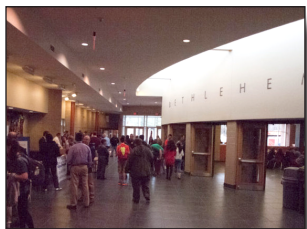

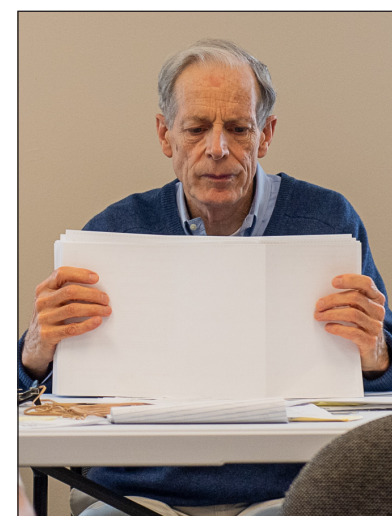

Firecracker story was fake

County corrections officer allegedly lied about lit firecracker thrown into family home

NEW SCOTLAND — A 30-year-old county corrections officer was arrested on Wednesday, July 1 for falsely reporting someone threw a lit firework into his home.

According to Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple, the firework was lit by a family member of the New Scotland household and no outside person was involved.

Ryan Lawson called authorities on Saturday July 27 to report someone had opened the door of his Crow Ridge Road home and threw a lit firework in as he, his wife and

his 4-year-old daughter were sitting on the couch watching TV. The firework lit an area rug on fire, he reported, which he and his wife extinguished with a pillow.

Lawson was charged with the misdemeanor of falsely reporting an incident and issued an appearance ticket in New Scotland Court. His job status is not clear at this time.

Residents report stolen items from parked cars

SLINGERLANDS — The Bethlehem Police Department is investigating a string of larcenies that

occurred at Deer Run Apartments in the early morning hours of Saturday, June 27.

The person or people absconded with various items from unlocked cars. Loose change, wallets, phone chargers, hand sanitizer and tools were taken, according to one resident. One car reportedly showed evidence of a person attempting to rip out the console from inside.

Deer Run Apartments sits at the intersection of Kenwood Avenue and the Cherry Avenue Extension in Slingerlands. Behind the complex runs the Albany County rail trail. An access road was recently installed along the bridge that carries motorists above the trail. Residents believe there may be a connection.

DELMAR — Bethlehem Police continue to investigate a car/bicycle crash on Feura Bush Road in the area of Sudbury Road on Sunday, July 5, at 5:53 p.m.

Police said Margaret Mullaney, 19, of Feura Bush, was driving her 2005 Honda westbound on Feura Bush Road when she and a bicyclist sideswiped one another. Gary Fish, 60, of Delmar was also traveling west on the sidewalk. A fallen tree lying across the sidewalk prompted him to peddle onto the roadway.

As Fish rode his bicycle on the roadway, police said Mullaney was unable to avoid him due to on-coming traffic.

Fish was transported to Albany Medical Center with non-life threatening internal injuries.

NOTICE OF SUBMISSION OF JOINT APPLICATION FOR PERMIT, INCLUDING REQUEST FOR ISSUANCE OF WATER QUALITY CERTIFICATION

Hecate Energy Albany 1 LLC and Hecate Energy Albany 2 LLC (“Hecate Albany”) are seeking authority from the New York State Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (the “Siting Board”) to construct a 40-megawatt (“MW”) solar photovoltaic electric generating facility (the “Facility”) in the Town of Coeymans, Albany County, New York, under Article 10 of the New York State Public Service Law (“PSL”). Hecate Albany previously submitted its Article 10 Application seeking a Certificate of Environmental Compatibility and Public Need from the Siting Board on June 7, 2019. Pursuant to 16 NYCRR § 1000.8, Hecate Albany hereby provides notice that, on or about July 13, 2020, it intends to file its Request for Issuance of a Water Quality Certification in connection with the Joint Application for Permit for wetlands and related permits that is being filed with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers.

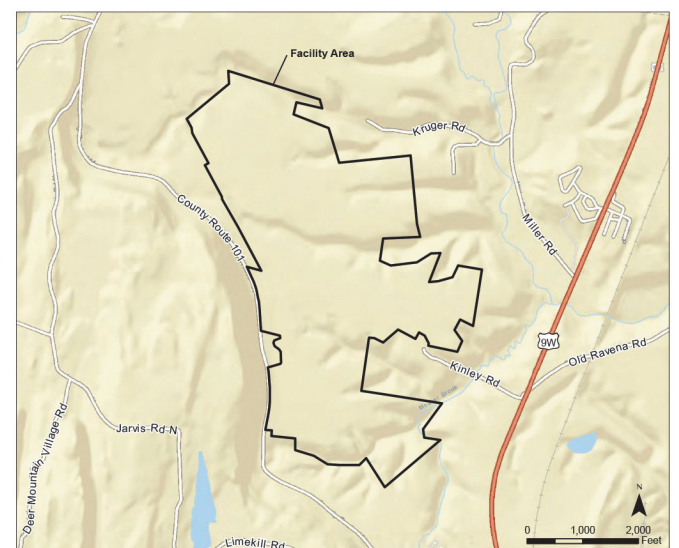
The Joint Application covers the permits/approvals required to construct and/or operate the Facility under Section 404 of the Clean Water Act that would be issued by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers. In connection therewith, Hecate Albany is requesting that the Section 401 Water Quality Certification be issued by the Siting Board. The Joint Application includes, among other things, a description of the Facility and its components and construction, an analysis of the environmental setting of the Facility, results from analyses conducted to assess potential impacts to aquatic resources and jurisdictional waters (e.g., wetlands and streams), and measures that will be implemented to avoid, minimize, and mitigate environmental impacts to the maximum extent practicable. As shown in the Joint Application, and previously shown in Hecate Albany’s Article 10 Application, construction and operation of the Facility will not result adverse impacts to water resources. The Joint Application also addresses compliance with the Endangered Species Act and the Historic Preservation Act.

