Have wheels, can't travel

Young family needs help finding transportation for disabled daughter

While Karen Gill, 42, of Watervliet was trying to place her 10-year-old daughter, Charlotte, into their Ford Edge two weeks ago, Karen suddenly injured her back. 

Monolith Solar moving forward

Company's first status updates in over a month

BETHLEHEM — Monolith Solar owner Steve Erby confirmed that the company has signed with an investor to begin a “recurring revenue stream in the form of financing” after appearing at the town’s Industrial Development Agency board meeting on Friday, Feb. 22., although exact details and the investor’s name were not disclosed at the time.

“We’re anxious to go to the next level and show the world what we can do with renewable energy, really reducing our burden on fossil fuels and hopefully convince the naysayers to open their minds a bit to renewable power,” he said.

He also confirmed that Monolith Solar is still operational.

Erby also said that since the solar installation company had furloughed close to 70 workers in September 2018, it has begun rehiring some of them back, although he

noted that “a lot of them found jobs already so we’ve been trying to call people back.”

However, he said he understood the situation since such furloughed workers needed employment in the meantime, which then prevented them from returning to Monolith Solar.

He also confirmed that Monolith Solar has been working with the Glenmont Job Corps Center and has offered a few jobs through that program.

“Pioneer Bank has been working diligently with us and with consultants that were hired by KeyBank,” he said but did not elaborate further. “Everyone has been working with us very diligently to get through this process and come out the other side even better and stronger than we were before.”

Regarding the incomplete \$4.9 million Slingerlands headquarters building at the Vista Technology Park, it remains unclear, given Monolith Solar’s new updates, when it intends to resume construction since

it was not discussed much during the IDA meeting. Construction had ceased back in September 2018, the same time as when Monolith Solar furloughed many of its employees.

The building’s site plan, which was issued in March 2015, had expired on Thursday, Dec. 13 after receiving two 90-day extensions.

The building permits recently expired on Thursday, Jan. 31 too, so if Monolith Solar intends to restart construction, it has to apply again to the Bethlehem Planning Board for re-approval of both documents.

“I’m going to fight to keep the building and see what we can do ... but as you all know, we have to work with the banks and creditors right now,” Erby said before the IDA board.

However, he maintained his optimism by saying, “I think we’re going to be tenfold better coming out of this and I’m really proud of my team and our collaboration with KeyBank and Pioneer. We’ve been hard at work, sleepless nights, keeping the momentum going forward but it’s a lot of fun.”

BETHLEHEM — The Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post 1040 of the American Legion will hold its 40th annual Community Awards ceremony to honor local firefighters, police and first responders on Monday,

March 4 at 7 p.m. in its building on 16 West Poplar Dr. in Delmar.

Each volunteer fire department, volunteer ambulance service and the Bethlehem Police Department had to choose one of their own employees they would like to recognize as “Man or Woman of the Year” prior to the event and submit their name and a brief statement of why they feel qualified for the recognition.

While the event is free and open to the public, Post 1040 Commander Lyle Maddock said that it has invited notable figures like Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven, the Town Board members, the town’s judges, Albany County Executive Daniel P. McCoy and even Sen. Neil Breslin.

Maddock added that although the list of winners has not been finalized as of the week of Feb. 17, he said that the event is important because “they’re our heroes. They’re everyday heroes and we sometimes take them for granted for all the hard work they do for the community. We’re basically honoring them and recognizing them, and that’s a very special thing.”

Bee there for the BOU Spelling Bee

BETHLEHEM — Bethlehem Opportunities Unlimited is set to hold its seventh annual community spelling bee on Tuesday, March 5 at 6:30 p.m. at the Bethlehem Central High School cafeteria, with a snow date of Monday, March 11 at 6:30 p.m.

BOU is a not-for-profit organization that seeks to educate local youth about drug and alcohol abuse prevention as well as other similar risky behavior, all while reaching out to students, parents, and the overall community.

This being its biggest fundraising event of the year, around 20 teams — or “swarms” — of three to five members will be able to compete to be the best spellers in town. In the past, many residents, school teachers, small businesses and community groups have participated in the

fun. Team members must be aged 13 and older, and make a contribution of \$120 to qualify. They are encouraged to dress up in quirky costumes and come up with an appropriate team name too. Teams can buy “lifelines” for \$10 each which give them the chance to either use a dictionary or phone a friend for just 30 seconds during the competition if they get stumped on a certain word for instance.

Saying that last year’s event raised around \$7,000, BOU President Cindy Ferrari recalled teams who went for the overall bee-theme, like the Hip Bees, a few Eagle Elementary School teachers and staff who dressed in tie dye; BeeWitched, a group from BC Teachers Association who sported witch hats and wands; and the Spelling Beeyonces, who all came from Slingerlands Elementary and wore veils. “No one spells alone,”

Ferrari said. “And people get very creative with their outfits and themes. The crowds have been getting bigger in recent years and we generally see a few hundred people attend.”

As of Friday, Feb. 22, Ferrari confirmed that nine teams have signed up so far for this year. Registration and lifeline forms are available on the

BOU website at www.bethlehemschools.org/community/bou.

There will also be a silent auction and numerous raffle baskets to further keep the public engaged that night, with chances to win gift cards, tea, honey, mugs, gift certificates, Proctors tickets and Spotlight News subscriptions. The overall event is free and open to

the public.

Ferrari said that this year all proceeds will be used to give out community-related grants and provide free educational BOU programming. Regarding the former, one can go on BOU’s website to learn more and apply for one. For the latter, such programming happen all year round and mainly are

free presentations to the public about topics like cybersafety, mental health, drug and alcohol abuse, addiction, and preparing young students for college.

