Rediscover your surroundings

A more attractive place for locals, visitors, conventions

ALBANY COUNTY — When a person thinks of the words “Albany” and “tourism,” images like the New York State Capitol, the Egg or the Empire State Plaza may come to mind.

However, Discover Albany, an independent, not-for-profit organization that promotes Albany County to visitors, event planners and even local residents, wants to change that mindset — or rather, expand it.

The public is encouraged to attend “Discover: Discover Albany,” along with the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce.

It is a free event where

they can learn more about what Discover Albany does and what the county offers in terms of events, conventions, culture, natural landmarks, and also attract visitors to businesses here.

The event is geared towards local business owners too who want to learn how to gain more exposure to visitors and convention attendees.

It will be on Tuesday, June 11 from 8:30 to 9:30 a.m. at the Bethlehem Public Library on 451 Delaware Ave. in Delmar.

Being the official

tourism organization for Albany County since its founding in 1976, Discover Albany CEO and president Jill Delaney said, “There’s always this perception that the word, ‘Albany,’ is only for downtown Albany or the city of Albany. But it’s actually for Albany County and we want to represent businesses and residents from all over the county too. We promote Albany County to visitors, conventions, and meeting planners, and promote all the wonderful rich, cultural assets that we have here to residents too.”

According to Discover Albany, more than 4,300 visitors come to Albany County each day.

Delaney added that Discover Albany also offers many maps, an events calendar, restaurant guides, and visitor guides to help visitors, curious residents, and people relocating to the area.

She also said its website and social media platforms are “very active and heavily followed.”

Relating to the latter point, she said one step Discover Albany took in recent years to boost more public interest in Albany County was to change its former name — Albany County Convention and Visitors Bureau, Inc. — into its current one.

“The old name didn’t really speak to the locals although it invited people from outside,” she said. “Changing our name helped make it sound more like it’s for everybody and to promote locals too. It gave us a better voice in social media as well and our followers have really boosted locally as much as it has from conventions. The old name is still our legal name though.”

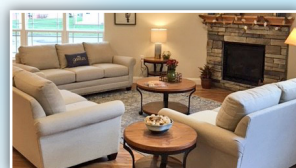

The changing landscape of Wemple Road

A look into the evolution along the road in recent years

BETHLEHEM — For Bethlehem residents, Wemple Road helps to connect different parts of town, like Delmar to the west and Glenmont to the east. However, driving down this road in recent years has become a visibly slowly-changing experience. **Wemple Road Apartments and subdivision**

The Wemple Road Apartments and subdivision projects were approved by the Bethlehem Planning Board back on March 19 in a 3-2 vote — Chairman John Smolinsky and Board Members Scott Lewendon and Kate Powers supported it; fellow Board Members Brian Gyory and Gianna Aiezza opposed it.

The board initially had rejected it prior on February 5 but this vote was rescinded in the March 19 meeting in hopes of reopening further discussion on the project. A previous *Spotlight News* article on Wednesday, May 29 incorrectly stated this project had remained rejected. So far, it had appeared before the

board for around a dozen meetings, dating back to Aug. 16, 2016.

According to town documents, the overall project is a 96-unit multifamily development, comprising of nine four-unit buildings and 10 six-unit buildings that are styled in a townhouse setting. This would take up over 28 acres, as part of a bigger 37-acre parcel of land, and take up one lot of the subdivision. Roughly seven more acres are for the subdivision's second lot to be kept by its landowner John Biscone, and the last 1.8 acres are to be conveyed to the town for highway purposes.

The apartments are

rental and cater to those seeking to rent in higher-end, condo-like housing.

Prior to construction, the area — located north of Wemple Road near the intersection of that road

and Route 9W — is a large wide-open corn and agricultural field.

After listening to the board members' comments, Ingalls Associates — the Schenectady-based firm which had conducted the project's land surveying, engineering designs and commentary-influenced adjustments — agreed to install an eight-foot-wide multi-use path to complement pedestrian/bicycle travel for the lot; modify the apartment buildings' elevations to de-emphasize the appearance of garage doors on its façades; and ensure it would be sufficiently served with sewer and water lines.

As it is located in a Rural Hamlet zoning district, the area allows for multifamily development too, despite concerns from board members and the public about its density.

Glenmont eight-acre parcel

An inland eight-acre parcel of open land has recently been confirmed to remain conserved in perpetuity, due to a partnership between the Town of Bethlehem and the Albany County Land Bank. It is located 40 feet south of Wemple Road, and near its intersection with Route 9W, placing it just south of the aforementioned 96-unit multifamily development.

The landlocked eight-acre parcel consists of 3.5 acres of constructed wetlands, 0.75 acres of natural wetlands, and 3.75 acres of upland forest and scrub.

The town bought the land from Albany County Land Bank for \$1 although there were recording and closing costs of \$762 as well. Albany County Land Bank had first accepted the town's application to buy it back on Nov. 27, 2018 and Town Supervisor David VanLuven signed the purchase contract and other relevant documents on Feb. 13 this year. VanLuven said the parcel has foreclosed previously as it was not generating tax revenue for the town. He added that even with its new status as a conserved open space, no resident's taxes would be increased.

Bethlehem's Open Space Coordinator Karen Shaw confirmed that the parcel will be left to "maintain its natural services" like continuing to foster a natural habitat, and providing flooding and water quality control. She said that there is a possibility of making the landlocked parcel more readily accessible to the public and adding passive recreational trails — which could be created together with the town's Parks and Recreation department

— within the parcel in the future.

No timeframe has been set about this though.

Elsmere Fire District substation

At the corner of Wemple and Feura Bush roads, one would notice a brand-new building by the intersection, the site of which had been under construction since last fall. This is the Elsmere Fire District's new South Substation.

The 4,608 square-foot substation was constructed to improve response times to emergencies in the southern half of the fire district, as well as better serve the residents there. Behind the \$1.4 million project was C.T. Male Associates, the general architect which is a Latham-hailing company that specializes in land surveying, architectural engineering, and more.

According to the fire district's website, the project originally went through the town's Zoning Board of Appeals prior on Dec. 6, 2017 and voters residing within the fire district passed it six days later on Dec. 12 — 272 supported and 180 opposed it.

Then on Dec. 20, a public hearing was held and it was decided that the project needed to be reviewed by the town's Planning Board. The project was later brought before that board on Feb. 20, 2018 and following a number of meetings and discussions, its site plan was finally approved on July 3.

