# Smoke screened

Town puts freeze on vape shops

**BETHLEHEM** — The Town Board approved 4-1 to have a six-month moratorium on vape and medical marijuana stores after deliberation and having a public hearing in its June 26 meeting.

# Police: Child gets electric shock in Selkirk

Incident led to building being declared unsafe

**SELKIRK** — A six-year-old boy received an electric shock from an outlet in a Selkirk apartment on Wednesday, June 26, prompting the building to be shut down by building inspectors who declared it uninhabitable for now.

The incident occurred at 10:49 a.m. within a two-story building on 130 Maple Ave. which contained five apartments. According to Bethlehem police, the boy had been playing with his brother when he fell onto an outlet, which had no cover, and it burned out and sparked. The boy was then shocked but he did not lose consciousness; no one else was hurt.



Paramedics arrived on the scene but building inspectors determined that the building, where the incident happened, had unsafe living conditions.

Selkirk Fire Chief Joe Michaniw, who was on the scene, said that the boy received “some bruising” but was not burned.

He added that he helped calm the boy down upon arrival by inviting him to sit in the firetruck and the gesture made him smile and

cheer up. Also arriving on the scene were the Bethlehem Police Department, Bethlehem Building Department, Selkirk Fire Department and Delmar-Bethlehem EMS.

The boy was treated on the scene and was

transported by Delmar-Bethlehem EMS to the Albany Medical Center Hospital as a precaution, given his young age.

Michaniw said that the town’s Building Department inspected the overall apartment building and found some “code

violations” throughout, such as leftover moisture from water leaks on the walls, unsafe air-conditioner wiring and placements, and so on.

Spotlight News has contacted the Building Department for comment but did not receive any in time for this publication.

Michaniw said that residents said the building’s unsafe nature allegedly stemmed from how its landlord, who is said to be living in Long Island, “has said that he would fix the issues but he never followed through.” The Building Department is planning to follow up with the landlord.

This led to the building being deemed unsafe and residents were required to seek alternate living for now although they are able to return to their homes and retrieve their belongings. According to Bethlehem police, affected residents have made arrangements to stay

with their relatives or were helped by the Red Cross.

“It may take a while to fix it all because there’s so much wrong with the building,” said Michaniw, who added that incidents like this are not common in Bethlehem. “This looks like the landlord ignored the issues.”

Bethlehem Police Cmdr. Adam Hornick said that because it is a rental property, “it is important [for] the landlords to stay on regular care on their property and make sure everything is within code.” He encouraged town residents to contact an electrician if they experience unusual power outages, for instance.

“But the boy is going to be okay,” concluded Michaniw.

VanLuven said that the moratorium would go into effect immediately, citing it as an important issue due to the realization that the town's zoning regulations do not address anything related to vape or medical marijuana stores. He said it is also a timely issue as the town has received two applications for such stores recently, one on 243 Delaware Ave. in Elsmere and the other on 365 Feura Bush Road in Glenmont. The Town Board noted that the former would be located in front of Elsmere Elementary School and the latter would be 1,800 feet from Glenmont Elementary School.

Robert Leslie, the town's Planning Division director, confirmed that the moratorium would not affect Interstate Vapor — the only existing vape shop on 340 Delaware Ave. in Delmar which opened in 2015 — and also the proposed Glenmont business as it already received its own certificate of occupancy from the Building Department on the week of June 16. He said that the moratorium would affect the proposed Elsmere business as it has not received its own certificate of occupancy and also impact any other applications for in-town vape or medical marijuana stores for now.

Foster said that he did not like that the moratorium could be used as part of a political agenda and spread hysteria throughout the community about the dangers of vaping. Prior to the board's vote, he said that if the moratorium would be approved, it indicated that the other board members do not have much faith in the town's police department — in protecting residents, including youth, from illegally buying or abusing vape devices or medical marijuana — as well as not respecting honest business people who either have

already opened such a store or are proposing to open one in town.

Foster found it was "arbitrary" that the other board members defended the necessity of a moratorium due to their belief that public, especially youth, exposure to vaping and marijuana would have direct adverse health impacts. "It has been established that fast food has really serious adverse health impacts on all ages, especially children, with epidemic levels of childhood obesity and diabetes. Yet there's no proposal by this board that I'm aware of that there would be a moratorium on the location of fast-food restaurants in proximity to elementary schools, recreation spaces or elsewhere," he said.

VanLuven said that vaping and medical marijuana are new challenges that the town needs time to look into, unlike fast food which he said had been an issue for decades now. He also brought up that the potential legalization of marijuana in New York state is another new issue to address too. Taking the time to address zoning codes has helped the town prevent a hazardous waste facility from being placed near a school, for example, he said.

"I think that passing this moratorium will give us a chance to have the thoughtful, productive conversation that we need rather than rushing into decisions and cloaking them in the guise of politics when actually it's good governance," he said.