Saying that the Spelling Bee and its fundraising help BOU to stay connected with the community, Ferrari said that the response from residents through the years “has been amazing and very heartwarming. We really appreciate them.” She also gave a shout out to the event’s numerous sponsors like Bethlehem Town Family Dental and Kinderhook Bank, adding that some have even paid \$120 to sponsor a word that is related to their specific profession or industry.

Overall, Ferrari concluded that this annual event “is a nice reflection on the community and I want to thank you all for your continued involvement and being part of a positive thing in our town.”

Endorsed candidate names start rolling out

Gearing up for the year's election earlier than usual

BETHLEHEM —The town's Democratic and Republican Committees have begun announcing their endorsed candidates for the year's upcoming election, although some names have yet to be finalized.

Town Board

On the Democratic side, Joyce Becker and Dan Coffey are each seeking re-election, having served since 2016 and 2018 respectively.

Becker has almost three decades of experience heading the town's Senior Services Department.

Coffey is a trial attorney at Bowitch & Coffey,

an Albany law firm he co-founded in June 2012, with decades-spanning experience in government too.

Supervisor on the Democratic side, confirmed he's seeking re-election, having first assumed the position in January 2018.

While he had been a Town Board member prior from 2016 to 2018, he has an extensive background in urban and environmental policy, biology, working with government and non-profit organizations, and budget maintenance.

the position's term is quite short — just two years — it takes time to continue getting major work done and seeing them through.

He offered the example of the town's comprehensive plan which connects with issues like development, forest and farm protection, and infrastructure improvements.

"I've only gotten started and we have so much work to do," he wrote, adding that Bethlehem is in great shape.

He recognized all the town's employees, local businesses and services that provide for the people too.

"I want the Town to continue delivering top notch services in a fiscally responsible manner," he wrote, looking ahead.

"I want to establish a Farms and Forests Fund to help give landowners options other than selling to developers; support new and existing businesses; build more trails for walking and biking; expand our parks; and create a new vision for Bethlehem's future with clear actions we can take to better manage development."

Town Highway Superintendent

Service is one motivation behind the Democratic candidate, Marc Dorsey, who is running for office for the first time this year.

Having lived in Bethlehem for over 48 years, he has a long background in construction and carpentry, and has worked as a local police officer, a volunteer firefighter at the Delmar

Fire Department, and for seven years now, has served in the army where he was a sniper team leader that was deployed in Afghanistan.

"I've served the state of New York, I've served my country, and this year, I felt that it was an opportunity now to serve in a role in the Town of Bethlehem in the sense of maybe changing the mindset of the workers by leadership and to serve at the pleasure of the Town Supervisor," Dorsey said.

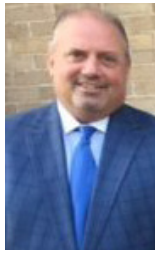
"From what I've learned in the military on how to lead by example, hopefully that can affect a better culture here and get better efficient workers and guys that believe in the town and in what they're doing is making a difference."

Incumbent Highway Superintendent John "Tiger" Anastasi, on the GOP side, is seeking re-election, having served since January 2018.

Raised and having lived most of his life in Delmar, he is a building contractor and developer who had majored in Construction Technology at Hudson Valley Community College.

He had also spent many years working for the

Bethlehem Pop Warner Organization where he became president, before retiring to earn a spot on the board of directors at the Capital District Pop Warner Organization.

Anastasi wrote in an email to Spotlight News that his team has been already successful "with the connectivity of

sidewalks throughout the town, improvements to fields that our children play on, improvements to our deteriorated storm water systems, and the updating of our highway fleet, which has been seriously neglected in the past, yet is much needed to continue to provide the level of services that our taxpayers deserve; I would like to continue on the aggressive road we have paved in the past twelve months."

Expressing pride in working long hours with his dedicated crew, he also wrote, "Why change something that works!"

Closing Comments

Joanne Cunningham, Chair of the Bethlehem Democratic Committee, said her side's candidates are experienced leaders with a vision for the town.

"The current leadership under VanLoven and the Democratic Town Board members are still looking to maintain using resources effectively, enhance our local business climate and focus on preserving the town's character. That's a great recipe and why we should stay the course."

"I think the big issues overall are the continually perceived overdevelopment, preservation of open space, and town future planning," she said.

Melissa Kermani, the GOP Chair, wrote in an email to Spotlight News that it's important to have "varying perspectives" on issues which could lead to seeking better policies and directions for the town.

"The Democratic Party has been in almost full control for the past 15 years and the longtime residents have watched in disbelief at some of the changes that seem so contrary to the structure and values that made Bethlehem the town it is."

She similarly brought up how issues like overdevelopment, the comprehensive plan update and the town's character's preservation are key.

When asked how she felt about the town's so-called one-party rule so far under the Democrats, she wrote, "The Progressive policies cannot make up the majority of the strategies going forward. We need to include all residents of this town, and having a more balanced government will help achieve this goal."

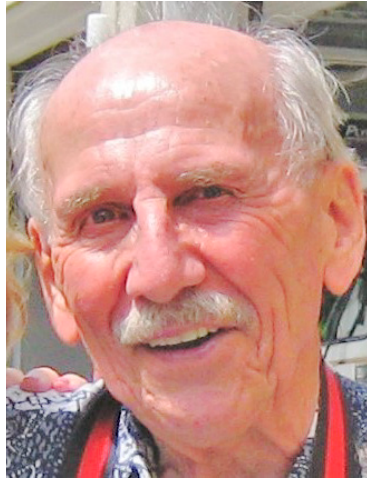

The ties that bind

We live in divisive times when the ties that bind all of us Americans seem to have unraveled. Just when we have an apparent stronghold on what we believe define the principals in which the Founding Fathers had when America was conceived, we now stop short of looking beyond Republican Red or Democrat Blue in simple conversations between neighbors.

