Become a potential life-saver

BETHLEHEM —The Police Department will hold a Stop the Bleed course for town residents on Thursday, Nov. 14 to teach ways to manage lifethreatening bleeding.

Happening at Town Hall on 445 Delaware Ave. in Delmar, it will start at 7 p.m. and people are encouraged to RSVP to Sgt. Mike Whiteley at 518-439-9973 ext. 1360 or mwhiteley@ townofbethlehem.org.

Stop the Bleed is a nationwide initiative by the American College of Surgeons and the Hartford Consensus that seeks to educate people on how they can save a life when faced with a bleeding emergency by using clotting bandages and tourniquets. BPD Chief Louis Corsi said the department has partnered with Delmar-Bethlehem



EMS for the Nov. 14 event.

That night, people can expect a 45-minute PowerPoint presentation by a certified Stop the Bleed instructor and then have hands-on time working with life-saving equipment as well as everyday objects to tend to a bleeding victim.

BPD Commander

Adam Hornick said,
"Equipment people may
have in everyday life
that can help as well are
like towels and items
of clothing. There is a
technique to putting
something over an area to
stop the bleeding and how
to properly do it and find
pressure points."

He added, "About a year ago, we started training our officers with tourniquets and everything else in their emergency supply kits. Now it's come to another step where we're bringing it up to the public and we've also been training with school nurses at the school district."

"It's a great opportunity for the public to learn a valuable skill and it doesn't take a lot of their time. But you never know when you're going to need it."

Bethlehem police officers have been equipped with emergency supply kits since November 2018 to help save lives and improve response time while emergency services are still traveling to the scene. The result of a collaboration between BPD and Delmar-Bethlehem EMS again, each kit contains supplies like trauma shears, a rescue blanket, four tourniquets,

a CPR mask, Band-Aids and tape. Each kit has been placed in BPD vehicles to benefit both officers and victims.

Corsi said that while BPD has done a variety of public educational events for residents, this is the first bleeding-related event. "Any time you can put a life-saving effort out there, that benefits the community and so, we're usually at the scene first and if we can mitigate the bleeding, the chances of surviving increase greatly. So it's important for us," he added.

Hornick concluded, "It's a great opportunity for the public to learn a valuable skill and it doesn't take a lot of their time. But you never know when you're going to need it."

A can-paign with a message

Addressing STEAM curriculum and food insecurity

ALBANY — Four Capital District schools are participating in a STEAM-related program and competition called Kids Can Build, created by the Shalom Food Pantry this month.

Located on 393 Delaware Ave. in Delmar, the Shalom Food Pantry is a volunteer-based organization which offers healthy food packages to people and families in need, especially the local Jewish community.

Kids Can Build complements participating students' STEAM curriculum where their subjects like science, technology, the arts and mathematics intersect.

Students receive around 1,000 donated cans and are tasked to build 5-by-5-by-5 structures with them that are based on a visual theme that they get to choose.

The four participating schools are Woodland Hill Montessori School in Rensselaer, Robert C. Parker School in Wynantskill, Maimonides Hebrew Day School in Albany and Bet Shraga Hebrew Academy of the Capital District in Albany.

Once students finish prototyping and building their structures in their respective schools they will

head to Crossgates Mall on Monday, Nov. 18 at noon to build them again for an hour. Then at 4 p.m., a one-hour long awards ceremony will occur which will recognize each school's structure and their hard work.

After the structures are publicly displayed with descriptions, half of the cans will be donated to the Shalom Food Pantry while the other half will be distributed among the four schools that then decide which other food pantry they would like to donate their share of cans to

Chanie Simon, the program coordinator at Shalom Food Pantry, said Kids Can Build is sponsored by Sunmark Charitable Community Foundation and also seeks to address food insecurity in the Capital District.

"After this program is finished this month, we'll have about 4,000 cans to be donated off and service those in need," she said. "It brings awareness to the entire community and also the youth that there are people in the community who are struggling to put food on the table."

As an example of what one of the four schools is doing, during a visit to the Woodland Hill Montessori School on Oct. 31, Megan Stasi, a seventh and eighth grade arts teacher, said 28 students are involved in Kids Can Build.

