Setting sail

Bethlehem Central about to disembark on storied tragedy of the doomed Titanic ocean liner

BETHLEHEM — While the deteriorating shipwreck of the RMS Titanic remains silent on the North Atlantic Ocean's bed, its legacy and stories continue to live on in modern popular culture, this time being reimagined by the Bethlehem Central High School's Stage 700 theatre club.

"Titanic: The Musical" will set sail with four performances at the school's auditorium: from Thursday to Saturday, April 4 to 6 at 7 p.m. each, and on Sunday, April 7 at 2 p.m. These dates fall just around one week

before the ocean liner's 107th sinking anniversary on April 15, 1912. Tickets are \$12, and \$6 for students, seniors and military personnel. They are available for purchase on Saturday, March 30 from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. at the BCHS auditorium lobby as well as at the door one hour before each show begins. This is also the final theater production in the high school's auditorium before it closes its curtains for a year to be renovated in relation to the BCSD's 2016 Facilities Improvement Project.

Inappropriate care

BETHLEHEM — The Bethlehem Police Department arrested a 31-year-old Schenectady woman on Tuesday, March 19 after a six-month investigation relating to a complaint of inappropriate conduct with a disabled person.

reported possible inappropriate care of a consumer at the home.

As Bethlehem police then conducted a joint investigation with New York State Justice Center, an alleged second incident of inappropriate care and treatment of a second consumer at the same home earlier in 2018 came into light.

Mair allegedly mistreated a physically disabled person and allegedly falsified records to pretend it did not happen.

Mair was arraigned at the Bethlehem Town Court and charged with two felony counts

of endangering the welfare of an incompetent or physically disabled person, and one felony count of falsifying business records.

She was released under the supervision of probation and her case was waived up to Albany County Court.

DWI charges

GLENMONT - A 23-year-old Rensselaer woman was arrested for DWI-related charges on Sunday, March 17 at 12:41 a.m. on 382 Route 9W in Glenmont.

A Bethlehem police officer noticed that a white Honda Civic remained parked with its lights on for almost an hour at the above address' parking lot.

After pulling up to ensure the driver was okay, the officer observed that the driver's window was fully open and Shoshoni Mikel Bristol appeared slouched to her right while still seated, and the keys were in the ignition and the heater was on high setting.

The officer then noticed her red, watery eyes, a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage from her

breath, her droopy eyelids and slurred speech.

According to the police report, Bristol was unable to recall how she arrived at the parking lot, exactly where she was headed and where she drove from. Admitting to having drank earlier somewhere in Albany, she then failed all field sobriety tests and was taken into custody without incident.

Transported to the Bethlehem Police Department, she was found to have a BAC of 0.14 percent and was charged with a DWI with a BAC of 0.08 percent or more, and a DWI intoxication misdemeanor.

She has a scheduled return court date of Tuesday, April 2 at 5:30 p.m.

Hit and run

GLENMONT - A Bethlehem police officer responded to a report of an Albany property damage hitand-run incident on Wednesday, March 20 at 3:53 p.m.

Upon arrival, the officer met with the caller who reported that their vehicle had just been struck by a blue Volkswagen Routan in Albany, and the caller followed the Volkswagen to 239 River Road in Glenmont and called the Route 9W in a green Chevrolet

police.

The officer then saw the Volkswagen in the address' parking lot and upon approaching it, he noticed its driver was still inside and had the ignition on.

Identified as Felipe E. Rosa, 33, of Albany by his state ID, the officer detected an odor of an alcoholic beverage from his breath, his bloodshot eyes and how he stumbled when asked to exit the vehicle.

He stated that he had two beers earlier and he then failed all field sobriety tests.

Rosa was taken into custody and after being transported to BPD, he refused to get his BAC level tested three times.

Rosa was charged with a DWI, unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle, and aggravated unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle.

He had a scheduled refusal hearing on Monday, March 25 and a return court date of Tuesday, April 16 at 4 p.m.

High BAC level

GLENMONT — Bethlehem police received a complaint call about an erratic driver who was traveling northbound on

Silverado on Saturday, March 2 at 7:03 p.m.

The officer then located the vehicle exiting the Sunoco gas station on 415 Route 9W and observed that it failed to use turn signals while traveling on the road.

The officer approached the vehicle once it entered a CVS parking lot on 416 Route 9W and immediately noticed the driver's red and watery eyes, and an odor of alcoholic beverage from his mouth.

Identified as 50-year-old Martin Garcia of Ravena, he said that he had "six beers at home" and the officer noted his slurred speech and stumbling as he exited his vehicle.

Police reported an open container of Budweiser and three open bottles of Southern Comfort. Garcia was arrested after he failed field sobriety tests with a reported BAC of 0.19 percent.

Garcia was charged with aggravated DWI with a BAC of 0.18 percent or more, a DWI 1st offense, failure to signal, an uninspected motor vehicle and having an open container in a vehicle. He had a scheduled return court date of Tuesday, March 19 at 5:30 p.m.