Construction began on Sept. 20 afterwards, stopped for the winter season, and resumed in

spring for further outside work. A timeline of photographs depicting the construction's progress is available online on the Elsmere Fire District's website at elsmerefire.org/fire-district/south-station.

Remembering Sandy Creek Barn

Longtime residents would remember the Sandy Creek Farm and its former 80-year-old barn that used to be located along Wemple Road.

The barn was a two-story structure that used to contain a dairy farm owned by Thomas and Valerie Newell. According to town records, the farm had been owned by the Newell family since John M. Mabel and Ernest A. Newell bought the 165-acre lot back in 1938. The barn had been built around this time period too.

The barn, unfortunately, could not survive well into the 21st century as on Apr. 27, 2016, it gave way to a proposal to construct a 40-lot residential subdivision on where it was located. Such plans to build on that area had been brought before the town government since around 2012.

Spotlight News had reported on this in April 2016, where numerous residents criticized how rising developments have taken over the agricultural regions and damaged the local natural habitat too.

DELMAR — Respected Capital District area home builder and developer Henry John Klersy, Jr., 88, passed on peacefully, Monday, June 3, 2019 at home with his loving and caring wife Donata by his side.

Henry's remarkable life story began when he was born in Reidsville in the Town of Berne, NY to parents Henry, Sr. and Flossie (nee Wideman) Klersy.

Growing up and working on the family farm instilled in him an ethic of hard work and a respect for a job well done.

After attending Berne Knox Westerlo schools, Henry began his career as a craftsman by working for and learning the trade from Bob May, a local home builder.

Lacrosse team headed to state semis

ROTTERDAM — The Eagles dominated the state quarterfinals on Friday, May 31 by beating North Rockland, of Section I, 15-9 in a game that wasn't even that close.

Bethlehem, with self-made, inspirational tattoos like "Roll Tide" and "Work Hard" and "2 seed" written on their thighs and arms, dominated both ends of the field and never let North Rockland get into any kind of groove.

Six different players scored for Bethlehem with Caroline Wise and Lauren Riker scoring four each, the latter getting a

Police observed his glassy eyes, inability to answer questions, and his overall confused state.

DiLorenzo was not able

He was charged with driving while ability impaired by a drug, failure to keep right, and unlawful possession of marijuana.

He is scheduled to return to the Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, June 18 at 5:30 p.m.

Bethlehem Public Library continues to take the lead in putting new technology within everyone's reach with our Studio Makerspace and One Button recording system. The studio, which celebrated its grand opening this spring, has recently been enhanced with sound-dampening drop ceilings and LED lighting to provide an even better user experience.

The Studio Makerspace makes it easy to share stories and ideas with a greater audience through self-produced videos, TV shows, podcasting and more. It's also a great way to record and preserve personal histories or create presentations for distance-learning. The only limit is your imagination.

This self-service model and its user-friendly A/V equipment



is right in line with the library's mission of providing the tools and training to help people reach their goals – instead of doing the work for them. It also means studio availability is no longer limited by staffing and is now accessible seven days a week. Anyone with an active Upper Hudson library card can book studio time in 3-hour increments through the library's online calendar. Public access to these cutting edge tools helps bridge the digital divide in our community and creates opportunities that were once limited to those with professional experience.

The hallmark of the Studio Makerspace is the One Button system, which records and saves an mp4 file directly to a USB flash drive in one step. Laptops with Adobe Premiere Elements are available in the library for video editing, and the library also loans out handheld digital video cameras, so anyone is free to take their show on the road.

A word about local farms

Continuing the dialogue with the public

ALTAMONT — Town residents interested in learning more about how to conserve local farmland and hearing numerous success stories can attend “Making Local Conservation Happen: Talks, Tastes, and a Tour! — Conserving Farmland” on Thursday, June 13 at the Indian Ladder Farms’ Apple Barn on 342 Altamont Road.

The main event, which is free and open to the public, will happen from 6 to 8:30 p.m.

It will be preceded by a guided 45-minute farm tour at 5 p.m. and succeeded by a 30-minute Q&A session. While the main event does not require registration, online registration is recommended for the farm tour due to limited availability and can be done by sending an email to education@ladderfarms.com.

The main event will feature multiple short speeches by local farmers and farmland conservation organizations.

Farm speakers will include those from Indian Ladder Farms, Lansing Farm, Laughing Earth Farm, Lovin’ Mama Farm, Stanton’s Legacy Farm, Tilldale Farm, Riverview Orchards, and Chaseholm Farm and Creamery.

Organizations to appear will include representatives from Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy, National Young Farmers Coalition, Cornell Cooperative Extension, American Farmland Trust, New York Farm Bureau, Albany County Soil and Water Conservation District, and more.

Karen Shaw, Bethlehem’s Open Space Coordinator, said the event is like “a public education event where we’re using landowners as storytellers so we can relate to them human-to-human. They will give short talks about

conserving farmlands, what their funding was, what obstacles they faced, and what lessons they’ve learned.”

She said it is also to help people realize that conserving farmland can be possible and it would show them what possible options they may have if interested.

Mark King, the executive director of Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy, said that the speakers will generally be farmers who are either working to protect or have protected their farmlands.

King himself would be briefly speaking there too, “Conserving farmland is really a subject on people’s minds these days and there is also a huge interest in local foods. People increasingly want to know where their foods come from.”

Speaking of food, the event will feature locally-sourced foods and craft beverages for the public to enjoy, courtesy of Indian Ladder Farms Cidery and Brewery.

Shaw said it’s one way “to make this sort of both festive and educational for people, instead of having a regular public workshop.”

The event is the second of a two-part local land conservation-related dialogue, with the first already taken place on Feb. 7.

The former focused on the preservation of local forests and preserves — featuring speakers who spoke about those topics — and attracted a large turnout.

“I think it’s heartening to hear actual landowners come and tell their conservation stories, and also how people in town are passionate about this topic,” Shaw said. “I’ve also gotten a few calls since the February event from people who are interested in the town’s Conservation Easement Exemption Program.”

This program gives private landowners an option to work with the town to conserve their open spaces for a period of time or in perpetuity; they would see a percentage reduction in their annual local taxes too.

King similarly said that “a couple of different folks” have contacted his organization since the February event “and we’re talking to them about their properties. Projects tend to take a long time though because there are big decisions and expenses involved. But we got some very positive leads.”

Shaw did note that private landowners do have the right to sell their lands

their retirement or lifelong investment. Not every farmer wants to or can conserve their land,” she said.

