Felony larceny in Delmar

BETHLEHEM — A

26-year-old Berne woman was arrested in relation to grand larceny incidents that had happened from Oct. 13 to 22 at 311 Fisher Blvd. in Delmar.

Bethlehem police detained Jessica Maria Grove on Tuesday, Nov. 15 near Quail Street in Albany and she was transported to the Bethlehem Police Department to be interviewed about the incident.

After the interview, she was taken into custody and processed on two charges: a grand larceny felony and a criminal possession of controlled substance misdemeanor.

Grove was arraigned before Judge Ryan Donovan and is scheduled to return to the Town of Bethlehem Court on Dec. 3 at 4 p.m.

Man arrested for alleged inappropriate contact

Police commends students, staff and parents for alerting them quickly

BETHLEHEM — A 20-year-old Selkirk man was arrested by Bethlehem police on Monday, Nov. 11 in relation to an incident with four Glenmont Elementary School children last

Matthew S. Wilson was an employee of Schools Out Inc., a non-profit organization that provides before- and after-care for students across the Bethlehem Central School District.

He allegedly had inappropriate contact with four girls, all under the age of 11, at their school during its Schools Out program before regular classes began, according to police reports.

The children immediately told school staff and their parents about the incident who then reported to the police.

After an investigation by Bethlehem police, Wilson was

arrested on four misdemeanor counts of forcible touching and four misdemeanor counts of endangering the welfare of a

He was arraigned before Judge Ryan Donovan at the Town of Bethlehem Court and released under the supervision of probation. He will return to the court on Dec. 3 at 4 p.m.

On Wednesday, Nov. 13, Lorraine R. Silverman, president of the Schools Out Inc. (SOI) Board of Directors, released a letter to parents where she confirmed that Wilson was no longer a SOI employee at the Glenmont Elementary School, effective immediately.

According to her, the incident happened while the kids were enjoying playtime on the playground and SOI has been fully cooperative with police during its investigation.

While she did not detail what exactly happened, she added that SOI "reported the allegation to Child Protective Services and also retained a law firm to pursue an independent and comprehensive review of our internal controls

and processes to ensure our handling of this matter was done appropriately.'

She also wrote that SOI is not aware of any other similar allegation in its 35-year history.

While Bethlehem Police Cmdr. Adam Hornick said that incidents like this are not common around town, he said, "The biggest thing here and the most important thing is that these kids did the right thing and felt comfortable enough to

tell their teachers and parents what took place and exactly what happened. And it went to the police quickly."

"It also speaks volumes of the parents' characters because of their kids' bravery in incidents like this and they're all to be commended for what they did," he continued.

Hornick added that it is highly encouraged for parents to have that "sometimes awkward and difficult but important" conversation with their children to ensure they feel comfortable coming to them if such incidents happen or have already happened.

"As unfortunate as this incident was, it's a reminder for parents to have that open dialogue with their children and make sure their children know who they can feel comfortable going to or can't go to," he said.

Glenmont roundabout on its way

A chosen design and a new construction approach

GLENMONT —

Town staff and Creighton Manning officials presented the chosen roundabout project design at an open house on Thursday, Nov. 14 at the Glenmont Elementary School.

At the open house around a dozen local residents perused several informational tables containing detailed design plans for the upcoming roundabout and sidewalk work, and they asked staff questions about them.

During a formal presentation, Creighton Manning Senior Project Engineer Stephan Godlewski spoke about the project's overview; its progress so far planning-wise; having had discussions with tobe-affected stakeholders like nearby business owners, the trucking industry, local emergency services personnel, and the state Department of Transportation; the approach to the construction itself; and next

with Route 9W — into a roundabout. It aims to lessen traffic congestion and the likelihood of fatal rightangle and head-on crashes, which have been common

The new roundabout would be complemented by short pedestrian crosswalks throughout with rectangular rapid-flashing beacons and 2,800 feet of new sidewalk to connect to Glenmont Elementary School and Vagele Lane.

Two public meetings had already been held in the last two years where the public were able to offer input on three potential designs to improve that intersection: keeping it as an improved stoplight intersection, a single-lane roundabout or a hybrid roundabout. These options were presented in a public workshop on Jan. 17 but

Robert Leslie, the town's Planning Division director, confirmed in June that the hybrid roundabout has since become the chosen design.

The project is overseen by the Planning Division, the state DOT and Creighton Manning, an Albany-based engineering firm. The chosen roundabout design is still subject to final revision though.

The chosen hybrid roundabout design features single-lane exits, doublelane entrances and a center island, the outer shell of which optimally allows bigger vehicles like trucks or emergency vehicles to drive onto if they need more space as they make their way through the roundabout.

Such affected driveways include those that serve Price Chopper, Chili's Glenmont Centre Square, the Bethlehem Preschool, Sunoco and CVS. The roundabout would

Five end-of-year tax planning ideas for individuals

n December 2017, Congress passed the Tax Cuts and Jobs

Act. It represented the largest tax law change in 30 years, affecting both individuals and businesses, as well as the overall economy.

For many tax filers, the most significant change of the new law was the doubling of the standard deduction—\$12,000 for individuals and \$24,000 for married

couples. Approximately 90 percent of individuals took the standard deduction in 2018

However, there are still many facets of the law that impact tax payers and can affect individual tax liability and wealth planning goals. And has always been recommended, individual tax planning and investment management should be a year-long process, with an end-of-year review to identify smart money moves.

The following are five wealth tax planning ideas to consider

Take advantage of losses to offset capital gains

Capital losses can't be carried back, but they can be indefinitely

> Also, consider taking advantage of the lower capital gains rates by pulling investments out of holdings that generate income taxed at ordinary income tax rates (e.g., bonds). Shifting them into municipal bonds or dividendpaying stocks can provide tax-free income, tax savings and ultimately may

result in higher after-tax income.

With more taxpayers taking the standard deduction, many are asking what can be done to maximize your charitable gifts?

You should consider bunching charitable deductions into particular years. Or you can consider making gifts to a donor-advised fund. This will allow you to obtain the deduction now and make actual distributions from the fund at a future date. Also, you can gift low basis assets directly to charity and avoid paying capital gains tax on the appreciation of the asset. Alternatively, you can sell loss assets first and then gift the cash

advantage of the loss to offset other important to consider the future capital gains.