Kibbey to be laid to rest Welcoming girls now

Remains found near site of 1967 copter crash in Vietnam

WASHINGTON, **D.C.** — The family of a fallen Vietnam War helicopter pilot will finally be able to lay him to rest this week.

In 1967, Col. Richard Kibbey was a rescue helicopter pilot in Vietnam when his Sikorsky "Jolly Green Giant" was shot down after retrieving a downed pilot in the Mu Gia Pass valley of Vietnam.

Last August, his family was notified that his remains had been identified.

Kibbey's flag-draped casket will arrive in a Dignified Arrival ceremony at Reagan National Airport shortly before 1 p.m. on Thursday, March 28, in Washington, D.C.

The ceremony will be followed by a viewing at Jefferson Funeral Chapel in Alexandria, Virginia, at 3 p.m. before a funeral service at Arlington National Cemetary the following day on Friday, March 29, at 11 a.m.

The crew took the lead in a rescue mission to retrieve Air Force pilot, Capt. Lucius L. Heiskell, whose single-prop O-1F "Birddog" was shot down over the Mu Gia Pass near the Laos-Vietnam border.

Kibbev and his crew successfully retrieved the downed pilot.

However, as they proceeded to leave the valley, their helicopter caught fire after it was hit with heavy gunfire.

The Mu Gia Pass was one of two major arteries to the Ho Chi Minh Trail, a pathway that meandered through mountains and thick jungle that was used to supply enemy forces.

Between April 1965 and December 1971, 43 American airmen were downed and later listed as either missing or captured.

Delmar's Scouts BSA Troop 75 is more open than ever

DELMAR — The town's Boy Scouts of America Troop 75 has become the first of its kind in Albany County to have a Girls Troop, having first being officially formed back on March 1.

Traditionally long been only available for boys, the BSA decided just last year to open the scouting program up to all youth, regardless of gender, leading its flagship program, Boy Scouting, to change its name to Scouts BSA to take into account the new change. For Delmar's Troop 75, it offers numerous annual activities and events for boys and girls aged 11 through 17 like summer camp, day hikes, field trips, service projects and weekend campouts.

Scoutmaster Suzy Pris, who has a son and a daughter now in Scouts BSA, said, "It's fabulous and now, the older brothers in the troop are helping and guiding if the girls need help with

something. Normally in a troop, you've got older and younger scouts but since we're still so new, we don't have that. Thankfully, the brothers have taken on the role as guides, if you will."

She also expressed gratitude to Troop 75's committee who were open to having girls join and "they've been more than willing to accomodate so it's been really great."

Beth Gannon, 15, one of three girls who have joined Troop 75 so far, said she hopes to get the coveted Eagle Scout rank — the Scouts BSA's highest rank. To achieve

that, she would have to demonstrate strong leadership, citizenship and community-oriented skills and attain numerous merit badges along the way. She hopes to attain that rank by the end of 2020 and if she does accomplish this, she said, "You'll be included as like the first class of girls to get that." Pris said that achieving that rank within 18 or 19 months is "certainly the fastest route but it's doable."

While admitting that the Girls Troop is still fairly new and is still working to develop its

New studio promotes self-sustaining creativity

BETHLEHEM — The public library held its ribbon-cutting ceremony for its new self-service Studio Makerspace on Friday, March 22 at 11 a.m. to officially open it to residents who can use to film videos, record podcasts, convert audio and video files, and more.

"We're very excited, we've been talking about this for a very long time and it's nice to bring it to fruition," said library director Geoffrey Kirkpatrick. He added that in the past week or so, the library has received an anticipatory response from the public and had even given a few exclusive tours to some residents prior to the ceremony.

This ADA-compliant studio space is now open all week and can be reserved through the library's online calendar for three-hour increments by an individual or a group at one time with an Upper Hudson Library card.

It includes a One Button desktop — comprising of

a built-in video camera, a silver button to start and end recording, and a USB port where an inserted flash drive would save the recorded raw footage which is accompanied by a talk show-esque backdrop with two seats, a middle table and blue background curtains.

Once the user presses the aforementioned silver button, they are given an eight-second countdown during which they can quickly head over to the seats, just in time as the video camera commences recording.

In addition, the studio has a podcasting studio to record personal or professional podcasts, a VHS-to-DVD conversion machine, and 10 laptops equipped with video editing software Adobe Premiere Elements. A user can also borrow a video camera for two weeks in case they would like to film or record beyond the library grounds.

The ceremony was attended by numerous local politicians and public figures, including Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven, Town Board members Joyce Becker and Jim Foster, the town's Chamber of Commerce's president Maureen McGuinness, and state Assemblywoman Patricia Fahy.

"This is part of why I love libraries because it is equal access, equal opportunities and because of the variety of things you could do here, it just fuels our creativity and provides even more opportunities for our youth which is what it is really all about in the end," said Fahy. "It's stimulating their minds, stimulating that creativity because that is the future, right?"

She brought up how it can relate to how digital literacy is highly encouraged nowadays as we live in a more techfueled world. "So thank you to everyone here and in the town who are continuing to make this town as great as it is with all the opportunities at our fingertips," she said.