All public documents filed in this proceeding, including the Joint Application and Request for Issuance of the Section 401 Water Quality Certification, may be viewed at the DPS website located at www.dps.ny.gov by clicking “Search” on the homepage and then entering Case 17-F-0617 in “Search by Case Number.”

BOE commissioner under fire

Clyne refuses to wear mask; Joyce calls him out

ALBANY — A powerful Democratic politician is pushing for a new elections commissioner because of his refusal to wear a mask during an absentee ballot recount.

Matthew Clyne, the party's commissioner since 2008, was the only person out of about a dozen in the room counting ballots at the county Board of Elections not wearing a mask to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

Clyne was not wearing a mask when the count of thousands of absentee ballots began on Tuesday, June 30. On Wednesday, Chairman of the Albany County Legislature Andrew Joyce, in a tweet, said Clyne "laughed" when asked about the lack of a facemask.

"So yea, we're going to be looking for a new Democratic commissioner. Interested parties should submit their resume," he wrote.

County Executive Dan McCoy, who has been hounding people to wear masks and abide by other

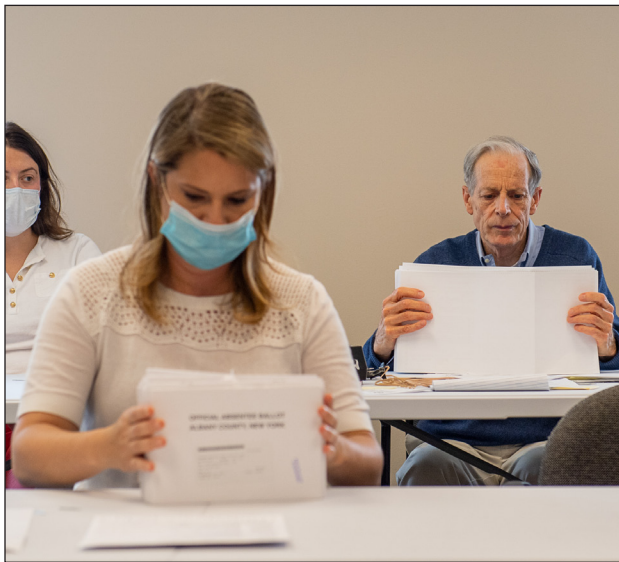
protocols since mid-March to prevent the spread of COVID-19 said Clyne probably should be wearing a mask.

"Either he is being ignorant to the people around him and doesn't care or he is scared to have a mask on," McCoy said during one of his press briefings.

He said as the county brings back employees, there are social distance provisions so anyone at his or her desk does not have to wear a mask, but they are required to wear them if they move about an office building.

Clyne was in a common room with half a dozen tables set up working alongside other BOE employees. At times he was six feet away, but others he was not.

Clyne's two-year term ends at the end of the year. According to Albany County Democratic Party Chairman Jack Flynn said he will appoint a committee to accept and screen resumes before making recommendations to the full county committee. The committee will then make a nomination to the county

Legislature to formally appoint a commissioner.

He said the process is the same every four years and should Clyne want another term, his name would be included in the mix.

"It's a very good job. Matt has been a commissioner since 2008 and I'm sure the party wants to see a change," Flynn said.

Flynn said he would post information about the job in the newspapers and on social media to

open up the process to all interested and hopes the committee will make a recommendation to the party in time for its organizational meeting on Sept. 20.

It is not the first time Clyne has come under fire. In 2016, when the committee met to recommend Clyne for another term Carolyn McLaughlin was chair. After Clyne passed that hurdle and before the Legislature voted to formally confirm him to

the \$90,000-plus a year job, McLaughlin was ousted and Flynn took over as chair.

Flynn, who was working at the BOE, tried to get the Legislature to table his nomination and wanted to reconvene another committee to re-interview candidates

for commissioner. Clyne, instead of interviewing again, filed a lawsuit and he was appointed to another term.

Clyne fired Flynn, but Flynn was quickly hired by Albany County Sheriff Craig Apple for about the same salary of \$48,500.

COVID shuts eateries

Delmonico's, Philly Bar both closed

ALBANY COUNTY — New York state was the epicenter of the COVID-19 pandemic for more than two months, and with the number of infections rising in state's across the country, enforcing the protocols put in place to bring the outbreak under control here are paramount.

The Albany County Department of Health temporarily shut down two Colonie restaurants after three employees at the Philly Bar and Lounge on Watervliet Shaker Road and three at Delmonico's Italian Steakhouse on Central Avenue tested positive for the virus. The state Health Department had staff at each restaurant late last week to test other employees and five more tested positive between the two staffs.

Both restaurants have cooperated fully, said Mary Rozak, a spokeswoman for County Executive Dan McCoy.

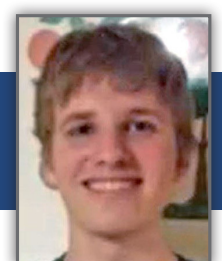

A sign on the Delmonico's driveway, where they had been doing curbside pickup, said the restaurant would re-open on Monday, July 6. A sign on the Philly marque said it would open on Tuesday, July 7.