Coffey said that the moratorium is not about debating the legality of vaping overall, but rather using it as a six-month pause button to look into and update the town's zoning regulations, determine if there should be a required distance of



vape and medical marijuana shops from schools, and where such shops should be located in town.

Cunningham said the board had received over a dozen emails from residents who supported the moratorium but were unable to make the public hearing. As a member of the Bethlehem Youth Court, Cunningham brought up that in a recent meeting, a middle school principal presented all the confiscated vape products found in the middle and high school; she connected this with how the local youth have been exposed to and tried out such products, which she found concerning.

She said the moratorium helps the town to look forward and take the time needed to address zoning regulations and "think about the kind of community we want to be."

### Public hearing

Prior to the Town Board deliberation, around a dozen residents voiced their perspectives on the moratorium proposal. Most

agreed that having a vape store near a school could interest youth to try vaping which can lead to health issues, that vaping products come in flavors and different colors to attract youth, that young people's minds can be easily molded to continue vaping through adulthood, and vape shops may deter potential families to want to move into Bethlehem.

"It terrifies me that my school where I have so many amazing memories could have a vape shop right next door ... and that could confuse me," said Lyla Stebbins, a Bethlehem Central Middle School student who was notably the youngest person to speak that night; her comments induced applause from the audience. "Being a child is already confusing enough and ... it could be confusing to a child to be hearing from an adult that we should not vape and don't smoke. And then, right across the street is a vape shop offering it."

In contrast, Leo Carusone, the owner of Interstate Vapor, said he used to smoke and switched

to vaping in 2011, and "my life has changed for the better." He said that he wants to help other adults kick their smoking habits too, which explained why he opened his business in 2015.

"In those four and a half years [so far], there have been zero instances of underage sales at our shop," he said, adding that he always remained firm and responsible with his store like not allowing to sell even a soft drink to anyone below 21 who comes to the store. He also is aware of how easy forged out-of-state IDs are made.

He also brought up Cunningham's comments from the June 12 Town Board meeting where she had said she does not "think it's a coincidence these shops are going in near schools. They know who their customers are." He said that he found those comments "offensive and hurtful" as his business is responsibly run, many of his adult-only customers enjoy the fruit-flavored vape products, and it serves the community.

Cunningham later said in the June 26 meeting that she still stood by what she said on June 12, adding that while she believes Interstate Vapor is a responsible business, not all businesspeople may be as honest and forthcoming like Carusone. "Prove me wrong. But I think the last 50 years of the tobacco industry have proven it's a very predatory industry."

# Monolith Solar to repay over \$54,000

Town concerned about lack of communication

**BETHLEHEM** — Monolith Solar has to repay \$54,222 in tax breaks as the solar installation company failed to complete its \$4.9 million Slingerlands headquarters, according to the Bethlehem Industrial Development Agency.

The amount — which the company had received prior to stopping the building's construction at Vista Technology Park off Route 85 in Slingerlands — comprises of \$30,400 in mortgage recording tax exemptions and \$23,822 in sales tax exemptions.

The IDA had passed a resolution to recapture that money in late March; IDA executive director Thomas Connolly said that after receiving no response from

Monolith Solar, he sent a letter to the company on May 14, containing an invoice that included the \$54,222 amount that had to be repaid.

"We want it repaid immediately and my guess is that they're not going to do that," Connolly said, confirming that the company has yet to respond since the letter was sent. "The vast majority of the money were tax exemptions that were in effect from the state so the town of Bethlehem is not owed money really. If we ever do get the money, almost all of it goes back to the state and the rest to the county. ... The town of Bethlehem has not lost any money on this deal."

This update came after Monolith Solar stopped construction and furloughed almost 70 workers in September 2018, as well as facing at least three lawsuits from other companies like Solar

Foundations USA that alleged it had not paid its bills to them.

The company had also welcomed Chris Stroud as its new CEO in October after his predecessor, Mike Hickey, departed after one year for a job at Siena College. Although Monolith Solar owner Steve Erby was optimistic that the company was moving forward, by

bringing back some of the furloughed workers and receiving a "recurring revenue stream in the form of financing" with an investor at the Feb. 22 IDA meeting, no updates have arisen since.

For months, what stands at the Vista Technology Park is an incomplete fenced-off structure of metal beams. Construction had been slated to finish in

December 2018 but its site plan, first issued in March 2015, expired on Dec. 13, 2018 despite receiving two 90-day extensions. Its building permits also expired on Jan. 31, 2019.

Connolly said that the building site is in the hands of Pioneer Bank now and if construction does not resume at all, "it is going to be a difficult property to sell because the structure

was started but not finished. But you have to find somebody who would want the specific square footage and eventually, something will be built there. But it will be a long, long process. Maybe in five years."

He added that the IDA has never faced such a similar situation where a company does not finish its project and also not communicate updates with the IDA.

"It's such a huge disappointment because we wanted to have the solar manufacturer in the Vista Tech Park," he said. "I think it'll be a waiting game at this point as we put all the pressure we could. We terminated their contracts and we are not getting the jobs and investments that were promised, and we want them to pay back."

