District residents will head to the polls to decide the fates of both their respective school budgets and the candidates running for seats upon their school boards on Tuesday, May 21.

Police: Lock your car, folks

DELMAR — The Bethlehem Police Department is investigating multiple reported larcenies from unlocked vehicles and residential burglaries in the Old Delmar neighborhood, which occurred overnight on Monday, May 6 through the early morning of Tuesday, May 7.

Such items reported stolen by residents included money, credit cards, cash, electronic devices, and jewelry. Overhead garage doors and vehicles on driveways had been left open and unlocked at the time of the incidents, and in some cases, the suspects had entered the homes through the garage to take items from inside. No one has been reported hurt though.

The affected area encompasses Winne Road, Fernbank Avenue, Douglas Road, Brookside Drive, Delmar Place, and nearby streets.

BPD Cmdr. Adam Hornick said police believe there are multiple suspects but no resident has reported encountering any suspicious individual so far.

He also encouraged residents, particularly those living in or around the aforementioned streets, to review any possible surveillance footage they have to see if anything or anyone suspicious is caught on camera.

Hornick said it is, unfortunately, commonplace for Delmar residents to leave their vehicles on their driveways and front doors unlocked, and leave their garage doors open. "I feel that it is concerning and we know many people who are too trusting and people also have this belief that crime does not happen on their streets because they think they live in a safe neighborhood," he said. "It's obviously not the case and we have been dealing with these types of incidents recently a lot."

He added that the BPD has been working and sharing information with other local police departments to determine if similar incidents occurred elsewhere recently too.

Hornick encouraged residents to also make sure their vehicles are locked at all times with no personal valuables visible from the windows, leave exterior lighting or motion lights on overnight, and lock all garage and front doors.

"If you hear something, say something, and call us," he added. "Alert us so that we could also have a police car come through your area which can prevent crimes from happening."

Bus aide in abandoned child case retires

School board approves retirement without public statement

DELMAR — In a unanimous decision, Bethlehem Central's Board of Education accepted the resignation of the bus attendant linked to the incident which left an autistic student unsupervised and outside in below-freezing temperatures for two hours after he was dropped off at work in April.

Stephanie Corbett, a 20-year employee of the district, resigned to retire effective April 29. According to multiple sources, Corbett was the bus attendant present when Michael Seavey was transported by bus to his job as part of a school-to-work program on Monday, April 1. However, the business was closed for the day.

Seavey, whose communication skills are challenged due to his autism, was unable to seek help. He stood in the cold for two hours before another bus arrived to pick him up at his scheduled time.

According to a source familiar with the situation, Corbett



was later involved in another incident which was immediately followed by her resignation. *The Spotlight* filed a request for a copy of the termination agreement under the state's Freedom of Information Act. The district said there is no such agreement on file. The details of the incident have not been disclosed by the district.

Members of the Board of Education were asked if they were aware of the details behind Corbett's resignation. The board's president declined to respond, stating in an email that the board is "bound by confidentiality."

"It is the policy of the board and of the district that personnel matters are dealt with in Executive Session, and the board and the administration are bound by confidentiality to not discuss such matters in public," stated BCSD board President Michael Cooper. "This is to ensure not only

the privacy of the staff member involved but also to protect the integrity of the investigation."

Seavey, a 21-year-old student in the final year at Bethlehem Central, was enrolled in a school-to-work program on April 1. His daily schedule involved attending a few morning classes before being bused to his employer for a two-hour shift starting at 11:15 a.m. Afterward, he would return back to school for additional classes. His parents provide him a cell phone, to which he carries with him at school. However, he's not permitted to have it while at work.

According to his parents, Seavey would be escorted from the bus by the bus attendant before he was handed off to his employer. On April 1, that did not happen. The place of business was closed for the day. The site's owner was out of town and one of

the employees neglected to inform the school. When Seavey was dropped off, the bus allegedly left before he attempted to walk into the building. Without his cell phone, he was unable to call for help. He was found two hours later, where he was dropped off. In response, the district promised new "protocols."

"Something like this should never happen and is absolutely unacceptable," said BCSD Superintendent Jody Monroe. "We have put in place new transportation protocols for our work program students to make sure this does not happen again... Additionally, we are working to improve the communication with our business partners who host our students."

According to the district's Communication Department, the district has worked on strengthening communications between worksites. However, there are no current investigations into the transportation department.

"I am not aware of any investigation of the department," said JoEllen Gardner, of the district's Communications Department.

Since the incident, the Seavey family has reported that Michael struggles with post-traumatic stress along with panic attacks. They have since retained the services of an attorney.

Who are you?

A few questions with the three candidates running for Bethlehem Central's Board of Education

Jonathan Fishbein

1. What is your current job/occupation?

I am General Counsel at the NYS Division of Veterans Services where I have the honor of helping Veterans obtain the benefits and services they earned through their service to our country.

2. Where do you live?

Delmar

3. Why are you running for a seat on the School Board?

I am running for re-election because I have more to accomplish. For example, I support the move to a later high school start time. While the science is undeniable, like climate change, the question will be how to adopt to a new dynamic -- a new schedule -- while accommodating the needs and achieving by-in from the many stakeholders affected. I will also continue to advocate for the adoption of a conflict of interest policy that seeks to identify and prevent or mitigate actual and perceived conflicts of interest.