Bethlehem recently moved forward with its land conservation mission with the May 23 press conference about the perpetual conservation of an eight-acre parcel of open land near the intersection of Wemple Road and Route 9W.

This was accomplished due to a partnership with the Albany County Land Bank, which previously owned the parcel.

The town acquired it for just \$1.

“I think it’s great the town is willing to step forward and work with the [Albany County] Land Bank to have that kind of property conserved and protect the wetlands as that otherwise would’ve been abandoned,” said King. “The town is doing

lots of great things, like the Conservation Exemption Program and supporting the ‘Conserving Farmland’ event. It’s very heartwarming to see town so committed.”

Shaw concluded that the June 13 event will help continue the dialogue with local landowners and farmers.

“It could maybe attract new and young farmers into Bethlehem too and the average age of farmers is over 55 now,” she said. “We need to think about getting new farmers in here and helping them with their business plans and inspiring them. It’s all about getting us all to talk and spark ideas so that more realities can come true.”

While the Dive Pool has been fenced up, the rest of the pool complex will open as scheduled from Wednesday, June 5 to September 2. Ever since the Dive Pool was originally built in 1973, not much structural work had been done in its last 46 years of operation. "We can maybe call it a relative success all this time but pools eventually need work that's major," he said.

Gallo said this past spring, the Dive Pool was found to have deteriorated concrete walls and water infiltration. Upon the removal of the linings and gutters, it was determined that more work and repairs were needed to improve the pool. Recommendations included the replacement of the concrete, the installation of an underdrain and the excavation of the areas just behind the pool's walls. Repairs had been planned to take at least two months to complete.

It was originally estimated that had

construction started early this summer, repairs could have been finished sometime in July if the weather cooperates and no further issues were found. But Gallo said that it was decided to leave the pool closed for the summer and postpone the construction until the fall, believing that this would best not negatively affect patrons' experiences at or deter them away from the pool complex. "If we have an active construction zone while the other pools are open, it would impact the user experience so I felt it was best to delay the construction," he said. A town release also noted that the delayed construction would prevent noise, dust and debris from affecting the patrons and other parts of the park, if construction is underway in the summer.

Gallo added that since "we are still not sure how pervasive the concrete features are in that pool, exactly how much and how long the repairs will be are

still to be determined. But it will definitely be open for summer 2020."

He brought up that depending on the true extent of the Dive Pool's deteriorated state and how much repairs would be, there is a possibility of turning it into a new kind of pool or a different amenity like a picnic area. There is potential for the public to have a say in what the Dive Pool could become, if the situation arises, said Gallo.

The Learn-to-Swim Pool also had issues with its gutters, stairs and concrete deck but they have been repaired with modified supports for the gutters, the addition of grouts, installing code-compliant and improved stairs, and replacing sections of the deteriorated concrete deck. Such repairs have been completed, according to Gallo, by May so the pool is scheduled to open on Wednesday, June 5.

Zef Gjonaj

DELMAR — On the morning of Sunday, May 26, 2019, Zef Gjonaj, well cared for and loved, slipped peacefully to Heaven.

Zef was born in Porav, Albania but had no memory of it. Instead, he had memories of the refugee camps in Kosovo and Italy. His parents had been identified as part of the Anti-Communist resistance so they carefully planned their escape along with his uncle's family. They walked through the forested mountains and crossed a treacherous river with babies and children to get to Kosovo. Had they been caught by the Communists, every man, woman and child would have been tortured and killed.

Zef was between three and four years old when his father, who had been imprisoned for three years without charge, was simply released to be reunited with his family. Until then, his cousin Lisa had thought he was her beloved brother, not cousin, and was ready to do battle with others who told her differently. For the rest of his life, Zef found cabbage absolutely revolting after eating so much of it in the camps.

Eventually, they were sponsored and emigrated to the USA. Speaking no English, Zef was enrolled in St. Angela Merici in the Bronx and quickly learned English. As many immigrant children before him, he was pressed into service by the adults to read and translate their rent contracts, government forms, and all kinds of other documents and notes while he was barely seven years old.

His perseverance and intelligence earned a full scholarship to Columbia University. While there he was stricken with a disorder that made his life a roller coaster. After his family moved to Cossackie, Zef used his charm and love of driving to find employment in the Albany, NY area.

His brother Leka spent an untold number of hours over the decades, working on Zef's cars, in all kinds of weather and locations. Zef's loving sisters, parents, cousins, Aunt, and sister-in-law all pitched in and helped him in countless ways.

Zef Gjonaj is survived by his four siblings, Paska Nayden, Maria, Lena, and Leka (Erma Klein-) Gjonaj as well as his Aunt Katrina Gjonaj, and cousins, Barth (Rose) Gjonaj, Lisa (Richard) Brunetti, Katarina (Ron) Bakkedahl, Zeta (John) Fairbrother, Michael (Luljeta) Gjonaj and many second cousins.

