Crossgates takes a stand

An attempt to increase safety amid recent fights, incidents

GUILDERLAND — Police will have a greater presence at Crossgates Mall, where a number of violent incidents has occurred in recent months.

Officers will patrol the expansive mall and will complement the "already successful Retail Interdiction Program" which has been active for more than a year, said Guilderland Police Chief Daniel McNally.

"We can now provide this additional service on a full-time basis by having two officers stationed at Crossgates," he said. "The assigned officers' shifts will be flexible to address current needs."

The owners of Crossgates, Pyramid Management Group, will pick up the cost of having the officers at the mall.

The town will hire two additional police officers, McNally said.

Guilderland Supervisor Peter G. Barber said the arrangement allows the Police Department to maintain its full complement of officers for road and other duties, and at its operational discretion to deploy two full-time officers at Crossgates without an additional cost to taxpayers or an additional burden on the force.

"I am very appreciative of the long-term service provided by the police to residents and visitors at Crossgates, and the collaborative working relationship between the Police Department and Crossgates," he said in a statement.

Recent incidents at the mall include a stalker allegedly following two women into the restroom where he restrained one of them, a stabbing outside of

Best Buy and three brawls, one of which spilled into the Beef Jerky Outlet that was captured and widely circulated on social media.

"Crossgates sees millions of guests coming through our doors annually," said Michael Gately, General Manager of Crossgates.

"We are grateful for our partnership with the Guilderland Police Department and the ability to bring this program to our center. Going forward, we will continue to work together to analyze best practices and implement new programs to ensure that the actions of a few do not impact the experience of many. We are a place where families go to spend quality time, for our community to gather to help local non-profits raise funds and where locals and tourists alike come to shop, dine and experience everything that Crossgates has to offer."

Three-car accident

Cohoes resident sustained minor injuries after a multivehicle accident at the intersection of Route 32 and Waldenmeier Road on Wednesday, Feb. 19 at 6:08 p.m.

According to Bethlehem police, Krystal L. Cheeley, 34, of Cohoes was driving a 2011 Kia northbound on Route 32 and stopped at the intersection to turn north onto Waldenmeier Road. Blair, 21, of Albany, was driving a 2010 Kia and struck Cheeley's vehicle from behind, pushing it into a southbound 2016 Subaru, that was driven by Amber Barton, 38, of Coeymans Hollow.

Addressing grave misconceptions

Bethlehem Cemetery raises awareness about its challenges

BETHLEHEM —

Bethlehem Cemetery operators want the public to know that contrary to several misconceptions, it is not owned by the town, there are still acres of lots available and it is not in danger of closing down or becoming abandoned.

Established in 1865, the 30-acre cemetery, located by the intersection of Kenwood and Elsmere Avenues, contains at least 3,500 known burials and is owned by the Bethlehem Cemetery Association, consisting of all lot owners who bought the rights to have loved ones buried there. Services include in-ground full casket and cremation burials, aboveground cremation burials, memorialization, and preplanning for funerals and burial arrangements.

Steve Riedel, the association's president, said it is important to inform the public that the misconceptions, which he said began taking form five years ago, are not true and the Bethlehem Cemetery is still capable of serving the community for generations

Regina "Reggie" Futia, the association's secretary and administrator, said, "We're still profitable and we're in the black. We're

still here."

Available lots

Futia showed a map of how the cemetery is divided into over a dozen lots which are alphanumerically labeled. She said that lots H through K, which take up at least four acres at the property's southern end, are part of the cemetery but are still covered in trees and vegetation. These undeveloped lots would be cleared in 150 years' time to make room for future generations to be buried there, she said.

Also, lots F and G, which are adjacent to lots H and I directly to the north, were just cleared of trees a decade ago and along with lot C, there are many vacant lots available.

These factors refute the misconception that the cemetery is running out of space, Futia said.

"Through the years, we get some calls from people interested in buying a lot and after meeting with them at the cemetery to give them a tour, that's when they say that they've heard we're running out of space," Futia said. "No, we're not actually. We've got four undeveloped acres and at least two acres [lots C, F and G] that are readily available, and you can almost hear the relief from them."

Futia and Riedel brought up that the misconception of the cemetery running out of space may be linked to another misconception that it could close down or get

abandoned anytime soon.