VanLuven said that he personally distinguishes the Bethlehem library as the best within the local region.

He said that it's "evolving with our community, evolving with the times. We still have books but the library is our community center and hub. It's so much more than just books ... This is an opportunity for residents to more effectively

POINT OF VIEW My father's memories of Delmar

The following is a Point of View from Voorheesville author Sandra Paige Sorell. She shares the stories and memories passed on to her from her father who grew up in Delmar. This is Part One of a two-part series.

was recently at the Bethlehem Veterans Memorial Park to visit my father's memorial stone and to reflect. My sister and I purchased a brick for Dad a couple of years before he died. He was very proud of that gift. After a quiet visit I sat down on one of the benches and remembered...

My dad was Dr. Harry Worthington Paige (1922-2003). He grew up in Delmar as

part of the Greatest Generation, graduating from Bethlehem Central High School (class of '41) when it was located on Kenwood Ave — the building that is now the middle school. As a young kid, he and his sister Jeanne (Martha) Paige lived on 5 Rural Place near the Restifo family. When Dad was 16 and Aunt Jeanne 15, they moved to the new family home at 16 Douglas Road. This house remained the Paige family home until 1996 when my grandmother, Ruth Converse Paige, died at the age of 99.

Dad was a writer and a storyteller and he talked often about growing up in Delmar. His childhood was

a magical one full of fun, friends and innocence.

As a kid, Dad's fun consisted of playing with his yo-yo, shooting marbles, collecting stamps and playing games like Kick the Can or dodge ball in one of the many open lots in Delmar. Climbing trees was another favorite activity, especially since Delmar was densely wooded in the 1930s and 1940s, before the migration to the suburbs and building boom. He, like many of his friends, was a Boy Scout, and that occupied a good deal of his time.

Dad was a prolific writer. He told me that he sold his first story when he was 12, during the Depression era. He said he felt very guilty accepting money for the sale as so many men were out of work, and families were going hungry at the time.

Life was relatively simple when Dad was growing up. A Paige family excursion to Warner's Lake for a picnic and swim on a hot summer day was considered a real adventure. I remember hearing the story about my grandfather, Montfort (Monty) Paige, a notoriously slow driver, receiving a speeding ticket on one of the family trips up to the Helderbergs. He was mortified. An occasional trip to the Hawkins Stadium to see the Albany Senators baseball team was a big deal too. Then there were

summertime excursions to Mid-City in Menands near where Montgomery Ward used to be in that massive building on Broadway. He would take a red and yellow United Traction Company bus there to enjoy the park and cool off in the large pool.

Dad went to Elsmere Grade School when it was a brand new school. His mother, a former Latin teacher and Syracuse University graduate, was a member of the PTA there.

Of all the stories Dad told, the most vivid in my mind were of his days spent at his beloved alma mater, Bethlehem Central, where he met my mother, Ruth Killough (class of '42), an accomplished

athlete and field hockey star.

Dad's best friends were named Prue, Van Zandt, Chesbro, Oliver, Hartzel and Murray. There were other names too that I've forgotten over the years. Some 20 years and one world war later, quite a few of Dad's buddies returned to the Delmar area to live, work and raise families. Some of their children became my classmates at Bethlehem Central in the 1960s.



Amy Roos, the musical's director, said that it would focus more on the accident's true events and affected real-life people, instead of being a straightforward adaptation of the James Cameron-helmed 1997 namesake film which starred Leonardo DiCaprio and Kate Winslet. The central theme would be tragedy, she added. "Titanic" had been decided to be produced last summer because of its challenging Tony Award-winning music score which the cast and orchestra felt willing to tackle, and it had almost 40 speaking roles in addition to the ensemble — this provided more opportunities for students to participate.

The result is planned to be ambitious, with large-scale onstage props and moving staircases sets to emulate the Edwardian era-styled ship. Roos said that around 35 parents have volunteered to help out with the production and provide more props, costumes and publicity. Roos also worked with technical director Michael O'Keeffe to develop more opportunities for students who want to do tech for the shows and she even has a student team, comprising of a stage manager, two assistant stage managers and an assistant director. She perceived them as an "invaluable asset" who are open to learning about tech in theater and they rise "to every challenge they are given.'

Meanwhile, costume Andrea Adamczyk and her crew have helped incorporate their research of the Edwardian era into their

costume creations.

While attending a rehearsal on Wednesday, March 20, such costumes were not worn by the students yet and the stage sets and props were still being finalized. Nevertheless, students took the subject matter seriously as they began portraying real-life individuals and couples who became torn apart by the classist treatment of passengers as well as the rule that women and children only should begin boarding the emergency lifeboats.

The overall cast, who first auditioned for roles back in January, appeared ready to depict the frenzied mass of doomed passengers as many students littered the stage, as if showing how large the stakes are.