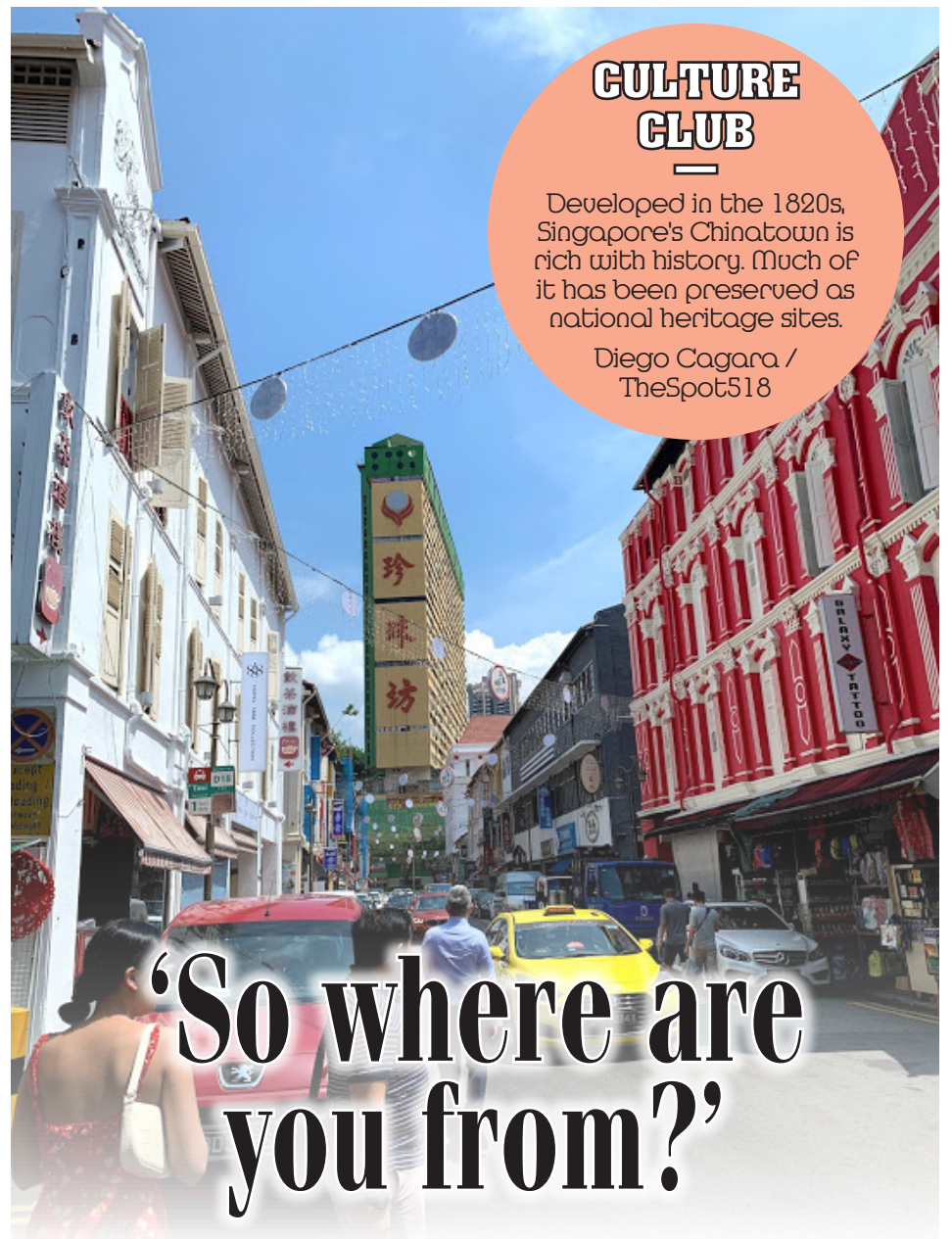

‘So where are you from?’

Our Diego Cagara reports back from a visit to his home in Singapore

“So where are you from?” People have long asked me this question and although they may just be prolonging small talk or feigning interest in me, I would typically pause and mentally wonder how to exactly answer.

Home. It’s a simple four-letter word and yet a concept that I had struggled with for over a decade now.

I was born in 1996 in Manila, the capital city of the Philippines but in early 1998, my family — comprising of my parents, my older sister, my younger brother and I — moved to the tiny Southeast-Asian island city-state of Singapore since my parents, who are engineers, were able to find increased salaries and a higher standard of living there.

Singapore is situated at the southern tip of Malaysia, is surrounded by Indonesian islands and is just 85 miles north of the equator; it has a hot and tropical climate, with temperatures staying at around 88° F all year long. Since gaining independence in 1965, it has transitioned from a third world to first world nation within a

generation, thanks partly to its strategic geographical location for trade and business between the East and West.

As I was still too young when we moved there though, I have no memory of living in the Philippines which, unfortunately, caused me to not feel a strong emotional connection to my birth country — my extended family still resides there.

Settling into the petite town of Choa Chu Kang (pronounced Choo-wah Choo K-ah-ng) in Singapore, this was where I spent my early formative years and attended school up until fifth grade in 2007. Due to my parents’ desire to travel the world, they were able to score jobs in Dresden, Germany and we moved there in 2008; we later relocated again to upstate New York in mid-2011, where we have been living since then. I eventually became an American citizen just this past March.

However, since moving away from Singapore, one of my goals has long been to return for a visit, and reconnect with my old friends and the country I consider my true homeland. This was not possible for over a decade though as I was still too young to comprehend how expensive and far Singapore was from both Germany and the United States, and I needed to earn enough to afford a flight back — flights are generally more than \$1,000 per person.

From Bethlehem, Singapore is 9,389 miles away. To further get a sense of that sheer distance, a flight would take around

a full day, depending on stopovers or the airline.

That goal finally became a reality in May 2019, 12 years since moving away, when my family discovered cheaper-than-usual flights and were able to return for a week. But before diving into my experience of ultimately coming home, I would need to discuss my childhood years in Singapore first for context.

Childhood in Singapore

As I reminisce, my childhood felt like a safety bubble where everything felt rosy and easygoing. This was also the time before social media took off, when Motorola and Nokia were the most popular cellphone brands, when Britney Spears was at her career prime, and when Singapore, as a country, was not well-known worldwide yet as it is today.

Some of my best memories then were rooted in the strong connections I forged with several of my classmates. The following was one such example.

“Why don’t you sit in the back there beside her? There’s the last empty seat,” my teacher gestured to the classroom’s last row on my first day of fourth grade in 2006. Heading over, I saw an unassuming and shy Chinese-looking girl seated beside the one I was directed to. Her name was Jodie.

Our introvertedness prevented us from initially introducing ourselves and conversing that day but as the semester went on, we grew more comfortable around each other and our friendship took form. It was further solidified when we learned that we lived in the same apartment block across the street from our elementary school; I lived on the fourth

floor while her family was in the sixth. This made it natural for us to walk and take the elevator up home together everyday, and we would get ice cream along the way and talk about our days.

Classmates used to also tease us about being like a couple but our friendship grew stronger as we would continue hanging out without caring for the swirling rumors throughout school about us.

Unfortunately, Jodie and I never had a proper goodbye when my family moved to Germany in 2008 since I naively did not realize just how far Europe was from Singapore then. I had assumed that we would be able to visit often but it was not the case. We also lost contact immediately as we did not use social media at the time — Facebook was still relatively in its infancy usage-wise, for instance.

My memories of Singapore then grew bittersweet through the years since we left as it represented a time of unadulterated joy, and I felt that I lost a major part of my life from there.

