Delmar man earns national accolade through service with regional EMS

DELMAR — A local resident earned the 2019 NAEMT/Bound Tree EMS Medical Director of the Year Award by the National Association of Emergency Medical Technicians.

As part of its National EMS Awards, NAEMT recognized Michael Dailey, the Regional EMS Medical Director for the Regional Emergency Medical Organization (REMO) earlier this month. According to its website, REMO is a 3,500-square mile region including Albany, Columbia, Greene, Rensselaer, Saratoga and Schenectady counties which serves a population of over 860,000 people and answers 200,000 emergency medical calls every year.

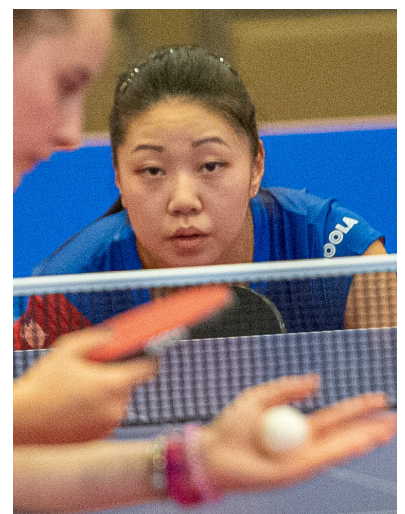

Having been involved in EMS since 1983, Dailey holds numerous other positions throughout the Capital District, including being the medical director for the Town of Colonie EMS, the Duanesburg Volunteer Ambulance Corps, the City of Albany Fire and EMS, New York State Police and more.

"I work with a lot of medical directors in the state and around the country, and there's a sort of small population of people who are very engaged in EMS. The people that I work with professionally are amazing individuals and are doing some great work and to be selected as the representative of that body of individuals this year is an incredible honor," he said, adding that he received the news via a phone call. "It made my day stop and it was a surprise and it was a huge honor and I'm extremely thankful. It also really reflects my passion for EMS."

Dailey will accept the award at the NAEMT's

General Membership Meeting on Oct. 15 in New Orleans, Louisiana as well in the EMS World Expo's opening ceremony the day after. Dailey is among six other individuals from across the country to be recognized for their contributions to emergency response services; for more information regarding this, visit www.naemt.org/initiatives/national-ems-awards.

Dailey had been nominated by his colleagues Luke Duncan and Steven Kröll in June, both from the Delmar-Bethlehem EMS where the former serves as a co-medical director and the latter is its chief and executive director.

Duncan said, "I trained under Mike as a resident for the nine years I've been here and Mike is not just the director of REMO but he's also at the Capital and lobbying for his EMS providers and he's at the forefront of so many things. He's a fantastic person to nominate for that because he's involved in so many

agencies too."

Kröll chimed in, "We've all seen Dr. Dailey in the home of a patient who's extremely ill and he's sitting on the floor and talking to family members about what's happening. So on a regular basis, he's directly involved in helping individual people." In their nomination letter, they added that Dailey recognized the importance of bystander CPR, the use of BLS naloxone to address the state's opioid crisis, being a compassionate mentor to local EMS agencies, and more.

Dailey concluded, "EMS gives me an opportunity to work with people from different walks of life and everybody within this system is making a contribution to improving the lives of people in the Capital District. ... To be recognized by my peers in EMS both at the physician level and EMTs means an incredible amount. It really is and it's humbling. I can't come up with a synonym for that."

Port of Albany wants to expand

New project still under review of Bethlehem Planning Board

ALBANY — The Albany Port District Commission is proposing to develop around 81.5 acres of land east of Route 144 in Glenmont.

This development, according to submitted town documents, would be “an industrial park with five conceptual layouts that range from 1.13 million square feet to 160,000 square feet of industrial use facilities.”

Megan Daly, the Commission’s Director of Economic Development and Procurement, said it is an expansion project for the port and “add 25 percent to the overall land size of the Port of Albany. With the land included, the Port District would be close to 400 acres altogether.”

The aforementioned concept layouts appear to be preliminary in nature for now as the project’s application is currently going through the Bethlehem Planning Board and has been under review by entities including the state Department of Environmental Conservation, Department of Transportation and the state Historic Preservation Office.

Each concept “would include associated access roads, employee parking, trailer parking, utility extensions, rail access from the north over Normans Kill and a bulkhead along Hudson River for on and offloading of equipment and materials,” according to the project’s submitted application.

The application was first presented to the Bethlehem Planning Board on Nov. 20, 2018.

Regarding recent updates, a public hearing on its Draft Generic Environmental Impact Statement will be held at the Tuesday, Sept. 3 meeting and the public comment period has been extended to Sept. 14.