If you haven't already taken your 2019 required minimum distribution (RMD), consider the Charitable IRA Rollover. It allows an individual age 70 ½ or older to make a qualified charitable distribution (QCD) from their IRA directly to a charity and exclude the distribution from gross income (up to \$100,000 per year).

Review your estate plan

The federal estate and gift exemption amount has nearly doubled—to \$11.4 million per person. Those with taxable estates should make use of the increased exemption with the use of lifetime gifts. You can also utilize the annual per-donee exclusion of \$15,000 to save on future estate taxes.

When reviewing your estate plan, consider the possibility that a reference to the exemption amount in an estate planning document that was drafted before the enactment of TJCA could create an undesirable result.

IRA to Roth IRA conversions

If you are trying to convert your traditional IRA to a Roth IRA to fill up a tax bracket, end of year is a good time to initiate these conversations. Traditional IRA to Roth IRA conversions can reduce future required minimum distributions and create a potential tax-free inheritance

potential legislation that could limit what is known as the "stretch IRA," a concept that allows IRA or defined contribution plan beneficiaries to draw down the remaining plan benefits over the beneficiary's life expectancy. The new legislation would cause inherited IRAs and inherited defined contribution plans to be distributed within 10 years of the original owner's death.

Maximize the use of tax-advantaged savings vehicles

Finally, reduce taxable income by increasing pre-tax salary deferrals to employersponsored retirement plans

Also, with IRA planning it is 401(k), 403(b), 457 & SEP-IRA 55, there is an additional \$1,000 plans. If your plan allows aftertax Roth contributions, these should be considered because of the lack of an income-level phase out for contributions and the potential for tax-free growth.

> HSAs can be a great way to help pay for and save for your qualified medical expenses on a tax-advantaged basis. Contributions to HSAs are made pretax, which reduces your taxable income, earnings are free of federal tax and withdrawals are tax free if they are used for qualified medical expenses. The allowable HSA contribution levels for 2019 have increased to \$3,500 for individuals and \$7,000 for families. For individuals over the age of

contribution allowance. Another benefit of HSAs is that if you remain healthy, a well-funded HSA can become an important part of your retirement plan.

Core charitable giving strategies

investors and families most often engage in philanthropy and charity for moral reasons, but philanthropic investments still have a significant role in overall wealth and legacy planning.

3. Understand differences in giving approaches
Before choosing a giving approach, understand the fundamental differences of each and how they may impact your family's finances—both immediately and in the future. For example, certain types of donations can be claimed as tax-deductible expenses, but new deduction limitations introduced in the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 may impact HNW investors' ability to do so. Nearly half of advisors say they see some HNW clients choosing to donate in large lump sums (i.e., "bunching") in light of the tax changes, allowing them to itemize in their giving years to get the deduction and take the standard deduction in other years.

> Examine giving vehicles and strategies As new types of charitable giving vehicles emerge - such as crowdfunding and peer-to-peer giving via social networks - consider which philanthropy strategies support overall family financial goals. Nearly 50 percent of advisors say they see more HNW investors directing one-time gifts to organizations, while 47 percent of advisors say they see more clients establishing donoradvised funds.

5. Measure the impact of donations

Philanthropy doesn't end after a charitable donation has been provided. While measuring impact can be difficult, donating to a local cause within the community is a great way to stay connected with a charitable organization.

2020 town budget adopted


The Town Board voted unanimously to approve a \$45 million town budget for 2020 during its Nov. 13 meeting.

Using a home assessed at \$260,000, town residents would see an increase of \$24.68 in their average property tax bill — it was \$994.24 in 2019 and now \$1,018.92 for 2020. From that

\$1,018.92 figure, \$449.75 goes to the Highway Fund, \$235.92 to the General Fund, \$157.72 to the Water Fund, \$85.93 to the Sewer Fund, \$79.26 to the county EMS and \$10.34 to Delmar-Bethlehem EMS.

The tax rate will increase by 2.5 percent, the tax cap will be at 2 percent and the tax levy will be up by \$532,089.

The \$45 million amount is roughly a 4.6 percent, or \$2 million, increase from 2019's \$43.1 million budget. When distributed across the town's departments,



\$8.6 million would go to police, \$900,000 to parks and recreation, \$800,000 between parks and highway departments, \$8.5 million to highway, \$14 million to public works and \$7.5 million to all other departments. In addition, \$1.4 million goes to ambulance/EMS and \$3.3 million goes to debt service.

The town's budget has increased from last year's due to several reasons, including the Clapper Road Water Treatment Plant's debt and how the money that goes to county EMS will increase by 13.9 percent, from \$1.1 million in

2019 to \$1.2 million in 2020. The latter point is connected to how county EMS was announced this past September that it was moving to full-time staff.

Town Comptroller Michael Cohen originally introduced the town's tentative \$45 million budget for 2020 at the Sept. 25 Town Board meeting. "There are no changes from the preliminary budget with this adopted

budget," he said.

After the budget was adopted by the Town Board, town supervisor David VanLuven said, "Thank you, Michael and all the department heads and staff for all your hard work in putting this budget together."

GOP Chair steps down

BETHLEHEM —

Melissa Kermani announced on Tuesday, Nov. 12 that she was stepping down as the town's Republican Party Committee Chair, according to Keith Wiggand, the former vice-chair who will take over her role.

Wiggand, the Vice-Chair for the last two years, said Kermani sent out an email announcing her intention to step down to the committee and the change was effective immediately.

Spotlight News reached out to Kermani for comment but did not receive any in time of this publication.

The announcement came one week after Election Day, where Republican Jim Carriero lost to Democrats Dan Coffey and Joyce Becker in the Town Board race. The highway superintendent race remains tight though between Democrat Marc Dorsey and Independent/Republican-endorsed John

Anastasi; the Albany County Board of Elections will count more than 280 absentee ballots on Thursday, Nov. 21 at 9 a.m. which will finalize the vote count.