According to the association's data that Futia reported about the number of burials at the cemetery in the last decade, there was no continuous decline which appeared to not be concerning. There were 45 burials in 2010, 34 in 2011, 39 in 2012, 55 in 2013, 64 in 2014, 60 in 2015, 58 in 2016, 37 in 2017, 52 in 2018 and 39 in 2019.

Challenges

Despite available vacant lots and the above data, Riedel said the cemetery is facing several challenges.

If lot owners do not pay for their respective lots, the association would not have enough money to maintain the cemetery like mowing and snowplowing. "End-

of-life expenses are high too because not only are people paying for a loved one's medical care just to ease their suffering or pain but when the person passes away, you've got costs for a funeral, casket, burial or headstone," Futia said. "Also, more people are becoming more environmental-conscious so they don't want to take up space [like a burial site] which also could help keep costs down."

The National Funeral Directors Association, an

international funeral service association that represents funeral homes in the U.S. and 49 countries, reported that in 2017, the median cost of a funeral with a vault, viewing and burial was \$8,755, a slight increase from \$8,508 in 2014.

Futia added that she noticed people, especially starting with the baby boomer generation, prefer cremating their loved ones' bodies instead of burying them in a cemetery; or keeping their loved ones' ashes at home or scattering them elsewhere; or burying them at sea. "What we also see is that people are donating their bodies to science more and it usually takes one to two years for a medical establishment to finish their study on a particular body and then it's cremated and returned to the family," she said.

Also, people may donate their organs and tissue after death to others who need them to survive or for science or medical research, including bone tissue, heart valves, kidneys and lungs. The American Association of Tissue Banks, a transplant organization that accredits over 100 national tissue banks, reported in its website that 1.75 million tissue transplants are performed in the U.S. every

But these challenges have not caused the Bethlehem Cemetery to be in critical danger businesswise, Riedel and Futia said.

Raising \$1.2M for historic farm underway

Land conservancy encourages more monetary donations

NEW SCOTLAND

— The Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy has reached "well beyond the halfway mark" of raising \$1.2 million needed to purchase the historic Bender Melon Farm by May and preserve it, according to MHLC Executive Director Mark King.

King said that much of the raised money so far came from a \$400,000 state grant through the Regional Economic Development Council in December 2019, which MHLC applied for in the summer. "We track grants all the time and it was there so we were aware of that opportunity for a while," King said. "It really

makes a difference in the project and I'm not sure we could possibly succeed without it. It's a giant boost"

Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven said, "I think it's fantastic and a wise move on the state's part to support this important initiative. Preserving this farm will have an impact on residents and life. I think it's great we have a group like the Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy that's willing to work across municipal lines. That's great

for the region."

New Scotland Town Supervisor Douglas LaGrange also expressed support for the fundraising campaign although he has been seeing "Save the Bender Melon Farm" signs across town. He said the "The farm is sort of this bridge between Voorheesville, Slingerlands, Bethlehem and New Scotland. As development is rapid there, we think there's great vlue in this green space to help define community boundaries."

"I've gotten some reactions from folks about the signs which I mentioned to Mark. We have to continue better outreach by letting people know that it has until May to come up with the money. I give Mark and his organization a lot of credit for taking this daunting effort on."

Beyond the state grant, the remaining funds raised came from private donors.

Asked why the conservancy wanted to purchase and preserve the farm, King said there are several reasons, including its historic significance, maintaining its scenic views, possibly making it a recreational spot for the public and addressing rising development in the local

McCoy: County will increase services in 2020

ALBANY — County Executive Dan McCoy, in his ninth State of the County address on Thursday, Feb. 13, pledged to increase services to the mentally ill, those addicted to opioids and seniors.

In 2020, he said, the county Department of Mental Health will establish a Mental Health Court. It would be similar to drug court, which allows those who commit a crime while under the influence or as a direct result of an addiction stay out of jail provided they get treatment for the underlying addition.

'The department is also committed to offering individuals living with mental illness every opportunity to minimize or avoid unnecessary involvement with the criminal justice system and by reducing unnecessary incarceration whenever

possible," McCoy said during his speech at the Times Union Center atrium. "And after years of effort, the department's goal of establishing a mental health court for Albany County – an initiative I proposed nearly five years ago, will become a reality this year."

While opioid addiction does not discriminate, McCoy said the county will expand the GROW -Getting Recovery Options Working — program to include a peer-support program designed specifically for veterans.