The land for the proposed development was bought by the Port of Albany in fall 2018, said Daly.

Bethlehem Planning Board Chairman John Smolinsky said that the project’s consultants will be there for the Sept. 3 meeting to go through the application to any interested residents and discuss topics like potential effects on water, sewer and geology.

“I think it’s a big opportunity for Bethlehem as we haven’t had much industrial development,” he said. “It’s in an area that’s targeted in our zoning as Industrial and it’s identified in our 2005 Comprehensive Plan to encourage industrial development.”

He added that there is “very little residential development”

near the proposed site and its convenient location by the Hudson River and “right next to the Port makes it one of the obvious places in town to develop industrially.”

“We want to add more operations with businesses that have a use for a logistics hub. In the last 18 months or so, Governor Cuomo had the offshore wind initiative off the coast of New York at Long Island and he identified the need for supply chain activity in the state where companies would assemble and make parts for the offshore area,” Daly said. “We saw the [Glenmont] site as an excellent area for activity for offshore wind. We’re excited about what it could mean for the Port of Albany, the Capital Region and the New York offshore wind initiative.”

Speaking of that initiative, Daly said that it relates to Cuomo’s vision for a massive wind farm on Long Island to increase renewable energy usage.

The Port of Albany is proposed to be one site where production

and manufacturing for that wind farm would start and then be transported down via the Hudson River.

Besides a hope to contribute to the offshore wind farm cause, Daly said it would ideally “help connect the Capital District to the international marine highway where we can move goods either from the Capital Region to the world or have products imported from the world to the Capital Region.”

According to Daly, since the application is still seeking a generic approval, the exact purpose or layout for each of the five aforementioned concepts is not finalized yet.

“The intention is for the offshore wind initiative and it remains a major target for us,” she said. “Right now, such products are manufactured in Europe but if the Capital Region has a substantial part in that, that’d be amazing.”

She confirmed that whatever the final concepts will be, they

will be within the Town of Bethlehem’s zoning codes.

She also said that the Port of Albany is still working on the project’s cost estimates “but it could range as much as \$100 million or more. It really depends on what exactly is located there.”

She added that the funding will come from the Port of Albany itself, from private investments from businesses that would lease space in the future development, and hopefully from grant applications the Port of Albany is either making or will make.

“The Port typically applies to economic development and/or transportation-related funding either through the New York State or federal application,” she said.

While Daly said she is not sure yet when exactly construction is expected to begin, she expressed hope that it would immediately start as soon as the project receives approval, “A really good construction timeframe for this is around two to five years.”

She brought up that there has not been any overt criticism about the project but instead, residents have been asking questions and expressing interest in learning more about it.

She added that there has been “some very positive feedback” since it is related to the offshore wind farm and renewable energy causes, as well as providing more local jobs which can complement the Capital District’s economy.

The Aurora Games

ALBANY — The Aurora games, a first-of-its kind, international all-women’s multi-sport competition will return to the Times Union Center in 2021 and 2023.

On Sunday, Aug. 25, the seven-day inaugural games wrapped up with Team Americas winning six events — beach volleyball, figure skating, gymnastics, hockey, table tennis, tennis — and Team World winning one — basketball.

“I am so thrilled that the Aurora Games will return to Albany in 2021 and 2023,” said Albany County Executive Daniel P. McCoy. “These inaugural games have served as an inspiration to our young women and there were history-making moments like 14-year-old figure skater Alysa Liu completing a quadruple Lutz, the first U.S. woman to successfully do so in a competition. The Aurora Games have gotten off to a great start and I look forward to them growing in the future.”

The closing ceremonies on Sunday, Aug. 25, included the awarding to Team Americas of the Babe Didrikson Zaharias Trophy, the official trophy of the Aurora Games. Didrikson Zaharias was named the “Greatest Female Athlete of the First Half of the 20th Century” by the Associated Press for her achievements in

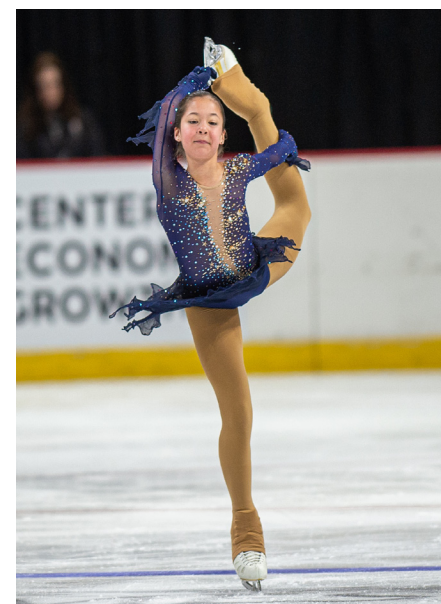
multiple sports, including golf, basketball, baseball and track and field.