While Kermani had been chair for six years, Wiggand said that he had been chair previously from 1999 to 2003 so his role now is not new to him. "I'm looking forward to it and I will look to make changes in the committee if needed and the biggest issue we have going on is to just reorganize and make the committee stronger and tighter, and looking forward, not backward," he said. "The number one thing is having the team concept where you have to run as a team. If you don't, you've got several people running individual campaigns which I think was the issue this year."

He also said that Kermani "still remains as a Bethlehem Republican Committee member who's very valued."

Another possible six months ahead

Discussion on moratorium may continue into 2020

BETHLEHEM —

The Town Board is considering an extension of the six-month moratorium on permitting new vape stores by another six months.

They unanimously voted during its Nov. 13 meeting to set a public hearing at its Nov. 26 meeting at 6 p.m. so that the public can offer input on the potential of prolonging the moratorium. The moratorium in question is on "the submission and processing of applications for building permits, certificates of occupancy, and land use approvals for vape shops, smoke shops and the sale of marijuana or marijuana products, or the dispensing



or distribution of medical marijuana," according to town documents.

The original six-month moratorium had been in place after the Town Board voted 4-1, with member Jim Foster the only one against it, on June 26.

Leslie Lombardo, a senior planner in the town's Planning Division's, appeared before the board to say town staff has been researching options for regulating vaping products and e-cigarettes so far. "Our research shows that vaping products are tobacco products, according to the New York State Department of Health," she said. "As a result of that connection, vape and tobacco products cannot be regulated separately and standalone vape shops

cannot be separated from tobacco retailers, which would include gas stations, convenience stores, grocery stores in towns that do not have pharmacies and other standalone stores like a beverage center."

Lombardo also said that town staff have researched marijuana product sales and "found that they would be a natural progression for businesses selling tobacco products."

Since vape and tobacco products have to be considered together and not as separate issues, she added, "staff is recommending a combination of zoning law amendments as well as a licensing system at the town level to regulate use and product sales. The purpose would be to reduce exposure, particularly of children and teenagers, to the number of retailers selling tobacco and vape products. All the research

that we've done so far needs to be considered by the Town Board for policy decisions."

The Planning
Department also has to
receive guidance from the
Town Board first regarding
drafting regulations; the
latter board can then
get options for potential
zoning law changes and the
former board will provide
a recommendation on such
changes too.

Lombardo explained that this process takes time as well as how the town's Building Department needs to learn how to set up and handle the aforementioned licensing system, hence the request for an additional six months to this moratorium.

The original six-month moratorium had been created because the town had received two building permit applications for proposed stores earlier this year that would sell products like vaping

devices and medical marijuana.

One application was to be located on 243 Delaware Ave. close to Elsmere Elementary School and the other on 365 Feura Bush Road which was 1,800 feet from Glenmont Elementary School. This raised questions about whether such a store should be located near a school and young children.

Bethlehem has one existing vaping shop so far which is Interstate Vapor, located on 340 Delaware Ave. which opened in 2015 and is not affected by this moratorium.

The aforementioned Glenmont business application would not also be affected as it already got its certificate of occupancy from the town's Building Department in mid-June.

Foster asked whether there has been an outreach effort so far to existing vape and tobacco retailers in town to let them know about this ongoing issue but Lombardo said no as town staff have been only in its research stage since June.

"Regardless of how the board decides to proceed, I think that's something that would be valuable for town staff and the board too to make that outreach to local business owners," Foster said.

While Town Board member Dan Coffey confirmed that the board was not voting yet on whether to extend the moratorium on Nov. 13, he wondered whether the requested sixmonth period is enough time to get

the desired work done or even if there is a possibility for yet another request in summer 2020 for six more months.

"I feel like we're ready for the next step, once we have the direction of actually drafting, so I do think six months will hopefully be enough time," Lombardo said. "We do have to go to the Planning Board and so there's meeting dates and we also have to make a referral to the Albany County Planning Board. So, there's a lot of procedural steps but I feel confident that we have done the research and have the knowledge now to take the next step forward."

Town Board member Maureen Cunningham said, "I'm so glad you all have done this research and I'm especially interested in what other communities around the country or state are doing. I think we, as a town, are taking a common-sense approach which I believe in, especially when it's based on research and facts."

While she added that she supports an extension to the moratorium, she recalled how a community in Buffalo had contacted her when the original moratorium was just created as it was undergoing a similar issue with regulating vape and medical marijuana stores too.

Robert Leslie, the town's Planning Division director, said his department expects to present to the Town Board about zoning and setting up the licensing system soon, and the Town Board should make a decision on extending the moratorium or not in December or January at the latest.

New shed for clothing donations

Dive Pool

The Dive Pool originally opened in 1973 but no major structural work or improvements were done since then. When the town began looking into it earlier this spring, its concrete walls and water infiltration were found to be deteriorated. It was then decided that construction be halted during the summer so as to not negatively affect patrons' experience when coming to the Elm Avenue Pool Complex.

Over the summer, 1,230 residents participated in a free online 10-question survey where they answered questions about how often they visit the pool complex, how many family members accompany them, if they take part in aquatic or diving programs there, their perspective on the complex's fees and to rate their overall user experience there. The survey also included questions like what amenity type they would like if the Dive Pool had to be replaced if it's too expensive to do so, whether the Dive Pool should be repaired no matter the cost, and if the pool complex is still attractive without a Dive Pool at all.

Town Board member Jim Foster said he appreciated the use of a public survey as public input has helped guide decision-making for this project moving forward. "Even as we arrive at some unexpected issues and contingencies, I would stress the value of that public survey perhaps in regards to other additional projects the town might be considering in the future,"

Gallo had said that this survey was done in order to gauge public input and consider them as construction on the Dive Pool later resumed in early September. Gallo said that around that time, "unfortunately, we have now discovered that the Dive Pool must be completely rebuilt" as opposed to the original plan to simply improve it.

Two options ahead

Gallo said the town now has to consider one of two options: replacing the current one with an all-new Dive Pool or building a new double-slide pool.