Grant Napierski, a senior student who

portrays Captain Edward John Smith, said that while he has already been in all the shows throughout his high school years, he wanted to join this production in order to work with Roos, whom he and the other students view as a new director since longtime theater director James Yeara retired in 2017. "It's also a show I've never been in before and I never really heard this music before, and I think a lot of people felt that way," he said. "But I just wanted another theater experience and it's definitely a cool, interesting show to be in.'

Sophomore Brayden Karn, who plays naval architect Thomas Andrews, similarly said he just wanted to be a part of this production, regardless of what role he got. Adding that he personally enjoys singing and musical theater, he said he has enjoyed Roos' direction thus far and he appreciated

the theater club's overall positive environment. "We have great fellow actors here and we all really enjoy being here," he said.

Sarah Marshall, a senior who plays Quartermaster Hitchens, said that while many of her fellow costars are passionate about musical theater, "Titanic: The Musical" is a show that most are not familiar with. Liking how this production offers many speaking roles as opposed to other musicals that only have a few starring roles, she said that she at least wanted a character with a name since she'd always been in the ensemble in past musical productions. "So, when I saw the cast list come out and that I have a name, that's good enough for me and I was just happy about that," she laughed, adding that she does plan to continue pursuing theater seriously beyond high school.

When asked if she had any advice for such students who want to continue doing theater after graduation, Roos said it's best "to find your niche. Find the thing that makes you stand out above the pack. It doesn't have to be strictly talent. It can be your reliability, your ability to memorize lines quickly, your physical comedy, speaking another language. Find the thing that gives you an edge." In the meantime, she said that she has enjoyed working with her students, regardless of if they are graduating this year or not. "They are an incredibly talented group and I will be very proud when the curtain goes up on opening night," she concluded.

The various ways to fund your home project



6 options for funding your next home improvement project

B efore starting a home improvement project, either on one's own or with the assistance of a professional contractor, homeowners must first consider the costs

1. Cash-out refinancing: With cash-out refinancing, a person will begin the mortgage process anew with the intention of paying

> off the current mortgage balance, and then taking out additional funds for other purposes. Cash-out refinancing is a way to tap into a home's existing equity for use on improvements or other expenses, such as college tuition.

2. Home equity line of credit: The financial experts at Bankrate indicate that a HELOC works like a credit card, with the house as collateral. There is a credit limit, and borrowers can spend up to that limit. The interest rate may or may not be fixed. However, the interest may be tax-deductible if the financing is used to improve, buy or build a home.

3. Home equity loan: Individuals also can borrow against equity in their homes with a fixed interest rate through a home equity loan. Most lenders will calculate 80 percent of the home value and subtract a homeowner's mortgage balance to figure out how much can be borrowed, according to the financial advisory site The Simple Dollar.

4. Personal loan: Homeowners can shop around at various financial institutions for competitive personal loans to be used for home improvement purposes. Funds may be approved within one business day, which can be ideal for those who want to begin their improvements soon.

5. Personal line of credit: A personal line of credit allows borrowers to borrow only the money needed at the time, and offers a variable interest rate that is generally lower than fixed loan rates. Again, like a credit card, PLOC gives a person a maximum borrowing amount and is ideal for ongoing purchases.

6. Credit cards: In a pinch, credit cards can be used to finance improvements, but they do come with the cost of very high interest rates if the balance is not paid in full by the time the bill comes due. However, for funding smaller projects and maximizing rewards points through home improvement retailers or specific credit card company promotions, credit cards can be a way to earn various perks in addition to the benefit of improving a home.

Homeowners looking to finance their next improvements should speak to a financial advisor and shop around for the best types of funding for them.



ALBANY COUNTY — Cancer is a universal topic. Think of the topics you discuss around the water cooler: Not everyone can appreciate politics. Not everyone can speak adequately about the nuances of baseball

strategy. But everyone has something to say about cancer. According to the New York Cancer Registry, there was an average of nearly 2,000 new cases of cancer each year between 2011 and 2015 in Albany County alone. At the same time, Schenectady County averaged roughly 1,000 cases, as did Rensselaer. Saratoga County registered about 1,400 new cases. It works out to a rate of 1 out of 200 people throughout the Capital District. For some of us, that's one or two people with whom we graduated high school.







Guide to wigs and head coverings

ancer patients face various challenges. One of the more difficult side effects of cancer treatment is the probability of hair loss, as both men and women report hair loss as one of the side effects they fear the most after being diagnosed with cancer.

Hair loss may be a side effect of chemotherapy. But the Mayo Clinic notes that not everyone who undergoes chemotherapy will experience hair loss, which may be a side effect of the medication chosen and dosage administered. Chemotherapy drugs are powerful medications that attack rapidly growing cancer cells. However, these drugs not only impact cancerous cells, but they affect healthy cells as well. That means they can affect any cells in the body, including those that form hair follicles.

Cancer-related hair loss can occur just about anywhere hair grows. But while hair loss elsewhere on the body can be concealed relatively easily, it's hair loss on one's head that

• Begin shopping early. Hair loss may begin two to four weeks after treatment is initiated. Explore your options once you know your treatment plan. Ask for referrals to reputable wig shops or browse online to see which options are available to you.