Philly, in a statement on Facebook, said the entire facility will be thoroughly sanitized and it will hand over the master

schedule of employees to the Department of Health to publicize if it would help with contact tracing. The statement said: "No employee was ever working in our building while with symptoms."

"That is not something that we will stand for. We do check employee temps on site with a laser thermometer," it said. "We want you and your

families to be healthy just as we want ours to be. We thought we were doing pretty well, but we can do better."

Delmonico's, in a statement, said it would sanitize its restaurant and had already had been doing employee temperature checks, mandating masks and had accommodations for social distancing in place.

"We will continue working with the Albany County Department of Health and we will not reopen until we are

confident that our team and guests will be in a safe and health atmosphere," the restaurant said in a statement.

Meanwhile, the State Liquor Authority suspended the liquor license of two other Capital District establishments for selling tickets to Fourth of July events in violation of the protocols mandated by Gov. Andrew Cuomo.

Liberty Farms in Rensselaer County and Lebanon Valley Speedway would have violated the 50-person density limit

at their respective events and as such the SLA, which was recently given the authority to suspend licenses for establishments not following the proper protocols, unilaterally suspended their licenses.

Restaurants in the eight-county Capital District have been doing takeout via delivery and curb side pickup since the beginning of the pandemic and were, in a surprise change of plans, allowed to serve meals in-house at the beginning of June, some two weeks before it was originally scheduled

provided social distancing could be maintained. Many restaurants were utilizing sidewalks and parking lots and some, like Delmonico's, put up large tents to help the customer flow and still maintain the appropriate social distance between tables.

In-house dining in New York City was supposed to begin when that region hit phase three last week but that plan was put on hold to avoid another outbreak of COVID-19 in the hardest hit city in the U.S.

MeToo account prompts BCSD to act

DELMAR — On Monday, June 29, an Instagram account was started called @MeTooBethlehem. The account was created for Bethlehem residents, students, and community members to submit stories of sexual assault or harassment. Within the first 48 hours, the account received over 300 stories.

"We just hope that by creating this outlet that people have a place where they can feel safe and trust us," said Morgan Mulligan, one of the creators of the account and a 2020 BC graduate. The account aims to provide a safe space for people to share their stories.

"We aim to create a comfortable and supporting atmosphere to foster attention and conversation about the ongoing rape culture in Bethlehem,"

reads the first post on the account. This culture is something that Mulligan says is obvious to students, but not the administration. "I think it is clear to a lot of the students, but I don't think the district, teachers, or even parents have any idea of how severe it was," she said.

Mulligan said she started the account after a group of male students made a bracket with some of the girls from her grade. "A group of us who were involved at the time of the bracket all agreed that it wasn't an isolated incident in Bethlehem."

There was also an incident at Bethlehem with a "stock market game." The game gave female students a stock value based on appearance. In 2018, there was a "hot or not" list of both male and female students. Mulligan believes that to combat this, more needs to be done.

"We need to be more aware and start teaching from a young age how to prevent sexual assault. Less on the side of how not to be sexually assaulted, but how not to sexually assault someone," Mulligan said.

The overwhelming response and number of submissions to the account prompted Bethlehem School District to respond on Tuesday, the day after the account was created. "These allegations are disturbing and heartbreaking, and in some cases, may be criminal," Bethlehem Central School District superintendent Jody Monroe said in a statement. Monroe said she assembled the team of counselors at school and they are available to talk to any BC student who has knowledge of these incidents.

Monroe released a statement on Wednesday as well. "We are a traumatized

community in many ways and we can have no tolerance for inequality or inequity based on race, color, religion, gender, gender expression, disability, or sexual orientation. And we will not stand for sexual harassment or for the objectification of women and girls, or of any student or staff member at Bethlehem." Moving forward, Monroe said that the district will be scheduling focus Also, on Wednesday, Bethlehem Police released a statement about the Instagram account. "Since learning of this blog account, the Bethlehem Police Department has been in close contact with the Bethlehem Central School District, and our police school resource officers are prepared to assist in any manner possible." The statement also said Bethlehem police is in contact with the Albany

County District Attorney's Office.

Albany County Executive Daniel McCoy released a statement of his own the same day, stating, "No one should ever be victimized in this way, but those who are will always have a champion at our Albany County Crime Victim and Sexual Violence Center."

The school district, Bethlehem police, and McCoy have all encouraged victims to come forward and explore the resources that they each offer, ranging from counseling to prosecution.

For Mulligan, she hopes that there is a real change coming to Bethlehem. While her account has helped many to come forward, one teacher at Bethlehem went the extra mile.

Jessica Westervelt, a teacher at the high school,

reached out to her students via email. "I am here for anyone who needs to talk or share," the email said. She said that reading the posts on the account broke her heart.

"It was heartbreaking just to see they don't feel like school is a safe place for them," Westervelt said. This feeling prompted her to reach out to her students and include her personal email in the message. "That's part of the job that is not in the job description," she said in reference to helping students emotionally.

Mulligan thanks those who have shared their stories and those who have not come forward, too. "It means a lot that they are doing the selfless thing to hopefully benefit more people than just themselves."