Some 150 athletes participated, including Olympic medal winners and national champions, from more than 20 countries. Highlights included Katelyn Ohashi, a former UCLA gymnast scoring a perfect 10 on the artistic floor exercise, and 14-year-old U.S. Figure skating champion Alysa Liu nailing a quadruple Lutz, the first U.S. women figure skater to do so in competition.

Total attendance for the six-day event was 20,423. It was aired live on ESPNU and ESPN3 throughout the week.

“The women who competed here in Albany showed why they’re some of the best athletes in the world and demonstrated why they deserve an exclusive platform to showcase their outstanding talents,” said Jerry Solomon, executive director and founder of the Aurora Games. “The athletes also took the time to participate in youth sports clinics and workshops on women’s empowerment, giving young girls and women the opportunity to meet their sports idols and Olympic legends one-on-one.”

Statewide contest to pick design

Mandatory new license plate costs \$25

ALBANY — State residents are being asked to pick their favorite out of five proposed new license plate designs.

Beginning in April 2020, when a person who has the blue and white Empire State plate re-registers a vehicle they will need to buy a new license plate for \$25.

It will cost \$20 for those who want to keep their current license plate number. Other registration fees will still apply.

“I don’t have an issue with updating the design of New York’s license plates or replacing the plates that are peeling, but taxpayers should not have to foot the bill for the inferior product that the state has produced.”

said Sen. Jim Tedisco, R-Schenectady. “More than 189,000 people escaped from New York over the last year and one million over the past decade. These new DMV plate fees will certainly accomplish one goal: getting more New Yorkers to hit the road – permanently.”

Three of the plates feature the Statue of

Liberty, one of them has a small silhouette of Lady Liberty as well as a depiction of Niagara Falls and Manhattan and the last has a depiction of the bridge formerly known as the Tappan Zee recently renamed after Cuomo’s father, former Gov. Mario Cuomo.

Four of the plates, with the exception of the one

featuring the bridge, has the word “Excelsior,” which is Latin for “forever upward.”

“License plates are a symbol of who we are as a state and New Yorkers should have a voice and a vote in its final design,” said Gov. Andrew Cuomo. “As the life span of the old plates comes to an end and we develop new ones that are as easy to read as

possible, I encourage all residents to take part in choosing this piece of our state’s history.”

Currently more than three million vehicles in New York state have plates that are more than 10 years old, many of them are damaged, rusted and/or peeling making it difficult or impossible to read license plate numbers.

Having a license plate that is legible reduces a motorist’s risk of being pulled over and cited for having an illegible license plate.

Legibility issues can also hinder license plate readers, which are used by law enforcement, red light cameras and cashless tolling systems, from correctly identifying the registered vehicle owner.

Voting runs to Sept. 2 at 11:59 p.m. Only state residents can vote, and only vote once. Visit now.ny.gov/page/s/vote-for-the-next-nys-license-plate-design-to

Go ahead, make me ask for a straw

County bill won't do
any good, but may raise
awareness

At first blush, when I saw the county Legislature wanted to limit the use of plastic straws and plastic cutlery I thought, "here we go again."

Another stupid, nanny state move that won't do anybody or anything any good but, instead, just make it harder for businesses and a pain in the butt for customers, who get a milk shake at a drive through and have to circle back around to get a straw.

Generally, I'm of the mindset, the smaller the government the better. There are too many reasons for that to go into in 800 or so words.

And, the Albany County Legislature is infamous for overstepping the bounds of government into personal lives and private business — again, not enough room to go into here.

But, one of the great things about being in this business is you get to learn all sorts of things about all sorts of things.

Have you ever heard of the Great Pacific Garbage Patch? I didn't until a couple weeks ago. That's where all the plastic that ends up in the ocean ends up. It floats between Hawaii and California and its existence is inarguable. How big it actually is is hard to determine, but some estimates put it at twice the size of Texas. Even if it's the size of Texas we should worry. Or even the size of Rhode Island.

How much garbage in

the ocean is difficult, if not impossible to ascertain. How much plastic, thanks to tidal and atmospheric conditions, is in the Garbage Patch is impossible to measure because plastic doesn't biodegrade for a couple centuries or more.

Well, a logical person would assume, that should make it easier to calculate and even easier to clean up. But, I also learned a couple weeks ago, plastic that does end up in the ocean gets beat around pretty good along its journey down smaller tributaries and rivers and into the harsh salt water and breaks apart to pieces the naked eye just can't see.

It becomes microplastic. And no, that's not a sci-fi monster from the 1970s ready to take on Godzilla.