He cited studies that found 17 veterans commit

suicide every day with the majority of those either abusing or being addicted to opioids. Veterans who have successfully dealt with their abuse and/or addiction issues will be trained to counsel and assist veterans and their families still in the throes.

touted the county's role in a massive lawsuit against the pharmaceutical industry that is still working its way through the courts.

"That litigation, is now the largest and the most complex lawsuit in American legal history," he said. "In fact, it is the first time ever that a class action has been certified for negotiating purposes, and Albany County has been given a lead role as a class representative. I believe that almost nothing we do is more critical than our efforts to stop this crisis and to get help to those individuals and families suffering from the ravages of addiction. And almost nothing that we do will be more consequential than ensuring that no one, particularly our children will be further endangered by the reckless conduct of the pharmaceutical industry."

He also announced the Along the same lines, he creation of a taskforce to

combat isolationism among the senior population.

"Medical research has shown that social isolation is more lethal than smoking 15 cigarettes a day or even obesity. In fact, research has shown that social isolation leads to heart disease, dementia and higher death rates," he said. "We've already seen the success of our Department for Aging's congregate senior dining initiatives to combat loneliness and isolation with older residents. They can serve as a model of what we can and will do in Albany County to lead on this important mental health issue."

One concern he did express is Gov. Andrew Cuomo's plan restructure Medicaid. The state has absorbed increases in Medicaid to help localities stay within the tax cap, and while the governor has not explicitly said he plans to shift more Medicaid costs to localities in order to help close the some \$6.1 billion deficit, it is widely expected. How much is not certain, but the counties have long complained about picking up a portion of the tab for services the state dictates they must provide.

McCoy, who ran unopposed for a third fouryear term in November, 2019 said he was more excited about this speech than his first because of the county's fiscal condition when he took office.

"Our nation and our state were entangled in a financial downturn that affected our county in ways large and small," he said. "Almost all of the County's departmental budgets had been slashed and many essential programs had been cut. Our reserves were being depleted, and we were resorting to cash flow borrowings."

Since, he said, finances are stabilized, reserves are at historic highs, programs have expanded and tax increases remained under the state mandated cap seven years in a row.

New York still blue

Siena Poll sees any of current Dem candidates beating Trump

COLONIE — If the presidential primary were held today, New York Democrats would narrowly pick Vermont Sen. Bernie Sanders over former New York City Mayor Michael Bloomberg, according to a recent poll by the Siena College Research

And, if the general election were held today rather than in November, voters would choose any of the six leading Democratic candidates over President Donald Trump, according to a poll by the Siena College Research

Of the polled registered Democrats who are eligible to vote in New York's primary on Tuesday, April 28 — only enrolled members of a party can vote in that party's primary — Sanders has the support of 25 percent followed by Bloomberg with 21 percent. Former Vice President Joe Biden would place third with 13 percent, Massachusetts Sen. Elizabeth Warren was favored by 11 percent while former South Bend Indiana Mayor Peter Buttigieg and

Minnesota Sen. Amy Klobuchar had the support of 9 percent each.

According to the poll, 51 percent of Democrats prefer a candidate they agree with on more issues, while 45 percent want the candidate with the best chance to defeat Trump. Also, 33 percent of Democrats say Bloomberg, who now lives in Florida, has the best chance to beat Trump, followed by Sanders at 22 percent, Biden at 16 percent with the remaining three in single digits.

"Bloomberg leads in New York City with Sanders second, while Sanders leads upstate and in the downstate suburbs, where Bloomberg finishes third in both" Greenberg said. "Bernie is trouncing with younger voters and Mike has a commanding lead with older voters. Men side with Bernie, while women lean toward Mike.'

"Thirty-six weeks out, it does not appear that the Democrats' winning streak in presidential contests in New York – solid since Ronald Regan's re-election in 1984 – is in jeopardy," said Siena College pollster Steven Greenberg. "All six leading Democratic candidates currently lead Trump by double digits."

Enter the Kendama

A kendama is a traditional Japanese skill toy, comprising of a handle, two cups, and a ball that is connected by a string. Spiking a kendama is when an individual maneuvers the ball into one of the cups' holes with just one hand. While it provides entertainment, it helps an individual develop their hand-eye coordination, balance and reflex skills.