Originally starting in September, she said they began brainstorming ideas for what their structure could be like, discussing possible patterns to choose, working to cut cardboard and collect cans, and even visit other classes in the school to speak on the importance of giving back "After this program is finished this month, we'll have about 4,000 cans to be donated off and service those in need. to the community.

Adding that this ideation process allowed different students to showcase their artistic, math- and science-related skills, Stasi said, "They discussed what they want to build with the cans and made grids where they drew out patterns and colors that the structure could look, and even considered whether they could spell out something with the cans."

She also said they had to keep in mind the structure's measurements, the potential to do an optical illusion, and finding ways to design and actually build it.

Four of the 28 students showed their still-incomplete structure during the Oct. 31 visit

where they explained they've chosen to do an agamograph — a visual that reveals a different image when viewed from different angles — with their cans. Zeinab, a seventh-grade student, said they chose the theme of "Think Outside the Box."


"We chose this because we thought it embodied our chosen theme which was 'Thinking outside the box' and when you think outside the box, you can't look at something from one perspective, you have to look at it from where someone else stands," said Nora, another seventhgrade student. "An eighthgrader was the one who came up with this idea and it kind of stuck."

So far, Colin, a fellow seventh-grader, said they have used at least 370 cans and need around 1,180 cans eventually. Maggie, another seventh-grader, said they had held a schoolwide can drive prior for the project.

The 28 students have since begun erecting their structure — with carefully placed colorful cans on top of pizza box cutouts — within a 5-by-5 square area in a classroom.

Nora brought up that she and her classmates got involved in Kids Can Build "because first, it's a really fun project and it also gives back to the community and helps other people and we're lucky enough to have a lot of stuff. So if we can

Enjoy a new free streaming platform

Kanopy offers thought-provoking content for users

The Bethlehem Public Library has debuted Kanopy, a new streaming platform, this month that offers a rich collection of films, documentaries, children entertainment and educational content to its library cardholders.

Kanopy is home to more than 30,000 acclaimed independent and classic films, foreign films, college-level courses called the Great Courses, the Criterion Collection and more content from PBS, Kino Lorber, Music Box Films, Samuel Goldwyn, The Orchard and other independent filmmakers. The Great Courses are

video courses on topics like fine arts, history, literature, mathematics, economics and more.

This connected to how Kanopy brands itself as offering "thoughtful entertainment." In terms of modern films, it would not necessarily have the latest blockbuster ones like "Avengers: Endgame" (2019) but it has more thought-provoking films including "Melancholia" (2011), "Lady Bird" (2017) and "Moonlight" (2016).

Kanopy is available as a downloadable app for smartphones, tablets

and certain smart TVs like Roku, AppleTV and Chromecast. It is free to anyone with an active Bethlehem Library Card after a quick authentication process. "Users already pay their library taxes so they pay for everything we have here, whether it'd be

e-magazines, e-audiobooks and physical products," said Gordon Noble, the library's manager for information and readers' advisory. "So Kanopy is sort of free but not free. It depends on how you want to look at it."

A user can click on the eContent graphic link on the library's home page at www. bethlehempubliclibrary.com to get started.

Kanopy is an Australianbased video streaming platform which was originally founded in 2008 and it offers streaming content for public libraries and universities. Now headquartered in San Francisco, its navigational menu is similar to Netflix's.

Noble said the Bethlehem Public Library began considering to introduce a streaming service for its cardholders a few years ago. As more local residents expressed interest in having one in the past two years alone, it led to connecting with Kanopy and the

No clear path, yet

The Board of Elections will count the absentee ballots next week and expects to continue receiving a few more in the meantime until Nov. 12 that had been postmarked by Nov. 5. On the night of Nov. 5 though, Democrats held a gathering at Twisted Vine while Republicans met at My Place & Co as the results began posting online.

The numbers of votes in each race in the rest of this article are based on unofficial results from the Albany County Board of Elections as of Wednesday, Nov. 6. Moquin and Roney, who each ran uncontested, received 7,890 and 8,033 votes respectively.

Highway Superintendent

The absentee ballots will help finalize the number of votes for the tight Highway Superintendent race soon. So far, Dorsey has received 5,111 votes, which is 88 more than Anastasi who has 5,023 votes.

While saying that he did not realize the race would be this tight, Dorsey said, "I've never had this kind of support before. If I win, it would be an overwhelming feeling. Even before this, I've already won. Father, brother, son, husband all those things are very important to me as well but to be entrusted with an opportunity to change and make change on behalf of the people is something else."