4. What type of experience or skill set will help you fulfill your role on the

school board?

I have served on various Boards for over 30 years including 18-years on the Albany-based Mediation Matters Board as Secretary and later President. This June, I will complete my first 3-year-term on the BCSO Board, having served on the Policy, Audit, Facilities, and Superintendent Evaluation Committees. I bring a wealth of knowledge about Board Operations and a Mediation skill-set which are well-suited to the development of school budgets, with many stakeholders seeking a fair allocation of scarce resources. As an attorney, I have often created solutions for clients by not only thinking outside the box, but by looking at a situation from many different perspectives.

5. What do you think are some challenges the school district has been facing?

Addressing the mental health and wellness needs of our students, faculty and staff, is one of the biggest challenges facing the District. As a result, the question has become how is the District going to continue to offer the quality education and support BCSO is known for, with a budget

that continues to grow modestly each year, but with state resources not keeping pace.

6. How do you plan to address these challenges?

These challenges can be addressed by implementing the 2019 strategic plan and the continued support of the numerous health and wellness programs for students, faculty, and staff, to create a welcoming learning environment. I supported and will continue to support the planned new learning spaces and the redesign of the High School LMC and auditorium. Because state funding no longer keeps pace with rising costs, new funding streams are necessary. Endowment funds, created from private donations, are a new funding source for public schools. Once endowed, these funds provide schools with additional funds that earn interest until they are needed.

7. Last comments?

If re-elected, I will continue my practice of carefully listening to community concerns, advocating for common sense solutions, and the planned implementation of any new programs. My decisions will be based on what is best for the district

after considering the perspectives of all community members.

Check the cape at the door: An interview with Lee Woodruff

In January 2006, Lee Woodruff was at Disney World with her kids. She was in her 40s, her husband Bob recently landed the dream job of co-anchor of ABC World News Tonight and the life she thought she had worked hard for and earned was hers.

“There was a part of me that naively believed, and I don’t know how deeply, that if you lived a good life and were kind life wouldn’t throw you a curveball,” Woodruff said in a conversation earlier this month. “Obviously, that’s not how the world works.”

The curveball for Woodruff was the phone call she received in her Disney hotel room. It was the president of ABC News. A roadside bomb hit an armored car Bob was riding in while covering the Iraq War. He was critically injured.

Woodruff is the keynote speaker for the Annual Key4Women Forum on Friday, May 17, 2019, at the Albany Marriott. She will tell her story of how overcoming the challenges along Bob’s path to recovery taught her many lessons about relationships, growing a career in the face of adversity and shedding the idea that the mythical superwoman exists. Here, she shares some thoughts about women finding balance and success in their careers.

Jennifer Regelski: You often talk about life being messy. Can you talk about this in the context of expectations and how to realign, find balance and thrive when faced with a curveball?

Lee Woodruff: Everybody believes there’s this mythical sense of career satisfaction. That there is a time when things will align. What I’ve come to realize is life comes in chapters and within those chapters you’re never going to find balance and you’re never going to be perfect. When life does have other plans and does throw that curveball, it’s not a punishment for things you haven’t done right. The key is the ability to survive. It’s different for all of us, but that instinct to survive is strong.

Regelski: Following your husband’s accident, you thought of yourself as “The

General.” This obviously portrays an image of strength, particularly for your children. Why was this important to you? How does it juxtapose with the “Four Fs”—Friends, Family, Funny, and Faith—you credit for keeping you upright?

Woodruff: The general was me initially, when I had to give the kids the news and show them I was okay. From my outside body language, voice and words I needed them to know I would be alright and they would be alright.

The real me was relying on the “Four F’s” in different percentages and different measures during that time and still today. We never get over something, we just get through it. I think everybody who’s been through a trauma still has days it revisits them.

New York Times columnist David Brooks, who I love, recently wrote about the pursuit of elusive goals to bring us happiness when at the end of the day the real thing that brings us happiness and a sense of peace in the world is human connections. I leaned on connections. The chats or walks with a girlfriend were some of the most meaningful moments to get me past the fear of not knowing what was going to happen to us.

Regelski: During your husband’s recovery, you kept a journal. Have you always been a journal writer? Why is/was it important to document what you were experiencing?

Woodruff: There are times I have journaled in my life, usually times that were more difficult than others. My first instinct with Bob was to start creating some order out of what was happening, because I knew if Bob lived he would want to know what

happened. Life in an ICU is moving so quick you don’t remember anything, so it was a way to get some control over an uncontrollable situation. The writing became my therapy.

When we got to the point where we could sort of see a future, people started asking if I would be interested in writing a book. I remember Bob’s neurosurgeon saying that somebody needs to write a book, because there are thousands of kids coming through military hospitals with these kinds of injuries and nobody knows about it. That really stuck with me. It became the basis of taking my messy journal and having a publisher say, “yes, we can do something with this.”

Regelski: In addition to being a writer, you also have a business in which you help clients become better communicators. Why is storytelling so important to advancing a career or business?