Fine, it's small, one might say, so what, it's not bothering anyone and I want a straw with my milkshake.

Fish, not known for their smarts, don't know the difference between tiny pieces of plastic and food so they eat it. Petroleum-based plastic is worse for a living being than a steady diet of fast food. It doesn't take much more than a basic understanding of the food chain to connect the dots and figure out what happens when people eat the fish.

Paper products, on the other hand, are by and large natural and start to biodegrade within a couple weeks. Within a couple years they are absorbed back into the earth or other organisms and become part of a healthy cycle of things.

Even if the plastic stuff does make it into the landfill instead of ending up in the ocean, it

doesn't biodegrade any faster. If it's recycled, great. But there are all sorts of issues with recycling now and a big part of that problem is China not wanting to buy our recyclable products any longer. China is also a major contributor to the Garbage Patch mentioned above.

I'm not a big fan of county government, and have written how easy it would be to just get rid of it entirely. How a county spends 90 percent of its budget is mandated by the state and most of that is in social services programs. The county is directly responsible for law enforcement, the nursing home and paving and plowing roads. Pretty much everything else is a state mandate.

I don't think we need a county executive and 39 legislators to figure out how to plow a road.

In the end, though, the effort to remove plastic from circulation is not a bad objective, even if this legislation is flawed to the core — for starters enforcement is about impossible and while paper straws are a feasible substitute, a paper-plastic knife and fork is a little trickier.

A little history, the Legislature was prepared to ban plastic bags before the state preempted the county and by 2020 everyone in the state will have to use paper bags or, better yet, re-usable ones. In Albany County, there is a bill

to have consumers pay a nickel for every bag that is handed out at a retailer's counter. Everything has a tax associated with it.

The bill I've been talking about would stop businesses from automatically handing out a straw or plastic cutlery and make the customer ask for them instead. I know if I don't get a straw with my shake, I ask for one. If I've already left the drive thru, first I swear a couple times and then go back and ask for one.

I'm not sure why the county just doesn't ban the plastic utensils like they did Styrofoam cups a couple years ago. It didn't do any global good — you can still get a Styrofoam cup filled with Dunkin' Donuts coffee in Saratoga County — but it's not a bad thing, either.

The same can apply to the restrictions on plastic utensils, I guess, but instead of driving across a county line to get a plastic straw, all you have to do is ask for it. Pretty useless, really.

Even if the state did it, anyone who really wanted plastic straws could just drive over the border Massachusetts — and New York state is a far cry from the size of Texas.

The county Legislature has a history of trying to overstep its bounds like trying ban on flavored tobacco, perfectly legal and already highly regulated products, and trying to mandate paid sick time. I guess, this one too, is along those same lines.

But, maybe by just proposing the restrictions will raise awareness and people will take it upon themselves to do the right thing and make an effort to cut down on their own personal use of plastic or, in the least, dispose of it properly after they get done with their milkshake.

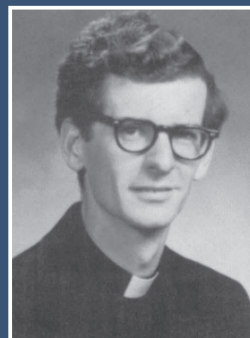

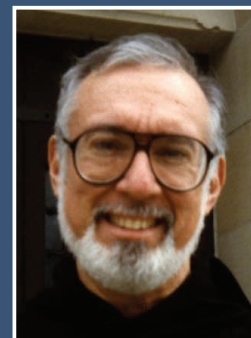

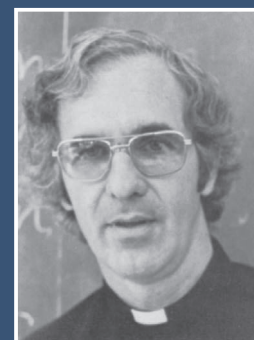

"Things happen for a reason and I think I've made great decisions and one parent once told me when I was worried that I know what I'm doing and I can now showcase what I'm doing with this studio," she said. "I thought that's right and I thanked them for helping me realize that. I do offer more today than I did in October."

Regarding that last point, she said the studio has 50 enrolled children for the fall now which "was double my number from last year. We have, on average, probably 10 to 15 adults too." She added the studio benefits from its convenient location at Glenmont Plaza. "It's right there in the community. I love Glenmont and the families I've attracted are really wonderful people," she said. "I also draw in families from Selkirk and Ravena which I did on purpose because I don't think they have much there to offer for kids. So, the parents are thrilled and while their kids are

dancing, the parents may get groceries nearby here or even take classes themselves."