Anastasi brought up his gratitude for his support system — his family, friends and supportive voters — and "no matter what happens, I'm very thankful for the people who stood by me and even the people who've reached out to me because they're not happy with what's going on in town. I'll hold my head high either way it turns out."

Town Supervisor

VanLuven, who ran uncontested, scored 7,867 votes. "I'm excited to

come back and we've been working hard to get lots of things done and they take a lot of time," he said. "As I look into next year, I'll look at expanding town parks, the use of renewable energy resources, continue to deliver great services and more. Thank you for voting."

He added that he is thrilled that Coffey and Becker are returning too on the Town Board, saying that "they're smart and ask intelligent questions. In meetings, they provide invaluable insight. We've got a really good group of people to guide the town."

Town Board

Becker and Coffey scored 7,488 and 6,103 votes respectively while James Carriero received 4,226 votes. This means that Becker and Coffey will get to serve their second terms, starting in 2020.

Becker said, "I'm thrilled to have another four years and all I want to say is thank you for believing that I can represent the community and I will lead to the best of my ability." She added that looking ahead, she wants to look into the town's aging infrastructure and an in-

depth inventory of historic homes in the area, among other things.

Coffey said he feels humbled that voters have given him another chance to stay on the Town Board and he plans to dive more into the town's comprehensive plan update process, the Glenmont roundabout project, addressing development and open space, the Clapper Water Road Treatment Plant and the Delaware Avenue Road Diet projects. "We ran a positive campaign this year, I'm glad Joyce is back too and I knocked on a lot of

doors in town and got a lot of great feedback from people," he said. "We always stayed positive."

This year was Carriero's second consecutive attempt to run for office and although it was not the outcome he'd hoped for, he expressed gratitude for the voters who believed in him. "I've enjoyed visiting the neighborhoods and getting to know more about people," he said. "I don't care about what political affiliation or philosophy you have. It was wonderful to get a diverse input on their lives and what their interests in local issues are."

While he is unsure of running for office again in the next election, he congratulated Becker and Coffey on their wins and said he hopes they represent all the people in town. "I knew the odds that I was up against ... and I never anticipated that this was going to be a short process, coming from a minority," he said. "I know it was an uphill battle. But I'd like to thank all the people who were at least willing to speak with me at the door and it's been gracious and positive."



Doc suggests ban on flavored tobacco

s a physician, I know firsthand the burden tobacco use places on patients and I support evidencebased tobacco control measures that prevent the unnecessary suffering and death that results from tobacco use. Since the vast majority of adult tobacco users start before age 18, making tobacco products less accessible and attractive to teenagers is key to eliminating tobaccorelated death and disease.

That's why I support the comprehensive provisions of the Albany County Legislature's Local Law E which directly address flavors as a primary factor in the youth appeal of tobacco products. Restricting the sale of all flavored tobacco products ensures we avoid repeating the mistake made in 2009 when the federal government banned only the sale of flavored cigarettes, excepting menthol.

Here's what happened. In 2009, the federal government passed the Family Smoking and Tobacco Prevention Act which banned the sale of flavored cigarettes other than menthol. The law allowed the continued sale of menthol cigarettes and other candy and fruit-flavored tobacco products including smokeless tobacco, little cigars and cigarillos. Then

e-cigarettes hit the market in what seemed to be an infinite number of flavors including gummi bear, berry smash, watermelon wave and smooth menthol.

In the decade since the federal ban on flavored cigarettes went into effect, we have witnessed a tobacco flavor explosion. There are now more than 15,000 e-cigarette flavors and 200 cigar flavors, and more keep coming.

The 2009 ban on flavored cigarettes succeeded in reducing the rate of youth cigarette smoking by more than half. But among youth who continued smoking cigarettes, their use of menthol cigarettes increased by 45 percent.

And unsurprisingly, youth use of flavored tobacco products other than cigarettes also increased. By 2014, with the widespread availability of flavored e-cigarettes, youth use of e-cigarettes eclipsed the rate of youth cigarette and other tobacco use combined.

As of 2018 in New York state, nearly one in every three high school students had used a tobacco product, a rate of youth tobacco product use not seen since the year 2000.