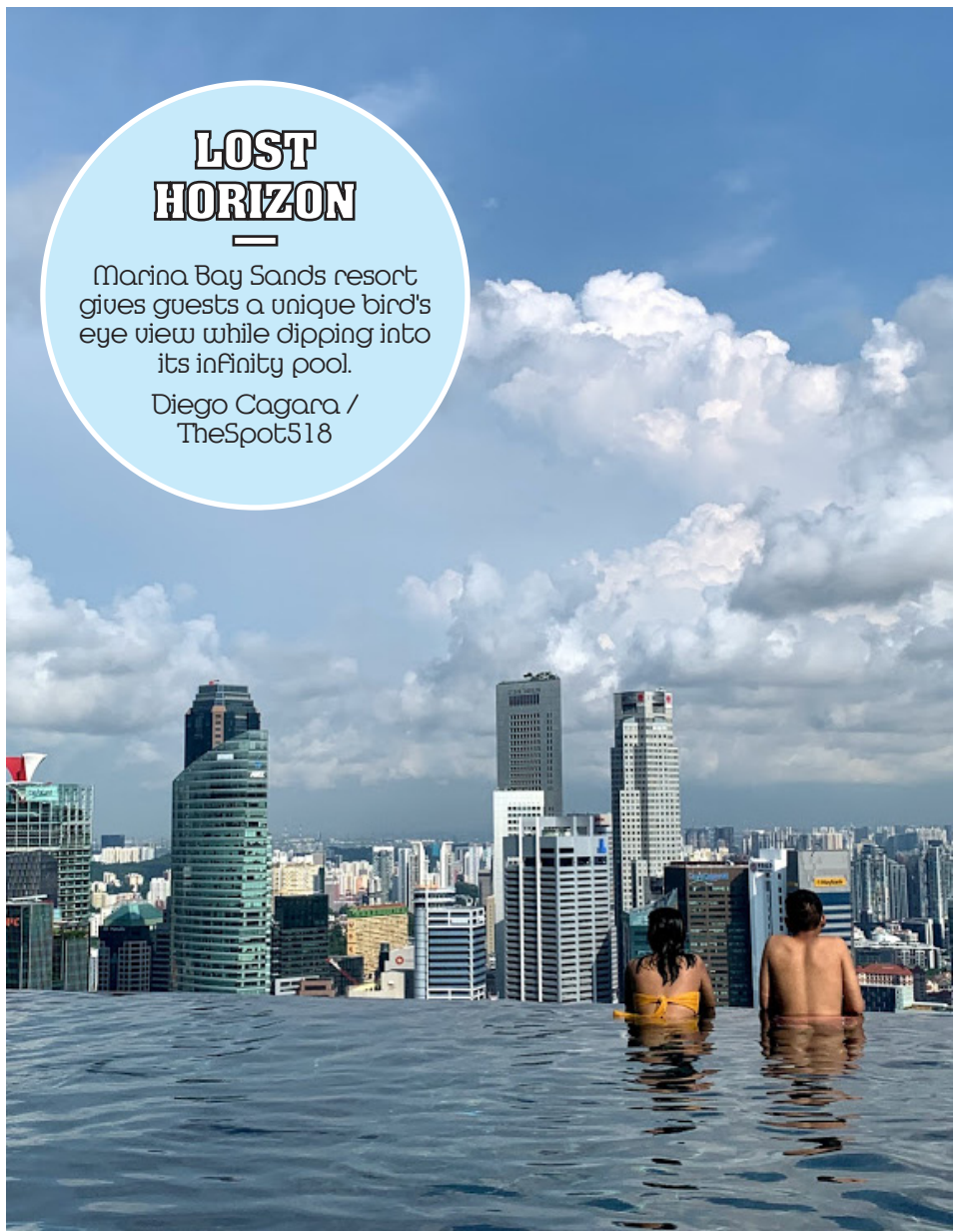
The journey back

Upon landing in Singapore in May 2019 after a 25-hour flight, the first familiar sensation I experienced was the genuine humid climate and the 90° F temperature once I exited the airport. There were aspects that have remained the same since I left, like the roads, the dialects, the foods, the public transport, the neighborhood malls, and the wet markets.

But much has changed too.

The country has seen a boost in tourism and business in the past year alone, due to being the setting of the critically-

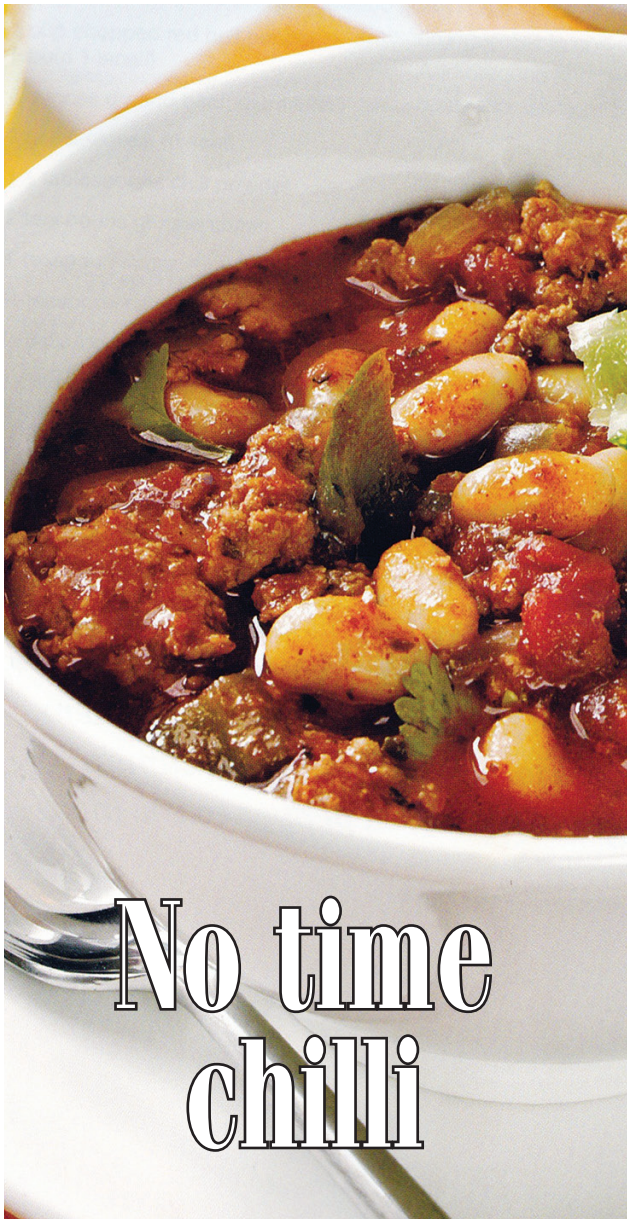

Busy individuals sometimes think they have to skimp on home-cooked meals because there simply aren't enough hours in the day to prepare something fresh. While the drive-through lane of the nearest fast-food establishment can be tempting, rest assured there are many dishes that can be whipped up in a flash.

