
Hornick wrote in a statement that Holligan was "very passionate about training and the education of future police officers," and he paved the way for BPD's Family Services Unit.

Flip through pages of Bethlehem's past

Riveting historical stories to learn from

BETHLEHEM — Warren Welch. John Adams Dyer. Grace Slingerland. Not familiar with those names? Town Historian Susan Leath's new book, "Bethlehem People and Places" has the answers.


Her book includes 33 illustrated stories of numerous real-life individuals, families and buildings that make up part of Bethlehem's rich history, dating back to at least the 19th century.

Leath, who has been the town historian since 2007, said that such stories were mainly collected from articles originally published in Our Towne Bethlehem from 2016 to 2018, a local publication that reaches over 10,000 homes and businesses; some of the stories and photos were directly sent to her by residents in town too.

"I've had some people call me or come to me over the years and say like, Tve got these old pictures, do you want to look at them?' and that's what gets me going," she said. "People know I'm the town historian so many historical things come my way." Upon coming across such historical anecdotes and photos, Leath added that it further boosts her curiosity about the town's history overall.

People can meet Leath in a book-signing event on Saturday, March 23 from 10 a.m. to noon at I Love Books on 380 Delaware Ave. in Delmar.

Leath brought up how she had much creative control over this book since it was self-published with Troy Book Makers, and she was able to approve the book cover, the photos within, and its overall layout.

"Bethlehem People and Places" marks her

third book, after 2011's "Bethlehem (Images of America)" and 2016's "Historic Tales of Bethlehem, New York." It also took her just six months to gather all the stories and photos that she wanted for this new release.

Commenting on her longtime passion for local history, she said that she's always curious about how things and everyday life used to be, and how that has since affected how we live today. She also noted that in the future, she wonders how people then will look back on today too.

When asked what she hopes people would take away from this book, she said, "I hope that they will appreciate Bethlehem and appreciate our history and the people who were here. It fascinates me how our little town is connected to bigger historical stories too." She brought up an example within the book about a local farmer who

died with Lt. Col. George Armstrong Custer at the Battle of the Little Bighorn in June 1876 at Big Horn County, Montana. "It's like, 'How did this little Bethlehem farm boy end up out there?' It's fascinating,' she said.

Looking ahead, while she mentioned that she is not sure about writing a new book beyond this one yet, she concluded nevertheless that "it's important to keep holding onto these kinds of stories and our town's history because we'll forget them if we don't. It's really important to know where we came from, you know, and the folks that went before us and the impact they had on the development of the town. I just don't want to forget these things."

May have a makeover to go

GLENMONT — The McDonald's location at Glenmont Plaza on 376 Feura Bush Road may receive an order of a makeover soon, something the Bethlehem Planning Board has been considering looking further into since its March 5 meeting.

This 2,932-squarefoot fast-food restaurant is looking to receive a renovated facade, an aesthetic overhaul of its menu boards, patio improvements, three new building signage and more ADA-compliant parking spaces, walkways and seating layout. Blueprints and artistic renderings were provided by Bohler Engineering and architects Hoffman & Riley, both

based in Albany.

According to submitted town documents, the refurbished building would have an overall grey theme and appear more rightangled to exude a modern look. Planning Board Chairman John Smolinsky

had said that he would like it to visually complement the other nearby existing buildings and he requested Owen Špeulstra — the visiting Bohler Engineering civil design engineer to return for a future meeting with more artistic simulations to

show whether the new McDonald's color scheme would aesthetically fit with the rest of Glenmont Plaza and even the residential homes across the street.

"Maybe you could try to consider the nearby residential buildings and

the neighborhood character too in your designs, to the extent you can with McDonald's," Planning Board member Kate Powers said. "If you drive around to different places in the world, McDonald's looks differently as you know, depending on the community so I think it would be helpful if you can try to match that to some extent."

The current analog plastic menu boards would be replaced with new digital LED ones; ADA-compliant accessible walkways would better connect the building to the parking spaces and street sidewalk along Feura Bush Road; and there would be more adequate lighting for said walkways. The existing parking spaces would be slightly remade as Speulstra noted that they are "too steep where they are and there's also a drainage structure in the middle of it which is a kind of a trip hazard." He also said that the building's outdoor patio and seating will be removed and reinstalled with better ADA-compliant ones in terms of remedying the current slope and lack of sufficient ADA-accessible seats.