Headlines of news stories over the past few years paint a picture not at all like the one Emanuel Leutze had envisioned. Instead of Washington Crossing the Delaware, people chuckle over the prospect of the state of Montana being sold to Canada. The one million Americans who call Big Sky Country would surpass the more than 180 who crossed the northern border in 2017 to renounce their citizenship and escape to the Great White

North. Silly news items that belong more on the satirical Daily News show than the *Washington Post*, but there they read. And, if not to make readers pause and laugh at such improbabilities, the preposterous has been observed more frequently as the divide between conservative and liberal grows ever wider.

Many of us are multi-generational Americans. We were born here. Our parents were born here. The dream of crossing over the ocean to find prosperity in America is often a parody. We never knew of a land with streets paved with gold. We went to school and begrudgingly learned of George Washington chopping down a cherry tree and Abraham Lincoln reading by candlelight in a log cabin. But, growing up in America means learning to tear down our heroes. Washington may never have told a lie, but that story was. And, that poem

written around the events of 1492 we've since learned could have been reserved for the Vikings who discovered America nearly 500 years before Christopher Columbus sailed the ocean blue. In 50 years, we've gone from a future in plastics to our oceans choked by plastics. Our faith in science and perceived progress in big corporations has left us jaded. For every Lee Iacocca pulling a company out from the dark is a Jeff Bezos vilified for not paying taxes. And, as loudly as we may voice our displeasure, we still pay towards our Amazon Prime accounts because prices for groceries seem to grow by the week.

Many of us have retreated back into the recesses of our private lives, retreating back to the safety of our families and holding on to the few touchstones that keep us sane despite the news and events surrounding us today. It's as if we

build ourselves a wall to prevent everything else from coming in. It only cultivates a cynical view of the world, and that's not the kind of world that helped build this country out of dark times. It was not the dream our ancestors envisioned for us.

In 2017, more than 700,000 people became American citizens. People who purposely stake claim to a life best served here than where they came from. One of the thousands more to do the same this year is here in our own office. The effort to become a citizen was visible to us. The need to complete paperwork, the studying of our history and our government structure, was in front of our eyes. The irony, too, that we would likely fail that upcoming test if it were presented before us was not lost.

The stories of our streets paved in anything other than asphalt have stopped long ago, but there is a piece of this present-day storyline that can be passed on to Americans today. Lost in our colloquialism is the propensity to call our home 'merica. It suggests an erosion, if not in just the name itself, then of the values in which we once took pride. Instead of laboring so hard towards defining ourselves as individuals we should recognize the concept that ties us all together. The one concept those 700,000 people work diligently towards grasping themselves. The idea that we are all Americans. The idea that we all reside within a country, called by its full name, is the United States of America. When we let go of that strand, it all becomes untied.