She recalled discovering the studio's space back in late August 2018 and she immediately pushed to have the lease set up in order to start construction and have it open by October. She admitted that setting up the studio's website and social media pages were quite challenging. Her somewhat carpe diem-like disposition stemmed from how she said she did not dance as much prior to the studio's opening and when she had just become a mother and a local part-time mathematics teacher.

"But after my second child, I realized I needed dance to be a major part of my life again. I thought the best way to make that happen is this dance studio," she said, perceiving it as an ideal combination of her love for dance and teaching. "Our teaching method is gentle and we teach our students how to use their bodies correctly so there's no injuries but we also want them to enjoy dance as an art form to express themselves."

When asked what skills people can benefit from dancing, McConnell said,

"Dance teaches us far more than the physical activity of dance. Dance provides kids and adults with confidence, the ability to speak for yourself and to mean it and be honest about it. I want the students to find that joy whenever they have a rough day too."

Adding that the studio's first year has been positive and successful, she hinted at looking into expanding into a second space one day. However, there are no more details regarding that for now. "We're still building a community and a beautiful dance family. ... Dance has provided so much for me since childhood and it's really exciting to provide that same idea and tools to all these wonderful people coming through my doors," she concluded.

Think small

Weight is a factor within a complex equation that determines whether or not a passenger jet can leave the ground. When considering a Boeing 767 is nearly 400,000 pounds on its own, a defiant commuter will argue over a few more to avoid parting with his luggage. But, explaining away the airline's policy would require a pad, some paper, a slide rule and a few semesters at Rensselaer. Suffice it to say, it's science.

So, science is applied towards the smallest of endeavors at United Aircraft Technologies, Inc. in Troy. Daryian and Evaguel Rhysing lead an upstart out of the Tech Valley Center of Gravity that has designed an inter-connecting clamp that could prolong the use of the military's strongest workhorse.

Daryian Rhysing, chief technology officer and executive chairman of UAT, spent 12 years as an aircraft mechanic for the U.S. Army and as a hull technician in the U.S. Navy. He developed Carpal Tunnel Syndrome from the countless hours spent on maintaining and fixing the wiring in the aircraft. Later, while attending Rensselaer to earn his bachelor's degree, Daryian developed his business concept. A clamp.

Think of the wiring behind your television and all its various wires. Your cable, the HDMI cords

for each of your gaming systems and the power cords for everything on your television stand — it's either left unkempt or you ziptied it all into a uniformed look. Now, step out of your living room and imagine climbing into the cockpit of a Sikorsky Blackhawk helicopter. Behind each of its gauges are wires strung throughout its fuselage and held in place by a thousand clamps.

Daryian's thermoplastic wire fastener is designed to reduce weight and simplify maintenance. It would reduce the weight of a Blackhawk by 50 pounds. He said that kind of weight reduction would introduce more technology into a helicopter used for a wide variety of purposes.

Through a three-year agreement with Sikorsky, the Rhysings meet with Sikorsky engineers bi-weekly in order to ensure their design stays within the needs of the U.S. military. In Troy, UAT uses 3D and augmented reality in lieu of parking a 20,000-pound helicopter on 3rd Street.

“They are modernizing their aircraft, so they want to bring on more technology,” said Daryian. “If we take off 50 pounds, they can bring new technology beyond what we have today.”

Blackhawk

Since it first launched 40 years ago, the U.S. Army’s Blackhawk fleet has more than 10 million hours of service. It is commonly used for transport, rescue, firefighting and combat. Despite the age of its design, Sikorsky is still under contract to build more for the U.S. military. The Rhysings did not specifically name the type of technology Sikorsky is planning, but the Lockheed Martin company announced late last year that it is preparing to equip its helicopter with the ability to fly autonomously.

Using what Sikorsky has named its MATRIX Technology, it will allow the military to perform missions with “two, one or zero crew members,” according to its website. While celebrating the helicopter’s 40 years in service, Sikorsky announced it expected to see Blackhawks flying for another 50 years.

“We are committed to the U.S. Army – and all other [Blackhawk] operators – and look forward to continued partnerships on the Black Hawk program in the years to come,” said Dana Fiatarone, Sikorsky vice president of Army and Air Force Systems. “It is our priority to continue fulfilling current and future requirements in order to meet the needs of operational units both today and tomorrow.”

In addition to the military’s interest in Daryian’s clamp, commercial airlines could use it in the effort to reduce its carbon emissions. Retrofitting an Airbus A380 with

UAT’s clamp would slash 600 pounds from the world’s largest passenger airliner. That won’t allow for more carry-on luggage, but the weight reduction would help fuel efficiency and reduce carbon emissions, said Daryian.