The first option, projected to cost \$900,000, would be a 40-by-40 replacement Dive Pool that is 12 feet deep. Other expected works include installing proper drainage, new under- and main drains, new dive towers and a new concrete deck. He explained its high cost is due to a number of factors: prevailing wages have to be paid, the replacement concrete deck needs many materials and much skilled labor, and in order for it to hopefully be open by summer 2020, it would have to be constructed during this winter season. This means that more work is needed to protect and heat the site during the winter.

Regarding the aforementioned survey, Gallo presented that 826 residents, or 68 percent of the 1,230 people who took it, said they believe the Dive Pool should be repaired regardless of the cost and 876 people, or 72 percent, said they would still visit the pool complex if the Dive Pool was no longer part of it. Also, 745 people, or 62 percent, said they would prefer a slide pool if the town decides not to rebuild the Dive Pool.

This leads to the second option: a double-slide pool which would be 15 feet tall, 5 feet higher than the original 10-feet high diving board of the Dive Pool. Projected to cost \$780,000, the 25-by-25 pool itself would be 4 feet deep and it is believed to have a "wow factor" due to its new bold look and can attract more users, especially children and young teenagers.

Regardless of which option the town decides to move forward with, Gallo pointed out that constructing a new pool through this winter is imperative to increase the chances of having it done by summer 2020. Gallo added, though, that it is not a 100 percent guarantee that if winter construction is approved that the new pool would be open by summer 2020 as it depends on the weather and its effect on the workload.

Funding

If the pool, regardless of which pool type the town chooses, is hypothetically finished by and open in summer 2020, the Dive Pool would cost \$900,000 while the double-slide pool would cost \$780,000 — this requires winter construction. If the pool does not get constructed through the winter and it would not open in summer 2020, the Dive Pool would cost \$828,000 and the double-slide pool would be \$717,600.

He added that the project can be funded by a mix of the Park Land Set Aside Fund and any surplus from the 2019 town budget.

Discussion

There was general agreement among the Town Board members that the new pool, whichever option it may be, should be finished and open in summer 2020. They referred back to how many residents, as mentioned above, said in the survey they want the Dive Pool to be repaired regardless of the cost, support a new slide pool if the Dive Pool can't be rebuilt, and that they still would visit the pool complex if the Dive Pool will not exist anymore.

The Town Board members also generally agreed that due to concerns and complaints from residents about the Dive Pool being closed this past summer, they do not want that to happen again in summer 2020.

Opinions began to diverge though when they wondered which option they should go with, although VanLuven noted that they were not actually voting on an option yet but rather in the near immediate future — such a quick decision-making is ideal so that winter construction can begin

VanLuven, Joyce Becker, Dan Coffey and Maureen Cunningham said they would prefer moving forward with the doubleslide while Foster preferred a replacement Dive Pool.

Foster said having a replacement Dive Pool would have a nostalgic effect as residents can remember the original one.

"Having grown up in the area, it was always



A nickel for a paper bag soon

New state act goes into effect in early 2020

ALBANY — By March 2020, New York state retailers who hand out plastic bags will get fined. And in Albany County, a paper bag will cost you a nickel as per the "Reusable Shopping Bag Incentive Act" approved by the Legislature by a vote of 22-14 on Tuesday, Nov. 12.

Albany County is one of many municipalities across the state that opted to force retailers to charge a nickel per paper bag at the register. According to state law, 40 percent, or 2 cents, will go to Albany County to purchase reusable bags for lower income people and for programs to educate and promote the benefits of reusable bags. Sixty percent, or 3 cents, will go to the state's Environmental Protection Fund.

The fee does not apply to any customer using the supplemental nutrition assistance program or special nutrition program for women, infants and children

Joanne Cunningham, D-Bethlehem, a sponsor of the bill, said the fee is not a tax, though because taxes are not optional and people can get out of paying the nickel by bringing their own bags.

"There is data that supports instituting a bag fee in retail establishments is a powerful disincentive. What we are trying to do is create a disincentive to just move to a paper bag and instead create an incentivize people to use reusable bags," she said. "This is important stuff. Our planet is dying, we all know that. Instituting a plastic bag ban is an important first step but it doesn't go far enough.

"The bottom line is that we are trying to change behavior. All of the things we are trying to do to rescue our planet is not going to be simple. It's going to involve a little bit of work."

the retailer.

Legislator Mark Grimm, R-Guilderland, said he is not in favor of 60 percent of the "tax" being kicked up to the state.

"I have a big problem with the distribution of the tax. The state of New York is a \$175 billion budget and yet they still think they have to tap into county taxpayers and take money from here and send it to Albany," he said. "And all the mandates they impose on the county is driving up county costs so there is

not a fair relationship with the state and if we pass this we are cultivating the state treating us unfairly."

Paul Burgdorf, R-Colonie, also called it a tax, just one the state didn't want to charge.

"The state of New York is very shrewd, 60 percent of this nickel is going to be remitted to the state of New York. That is a tax. It is a tax the state of New York did not want to levy, they wanted us to levy," he said. "I believe it is a tax, and I think it is also a mandate

on business because the business now has to buy the paper bags and sell them to people with the money being recycled to government."

Todd Drake, R-Colonie, said it should be left to the retailers to decide if they want to charge a nickel or not.

"I don't want to carry the water for New York state and collect the tax for them, and I don't want to cause a business to spend money to implement a system to collect a tax for the state,"

he said

According to the governor's office, New Yorkers use an estimated 23 billion plastic bags a year, and nationwide studies show that about 50 percent of single-use plastic bags end up as litter. In addition to preventing plastic bag litter in the environment, the ban's aim is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with plastic bag production and disposal, from the petroleum used to produce the bags to emissions from the transportation of bags to

"You see plastic bags hanging in trees, blowing down the streets, in landfills and in our waterways, and there is no doubt they are doing tremendous damage," Gov. Andrew Cuomo said in a statement when he signed the bill banning plastic bags on Earth Day earlier this year.

On March 1, 2020, New York will join Hawaii and California in banning the use of single-use plastic bags.

"The Legislature agrees there is a health crisis regarding youth who use vaping products and something needs to be done to address that issue," said Chairman of the Legislature Andrew Joyce. "However, members of the Legislature felt that there were too many provisions in Local Law E that were prohibitive and unclear. Albany County does have laws already in place to reduce the exposure of youth to tobacco and vaping products. Perhaps the answer to the current crisis is to simply strengthen the laws we currently have and ensure they are being enforced."

