



Cemetery crash BETHLEHEM — A

53-year-old Albany man crashed his vehicle into a telephone pole on Route 9W near Beacon Road on Thursday, March 5, at 1:06 a.m., according to Bethlehem police.

The accident caused that road's section to be temporarily closed until 3 p.m., affecting local traffic.

According to police reports, Arthur L. Williams was driving a 2009 Nissan when he significantly damaged the pole, prompting National Grid to work to replace it.

Bethlehem police and the Selkirk Fire Department responded to the scene. Williams was treated at the scene and transported by Delmar-Bethlehem EMS and Albany County Paramedics to Albany Medical Center Hospital.

Bethlehem police investigated the incident and determined that Williams was intoxicated while driving.

He was charged with

a DWI misdemeanor, a criminal possession of a controlled substance misdemeanor, and traffic violations of speed not reasonable and prudent, failure to keep right, driving a motor vehicle with no seatbelt and unlicensed operation of a motor vehicle.

Williams is scheduled to appear at the Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, March 24 at 6 p.m.

DWI

SLINGERLANDS — A 21-year-old Slingerlands man was arrested on a host of charges on Thursday, Feb. 27, at 1:12 a.m.

Bethlehem police observed a green Chevrolet Camaro speeding at 43 mph in a 30 mph zone on Schoolhouse Road and after having it pull over, the operator identified himself with his state license as Sanja Raja Oconnor.

Police noted strong odors of alcohol and marijuana.

According to police reports, when he was told to leave his vehicle, the odors grew stronger and he refused to do all the field sobriety tests.

Oconnor was arrested and was transported to the Bethlehem Police Department where he was processed.

However, he refused a chemical test to determine the alcohol or drug content of his blood.

Oconnor was scheduled to return to the Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, March 3, and was charged with a DWI misdemeanor, a refusal to take a breath test infraction and a failure to obey a traffic device infraction.

While Ragule's vehicle was towed, police said a breath test showed a BAC of three times the legal limit.

Ragule was charged with aggravated DWI with a BAC of 0.18 percent or higher, driving while intoxicated with a BAC of 0.08 percent or higher, driving while intoxicated and speeding in zone.

Biz owners worried about road diet

Exchanged ideas and concerns with town officials

DELMAR — Business owners along Delaware Avenue expressed concern about the upcoming road's Complete Streets Project at a public forum in the Normanside Country Club on Thursday, March 5.

There was a general consensus throughout the meeting that road safety, maintaining communication among residents and businesses and improving infrastructure on Delaware Avenue's 1.3-mile stretch from Elsmere Avenue to the Normans Kill Bridge were important.

Business owners are worried customers will be discouraged from coming during and after construction, that road detours will affect traffic on nearby streets and it hurting businesses' bottom lines.

The meeting was mainly led by Jim Giacone, the owner of My Place & Co., who said he did not like the road diet's planned restriping — from the existing four-lane road to two opposing traffic lanes, a middle two-way left-turn lane and two opposing bicycle lanes.

He was also worried about the potential increase in peak hour traffic in the late afternoon.

However, he said, "Let's

be clear. I don't think there's anyone in this room who doesn't love Bethlehem. I was born and raised here, and we are 100 percent for pedestrian crosswalks, safer roads, ADA-adaptability

and connectivity."

The meeting attracted dozens of residents and key officials like Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven; all four Town Board members; Robert Leslie, the town's director of planning; Elizabeth Staubach, the town's economic development coordinator; and several state Department of Transportation staff.

Leeanne Shade, owner of Choices Hair Studio, was concerned that construction and the road's planned twoopposing-lanes approach could deter customers.

"I have to worry about [my] employees that have been with me for a very long time and are very loyal. I owe it to them to make certain I'm looking out for their interests," she said. "My salon, because people do make appointments, often has me receiving

calls from people who are on their way but stuck in traffic. And that's with four

lanes here."

Stephanie Kosnick, owner of InFerno NY. wondered whether the construction and restriping would affect local emergency respondents; she believed that having two opposing lanes would feel tight and increase more traffic.

"How are they going to be able to access accidents that most likely will occur during rush hour when there are more people crammed into that space?" she said. "The fire trucks and ambulances are pretty big.'

VanLuven understood their concerns and said, "The three desired outcomes are greater safety for vehicles, greater

safety for pedestrians and greater safety for cyclists. In addition to that, we want it to also benefit businesses which I firmly believe it will."

He added he knows of business owners who support the project but did not attend the meeting, implying they may "feel harangued and bullied and just don't want to deal with it" because of those who oppose it.

Town Board member and volunteer Elsmere Fire District firefighter Jim Foster said, "What I'm horribly afraid of is putting crosswalks along this corridor when we have data that shows the number one

cause of accidents is distracted driving. ... I live in fear of the day when I respond to that fire truck and there's a tragedy on that corridor because we sprinkled some crosswalks and I think everyone here can see we can do better from a yielding-to-pedestrians-at-crosswalks perspective."