Woodruff: If you think about it, storytelling has been important since the beginning of time. People sitting around a fire. It’s important in any job to be a communicator. Everybody has a shot at grabbing someone’s attention if you can tell your story. It’s how you can define and encapsulate who you are in a short amount of time.

Regelski: Do women have any unique obstacles? What is the most important skill women should learn to become better communicators in the business environment?

Woodruff: I was doing some work with a client, and we were talking about connecting to your clients and finding those human moments before the conference call starts when you can chitchat. I used the example of talking about my kid’s soccer game. One of the women immediately chimed in and said, “The minute I talk about kids I’m pegged as a woman.” It made me sad. The fact that someone said that says a lot about where we are. We’ve come a super long way, but men and women sometimes approach situations differently. To amplify their presence, women still need to work a little harder and smarter... but a good sense of humor still works every time when a situation doesn’t feel quite right.

Regelski: You say “Superwoman” is a myth. Who is this superwoman?

Woodruff: The mythical superwoman is the woman who has it all in balance... who can take care of her kids, make the perfect cupcakes for the birthday party, ace the proposal at work and have the house decorated for Christmas. Perpetuating the myth that some people can do all this without a support network of other family, baby-sitters, cleaning and shopping help is not fair to the rest of women. We all have places in our life that need better attention. You can’t do it all well all the time.

Regelski: You also talk about checking the “cape” at the door. What does this mean to you?

Woodruff: It means being real with yourself. It means being real with your kids. There are many moments where I say that to my kids, “I’m kind of falling short here. I’m doing the best I can.” It’s a real view on life. We have choices on how to balance things, but everything has a price tag attached to it.

Regelski: What is the most important thing you want people to take away from this year’s Key4Women Forum?

Woodruff: Other than the fact it has never been a better time to be a woman, it’s to forgive yourself. We all need to embrace the imperfect in all of us. It’s okay to leave the dishes and pick up a book to read with your child or grandchild, because the big lesson in my life is that in an instant it all can change. You don’t want to look back and realize you prioritized the wrong things.

OBITUARY

John Stokoe

John C. Stokoe, 84, of Hebron, NH passed away peacefully at his home Tuesday, April 30, surrounded by his four children.

Born February 18, 1935 in Albany, NY, John was the only child of the late Donald and Mirtha (McClary) Stokoe. Growing up in Delmar, New York, John's roots ran deep in the town of Bethlehem community, and he greatly valued the many enduring relationships established during his youth. John was a 1953 graduate of Bethlehem Central High School. During his four years at BCHS, he was a natural class leader, as well as an outstanding athlete in football, basketball, baseball, and track. Baseball would prove to be a lifelong love. John played American Legion baseball from 1947-51 for the Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post in Delmar where he honed his skills as a left-handed pitcher. He was selected as an Albany Times Union

representative in the 1953 Hearst Sandlot Classic at The Polo Grounds in NYC, where he pitched two innings for the United States All-Stars. John was offered a baseball scholarship to Wake Forest College in Winston-Salem, NC where he pitched all four years and, as a sophomore, was on the mound in the semi-final game against Oklahoma A&M. Wake Forest won 2-0 and went on to win the final game of the College World Series, becoming the 1955 NCAA tournament champs. John cultivated many lifelong friendships at Wake Forest and was a member of the Sigma

Chi fraternity. During the summers John played amateur baseball in Nova Scotia. He pitched and played centerfield for Dartmouth in the Halifax + District League, and in his 1957 season, he helped Dartmouth win the H+D League Championship.

John graduated from Wake Forest in 1957, and in August baseball scout Jeff Jones with the Milwaukee Braves, signed him to a 1958 baseball contract with Atlanta in the Class AA Southern Association. John's professional dream was coming true.

John was blessed in his personal life, as well. In 1958 he married the love of his life, Barbara McWhorter, also of Delmar. Barbara, an athlete in her own right, fully supported and encouraged John in his professional baseball career. They spent four years moving through the Braves minor league system, living in Jacksonville, Boise, Victoria, Ardmore, and Eau Claire, and they added two children to

their "team" along the way. After John left the Braves, he and Barbara settled in Slingerlands, NY where John worked in the bond department of the Travelers Insurance Company. Not one to hang up his cleats, John stayed in the game for the next six years as a player/manager in the Albany Twilight League. His teams, Mike's Subs and, later, Finkle Jewelers, won many championships. It was during this time that John met Baltimore Oriole scout Barney Lutz and began working part time for the Orioles. John's detailed reports on baseball prospects and his unique gift to judge the ability and potential of a young ball player caught the attention of the Oriole front office. In November of 1968, John became a full time scout with the O's. By then John and Barbara had finalized their family roster by adding two more children. As a full time area scout, John covered a nine state region. John's commitment to finding the best prospects for the Orioles was not limited to assessing a player's current

physical ability but also to scoping out a future player's potential. John had the skill to develop a relationship with the prospective ball player and his family, thus, getting a picture of the player's character, as well. John scouted Mike Flanagan, a left-handed pitcher from Manchester, NH, and got to know him and his parents well. Mike had developed trouble with the ulnar nerve in his elbow, but, after John and other Baltimore officials reviewed all the medical reports, the Orioles signed Flanagan in 1973. John proudly followed Mike's career, and in 1979 the O's won the American League Pennant, and Flanagan won the prestigious Cy Young Award for best American League pitcher. The success of his signees highlighted John's instinct and talents as a scout in his early career.