There was one abstention, and three legislators were absent from the 39-member body.

"I am disappointed that

this didn't pass. Hopefully this will be reintroduced in the new year," said Legislator Paul Miller, D-Albany, a sponsor of the

The vote was months in the works and dozens of people again crowded the Legislative chambers to speak for and against the ban. Themes of those against the ban included people who used vaping to quit smoking and shop owners who say the ban would put them out of

business.

"I've been a smoker for 10 years and I recently quit smoking thanks to flavored vaping and I oppose Local Law E," said one man.

"I own three vape shops in Albany County and I also have three kids so I know what you people are saying. But my kids know what they should and should not do," said shop owner David Lee. "If nothing else, think about the tax revenue Albany County will lose because

people will just go to other counties."

Lawmakers, though, have also been targeting flavored e-liquid because of a sharp increase of underage people vaping and getting hooked on nicotine. According to the American Heart Association, in the past four years, there has been an increase of 160 percent in high schoolers who have used e-cigarettes.

Joanne Cunningham, D-Bethlehem, said there is "irrefutable evidence"

that when the federal government banned flavored tobacco products in 2009, the number of youth smoking dropped.

But data generated by the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services found that smoking among high school seniors has steadily dropped since 1998, about the same time governments across the board upped education and advertising about the dangers of smoking.

"My heart goes out to the vapors and I understand they view vaping as a way to quit smoking but to me the most important issue is we are repeating the same mistakes young people were subject to when big tobacco came in and started marketing tobacco flavors," she said. "I'm so tired of the crocodile tears of the Juul and vaping industry. They have flavor after flavor after flavor that are all enticing young people to vape. That is a despicable marketing model. Walk into any high school today and you will see kids vaping. High school kids, middle school kids. Fruity Peebles are not enticing adults to vape, they are enticing a child.

Gil Ethier, D-Cohoes,

said the ban won't accomplish anything but force businesses to close and push people to neighboring counties.

"It doesn't help children. They can't go into these stores now if they are under 21," he said. "I think the county will do better if we try to beat this with education than a ban. I think parents should take a stronger reasonability for these things. We should not be mandating choices for people. And I think if we are going to go to government to accomplish this, it should be up to the state and not just penalize people in Albany County."

According to the legislation, "during the past year, current e-cigarette use has increased 78 percent among high school students" and "more than 3.6 million U.S. youth, including one in five high school students and one in 20 middle school students currently use e-cigarettes."

"We are extremely disappointed that the Albany County Legislature chose to listen and follow Big Tobacco instead of the public health community,

Paper bags

implementation of the fee program and enforce the new law, which will apply to any retailer required to collect sales tax on the merchandise it sells.

Some bags are exempt under the law, so plastic bags may still be distributed to consumers in a certain circumstances such as a bag used by a pharmacy to carry prescription drugs, a grocery store to carry uncooked meet and fish and produce bags for bulk items such as

fruits and vegetables, according to the state Department of Environmental Conservation.

In addition to state Environmental Conservation Law penalties, retailers in Albany County will receive a written warning for a first violation of the law. The second violation will earn a \$100 fine, the third violation equals a \$250 fine and a fourth violation will cost the retailer \$500. For each subsequent violation, the fine will be \$100 a day until compliance is

Stores are prohibited from passing along any fines to employees, according to the Albany County law.

Stores are not required to offer paper bags, which are more expensive, bulkier and not as easy to handle as plastic bags. The storage of paper bags is more of an issue than plastic too because of their size and the fact they attract vermin. Since the retailer does not get any of the nickel fee, many stores may simply not offer any type of bag. Retailers could also opt to only sell reusable bags at checkout.

A reusable bag, according to the DEC is any bag "made of cloth or other machine washable fabric that has handles or a durable bag with handles that is

specifically designed and manufactured for multiple reuse."

A "durable bag" has a minimum of 125 uses, with each use the "equivalent to carrying a minimum of 22 pounds over a distance of 175 feet, according to the DEC. It must have a capacity of at least 15 liters and a minimum fabric weight of 80 Grams per Square Meter, which is a measurement of polypropylene density. The higher the GSM the more durable the bag. A reusable bag cannot be made of "film plastic, bioplastic, biodegradable materials, compostable plastic, plant-based materials or decomposable materials," according to the DEC.

on traffic." An example of needed daytime work is pouring concrete for the new sidewalks which is difficult to achieve at night.

During construction, residents can still access the businesses though and expect minimal impact on traffic during the day. Pedestrian routes and access will also be maintained, which Godlewski said is required, and there will be limited nighttime detours.

"The town's goal is to minimize the short-term disruption to businesses during construction and how are we going to do that? They're going to hire a professional communication specialist," he said. This will help the town craft a communication plan for the project to communicate with the businesses, residents and construction workers, an outline of which could be replicated for similar future town projects.

It would also suggest how and when businesses should further communicate with their customers and staff regarding the construction timeframe and approach.

Looking ahead, a construction contract is expected to be awarded in winter 2020 with another public pre-construction meeting set sometime in the spring. Construction is scheduled also begin this spring and the roundabout is planned to open in the fall, with additional landscaping and final works set for spring 2021.

a mainstay and the big social event for kids, especially as they enter the teenage years and they congregate around there," he said. "That unique feature is something I wouldn't like to see lost and I think that was demonstrated in the survey's data results. So, I would be inclined to go with the winter construction and a replacement Dive Pool option."

VanLuven initially agreed with Foster, "The Dive Pool would have a much deeper resonance and a great nostalgic factor for adults, whether you remember jumping off as a child or remember watching your child build up the strength to overcome their fear of jumping off the high dive themselves."

However, he added, "But I think the kids would much prefer, if you put the two [options] side-by-side, the slide pool. So, the question is, 'Are we building this for the adults who are paying for it or are we building it for the kids who are going to primarily be the ones using it?' We'll have a great facility either way ... but I've been thinking about who the core target audience is."