Attending business owners offered suggestions like temporarily restriping the road for a year to test whether a road diet is successful; restriping the road's stretch to have two lanes coming from Albany, one lane to Albany and a two-way left-turn lane in between; lowering the current speed limit to 30 mph; and encouraging bicyclists to use the nearby Albany County Rail Trail.

VanLuven and the Town Board members said residents can continue to reach out with their ideas or concerns. While the project's final design process is ongoing and an engineering consultant has yet to be hired, residents and business owners can expect more communication from the town as it hired the Albanybased Baker Public Relations firm in January to craft a strategic communications plan for the Glenmont roundabout project.

Set to be finished by April 1, this plan will be a template the town can use for future major roadway construction projects, like the road diet, to keep residents, businesses and customers in the loop about construction updates and traffic detours.

The \$5.2 million Delaware Avenue Complete Streets Project or road diet will not shorten the road's physical width though. According to the town's website, construction will commence in late 2021 or 2022, depending on the state DOT's paving schedule, and an engineering consultant will be hired in winter 2020 to help work on the project's final design.

Some local families self-quarantined

Unconfirmed cases in Guilderland and Niskayuna

CAPITAL DISTRICT

A few Capital District households have voluntarily quarantined themselves at home as a precaution due to possible exposure to the coronavirus (COVID-19).

On Friday, March 6, the Guilderland Central School District announced that a self-quarantined household connected to Lynnwood Elementary School has not shown signs of illness yet but did not explain how it possibly was exposed to the coronavirus.

On the same day, the Niskayuna Central School District reported that two of its connected and selfquarantined households traveled recently but did not indicate when and where.

These are not confirmed coronavirus cases, so there is no critical risk of a spread, the school districts each reported.

They have begun taking precautionary measures like contacting local public health officials, distributing disinfectant wipes districtwide, and disinfecting frequentlytouched surfaces in buildings and buses.

However, Gov. Andrew Cuomo announced on Saturday, March 7 that there are two confirmed coronavirus cases in Saratoga County and they are being quarantined.

New York state now has 76 confirmed coronavirus cases.

The school districts offered advice including washing your hands with soap for at least 20 seconds; not touching one's eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands; covering one's cough or sneeze with a tissue and throwing it into

the trash; and disinfecting surfaces.

"We will continue to monitor this situation and will provide updates as necessary and appropriate," Guilderland CSD Superintendent Marie Wiles wrote. "We appreciate your patience and cooperation as we

continue to respond to this evolving concern."

Cosimo Tangorra Jr., Niskayuna CSD's superintendent, wrote, "The health and safety of our students and staff is our highest priority, and we will remain vigilant in our efforts to help prevent the spread of this illness."

Court of second chances

Treatment court strives to save lives and foster rebirth

BETHLEHEM — The town's treatment court hopes to give people battling drug addiction or alcoholism and facing serious charges for addiction-related crimes a second chance, according to Town Justice Ryan T. Donovan, the program's head.

About

The treatment court program, which operates in the Town of Bethlehem Court, lasts for one year for each enrolled defendant. First developed in 2017, around 10 defendants voluntarily take part in this program now.

Each meets with their attorney, an Albany

County probation officer, a District Attorney's Office representative and Donovan the people in our court monthly to discuss whether they have stayed clean, what their progress and future goals are, assess whether they feel vulnerable to abuse again and keep them

accountable.

"We care a lot about and we take no pleasure in people going to jail. We want people who are sick to get help," he said, noting that there is no silver bullet to address addiction.

"The idea is that we are an instrument for positive change in people's lives. Jail and punishment are necessary as they're part of our criminal justice system but we want to give people a positive change in their lives."

If a defendant completes the year-long program, they "graduate" and can have their criminal record cleaned or have their Class A misdemeanor charges reduced.

Assistance and resources are available to defendants to try to secure housing and employment after "graduation" so as to reenter society without a high risk of reverting to addiction again.

William M. Connors, the Albany County Probation Department's director, said it is important to recognize, assess and treat substance abuse first. "We also do everything we can to have people obtain employment and part of getting employment is remaining substance abusefree. We're trying to move people forward.

However, Donovan said not all defendants feel helped by the treatment court and have the right to leave it at any time; any

"There's not one way we can do this as everyone in our court requires a different level of attention and services," he said. "I only accept people in this program that want to get better."

"We hold them accountable and we let them know that we care. that someone's here and that we're listening. It's so often that they just want someone to care," he continued. "Giving someone structure is a way to show we care about them. Like when we meet the next month, I sometimes say that I want them to apply for five jobs in the meantime. I want to make sure they meet their treatment goals, they're clean and what their living situations are."

Inspiration

Donovan was inspired in 2017 to develop the treatment court to address the statewide opioid crisis. He also did not like how many defendants died

New world record for local man?