Inspiration

Joseph Carusone, a local husband and father, said he became inspired to set the record because growing up, he remembered how many people were fascinated by the Guinness World Record books. He said, "You'd see all the pictures, events and records in that book and I was one of those kids who always wanted to be in the book."

That desire, as well as inspiration from his father, caused him to first develop an interest in juggling in his teen years. "My father juggled and he taught himself," he said. "I used to

watch him juggle in bed at night for half an hour and I thought that was amazing and I wanted to learn. He taught me and I went wild and learned many tricks. I was about 12 or 13 then."

This led him to juggle at several local events in the late 1990s, including the Albany Tulip Festival, Albany First Night and Albany Firebird Block Party. But as he grew

older, his love for juggling somewhat subsided and after college, he pursued acting in New York City for a few years before moving back to Delmar in 2011.

Carusone's recent passion for the kendama then grew from his juggling background and he began playing with a kendama in March 2019. "I discovered it through a juggler's Instagram page and thought the kendama was an interesting skill toy so I bought one for myself and became obsessed," he said, adding that he does not think it is commonplace in the Capital District. "They're typically available online and there's this wonderful organization called KendamaUSA.com that does a lot of outreach and education about the kendama. I learned a lot from there."

Applying

Carusone said the kendama helped slightly reinvigorate his interest in juggling and thought the kendama was one way he could try for a Guinness World Record.

He visited its website, saw what juggling and kendama-related records were there and realized that many juggling records were already set, so trying with a kendama appealed to him more. He then applied online to attempt to set a kendama-related record and after the organization approved his application, it emailed him a list of guidelines and rules for the record attempt.

However, the Guinness World Records will not send a representative to view Carusone's attempt on Feb. 29. This meant that at the event, he must have at least two independent witnesses, two separate timekeepers, their signatures proving their attendance and that they witnessed Carusone's attempt. After Carusone submits the evidence of the event to the organization, it would get back to him in around 12 weeks' time.

"You'd have to pay like \$1,000 for a representative's visit because it includes their airfare and overnight stay," he said. "The 12 weeks is also because they [the Guinness World Records organization] will do a lot of confirmation like calling the witnesses and dealing with many other world record attempts for other

things at the same time."

Anticipation

As the Feb. 29 event nears, Carusone said he has been practicing at least one hour every night for almost a year now. The record attempt also requires him to complete a spike each on five Guinness World Records-approved kendamas, instead of five spikes on one kendama. The organization already sent him the set of five kendamas to practice with and he hopes to set a record under 50 seconds.

"Spiking the kendama was definitely something I knew I could do but it's the issue of doing it on five kendamas swiftly and efficiently," he said. "It's been challenging yet incredibly rewarding." He added that he continues to learn from online kendamarelated communities that list beginner and advanced

Friends and family, he said, have been supportive of his upcoming record attempt, some of whom will attend the Feb. 29 event. Even his six-year-old son is starting to learn kendama spiking tricks, Carusone said, "My son is very excited and he understands the world record thing and he also gets the [Guinness World Records] books at his school library. It's a good skill toy to teach to anyone about focus, patience and dedication."

When asked what setting the Guinness World Record would mean to him, Carusone said, "It'd be the culmination of a lifelong dream to be in the Guinness World Records book and website. I don't think everyone gets in the book but to know that I have that record would mean a great deal to me, especially since it's related to juggling. My dad will also be at the event and that's great to know because he inspired me all those years ago and it would be wonderful. He's 75 now."

He added that the record attempt can "help absolutely spread the word about pushing boundaries of what you think you can do and it can show kids that they can also set records and push themselves. It also spreads the word about kendamas which are a lot of fun and they can teach you about patience, dedication and

Raising awareness

Looking ahead, Futia said, "Our first attack is education and talking to the people and explain what we do and what's going on at the cemetery."

One example is how Bethlehem Town Historian Susan Leath has been hosting two public tours of the cemetery every June and October since

2018 through the Parks and Recreation department.

"I was always fascinated by old cemeteries, stones and people's names and the town has had some notable local families like Nathaniel Adams and his wife from 1835, and the Slingerland family," Leath said. "Cemeteries are beautiful, peaceful places and you can think of the past and people who came before us. It's also a nice walk when I do the tour in the fall. It's also interesting to see the iconography on the stones and different symbols and images

there."