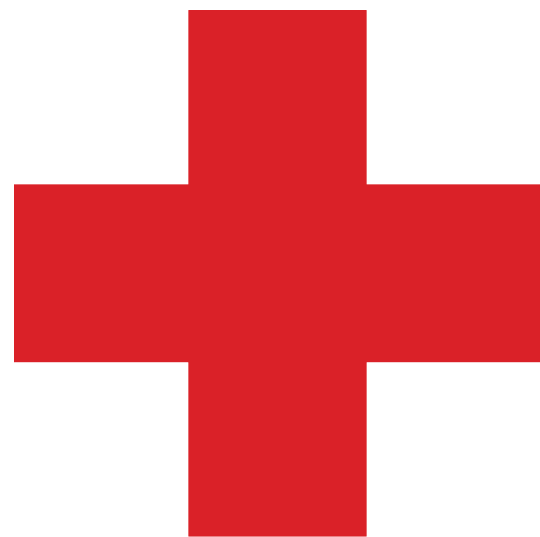

National Grid: Substation is needed

Utility company will return before Bethlehem ZBA addressing need to increase energy capacity to town's aging infrastructure

DELMAR — National Grid likened the situation to a person in need of a pacemaker, and that the operation was needed a decade ago.

"You have a patient walk in with a heart arrhythmia, and it needs to be addressed," said Andrew Leja, an attorney from Barclay Damon representing the London-based utility company. In his analogy, he said National Grid has placed all the bandages it can to maintain the town's aging infrastructure. The company continues its argument for an oft-proposed \$15 million substation National Grid plans to build near Eagle Elementary.

"Ultimately, the need for

the pacemaker remains," said Leja. "And, you don't place the pacemaker in the foot, knee, or even the abdomen. You place it closest to where it's actually going to do the work."

National Grid first proposed the Van Dyke Road substation to the zoning board in 2014. Because the land is not zoned for a substation, the energy company's plan needs to first obtain a use variance.

The proposal has since gone back and forth with some pauses as National Grid addressed resident concerns. Many of those concerns centered on the introduction of electromagnetic fields at close proximity to Eagle Elementary, which stands less than half a mile away from the proposed site.

In 2015, eight residents spoke against construction of the substation proposed for that location and an Eagle Elementary student submitted a petition with 105 signatures opposing it. In addition, the board received 11 emails in opposition, three that conveyed concern, and just one in favor of the project.

National Grid tried to dispel those concerns in 2018. A company spokesperson had said substations are designed to emit "zero EMF" at the property line. The town's engineering consultant supported the energy's claim that a new substation would address the energy needs of a growing Slingerlands community and that it fit into the town's growth projections.

the town's engineering consultant, had also reviewed National Grid's assessment of 61 potential locations for a new substation. The utility company had narrowed the number of sites down based on the location's proximity to a transmission line, and to the feeders providing energy along the Delaware Avenue corridor and beyond. It also agreed with the utility company's assessment of those locations.

If the Van Dyke proposal goes forward, National Grid plans to close two aging substations. The Delmar substation that abuts the Albany County Rail Trail off Adams Street and the Juniper substation north of Elm Avenue Park will each be dismantled in the plan.

The zoning board is to host another public hearing on the topic on Wednesday, July 15.

Battle of two rallies

Both movements organized congruent rallies on the banner day of the holiday weekend. Back the Blue supporters gathered around the clock with several American flags flapping in the summer breeze. Less than a quarter mile away, a Black Lives Matter rally was meant to gather around Bethlehem Town Hall.

At the afternoon's

height, roughly 600 people representing both sides stood along the intersection of Delaware and Kenwood avenues, screaming and chanting. It was a scenario the Bethlehem Police Department was initially concerned with, prompting the police agency to initiate the services of the Albany County Sheriffs and New York State Police.

Pockets of arguments



ignited throughout the day as individuals from each side crossed the street to faceoff against the opposition. It ultimately painted a mosaic of signs declaring the support for, and the defunding of, police agencies.

Among the arguments, brief altercations occurred. One protestor had his sign

ripped out of his hands and torn. Another person was allegedly hit with a sign. A woman on a bullhorn leading the Black Lives Matter movement claimed her life was threatened by a Back the Blue supporter. The incidents appeared to be quelled by the police and no arrests were made.

The back-and-forth

continued for two hours, highlighted by motorcyclists on Harley Davidsons driving past to drown out the voices of Black Lives Matter supporters. Each side traded barbs across the street, with one side shouting "I can't breathe," with the other responding, "Yes, you can." Other trade offs included "9-1-1" to "Defund the police," and "Get a job" to "Go home, racists."

By 2 p.m., people who gathered at the town hall rally walked to the Four Corners to envelop the Back the Blue supporters huddled around the clock. There was also the promise of more arriving from another rally in Schenectady. Back the Blue demonstrators dissipated by that time, allowing the other side to gather underneath the town clock. Those who had remained, appeared to stay to engage in conversation over their issues.

Bridging the gap in social distancing

Spinney Group focused on staying social with residents, community

DELMAR — In a time of minimized social interaction, the Spinney Group has found a way to bring community to the doorsteps of their residents.

Today, the Spinney Group said they are optimistic about the future. With the help of their community and the wider community in Bethlehem, this local business has been able to begin to bounce back from the pandemic.

Memories of a Charlie Sanders

We moved to Brockley Drive in Delmar in 1948. This is across Delaware Avenue from the present high school. At the time it was a new 10-house development, the last street on public water supply. Further west, behind Meyers' funeral home, was a 90-acre sheep field — with sheep in it.

Meyers occupies what was the farm house associated with the sheep field. The large, aged barn still stood by the farmhouse. Stable inside in the gloom was "Black Beauty," an aged black Shetland pony. My next door neighbor, Ruthie, about 12 years old, took care of the daily needs

of the pony for the city dwelling owner. She was also allowed to hitch the pony to the buggy and take us younger kids for a ride.