Awaiting official confirmation within four months

BETHLEHEM — Delmar resident Joseph Carusone may have set a new Guinness World Record on Saturday, Feb. 29 at the Bethlehem Public Library for the fastest time to complete five kendama spikes at 25.65 seconds, beating the previous 50-second record.

However, Guinness World Records has to confirm the record attempt within the next four months before it becomes official.

Carusone, 36, said that the organization will take that long to get back to him because it needs to first confirm the logged time and record attempt with eyewitnesses and also deal

with other world record attempts.

A kendama, a traditional Japanese skill toy, consists of a handle, two cups, a center spike and a ball with a hole that is connected by a string. Spiking a kendama is when a person maneuvers the ball to have its hole land on top of the center spike with just one hand. Besides being entertaining to watch, it helps the person work on their balance, hand-eye coordination and reflex skills, as well as patience. Carusone spiked

five separate kendamas consecutively, instead of just spiking one kendama five times.

"Technically, I did set the record but [the Guinness World Records organization] needs to confirm it," he said. "I'll send all the evidence to

Guinness and they'll review it.

"They said they'll take about 12 to 16 weeks and once everything is confirmed, they'll get back to me, saying I have a Guinness World Record," he added. "They'll give you a poster-size certificate that you could hang up."

He said he is not sure whether he would end up in the physical Guinness World Records Book since it has limited space, but he should be on its website. His record attempt was filmed by some of his attending family members, including his wife, child and parents. Several local well-wishers also came to the library to cheer him on.

No official Guinness World Records representative attended the event because Carusone said he would have needed to pay at least \$1,000 for their airfare and lodging.

Hence, two local residents attended the library event and used separate stopwatches to track the time and two others — Town Historian Susan Leath and Bethlehem Police Officer James Corrigan — served as official witnesses of the event.

A video of the record attempt and their signatures, proving their attendance and that they were eyewitnesses, were then submitted.

But for now, Carusone said, "I feel great, I feel relieved! I'm happy that everything went as planned. Also, my family has always been very supportive with everything I've done so it feels great to have them here."

He noted his 75-yearold father's attendance meant a lot to him since he was one of the reasons he became passionate about juggling and kendamas.

Growing up, he said that his father used to juggle and introduced him to it. Over time, this led to his passion for the kendama — spiking it is physically similar to juggling.

"My dad taught me how to juggle all those years ago and to have him here now while I set a Guinness World Record is amazing," Carusone said.


Also, setting a world record has been Carusone's lifelong dream, as he said that when he was young, he was fascinated by the Guinness World Records books and he wanted to be in it one day. When asked what he would hypothetically say to his teenage self, Carusone said, "Keep practicing and one day, you never know. You may set a Guinness record!"

Bethlehem in the Frozen Four

SCHENECTADY —The Eagles are headed to the Frozen Four.

Bethlehem won its third consecutive Section II title on Tuesday, March 3 by beating Saratoga 3-2, and then, in the Regionals, beat the top ranked team in the state from Suffern on Saturday, March 7 by a score of 1-0 in OT.

Justin Chenaille had a hat trick for The Eagles against Saratoga — which ended the season atop the Capital District High School Hockey League with a 13-2 conference record and 21-2 overall — in front of a large, loud crowd at Union College's Messa Rink.

"This is what we worked hard for all season long. It's all my teammates," Chenaille said after the game. "The game plan was simple, shoot it on net and crash the net. Credit my teammates. They shot the puck hard and they played hard all night long." Against Suffern, Jonathan Thibodeau scored the game's only goal to avenge a loss last year to Suffern.

Against Saratoga, Bethlehem took a 1-0 lead after the first period and extended it to 2-0 on Chenaille's second goal of the night early in the second. Saratoga (11-4, 17-6) pulled within one with 90 second left in the second on a goal by Mack Ogden.

Chenaille, the CDHSHL's Player of the Year, scored his third about three minutes into the third period to give the Eagles a 3-1 lead and with some five minutes to play, Saratoga pulled it's goalie to give them an extra skater on offense. It paid off, and Saratoga pulled within one on an Andrew Blanchard goal with about 2:30 left in regulation.

The Eagles, though, anchored by goalie Mike Kurdziolek, withstood a flurry of activity in front of the net.

"There are things that will not happen again in your life and this is one of them," said the CDHSHL Leading Goaltender who had 28 saves on Tuesday. "When this team gives its all we are unstoppable. We are the best team in the state and we can go all the way."

Kurdziolek had 39 saves against Suffern.

The Eagles will now head to the Harbor Center in Buffalo on March 14 to square off against Massena. The winner will play the winner of Williamsville North and Victor on March 15 for the state championship.

"It's very special. We have a lot of leaders on the team and have been on this team for all three and they all know how hard we have to work and they worked hard all year and we pulled it off," said Bethlehem coach Dylan Lappe of winning three in a row. "They never give up. They always have their head up, and they focus on the next shift and they never give up. They knew from the beginning everyone is out to beat us so we know we have to battle to the very end and we did."