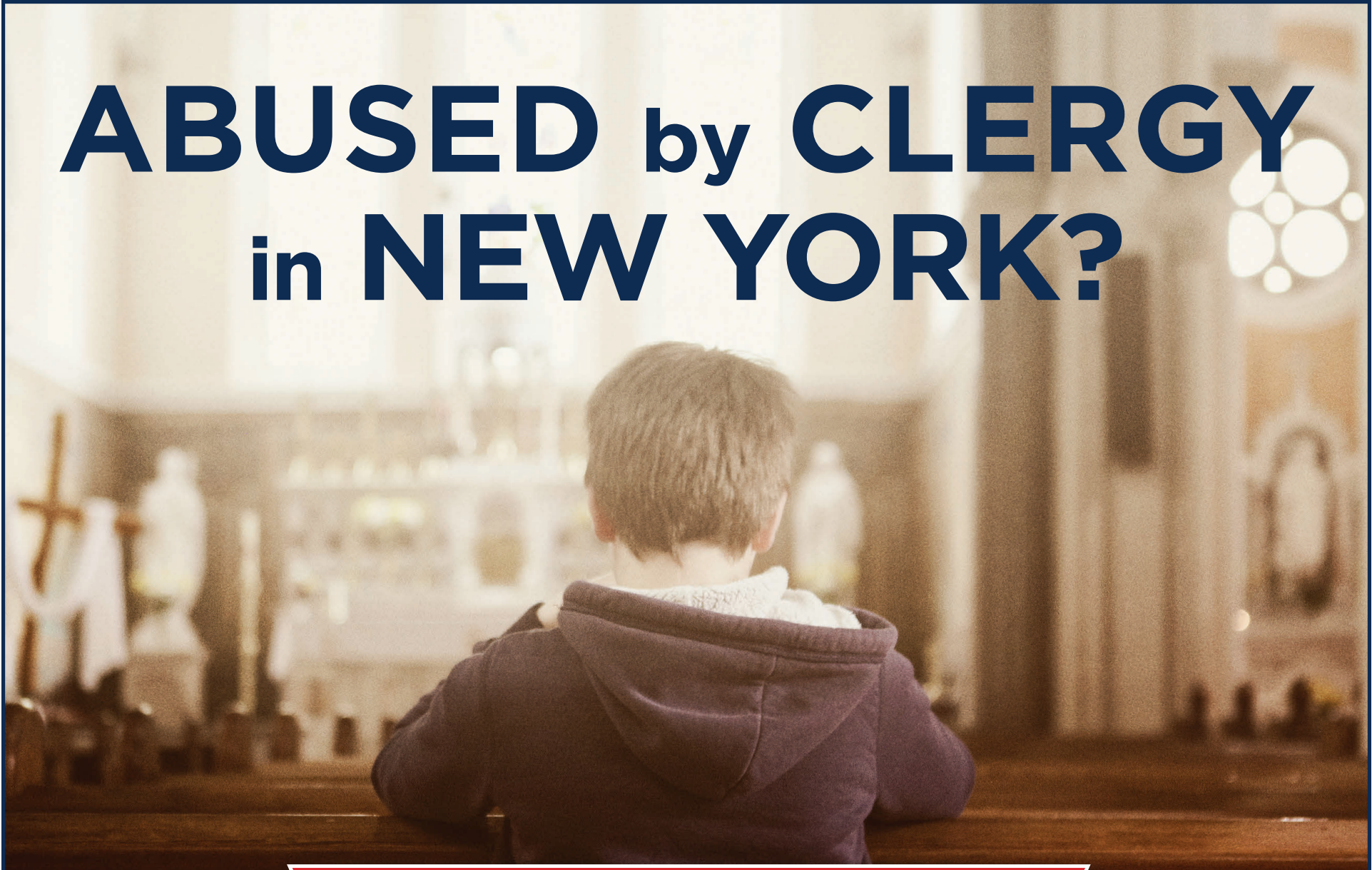

From page 1 ... Have wheels, can't travel

This led Karen to come up with the idea of starting up a GoFundMe page with a goal of \$12,000 called "Help Charli Get New Wheels" at www.gofundme.com/help-charli-get-her-chariot where she would use the funds to purchase a wheelchair-accessible vehicle to better facilitate Charli's everyday transport. While the accident and GoFundMe page happened recently, they stemmed from a decade-long history of health-related hardships.

Charli had suffered a severe stroke a few days before being born but the doctors only found out when she was 8 days old. By the time Charli was 6 months old, she had developed a rare form of epilepsy called infantile spasms or West syndrome, and had around 500 seizures a day. "I was in total shock since I thought I had a very normal pregnancy, and I don't think I'd absorbed what was told to me by the doctors then," Karen recalled. "When Charli was born, she was kind of fine but it felt bizarre to know

afterwards that she did have a stroke."

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, West syndrome is "characterized by a specific type of seizure [infantile spasms] seen in infancy and childhood" where the individual's body would abruptly bend forward while their limbs get stiff — they often occur after the individual wakes up or was just fed, and can also be comprised "of up to 100 spasms at a time." The department states that surgically removing brain lesions or giving some medications which can help alleviate or stop seizures like corticoids, vigabatrin and antiepileptic drugs, can treat improve the individual's condition.

Karen said that Charli tried nine different kinds of medication and required 30 surgeries since birth, including traveling to the Detroit Children's Hospital in Michigan with her then-husband when Charli was almost 2 years old to remove the left half of her

brain which did stop the seizures, and getting a VP shunt to drain spinal fluid from a skull cavity.

Karen said that the stroke had originally caused the middle of Charli's brain's left hemisphere to never develop, which had contained the auditory dorsal stream, meaning Charli should have lost the ability of speech control; the stroke had also caused parts of the left hemisphere to move to the right hemisphere which then picked up some of it. This has caused Charli to unusually still develop speech and start puberty early within the past year alone, the latter causing her aforementioned growth spurts.

"In the last six months, it's gone from me being able to lift her to not being able to do so much anymore," Karen said. "It's difficult for me to try to lift and transfer her, which is now very unsafe." She added that Charli is now 4 feet 7 inches tall, weighs 117 pounds and has remained seizure-free since 2010 so far, and uses a wheelchair, connecting this to why she needs money to afford an accommodating vehicle like a van, where Karen

would not need to dismount Charli from her wheelchair, but rather just wheel her into the vehicle safely.

Charli is now in fifth grade in a special needs program with around eight other children at the Red Mill Elementary School in East Greenbush and she also has physical therapy.

Karen said that "math and music seem to be her strongest suits, and she has music therapy too. She's had musicality since an extremely early age. Music is very motivating for her and they use it a lot at the school." When asked if Charli can play any instruments, Karen answered in the negative although she noted that

Charli does enjoy trying to play the drums and maracas because "she likes to shake things. She does, however, has weakness on her right side so it's difficult to play using both hands. She's not completely paralyzed on her right side and she has no use of her upper right hand area."

Looking ahead into what Charli's education could be like in the future, Karen said, "I don't know, that's a very scary unknown for me right now. But she will be in sixth grade next year and go to middle school for sure, all in self-contained special needs classrooms and an adjusted curriculum." For now, Charli has been trying to learn life and everyday skills in class too like remembering her house address, creating breakfast, making pancakes and brushing her teeth.

Saying that Charli still visits Karen's now ex-husband and grandparents on weekends, Karen said she

appreciates their constant support and believed that "it takes a village when it comes to being a special needs parent." She also brought up how she has joined a Facebook group for special needs parents who have children with similar challenges, with whom she has developed a sense of "camaraderie."

Speaking of village, the GoFundMe page has received a hair over \$3,000 from 26 people in just six days. Karen expressed shock and gratitude for the mix of family, friends and strangers who have donated to the cause so far.

When asked if she had a message to the public about her daughter and her overall situation, Karen said, "Don't be afraid to ask questions because I think a lot of people tend to shy away, especially after initial diagnosis. You may also lose a lot of people because they don't know how to go about dealing with someone with a specific condition. There's sadly lots of isolation that comes with having a child with disabilities."

But Karen concluded that it won't happen on Charli's case, "On paper, she's severely disabled but she doesn't match up with that for sure, because when you look at her and get to know her, you see her in a different light. She's so lucky to have supportive friends and family, and she's a truly lovable child."