In 1980, the Orioles promoted John to East Coast Scouting Supervisor. In this position he was responsible for twenty states from Maine to Florida and had eight scouts working under him. His main job was cross

checking prospects that his scouts had identified. A highlight for John was the opportunity to do advance scouting on the Phillies prior to the 1983 World Series. Stokoe prepared reports on the individual Philly players, charting every aspect of their game. John was proud to have contributed to the success of the Orioles as they went on to defeat the Phillies and win the 1983 World Series. Although offered the scouting director job in Baltimore more than once, John preferred being out in the field and continued scouting for the Orioles until his retirement in 1997. To honor his pending retirement, John was on the mound of Camden Yards in September of 1997 to throw out the first pitch before an Oriole-Yankee game, and Mike Flanagan was at home plate to make the catch. John felt privileged to have spent his entire scouting career with the Baltimore Orioles, a great organization. He made lasting friendships with many in the baseball

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

Say... something!

We now teach our children “when you see something, say something.” We also encourage those who were victims of horrible crimes in the past to come forward so that predators can be stopped before they hurt others — the #MeToo movement and the NY Child Victims Act both come to mind. This is an unfortunate, but necessary, reality of our time.

Over the past several years, we’ve observed a trend with our school boards and administrations — school board members hiding behind the district’s communications office, which is under the direction of the superintendent. This office funnels news through the district’s website, social media and news organizations to provide us with information that allows busy parents to see what’s happening in our children’s school. It has, however, also worked as a shield for the superintendent, administration and school board against the press.

Our newspaper still serves as a watchdog and sounding board for our community. We ask the questions to which our readers expect answers. Our readers are parents, taxpayers and voters. Each has a vested interest in the health of our schools and the effectiveness of those who work there. We can, and should, have access to our public schools. The Board of Education, as an independently elected body, should answer its own questions.

This week, school district residents perform the

fundamental act of voting on an annual budget, but also decide who sits on the school board. These are individuals who represent us. They must be the pillars of our community.

Taking a seat on the Board of Education means assuming the mantle as our champion, a steward for the quality of our children’s education and also for their safety. The district’s administration is the responsibility of, and answers to, the board. Not the other way around. Each member acts as an independent advocate for our students and for us. That responsibility should weigh heavily upon member’s shoulders and each one must have enough strength to stand up against inadequate policies and ineffective administrations.

Unfortunately, we don’t see that happening.

Too often when we ask our questions to the Board of Education they punt the question to the district’s public relations officer. In the case of Bethlehem Central, the phone number to the Board of Education is listed as the communications office. It may have been an innocent oversight but this structure alone embodies an amalgamation of two entities that must be separate. They are, however, not.

On April 1, an autistic student was abandoned in the cold while on Bethlehem Central’s watch. This is a parent’s worst nightmare. Parents entrust our schools to keep their kids safe. Educate them, yes, but it’s assumed that is done within the confines of the safest

environment our tax money can provide. It didn’t happen. It is apparent that one of the individuals involved with the incident, Stephanie Corbett, is no longer an employee. Good. However, that information was not freely provided. In fact, the circumstances leading to her separation from the district leaves her protected behind a policy that keeps the district from discussing it.

The school does not publicly comment on personnel matters. In moments of controversy surrounding its employees, the superintendent, its staff and its communications office will not speak. Maybe a statement will be provided — one that is controlled, one-sided and prepared without facing inquiry; one, most likely, devised with guidance from the school district’s attorney. Such a statement was provided by Superintendent Jody Monroe after the April 1 incident. It was a promise that protocols would be improved.

We learned that the April 1 incident was not necessarily the catalyst behind Corbett’s termination, that there was an additional alleged act of misconduct. We asked for a copy of her termination agreement, but found there was none prepared. Because the employee “resigned for purposes of retirement,” no reasons needed to be documented. Very clean and neat.

We approached the president of the Board of Education and asked him if he was aware of the circumstances surrounding Corbett and her resignation.

We received a quick response back from its president, Michael Cooper. “It is the policy of the board and of the district that personnel matters are dealt with in Executive Session,” he stated in an email. “This is to ensure not only the privacy of the staff member involved but also to protect the integrity of the investigation.”

Ok, but what investigation?

Based on our conversation with the district’s communication office, there is no current investigation. If there was an investigation, we’re entitled to learn the results. We asked that question. The board did not answer. The district said they would revisit their protocols and strengthen communication avenues with employers within the school-to-work program. Was the board satisfied with that determination? We asked that question. The board did not answer.

New York State Open Meeting Law defines the process of executive sessions. There needs to be a specific reason as to why you are closing the door on your public to speak about matters. Information relating to current or future investigations or prosecution of a criminal offense that would imperil effective law enforcement if disclosed is one such reason.

There is no current criminal investigation, and speaking with Bethlehem Police, law enforcement was not involved. We are also unaware of any litigation pending in this case.