Cunningham expressed concern over whether the double-slide pool is safe for young children and Gallo said that while the Dive Pool always required one lifeguard, the double-slide pool would need at least two lifeguards — one by the pool itself and one to guide a user as they physically get into the slide and launch off. Gallo noted that the Dive

Pool is not 100 percent safe though as there have been kids who have slipped off while climbing the ladders.

VanLuven said, "If we want construction to start this winter, we have to get the RFP [request for proposal] like next week and that's to give construction companies the time to get us their bids. In the beginning of December, for engineers to look at the options and make recommendations and for the town board to approve it in the beginning of January."

Looking ahead, the Town Board will have to select which pool option and permit winter construction or not as part of the project's RFP in order for it to be put out for bid. The Town Board expects to award a contract in early January.

Not enough votes

teachers, and youth themselves," said Caitlin O'Brien, the American Heart Association's government relations director for New York state.

"With the defeat of this bill, our legislators have subjected our kids to continued nicotine addiction and myriad chronic health issues that follow."

The vote came about two months after an executive order by Gov. Andrew Cuomo banned the sale of flavored e-liquid across the state.

That order was challenged by the

vaping industry and is currently on hold as per a court order.

One impetus behind the executive order was a recent spate of sickness and death initially attributed to vaping e-liquid.

It was later determined the respiratory issues were because of Vitamin E Acetate, a type of oil used in cosmetics, which was added to illegal THC vaping cartridges and is not found in legally sold e-liquid products.

In Albany County, flavored vape products and e-cigarettes, like traditional tobacco products, are already restricted to those more than 21 years old, and shops who sell flavored e-liquid and e-cigarettes cannot allow anyone under 21 through the door.

In other words, a convenient store cannot sell any flavored e-liquid and allow anyone under 21 in the shop. It essentially restricts the sale of flavored e-liquid and e-cigarettes to specialty vape shops and is another layer of regulation to prevent youth from using e-cigarettes and other vaping products.

Local Law E would also have banned the sale of menthol cigarettes, a popular choice among minorities who smoke and which raised the ire of convenience store owners, who have waged an advertising campaign against the measure.







"Our Moms are dedicated to helping the many veterans in our area who find themselves in need for shelter, food, blankets and just knowing we are here for them," said Donna Vickery, president of Blue Star Mothers of America, NY2. "Our servicemen and women, and our veterans are our heroes."

Blue Star Mothers have sons and daughters who currently serve in the military, or have children who are veterans

Each year, Gary Weinlein organizes a concert that benefits servicemen and women. His Groovin' series of concerts showcases local performers who embody iconic musicians of recent past. Jim Morrison, Janis Joplin, Joe Cocker are just a few stars who slip through the passage of time to return back in front of a live audience. The music is as authentic as their visage, drawing audiences back each year. Patrons are awarded with a different show each time. And, proceeds always go to a special cause.

This year, "Groovin'... Rock Legends of the Vietnam War" will perform a veterans benefit show at The Egg on Friday, Nov. 22. Proceeds will benefit the Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. and its Moms on a Mission program.

When Weinlein speaks of Groovin', he speaks of the music as serving a lifeline, as well. The youngest of four brothers, the Albany native saw his brothers go off to Vietnam before his number was called in the lottery. The war ended before he was to report.

"It was a tough time," said Weinlein. "I hate to say it; it's 50 years later, and it's almost like it is today. Who the hell do you believe?"

The music of the time was a sounding board for a



generation. Neil Young's "Ohio" mirrored the anger of the homefront, as Jefferson Airplane's "White Rabbit" helped listeners to escape down the hole. In between the time that separated a thoughtful care package from home, soldiers clung to songs from home.

"Music was a savior, especially over there," said Weinlein. "That's all they had. There was no social media. They listened to music, and they waited for mail... they waited for the next battle. Without music in 'nam, I don't think they had very much happiness."

Weinlein's current line-up of Groovin' performers focuses on those from the Vietnam War era. Morrison, Joplin, Cocker and Young will be joined by performances of John Fogerty, Mick Jagger, Eric Burdon, Grace Slick and Robert Plant.

"Our show represents a true meaning of classic rock music of that era never dying," said Weinlein.





Falling out of step

It's okay if walkers miss their 10,000-steps

ver the last several years, many people have embraced the notion that 10,000 daily steps are the way to being physically fit. Health experts espouse that notion and trainers endorse it, but is there scientific proof behind the recommendation?

The 10,000-step standard — which equates to roughly five miles, depending on a person's stride length and speed — has some surprising origins that are not necessarily rooted in medical science. I-Min Lee, a professor of epidemiology at the Harvard University T. H. Chan School of Public Health and the lead author of a new study published in May 2019 in The Journal of the American Medical Association wanted to explore the origins of the 10,000-step recommendation. She discovered the guideline evolved from a marketing strategy devised by a Japanese company called Yamasa Toki. That firm introduced its new step-counter in 1965, naming it Manpo-Kei, which translated into "10,000 steps meter." They marketed the meter using the Japanese character for "10,000," which resembles a man walking. The character and round number proved memorable and the slogan, "Let's walk 10,000 steps a day" was catchy. As a result, many people adopted the 10,000-step approach, even though its medical benefits might not have been

But this isn't to suggest that taking 10,000 steps per day cannot be part of a healthy living plan. In fact, such a goal promotes physical activity, which is a key component of a healthy lifestyle. However, simply taking 10,000 steps



per day might not be enough to achieve long-term health.

Lee conducted her own research to test if the Japanese were on to something by inadvertently setting the 10,000-step standard. She found that an increase in walking correlated to lower mortality rates among more than 16,000 elderly American women. However, when these women reached about 7,500 steps the mortality rates leveled out, suggesting that those extra 2,500 steps might not be necessary.

Even the manufacturer of one of the most popular fitness trackers, Fitbit, says that users' step goals can vary depending on need, and that goals may even shift over time. People who are looking to lose weight and maintain their existing health will need to modify their step count accordingly. Working with a qualified trainer or using a medically sanctioned training program can help people exercise safely and effectively.

Taking 10,000 steps per day may help people achieve their health-related goals. But 10,000 steps alone likely won't be enough to achieve optimal health.

