is uninviting to the easylistener. Regardless, you delve in for seconds and it becomes clear- there is no turning back. It's "quick, punchy and powerful," said vocalist Andrea Belaidi.

Bite hooks your lip and reels you deep into the 24-minute storyline of Harsh Armadillo on the rise.

Since their inception in 2013, the New Hampshirebased ensemble is out for blood. Harsh Armadillo debuted their first full-length album Thayer It Is in 2014 and quickly began to draw crowds of 700 or more. Harsh Armadillo was named New England Music Awards' Best Band in NH (2017) and has shared the stage with bands like The Nth Power, Kung Fu, Twiddle, After Funk and Kat Wright.

The seven-piece is equipped with keyboards, synth and organs, saxophone, trumpet, guitars and drums making their soundscape endless. R&B, funk and soul roots create a whirlwind of driving dance grooves that are paired with slow feel-good vocals and melodic leads throughout the

Bite was recorded at Iron Wax Studio in Erving, Mass. with Alan Evans of Soulive. "Working in Alan's studio was like getting catapulted through a black hole and emerging with no pants or conception of time," siad Max Harris (saxophone, vocals). Harsh Armadillo looks up to artists like Evans which made the four day recording endeavor energetic and natural for the band. "It was just wild seeing how Alan did his thing," said bassist Thomas

"The EP all works together in sequence. These songs are comprised of bits and pieces that make it different," said Max. The band recorded the album together – all in one room, whereas it is typical for bands to record each part layered independently. "The intention was for it to be a cohesive unit. There's something about proximity," that makes it all flow, said Max. "We learned that it was okay to have bleed into the drum parts."

"Gravy" starts the EP off smooth, building in volume, before the drums and horns crash in unison. The groove is sharp and interrupts with syncopated off-the-beat phrases. Male and female vocals, funky guitar licks and changing drum and bass grooves drag your head from left to right with your feet. The feel livens up in the bridge with syncopated snare, contrasting horn pads and rolling bass fills. Soon you timehop, fired-up for the hot saxophone solo in "Two Wishes and a Truth." When playing these songs "we want someone like 'Sput' from Ghost Note (one of our idols) to turn around and say: What was that?," added Forbes.

The new songs are all about pushing the envelope.

Album art

Spoken-word rap in "Animal" contrasted by Dmitrys' synth leads expand your mind. When the band digs through the bridge they become unstoppable, in full break dancing force. Songs like "Live Action" are amped up and refreshing from the laid back push-and-pull of the rhythm section. It drives hard, so you better hang on.

Guitarist Camden Riley felt that the EP is "one tiny seed planted; It is a landmark of how we are as a unit [at this moment in time]." According to the band's press release, "The EP is about biting hard into life and being the most unapologetic version of yourself possible. A lot of the songs have this swaggy feel that everyone's frothing over these days. I think Questlove calls it drunk drums. Either way it's an addiction. It takes a team to get this

Harsh Armadillo is cueing up for the second EP release of the series within the next few weeks. Evolving with the changing times of the music industry Max Harris felt "You can't put an album out every two years and still be relevant." Harsh Armadillo's second release "Blame Bad Habits" was exactly that - two years in the making, which became boring by the time it was ready to drop. Thus, the ensemble is 'keeping it loose' as they move forward not only as a band, but moreover as a tight-knit collaboration

For those wondering about the 'moldy basement' it's Dmitrys', the bands keyboard player. "It [actually] is moldy," added Dan [the band laughs]. To this day, Harsh Armadillo continues to practice in the same stinky rehearsal space where they were founded. "That's where the fun comes in." It allows Harsh Armadillo to sound raw, capturing a live feel effortlessly on Bite. "An idea sparks the song...and then we start arguing in the most exciting sense of the word. The idea is growth – to push the bar one-hundred percent."

"Gravy" is one thick serving of horns, backed by '2' and '4' on the snare. It cuts right to the groove and sucks you into the song. Tight melodic hits occur when you least expect it and the drums continue to push and pull you in time. Andrea's smooth vocals, add the right amount of soul, half way through the track.

The EP would not be complete without "Live Action." As their press release describes, "It tracks the speed of the missile and shoots just enough in front of it to hit it." With lightning speed it is too energetic to soak up the funk from each instrument. Guitars take the spotlight early on with hot, up-beat rhythm and a blazing guitar solo within the first minute of listening. It is everchanging. "Live Action," is all Harsh's best ideas morphed into one; from funk to a jam band with heavy synth-lead, to soulful vocals and back around again.

# To be a 46er

#### The movie

For Cortright, love for the Adirondacks started in 2012 with a father and son hike up Marcy, the state's tallest mountain at 5,343 feet above sea level. For good measure, they tacked on Phelps and Tabletop too.

Like so many, the stunning view from the top captured the imagination of the then Shaker High School student and aspiring filmmaker who two years prior, while in the 10th grade, produced a documentary about the first Boy Scout encampment in the U.S.

"I've never seen it done justice on film. I've seen incredible photographs but never film or video," he said during an interview. "And then I began wondering why people do all 46 of these because we were pretty worn out after three. So it all started with being inspired by how beautiful it is and a question: What draws people to the Adirondack High Peaks and then what changes them from casual day hikers to a 46er? This kind of willingness to go through these crazy things."

He said he interviewed one woman who would leave Ontario on Friday, drive eight hours and sleep in her car or stay with friends, hike all weekend and drive back Sunday night.

"She had been doing it for a year and a half and she doesn't know why she does it.



She said she loves it there and 'it feels like home," he said. "One way to describe the film is a love story between the mountains and the people who climb them."

The film features stunning videography and interviews with long time advocates, long time hikers and includes footage of the 46er's matriarch Grace Hudowalski, who became 46er No. 9 in 1937.

"Leaving the superb job Blake did with filming aside, it was more substance than style," said John Sasso, a long time 46er who does hours of volunteer work with the group. "That is, I think many of us were concerned that the 46ers film would come off as something flashy, that would hype

up the 46ers and make it testosteronedriven with little if any content in regards to what the organization and its founders really stood for and promoted — not just tackling such a challenge, but embracing the environment and gaining a sense of stewardship of it."

"The 46ers" is a documentary that took 100 hours of footage, a number of interviews and a shoe-string budget. It took Cortright and company two years to shoot and another year to write and edit.

Cortright pitched the idea to Dan Swinton, who headed up production at Mountain Lake PBS in Plattsburgh, and he became the executive producer. PBS has

since aired the documentary on 26 stations in 15 states.

In 2015, the film started showing in theaters "and we were selling out and people were calling the theaters and asking for extra screenings or were trying to get a hold of the film. We didn't realize what we had until all that started.'

He wanted to make two points: We are all stewards of the mountains, and climbing the high peaks is not a typical walk in the park.

One New York City couple he featured were travelling around the world and decided to do some hiking. The weather changed, the man got hypothermia and

"I wanted to bring some gravity to it. it's one thing to hear 'cotton kills' but it's another to hear a true story about it. This is not the place to wear jeans and a hoodie,"

He does acknowledge the increased number of people hiking the high peaks, and understands his film may contribute to that. But, he would like people to a come away with sense of stewardship and respect for the mountains too.

What I hope, what will be awesome, is that people will see the reverence the 46ers have historically, and continue to hold, for the mountains and the great lengths and the decades of effort that have gone into stewarding them," he said. "So in a sense it might increase the number of people that are coming, but people who do come because they saw the 46ers film, will have an understanding or even a love for the mountains and the care that goes into it."