The poor old creature usually drew us across the meadows where the high school and bus garage stand today. But sometimes we drove on the streets and went in other directions. To the Slingerlands Elementary School for example. This was a long round-about drive because Brockley Drive was not yet cut through the woods to Orchard Avenue. But we did it, and that might mean a trip to Charlie Sander's store at The Tool Gate. The picture above shows a gas pump. I do not recall ever seeing a car gas

up there. However, it was certainly a place to visit if you wanted candy, soda or smokes.

Charlie lived in the fancy, big Victorian seen in the background of the image. Years later, this was town down. I have always felt willfully, by a new owner with no appreciation for the past. Given the many Victorian homes now proudly occupied by Slingerlands residents, I felt this philistine was guilty of a crime against humanity, by such willful destruction.

Once Charlie allowed Ruthie to hitch up his own pony to his own buggy, as we kids joy-rode to the Slingerlands elementary School playing fields and

had a fun time. It was a nice thing for Charlie to do and I remember him fondly for doing so. Given today's emphasis on legal liability, I guess I grew up in a kinder, gentler era.

Across New Scotland Road from Charlie's was the Toll Gate itself. This building shared the Post Office, today Trustco Bank and of court Art Zautner's restaurant. Which incidentally has not changed its décor one bit since 1950. Perhaps that restaurant should be restored as an historic site.

Pre-teen kids of my era seldom had enough money for an ice cream cone in their pockets. But there was one thing we could usually

buy. I well remember one hot summer day when we parked out biesk near the door and went into the blessed air conditioned shade, clubbing together our pennies to buy — "daiquiris."

These were not the rum and fruit drinks you are thinking of. For one thing, we were 12 years old, under-aged. No, they were a green, cold, wet, sweet relief from summer's sunny assault. Best of all, a small cocktail glass cost just 3 cents.

As I said, I guess I grew up in a kinder gentler era.

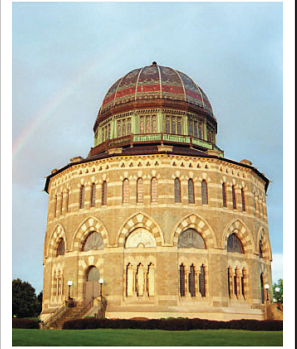

COVID closes Wolff's

Local eatery chain cites pandemic, public behavior as reasons to close

A few area restaurants are closing their doors just weeks after the governor's office gave the OK to open indoor dining rooms.

Philly Bar and Lounge in Latham and Delmonico's in Colonie closed their doors after employees tested positive for novel coronavirus. The news from those eateries was shared by Albany County Executive Dan McCoy during his daily address last week.

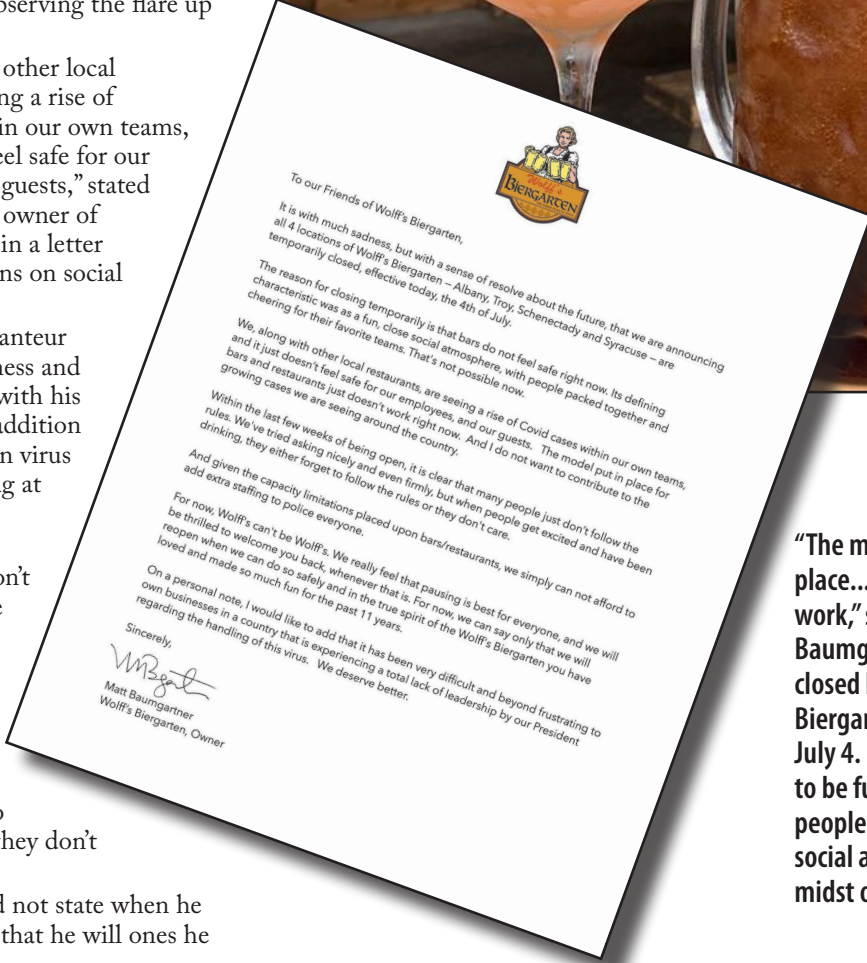
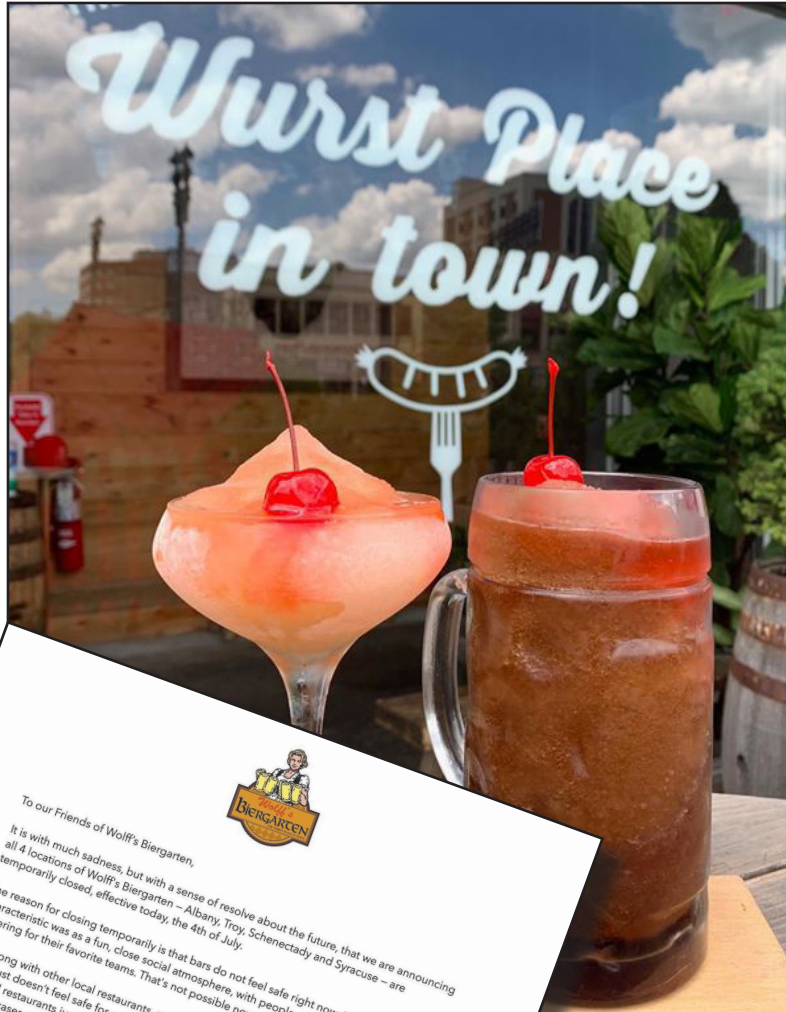
On Saturday, the owner of Wolff's Biergarten closed the doors to all four of its locations after observing the flare up in cases.