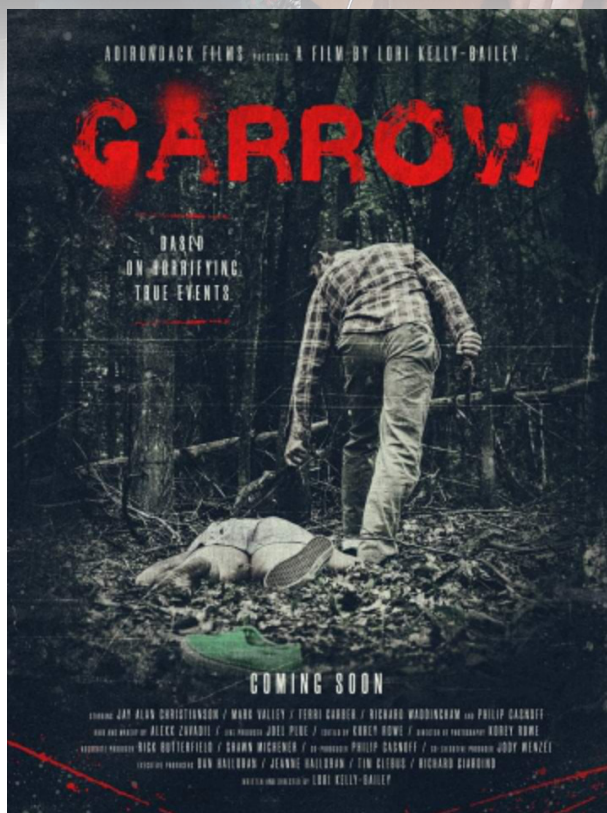

SCHENECTADY — Proctors will soon shine a spotlight as it honors the major players of the local music scene with what is expected to be an annual award ceremony.

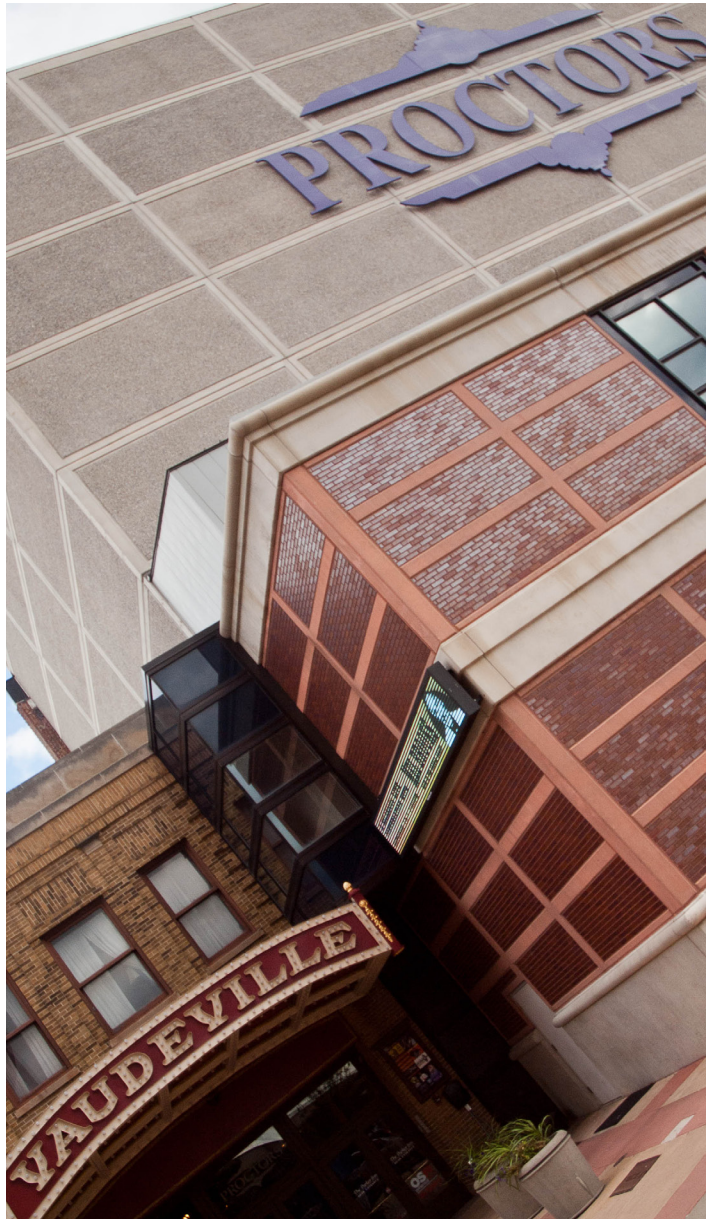

Behind the goggles

The tech behind VR

Daydreaming about deep space or the depths of the ocean used to be bits of escapism that could never truly be experienced. However, thanks to the ever-evolving magic of technology, devices that transport people to other worlds without having to leave the comfort of home have taken fantasies to entirely new levels.

Virtual reality devices have become very popular and increasingly available to consumers working with various budgets. Such devices provide entertainment and educational benefits as well. For example, students who are learning about the Great Wall of China are not restricted to reading about it or watching videos. They can actually traverse the wall from the classroom.

When putting VR headsets on, users may ponder how the technology works. What turns an ordinary living room into a distant galaxy?

The primary purpose of VR is to stimulate vision. Every VR set creates an immersive 3D environment based on computer-driven imagery, states the technology information site NewGenApps. Headsets put two screens in front of a person's eyes and block out all interaction and distractions. The lenses auto-focus based on individual eye movement and head positioning. In some cases, the lenses can be adjusted to match the distance between a person's eyes to produce a customized effect.

Video is directed from a computer or

video gaming console to the headset via an HDMI cable in more expensive and immersive VR systems. In others, the headset is connected to a smartphone which renders the images, advises the tech gear guide Wearable.

The lenses will focus and reshape the picture projected for each eye and create a stereoscopic 3D image by reconfiguring the two 2D images. This mimics how two eyes view the world slightly differently from one another. Most high-end headsets will use a 100- or 110-degree field of view to create a lifelike VR environment.

In addition to the headset, a good frame per second rate is needed to avoid image flickering that can cause motion sickness or distortion. VR headsets have significantly higher requirements than ordinary video games in regard to the time it takes from a change in input to have a visual effect. Many VR headsets achieve 60 fps, while higher-end models can reach upwards of 120 fps, according to VR engineers.