Troy

Daryian’s thermoplastic wire fastener is still in development. Through assistance from the Center of Economic Growth’s Business Growth Service group and regional Manufacturing Extension Partnership, UAT and CEG have secured more than \$40,000 from the FuzeHub Jeff Lawrence Innovation Fund to facilitate its commercialization.

“The Capital Region has been beneficial in fostering entrepreneurship,” said Evaguel Rhysing, chief executive officer of UAT. “It’s sometimes not easy. To say, I have this thing and I’m going to sell it to the government. It’s a big task.”

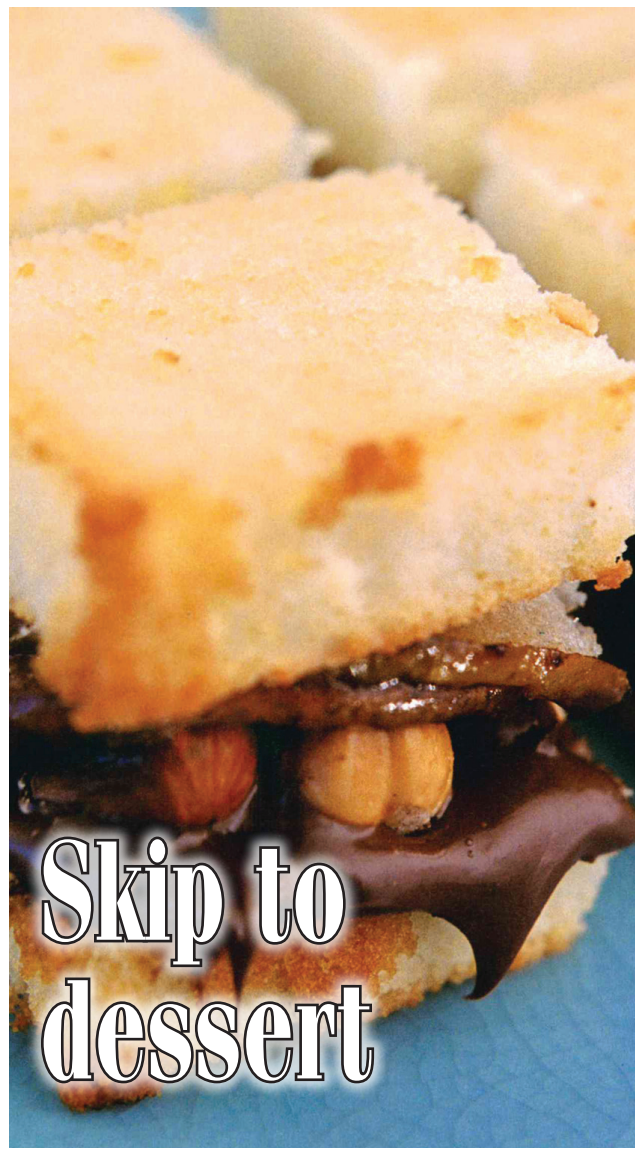

Dessert means different things to different people. Some may prefer a piece of cake, while others consider a cup of coffee to be the ideal caper to a delicious meal.

Sandwiches may not be the first thing to come to mind when the dessert tray is rolled out, but this delicious recipe for a “Knuckle Sandwich” from Bob Blumer’s “Surreal Gourmet Bites” is sure to please dessert lovers who want to expand their horizons.

Knuckle Sandwich

Ingredients: Serves 12 bites

- 1/2 cup whole hazelnuts, ideally blanched (skinned)
- 2 tablespoons butter
- 2 pears, skin on, cut into 1/8-inch-thick slices, then cored
- 1 store-bought pound cake
- 6 tablespoons Nutella or other chocolate-hazelnut spread

Preheat oven to 350° F.

Put hazelnuts on a baking sheet and bake for 12 minutes, or until they begin to brown. If hazelnuts are still in their skins, bake until skins begin to darken, or for blanched nuts, until they turn golden. Remove from oven and let cool. If hazelnuts are still in their skins, place nuts in the center of a clean dish towel, fold the towel around the nuts, and rub vigorously between both hands for 15

seconds to release the skins. Discard skins and reserve the nuts.

In a sauté pan over medium heat (err on the low side of medium), melt butter and sauté pear slices for approximately 5 minutes per side, or until they begin to brown. Reserve.

Cut 6 slices of pound cake, 1/4-inch thick. Toast the pound cake in a toaster oven, or on a baking sheet in a 300° F oven. (It will fall apart in an upright toaster.)

Smear 3 cake slices with Nutella or chocolate-hazelnut spread. Cover entire Nutella/spread surface with hazelnuts, then press them into the Nutella/spread. Top with a layer of pear slices and cover with second slice of pound cake. Secure each knuckle sandwich with 4 toothpicks, then cut into 4 pieces.