"We, along with other local restaurants, are seeing a rise of COVID cases within our own teams, and it just doesn't feel safe for our employees, and our guests," stated Matt Baumgartner, owner of Wolff's Biergarten, in a letter he released to patrons on social media.

The local restaurateur expressed both sadness and a "sense of resolve" with his announcement. In addition to observing a rise in virus cases, he was looking at his patrons.

"It is clear that many people just don't follow the rules," he said. "We've tried asking nicely and even firmly, but when people get excited and have been drinking, they either forget to follow the rules or they don't care."

Baumgartner did not state when he would reopen, only that he will ones he can "do so safely."



"The model put in place... just doesn't work," stated Matt Baumgartner, who closed his Wolff's Biergarten locations on July 4. Bars are supposed to be fun, he said, and people can't have a close, social atmosphere in the midst of a pandemic.

The ARE Project, now a global organization, has its roots right here in Albany with a recent Shaker High School alumna.

“Our main goal is to make continuously educating ourselves feasible through approachable content,” co-lead founder Hannah Wang, a 2020 Shaker High School graduate, said. Wang added because participants are located in different countries, group members do not assume anyone’s knowledge of anti-Blackness. Along with a palatable way to digest material many would deem hard to approach, the ARE Project has people translating content into different languages.

The group’s other objectives include giving participants tools to have educated discussions, provide materials to examine anti-Blackness within members’ communities and showing participants how to use their knowledge later in life when they may be in

positions of power.

At just under a month old, the ARE Project has amassed almost 500 members in 17 countries with over 115 organizers. All are students of the digital age; over 90 percent of the group found out about its existence through Instagram. The ARE Project hopes to aggregate resources on racism from those qualified to teach on it and amplify Black voices through its digital meetings.

The ARE Project chooses its monthly content based on a theme. From there, a book, television show episode, movie, podcast episode, article and poem collection is chosen. Wang said the different medias are offered to cater to all types of learners; each participant only picks one piece of content to analyze, as more people are able to dedicate time to one part of the picture. After digesting the material, group members meet on one of four hour-long meetings a month (each accommodating different

time zones) to discuss the works. The first 10 minutes of the meetings are dedicated to establishing a baseline of everyone’s cultural norms around the topic. From there, members break off into their respective content choices to analyze. For the last 20 minutes, group members converge to discuss the theme as a whole. Most content is from Black creators.

“Our project is a testament to the power of social media and our generation’s willingness to learn and fight for positive change, Wang said. “Everyone is contributing in their own ways, whether it be using their training in discussion moderating, 3D-printing pins to fundraise, or sharing their premium Zoom account with us. We have over 50 groups working on everything from maintaining our Instagram to developing community guidelines.”

From Media to Movement

The ARE Project started as an idea for a book club run by Sasha Ronaghi, a

recent high school graduate in Southern California. Ronaghi had posted on her Instagram story about starting a book club to amplify Black voices. “The whole purpose of using [Instagram] is that it is sustainable and approachable,” Ronaghi said.