DiBiase, a teacher at the Bethlehem Central School District since 2005, heads Paper Pastries.

"Unfortunately, with work skills needed today, it's very hard to find things that our students [with special needs] can do," DiBiase said. "The goal for them is to be independent and some of them can do things independently when you show them, like performing the same tasks."

Paper Pastries, which calebrates its one-year anniversary on March 15, is the high school's first card shop. It sells colorful greeting cards with positive messages for many occasions like birthdays, graduation, the new year and the holiday season. It



is located in room A108, although it sometimes does business at a temporary location in the hallways. It has even appeared at the Delmar Farmers Market.

All the shop's envelopes, stamps and stamp pads were donated from the school and local community, DiBiase added. I Love Books, a Delmar store near the Four Corners, donated display racks and The Paper Mill, from Delaware Plaza, donated envelopes.

DiBiase said 10 students - from the LEAD (Linking Education and Development) program as part of the school's Special Education Student Services – work on Mondays to Thursdays during eighth period. They cut and make the cards; develop their communication and motor skills; handle monetary transactions and inventory; and learn to use technology to help print designs via Bluetooth and a special Cricut cutting machine. Several aides and a speech therapist help DiBiase with

the students throughout the week.

"It's not a steady stream of business because kids these days don't buy cards much because everybody sends messages with their phones," she said. "But on Valentine's Day, we did great and then there's Mother's Day and the holidays, too. Also, we found that most of our business comes from adults in the building overall." She added that all money made from purchases at Paper Pastries stays within the business to help it grow and buy more materials.

David DeCancio, a member of Bethlehem Opportunities Unlimited's board of directors, recently visited Paper Pastries to pick up a bulk order of 50 "thank you" cards he ordered last November. He said he planned to distribute them at the eighth annual Bethlehem Community Spelling Bee - which BOU hosted on Tuesday, March 3 — to people who donated money to that event as a form of gratitude and community support for Paper Pastries.

"It's great to see these kids work together and learn good life skills together," DeCancio said. "The BOU and I wanted to support them with the bulk purchase, and it's one of the many interesting things being done at the school."

Cindy Ferrari, BOU's president, said, "I'm just thrilled that David thought of that and it's such a great connection from our community group to the high school. David bought the cards with our [BOU] money and it's a nice and really positive way to connect our non-profit community."

Inspiration

DiBiase said she and former teacher Susan Deierlein came up with the idea for Paper Pastries, adding she was inspired by a North Carolina-based cafe called Bitty and Beau's Coffee, owned by Amy Wright. Wright is a mother of four; two of them, named Bitty and Beau, have Down syndrome.

The cafe opened in early 2016 and has since expanded to South Carolina, Georgia and Maryland; it employs around 120 people with special needs. "[Wright] started Bitty and Beau's for her children because when they get older, she wants to have a place for them to work, so all employees at Bitty and Beau's have special needs and have job coaches there to help them," said DiBiase. "Each summer, my family and I vacation at North Carolina and three years ago, I visited [Bitty and Beau's] in Wilmington and I was so inspired."

She also said there is a business called Puzzles Bakery and Cafe, located on 515 State Street in Schenectady, that employs adults with developmental disabilities. Owned by Sara Mae Hickey, DiBiase said Hickey's mother used to work at Bethlehem Central as a physical therapist and her sister has autism.

This caused DiBiase and Deierlein to pitch the idea for a similar business to Principal David Doemel Jr., at the high school.

"We said what we wanted to do and if we could set up shop somewhere. And everybody has been so, so, so supportive of it," DiBiase said. This led to a ribboncutting ceremony in March 2019, attended by students and faculty including Doemel, Superintendent Jody Monroe and Director of Special Education and Student Services Kathleen Johnston.

Reflection

Looking ahead, DiBiase hopes to move the shop into a permanent location in the school and wants to help the students conduct business at the monthly Delmar Farmers Market in May, June, September, October, November and December. "We had a lot of people stop by there and for the kids in the past, and it gave them so much experience to handle the cards and interact with them and be outside," she said.

She said she would also like to collaborate with some general education students, especially those with art or graphic design skills, to help make more cards with original designs.

DiBiase added that she continues to enjoy working with the LEAD students at Paper Pastries. "The best thing that can happen for these kids is for people to just think outside the box," she concluded. "They're the most loyal and honest employees. Once they learn something, it's great."

without receiving enough assistance or resources to confront their addiction.

According to the New York State Health Foundation, almost 9 million opioid prescriptions were issued statewide in 2015, but between 2011 and 2014, about 145,000 New Yorkers abused or were addicted to opioids.

The National Institutes of Health's Institute on Drug Abuse reported in March 2019 that the crisis had not subsided because there were 3,224 opioidrelated overdose deaths in New York in 2017. This was the highest number since the institute began recording in 1999 and it was an increase from around 3,000 deaths in 2016.