Leath's tour mainly guides people through lots 1 through 5, located at the Bethlehem Cemetery's northern end, which is the final resting place for many historical individuals and families who were the first to be buried on the property in the 19th and early 20th centuries. Leath said, however, that she was not aware of the misconceptions Riedel and Futia brought up.

"The cemetery seems to be doing fine and there's plenty of open space in the back," Leath said, adding that dozens of residents have already taken her tour so far. "I do the tours to promote Bethlehem history and I had reached out to [the Bethlehem Cemetery Association] about my idea for a tour in 2018 and they were very receptive."

Riedel said the cemetery is also the final resting place for many local military veterans who were active in conflicts including the Spanish-American War, Civil War, World War I and II, Korean War and Vietnam War.

This year, Leath's two tours will happen on June 27 and Oct. 3. If interested, contact her at sleath@townofbethlehem.org or at 518-439-4955, ext. 1160.

While the Bethlehem Cemetery Association continues to address the aforementioned misconceptions and promote Leath's tours, Riedel concluded, "We're still here to serve you, the community. We're in good shape but like anybody or any business, we could be in better shape."

Raising money

Melon Farm takes up around 198 acres and is owned by 306 Maple Road, LLC. A historic marker by its entrance only tells a fraction of its historic significance, which dates back to the late 19th century.

According to "Charles Bender and the Bender Melon Farm: A Local History," a 1990 book written by Voorheesville's Village Historian Dennis Sullivan, it was where New Scotland farmer Charles Bender experimented with melon seeds in 1884 to develop cantaloupe melons later known as Bender melons

— which became popular across 33 U.S. states, England, Mexico and France.

After the farm switched owners several times during the 20th century, it declined and in 2008, a proposal to build a big box store on its property generated controversy although it never moved forward.

"I'd say that many residents at the time certainly knew the history of the Bender Melon Farm and any history is significant to hold onto," LaGrange said. "It's another reason New Scotland is on the map with the history we've had. It's also a nice buffer from development."

King chimed in, "The farm is sort of this bridge between

Voorheesville, Slingerlands, Bethlehem and New Scotland. As development is rapid there, we think there's great value in this green space to help define community boundaries and that's an important vision."

If the farm gets preserved, King said the conservancy hopes to take advantage of how the Albany County Rail Trail runs through the farm.

He said this could promote public recreational use in and around the farm, and it can maintain the area's scenic views.

Other possibilities include establishing nature and mountain biking trails in the area and it can complement the adjacent Hilton Barn property.

He added that 10 to 15 acres

of the Bender Melon Farm's southern portion which runs along Route 85 "may have some commercial use. We will not directly do this as someone else has to but since there's some businesses near the 85 and 85A intersection, we could see an expansion of commercial space. But the farm will mostly stay agricultural."

LaGrange said the town of New Scotland has worked with MHLC for various projects in the past and "it's always exciting and it's an opportunity to keep working with them.'

VanLuven said he hopes Bethlehem residents can help donate funds to the campaign.

"Human nature has assumed that landscapes will remain

the same but gets surprised if development comes in," he said. "That's why I think it's important for us to protect property like the

King concluded, "We always have a lot of other projects too but I appreciate how people from New Scotland, Bethlehem, the City of Albany and lots of different organizations have come through with their support. It's challenging and exciting at the time."







ALBANY — All speculation was correct as a nationwide television audience witnessed Julia Gargano advance past her American Idol audition on Sunday, Feb. 23

"Is anyone else falling in love with Julia Gargano's voice right now?" asked Katy Perry on Twitter. The audition was recorded last October, but most of the nation was watching The College of Saint Rose student for the first time on Sunday.

An army of harmony

from jazz standards to pop chart hits, explored medieval motets and Renaissance madrigals, and encouraged young composers to write new scores.

This year sees the King's Singers release their new album Finding Harmony, as part of a new campaign to harness the positive power of music to bring people together and effect social change. The recording explores the development of Western harmony over the last 800 years, celebrating music that has united different people all over the world, particularly in the face of oppression. The program covers eleven significant and iconic episodes of history, from the Protestant Reformation in Europe to the 2017 Manchester bombings.

The group is known for the flexibility and diversity of their repertoire, and this album brings together music from a range of communities, countries and genres to celebrate music from throughout history. Finding Harmony includes arrangements by a number of leading composers, including young British composers Rebecca Dale and Toby Young, Mexican composer Jorge Cózatl, South African composer Neo Muyanga, worldfamous Scottish composer Sir James MacMillan, British singer and director Richard Wilberforce and Stacey V. Gibbs, one of America's foremost arrangers of spirituals.