Flavors in tobacco products attract kids, make it easier for them to start by masking the irritants present in the inhaled smoke and aerosol, and make it harder for them to

I applaud Albany County for their leadership in ending the sale of tobacco in pharmacies and raising the minimum age for the sale of tobacco products to 21. I urge the Legislature to strengthen local efforts to curb youth tobacco use by passing Local Law E.

Change in perspective needed

not the combined science and natural history of media-science. A scientific approach gathers all relevant information before casting a working hypothesis that identifies the cause of observable facts. ("Science" is both a search for cause and a cornucopia of earlier discovery".)

Current custodians of local habitats such as the Albany Pinebush and Lake George (LG) ignore the scientific approach. The 3200 acre Pine Bush ecosystem became the victim of combustion by fire. Flames transformed Pinebush into Albany Scrub-bush. It currently consists of multiple species of unidentifiable black oaks. With above ground buds destroyed, regeneration each Spring becomes the job for root buds that survive the fire, which are unequipped to produce species specific identifiers.

Environmental awareness invites scrutiny of current practice in Albany's "Pine Bush". Converting vegetation to greenhouse gasses flouts New York's efforts to reduce them. One person's misguided attempt to provide habitat for a small reptile confined to the Chihuahua Desert of Mexico contributes to global warming, and suggests the personal vanity of a herpetologist and an ignorance of ecology. How does burning dinner in the oven feed horned toads, plain toads and salamanders?

My suggestion is why not shelve misdirection and selfishness and favor the planting of a hardwood

forest for a growing volume of ecosystem services such as the absorption of greenhouse gasses. My, and hopefully the financial contribution of other donors await the installation of the necessary workforce.

Lacking a scientific approach, the commandeering engineers of RPI provide essential service by guarding the quality of water flowing into Lake George; necessary but insufficient. A scientific appraisal would hypothesize, based on gathered evidence, that the vast underwater meadows of nitella provided the hallmark clarity initially and continue to do so.

Currently the meadows suffer from inflowing plant nutrients, worse in the lake south of the Narrows. In the 23-year time span from 1948 to 1971, an index of light penetration was reduced from a depth of 84 to 42 feet, the culprit, phosphate. Although evident, the effect was less severe north of the Narrows.

Light provides two services, energy for photosynthesis and information for its signal functions, known as photogenesis. Nature's greenery owns the necessary pigmented proteins to capture photons in the signal bands of red, blue and violet radiation. A scientific perspective exposes the work of energetic and signal light.

back in any way, that's great." Maggie chimed in to say their school has done fundraising and worked with other organizations, nonprofits and corporations before. Kids Can Build, she added, also complemented how her school is huge on giving students hands-on learning experience.

Simon concluded that she had been met with excitement from the four participating schools, their teachers and students when she approached them about Kids Can Build earlier this year. She also brought up that this is the first year that Kids Can Build is happening and she is looking to make it an annual event with partnering schools next.

"There's been a big push in the schools in taking their curriculum and incorporating STEAM in it to bring it more into their lives," Simon said. "This ties in nicely with that and it's been great."

library launched it on Nov. 1 for a one-year experiment.

"It's always about how well it works with our patrons and we hope we get a lot of feedback because this is very much patron-driven," Noble said. "Once our patrons start to really ask for a streaming service like this, we take a harder push with companies that offer it and work to negotiate better contracts. Kanopy is developing its name brand."

The library will report to Kanopy officials regarding its success rate throughout the coming year and in late 2020, reconvene to discuss whether to continue it or not.

Noble said he is the main person who has negotiated the contracts for e-content and databases, including Kanopy, and works with two other department heads on reviewing analytics and reporting on its usage.

He added that the Nov. 1 launch date felt optimal since premiering it in December may feel too late as new streaming services like Apple TV+ also came out on Nov. 1 and Disney+ was released on Tuesday, Nov. 12. "I was concerned and we're never going to be able to compete with

them or Hulu or Netflix which are much more current, but there's absolutely a niche for Kanopy in our community," he said.

Geoffrey Kirkpatrick, the library's director, brought up that streaming "is maybe not a saturated market but more like the Wild West, and I think that the movies on Kanopy are not as well-represented in other streaming services because they are historically significant, foreign movies and popular films from the past that may not get the representation they should have. I think it fills a gap in representation."