"But this treatment court does not only take people in with opioid addiction, we'll take anybody with addiction that wants help," Donovan said. "However, the court system can be viewed negatively by people where a judge throws someone in jail and a prosecutor is insensitive. I'm here to be an example of how that's not the way it is."

Donovan's mindset led him to meet with people in 2017, including representatives on behalf of the county District Attorney David Soares' office, the county Public Defender James Milstein's office and the county Probation Department.

"I can't praise those three agencies enough and even our County Executive Dan McCoy was very supportive of this," Donovan said. "We didn't ask for money, we asked for time. Although all these groups were overloaded with their own cases, they were excited in wanting to address addiction from this different angle."

Donovan, those agencies and the Bethlehem Police Department work together to identify possible candidates, who face certain serious charges and addiction issues, who could benefit from the treatment court.

Anecdotes

Andrew, a 28-year-old Bethlehem resident, has

been one of the treatment court's enrolled defendants for two years and three months, longer than the program's oneyear timeframe.

"I've screwed up more than a few times, but they continue to support and give me the help I need," he explained. "Seeing them continue to help is not something I was used to; most times in courts, they just send you to jail to do your time. But these guys really care."

Once he "graduates" from this treatment court, he hopes to have his petit larceny charge — this is a misdemeanor that was previously reduced from a burglary felony — reduced to a violation. Looking ahead, he hopes to work in an Albany welding program and get an apartment.

"I have a very good start, thanks to this

> court. I'm just very grateful," he added. "There's this whole other side to Judge Donovan as I've gotten jail time from him before this court when I was still using. This time, he's more treatment-oriented and wants you to get yourself together and the help you need."

Skyler, a 25-year-old Troy-Watervliet resident who enrolled in the treatment court in October 2019, similarly offered praise. "It's been my saving grace and it's saved my life," she said. "If it weren't for Judge Donovan, I'd be dead, in jail again or a lost cause."

Skyler faces charges including petit larceny and criminal possession of a controlled substance. Once she finishes the treatment court program, her charges can be dropped. She said her primary goal is to provide for her four children. She also wants to earn a GED, attend a nursing class and become a phlebotomist.

"I hadn't been clean since I was 13 and I have a long line of family addicts. I'm just happy to end that vicious cycle for my kids," Skyler said, adding she's been clean since enrolling in the treatment court. "My mom was really good friends with my friend who just passed away recently from an overdose. So, my mom is so thankful I'm in here."

Reflection

Heading the treatment court has affected the way Donovan perceived people struggling with addiction or those who are less fortunate, he said.

"Maybe they come from a broken home or not have great parents or have education, but when you look them in the eye and you see them for who they are, I believe that everyone in their core is good," he added. "You have to look at this through a humane eye. It's changed me as a judge and I look at people differently now after getting to know them. I root for them but also hold them accountable."

Donovan said there have been 15 defendants who successfully completed the program since it began in 2017. He wants to continue helping more in years to come.

"Our mission is really rehabilitation and to move people past their addiction and get them clean and sober," Connors said. "Get them in a good way of life and off probation."

Donovan concluded, "We deal with people on the edge of life and death, and this court, I would say, has saved lives. If we can save one person, it's worth it."

Railroad Avenue is a gateway into Albany County for those coming off of I-90, and it is the focus of this month's Discover series.



The wheels of progress keep turning



The Railroad Avenue corridor once bustling with technology continues to be viewed for something new in today's world

COLONIE — You might be familiar with Railroad Avenue as the road you used to take to the bygone discount movie theatre that was within a stone's throw of the

Northway, where Lowe's

and BJ's now stand.

Once a vital corridor for railroad transportation, Railroad Avenue continues to be important for local business.

Colonie Historian

It's also one of the roads you can take to the Northway Shopping Center off of Central Avenue. And it's an industrial avenue lined with warehouses, a gym, a Coca Cola distribution warehouse, and a furniture showroom/ warehouse.

But, long before all of this, Railroad Avenue was - shockingly- home to a railroad.

The railroad line in this corridor, which straddles the town of Colonie and the town of Guilderland, was a New York Central Railroad project, said Colonie historian Kevin Franklin.

The first portion of

the Railroad Avenue development was likely in 1939, according to town assessor documents. Town maps of the area show portions of the original location of the line of the Mohawk & Hudson River Railroad, the first railroad established between Albany to Schenectady.

"The railroad line is where the famous engine the 'Dewitt Clinton' chugged its way along the tracks at an astounding 12 miles per hour," observed Franklin.

The "Dewitt Clinton" was the first steam locomotive to operate in the state of New York and the fourth built for service

in the United States. Franklin noted that there would have been steam engines in the 1930s that would evolve into diesel-electric engines into the 1940s and 1950s.

Corridor for tech?