Diet to ward off cancer

Free radicals, antioxidants and cancer

Cancer is a formidable foe. According to the World Health Organization, the global cancer burden is estimated to have risen to 18.1 million new cases and 9.6 million deaths in 2018. The WHO notes that current estimates indicate one in eight men and one in 11 women will die from cancer.

Statistics like those from WHO paint a scary picture, but those who have been diagnosed with cancer or watched as a brave loved one fought the disease know it is far scarier than any statistic. However, despite its prevalence, cancer can, and often is, beaten. Preventive efforts like applying sunscreen before spending time in the sun and adhering to cancer screening guidelines can help people lower their risk for cancer and/or detect it early, when the disease is most treatable.

People looking to lower their risk for cancer will uncover lots of information, some legitimate and some questionable, by simply entering “cancer prevention” into an online search engine. Two of the terms that are likely to pop up in such a search are “free radicals” and “antioxidants.” Understanding these terms and their relationship to cancer can shed light on the disease.

What are free radicals?

The National Cancer Institute notes that free radicals are highly reactive chemicals that have the potential to harm cells. Free radicals form naturally in the body and actually play a key role in various cellular processes. However, high concentrations of free radicals can damage

all major components of cells, including DNA and cell membranes. Researchers have long felt that the damage caused by free radicals may play a role in the development of cancer.

What are antioxidants?

Antioxidants, some of which are made by the body, are chemicals that interact with free radicals and neutralize them, thereby preventing the damage that they can cause. The body needs more antioxidants than it can produce on its own and gets most of them via a person’s diet. These are referred to as dietary antioxidants, which can be gleaned from foods like fruits, vegetables and whole grains. The NCI notes that some dietary antioxidants are available as dietary supplements.

Can antioxidant supplements prevent cancer?

According to the NCI, analysis of nine randomized controlled clinical trials did not provide evidence that dietary antioxidant supplements can prevent cancer. However, this should not discourage people from consuming antioxidants in foods, which the NCI notes contain complex mixtures of antioxidants, vitamins and minerals.

Men and women concerned about cancer and the role that antioxidants can play in cancer prevention should discuss their diets with their physicians.

The Dana-Farber Cancer Institute says that, to date, nine randomized controlled clinical trials of dietary antioxidant supplements for cancer prevention have been conducted worldwide. Some studies have pointed to the benefits of antioxidant supplements, while others found that these supplements can actually elevate cancer risk or diminish the efficacy of cancer treatments. Increasing antioxidant intake may be best accomplished by eating a variety of plant-based foods that contain high levels of naturally occurring antioxidants, rather than through supplementation.

So what foods offer the highest levels of potentially cancer-fighting antioxidants? The largest and most comprehensive study to date into antioxidant levels was published in 2004 in the Journal of Agriculture and Food Chemistry by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Researchers analyzed antioxidant levels in more than 100 foods. In addition to pointing out many foods people already knew to be antioxidant-rich, researchers uncovered some surprises.

These foods rank high among those with the most antioxidants per serving, according to the USDA. However, many other foods also are great sources of antioxidants. These include russet potatoes, pecans, gala apples, walnuts, Indian gooseberries, cloves and mint.

Foods with ample antioxidants

The term “antioxidants” is frequently associated with cancer prevention. Antioxidants are helpful, but many people may not fully comprehend the role antioxidants play in fighting cancer.

Antioxidants are chemicals that interact with and neutralize free radicals, thus preventing them from causing damage, offers the National Cancer Institute. Free radicals are formed in the body by exposure to ionizing radiation and other radiation. An excessive amount of free radicals in the body can negatively affect cells and potentially lead to the formation of various types of cancer and other diseases.

While the body makes some of the antioxidants it uses to scavenge free radicals and render them ineffective, it also relies on antioxidants from food sources.

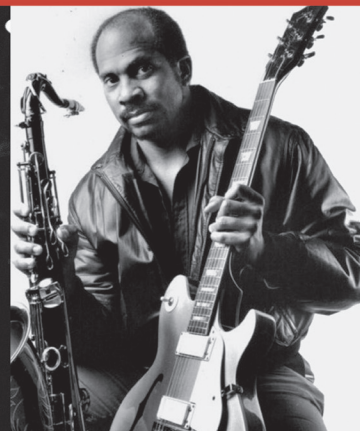

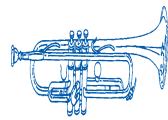

Bros claim Albany



Jonas Brothers use nostalgia to entertain Albany concert

ALBANY — “If you told me two years ago that I would be on this stage, I would say you’re lying. But tonight, I’m here with my brothers,” said musician Kevin Jonas to a nearly sold-out Times Union Center on Monday, Aug. 19.