Spotlight News has reached out to Monolith Solar for comment but did not receive any in time of this publication.

# Six whooping cough cases at BC in June

Spread to hopefully alleviate as classes ended for the summer

**BETHLEHEM** — There are now six cases of whooping cough in the Bethlehem Central School District in the past month alone, according to the Albany County Department of Health, as of Thursday, June 27.

The most recent case was on Wednesday, June 26 at the high school and another one had been confirmed at Slingerlands Elementary School on Friday, June 21. The remaining four had been in the high school. In all cases, Superintendent Jody Monroe wrote in mass-sent messages that the afflicted individuals were excluded from their school until they were deemed to not be contagious anymore. In each case, people who

were in close contact with the afflicted individuals were identified and directly contacted.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention defines pertussis, also known as whooping cough, as “a highly contagious respiratory disease ... caused by the bacterium *Bordetella pertussis*.” It can affect any age group but it is more serious for babies who are not 12 months old yet. People with impaired immune systems or moderate-to-severe asthma are also at high risk. An afflicted person would have uncontrollable, violent coughing which makes breathing more difficult; the person would often also have to breathe deeply afterwards, which causes a so-called “whooping” sound.

Mary Rozak, of communications for Albany County Department of Health, said the public should not be alarmed as

it is not an outbreak and the spread of whooping cough likely would decrease since classes have ended for the spring semester. “We are aware of this issue and we’ve been in touch with the folks and patients were identified and recommended for follow up,” she said. “We don’t have any pending test results at this time.”

She added that the department and school district have been following

the same practice whenever whooping cough arises like identifying the afflicted individuals and their closely-contacted peers to minimize further potential spreading.

Pertussis typically starts with cold-like symptoms, like a fever and mild cough, but it worsens after a week or two. By that time, the person may experience many coughing fits, vomiting, breathing issues and exhaustion.

The cough generally gets worse at night and cough medications may not remedy it. Such coughing fits could last for many weeks but people who had been vaccinated prior to contracting pertussis may experience milder symptoms and not have the “whoop” sound when breathing. However, people who had been vaccinated during their childhood could still contract pertussis “because protection

decreases over time,” according to Monroe.

Monroe also wrote that if a child starts having a persistent cough for over a week, the child should be evaluated by a healthcare provider. If pertussis is discovered, antibiotics can help treat the child to make them feel better faster as well as decrease the likelihood of spreading it to other people. According to Monroe, a child is not allowed to resume any school, work or extracurricular activities unless five days of antibiotic treatment have passed or the healthcare provider approves.

# Progressive Democrats earn early victory

Looking into Bethlehem races in June 25 primary

**BETHLEHEM** — Progressive Democrats earned an early victory in Tuesday night's primary election according to unofficial results provided by Albany County's Board of Elections.

Joanne Cunningham pulled away from her challenger George Harder by taking more than 76 percent of the 703 votes in the county legislature race in District 34. Cunningham, the district's current representative with the legislature, was one of three progressives running in town. She had teamed with both Jeff Kuhn (District 35) and Matt Miller (District 36) in a joint advertising campaign



leading into Primary Day.

Each of the three walked away with the majority vote within their party. In addition to Cunningham's victory, Kuhn staved off Sean Raleigh with a 490-260 result in the race for Delmar and Glenmont. For Glenmont and Selkirk, Matthew Miller will be

on the party line after defeating Marc Gronich 285-78.

Miller's counterpart on the Republican line will likely be David Harrington. Harrington beat Colin Dwyer by 27 of 248 votes.

Harder and Cunningham traded barbs in recent letters to the

editor. Harder took aim on a perceived lack of attendance. Cunningham, however, denied the accusation and stated her attendance record, including 70 public legislative hearings and 43 sessions during her term.

Harder has been visible in town politics for more than 20 years, having run for town office along with Matthew Clyne as early as the '90s. Despite not winning an election, Harder has served on the town's Zoning Board of Appeals from 2011 to 2015. In

2017, he and Dan Morin successfully sued the town's Democratic Committee for failing to properly amend its chosen candidates for that year's general election with the Board of Elections. The gaffe resulted in Harder and Morin appearing on the party line with the committee openly endorsing candidates on the Working Families Party. That division remained apparent as Harder took additional shots at Kuhn, who in 2017 was the committee's chair. He was later succeeded by Cunningham.

That history was later implied by both Harder and Raleigh, the latter of which described Kuhn as a "friends and family" candidate. Kuhn balked at that description, stating that he has no one in his family working in local or state government. Both he and Cunningham are pushing against nepotism in county government.

In the end, the voting majority did not lend weight to the accusations.

Each of the three local Democrats running for the legislature stands on progressive platforms that include

reform and downsizing of the legislative body. Cunningham lists a record of authoring and cosponsoring several proposals, including bans on polystyrene and plastic bags, family and medical leave, and pay equity.