Speulstra said the drivethru's outdoor speaking signs would emit about 65 decibels within four feet which is around how loud normal conversation is like — this ideally would not cause noise pollution to surrounding buildings and homes.

The Planning Board has tabled the application for now.

a completely parent-run program. Almost all props used in the competition have to be recycled materials.

With regards to the March 2 competition, the long-term problems were first revealed in early Fall 2018 which gave teams ample time to start thinking how to solve them by March 2019, and gather any appropriate props and/ or materials.

OOTM's website listed the problems as:

"OMER to the Rescue, Again" - Crafting a ride-on vehicle that could fit inside a suitcase

"Hide in Plain Sight" - Creating a mechanical creature that can camouflage with its surroundings

"Classics: Leonardo's Workshop" - "Reimagining" the works of Leonardo da Vinci

"Structure Toss" -Evaluating how strong a team-designed balsa wood structure is

"Opposites Distract":

Learning about being intentionally distracted through comic arguments and more

"We have fantastic teams and it was nuts because the students were the ones who took on the tasks, did a ton of research and tried different things. All the decisions are from them," Beiter said. "The school district has been very generous and supportive of us too, and has allowed us to use in-school facilities like the cafeteria for us to meet and practice in the past months."

When asked what skills and experiences students get from participating, fellow BCHS coach Carol Roeder, whose 11th-grade daughter has been an OOTM competitor since her middle school days, said students learn that it's important to keep trying even if they fail sometimes. "It gets them on their feet too, makes them learn and adapt, and deal with failure and learn from it," said Roeder. "As long as you do your best, it's okay. It's also

how you learn to improvise and make the most out of a situation."

She added that when her students first found out what problems they had to solve last fall, they then spent much time together to find solutions and get creative. "They've formed a sense of comradery and it's definitely forged some lifelong friendships it seems," she said. "They're very excited, apprehensive and driven. This is dealing with academics too and this is their favorite thing to do."

Emily Saunders, the 3rd grade Hamagrael Elementary team's coach whom she said has practiced weekly since mid-October 2018, said, "In school, you have a set of things to learn in set ways — that's not a reflection on the teaching though — but there's so many more ways to learn and have fun with math and theater, so I think having the teamwork and being with friends to learn and be productive has been all really valuable."



Regarding challenges faced during this competition season so far, Beiter said that being a coach could sometimes take up a lot of time and

energy due to monthslong preparations for the competition and coming up with the props. Roeder said that her students sometimes have other obligations to focus on, like school exams and other extracurricular activities; Saunders brought up how when the problems were first unveiled last fall, her students — who are aged 8 or 9 — initially did not feel a sense of competing since the March 2019 competition felt so far away then.

Nevertheless, all three agreed that their advancing teams will reuse their same skits and products from the March 2 competition for the March 23 statewide competition albeit with a few tweaks.

"All the Bethlehem Central teams are great and have worked very hard, and we're all very proud of their performances so far," Beiter concluded. "Employers are nowadays looking for people who can work in groups and solve problems. This provides kids an opportunity to get really good at those skills and push out of their comfort zone. These young kids are already learning a lot of 21st century skills."

\$5K High School Scholarship offered through eSports gaming tourny

SCHENECTADY — Gaming Insomniacs League recently announced it is hosting a \$5,000 High School Scholarship eSports Tournament in the GE Theater at Proctors from Saturday, May 18 to Sunday, May 19.

"We are very excited about hosting the first high school eSports tournament in the Capital Region," said Shane Batcher, Director of Operations for Gaming Insomniacs. 

Gaming Insomniacs League nationwide. He notes that many colleges are starting to develop eSports teams and offer thousands of dollars in scholarships for players and said that GIL is very focused on building up high school and college leagues in the Capital District.

"It is essential that high school students develop marketable 21st century skills that will encourage their success in college, the work force, or military," he said. "eSports fosters opportunities for students to work as a team, practice time management, improve communication skills and develop as a leader. Eyes on the road, Junior

Reduce distractions behind the wheel

espite the fact that automobiles are now designed with more safety features than ever before, the rate of traffic accidents and fatalities continue to rise. The National Safety Council says safety improvement like crash-avoidance technology hasn't reduced accidents, and driver error is still to blame for many crashes — with distractions behind the wheel and impaired driving leading the way.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration says distracted driving claimed 3,450 lives in 2016 alone. Distracted driving is defined as any activity that diverts drivers' attention from the road. This can include everything from talking to passengers to eating to fiddling with the car radio. However, distractions from technology have become especially alarming, particularly texting or reading phones while driving. During daylight hours, approximately 481,000 drivers typically use cell phones while driving. The NHTSA says that removing one's eyes from the road for a mere 5 seconds when traveling at 55 miles per hour is like driving the length of a football field with your eyes closed.