Kirkpatrick added that BPL will continue maintaining a physical DVD/film collection for users to enjoy but Kanopy helps to alleviate the concern of limited content and space in the library. "Will that collection shrink in years to come? It all depends on shrinking demand in DVDs then which might happen, then possibly it can," he said. "We're in the middle of Kanopy's launch now so it'll be a question for the library board and staff on how we'll allocate space in the library in time. But we are not canceling the collection just because Kanopy's here now."

Both men also noted that if any user does not feel tech-savvy, know how to set up or navigate around Kanopy, librarians are available to help them with any questions and demonstrations. "That's always a concern and if you're really struggling with our services, we'll set up a one-on-one appointment with you, the patron, and walk them through the process to help them out," said Noble.

Kristen Roberts, who does communications for the library, said the Kanopy has a "pretty intuitive interface to navigate and they've done a lot of work on that and it looks like Netflix. If you're Netflix-level experienced, I think you can easily navigate Kanopy." Noble also said a user can easily search on Kanopy for works involving a specific actor, director or genre.

While Kirkpatrick said it feels too early to speak on what the public reaction has been like since Kanopy's launch, a streaming service like it has been desired by patrons already. "I'm just really excited and again, if anyone has any hiccups or trouble with the experience, don't feel afraid to come into the library and the librarians are literally here to answer questions," he concluded.





Something good here

Blackcat Elliot to drop 'There Is No Good In Us,' to throw CD release party at The Hollow

lackcat Elliot has been kicking around the Albany music scene for the better part of 20 years. The three-piece garage rock band is in good company, especially as of late, as they shared gigs with The Supersuckers and The Fleshtones last year.

It's difficult to stand out as a garage rock band. When one thinks of the genre, The Fleshtones certainly come to mind. It's a sound that conjures up CBGB's in New York's Bowery. Bands like The Clash, The Ramones and The New York Dolls have fueled an aggressive, fuzzy and distorted sound with aggressive lyrics that gets a live crowd moving.

Blackcat Elliot has twenty years of original content, showcased on three CDs as of November. The band's third installment "There Is No Good In Us" comes out on Saturday, Nov. 16, at a release party to feature sets from The Erotics, Mordwolf and The Lawn Sausages at The Hangar on the Hudson, in Troy.

The trio keeps it fun and loose. Kostas Gus Hais writes the songs, as well as sings and plays guitar. And, when Marky Balboa and Fast Eddie are not playing drums and bass, respectively, the two supply the nunchucks and six packs. I imagine that's what you need to kick butt.

Marky, Fast Eddie and myself are fans of music from the CBGB's era. Classic punk like The Ramones, The Clash, 70s rock like Cheap Trick, Vintage KISS and 90s Seattle-based grunge rock. You'll hear these influences on this album.

— Gus Hais, Blackcat Elliot The subjects of the band's material focuses on "our mischievous adventures," songs, the band says, that cater to the blue collar, broken-hearted and the unsung hero.

"There Is No Good In Us" was recorded at AAA Studios and engineered by John Chiara. The band said each of the ten tracks are "road tested, go-for-thethroat gems" they recorded after last fall's gig with The Fleshtones. Most of the songs come out fast and dirty. A gritty sound with each track clocking in at around three-minutes apiece, with the longest listen coming from the opening track, "Come Take Me Away" (4:03).

Hais provided great insight into what their fans and future listeners can expect from "There is No Good In Us" in this exclusive interview.

Gus: First, I'd like to thank The Spotlight/The Spot 518 for continuing the support of local music. Blackcat Elliot has been together for almost 20 years and with that much time, you start to establish a method for the right ingredients on writing and developing songs. With this album, the music was more of a team effort. Every time we got together, and a riff came about, we would try to structure it into a song. If it passed inspection, I would bring it home and write lyrics to it and most importantly, find the right phrasing. The songs on "There Is No Good In Us" are pretty much experiences from all over the place. Some are personal, some are stories, and some are inspired by movies. Fast Eddie and myself are movie buffs and we always have discussions on movies we've recently seen while we're packing up after rehearsal. Sometimes, those discussions turn into ideas for lyrics and themes for songs.

The legendary blues artist's eighteenth solo LP "The Blues Is Alive and Well" showcases his raw and unadulterated sound. Its fifteen tracks are a true pleasure for aficionados and genre newcomers alike.