There must be something in the water because, generations later, the area around Railroad Avenue is once again at the top of the game for technology of the day. The corridor is practically in the shadow of the State University of New York at Albany and the SUNY Polytechnic Institute's College of Nanoscale Science and Engineering (SUNY Poly).

In the battle between two soft drinks, in this corner of Albany, Coke reigns.

It's partially because of the proximity to these institutions and the Harriman State Office Campus that a transportation and revitalization plan was put together about a decade ago for the Railroad Avenue

area which is mostly zoned for industrial and commercial type uses. The plan also leverages the location with nearby I-87, I-90, and Route 5. The revitalization

plan was put together in collaboration with the town of Guilderland, the county of Albany, the Capital District Transportation Committee, and the town of Colonie for the approximately two miles long avenue which,

generally, follows an eastwest route.

Around the time of this plan, the Railroad Avenue area was identified as a focus area for the expanded Empire Zone program and, under the program, 10 businesses were certified and made about \$8 million in capital investments. At one point, an action program included an item to explore the desirability and feasibility of locating a new rail station in the vicinity of the state campus on the west side of Albany.

A 2010 review determined that there were 625 eastbound and 600 westbound vehicles in the weekday evening peak hour on Railroad Avenue at the intersection with Fuller Road.

What's old is new?

Railroads may or may not be completely in the

R

past for this corridor. There are still some abandoned rails in the median of the avenue with even more tracks not far from the road. And that ever-elusive High-Speed

Colonie's Planning and Economic Development department, along with the county of Albany, said the revitalization plan pre-dates the current leadership. There do not appear to be any current projects on Railroad Avenue from this plan.

But, no matter what happens with the

rail was at one point discussed to potentially go through this corridor as well.

The Railroad Avenue area revitalization plan, which lays out the longrange vision for the corridor for what could happen over the next 20 years, also talks about railroad track rehab and removals. Officials reached in the town of

development of the area, the Colonie town historian is now considering a historic marker indicating the original route of the Mohawk & Hudson Railroad in the area of present day Railroad Avenue. Franklin said there is more to research and discuss, but a sign is a possibility.





The wedge-shaped hat that peaks at the back and slopes down to the brim is a classic style first popular in the waning days of the Victorian Age. People call it by different names. Peaky, poor boy, driver, ivy, newsboy — there are subtle variations that make them different, but look similar enough that people often interchange the names. Steampunk, which dwells within the same turn of the century period, has helped bring it back en vogue. That's why some have taken to calling them "hipster" hats.

"I've worn this style of cap almost every day since high school," said Justin Cook. "I've got a couple different styles. My favorite is the Donegal Touring Cap. But, I have a Hanna, Boston Scally and a Peaky." Albany Symphony's marketing manager said he was introduced to the style in junior high school, after attending a masterclass

with Nick Brignola. The late saxophonist was known to wear a similar style. "It's a sleek, cool and sophisticated

style. You can wear it with jeans or a suit."

The versatile look of the hat allows it to be worn with suits. Cillian Murphy's character on Peaky Blinders is never without his flat cap as he walks the streets of Birmingham, England in his three-piece suit. Just as "Mad Men" influenced the two-piece suit trend in professional attire, the BBC show has influenced several hat makers like Boston Scally Co. in Pennsylvania to market a hat named after the show. It's helped casual wear to lean towards a more mature look by deviating from the youthful baseball cap.

"Regular baseball caps never suited my face," said Jeff Nania, who dons the flat hat when he's not on stage playing his saxophone for Hartley's Encore. "I just like the way it feels and looks. Simple as that. I will say I find it funny when people assume I am of Irish stock when I have no Irish in me.'

Newsboy caps are not exclusive to Irish heritage, though for a long time you were more apt to find a hat in that style only in novelty stores. My first hat came from such a store more than a decade ago. I imagined Mr. Hanna sewing each of the panels together with his head cocked to the side as I handed over my money. Never let the facts get in the way of a good story.

Hats were a ubiquitous article of clothing in the early 20th century. Men and women did not leave the house without a hat; something that wouldn't change until a young Irish Catholic from Massachusetts ran for president in 1960. Hollywood has a way of influencing fashion. I, for one, have always been a hat person and can admit James Garner taught me a thing or two about wearing one in "Murphy's Romance."

The man who played the old Western gambling man Bret Maverick from 1957 to 1962 knows how to wear a cowboy hat. In the 1985 film, in which he earned an Academy Award nomination, Garner shared how a hat can speak for a man: push the brim back off from your face to show that you're approachable, pull it just over your eyes to warn people off, and if you wear it cocked to the side, well, you're a joker.

"My story started when I needed a prop for a music video. At the time I was still searching for a look that I could go with and would fit in with the band's sound," said Chris Brant, of C.K. & The Rising Tide. The Americana rock band is fronted by Curtis Flach, a poet of sorts in the ilk of a young Bob Dylan. "I thought the hat would work perfectly. [I] have never looked back."