To complete the immersion, VR uses head-tracking technology. This means when a person angles his head in different directions, the VR image will adjust accordingly. Most use a system called 6DoF (six degrees of freedom) to plot head location on an axis and measure movement. Again, the higher-end models will have much lower lag times in terms of head tracking.

Impressive sound can complete the virtual reality experience. As technology continues to expand, price points come down and high-quality VR is more affordable for the masses.

Let the 'Fight' begin

Jocelyn and Chris Arndt will play Jupiter Hall, drop new album Friday

ALBANY — Once Jocelyn and Chris Arndt pack up from Friday's album release party at Jupiter Hall on March 1, the band will hit the ground running on what's anticipated to be an unprecedented 2019.

The Billboard artists dropped their anticipated new studio album "The Fun in the Fight" last week. It features collaborations with Kung Fu's Beau Sasser, Gov't Mule's Danny Louis and Vulfpeck's Cory Wong. It's an 11-track collection of songs that promises to expose the band to a broader audience.

Jocelyn and Chris Arndt broke into Billboard's Adult Album Alternative Top 40 with "Red Stops Traffic" in December 2017. It was the band's third single off its 2017 release "Go," and it debuted at No. 37 among names such as The Killers, Big Head Todd and U2. The song ultimately topped at No. 35 before slipping back down in January.

"I feel like once we got into [the Billboard AAA Top 40] and that got onto our resume, a bunch of new people became interested in helping us," said Chris.

"Outta My Head," the band's debut

track off this latest album, premiered last November. It starts off with Jocelyn singing over a blues riff off of Chris' guitar, but it then turns into something different. It swiftly progresses into a layered, contemporary production; uptempo and hook-focused. It is the most commercial-leaning song the two have yet to produce. And, that's just the beginning. Other songs within the 11-track album suggest Jocelyn and Chris could take aim at alternative radio in addition to the AAA and jamband genres they are accustomed to playing.

"The Fun in the Fight" is the band's push towards the alternative radio format. Once "Outta My Head" debuted, Bridge Road Entertainment's David Bourgeois said he received phone calls from program directors ready to play it.

Capital District fans will have a chance to catch Jocelyn and Chris perform locally before things take off. The band is to play at the SXSW music festival in Austin next week. The duo also just recently announced it will perform on the Today Show next Thursday.

Jocelyn and Chris Arndt will play at Jupiter Hall on Friday, March 1, at 7 p.m. It's the album release party for "The Fun in the Fight." Every ticket sold will receive a copy of the record.

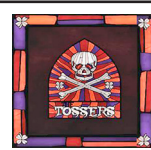

Sunday Gumbo

Ingredients: Makes 16 servings

- 1 pound Italian sausage links, cut into 1/4-inch pieces
- 1 pound boneless, skinless chicken breasts, cubed
- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 medium sweet red pepper, chopped
- 3 celery ribs, chopped
- 1 teaspoon dried marjoram
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 3 cans (14.5 ounces each) chicken broth
- 2/3 cup uncooked brown rice
- 1 can (14.5 ounces) diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 pound uncooked medium shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 2 cups frozen sliced okra

Instructions:

In a Dutch oven, brown the sausage and chicken in oil. Remove with a slotted spoon and keep warm. In the drippings, saute the red pepper, onion and celery until tender. Stir in the seasonings; cook for 5 minutes. Stir in the broth, rice and sausage mixture; bring to a boil. Reduce heat; cover and simmer for 20 to 25 minutes, or until rice is tender.

Stir in the tomatoes, shrimp and okra; cook for 10 minutes, or until shrimp turn pink, stirring occasionally.

When celebrating Mardi Gras this year, this recipe for Hurricanes, courtesy of Liquor.com, can help you get in the spirit of this festive occasion.

Hurricane

- 2 ounces white rum
- 2 ounces dark rum
- 1 ounce lime juice
- 1 ounce orange juice
- 2 ounces passion fruit juice
- 1/2 ounce simple syrup
- 1/2 ounce Grenadine

Garnish: 1 orange wheel and cherry

Add all the ingredients to a shaker and fill with ice. Shake, and strain into a large Hurricane glass filled with fresh ice. Garnish with an orange half-wheel and a cherry.

The effects of caffeine on the body

Caffeine is a vital component of many people's daily routines. A morning cup of caffeinated coffee provides the boost people need to get out the door and on their way each morning.

The history of caffeine and its use in beverages is mired in mystery and myth, though the U.S. National Library of Medicine notes that the historical origins of caffeinated tea and coffee are relatively recent. The USNLM indicates that coffee did not become widespread in Europe until the 18th and 19th centuries, remaining something of a luxury until somewhat recently. And while England's love of tea is widely known, caffeinated tea did not become common in Britain until the 18th century.

While it might have taken its time to take root in many cultures across the globe, there's no denying the prevalence of caffeine in the 21st century. A bitter substance that occurs naturally in more than 60 plants, caffeine can be found in coffee beans; tea leaves; kola nuts, which are used to flavor sodas; and cacao pods, which are vital to the creation of many chocolate products.

Many people get their caffeine from beverages, and the amount of caffeine such people consume may depend on which beverages they choose. For example, the USNLM says that an eight-ounce cup of coffee typically contains anywhere from 95 to 200 milligrams of caffeine. A 12-ounce can of soda is considerably less caffeinated, containing about 35 to 45 milligrams of caffeine on average. The extra

boost people get from sodas might be due to sugar, as sodas are notoriously high in sugar.

Caffeine has various effects on the body, some of which are beneficial. For example, the USNLM notes that caffeine is a diuretic, which means it can help the body get rid of extra salt and water by increasing the need to urinate. Caffeine also stimulates the central nervous system, providing that morning boost of energy that so many coffee drinkers rely on every day.