“Mise en place” is a French culinary term used to describe setting up ingredients in advance or “putting them in place.” Dicing, chopping and getting ingredients ready in the morning or the night before can make it easier to throw everything together when it comes time to cook. A recipe that also doesn't have a long cook time, like this one for “Turkey and Bean Chili” from “Cooking Light: Dinner's Ready” (Oxmoor House), by the Cooking Light Editors, also can help.

Turkey and Bean Chili

Ingredients — serves six

- 1 cup chopped red onion
- 1/3 cup chopped seeded poblano pepper
- 1 teaspoon bottled minced garlic
- 1 1/4 pounds ground turkey
- 1 tablespoon chili powder
- 2 tablespoons tomato paste
- 2 teaspoons dried oregano

- 1 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
- 1 19-ounce can cannellini beans, rinsed and drained
- 1 14.5-ounce can diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 14-ounce can fat-free, low-sodium chicken broth
- 1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro
- 6 lime wedges

Preparation

Heat a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the first four ingredients; cook 6 minutes or until the turkey is done, stirring frequently to crumble. Stir in the chili powder and the next eight ingredients; bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 10 minutes. Stir in the cilantro. Serve with lime wedges.

Attack the grill properly

How to safely marinate when grilling out

One of the joys of grilling is the chance to develop your own technique. Some people guard their grilling techniques as if they were safeguarding state secrets, while others are proud to tell friends and family how they made those burgers so tasty.

Marinating foods is one grilling technique that some swear by while others avoid. The efficacy of marinating is a topic of much debate. Some grilling enthusiasts wouldn't think of cooking meat or poultry on the grill without first marinating it, while others say marinades don't penetrate deep enough into the meat to provide any noticeable benefit in regard to taste.

Those loyal to marinating should always emphasize safety when doing so. The Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics notes that more than 128,000 Americans visit the hospital for food poisoning every year. Unsafe marinating increases the risk of food poisoning, but these strategies, courtesy of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics, can help marinade devotees avoid such a fate.

- Choose your dish wisely. Metal dishes should be avoided when marinating, as the acid in the marinade can react with the metal, posing a health risk. Reusable glass containers are both eco-friendly and safe to use as marinating dishes.

- Marinate foods in the refrigerator. Don't let foods sit out on the kitchen counter while they marinate. Keep them in the refrigerator, ideally on the bottom shelf at or



below 40 F. Doing so reduces the risk of food poisoning via unsafe levels of bacteria.

- Travel smart. If taking marinating foods to a nearby park or friend's house, transport them in a cooler, even if traveling a relatively short distance. Pack the marinating foods in ice and keep them out of direct sunlight.
- Do not reuse marinades. Marinades are not supposed to be reused on cooked foods. If you want to reuse marinade on food that's already cooked, it must first be boiled to destroy any harmful bacteria.

Some people stand by marinating as a great way to improve the taste of grilled foods. If you plan to marinate, emphasize safety to avoid food poisoning.