• Learn about sizing. Women's wigs generally come in three different sizes: petite, average and large. Many wear an average cap. To achieve the correct measurements, have someone measure the circumference of your head, tracing around the perimeter of your hairline and continuing behind the ears. A flexible seamstress measuring tape is helpful. Also, measure from the tip of the spine to the front of the head.

• Choose your hair type. Wigs come in a variety of materials. These include human hair, synthetic hair and heat-friendly synthetic hair. Human hair will require similar maintenance to a regular head of hair and will not hold styles long. Therefore, if you desire a wig that requires less maintenance, then synthetic is the way to go. These wigs retain their shape and can still be relatively indistinguishable in appearance from human hair. For women who would like versatility in styling, a heat-friendly synthetic wig can be styled much like human hair and will not be damaged by heat-producing appliances.

• Select cap type. Caps come in different materials and sewing types. Some, such as hand-tied caps, have







eg of lamb is a popular dish at family outings. Whether it's a holiday meal, anniversary dinner or a double date at home with friends, lamb can set the tone for a memorable night. Hosts who want to experiment with a less traditional take on lamb can try the following recipe for "Rack of Lamb With a Coffee and Avocado Honey Crust" courtesy of Laurey Masterton's "The Fresh Honey Cookbook" (Storey).

Rack of Lamb with a Coffee and Avocado Honey Crust

Ingredients: Serves 4

- 1/4 cup toasted fresh bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup honey, preferably avocado honey
- 1/4 cup coarse–ground mustard
- 1 small rack of lamb (about 2 pounds) Sea salt

Coarsely ground black pepper Granulated garlic

cup strong brewed coffee or espresso
 cup white wine

Instructions:

1. Preheat the oven to 375° F.

2. Make a paste of the bread crumbs, honey and mustard in a small bowl, mixing until just combined.

3. Season the lamb rack with salt, pepper and granulated garlic. Spread the honey-mustard paste on the meat side of the rack. Place the lamb rack in a baking dish just large enough to hold it, preferably one that can also be placed directly on the stove top. Pour the coffee into the bottom of the baking dish.

4. Bake for 10 minutes, or until the crust is set, then

baste with the pan drippings, trying not to dissolve the honey-mustard mixture. Continue to bake until a meat thermometer reads 130 F, 20 minutes or longer. Keep a careful watch. If your racks are small, this may take less time. Similarly, larger racks will take longer. When the proper temperature is reached, remove from the oven. Transfer the lamb rack to a warmed plate to rest while you prepare the sauce.

5. Place the baking dish on the stove. Simmer the drippings over the medium-high heat and add the wine to deglaze the pan, stirring with a wooden spoon. Add any additional juices that might have collected on the plate from the resting lamb. Stir until the drippings and wine are well mixed and slightly thick, about 5 minutes.

6. Cut the rack into rib portions and serve with the warmed sauce.

Note: To make fresh crumbs, simply cut a few slices of bread into tiny pieces or pulse a few slices in a food processor for a few seconds. You are looking for coarse crumbs, not grains of sand. To toast, toss in a dry saucepan over medium heat for a few minutes, until the bread dries and turns golden brown.

HEALTH & FITNESS Alcohol: friend or foe?

The answer isn't cut and dry

lcohol can be both tonic and poison. Literature suggesting that light to moderate drinking presents a plethora of health benefits can be found if people go looking for it. However, alcohol also has its detractors, who say that the risks outweigh the benefits when it comes to drinking. This makes it even more complicated to decided if consuming alcohol is something that can safely be included in one's lifestyle or if it's something to be avoided.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says that alcohol can affect every organ in the body. It is a central nervous system depressant that is rapidly absorbed from the stomach and small intestine into the bloodstream. The Mayo Clinic advises that moderate alcohol consumption may provide some health benefits. These can include reducing risk of developing and dying from heart disease. There's a possible reduction in the risk of ischemic stroke, which occurs when the arteries to the brain narrow or become blocked, impacting blood flow. Some think that moderate alcohol consumption may



reduce one's risk of diabetes.

The Harvard Medical School indicates that moderate drinking protecting against cardiovascular disease and diabetes makes sense biologically and scientifically. Moderate amounts of alcohol raise levels of high-density lipoprotein (HDL, or "good" cholesterol), and higher HDL levels



are associated with greater protection against heart disease. Moderate alcohol consumption has also been linked with beneficial changes ranging from greater sensitivity to insulin to improvements in factors that influence blood clotting.

Alcohol has a dark side, too. Its most pronounced issue is the toll it can take on the liver. Heavy alcohol use can cause inflammation or scarring of the liver. The World Cancer Research Fund also ties alcohol to cancers of the mouth, pharynx, larynx, esophagus, breast, liver, colon, and rectum. People who cannot control their drinking can develop addictions that affect both their personal and professional lives.

Moderation is essential when consuming alcohol. Those who do not currently drink are not advised to do so just for the potential health benefits. However, people who have one to two drinks (12 ounces of beer, eight ounces of malt liquor, five ounces of wine, or 1.5 ounces of liquor) on a regular basis and are healthy overall should generally have few problems, according to the Mayo Clinic. Still, it is always best to consult with a physician about alcohol consumption and its potential effects on one's overall health.