Michael Hallisey, The Spot 518: Your latest album includes arrangements from several composers, each from a different country and from a different culture. What kind of challenges are you presented with while singing such pieces?

Patrick Dunachie, countertenor in The King's Singers: Our latest album is called 'Finding Harmony' and takes a look at a series of stories from throughout history all over the world where songs have played a key role in the course of world events. From over



1000 years ago up until the year we recorded it, we wanted to look at the sheer power that certain songs have had for communities facing unimaginable challenges. We decided on the project, in part, because we wanted to use our global platform as touring artists to tell some of these moving stories, and encourage people to think about what a valuable force singing is, at times when the world is fractured and divided. But one of the key challenges was to make sure that we were singing this music

with authenticity, paying maximum respect to the people whose history we explore. This meant choosing composers and arrangers very carefully, making sure to collaborate with people who have experience or affinity with the cultures we had

chosen. There were also the challenges of language the album contains songs in 11 different languages and we were keen to make sure we sung the text accurately, no matter how difficult! And the final challenge was to capture the right emotion in our performances; many of these songs are highlycharged because of their social context, and we worked hard to find the right tone and energy to represent each song with the gravity it deserves.

The Spot 518: You all sing as one voice. How do you prepare as a group to achieve what you make appear so easy?

Dunachie: It's good to hear that it comes across as one voice — this is the effect we're often striving for, and it's not as easy as it might look. Our sounding as 'one voice' comes from our ability to blend the sound of our voices together, so that none of us is sticking out from the texture, but everyone is audible. The ability to sound like each other develops through a few different means. One is the sheer volume of rehearsing and performing that we do

together. We spend around 400 hours a year making sound together, and with that comes a musical bond where we know how best to sing with our neighbours on either side; we get used to their voice, their habits, their strengths, their weaknesses, and so we can work as a team with them to make a homogenous sound. In our rehearsals, we often spend time working on this 'one voice' effect by discussing the type of sound we're making, and adjusting the tone quality, volume and vowel sounds to create this effect. As for making it look easy: the trick is learning to smile sweetly while your brain is working at 200 mph!

The Spot 518: Is the art of harmonizing dying in today's world of technology?

Dunachie: Absolutely not! If anything, I'd say the art is getting stronger and getting more popular. Just yesterday, we were working with a high school choir in New Mexico, and after our workshop one 16-year-old man came up and told me that he'd only joined the choir 6 months ago, after stumbling upon barbershop videos on YouTube. The

availability of high quality performances online, through streaming services, social media sites and YouTube, is making choral music and vocal harmony more accessible than ever, and feeding into choirs and a cappella groups all over the world. For those people who don't have access to people around them with whom they can harmonize, technology today can enable people to sit on their own, and harmonize themselves using their phone or computer. Fourtime Grammy Awardwinner Jacob Collier is a perfect example of how one guy sitting in his bedroom with a computer can become one of the world's great voices on harmony. However, as we tour the world, it is the sense of teamwork, community and communication that makes singing in harmony so special, and so important in what can be a lonely world.

The Spot 518: You will be performing at the Troy Savings Bank Music Hall which is praised for its incredible acoustics; are there any shows from memory in which you are amazed by the venue or audience, and can you

describe that experience for our readers?

Dunachie: We're really looking forward to being in Troy, and to sample these famed acoustics. I've only been in The King's Singers for three-and-a-half years, yet even in that time so many venues and audiences stand out. The most magical concert atmospheres are often surprisingly modest ones. We have performed in Carnegie Hall, Washington National Cathedral, Royal Albert Hall and many other grand venues, yet my mind immediately goes to a concert we did a few years back in a small German town called Olten. We were singing in a small Lutheran church, to an audience of maybe 200 people, but somehow the atmosphere was electric - there was just enough light in the church to see the audience's faces, and I remember getting shivers down my spine singing the renaissance motet 'Versa est in luctum' by Alonso Lobo, in the church's warm acoustics. Somehow, the sense of intensity and focus through the whole concert made it at least as memorable as any of the world's top venues.

The Spot 518: In light of the origins of these songs, what kind of lessons can society or your audience learn from these songs?