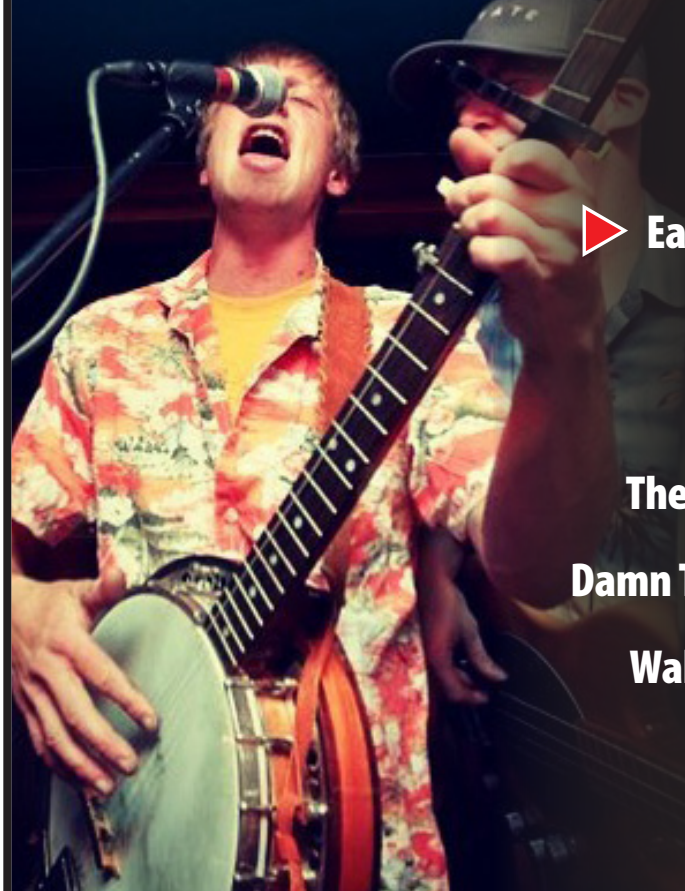

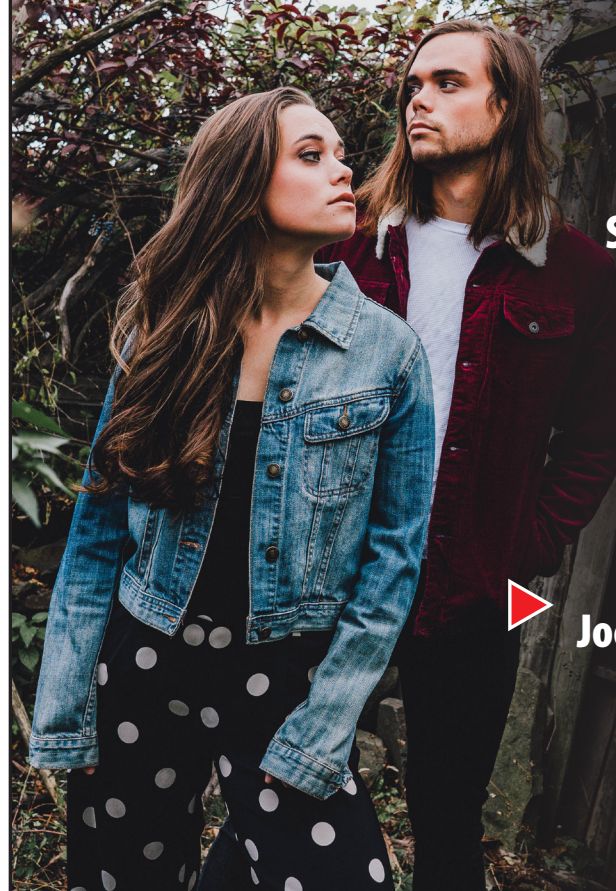

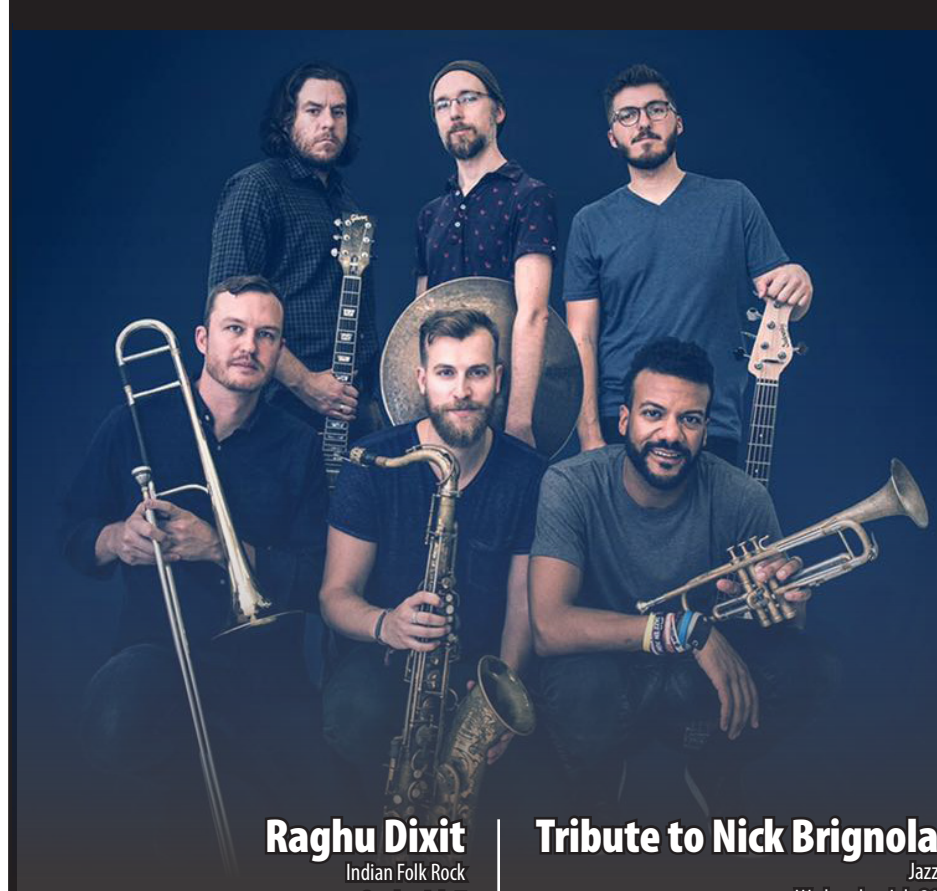

'So where are you from?'

acclaimed 2018 film, "Crazy Rich Asians." It was based on the same-named 2013 novel about a Chinese-American woman who flies to Singapore to discover that her boyfriend's family is wealthy, much to her

shock. I had also watched the film five times in the cinema last year and I would invite friends to watch with me, so I could show them where I came from.

The media buzz

and public excitement surrounding that film, for being the first mainstream Hollywood film to have a whole-Asian cast in 25 years, further placed Singapore under an international spotlight. In the years prior when I lived there and also right after I moved away, I had discovered that many people I interacted with either did not know where

area of the island which was also where my family's hotel was, I took a one-hour morning train ride out to Choa Chu Kang, my hometown, to see my old apartment, elementary school, and also reunite with Jodie.

Jodie and I had actually been able to first reconnect over social media and initially catch up back

Singapore was or know it even exists. Since 2018 though, people I've met knew more of Singapore due to the film.

I was also surprised at how the country has rapidly been more urbanized since I lived there, with more skyscrapers and developments dominating the tropical landscape, especially the iconic Marina Bay Sands integrated resort.

The reunion

While tourists flooded the metropolitan

in fall 2018 — she had messaged me when she saw a post I made about watching "Crazy Rich Asians" five times. When I told her I was coming to visit in the spring, we began planning our much-awaited reunion.

As the train neared Choa Chu Kang, my anticipation grew as it passed familiar apartment buildings, playground parks and neighborhood malls. It continued to balloon as I got off and waited beyond the train station's exit turnstiles, which was our designated meeting point.

Minutes later, my body stiffened as my eyes fell upon a specific face through the immense crowd. That face, which had long resided in my vault of childhood memories, looked a bit different now and yet it also was so familiar. It also no longer belonged to a girl, but rather a slightly-taller young woman now. A rare type of smile then formed on that face, a visible mix of recognition, surprise and after a few milliseconds, euphoria.

"Diego?" The young lady asked, her eyebrows raised above her glasses. Verbal communication was no

longer necessary afterwards though.

Embracing each other in a tight hug, it took me a moment to reorient myself as I realized that "home," as a concept, does not necessarily mean a physical house or a location. It could also mean a person, with whom you have a strong connection. We also had not seen each other in person in 12 years.

As we caught up over what we had each been up to, Jodie and I walked a comfortable 15-minute walk from the train station to our apartment block, as if I had entered a time portal into the mid-2000s. We went up to my former apartment door, although a bit disheartened that we could not enter. We got a couple of our childhood snacks from the neighborhood store and we even went up to our elementary school's entrance — a kind security guard told us we had to make an appointment with a teacher first to visit inside.

But peering up at the school's fourth floor, I saw the door of the very room where our fourth-grade teacher had first sat us together back in 2006.

With every step around, nostalgic memories, most of which had been long forgotten in my mind, resurfaced as I saw that the town had remained largely unchanged, albeit with a few new developments. A sense of humility also overcame me as I acknowledged just how far I have come since moving away from here.

After spending the whole day catching up more, further exploring our hometown and then traveling back to the city area, we lost track of time together as we continued reminiscing about our childhoods and discussing our desires for the future.