Reducing distractions should be a priority for all drivers. Here are some suggestions, courtesy of Geico insurance and AAA Exchange.

• Store loose gear and other items that can roll around away from the driver's seat so you are not tempted to reach for them.

• Adjust mirrors, GPS maps, climate controls, music,

and more before you put the car in drive.

• Use a mobile phone only for emergency purposes and



only after pulling over to the side of the road. Avoid social conversations on the phone while driving.

• Limit the number of passengers you allow inside your car. The more passengers, the more distractions. This is especially true for young drivers.

• Eat food before getting in the car. Snacking while driving makes you less attentive to the road around you.

• Secure children and pets accordingly. Both should wear harnesses and not be given free reign to roam around the car.

• Try to focus only on driving while in the car. Leave the multitasking to when you're not behind the wheel.

Geico indicates that studies have shown people are limited in the amount of information they can process at any one time. Driving requires focus and an ability to react to a host of potential circumstances. Distractions compromise drivers' ability to focus. Reducing distractions can considerably cut down on the number of motor vehicle accidents each year.

Slingerland, himself, comes across as an enigma wielding power. He, too, is always in black. Black shirt. Dark sunglasses. His ebony headphones framing a perfectly contrasting picture around his cleanly shaven head. It's as if J.R. Dobbs of the Church of the SubGenius died and was reborn, instead of a caricature of a 1950s salesman, but into a 21st-century club DJ. He's got a message you need to hear. His weekly Sunday show greets viewers with the declaration, "The weekend's not over until we say so."

Who are we to disagree?

The Situation is a trip. Slingerland recalls being enveloped into weekly episodes of the Twilight Zone television series. The beginning of each show invited viewers into another realm. It always looked like our familiar world, but it never failed to spoon-feed a fable we would never have sat through if left naked on its own.

From a narrow, twisted alley

Even the show's early introduction use to resemble something out of the old radio serials. Placing the audience in another dimension to suspend reality. For Slingerland, this vehicle was the visual of a "narrow, tristed alley."

"So we began with everything coming out of an alley," said Slingerland. "Quickly, we learned we were not going to be able to do everything out of an alley."

Slingerland's message is all about music. Whether he's throwing in a B-side from a long-distant track or showcasing a song from a local band, he's gift-wrapped an auditory package in a visual concept abandoned by Viacom's MTV more than a generation ago.

The Situation started in that bright, neon world. Where hairstyles threatened to destroy the ozone layer, and zebrastripped clothing seemed like a good idea at the time. MTV stood for Music Television, and in 1987 it continued to drive music and pop culture. Video, and deregulation nearly killed radio. The cookie-cutter formula that dominates the airwaves today was something Slingerland could avoid on television.

"If you invite friends over and listen to music, as we all did, you sit around, you have some fun, you be a little silly and you listen to good music," said Slingerland. "That's all we're trying to be."

Each episode features a trio or more of women dressed in the now iconic style of dark sunglasses and black dresses, called the Situation Stars. Slingerland said it is not a homage to Robert Palmer's 1985 hit "Addicted to Love." Nonetheless, they walk across the screen in a noir setting. No speech, and partaking in actions that sometimes leave you guessing. In 2019's sensitive climate, Slingerland said all of the power is wielded by the Stars.

"We try to elevate the women on our show," said Slingerland. Often times a sense will include a male counterpart or a "Fall Guy" who finds himself stepped on or on the short end of a leash. "The women are always in a superior position."

Comedian Aaron David Ward has provided humorous commentary towards the end of each episode for the past 12 years. His appearance on the show is different from his stand-up routine. He evokes the vision of another local icon when he calls his contribution, "Andy Rooney on acid."

While preparing for this article, I came across a comment on social media. The man was sharing the story of a moment he shared at a local bar. In my mind, it was Blue 82. "We've been there," said Slingerland, as I pass the story on to him. Each Saturday, a similar scene plays out on the club's doorstep on North Pearl Street. Beautiful women in tight dresses with hems so short and heels so long. The man looks around and says aloud, "Looks like something out of the Glenn Slingerland Situation. A few men at the bar chuckle, another saves himself from spitting out his drink.

They know the Situation.