Every attorney makes decisions based on the best interests of their clients, but

potential future victims have no representation. This policy of not commenting on personnel issues is not based upon law. It’s a provision devised from a fear of litigation — don’t speak as you’ll only make it easier for a potential plaintiff’s lawyer — but, in our opinion the district and the School Board must acknowledge the problem, execute a solution and ensure it doesn’t happen again should the employee move on to another district.

For generations, the Catholic Church has followed a similar confidentiality policy in regards to “personnel issues.” The weight from that kind of misjudgment has brought the Church to its knees. Only now is Rome starting to wake up to that mistake.

Bethlehem Central is failing to meet its obligation to the public. Worse, its Board of Education has aligned itself as a pseudo department of the district it is supposed to scrutinize and hold accountable. This is a situation in which the Board should be as passionate about what had happened to one of our students as the public is, and it should be demanding answers as the stewards we voted into office. Otherwise, you’ve failed us.

We are so grateful for everyone in the Bethlehem community,

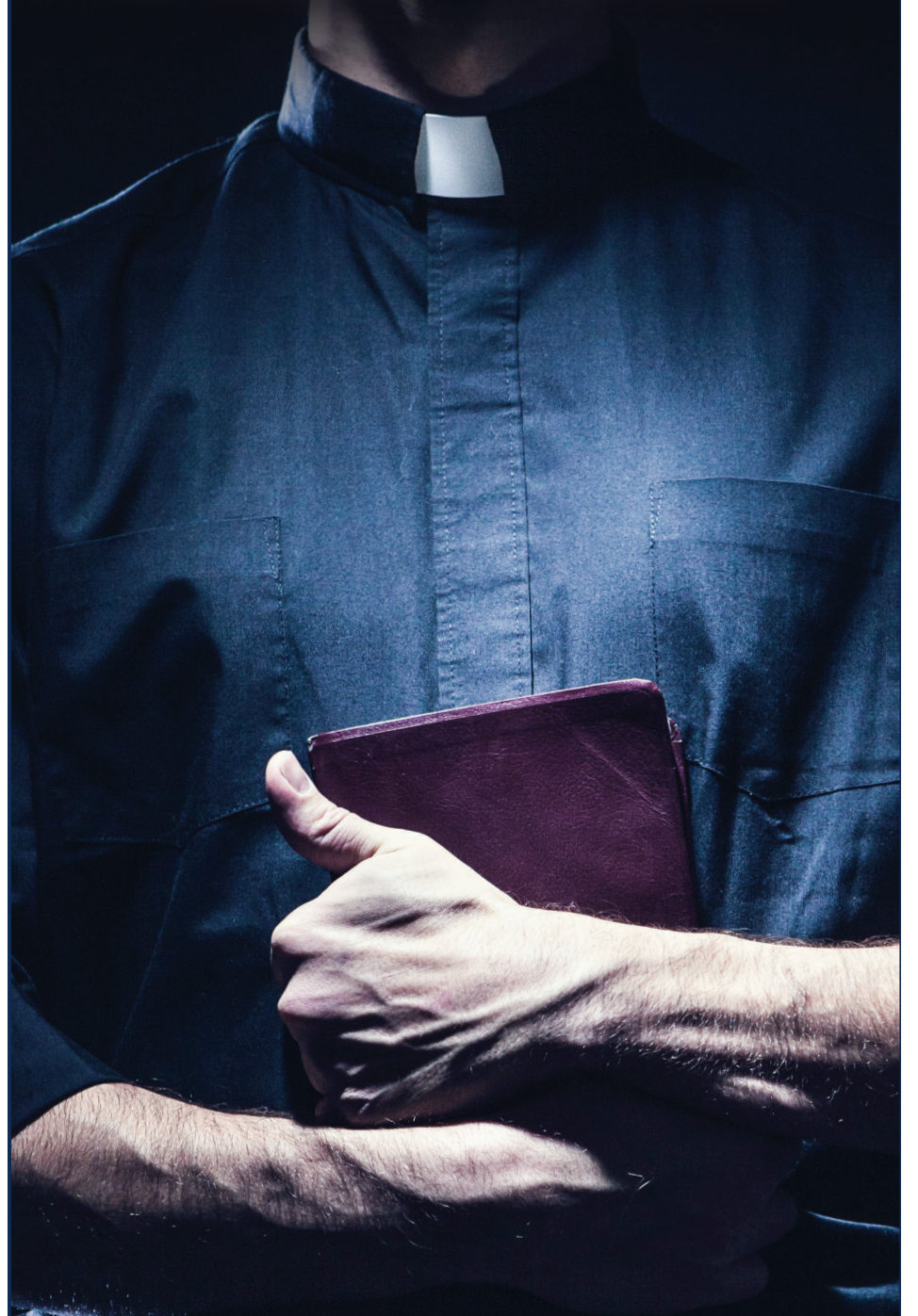

Who are you?

I have been an educator all my life, and my perspectives are broad, given the work I have done at the State Education Department, where I worked in the office of School Improvement and also the office of Curriculum and Instruction. I have various Board experiences as well, where I listen, ask questions, do research and work to build consensus.

5. What do you think are some challenges the school district has been facing?

The District has been working to address the issue of Diversity the past few years. The District has just developed a 5 year Strategic Plan designed to improve several areas for our students and foster good relationships with the community. Implementing various aspects of this plan, which includes addressing the needs of both students and teachers in assisting our students and families from all life experiences and backgrounds, will be very challenging.