But not all side effects of caffeine consumption are beneficial. Because it increases the release of acid in the stomach, caffeine can sometimes contribute to upset stomach or heartburn. In addition, caffeine can interfere with the absorption of calcium in the body, though the organization American Bone Health notes that such interference may only occur among heavy coffee drinkers who consume upwards of four cups of coffee per day.

The USNLM notes that most people can consume up to 400 milligrams of caffeine per day without suffering any ill effects. But exceeding that amount may contribute to a number of unwanted side effects, including restlessness, insomnia, headaches, dizziness, dehydration, anxiety, and rapid or abnormal heart rhythm. It's also important to recognize that some people are more sensitive to caffeine than others, so what's good for the goose is not necessarily good for the gander.

Caffeine plays a vital role in many people's lives, and understanding its effects can help people make smart decisions regarding their caffeine consumption.

Off the beaten path

Chateau shows in Albany meld professional practices with DIY methodology

Among the network of musicians in Albany, there are select venues that are known to be “off the beaten path” but still provide the listener with the intimate experience many are searching for from live music. Since the unfortunate closure of Valentine’s in 2014, the need for these spaces has increased, leading to house venues popping up across the area to cater to fans. With no particular venue picking up where Valentine’s left off, the mission of getting a PA and inviting your friends over for a show got the ball started for house venues such as the Chateau. One of these artists, Girl Blue, was recently profiled by NYS Music and web magazine recently presented the premiere of Girl Blue’s Chateau Shows performance.

The Chateau was born in 2014 with the first show in 2015, and since then, roughly 15 shows a year, or 1-2 a month are held at the house. Dan Maddalone says of Chateau, “It’s not a money maker, just something for fun and a sign of the healthy and continually growing music scene, both above and underground, in Albany.”

Albany native turned international performer Meg Duffy (Hand Habits) and beloved DIY stalwart Lomelda have both performed at Chateau, making it a utility space for musicians on their way up. More established acts like Spoon, White Denim, and White Reaper have also performed in the space due to Maddalones previous involvement with the radio station WEQX.

Thanks to venues like The Chateau, bands can build an audience in Albany and branch out to other towns without traditional airplay and booking. “House shows are an incubator for a small part of the scene, for a talented group of people who do a lot of great art and create amazing things.” As the industry has broken down, artists have found a new way to prosper and The Chateau is but one small part of an international movement. But make no mistake, Maddalone says, “This has always been happening in Albany and abroad, and will continue to happen forever. We are but one tiny part of a long-running DIY methodology.”

Chateau is one of many house venues in Albany. Normally, house venues last between six months to two years, depending on who manages them. Traditionally, it is college students who take on the practice and either move on or pass the house onto another group when their tenure is up. Chateau has such a long legacy due to it being owned and operated by the same persons year after year.

These venues are all several steps above

house parties due to the focus being put on the music. The setting typically involves a house kit, PA system, with some lights and decoration in the ‘venue’ part of the house, which is often an attic or basement. In non-venue parts of the house lie comfortable living quarters for bands to rest before moving on to other shows. Between bands, guests are typically welcome to wander about the house sipping whatever they brought with them, and chatting with friends.

The atmosphere of the Chateau and other house venues offer a different musical experience than what you typically find at a club or bar. Performances at clubs can foster a passive and inattentive crowd, but at house venues, the focus is intently upon the performer with a small audience of 30 to 80 people gathered to see something new, special, and intimate.

All around Albany, a music scene continues to thrive in venues of all sizes and styles. The Capital District has produced nationally touring bands already because of venues like The Chateau, Valentine’s, and The Hollow. Supporting artists from the ground up ensures a healthy breeding ground for future musicians down the road. House venues like The Chateau may be the place to catch your new favorite band.

Nothing but love songs

Railroad Earth and Holly Bowling spoil The Egg on Valentines Day

ALBANY — “Nothing but love songs, folks,” said Todd Scheaffer in front of a crowd gathered inside The Egg on Friday, Feb. 15. Scheaffer and the rest of the formative jamgrass group Railroad Earth were having lots of fun at the Capital District venue, the first stop of the band’s northeast run that weekend. So was Holly Bowling, the well-known pianist opening up for Earth, that also joined the band for most of their headlining performance last night. She and Railroad kicked off the run magnificently, winding through song material ready-made into a bluegrass Valentine’s Day playlist, but also putting heart into all the musical treats of the evening.

Bowling opened up with her own welcomed performance before the two main sets, as is the plan for the rest of the northeast shows. Among the most well received of her Phish and Grateful Dead piano versions was a full-stretched “Divided Sky” on which she put a lot of personal touch. Another highlight was, no doubt, the set ending of “Dark Star” > “I Know You Rider,” where Bowling invited Railroad Earth bassist Andrew Altman and mandolinist John Skehan to play.

Droning cello from Altman, soft strumming from Skehan and piano sound effects from Bowling wound through a wonderful version of the early Dead song that shifted between delicate moments and chromatic, jazzy creativity. The trio easefully guided one another into “Rider.” Holly started to really hammer on the keys and Altman played a cool standup bass solo. From this beautiful opening segment, the stage was set for the magic to be made

between Bowling and Railroad Earth.

After Bowling’s set, Railroad Earth descended upon The Egg with a great opening “Hunting Song,” giving this particularly psychedelic original a bit of musical power. When Railroad starts a show off with something extra heady like this, the chances for a strong show are in the cards. Bowling, who joined the band on stage from the beginning, got her first real sounds on “Old Man and The Land,” playing a ragtime-style solo that got a beaming smile from Todd Scheaffer.