It certainly was approachable for Wang, who saw Ronaghi’s Instagram and was inspired to repost it to her New York followers. From there, it was reposted on several other accounts including those of international students. Today, Wang and Ronaghi run the ARE Project’s meetings and have created a worldwide campaign started with the simple idea of a book club.

Anastasia Farronan also tirelessly helps the group in its early stages to create a website. Farronan had never designed or created a website before the ARE Project, but taught herself web design and continues to maintain the impressive website. Her hard work is a testament to the character of the group, who all recognize the need to learn new skills in order to get their message out.

Education and reforming how school curricula address race and issues of racial injustice are some of the main purposes of the ARE Project. However, Ronaghi, a rising college freshman, wanted to make sure the education did not stop at social media. “Social media is helpful with spreading the message, but it can almost feel like a trend or a fad.” The group now provides something social media posts do not offer: discussions.

The ARE Project aims to bring people together from all backgrounds to share their own experiences and learn from others. According to the ARE Project’s website, “We are not hoping to learn about the Black experience from our peers, but with our peers because it would provide different perspectives and experiences.” These discussions are what several members have said they learned the most from.

Wang said these discussions change participants’ perspectives after educating themselves and listening to others.

‘Pray the Racism Away’

Discussions are a large reason why Amari Parker joined the ARE Project. She said as a Black woman, she wanted to join difficult conversations and develop skills to use in everyday


life. Parker also expressed her concerns about social media. She said, “It doesn’t provide much of a space for discussion, but this group provides learning, discussion, and educating yourselves on implicit biases.”

The ARE Project’s reach goes beyond the blue states of New York and California. Parker is from Georgia and Luke Akhalaya is from Indiana. Both are current high


school students who say even today, they can easily identify racism in their communities.


Parker talked about visiting plantations during school trips in Georgia and feeling like she did not get the full picture in school. Akhalaya spoke of history classes where his white classmates made anti-Semitic jokes and “goofed off” during slavery readings.

The ARE Project

“The teacher just rolled his eyes,” Akhalaya said. He joined the ARE Project to gain new perspectives and hear viewpoints from outside of his hometown.

Parker attends a Catholic School in Georgia. After the death of George Floyd, her school sent out a letter condemning the violence and urging students to pray. Parker said this letter was not what she was hoping for. “I wanted to see they were taking action,” she said.

Instead, Parker has been taking action of her own. She is responsible for selecting the films for the ARE Project’s screenings and helps to participate in the group’s activism channel. This channel is used to set up calls and emails to local legislators near the participants. “There’s so many of us, it makes them realize they need to do something,” Parker said.

Akhalaya echoed Parker’s thoughts, saying, “We have to put actions behind our words.” Akhalaya believes the best way to make a change is through voting; however, he is under 18 and, therefore,

ineligible to do.

For Parker, this group has also been a way to learn from her role models. While doing a research paper for school on systemic racism, she found a name that kept coming up: Courtney Cogburn, Ph.D.

Cogburn is an associate professor at Columbia University and an award-winning researcher. Her research focuses on how racism and discrimination in society can physically affect minorities that ultimately lead to racial differences in diseases. Parker’s eyes lit up with inspiration while talking about Cogburn. Parker wants to become a cardiothoracic surgeon and was thrilled when a member of the group reached out to Cogburn about speaking to the ARE Project. Cogburn is set to speak over Zoom on Monday. Through the ARE Project, Parker has been given the chance to educate herself, her peers and further her passion.

‘What We Didn’t Learn’

“While these

conversations are happening inside our homes, there is still a lot of anti-Blackness in our community,” Maryam Ahmad, another Shaker student, said. “When I was in India, we had a face cream that was advertised to make your skin lighter because lighter is more beautiful in so many people’s minds. There were advertisements everywhere and so many people never really gave it any thought.” On June 26, Unilever announced in a statement its controversial face cream, “Fair & Lovely,” popular in India and other South Asian countries, would be renamed. “We [recognize] that the use of the words ‘fair’, ‘white’ and ‘light’ suggest a singular ideal of beauty that we don’t think is right, and we want to address this,” Unilever’s president of beauty and personal care, Sunny Jain, said in the company’s statement. “The evolution to a more inclusive vision of beauty that celebrates and cares for all skin tones, and no longer uses the words ‘white/whitening’, ‘light/lightening’ or ‘fair/fairness’, will be a policy for all Unilever’s beauty [and] personal care brands,” Jain concluded.

Priti Rangnekar, a teen from San Jose, California, has worked behind the scenes since the ARE

Project’s conception. A friend of Ronaghi’s and no stranger to activism, she quickly joined to figure out how to market the group. For her, this group is a welcome change.

“My school is very much Asian and white,” she explained. “The topic of anti-Blackness only really came up in what I would call a ‘graded discussion,’ where it would come up in class for an assignment and it wouldn’t go much further than that.”

As a member of the Indian community, Rangnekar testified to the mindset in her school; you focus on your academics and your own life. If it doesn’t affect you, “you don’t get dragged into it.”

Ahmad agreed. Another member of the Indian community, she has seen first hand how racism influences her world. She considers herself lucky enough to have grown up around people who categorically condemned racism from the get-go.

A lightbulb went off when Ahmad realized how much of civil rights today are to the credit of the Black community. Rangnekar nodded her head in agreement. It struck both women to see how insulated much of the world is.

Ahmad and Rangnekar agreed that much of the group is about unlearning implicit biases people have. The project helps them seek out content from different creators, particularly from POC, to form an expanded worldview.