"I got children and grandchildren who didn't know who I was," said Guy, "but nowadays we can play outdoor concerts and see kids that are 8, 9, 12 years old coming to me and saying, 'I didn't know who you was, but I read what Eric Clapton said about you."

Guy explains when discussing his mindset around the new record. "I'm always trying to make an album that someone accidentally plays where some kid hears it, picks up a guitar, and helps keep the blues alive."

The record arrives on the heels of a spate of high visibility for the 82-year-old performer: at the 2016 Grammys, he picked up a trophy for Best Blues Album honoring "Born to Play Guitar," and that same year he hit the road for a U.S. tour opening for Jeff Beck.





he holiday season is full of various traditions. One tradition that's popular among Italian-Americans on Christmas Eve is called "Festa dei sette pesci (Feast of the Seven Fishes)." When participating in this tradition, celebrants enjoy seven or more seafood dishes.

The origins of the Feast of the Seven Fishes are unclear. Some theories suggest that the number seven represents the seven sacraments of the Roman Catholic Church or the seven hills of Rome. This year, celebrants can incorporate this recipe for "Caldereta (Shellfish Stew)" from James Campbell Caruso's "España: Exploring the Flavors of Spain" (Gibbs Smith) into their seven fishes tradition. (Note: Omit the prosciutto if you are abstaining from meat.)

Calderetta

Ingredients: Makes 6 servings

Thickener

- cup extra-virgin olive oil
- large cloves garlic
- thick slices baguette
- cup toasted almonds
- cup chopped parsley

Heat oil in a skillet and fry the whole garlic cloves until brown in color, about 5 to 6 minutes. Remove garlic from

the pan and set aside. Place the bread in the hot oil and toast on both sides. Combine the bread, garlic, almonds, and parsley in a food processor or use a mortar and pestle. Crush and set aside. This will be used to thicken the stew before serving.

- yellow onion, finely chopped
- red bell pepper, cored, seeded and chopped 1
- ounces prosciutto or jamón serrano cut into strips


Instructions

Heat oil and sauté onion, pepper, ham, and tomatoes. Cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, for about 15 minutes. Add the saffron and sherry and bring to a boil for 2 minutes. 

When you just can't see straight



What is an ocular migraine?

eadaches can be difficult to handle and hard to see coming. Various things, including the weather, can trigger a headache. The American Migraine Foundation indicates that barometric pressure fluctuates as the seasons change, and those variations can lead to migraines.

Changes in the weather may contribute to ocular migraines, a specific type of headache that tends to catch people off-guard more often than not.

Understanding ocular migraines

A migraine that involves a visual disturbance is called an ocular migraine, according to Healthline. Ocular migraines may develop with or without the pain of a classic migraine headache.

Ocular migraines are different from the sensitivity to light that often accompanies migraines. The eye health organization All About Vision says ocular migraines are characterized by temporary vision loss or even temporary blindness in one eye. Ocular migraines may be mistaken for visual migraines, which typically affect both eyes and resolve themselves more quickly than ocular migraines.

Symptoms of ocular migraines

During an ocular migraine, a small blind spot

generally affects central vision in one eye. This blind spot can get larger, making it impossible to see clearly, which can affect one's ability to drive, operate machinery or read. In most cases, the disturbance to vision will be resolved in about an hour.

Causes of ocular migraines

Ocular migraines are believed to be caused by the same things that trigger classic migraines. The World Health Organization says migraine headaches seem to be triggered by a mechanism deep in the brain that releases inflammatory substances around nerves and blood vessels in the head and brain. Common triggers can include certain foods, beverages, food additives, perfumes and strong odors, glaring lights, weather, or emotional stress.

While ocular migraines originate in the brain, they can be mistaken for a more serious condition called retinal migraine. Retinal migraines involve repeated bouts of short-lasting, diminished vision or blindness. These bouts may precede or accompany a headache, says the Mayo Clinic. A retinal migraine may be the result of diminished blood flow to the blood vessels in the eye due to high blood pressure.

Because many terms are used interchangeably for migraines that affect the eyes, and some are more serious than others, it can be difficult for people to understand which type of migraines they suffer from. Always consult with an optometrist or ophthalmologist about changes in vision to rule out serious conditions.