Regarding other important countywide Democratic Party primaries, according to unofficial results by the BOE:

— Susan Rizzo defeated Darius Shahinfar to replace the retiring Albany County Comptroller Michael Conners by a count of 9,098 to 8,023.

— Andra Ackerman defeated Holly Trexler for the open seat on the Albany County Court bench by a count of 8,481 to 7,839.

— For the two open seats on the Albany County Family Court, Amy Joyce and Sherri Brooks got 6,792 and 6,736 votes, respectively.

The other candidates and their vote totals are: Jennifer Corona, 5,314; Margaret Tabak, 3,887; William Andrews, 3,823; David Levy, 2,329; and Michael Barone, 2,183.

# The Dutch are in the hunt

**COLONIE** — The Albany Dutchmen gave up seven runs in the second inning and dropped a home game to the Saugerties Stallions 9-5 in a Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League matchup on Thursday, June 27.

A day later the Dutch traveled to Amsterdam and won 11-10 with a walk off walk in the bottom of the ninth. But, on Saturday, June 29, the Dutch got some revenge by beating Amsterdam with a walk off grand slam. Down 4-1 heading into the bottom of the last, Aaron Roose, of Azua Pacific, hit one over the left field fence for his second grand slam of the season.

On Thursday, The

Dutchmen scored first and had a 1-0 lead after one, but they did not cross home plate again until the eighth inning.

Starter Ian Murphy, of St. John's, struck out the side in the first but walked four batters, hit a batter and gave up three hits in the second. Through two innings he gave up seven runs, six earned, and he took the loss for the Dutchmen.

Brandon Roberts, of St. John Fisher, and Ryan Greco, of Brockport, finished out the remaining 6.1 innings and allowed two runs.

seized as the result of Medicaid fraud investigations.

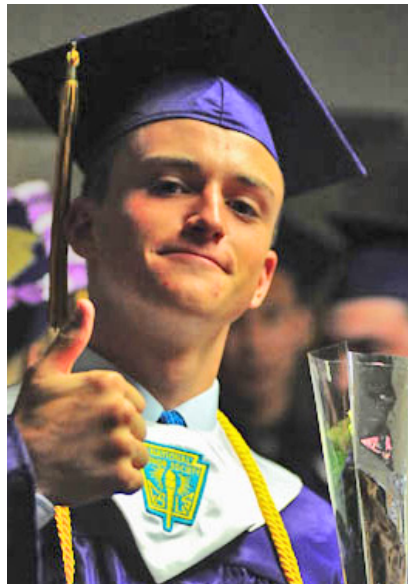

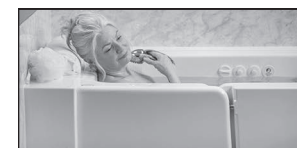

# Don't limit yourself

High school seniors said goodbye to their alma maters this past week, to embark on a journey wide-eyed and, in many cases, with timid first steps. The anxiety over the last of those final exams only just eased before slipping on the cap and gown, and walking the floor to the sound of pomp and circumstance. The tradition and pageantry is often lost on the young adults in the midst of it all. But, for the adults, it speaks towards memories of times gone by, and an affirmation to shared wisdom.

At one of the many graduation ceremonies this week was a young man seated in the back, not yet old enough to be in

high school. As the valedictorian spoke to her classmates, the boy's father tapped him on the shoulder. The young woman stood up before her classmates, heads and shoulders above them. Years of hard work, dedication and discipline to obtain good grades to earn the honor of being head of the class.

"Listen up," said the father to his son.

High school years are defined by fears. Worries over tests. Anxiety over rejection. Concerns about the unknown. How you see life at 14 may not be so different than when you're 18. The world, and the players within it, are changing. At 18, though, that

world is a little bigger.

Remember being 18 and listening to speeches that spoke of growth and perseverance and potential. How it all sounded tired and worn. The school administrators must share the same speech year after year, you thought. And, how puzzled you were at the unfamiliar look in your teachers' eyes as you walked to the stage. The valedictorian spoke of those fears but said, "limitations are born only from within." The father glanced over at his son, his nose deep into his phone.

Father and son walked out of the gymnasium together. Dad put his hand on his son's

shoulder and asked him what he took away from it all. The son shrugged. The boy's smart. He said to his father, "If I keep my grade point average up, that will be me on that stage." The father nodded as they walked towards the car.

Some people define their lives by fears. Worries over money. Anxiety over bills. Concerns about the unknown. How you see life at 18 may not be so different than when you're 43. The world, and the players within it, have changed. At 43, though, that world is a little bigger.

"Son, I'm not too hard on you when it comes to grades," he said. "I'm behind you, pass or fail, so

long as you do your best. Your lessons help you learn what you want to do after school. The hard work you put into it helps you become the person you're going to be. Somewhere in between, you have to understand, if there is something you want in life, you have to go after it. Only you can keep yourself from doing it."

The son looked up from his phone.

"Half the kids in that gym don't understand that," said the father. "They think that speech was just lip service. But, the other half, the kids standing on the stage graduating with honors, they were listening. I guarantee you, they understood."