Love songs did indeed imbue much of the band’s two sets through the evening, with “Happy Song,” “For Love,” and “Came Up Smiling” following the opener, and these cheerful songs started to get the audience, from the front row to the back of The Egg, out of their seats and dancing. “Raven’s Child” > “Only By The Light” was a powerful combo that saw expert playing from Skehan and Mike Robinson. Robinson was sitting in as a special guest for the entire night on banjo, guitar and pedal steel; and he deftly held his own beside Railroad Earth, standing out in multiple moments. On “Dandelion Wine,” the romance number to end the first set, the younger musician picked an incredible guitar solo that elicited not only cheers from The Egg, but a fist pump from violinist Tim Carbone.

The second set kept the welcome love theme rolling, starting with the bittersweet “Been Down This Road.” “Lovin’ You” and “Long Walk Home,” alternatively, brightened the attitude on. “Old Dangerfield” came in the middle of these as a particularly hot version, with Carbone’s fiddle soloing propelling the tune between its breakdown tempo and an Railroad-style funk beat.

The last stretch of the night received the most adventurous musical treatment from Earth and Bowling. “Goat” was standard length, perhaps even shorter than many

versions, but it was a rocking version at that. The thing to note about this one was Altman’s mighty standup bass work – huge and resonating. It sounded like a giant tap dancing on the roof of The Egg. Following on his and the drummer’s sturdy backbeat, the rest of the band ditched the song proper for a dynamic, colorful jam, and Bowling and Robinson were both well footed within the fray. “Jupiter and The 119” took this energy and ran away with it, for a very special version of this Railroad classic. The band showed their fearlessness in furrowing through an uptempo jam segue, and made a seamless and uplifting transition into “Butterfly and The Tree.” The playing from everybody on stage was a thing of progressive bluegrass beauty.

While the band soared from the one song to the next, there was one

particular moment in which Bowling and Skehan’s soloing linked up, and the two complimented one another musically much in the way they had in the opening Dark Star segment, only this time at a breezy speed. If anything best presented how well Bowling fit into Earth’s melodically dramatic and unpredictable style, it was here.

Many fans are understandably buzzing about the night’s encore as much as anything else in the show. “Said What You Mean” is definitely on the rarer side of Railroad Earth originals, having been performed only twice over the last two years. A song that sounds like it could have been co-written between Sam Bush and The Band (but it’s all Scheaffer, a genius in his own right), this was maybe the best loved hit of the night.

Garrow

Garrow, portrayed by actor Jay Alan Christianson, was born on Mar. 4, 1936 in Dannemora, New York and had a troubled childhood in Mineville with an alcoholic and abusive father, and a violent mother. Garrow would grow up to commit numerous rapes and murders, including killing four campers and hikers in the Adirondacks in July 1973. During his capture, he was shot by Conservation Officer Hillary LeBlanc and he pretended to be partially paralyzed from it in a wheelchair while he was serving a 25-years-to-life sentence at the Fishkill State Correctional Facility. He

then notoriously tricked the guards and escaped — ironically proving to be an actor, himself — on Sept. 8, 1978. He would die in a shootout just three days later.

The film's director, Lori Kelly-Bailey said that she had a longtime interest in writing about Garrow's real-life terror because he was actually a neighbor to her family in Mineville. She said that her father had went to school with Garrow, offering her an insider perspective, who described him as "a big strapping farm boy who was a loner and sat on the sidelines. He didn't play with the other children and was often teased.

... My dad could tell he was abused because of his wounds and he smelled very bad from being unclean and always working on the farms."

The film would include flashbacks to some of his crimes as well as his time on trial. It also featured some real-life individuals who directly interacted with Garrow at the time, including former state corrections officer Dominic Arena who survived a bullet from Garrow himself, and real props from when Garrow was alive, including guns, hats, vintage suits, and uniforms with actual bloodstains. To further prepare for the film, Kelly-Bailey said she obtained all the actual transcripts and crime photos while conducting more research to "help create his character out of facts that I could find" although "Garrow" stops short of depicting the violence.

"I found it wasn't hard to get in touch with the real people who are still alive and we tried to get as many as we can who'd participated in that time of life," she said, adding that Garrow's surviving family members still have not opened up to the media. "Like I love that the troopers dusted off their old uniforms and squeezed into them. That was all important to me and I just love the human interest part of it all." She also said that Arena found it challenging though to relive the shootout as well as being placed on a stretcher, replaying what did happen several decades ago. "Dominic will speak at the Albany

screening on his experience and he'll likely get emotional and get choked up," she said.

"Garrow" has already been screened at several theaters across upstate New York, including Plattsburgh and Glens Falls, since late last year. Kelly-Bailey said the public turnout and support "blows me away. I think the best example is that one night, I took myself out of the audience to really watch the people. Nobody took their eyes off the screen. I saw that every seat was filled and some audience members had come with oxygen tanks or healthcare

people. It's not common to see that demographic and I've even had several people come up to me to say they did interact with [Garrow] when he was alive."

One of the film's producers, Joel Plue, said that besides the storytelling aspect, another reason "Garrow" was made was to prove how easy and great it was to film on location in upstate New York. "That area is so user-friendly because

of its natural scenery and the people there are great to work with," he said. "It shows how you can make a movie there and many people dream of making or producing a film but think they can't because they live in rural New York. With a supportive community and things like video editing, cameras, laptops and more, it can work. It wasn't the case 20 years ago if you didn't know anyone in the industry."

Furthermore, he said that the film began production in 2016 and ended in 2018, with a budget of just \$30,000.

For the upcoming Albany screening, Kelly-Bailey said that besides the public, many state and local politicians have been invited to attend too, including Gov. Andrew Cuomo and Albany Mayor Kathy Sheehan. "The reason for Cuomo specifically was that he has always promoted filming in upstate New York and we stayed true to that aspect and it'd be nice if he comes out," she said.