Get on the bus

How'd you get on the bus?

The question is akin to one you would ask to test a fellow believer. Two followers of a secret order gingerly probing for equal footing before taking a leap of faith. A visibly benign question to reveal whether the stranger before them is, in fact, enlightened.

How'd you get on the bus? is the dowsing rod used to learn a stranger's moment of understanding. It's as telling as when your significant other asks, 'When did you fall in love with me?' It's loaded with nuance because how detailed the answer reveals how deep you're in.

Rik Bondy is in deep. He travels and performs with the Garcia Project, a renowned band that pays homage to the Jerry Garcia Band. When you drop the question on him, he can pinpoint the moment he fell in love with the Dead, and the moment that followed once he learned about Jerry's band.

Bondy got on the bus in high school. His art teacher encouraged students to bring in their favorite music. He said he brought in Pink Floyd and Led Zeppelin. One day, a girl brought in a bootleg tape of the Grateful Dead.

"I listened to it and I was hooked," he said. He soon followed with his first Dead show at Rochester's Silver Stadium in 1987. From there, he said he joked with a friend, "Imagine if Jerry Garcia sang all the tunes." From which he was educated on the Jerry Garcia Band.

Garcia Project is to perform at Cohoes Music Hall on Friday, Nov. 15. The concert will be part of a documentary on the Grateful Dead tribute scene and the Deadhead community. Filmed by Andy Logan, founder of the Grateful Guitars Foundation, it will look at the musical legacy of the Grateful Dead and the continually growing Deadhead community.

As a fan, Bondy acknowledges that touch of nirvana. He said he would refer to a show as "Jerry's church;" a chance to turn on, tune in and drop out from the world within a family environment. From the music, a community outside of everyday culture was born.

Not every fan prefers to be called a *Deadhead*. It's sometimes perceived as a derogatory term because of how people connect the band with drugs. First, there's no denying that, but the name is said to have come from Garcia's own hand, with a finger hanging serendipitously over a dictionary. Phil Lesh wrote in his autobiography that Garcia found the name in an old Britannica World Language Dictionary with the phrase defined as "the soul of a dead person, or his angel, showing gratitude to someone who, as an act of charity, arranged their burial." And, not someone high on pot.

"There's more to it than just the music," said Rob Koritz, of Dark Star Orchestra, "there's a scene that goes along with it, and I think that attracts a lot of people."

The drug culture can't be denied, and most fans don't. It's an act of futility. It was the 60s. The counterculture movement of the time was breaking away from the rigid conformity of the past. Like the divide between Baby Boomers and Millennials, those Boomers ironically wouldn't trust anyone older than 30. And, just before the 60s rolled into the 70s, it all came to a head over the Vietnam War. Not to say every young man with long hair dropped acid; marijuana and acid were a few means many used to breaking away. The Dead's early history is intertwined with the rise in LSD. Its earliest shows were at a Ken Kesey Acid Test. They were financially supported by Owsley "Bear" Stanley. Stanely was a genius. Not only did he create the Wall of Sound, he practiced chemistry. He was the self-proclaimed "King of Acid." Bear's lasting legacy, however, is the skull and lightning bolt logo he designed in 1969.

Legacy

The Grateful Dead's alchemy of bluegrass, jazz,

country, blues and gospel was groundbreaking and serves as the backbone to today's jam bands. So much so, when the Ominous Seapods started playing gigs in Plattsburgh, the band was commonly described as *that band that sounds like the Grateful Dead*. But, the solos commonly observed in bluegrass and jazz, with each musician in a band provided an opportunity to shine as an individual, is there. So is the noodlin'.

Dark Star Orchestra has toured the country for more than 20 years, replicating Dead shows of the past to today's audiences. Koritz and Dark Star Orchestra will also take part in the upcoming documentary.

"The lyrics are timeless," said Koritz. "When they were performed, even to

this day, they are important words to live by. And, I think people attach themselves to that."

Along every Grateful Dead show would be a small community called Shakedown Street. Named after one of the band's albums, it was where fans camped out and found familiar faces, many of whom friends who chased after the band. Some in search of a "miracle," a ticket to the show. Bondy referred to the community as family. His own miracle came in the form of the Scarlet Fire guitar, a custom built guitar by craftsman, Leo Elliot. He was lent the guitar three years ago, and he still plays while on stage.