# Vape shop moratorium is nothing but smoke

I have a 4-year-old who will soon be attending elementary school here in Delmar, and I can't think of anything more important than his health and safety.

That's why I was extremely disappointed when my colleagues on the Town Board recently approved a moratorium on vape shops that may initially sound good and appeal to us nervous parents, yet, in reality does little to nothing to protect our kids from underage vaping.

Some of the many problems with the moratorium become

apparent when we begin to understand what the moratorium does, and, more importantly, does not do. Let me elaborate.

First, in Bethlehem, and in fact all of Albany County, the sale of tobacco and vape products to anyone under 21 years of age is already illegal. The moratorium on new vape shops in Bethlehem does nothing to address the fact that, despite this ban against underage sales, middle school and high school students still somehow obtain vaping products.

How you may ask?

Teens can easily order

the products online or purchase them by making a quick trip outside of Bethlehem to visit some unscrupulous businesses. The moratorium does absolutely nothing to restrict or address those sales.

Moreover, and perhaps more concerning, many parents seem to be under the misimpression that the moratorium will put a six month halt to any new stores selling vape products or keep them out of our community entirely.

The problem is, the moratorium doesn't actually do that. You see, many shops, such as gas

stations and convenience stores that regularly sell vape and other tobacco products do not fall under the narrow legal definition of a vape shop and are therefore not subject to the moratorium.

Consequently, even with the moratorium in place, a new convenience store could open next to your child's school tomorrow and sell ice cream cones and soda right alongside cigarettes and vape products.

All the store names that are probably popping into your head right now -- well -- sorry to break it to you, but those aren't

technically vape shops so the moratorium doesn't relate to them. There are already convenience stores in town selling vape products and they will continue to do business as usual—and more are likely to open.

As we know, protecting the health and safety of our children is probably the most important thing any of us can do.

That's why I truly wish the moratorium was actually going to help keep our kids safe and prevent underage vaping, but it doesn't. Perhaps what is worst about this legislation is that it has fooled many

of us into thinking that we've done something meaningful to help tackle the very real problem of underage vaping.

We have not.

We have only wasted valuable time and energy that could have been spent more productively by cracking down on illegal sales, talking with and educating our children about the potential health risks associated with vaping, and giving our kids the tools to make smart, healthy choices throughout their lives.

# Spa City run moves date

Silks & Satins 5K to benefit  
Special Olympics New York

**SARATOGA SPRINGS** — The Jeff Clark Memorial Silks & Satins 5K, a signature summertime road race in the Spa City, has a new, earlier date for its 2019 edition.

Instead of being held on the third Saturday in July, this year's event has been moved up to Saturday, July 13 to coincide with the earlier opening weekend of the track.

The event features a male/female and co-ed team competition and an awards ceremony will start at 9 a.m. All participants are asked to bring a gently used t-shirt for the event's collection box which supports backstretch workers at Saratoga Race Course. Event parking is available in the Oklahoma lot across from Fasig Tipton at the intersection of Madison and East Ave., as well as on side streets.

"Volunteers are also needed for an array of roles, including course marshal, packet pickup, awards, water stop, start/finish line, refreshments, and event setup / tear down," said Silks and Satins Race Director Patrick Lynskey. 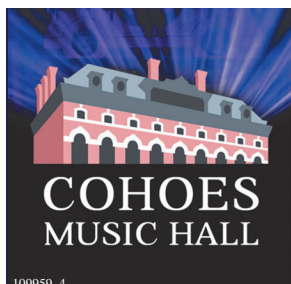

# Look who's back

Award-winning arts website will continue under auspices of NYSMUSIC co owner Jim Gilbert

**NISKAYUNA** — Nippertown.com is back.

Nippertown.com relaunched this morning, Wednesday, June 28 revealing a renewed focus on Capital District cultural offerings under its new publisher, NYSMUSIC.com co-owner Jim Gilbert. He will edit and manage the site along with longtime NYSMUSIC writer Laura DaPolito.

Greg Haymes and Sara Ayers founded the award-winning arts website Nippertown.com in May 2009. Over the years, the website's continuous coverage of the local music and arts scene garnered a strong following. It abruptly stopped on the eve of its tenth anniversary.

The site's relaunch was preceded by a short tease accompanied by a new, stylized logo of Nipper. Gilbert confessed to feeling anxious in an interview just prior to the launch.

"I want to do it justice," he said. "I want to do this right by Greg and Sara."



Gilbert's experience includes covering the regional music scene in the Northeast for nearly seven years as editor and publisher of UpstateLive, and later NYSMUSIC.com. A renowned concert photographer, his work has been featured in several publications, by venues and by a list of major recording artists that includes Pearl Jam and Korn.

Gilbert, however, said he understands the broad scope of Nippertown's audience extends beyond music.

"I always found it interesting that some of my favorite musicians were also incredible painters, or incredible poets or incredible writers," said Gilbert, "because the arts meld together. Nippertown is going to be that place where we meld together the things that make us feel."