6. How do you plan to address these challenges?

The No Place for Hate initiative in the middle and high schools is a great start to fostering student's knowledge of and ability to relate to others. In answering various questions last Wednesday, I suggested adding more media literacy, perhaps a peer counseling program, Making teens more aware of the resources the district has available to them, and

tweaking the schedule so that all kids who want lunch can have that break. I have some ideas revolving around culturally responsive materials, positive behavior incentive systems and more, and if overall wellness is a goal, we are currently studying the Start School Later times for the older students. It's a process, and the district is looking carefully at all the moving parts. But it is certainly something that will benefit ALL high school students without harming the younger ones.

7. Last comments?

Because I have been inspired by students, I would like to see the district continue to work to do what is best for all of our young people.

Let's talk

Brown School students adopt TED platform for a style of public speaking that fits a new generation

SCHENECTADY — Anyone who has taken a public speaking course understands there are rules.

There's etiquette. There's expected behavior and mannerisms to ensure the audience listens to the spoken word. Don't say "um." Don't move your hands. Don't stray from behind the podium. Don't look down. Don't. Don't. Don't. Follow these rules and you will successfully emulate every brilliant orator since Daniel Webster.

"It's the ultimate example of infantilism," said Cristina James, an English teacher at Brown School that has incorporated the popular TEDx speaking platform into her high school curriculum.

TED (Technology Entertainment and Design) is an online global platform that allows speakers to give short talks on "ideas worth spreading." TED allows local communities to put on their own TEDx events, and these talks are loaded to the TED platform.

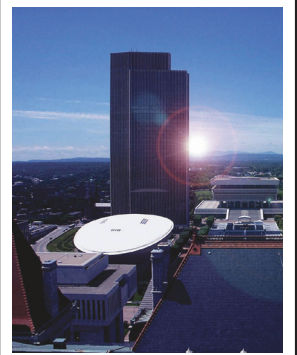



Picnic ready

This year the summer solstice, which marks the official start of summer, falls on June 21.

We're early. Sue us.

During this time of year, schedules become lax and meals often occur on-the-fly — and usually outdoors.

When firing up the grill or packing picnic essentials, home chefs should consider which dishes they'll serve alongside the main course. Of course, no summertime meal would be complete without a tasty potato salad in the mix. This recipe for "Potato Salad with Bacon and Parsley" from Allie Lewis Clapp, Lygeia Grace and Candy Gianetti's "Real Simple: Easy, Delicious Home Cooking" (Time Home Entertainment) offers a tasty take on this classic dish.

Potato Salad with Bacon and Parsley

Ingredients: Serves 6

- 1 1/2 pounds new potatoes, about 15
Kosher salt and black pepper
4 slices bacon
3 tablespoons olive oil
2 tablespoons red wine vinegar
2 teaspoons Dijon mustard
1 cup fresh, flat-leaf parsley, roughly chopped

Instructions:

Place the potatoes in a pot with 1 teaspoon salt and enough water to cover and simmer until tender, 15 to 18 minutes. Drain and run under cold water to cool. Cut into quarters.

Meanwhile, cook the bacon in a medium skillet over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until crisp, 6 to 8 minutes. Transfer to a paper towel-lined plate. Let cool, then crumble.

In a large bowl, whisk together the oil, vinegar, mustard, 3/4 teaspoon salt, and 1/4 teaspoon pepper. Add the potatoes, bacon and parsley and toss to combine.

Tip: The potatoes can be cooked and tossed with the dressing and parsley up to 1 day in advance; refrigerate, covered. Bring to room temperature and add the bacon just before serving.

Tuning in on a fit summer bod

Healthy ways to build muscle naturally

Reshaping one's body takes time and commitments, though shortcuts can be tempting when trying to get fit. The desire to see instant results can lead some people to make potentially dangerous mistakes in the name of looking good.

There are various ways to safely build natural muscle. Novices should always consult their physicians before beginning a fitness regimen. Patience must be part of the equation, as expecting overnight results but not seeing them may derail your fitness efforts or lead you down an unsafe path. The following are some safe ways to build muscle.

Boost training volume

According to Ava Fitzgerald, C.S.C.S., C.P.T., a sports performance coach with the Professional Athletic Performance Center in New York, one may need to increase the number of reps and sets, but at an intensity at between 50 and 75 percent



of the person's 1RM (the maximum weight he or she can lift for one rep). For good muscle volume, she recommends three to six sets of 10 to 20 reps.

Increase caloric intake

Find the balance between eating enough to gain muscle and gaining too much and body fat percentage creeping up. This can take some trial and error. Try to eat more calories on training days, focusing on plenty of lean protein, whole grain carbohydrates and vegetables.

Zero in on the eccentric phase of movement

Research published in the *European Journal of Applied Physiology* found that eccentric workouts are better at triggering hypertrophy, or the increased size of muscles. For example, when doing a squat, lowering into the squat would be the eccentric phase of the exercise. Increase weight resistance to make this eccentric phase even more effective.