Considering the flat hat's long lineage, it's likely to stay around longer than a young man's affinity towards the IPA. You can retire the hipster jokes, because more people like This Strange Paradise's Zane Agnew reach down their family trees to find something tangible from the distant past.

"I just bought my first one in Ireland," said Agnew, while visiting. "My great great great grandfather — I think that's right — John McHugh stowed away on a ship and came to American from Ireland in the late 1800's."







A Brilliant Bit of Color: The Work of Walter Launt Palmer

The Albany Institute of History & Art holds the largest public collection of works by artist Walter Launt Palmer (1854-1932), son of Albany sculptor Erastus Dow Palmer. It includes oil and watercolor paintings, pastels, pencil drawings, a rare painted ceramic cup, as well as letters and photographs. A new exhibition at the Albany Institute offers a visual overview of Palmer's life, travels, and artistic output. The exhibition includes works from all three of Palmer's major series: the early interior views where Palmer lavished attention on the textiles, ceramics, furniture, and wall decorations that filled well-furnished homes; his Venetian scenes that capture the luxuriant colors of the sea, sky, and buildings of this island city; and the snow scenes that continue to enchant viewers with their masterful tonal subtleties. Drawings, photographs, and ceramics accompany the exhibition. A Brilliant Bit of Color: The Work of Walter Launt Palmer is on exhibit from now until Friday, June 7. Ancient Egypt

Egyptologist and Guest Curator Dr. Peter Lacovara has incorporated the research

and scientific discoveries revealed in the GE Presents: The Mystery of the Albany Mummies exhibition into a new exhibition about Ancient Egypt. Visitors to the museum will continue to enjoy the story of the Albany mummies, learn about the history of Ancient Egypt, and see how the intersection of new science, technology, and scholarship changes how we learn. In addition to the story of Mummy Ankhefenmut, theme and topics in the new galleries include: Egyptian History and Civilization; the Nile and the Environment: Crafts and Professions: Food and Drink; Gods and Goddesses; and Preparing for the Afterlife. The Jabbur Gallery now features the story of Albany's 3,000 year old mummy, Ankhefenmut, a priest and sculptor in the Temple of Mut, along with his recently discovered priest's robe, his coffin base from the museum's collection, and his beautiful coffin lid on loan from the Kunsthistoriches Museum, Vienna. The museum's Ptolemaic Period mummy and his coffin are now on view in the Heinrich Medicus Gallery with a selection of over seventy objects highlighting ancient Egyptian daily life, afterlife, and animal mummies. Also included are a timeline and a slide presentation highlighting the trip the Albany Mummies took to Albany Medical Center for x-rays and CT scans, which revealed new information about the age, gender, and occupation of these mummies. Ancient Egypt is an ongoing exhibit. Albany Institute of History and Art is located at 125 Washington Ave., Albany.

"a small fort, which our people call Fort Orange"

Fort Orange was the first permanent Dutch settlement in New Netherland, built as a trading post by the West India Company in 1624 at the location of present-day Albany along the Hudson River. in the development of New Netherland changed—from a point of contact and trade between Native Americans and Europeans, to an enclosure with dwellings and private enterprises, and finally an abandoned space consumed by the development of Albany. Centuries later, Fort Orange on the surface had long disappeared. But in a six-month period in 1970 and 1971-just ahead of Interstate 787 construction-a small archaeology team from the State Historic Trust (predecessor to the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation. or OPRHP), headed by Paul Huey and composed mostly of volunteers, made remarkable discoveries about life in the Dutch colony at Fort Orange. In 2016, a collection of 36,000 artifacts from Fort Orange was transferred from OPRHP to the New York State Museum. This exhibition examines the momentous discovery of Fort Orange and the lasting impact of events occurring there 400 years ago that shaped the character of the region, New York State, and the nation. The exhibition title is a quote taken from The New World by Johannes De Laet, a director of the Dutch West India Company, recorded in 1625. Select artifacts, film footage from the excavation, and four decades of historical and archaeological research are highlighted-including renderings of the fort by Historical Artist Len Tantillo. Dutch ceramics on loan from the Albany Institute of History & Art help bring life to the story. This exhibition is supported as part of the Dutch Culture USA program by the Consulate General of the Netherlands in New York and in partnership with Historic Albany Foundation. Special thanks to the New York State Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation for their support in promoting understanding of New York

Enterprising Waters: New York's Erie Canal (Phase Two)