Gilbert said the new Nippertown,

while sharing some music content, will have a stronger focus and arts and culture, perhaps even branching into food. It will also employ new scribes and cover some topics left untended since the demise of AllOverAlbany.com.

"We are putting our all into Nippertown," said Gilbert. "We have the resources and the manpower to maintain it at the proper level and to respectfully move it forward. I'm honored to have a hand in the future of Nippertown."

This May marked Nippertown.com's tenth anniversary. The celebration was cut short, however, once Haymes was diagnosed with metastatic cancer. The site shut down shortly before he died in April.

Ayers, of Castleton, chose to retire from the site to pursue her own interests but expressed a desire for its mission to continue.

"Jim has the right frame of mind to keep Nippertown viable," said Ayers. "It's a lot of work keeping tabs on the amazing array of activities in the Capital Region. Importantly, he also has the knowledge and skills to maintain the technical side of the site."

Following talks with Gilbert, Ayers—a renowned ambient musician—felt confident to transfer the Nippertown archive, domain and legacy to the Niskayuna resident and his staff.

"We've had some excellent discussions with Sara," said Gilbert. "We understand the passion and vision that drove Nippertown for its first decade, and we understand the work necessary to keep that vision alive. We're ready."

Haymes, following a long career as a

musician and writer for *The Times Union*, *Daily Gazette* and *Metroland*, was a tireless supporter of arts and culture in all its forms.

Among the site's many features were "Today's Tips," a comprehensive listing of local musical offerings; "The Daily Flashback," which catalogued birthdays, deaths and milestones in cultural history; "Seen/Heard" a document of the couple's latest interests in film and recordings; and "Live," contributed concert reviews of all styles of music.

Ayers, among other duties, compiled "Art Beat: What to See," an in-depth survey of gallery openings, happenings and exhibits; and provided all technical support and strategy.

Additionally, Nippertown nurtured a community of contributors, developing new writers and photographers into seasoned web journalists.

Gilbert said NYSMUSIC will provide a home for many Nippertown contributors on its own site as well as on Nippertown.com, which launches anew today, featuring a dedication that reads "founded by Greg Haymes and Sara Ayers."

As per Ayers' wishes, the original site and all its contents will be permanently archived and available.

"I can rest easy knowing that all the work we put into Nippertown was not for naught," said Ayers. "The writers and photographers we loved will have a home and the spirit of the site will continue. I'm confident Jim and his crew will do a great job. Greg would be happy."