As fans responded with frenzied screams, recording smartphones and unashamedly loud merchandise, it was dizzyingly unmistakable how the Jonas Brothers meant a lot to the mostly young and female-dominated audience. The trio — Joe Jonas on lead vocals; Nick Jonas on vocals and rhythm guitar; and Kevin Jonas on lead guitar and backing vocalist — stopped at Albany as part of their Happiness Begins Tour, which supports their same-named comeback album released in June.

The Jonas Brothers have been active in the entertainment industry since 2005, with a major role in the late 2000s Disney Channel era, collaborations with fellow singer Demi Lovato, and releasing four studio albums through 2009. Gathering up a passionate young fanbase, their sudden break-up on Oct. 29, 2013 coincided with the cancelation of their fifth album and shocked their followers.

Each member then pursued solo projects but sent the music scene into an S.O.S. when they abruptly announced their comeback with the single, “Sucker,” on Feb. 28 this year. The song topped several countries’ music charts, including the Billboard Hot 100 and was followed by its parent album, “Happiness Begins,” which boasted the largest first-week sales this year with 414,000 copies. This record, however, was later broken by Taylor Swift’s “Lover” album, which sold 450,000 copies

on its first day alone on Friday, Aug. 23.

When the Happiness Begins tour was announced to come to Albany, Albany County Executive Dan McCoy announced a part of South Pearl Street to be named Jonas Brothers Way, which attracted mixed reception, in anticipation of their arrival.

The concert mainly centered on the themes of nostalgia and reconnecting with one’s childhood, as exemplified by how the Jonas Brothers felt like a much-welcomed time capsule from the 2000s. Interludes and screened visuals throughout the night showed the three brothers turn into much younger versions of themselves, which added to the concert’s cathartic nature as fans had waited years for their potential reunion.

That cathartic atmosphere exploded when the trio started the night with their 2008 song, “Burnin’ Up” which was further complemented by the use of pyrotechnics. Ending this song, the brothers looked visibly shocked at the sheer volume of screaming fans before them, even peering at one another with grins in disbelief. Throughout the night, they alternated between playing the main front stage, traveling down a slim runway through the floor seats, and performing on a smaller second stage to cater more to the back audience.

The band’s older songs like “S.O.S.,” “Fly with Me” and “Lovebug” received some of the loudest applause and enthusiasm from the audience, with fans echoing the all-so-familiar lyrics. This proved that the brothers understood how important these “childhood anthems” meant to their fans and they revelled in exploring their older music catalogue. The crowd scrambled in surprise when Nick began performing his 2014 solo song, “Jealous” which Joe also sang from the first chorus onwards. This was followed by “Cake by the Ocean,” Joe’s catchy 2016



song with his former band DNCE. For this number, inflatable tube men and confetti exploded on the scene to add to the concert's overall positive atmosphere.

Staying on the nostalgia train, the Jonas Brothers gauged the audience to offer some fan requests and they played "Turn Right," "Just Friends" and "Gotta Find You." The latter became one of the night's most memorable highlights as fans remembered it from the soundtrack of Disney's 2008 landmark film, "Camp Rock." As it was being performed, one couldn't help but imagine if their former co-star Demi Lovato may make a surprise appearance.

The newer songs like "Cool," "Only Human," "Comeback" and "Rollercoaster" also offered thrilling moments, although it was clear that not all audience members knew the lyrics. A surge in screams and applause followed when they began performing the familiar introductory guitar strings to their 2007 hit, "Year 3000" where fans jumped in unison during its lively chorus. The night ended with their recent smash hit, "Sucker" where the trio wanted lights on the audience so they could see them one final time before heading

offstage.

The concert's two openers were Jordan McGraw and Bebe Rexha, the latter offering soaring vocals, sassy choreography and familiar songs like "The Monster" and "Me, Myself & I." The former's set, unfortunately, was a mystery to most of the audience as he began around 7:40 p.m. and the Times Union Center's security screening process was moving at a glacial pace.

Although the arena was supposed to have its doors open at 6:30 p.m. and McGraw's set begin at 7:30 p.m., the doors would open just after 7:35 p.m., causing many waiting fans to express dissatisfaction with the delayed security screening process and to miss much of McGraw's opening set. There was evident confusion as fans, once let in by security, debated heading to their seats to watch McGraw perform or lining up for the restrooms and to purchase food and merchandise.

Nevertheless, numerous people took photos with the Jonas Brothers Way road sign outside while they waited for the security line. The sign served as a final reminder of the concert fans originally thought they had to wait until the year 3000 for, as they exited the arena with numb chatter and beaming smiles just after 11 p.m.