Hit muscle groups more frequently

In the 2016 study, "Effects of Resistance Training Frequency on Measures of Muscle Hypertrophy," published in *Sports Medicine*, targeting various muscle groups twice a week, rather than once, helped maximize muscle growth.

Consider a full-body routine

Working the entire body several times a week also may help one make gains in muscle growth. University of Alabama researchers followed a group of men who had been lifting weights for several years. Those who performed a full-body routine three days a week for three months gained almost 10 pounds of muscle over that time.

Fatigue the muscles

Decrease rest periods between sets to encourage quick release in muscle-building hormones.

Have casein protein before bed

Data published in *Science Daily* in March 2019 found that pre-sleep protein intake increases muscle protein synthesis during overnight sleep in young adults. Lead author Dr. Tim Snijders of Maastricht University gave 44 healthy young men a 12-week lifting program. Half were also given a nightly, pre-sleep protein shake with about 30 grams of casein, while the others weren't. The protein-before-bed group gained significantly more muscle strength and size than those who had no protein before bed.

Muscle growth comes from frequent strength training, increasing caloric consumption, taxing muscles, and being consistent and patient with one's goals.

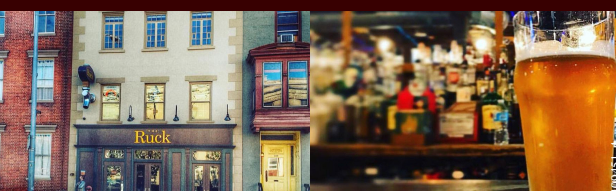

The Abyssmals' 'Gospels, Hymns and Other Trash'

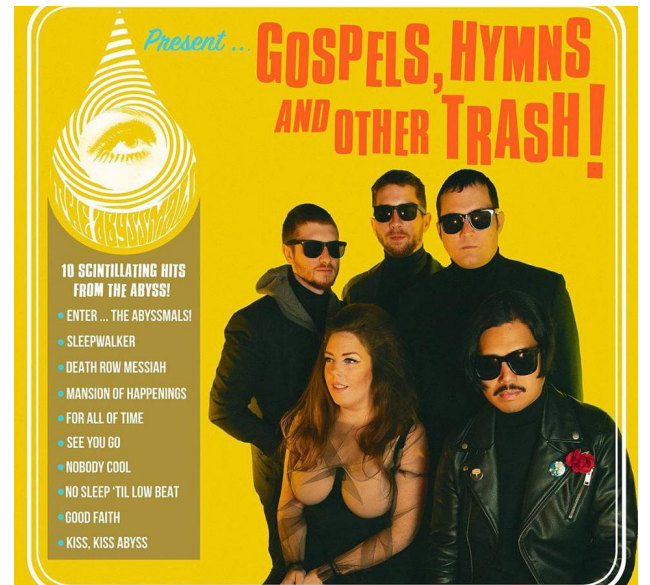
Listeners will be California Dreamin' in time for summer

Just in time for the impending summer heat comes the revival of the generally unappreciated sound of surf rock, unless you're Quentin Tarantino. Then, a track off this album will likely wind up on your next movie, shot in glorious 70mm film. The Abyssmals are treading new water on their sophomore album as they explore a surf rock sound. The genre is very cut and dry – a good majority of the top surf rock songs of the 1960s did have a similar feel to it. But The Abyssmals try to break out of the mold by mixing in new flavors, both modern and classic. Where would someone listen to something like this? Hard to say. A slow cruise with the top down on a blistering, mid-July heat wave? Tiki bar party, perhaps? The tone of surf rock isn't what people call uplifting either. It's odd that it's associated with relaxing at the beach at all. Nevertheless, it's timeless sound, and The Abyssmals have thrown a unique spin on the genre while flaunting their mastery of the quintessential sound of California's beaches circa 1960.

The album is good fun. It won't be in the Billboard Top 40 list anytime soon, but it could strike a chord with lovers of surf rock, grunge, psychedelia and even folk. The Abyssmals experiment with a several types of surf rock fusion, each of which has a natural and palatable feel to it, although the influence of grungy, darker tones can be found in almost every track. The album has a very familiar sound, but is also still very unique and almost indescribable. Listeners can pick out influences of anything ranging from Dick Dale to The Beatles, even Queens of the Stone age.

Listeners can enjoy a mainstream, stereotypical surf rock sound like in, "Enter... The Abyssmals!" and "For All Time." Quintessential instrumentation will drop listeners right into the bench seat of a '37 Split Window Ford, racing to Bikini Beach. Modern recording tactics keeps



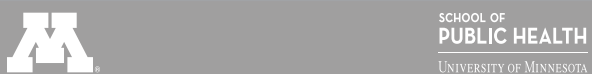

the sound recognizable but modern and tasty.

But dive deeper and listeners will find a more unique blend of their influences. Songs like "Sleepwalker" and "See You Go" are built upon surf rock basics but are laced with psychedelia and indie. At this point, their sound is that of The Beatles meets The Black Keys. Lackadaisical vocals from Jarpon Reyes and Bob Forget are coupled with washy but sturdy instrumentation creating a unique atmosphere and a throwback to simpler times.

This will be fun to see live and there are plenty of opportunities to do so. The album is up for download on Bandcamp and available to stream on Spotify and Soundcloud.