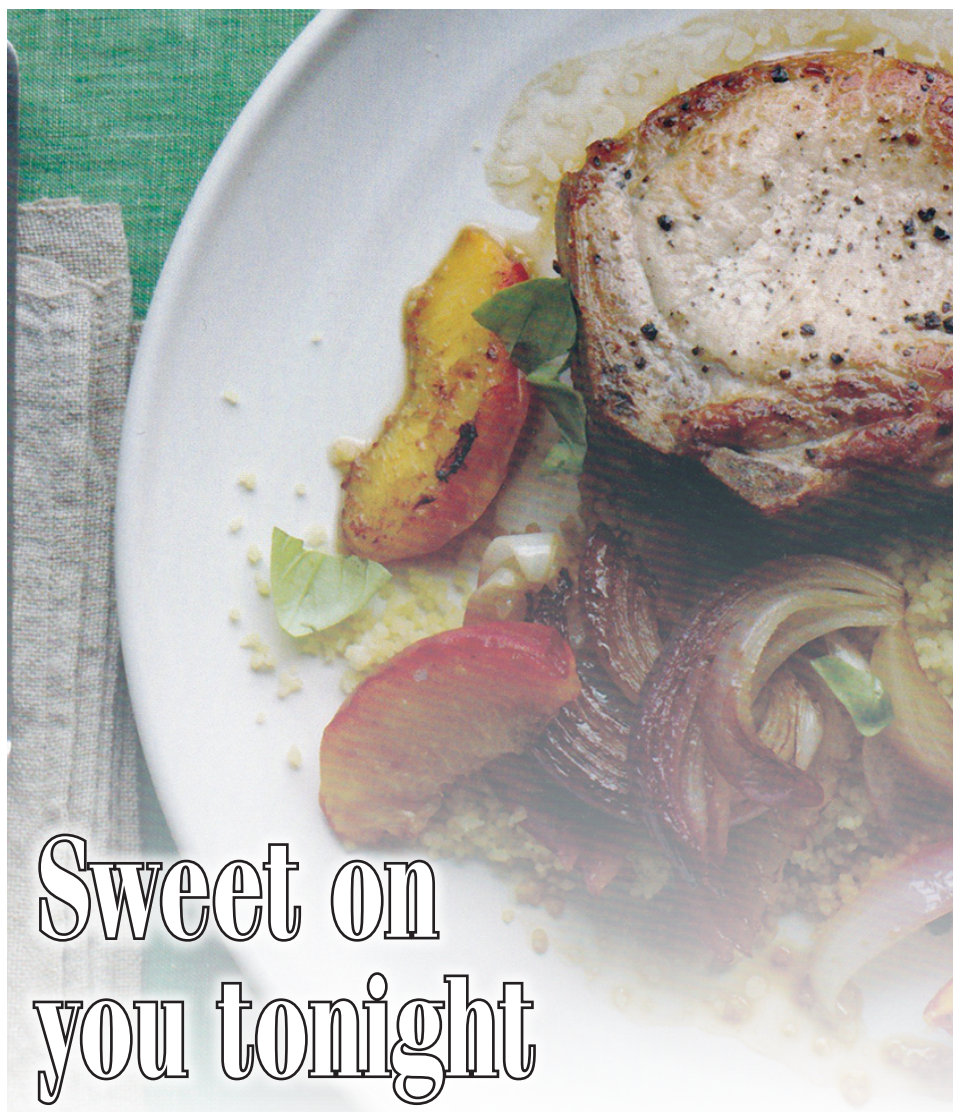

# Sweet on you tonight

The tastes of summer are often amplified by fresh, regional produce. Peaches are a classic warm-weather fruit that provide just the right amount of sweetness to a variety of dishes. While it's easy to pigeonhole peaches into breakfasts and desserts, they're equally at home in more savory dishes.

Fruit often pairs well with mild-flavored meats like poultry and pork. For a refreshing dinner that's easy to prepare and cooks up in just about 30 minutes, try "Roasted Pork Chops and Peaches" from "Real Simple: Dinner Tonight Done!" (Time Home Entertainment) from the editors of Real Simple.

## Roasted Pork Chops and Peaches

### Ingredients: Serves 4

- 1 10-ounce package couscous (1 1/2 cups)
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- 4 bone-in pork chops (3/4 inch thick; about 2 pounds total)
- Kosher salt and black pepper
- 2 peaches, cut into wedges
- 1 small red onion, cut into thin wedges
- 3 tablespoons white wine vinegar

1/2 cup fresh basil leaves

### Instructions:

Heat the oven to 400 F. Cook the couscous according to the package directions.

Meanwhile, heat the oil in a large ovenproof skillet over medium-high heat. Season the pork with 1/2 teaspoon salt and 1/4 teaspoon pepper and cook until browned, 3 to 5 minutes per side. Transfer to a plate.

Add the peaches, onion, vinegar, and 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper to the skillet, and cook, tossing, for 1 minute. Return the pork and any accumulated juices to the skillet.

Transfer the skillet to the oven and roast until the pork is cooked through and the peaches are tender, 8 to 10 minutes. Serve with the couscous and sprinkle with the basil.

# The root of the issue

Common causes of hair loss and treatment options

**M**illions of men and women experience hair loss in some shape or form in their lives. The Hair Society, a hair-loss information group, says that approximately 35 million men and 21 million women suffer from hair loss, and people are more likely to experience hair loss as they age.

Many different things can contribute to hair loss. Androgenetic alopecia (male pattern baldness) can begin to affect men in their mid- to late-20s, with displays of baldness growing in their 30s and 40s, says Bosley, a hair-loss treatment company. This is a hereditary condition that will only continue through life without intervention. Other non-hereditary hair loss issues may be temporary and reverse when the underlying cause is addressed. These include:

- **Hormonal changes:** Hormonal changes due to pregnancy, childbirth, menopause, or thyroid illness can cause patchy hair loss or thinning of the hair.

- **Medications and supplements:** The Mayo Clinic says that hair loss can be a side effect of certain drugs, such as those to treat cancer, depression, heart problems, gout, and high blood pressure. The American Academy of Dermatology says too much vitamin A in supplements can trigger hair loss as well.

- **Stress:** Hair can thin following a physical or emotional shock and may continue several months after the event.

- **Damage to the hair:** Treatments or hairstyles that stress the hair follicles and pull them tightly can cause a type of hair loss known as traction alopecia. These include cornrows, pigtailed, tight ponytails, and braids.

- **Crash diets:** Dramatic dietary changes may cause hair loss. For example, the AAD says people may suffer from hair loss if they suddenly are not getting enough protein in their diets.

- **Anemia:** A doctor may be able to do a blood test to determine if hair loss is possibly related to anemia from an iron deficiency.

Oftentimes, addressing the underlying condition causing hair loss can bring about regrowth. For those with hereditary hair loss, medications (topical, injections and pills); laser hair therapy; surgical or nonsurgical procedures; scalp treatments; like scalp reduction or scalp flaps; and other options may go a long way toward restoring hair volume.

Various hair-loss specialists offer free evaluations to people who want to learn about hair loss. Concerned men and women also can speak to a dermatologist if hair loss is a concern.

VanDenburg, Formica and Delaney make 518 proud

**ALBANY** — Full disclosure: I'm a major Moriah Formica fan. Since I began covering her two years ago, not only have I developed a wonderful professional relationship with the Formica family, but I've come to really love her and respect her as a person and as the hard worker that she is.