Ariana goes big

Star sets out to tour world two years after Manchester Arena tragedy

ALBANY — "We're way too fly to partake in all this hate, we out here vibin'." This memorable lyric from pop icon Ariana Grande's 2018 hit single, "No Tears Left to Cry," rang true during her opening night of her "Sweetener World Tour" at the Times Union Center in Albany on Monday, March 18. Positivity, gratitude and Instagram-worthy visuals dominated her concert, as she sang her way down the often-lit-in-pink stage, beaming as hundreds of fans harmonized along and danced with abandon.

It seemed that Grande was on top of the world as her cheeky retail-therapythemed banger, "7 Rings," reclaimed the top spot on the Billboard Hot 100 again for a sixth non-consecutive week the same day as she embarked on her tour. She also recently won her first-ever Grammy for Best Pop Vocal Album for 2018's "Sweetener" last February. With an infectious blitzkrieg of dance-ready hits and soothing ballads, all may seem well for Grande.

However, reflecting back on the aforementioned lyric, this was her first

tour since the Dangerous Woman Tour, which became infamous when a suicide bombing happened on May 22, 2017 at her Manchester Arena show, which left 22 dead and 139 injured in Manchester, England. For this reason, security to her Albany "Sweetener" concert was more pronounced. Grande's personal life also took a public nosedive when rapper Mac Miller, whom Grande dated from August 2016 to May 2018, died from an accidental drug overdose; Grande soon dated actor Pete Davidson later that May and got engaged in June, only to break it off later in October. Grande became the subject of much commentary on social media and the press as a result, including how there have been people who blamed Grande for Miller's death and have ridiculed her for her swift engagement.

With these in mind, things did lighten up when she surprise-released her fifth album, "Thank U, Next" — just six months after "Sweetener" — which earned critical acclaim and broke streaming and music video-viewership records with her three singles, "Thank U, Next," "7 Rings," and "Break Up with Your Girlfriend, I'm Bored."

Leading into the Albany concert, the



stage featured two gigantic, planet-like orbs — one from the ceiling and the other on the stage's central screen — and a V-like runway that jutted out through the arena's floor. Many fans were decked in NASA-themed sweatshirts, a reference to Grande's namesake song, knee-high boots and ponytails to copy her iconic hairstyle. Ariana Grande / Facebook

Prior to Grande's appearance, Pennsylvania-based pop duo Social House and former Fifth Harmony member Normani were her opening acts, the latter particularly enchanting the arena with her applause-

worthy stage presence and humble disposition.

This being her first solo tour, Normani has since been gradually building her solo portfolio, with hits like 2018's "Love Lies" with Khalid and 2019's "Dancing with a Stranger" with Sam Smith. Known for her impeccable dancing abilities, her choreography always were fluid and jaw-dropping, staying in harmony with her fellow background dancers. Speaking of harmony, she surprised the arena by performing a medley of Rihanna's hits and offering Fifth Harmony nostalgic songs, like 2014's "Boss," 2015's "Worth It" and 2016's "Work from Home." In fact, the concert was just one day before the anniversary of Fifth Harmony announcing its hiatus.

The concert began when the stage's backdrop and central orb emulated an eclipse, combining visuals of a fiery sun and silent moon, while Grande performed the a cappella "Raindrops (An Angel Cried)" to prove again how she neither required background dancers nor instruments to excite an arena. The audience melted into a frenzied blur when Grande then re-enacted her 2018 MTV Video Music Awards performance with "God is a Woman" where she raised eyebrows with her impressive whistle notes.

Continuing with the sassy "Bad Idea," she began traversing the V-shaped runway, giving fans an opportunity to see her up close, as she sang "Break Up with Your Girlfriend, I'm Bored" with some sinful choreography and playful winks. "Be Alright" came next with the same memorable vogueing routines from years' past, followed by the more intimate "Sweetener" and "Successful" numbers. Later on, the arena grew deafening when she performed "7 Rings" while the backdrop had similar pink house trap-like visuals like those of its music video. A pink graffiti-clad car also appeared onstage where she exuded confidence as she posed and looked unbothered while her dancers surrounded her.

The two large orbs offered magnificent imagery throughout the night, particularly during "NASA," a crowd favorite, where planets, galaxies, stars and moons hovered all over the screens. "NASA" had been one of the most highly-anticipated songs before the album came out and since the Albany concert was the first time she ever performed it live, there was a grand catharsis as fans loudly preached its chorus and jumped simultaneously.

Songs like "Breathin," "Fake Smile," "Needy" and "Goodnight n Go" offered a more vulnerable side to Grande, taking a welcomed diversion from the show's largely upbeat nature. "One Last Time"



was especially poignant as it was a tribute to the fallen Manchester victims. Older numbers like "Love Me Harder," "Right There," and "Break Your Heart Right Back" showed how she had not forgotten her first two albums, 2013's "Yours Truly" and 2014's "My Everything," which all felt so distant from now.