It was just past midnight now and the two of us were aimlessly walking through the streets of Chinatown, near where my hotel was. The night sky looked peaceful above while the formerly-iridescent and decorative lights had turned off, and the shophouses had just closed its doors. Chinatown, usually known for its booming tourist scene, was now an empty landscape. The only audible sounds were the rustling

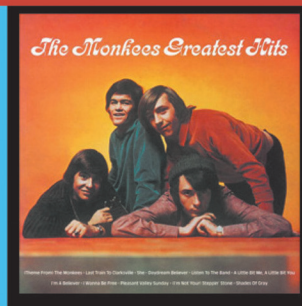

Enjoying each other's silent company, a sense of all-encompassing tranquility enveloped me. I was comforted by the familiar humid climate, the rich Southeast Asian culture around me, and the chance I had to reconnect with my long-lost childhood friend.

This was home to me. It felt right. And I was grateful.

After joking that it should not take us another 12 years to reunite once more and promising that we will stay in touch, we had to part ways and we hugged before Jodie took a taxi back. I was left standing alone by the desolate Chinatown street, a bittersweet smile etched on my face.

The question again

"So where are you from?"

Whenever I got asked this question, I used to take a brief pause to think.

On paper, I was born in the Philippines and I am now an American citizen. I am also grateful to be living in this amazing, free-thinking country where I have acclimated easily and welcomed the opportunities it has offered my family and I. In fact, during my American naturalization oath ceremony this past March, the judge called me up as "Diego Cagara, formerly of the Philippines," which felt weird to hear.

However, my true home lies on the

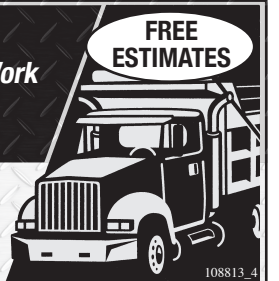

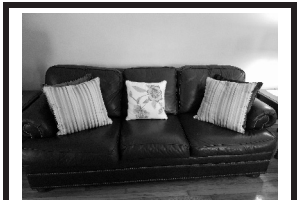

MUSIC REVIEW

Stellar Young's 'And Turned To Ash'

Sweeps you into a sonic glow

After you've released two albums, how do you do to follow it up? The Albany-based band, Stellar Young's, latest EP "And Turned To Ash," is as founding member John Glenn (vox/vocals) describes it, "the final of a concept trilogy." Something the band has been working on since late 2014.

The earlier cogs in this wheel, "Became a Flame," a straightforward rock and roll EP, and "The Spark Caught" (the first of three) which goes in multiple directions, have set the musical bar high for the finale. The opening track "Silhouette By Line" bathes you in warm expansive tones, setting the stage for the rest of the EP. Track two, "Wait," followed by "Old Roots," pick up where "Silhouette By Line" leaves off. For a moment you get lost, listening to a liquid suite and not just three separate songs, as the feel and flow align.

Maybe a trilogy within a trilogy? "Dance with Static" sits in the middle of the EP. The song takes a right turn from the previous three, cleansing the musical pallet with it's foot tapping straight away groove, while preparing you for the rest of the meal. "Struck" and title track "And Turned to Ash" round out the EP, sweeping you back into the sonic glow that envelops the EP.

Producer Dave Parker, who also doubles on bass and has produced all of the Stellar Young recordings, has captured the band's aura that radiates throughout this final piece. The music glides ever so smoothly from single instrument and vocal to full on band and back again without upsetting the character of the songs. Well thought out arrangements enhance the quality of the writing and playing, putting "And Turned To Ash" in the keep pile.

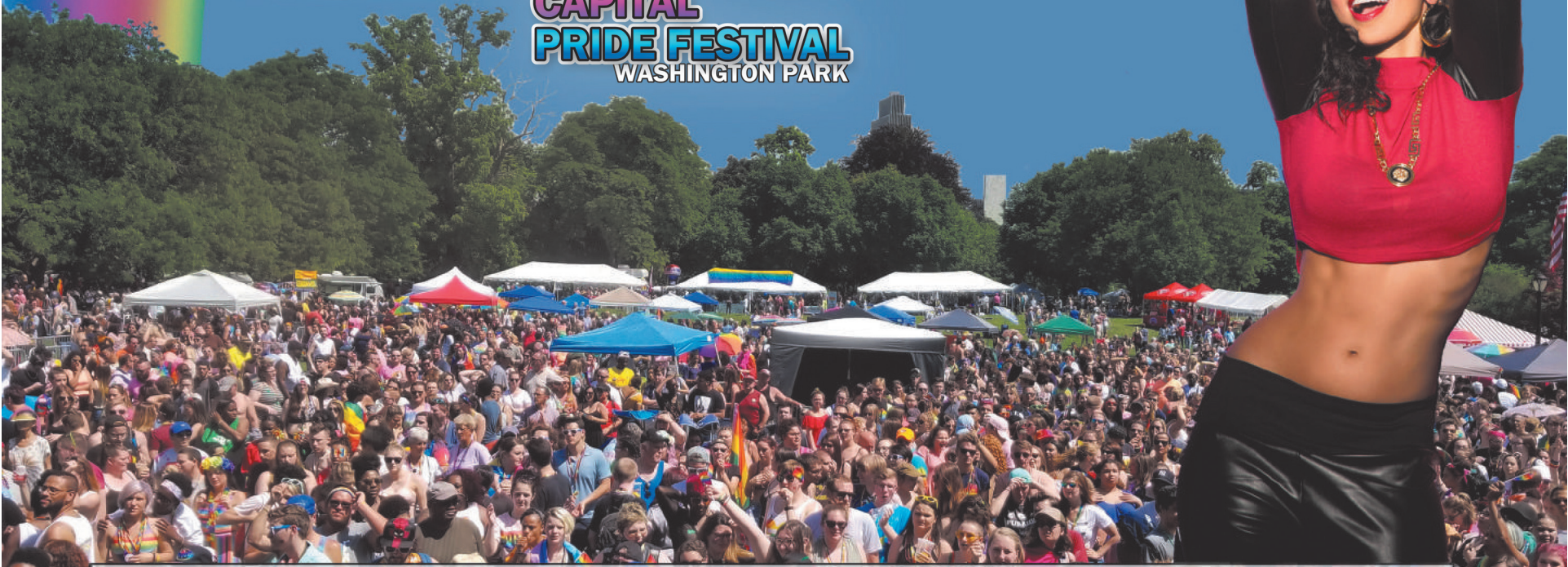