“Our book club has substituted what we should have learned in U.S. history,” Ahmad said.

For both, the camaraderie the ARE Project has formed is what keeps them coming back.

“I can see the sustainability in this organization because of how diverse we are,” Rangnekar said. “How we do this is motivating members to put forth the effort for good conversations that can be difficult. Since joining, I have made it a point to seek out content from POC creators and be more conscious of the media I’m digesting.”

Educate To Illuminate

One thing these students have in common is passion. Each expressed desire to see true change in their communities, countries and in our world. “It’s mind-blowing to me how many people care,” said Ronaghi when speaking about how

expansive the group has become.

“Even though it’s the Black Lives Matter Movement, it feels more like a revolution,” said Wang. Akhalaya repeated this sentiment, saying, “I think there is a revolution coming and I think it is long overdue.”

Ahmad spoke of her generation’s want to address systemic racism in society. “It goes to show how much our generation wants to solve this issue once and for all.” Parker spoke of their generation, too, and how social media has become a tool for change. “Social media can be powerful in influencing people, movies, and press.” The group has utilized social media since its founding and continues to do so through Instagram and Facebook.

The group is open to everyone and those who wish to join can sign up through its website or on Instagram. “Seeing things from different perspectives is really important,” Ahmad said. Outside of the group, the students want to encourage the community to educate themselves. “If you are confused on why something is racist, don’t be afraid to ask,” Akhalaya said.

You are what you drink

Signs water may be contaminated

A fresh glass of water can be just the thing to quench your thirst on a hot summer day. Water is vital to sustain life and communities go to great lengths to ensure drinking water is clean. But sometimes water can become contaminated and adversely affect public health.

According to the Water Quality Association, some common waterborne contaminants include aluminum, ammonia, copper, lead, mercury, and uranium. The WQA notes that, while people can become very sick from contaminated water, many people never recognize their water is contaminated until members of their community begin to get sick. Some people suffer from acute effects of contaminated water that appear within hours of consuming a contaminant. In such instances, the WQA notes that the human body can often fight off the contaminants in a similar way that it fights off germs and the person won't have any permanent side effects. However, people with weakened immune systems may become seriously or gravely ill after such exposure. Chronic effects, which include cancer, liver or kidney problems, or reproductive difficulties, result after the



consumption of contaminated water over a period of many years.

Water supplies are routinely inspected and treated in many parts of the world to ensure they're safe for human consumption. However, such measures are not fail-safe. The WQA notes that a human's senses are his or her first diagnostic tool in regard to detecting contaminated water. Though contaminated water is not always detectable to human senses, the following are some signs that may indicate a water supply is contaminated.

Discoloration

The WQA notes that water that is red, orange, yellow, brown, or cloudy may indicate the presence of iron, rust or other contaminants in household plumbing. Tannins from decaying

vegetation and leaves also can contribute to discolored water that appears yellow or has a brownish hue.

Foul smell and taste

Water that smells or tastes like a rotten egg or sulfur may indicate the presence of hydrogen sulfide, which may be a byproduct of a certain type of bacteria present in the water. Bacteria can grow in drains, water heaters, wells, or on the inside of pipes, so a professional inspection may be necessary.

Decaying organic matter in plumbing or the water source can give water a musty, earthy taste.

The WQA notes that chlorine is used to disinfect water to make it safe during the treatment

process. However, the smell and taste of chlorine may indicate the water is unsafe to consume.

Staining

Blue-green water or blue-green stains are likely indicative of the corrosion of copper within household plumbing. Other stains may be yellow, tan, brown, black, orange, or red, and these stains may indicate the presence of other metals in the water. Water treatment providers can help address this issue, which can make water unhealthy to consume and also adversely affect plumbing fixtures.

Contaminated water is not always identifiable to the senses. Homeowners who suspect their water has been contaminated are urged to contact their local water utility.

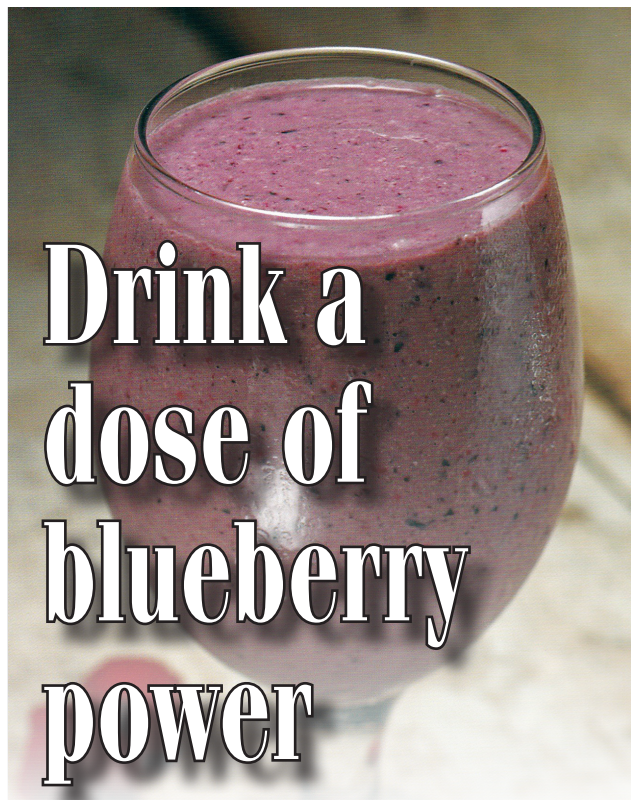