The Erie Canal directed the course of

New York and American history. When it opened in 1825, this "boldest and biggest American engineering project of its century" unlocked the Western interior for trade and settlement. Boomtowns sprang up along the canal's path and New York City, with its deep harbor connecting to the Hudson River, grew to be the nation's most powerful center of international trade. One of the largest public works projects in American history, the Erie Canal inspired a nation-wide transportation revolution. Thousands of people poured into New York to work on or along the canal, or just to pass through. Though the canal would eventually be superseded by the railroad, a heady mixture of innovation and determination, and the industrious seeking and creation of wealth, was cemented in the American character. In honor of the Bicentennial of the Erie Canal's construction, New York State's Office of Cultural Education will present this rich story with the first phase of Enterprising Waters: New York's Erie Canal at the New York State Museum. In collaboration with organizations on the canal corridor and across the state, the State Museum will tell the Erie Canal's story with unique objects, documents, and images. Dominating the exhibition space is a gigantic windlass—a pulley mechanism that easily lifted and lowered heavy cargo from both sides of a warehouse with only one or two men. From 1831 through 1866, this windlass operated in the H. G. Root and Company Warehouse in the Village of Mohawk on the Erie Canal. The owners of the warehouse, Humphrey G. and Elias Root, also ran a general store and other small businesses along the canal. Phase Two of Enterprising Waters continues the story of the Erie Canal with components on the Canal's growth, politics, industries, social reform, and the Canal legacy. New York State Museum Cultural Education Center is located at 222 Madison Ave.. Albany.

The Hudson River School: Landscape Paintings from the Albany Institute

The Albany Institute holds a large and important collection of nineteenth-century American landscape paintings, works often associated with the term "Hudson River School." They number more than ninety paintings and range in dimension from large wall-sized canvases to small business card-sized oil sketches on paper. In celebration of New York State History Month and in commemoration of the 101st anniversary of women's suffrage in New York State, the Museum is proud to display a model of a statue honoring Elizabeth Cady Stanton and Susan B. Anthony. The statue will be unveiled in New York City's Central Park in 2020—the first statue in the park to honor a woman. In 2013, longtime women's rights activists Pam Flam and Coline Jenkins formed the Statue Fund to create the first statue in Central Park that both honors and depicts real women. The statue will be on display at the State Museum in the West Hall Corridor through Sunday, April 26. New York State Museum Cultural Education Center is located at 222 Madison Ave., Albany. The Hudson River School is an ongoing exhibit. Albany Institute of History and Art is located at 125 Washington Ave., Albany.

The Wants' 'Container'


Try not to smile while bobbing your head

ubbling up on the Brooklyn DIY underground scene for the past three years with regular gigs at Bushwick's Alphaville, The Wants is set to release its debut album, "Container" on March 13 with Council Records. Madison Velding-VanDam (vocals/guitar/synth), Jason Gates (drums/electronics), and Heather Elle (vocals./ bass/synth) put their years of experience together to good use on a solid debut that has all the earmarks of a veteran band hitting their stride.

Perhaps it would be deemed uncool to flash a broad smile while bobbina your head to these tunes, but it's tough not to while thinking about the band recording in its all-tooappropriate studio space: a repurposed shipping container sitting in the middle of a dumpling factory parking lot in Brooklyn.



When the two concepts blend into one, the album hits

on all cylinders. "The Motor" hints at this potential in the first half, but the late run of "Clearly a Crisis," "Nuclear Party," and "Hydra" shine brightest. A Boogie drops 'Artist 2'

A Boogie wit da Hoodie doubles down, for better or worse on follow-up to 'Artist'

'hen A Boogie wit da Hoodie announced he was set to release his third studio album, his fans were jubilant. It had been over a year since anyone last heard from the Bronx native and in the age of microwaveable music, there was a yearning to hear what new melodies the "Just Like Me" rapper had cooked up. While leaked records delayed the album towards its Valentine's Day release, it all built up an anticipation for what was to come.

Coming into the rap game, A Boogie presented himself as a rapper who would occasionally try his hand at singing. On 'Artist 2.0,' he doubles down on the latter, pushing his own personal boundaries and blurring the lines on what his official title should really be.

At face value, this sequel to his 2016 breakout mixtape "Artist" gives his fans exactly what they asked for. The man known for his melodic chants and passionate crooning about his love life reverted back to what he knows best and then some. Although recognized as a rapper, that takes a backseat in this latest effort. A boogie never goes more than a few bars in any of the records before his singing takes precedence, exemplified in the emotional ballad "Good Girls Gone Bad," where he wails about a woman who's changed as a result of his inconsistencies.



What it lacks for in actual rapping, the album more than makes up for in its infectious choruses. "Right Back," "Mood Swings," "Me and My Guitar," and "DTB 4 Life" are all records that have the propensity to become a mainstay in any playlist. While he doesn't rap as much as some might have wanted on the album, his guest-features all brought their "A" game. Verses from Dababy, Young Thug, Gunna and Roddy Rich do a good job of balancing out the croon-heavy album, with A Boogie and Roddy Rich's chemistry being one of the project's highlights.

Coming into the rap game, A Boogie presented himself as a rapper who would occasionally try his hand at singing. On Artist 2.0, he doubles down on the latter, pushing his own personal boundaries and blurring the lines on what his official title should really be. While the album is enjoyable, it doesn't always feel like it's A Boogie at his best and it seems like, to A Boogie, "artist" means less rapping, which inherently is not the case.