Dunachie: In Troy, we're going to be singing 'An audience with The King's Singers', which is a typically diverse selection of music. There will be something for everyone, no matter their musical background, and so we hope to introduce people to a few songs they might not ordinarily hear and perhaps encourage people to broaden their musical interests just a little. More widely though — particularly with our 'Finding Harmony' project underway - we want people to appreciate the profound power that music can have on people and communities. I hope that even a few of the songs on the album make people stop and think about the inspiration, the healing, the motivation, and sometimes the real-world change, that singing together can create, and to think about whether the world today could use some of that power.










Music on the brain



Sheet music may be an effective guide for understanding human brain activity

TROY — When Sergio Pequito thinks about the brain, he visualizes a piano. The keys represent different parts of the brain, and the pressure applied by the pianist's fingers represents the outside stimuli that promote brain functions.

Just as notes and harmonies can be mapped onto sheet music, Pequito, an assistant professor of industrial and systems engineering at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, is looking to transcribe the brain's complex dynamics into new data models that can help researchers better understand how the brain and human cognition work. This composition effort, of sorts, is being supported by a new grant from the National Science Foundation.

"We have showed that, by thinking like this, there was a lot of activity in the brain that we were able to mimic

and capture," Pequito said. "We believe that we can use the math and models we have developed to capture intrinsic features that justify how the brain behaves over space and time."

Pequito's team, which includes a collaborator from the University of Southern California, will use publicly available brain signal data from the National Institutes of Health to improve the models they have built. The data has been collected using functional magnetic resonance imaging (fMRI) technology, which tracks blood flow and oxygen flow as they increase in active parts of the brain.

Pequito and his team are trying to provide insight into how a healthy brain functions, as well as how one with a neurological disease may behave. Continuing this analogy, Pequito explained that just as a pianist who hits the wrong key may create a dissonant noise, the models developed by his research team will show when something is a bit off in the brain's activity.

Industrial and systems engineers develop tools to analyze how complex systems interact. Pequito believes that this type of approach to humanity's long-standing questions about the brain can provide new understanding about the relationships between functions like attention, learning, memory, decision-making, and language. These insights may prove useful in improving current technology by reverse-engineering the brain, which is one of the National Academy of Engineering's Grand Challenges for Engineering.

"We have all sorts of tools that we, as industrial engineers, can use," Pequito said. "Now, we are working to improve them so we can provide new insights for the neuroscience and medical community."

ent is a solemn season of introspection and prayer as Christians prepare for the Easter celebration and feast. One of the hallmarks of the this time of year is abstaining from meat each Friday and during certain days of obligation.

People who routinely consume meat and poultry may be wondering which meals they can enjoy to keep flavors fresh on nonmeat days. Many Indian dishes are meat-free, vegan options that can be perfectly inserted into Lenten Fridays. Such is the case with this recipes for "Curry of Vegetables With Potatoes" from "Menus and Memories From Punjab" (Hippocrene Books) by Veronica "Rani" Sidhu

Curry of Vegetables With Potatoes (Aloo Mutter)

Ingredients: Makes 10 1-cup servings

- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 2 medium onions, chopped
- 3 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 inches of ginger, minced
- 2 teaspoons ground turmeric
- 11/2 teaspoons whole or ground cumin seeds
- 1 tablespoon ground fenugreek seeds (optional)
- 1 medium/large tomato, chopped

- 1 or 2 long green chile peppers, seeded and finely chopped
- 11/2 teaspoons salt, or to taste
- 1/3 cup tomato paste
- 2 teaspoons garam masala
- 4 cups potatoes, peeled and cut into 11/4-inch cubes.
- 3 cups frozen peas, thawed
- 1/2 cup cilantro leaves and stems, finely chopped, plus some for garnish

Instructions

In a large, heavy-bottomed pot, heat the oil and sauté the onions, garlic and ginger over medium heat until lightly browned, stirring frequently. Add the spices and brown for 1 more minute. For a smooth gravy, purée this tardka in a blender.

Return the tardka to the pot and add the tomato, chile pepper and salt, stirring constantly for another few minutes. Stir in the tomato paste, 1 teaspoon of the garam masala, potatoes, and three cups of water. Simmer for 30 minutes over low heat, stirring occasionally.

Add the peas plus 21/2 cups water. Taste for salt and heat through. Before serving, sprinkle with the last teaspoon of garam masala and the cilantro leaves garnish.