Maybird's 'Things I Remember From Earth'

'A complete sonic scrub that leaves no stone unturned'

Josh and Adam Netsky have been mainstays on the Rochester music scene for the past decade at least. Older brother Josh was writing songs beyond his years, while Adam brought the songs to life both on stage, playing drums, and on screen, crafting accompanying videos. Their creative teamwork reached a new high in 2012 with a song-cycle and experimental documentary about the ghost town of Centralia, PA.

Part of being a great bandleader is crafting the songs. The other part is putting together the right parts to bring your visions to life. The Netsky's pulled off a bit of a coup, scoring arguably the two best and most versatile guitarists in Rochester: Sam Snyder (Overhand Sam, Anamon) and Kurt Johnson (Moho Collective, Wallboards). Together they became Maybird, providing a more consistent outlet for their output. The band flourished on the Rochester scene and in 2016 they signed to Danger Mouse's 30th Century Records, on which they've released two EPs, *Turning Into Water* and *Unravelling*.

On *Things I Remember From Earth*, their debut LP for 30th Century, releasing Friday, the band's sound takes a huge leap forward. With major label backing and

national tours with acts like Portugal. The Man under their belt, the Netsky's creative visions are finally reaching their full potential.

The title, "Things I Remember From Earth," was taken from Kurt Vonnegut's "The Sirens of Titan," as were the themes of many of the songs. "Human purpose, holding on to memories, and losing control of your mind/memory are all themes in the book that found a place on the album." Josh Netsky explains.

No longer encumbered by the what-ifs of a shoestring budget, colorful sounds explode from the record like tubes of paint being smashed with a hammer. The opening track "In Technicolor (for the first time)," sets it all up perfectly: "If you mix the colors in your eyes / darkened tears will fall / into vivid seas and multiply."

From the driving march of "To You," to the slinky grooving "Gonna Lose Your Mind," to the 80s style bright pop of "Montreal," track after track, colors are added and the vision becomes more complete and more impressive.

The band might consist three guitarists and a drummer, but they pushed the studio to the limit, layering sounds upon sounds for a complete sonic scrub that leaves no stone unturned: A perfectly placed horn track, catchy backing vocals, an eerie whistle, a burst of piano, a humming organ, alien bubbles and wails from outer space, not to mention, all of that glorious guitar. A bevy of beautiful and unique choices color the edges of the psychedelic pop songs throughout. Don't fret about the how's and who's, close your eyes and let the grooves wash over you.

James is new to Brown School as of this year. She is an educational consultant who has spent the past few years developing a curriculum which incorporates TED talks in the traditional English curriculum and which she brings to schools who consider student voice a priority. She has worked with the students all school year on their talks.

“As the tragedy at Parkland suggested, the world is coming knocking on our classroom doors, and our students must know how to speak up in the interests of their own welfare and shaping the world into one in which they wish to go forward,” James said. “Having students attend to all the traditional aspects of the English classroom but also having them spend the year organizing and preparing to speak at their own TEDx event, gives them the opportunity to experience autonomy, leadership, and a sense that their vernacular voices are important in spreading important ideas.”

This school year she had students view talks to steep them in the TED culture for lessons they offer in terms of rejection, listening and leadership. Students used mindful journaling and hours of writing and editing to find their ideas that are worth spreading. They are currently working on memorization and preparing for the performance aspect.

While some of the preparation has been challenging, overall the students have embraced the experience.

“I’ve enjoyed getting to share an idea that I really wanted to get across, in a way that will be spread to many people,” said Taryn Klein, an eighth-grade student.

Another student reflects on what this has meant to her personally.

“Since my subject is more personal to me, I’ve enjoyed sharing it and writing it and it’s helped me deal with my issue more easily,” said Keziah Dunn, also in the eighth grade. “After you actually talk about things

that are really personal to you, it gets easier to deal with them.”

Student topics include problematizing the notion of strong female characters in young adult literature, reconsidering synesthesia as a tool to be used in the classroom and the downside of political correctness.

“I have seen students become comfortable with uncomfortable learning and take brave steps beyond their comfort zones, exposing themselves with courage and vulnerability not just by embracing this public speaking challenge, but by telling the world what is important to them,” said James.

Alex Timmis, an improv program coordinator with Mopco, recently worked James’ students through exercises to help with their performances. The first of which was to teach them the power of embracing mistakes.

Often times with public speaking, mistakes are made. Associating mistakes with failure creates fear, which is the underlying reason behind why most people bristle at the prospect of public speaking.

A few weeks before the students are scheduled to perform, Timmis has them stand in line to count off. But, as they count off, he purposely tries to throw them off count. It’s not long before a student fumbles through her words. The classroom cheers.

Timmis likens TED talks to stand-up comedy. Comedians stand on stage with prepared material, but they are nonetheless adaptive to the audience. And, unlike traditional speeches that often strip personality and individual mannerisms from speakers, TED talks embrace the performance. Gesticulations and movement from one end of the stage to the other is encouraged.

“It’s experiential and it gets you into exploring and trying new things,” said Timmis, “daring, and trying to get out of your comfort zone, try something new. Which is what I think is a great tool for presentation skill, because it doesn’t feel super scary.”