Master mashed potatoes

ashed potatoes are the perfect side dish, capable of being paired with meats, poultry and fish. Few meals wouldn't benefit from the addition of creamy mashed potatoes.

Some food historians say that the original recipe for mashed potatoes originated in 1771, when a Frenchman named Antoine Parmentier hosted a competition on ways to prepare potatoes. Others say that mashed potatoes surely were born in Great Britain in the 1600s, as potatoes were a staple of the English diet at that time. Regardless of the origin of mashed potatoes, a solid understanding of how to perfect this beloved side dish is a great way to impress family members and guests. This recipe for "Easiest, Creamiest Mashed Potatoes" from "Simple Soirées: Seasonal Menus for Sensational Dinner Parties" (Stewart, Tabori & Chang) by Peggy Knickerbocker is one every mashed potato lover will fall in love with.

Easiest, Creamiest Mashed Potatoes

Ingredients: Makes 6 servings

- 6 medium-sized russet potatoes, peeled and quartered
- 3 to 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 cup whole milk or cream (or half-and-half)
 Salt and freshly ground white pepper

Instructions

Place the potatoes in a large pot and cover with salted cold water. Bring to a boil. Reduce the heat to medium-



high, and cook for 15 to 20 minutes, until the potatoes are tender when pierced with a fork. Drain.

Meanwhile in a small pot, warm the butter and milk over medium-low heat.

Place the potatoes in a large bowl and mash them with a potato masher, adding a little of the warm milk-and-butter mixture as you go. Continue to mash until the lumps are gone. Add just enough of the milk mixture to get a creamy consistency. Then whip the potatoes with a fork and season with salt and pepper to taste.

You can make the potatoes a little ahead of time and keep them warm in a low oven, well covered, until ready to serve.

Proctors audience not cold on 'Frozen'

Crowd shows love for touring production in shadow of sequel's animated release this week

SCHENECTADY— Let it go? Disney says no.

A national tour of the hit Disney musical, "Frozen," has started in Schenectady, with performances scheduled from Nov. 10 to 24 at Schenectady's Proctors. The musical was a prime example of how when Disney fully trusts one of its own products, it unashamedly can erect a billion-dollar media franchise with two feature films, theme park attractions, children's books, Halloween costumes and more. "Frozen 2" is also expected to make a box office avalanche once it reaches theaters on Friday, Nov. 22 which surely would make children sing with glee and parents groan in defeat.

The musical originated as a pre-Broadway tryout in Denver, Colorado in late 2017 but grew to become a Broadway musical, starting in February 2018. It was nominated for Best Musical, Best Book of a Musical and Best Original Score (Music and/or Lyrics) Written for the Theatre at

the 2018 Tony Awards

The audience has been mesmerized by the sheer production value and soaring vocals that they have witnessed since the musical began its run at Proctors. Following the film's storyline closely, it explores the relationship between Anna, the exuberant and romantically-naive younger sister, and Elsa, the elder who wrestles with her abilities to conjure ice and wintry weather. Their dynamic mirrored that of the film because despite Elsa being distant from Anna and accidentally sending the kingdom of Arendelle into an eternal winter, their sisterly bond and love for each other never ceased to warm up the stage.

The two sisters coincidentally are played by two women who share a first name.

While attending the Nov. 15 show, Caroline Bowman proved she was a vocal powerhouse as Elsa; whenever she belted out familiar lyrics from the film and even original songs exclusive to the musical, the theater erupted into thunderous applause. Another highlight was Bowman's facial expressions throughout the musical — from dramatic raised eyebrows whenever a character got physically too close to her character when she was still struggling with her powers, to that of genuine concern when she believes Anna has either been injured or killed.

Anna was played by Caroline Innerbichler who consistently provided comic relief as she never lost her bombastic and animated personality. Innerbichler proved to be a triple threat since besides her impeccable voice and acting, her flexible body yielded impressive choreography onstage.

Arwen Monzon-Sanders and Jaiden Klein played young Anna and Elsa respectively and as they opened up the musical, they helped set an optimistic and classic Disney feel for the rest of the night too. Monzon-Sanders, in particular, portrayed Anna as a little firework of a girl who kept on literally jumping on beds, pleading with her sister to build a snowman and running around the stage.

While there were several original songs and characters in the musical, the performance's highlights were during familiar moments from the film. "Let It Go," the iconic number sung by Tony Award-winning Broadway veteran Idina Menzel in the film, was the song that closed the first act. As Bowman created an ice palace amid liberation-themed lyrics, gigantic sets of faux ice as well as breathtaking background visuals of a flurry winter gathered to offer a cathartic performance, along with a dramatic wardrobe makeover. Elsa's regal outfit transformed into her famous bright blue

ensemble and the stage instantly went black as the song ended, sending the audience into an applauding frenzy.

The musical was adorned with a great supporting cast: Mason Reeves as Kristoff who fluidly executed the choreography; his lovable reindeer, Sven (portrayed by Evan Strand as a more-than-life-sized puppet costume); and Olaf the snowman played by F. Michael Haynie who provided numerous sight gags and impressive vocals.

The production value was so vast that when Elsa accidentally set off her icy powers in the castle for the first time (in forever?), the sudden surge of ice onto the stage sent some children gasping in shock, which showed how big the musical's stakes are, while being a Disney property.

With falling snow, alluring princes and princesses, mountainous vocals, artful choreography, messages of being independent women and self-empowerment, an overall bright blue color scheme, and Sven and Olaf running across stage, the "Frozen" musical seems like a perfect family-friendly package for audiences who are nostalgic for the classic Disney musicals, bordering-on-cheesy romance and all-too-familiar lyrics.

Swan Lake amazes

Russian Ballet Theatre exhibits the extraordinary at The Palace

ALBANY — An enduring memory from my first viewing of Swan Lake is not of Odette, the Black Swan or Rothbart. It's of the series of barrel turns executed by the Jester. It was a decade ago, and I failed to record his name, but in memory I've named him "Baryshnikov." He proceeded to leap the length of the stage, spinning around with his leg extended as if in an attempt to kick something suspended above him, only to finish with what appeared to be a triple saut de basque. I was struck by this exhibition of strength and endurance.