Blues, gospel, soul and some Jimi

A Blues Legend: Interview with Joe Louis Walker

hen you've won four Blues Music Awards, been inducted into the Blues Hall of Fame, nominated for a Grammy, and are a W.C. Handy Award recipient, your mark on the world of blues is pretty much set. Add a close friendship with B.B. King, James Cotton and Willie Dixon, and you get a glimpse into the life and career of a Blues Master: Mr. Joe Louis Walker.

Named "A legendary boundary-pushing icon of modern blues" by NPR, Walker started playing the guitar as a young boy, growing up in the Fillmore District of San Francisco in the early 60's. Now living in the Hudson Valley for the last 10 years with his wife Robin, Joe has a non-stop schedule traveling the world; touring, writing, recording, and producing. I sat down with Joe after sound check at The Towne Crier in Beacon, N.Y. The band had just gotten in from Buffalo N.Y. and was wrapping up a few dates in the U.S. before heading off to a remote island in the Caribbean for a blues festival. Mickey Deneher: Your career, over 50 years?

Joe Louis Walker: About 53 years. I'm 69 now. I turned 69 on Christmas (2018). I've been playing since about '61. I joined the union in 1964. I joined the musician's union. Been a union man all my life. Been living on my own since I was 16.

MD: You started playing music at a young age. What brought you to the guitar?

JLW: Well the guitar, when I was a kid, was the most accessible instrument, as it is now. The guitar was, when I was 12, 1962, only something you could look at. I went to a Catholic school and at that time, you could check instruments out. If you had an aptitude, a little bit of an ear for the talent, they would nurture it. If you really had a talent, you would make a deal with your parents and they would rent you an instrument. Rent vou an instrument. Not buy you one. Rent you one. With renting the instrument, come lessons. So I first rented, I checked out the violin when I was about 9, cause I could carry that home. But I really couldn't make too much (out of it) when you're fixated on that sound; that electric sound.

My parents had a temporary split and we ended up moving to the Fillmore District, and my world began. We moved to the projects, me and my mom and all of



five kids, all of us. One project over, one housing (project), my cousins. I hadn't seen or hung out with my cousins too much. But the first day I go there, they are on the third floor of the projects; third floor! I walk from the first floor. I am going to walk up three floors. You don't want to catch the elevators. That's where a lot of stuff goes on. All the way on the third floor, all the way, the first floor to the third Photos by Mickey Deneher

floor, wall-to-wall girls. Just standing and listening to my cousins play. I'm like; I am definitely going to do this now. [Laughing] Wall to Wall!

MD: Ulterior motives!

jocks. Without being serious gang guys.

We literally, had the whole thing for ourselves. Of course, there were bands all in the area. There was Sly's (Sly and the Family Stone) brother Freddy Stewart who had a band with my cousin Ted Weisinger; Freddy Stewart and the Stone Soldiers, one of the big bands in San Francisco. This was before the hippies came to San Francisco. The hippies didn't come till '62, '63, '64. I was in the Fillmore district in '61, '62. I was 12 years old in '62. I was lucky because there was this convergence among all the soul groups. The Fillmore at that time was like Harlem in the Renascence. It was, I would say, 75 percent African-American, huge amount of Japanese, a nice amount of Chinese and different, various people.

When the hippies came into the Fillmore Auditorium, in it was sort of interesting because me and my cousins and all of us had been playing the Fillmore since we were young. That's where we would have our battle of the bands. I went to junior high school a block from the Fillmore Auditorium. So we used to have our rehearsal there, battle of the bands there. Then, if we clean up some times, Mr. Sullivan who owned the Fillmore, Charles Sullivan the promoter, he would give us free tickets. So we got to see the Temptations, the real Temptations. We got to see James Brown when he got a brand new bag. I got to see Little Richard with Jimi Hendricks on guitar. I got to see all of that sh#t for FREE! And plus, I got to play the Fillmore.

So when the hippies came there it was like ok, you know, I am cool with this. But as somebody said, very adroitly, they said "you know one of the best things to happened for a lot of the old rock and roll and blues guys was the English invasion, because they brought back interest in them." But it was also one of the worst

things to happen. Cause they put all their heroes out of work. The English guys did not mean to do that. That is not what they started for. There was like maximum R&B. That was, their heroes. That is not what they were about. Period. To note that it turned out that way, was a real drag. That is not what John Lennon and Mick Jagger and all those guys were about. They just weren't about that. The Yardbirds, they just weren't about all that. But that's what it sort of turned into.