When I discovered Madison's talent, I was equally intrigued; how are two girls, who just so happen to be best friends, this talented? Delaney is no different. While Delaney is relatively new to me, I've fallen in love with her music.

When Josh Formica texted me about this show, I ran into my publisher's office to see if he would let me cover it. A few calls, texts and emails later, and I was on the list with my photographer. # Taken to gospel

Erin McKeown bares all at Caffè Lena

SARATOGA SPRINGS — Erin McKeown had confidence that seemed unshakable on the stage at Caffè Lena Thursday night, June 20. Erin began her set speaking about how she has to do a lot of self-work and self-building to get where she is. She spoke of how she had been outed at a young age, and her parents weren't accepting of her lifestyle. It was a relief to hear that someone who was so strong could have moments of self-doubt.

"Sometimes," she explained, "It is hard to look in the mirror and like what you see. Mirrors can break you back." This led into her first song of the evening, "Mirrors Break Back," off her album of the same name released in 2017. She changed her performance by treating the song as a poem, a spoken word piece. When she was finished, she was met with loud applause from the audience.

The room was filled with joy, a crowd who could appreciate who Erin was and understand her background. Caffè Lena had given the LGBTQ community a safe space to listen to an out and proud lesbian performer and activist. Erin spoke openly about her life. She talked about the struggles she has had, and how she has overcome it.

Witty and charming, Erin stated that she felt like she should play songs for the Pride event that were gay, but then commented that all of her songs were. She did include an "especially gay set" for the crowd. These included songs like "Sugar in a Pie" and "Jenny."

She also chose a song, "28," which was

about a particular time in her life - when she was 28. Erin relates it to the orbit of Saturn, which takes 28 years, and when it rolls around there is a time of upheaval and huge changes take place. "It's not especially gay, but I am," she said with a playful shrug as she began.

Erin switched to the piano to continue her set with the song "The Lions" which contains the lyrics, "There's a risk, there's a twist, to anything worth doing." This seems to be a philosophy that Erin has carried with her through life. She has successfully produced the musical *Miss You Like Hell* which has won five Drama Desk awards and was named the "Best Musical of 2018" by *Wall Street Journal*. At the age of 40, Erin published a songbook, "Some of My Better Songs (But Not All of Them)." She is currently working on another musical and perhaps a singer/songwriter record. Erin is someone who is constantly busy, and she seems to thrive when she has many creative endeavors going on at once.

Erin does nothing by halves. In geographic areas where there has been tension about gay rights, Erin has chosen to not avoid them as some artists have, but has made it a point to play there. She wanted to see how things were on the ground level and encourage the people fighting the good fight. For them, she wrote the song "Queer Gospel" to encourage them to persist despite the difficulties they faced.

The audience gave Erin a standing ovation, and when she returned for her encore she chose to play a song that required audience participation. Together Erin and the audience sang "Where Did I Go" with the audience filling in the chorus and Erin singing the solo verses. The Caffè was filled with voices brought together to rejoice in who they were, in whom they had bravely chosen to be despite adversities. Hands clapped in unison. On a night when it was important to come together, Erin ended with the right song.

“Travel the world one concert at a time,” appears on the Music Haven Facebook page. Call it clever marketing, a motto, perhaps even a mission statement — so long as you agree that it is an accurate summation to the experience.

“Whether it’s an artist that has been nominated for or won a Grammy Award, or another music award, is a big deal; or has played a venue or festival that they know, is a big deal,” said Goulb. “There are certain hooks that help folks to recognize that the caliber of the talent they are going to hear is top notch.”



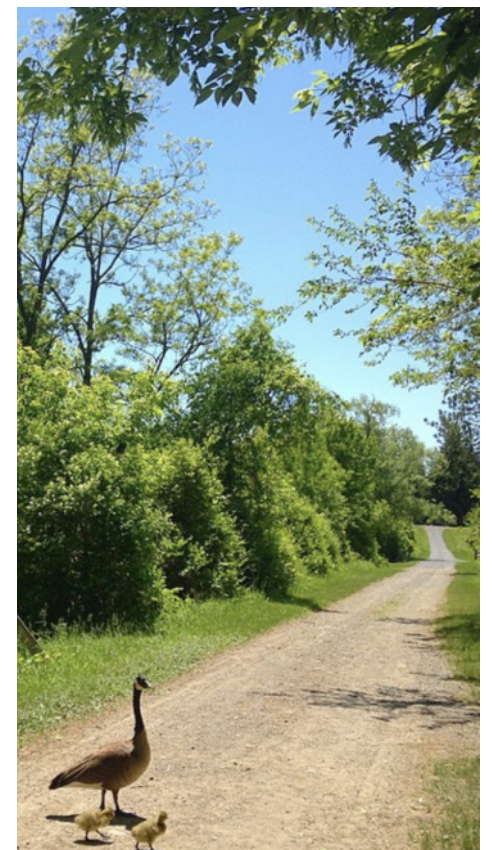