The Jester is a polarizing subject for those who appreciate Swan Lake. The character is more common in the St. Petersburg version of the ballet. He serves as comic relief, if performed properly. The bulk of his work is observed to the side and detracts one's attention from the dancers on center stage. Nonetheless, it was his performance I looked forward to when attending the Russian Ballet Theatre's "Swan Lake" at the Palace Theatre on Tuesday, Nov. 12.

This year's production, choreographed by Nadezhda Kalinina, included exquisitely hand-painted sets and handsewn costumes created by designer Sergei Novikov. From the first scene, the set gave the incredible illusion of Rothbart and the swans dancing from within a medieval tapestry. Rothbart's corvine appearance was striking, especially when paired with the makeup work of Award-winning artist

Irina Strukova from "Crazy Rich Asians." However, Novikov's remarkable work was best displayed in the ballroom scene in Act Two. The iron throne ornamented by a stained glass window set behind it, and the costumes adorned by the players, exhibited painstaking detail.

The ballet, however, is measured by the performance of three characteristic dances; the Jester, the Dance of the Cygnets, and the Black Swan's 32 fouettés. Olga Kifyak portrayed the dual roles of Odette and Odile, the Black Swan. This demanding role defines the career of the dancer who tackles it. Kifyak was graceful as the pure-of-heart Odette, and seductive as Odile. The subtle exchange with Rothbart as her Black Swan seduced Prince Siegfried helped complete the art of the storyline. She followed with a strong execution of those 32 fouettés, never wavering from her position.

Mikhail Ovcharov is a physical specimen. His thighs alone look larger than that of a professional football player. A stark contrast to the spindled legs of the male members of the corps, whose sloppy footwork was the only negative mark to this show. His Jester provided wonderful comic relief in a role not muted to satisfy its detractors. His work, too, was highlighted by those magnificent barrel turns.

This production of "Swan Lake" was not accompanied by an orchestra, but instead by a recording of Tchaikovsky's composition. The recording was played at a noticeably low volume. We could still hear each footfall of the cygnets despite that we were seated several rows away from the stage. This apparent oversight served as a blessing as it drew more attention to the female members of the corps de ballet, specifically during the Dance of the Cygnets. I've watched several performances and nothing compared to that of this particular quartet. Each movement was precise and in unison. Each footfall sounded as one, and I found myself thankful that I could hear it.





Acidhead's 'Distractions'

Track list of band's debut album is cohesive, not distracted at all



istractions," the debut album from the Brooklyn-based band Acidhead is a moving opening statement. It's an honest delivery of feelings and emotions that are often the very essence of being distracted.

The brainchild of multi instrumentalist Patrick McGee, Acidhead doesn't say outright that it's about a breakup but the cues from Kanye West's 808's & Heartbreak combined with song titles like the opening narration "Everything Got So Distant" and the album's single "Throw Away The Time" are obvious hints.

Throughout the album, distorted auto-tuned vocals and 808 beats put McGee's influence on full display. The second single, "Love Has Me Keep On Dying," is chock full of the aforementioned effects while the lyrical content drives the emotion forward – "Everyone's lonely, hearing her voice late in the morning."

While each track has strength in their own right, showcasing instrumental fluency and pulling from a variety of styles, the entire track list is cohesive and, ironically, not distracted at all. Each song sits just where it should and even as they are different in their composition, they feel like they all belong together on this album. 



Novak and Wayne's 'Rise'

Jess Novak and Ben Wayne serve up 'hauntingly beautiful' yet 'painful' songs on collab EP

ess Novak and Ben Wayne make up an alternative indie-folk rock-duo who fused together each other's individual works while recording in Nashville, Tennessee. The end result is a four-track EP titled "Rise," which dropped earlier this month.

The EP builds on both their individual strengths from Wayne's Southern California rock and reggae roots, and Novak's distinct violin, songwriting and vocal skills, which are well recognized with her winning Best Female Vocalist by the Syracuse New Times in 2018.

The EP opens with the song, "After All" which has a distinctly doo-wop rhythm to it. In conjunction with Novak's vocals it differs from every other song coming up on your favorite streaming service. It's a refreshingly unique combination of doo-wop and alt-rock that we don't hear nearly enough. With the rhythm section being layered with lead guitar, carrying an almost country feel, the song is hard to categorize into one singular genre. A trend of "Rise" in general. It's not one singular sound. It's not one singular genre. It is a little bit of its own thing which is one reason it's so enjoyable and a well rounded.

The second track "Carousel" is a known Ben Wayne song. While Jess Novak writes and takes the lead vocals on the other three tracks, Wayne leads on this hauntingly beautiful and painful song. It starts with a little walking bass line on the acoustic guitar played by Wayne and a violin smoothly dropping in, with Wayne's drawl starting shortly after. The song revolves around accepting that things are coming to an end and letting the other person

go even though you could still be happy with them. It's the kind of song you listen to on repeat with your headphones stuck in your ears, escaping the world, or maybe more correctly escaping your own carousel that you

"Here to Stay," an abrupt change from "Carousel," fits the EP's diverse musical and artistic showcase of both Novak and Wayne's talents. They don't have to stick to one particular sound or genre or tempo. The song is heavy on Novak's vocals without Wayne backing on it much if at all. This track really stars Novak's accompanying band which is made up of Jeff King on guitar, Steve Brewster on drums, Mark Hill on bass, Tim McDonald on keyboards, and of course Jess Novak on Violin. Between the tempo changes, build ups and guitar riffs it's definitely a track that is beyond vocally focussed and gives credit to all the great musicians involved.

"Ripper" swings. It has and upbeat, dance-tempo, making it hard for you to sit still. You will find yourself bobbing your head without meaning to. The song has a similar sound as "Here to Stay," with more punch to it. With the topic of having your heart ripped out and being excited about it, it's not the most common motif.

The EP had help from producer Bill Warner and songwriter Kirsti Manna, who is best known for her work with Blake Shelton. "Rise" is a powerful piece of work made by Jess Novak & Ben Wayne. It's something worth listening to if you're looking for new music to add to your arsenal.