But, be that as it may, I was fortunate to be able to see all the Fillmore stuff, then play at the Fillmore. When Graham owned it; Bill would let me come any time I wanted. So I got to see all the shows.... I was fortunate to be coming up in all that stuff. It wasn't just that; it was the young guys who were finding their musical paths. **MD: At 16 you had a name in the San**



Francisco music scene. Who were you were playing with?

JLW: Lowell Fulsom, Troyce Key, Percy Mayfield, Erle Hooker. You name it, I backed everybody. Katy Webster, Sly, (Mike) Bloomfield. John Lee, Earl, just on and on, and on and on. I played with all the hippie groups. I was in Blue Cheer, The Oxford Circle. We did a little fusion stuff with some other groups later. The coolest thing about that time, and that place was that everything was progressing at the same time. What people wore, what people thought, the way the people responding to old mores, the Vietnam war, Richard Nixon, interracial marriage. Everything was happening at the same and the biggest thing I think, was what we invented in the United States in the San Francisco area, was FM radio. That was the biggest thing. Cause without FM radio we'd still be listening to The Monkees, 2 minutes, 40 seconds.

MD: You're right. Wow, I did not think of that.

JLW: And jam bands.

MD: It wasn't just blues, experimental, psychedelic.

JLW: It was so much. Oh my God. You could literally go out every night, hit three spots a night... You go to the Avalon Ballroom, The Family Dog (Ballroom), go see John Mayall with Mick Taylor and Muddy Water's with his band, Big Mama Thorton. Go to the Fillmore, maybe see an Airplane with Quick Silver and Charles Lord Quartet, and Howlin' Wolf. Four acts, that's all in one night. That's all in one night! Then you go to clubs after that.

The 60's counterculture movement brought hippies, flower power and alternative lifestyles to the bay area. While the '70s found San Francisco awash in a psychedelic haze. Walker made a conscious decision to take a detour from the '70s status quo and attended San Francisco State University, where he earned degrees in both English and Music. "It (was) important for me. Because it was something I started and didn't finish."



Joe says. Applying his personal growth directive to music, Joe joined the gospel group The Spiritual Corinthians, in 1975.

MD: You went into gospel. You did that for 10 years?

JLW: Longer than that.

MD: When I think about Gospel, to me there is a blues base, a bluestone, that feeling.

JLW: Look at it like this: gospel, blues, and soul music. Just take a for instance. For instance, in blues, I mean B.B. King. I don't mean Eric Clapton. No disrespect to Eric Clapton, ok. In blues, that is the template. Or Howlin'Wolf. Say B.B. King, cause B.B. to me always was, and I used to have fun telling him this, "you're just a gospel singer in a blues singer's body." When he was young, cause he hit all the high notes, his range was limitless.

So you take a B.B. King for blues. So you take for soul music (pauses for a second), Sam Moore. Just a voice that's just wicked, or Al Green. And say in gospel music, you take somebody like my friend, Clarence Fountain (Blind Boys of Alabama). When you have those three, all those three guys are cousins. I could take Bobby Blue Bland and interject him into soul, he wouldn't miss a step, wouldn't miss cause he helped invent it. I could take Sam Cooke and interject him into blues. Sam Cooke had a No. 3 record; hit record with "Little Red Rooster." A lot of people don't know that and it's cool. I could take Sam Cooke and interject him into soul, wouldn't miss a step. I can take Sam Cooke, of course, interject him into gospel, wouldn't miss a step. I can interject B.B. into gospel, wouldn't miss a step.

But now I could not interject Eric Clapton into gospel. No disrespect. I could not interject Joe Bonamassa into soul music. I can interject him as a player. But I couldn't interject him in like Bernie Worrell or Catfish (Collins); Bootsy Collin's brother; or someone like Jimmy Nolen who played with James Brown; or Freddy Stewart, Sly Stones brother; or Bobby Womack. I'm sure he could play all that, don't get me wrong, but that style of playing within itself is the total opposite of this (Joe motions moving fingers all over a guitar neck at rapid speed.) Cause when you playing soul music and gospel, you are playing as an accompaniment to the voice. The lyric of the song is the star. Everything else is secondary. With blues now, and I should say blues rock, because its changed. It used to be, which it just blows your mind, go home and put on any record you like. Put on "Little Red Rooster" by Howlin' Wolf, put on "Boom, Boom" by John Hooker, put on "Baby What You" Want Me ToDo" by Jimmy Reed, put on "Got My Mojo Workin" you will not hear one solo. You might hear four, five notes; but you are not going to hear (Joe makes sounds like a cacophony of notes played at lightning speed.) That is sort of what a lot of stuff has morphed into now. So when it's morphed into that, and it's morphed into screaming as loud as you can, singing as loud as you can, with a lot of fake ass emotion. I'm sorry I grew up in the same project with Etta James, I grew up in the same projects man. She never screamed on "I'd Rather Go Blind." In that particular song she doesn't scream. She really doesn't.