Because it was a spiritual experience. We had many spiritual experiences, awakenings and ego-deaths at a Jerry Garcia show. I've learned a lot from that whole scene and the process. We learned a lot from each other."







A birthday bash for 'Albany's' WEQX

Third Eye Blind's Stephan Jenkins played intimate acoustic set

cold rain moved the performance from the Albany Distilling Company's patio to a narrow chamber room. The setting enhanced the intimacy of the event. All 80 tickets were sold for a performance featuring Third Eye Blind's Stephan Jenkins as a celebration for WEQX's 35th anniversary on Thursday,

The station out of Manchester, Vermont has been a bastion for independent radio for 35 years. Brooks Brown first fired a signal off Mount Equinox on Nov. 14, 1984. It played adult contemporary music for ten months before ultimately switching to its present alternative format. Though its studio resides in New England, its adopted home has long been Albany. The radio signal washes over the entire Capital District the Tri-City of Albany, Schenectady, Troy and north to Glens Falls. Its influence upon the local scene is felt at various events, including Pearlpalooza, to which it

There was symbolism in having the

birthday party in Albany's burgeoning Warehouse District. A corner of the city that has witnessed a boom in development over the past several years is converting a neighborhood of zombie properties into sound real estate investments. Such a project casts a shadow upon Albany Distilling Company's Livingston Avenue location. The old juxtaposed with the new; from which Derrick Forget induced a Dawson Leary trip with an opening set generous with covers from the 90s, sprinkled with originals and favorites ranging from Chuck Berry to Led Zeppelin and beyond.

Jenkins took the stage wearing a bright yellow hoodie; a smiley face peered out from his back with the words "HARDCORE HAPPINESS" arched around it. He took in his surroundings and warmly greeted the crowd before him. It was the kind of scene he admitted to daydreaming of while songwriting. He likened the setting to a medieval castle, and that it did. Exposed brick walls stretched skyward towards a high ceiling, giving the room ample space for the halfdozen propane patio torches in the room. One such torch made Jenkins immediately regret his hoodie.

Jenkins treated the crowd with humorous anecdotes between each of the seven songs on his set. He opened with "Who Am I," a track off Third Eye Blind's

latest release, Screamer. Afterwhich, he revealed how he hasn't felt the same since a collision with another surfer prior to the band's European tour earlier this year. "I went right and he went left," he shared the details with deftly places pauses for comedic effect. "We smashed. I won. But, there's this nerve that runs down your leg...'

"Sciatic," the crowd responded with a collective grown.

"That's what they call it," said Jenkins. "Well, he lit it up, and ever since, whenever I sit down, I don't want to sing. I want to scream."

Jenkins treated the crowd with the full lyrical package to "Slow Motion." The track was originally released on Third Eye Blind's 1999 album, Blue. However, it was met with immediate controversy before it hit the shelves.

Miss Jones taught me English But I think I just shot her son Cause he owed me money With a bullet in the chest you cannot run Now he's bleeding in a vacant lot

It was intended to blast Hollywood's obsession with violence, drugs and crime in a year the world witnessed the horrific events of the Columbine shooting that April. In retrospect, the media did a self-assessment of their role in the event. People pointed fingers towards Marilyn

Manson and his anti-social material, while the WB network famously pulled an episode of its popular "Buffy: The Vampire Slayer" as it involved a high school student who planned to shoot his classmates. The song was released as an instrumental with only the chorus left in. The full song would not be released until 2006 with "The Collection." Nonetheless, two decades after it was penned, the words were still jarring.

The night went off script, as Jenkins took the stage without a full setlist in mind. He entertained requests before cutting off the crowd two songs in. "No more hits. No more songs from the first album." He threw in a cover of Bon Iver's "Blood Bank" because he was compelled to share a Christmas song and did not have one of his own. "It's kinda Christmasy."

The highlight of the evening took place mid-set, when Jenkins coaxed the crowd into a singalong to "Shipboard Cook."

So light em up boys here's to your youth Sing loud enough to tell the truth I lost myself and that's where I lost you Ohh oh oh, let go of that whipping post I'm always a ghost

The words cut deep into a crowd mature enough to tether them to a poignant experience; that, or to an episode of Dawson's Creek.