Grande's personal life showed throughout the night too, like an interlude in the form of a scene from one of her favorite films, 1996's "The First Wives Club," featuring Goldie Hawn's character who declared, "I do have feelings! I'm an actress! I have all of them!" There were a few clips of Grande performing and acting when she was a young girl, and Grande's own brother and mother, Frankie and Joan, were attending the concert as well. The concert felt like a diary which had recorded and adapted her life journey thus far into a musical spectacle.


The night would conclude with the joyful "No Tears Left to Cry" and the self-love anthem, "Thank U, Next." For the former, the backdrop featured animations of floating staircases and rising umbrellas while her dancers swayed gently with their own physical umbrellas, recreating the song's trippy music video.

The latter began, after a chilling montage of how the song had made headlines for its subject matter and charttopping success, with some technical difficulties though. Grande and four dancers rose from below the stage but she lacked a working microphone — the audience helped her out though by singing along to the lyrics as she eventually received a functioning one. It has become an inside joke among Grande fans that she has not been able to perform this song without some mishap or getting too emotional. She had first debuted the song live in a November 2018 performance on "The Ellen DeGeneres Show" where she slipped after descending from a chair in heels, and she also messed up some of its lyrics during a rendition at the Billboard's Women in Music event the month after.

After descending onto the V-runway one last time with "First Wives Club"inspired choreography, she expressed gratitude to the audience before exiting the arena. For an artist who has endured so much tragedy, drama and commentary from the media and public in the past few years, Grande seemed resilient and ready to continue entertaining audiences as her tour will spill throughout the rest of North America and Europe through October 13 this year. While Albany fans may see her opening night concert as a way of getting up close to her, perhaps Grande saw this as the beginning of a road to reconnect with her love of performing and to let go of her demons from 2018 — a process that would happen on each stop of her tour.

And for that, we say thank you, next show.

MUSIC REVIEW Driftwood's 'Time of Shade'

Band's fifth studio release comes 'from the heart,' out this spring

riftwood is set to release their fifth studio album this coming spring. This folk-rock and Americanainfluenced band has grown over the years from a duo to a five-piece group. Band members include Dan Forsyth (guitar/vocals), Joe Kollar (banjo/guitar/ vocals), Claire Byrne (violin/vocals), Joey Acuri (bass), and Will Sigel (drums). Each additional instrument and added vocalist serve to create the rounded and wholesome feel of Driftwood's music.

Reminiscent of the sentiment of their band name, Driftwood continues to evolve with the passage of time. Tree of Shade consists of eleven tracks and represents the group's sonic evolution as they experiment with slower paced music. Personally, listening to this album puts me back around a campfire on a chilly summer night. The opening track "California" (which also happens to be violin/ vocalist Claire Byrne's favorite track) helps set the tone for the rest of the album as it embodies the previously described ambiance.

Perhaps one of my

favorite aspects of this album is the quality and quantity of the vocals. Songs like "Conquering Man" and "Santa Fe" beautifully portray the strength and conviction in Byrne's voice while "Stick With Me" demonstrates the bright harmonies the group is capable of delivering. "Stick With Me" is another standout track for guitar/ vocalist Dan Forsyth as he loves "how simple and timeless it is." Other noteworthy elements in their music consist of the raw sounds from the guitar and banjo as well as the

ever-present violin as heard in the closing few bars of "Tree of Shade," the title track of the album.

The group created this album in the Catskill Mountains and undoubtedly captured the energy of their surrounding environment. They said it was their first time working with a major producer like Simone Felice and he




really encouraged them to keep it simple and stick to whatever captures the song.


When I first heard songs like "Lay Like You Do" and "What You Do to Me," I couldn't help but think of other beloved bands who create similar sentiments in their music. Driftwood, like The Zac Brown Band and Mumford and Sons, succeeds in inciting feelings of togetherness through the power of music. Some groups the band cite as their biggest musical influences span across generations including Paul Simon, Dr. Dog, Brandi

Carlile, and Bob Dylan. It is evident by this list that they value "great songwriting and music that comes from the heart" as they told me.

"The album is emotional, mature and introspective. In some ways, it's really folky but there are also some tracks that we really took chances on."The group shared that their goal for the upcoming album is "just to touch people's hearts" as they "want to connect with [their] audience and share the music and this life."

their guitar playing in "Crawl In" and "I'll Be Fine," respectively. These changes represent a larger effort by producer Rix to experiment with the recording process. Encouraging the band to delve deeper into their non-traditional structure allowed Upstate to nail down its characteristic tone and sound.

Say What You Will's 'Anything, Everything'

Boundary pushing infusions of other genres creates 'unique and inspiring' album

ignettes of heartache, redemption, hometown joy and drama fuel Anything, Everything, the sophomore album from the Connecticut-based poppunk band Say What You Will. Hailing from New Haven, the band is Christine Sabol on bass guitar, Shane Emery on vocals and lead guitar, Chuck DeFilippo on drums and Ethan Griffeth on lead vocals. Amongst changes in personnel and other identity shifts since 2017's Seconds to Home, the new album is a work of passion and exploration, sure to excite longtime fans and attract new ones. The band supported the album release by debuting their music video for the feature track, "Southbound," in late February.