So I guess we all have our points of reference. We all have what we feel moves us. The same things, it moves me all my life. Once I heard the Wolf, I loved it. I loved it just as much now. When I heard "Satisfaction" I loved the song then, I love it now. But blues has morphed, you know it's just morphed into more of a me-thing, as opposed to a we-thing. Muddy Waters was great. But he sounded really good with Little Walter, he sounded really good with Otis Spann, you know what I mean. He sounded really freak'n good with Willie Big Eyes Smith. When he didn't have Willie, when he didn't have Otis Spann what did he do? He got Pinetop Perkins!

Those guys could literally solo over each other and not step over each other. They could solo a little during the song, but not step on each other. That it was all about we. A lot now is about me. It's about the individual. That's sort of the way the music business has morphed.

While attending the New Orleans Jazz and Heritage Festival with The New Corinthians in 1985, Joe had an epiphany that the blues were his calling. He realigned his musical direction and has not looked back. His resume of musical accomplishments includes 25 albums to date and countless guest appearances supporting the likes of B.B. King, James Cotton, Branford Marsalis, Peter Green, Elvin Bishop, Issac Hayes.

Joe's latest project is Journeys to the Heart of the Blues. An acoustic blues album nominated for two 2019 Blues Music Awards (Album Of The Year, Acoustic Album.) Joe recorded with renowned keyboard player and fellow Hudson Valley resident Bruce Katz (Greg Allman Band,) and next-generation British harmonica ace Giles Robson. The album is out on Alligator Records throughout North America, Australia, New Zealand and Japan. Munich Records, a division of V2 Records Benelux, will release it in all other territories. The sessions were recorded at NRS Studios in Woodstock.

MD: You are recording now, correct? JLW: My album. We are about three quarters finished. A double album.

FILM REVIEW Moving us ever so softly

'Five Feet Apart' serves subtle touches to evoke powerful emotions



The film's title is connected to how Grant wants to challenge that "six feet rule" and maintain at least five feet of distance instead, a rule that becomes more difficult to follow as the two start falling for each other. This stems from how Grant feels tired of being limited by her CF and she also tries to exercise

as much control as she can over her life by keeping herself busy with designing apps, live streaming her everyday life, and ensuring her fellow CF patients stick to their treatments.

Directed by Justin Baldoni who is famed for playing Rafael Solano on the CW's "Jane the Virgin," it largely takes place within the hospital grounds, exemplified by how Grant often looks out her window to cherish the distant city lights. It is a risky directorial choice to have the film almost exclusively stay within the same location but that concern evaporates as Grant and Newman's developing romance and Barb's nononsense maternal humor take center stage. Hence,

it feels ironically strange once the couple leaves the

hospital for a one-night

stroll, an impressive decision

on Baldoni's part. One main highlight of the film is when Grant and Newman hold opposite ends of a billiard pool cue stick, to represent around five feet of safe distance, as if they're "holding hands" while they traverse the hospital for their first date. Baldoni impressively expands on this quiet romantic gesture by having the two sit between the cue stick by the hospital's swimming pool. Things get silently sensual as Grant gently places the cue stick over her bare shoulder for example, and they eventually stand to strip and showcase their individual scars as a result of their CF and treatments.

This relates to how the film succeeds in its quieter moments, not its dramatic ones, where the characters say little or no dialogue and the camera pans to show how heartbreaking it is that the couple can't physically touch, hug or kiss each other, things that normal people take advantage of. From that same observation, it feels alarming when Grant suddenly holds Newman's hand with a glove in one scene and when Newman's bare hand rests briefly on Grant's shoulder in another.

"Five Feet Apart" represents one of the smaller entries in the young adult romance film genre for maintaining a more intimate atmosphere. Baldoni seemingly does not intend for it to be too ambitious, a common problem with other similar films that try to choke the audience with overt star-crossed lovers' drama and cheesy messages, and it mostly results in a delicate success.