Drawing from the likes of State Champs, Grayscale, Sleep On It and others, Say What You Will found a way to create a distinctive, unique sound while paying homage to their influences. Recorded with Chris Piquette at No Boundaries Studios in Rhode Island, the record marks a new age of growth and maturation for the band.

From the start, "Break Away" pulls listeners in, skipping casual orbit and launching them directly into the fiery atmosphere of Anything, Everything. The restrained, energy-building intro showcases the band's chemistry by allowing Griffeth's expressive voice to sit on top of the rhythm, culminating in a quick stop and explosion of layered melody sure to get peoples' bodies moving.

Moving on, it's clear that a key strength of the album is how it dynamically shifts between the blasting, yell-along, triumphant choruses and the sensitive, yearning reprieves. "Carolina" stands apart as a pop-punk ballad, an ode to a specific place and time, displaying Emery's



journeying, skilled guitar and the interplay between drums and Sabol's bass. The record picks up the pace again in "Lake Zoar," filled with jump-along moments.

Distinct from the instrumentation of each song, there are the stories Griffeth shares through emotive vocals and heartwrenchingly piercing lyrics. "Summer Haze" ends the album with a story of a woman who's struggled with helping her significant other with drug addiction. Inspired by heroin epidemics in Griffeth's hometown, the song is the band's plea to shine a light on dark moments.

Anything, Everything has all the elements of what makes a great pop-punk record, though it doesn't stop there. The Album art

album represents a refined and redefined sound identity for the group. Listeners will always find their way to the catchy hooks, the grooves and breakdowns in the songs that feature boundary-pushing infusions from other genres. Say What You Will has put all their cards on the table, successfully creating something unique and inspiring. Pop-punk fans will find plenty of value and perspective from picking up this album.

Each year, one or two of our former classmates learns they have cancer.

Connie Bramer learned of her breast cancer in 2008. Then, she was a single mother of a 7- and 8-year-old. Her mother had died at 53 after a bout with breast cancer. Bramer was 26 and could recall the "valiant effort" in her mother's fight with the disease. She knew she'd someday get it. That she'd someday be the fourth generation in her family to be diagnosed with it. She just didn't expect it at 39.

"When you become diagnosed with breast cancer, you get thrown into a club of sorts," she told an audience that gathered at the William K Sanford Town Library in Colonie to hear her read from her book. She said the club wasn't unlike that of being in a sorority. "And, I know all about that, because I was one of those." Just, this time, her initiation wasn't by choice.

Greg Aidala is an entertainer. His voice, his face, his very personality is a commercial brand. The Loudonville native has monetized his gift for comedy into a successful business. One in which he finds himself hustling to and from New York City. He appeared in the Lifetime Network movie "Off the Rails," a featured regularly in the Amazon Prime series "Welcome Home," and frequently performs at Gotham comedy clubs. He's a busy man. But, when it comes to charitable groups like Get Your Rack Back, of which he is a board member, he makes time.

Like Bramer, Aidala lost his mother to cancer, too. He was just a young kid.

On Saturday, March 30, Aidala will perform and present as master of ceremonies for Rack-a-palooza at Hilton Garden Inn in Clifton Park, from 6 to 10 p.m. It's a charity event organized by Bramer's non-for-profit Get Your Rack

Back to raise money to fund the little things that help families touched by cancer.

Named after Bramer's 2012 memoir, Get Your Rack Back helps local families by providing gas and grocery gift cards, and medical copay assistance. She said she was inspired by the kindness of others as she went through her medical treatment a decade ago. People she had never met sent her cards with inspiring words. Fruit baskets and meals were sent to her home. Her friends came to the rescue; picking her kids up from school and even assisting them with their homework when Bramer was too ill to get out of bed. The gift cards and assistance provided by Get Your Rack Back, she said, helps prevent families from having to decide between groceries and medical treatment.

The organization raises close to \$50,000 each year for local families. Each gift, Aidala said, is hand delivered. "That's what makes it so great," he said.

For \$55 a ticket, the night includes light fare, one drink ticket, artisan beer and spirits tastings. Sirsy is scheduled to headline the night's live music.

For Melanie Krahmer, who makes up one half of the dynamic rock duo, the evening will provide her and Rich Libutti the opportunity to share their gratitude, Krahmer's own fight against breast cancer last year went public. The two had to explain the sudden cancelation of a three-month tour before she sought her treatment for breast cancer again.

Krahmer, who sings and plays drums for the band, went several months without picking up the sticks. Though the thought of taking an extended vacation from touring sounds like a treat, it wasn't. The drums were taken away from her. In the midst of her treatment, she received a gift from Get Your Rack Back. Now, Krahmer is looking forward to Saturday's show.

"I'm looking forward to being able to give some of that love back," said Krahmer.
