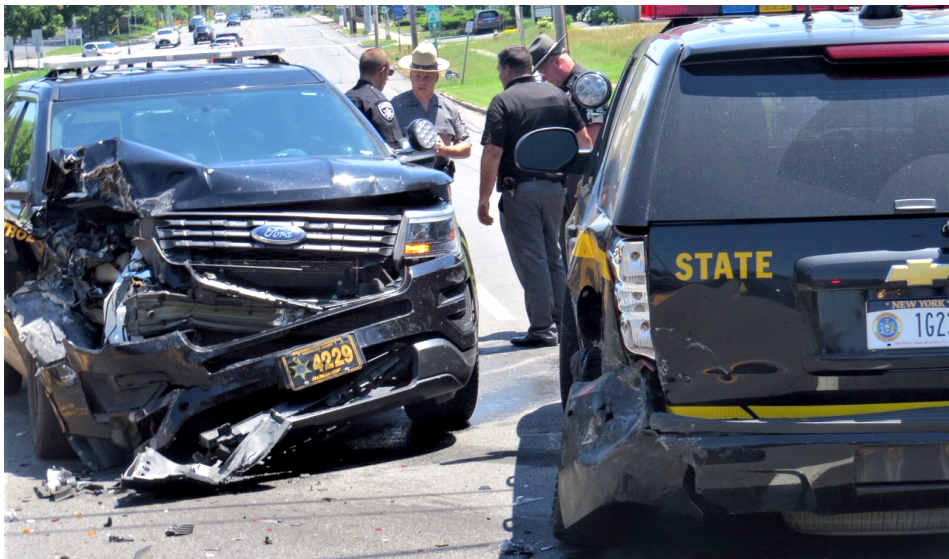

Police nab man for bank heist

Police collide while responding to scene in Guilderland

GUILDERLAND — A Troy man charged with robbing a bank in Brunswick was picked up on the same day as the heist by police in Guilderland on Monday, July 6.

Oscar Rodriguez allegedly robbed the Brunswick Key Bank after showing a weapon to a clerk. He escaped with an undisclosed amount of money only to be

picked up a half hour later.

New York State Police found Rodriguez on Western Avenue in Guilderland. As Rensselaer County Sheriffs responded to the call in Guilderland, one of its vehicles collided with a State Police SUV.

Rodriguez was charged with felony robbery and criminal possession of a weapon. He was arraigned in Brunswick town court.

Tit for tat

Bethlehem police receives exchange of harassment charges from July 4 rallies

DELMAR — At least three incident reports have been filed with Bethlehem police related to the dueling demonstrations on Saturday, July 4 — two of which were filed by and against former Bethlehem Republican Committee Chairman Keith Wiggand.

Bethlehem police confirmed three incident reports were filed since the July 4 demonstrations at Delmar's Four Corners. "As all of these cases are under investigation we cannot release names on anyone involved at this time," said Bethlehem Police Commander Adam Hornick. "As of this time there have been no arrests made as a result of the July 4th events."

Bethlehem police were supported by Albany County Sheriffs and New York State Police to keep order among the more than 600 people who attended. Wiggand had organized the Back the Blue rally to form at the Four Corners while a Black Lives Matter demonstration was planned at town hall less than a quarter mile down the street. Individual conflicts emerged after some demonstrators crossed the street to posture signs in front opposing views.

One incident report filed by resident Matthew

Lauricella claims Wiggand was "hitting me in the face with his sign, verbally harassing me, and also showing his sign in my face."

Lauricella was observed throughout the day holding various signs supporting the Black Lives Matter movement. He stood at the corner held predominantly by Wiggand's Back the Blue rally. Lauricella's first sign appeared to protest the Bethlehem Resident News Facebook page Wiggand maintains. The page, often written from a first-person perspective, reflects support for conservative and Republican initiatives, including Back the Blue. Comments voicing contrasting views are often responded to in kind, leading Wiggand's opponents to accuse him of bullying.

Lauricella emailed several videos to *The Spotlight* showing what appears to be confrontations with Wiggand. In one video, Wiggand stands beside Lauricella, appearing to hold his sign in front of Lauricella's. At one point, Wiggand's sign slaps and rests upon Lauricella's face for several seconds. Another video features a voice of someone calling Wiggand by name just before he appears to jab his sign towards the camera phone, knocking it to the ground.

The following day, a

statement was published on Bethlehem Resident News.

"So, now that I organized a successful rally supporting our police, I have been labeled 'the most racist person in Bethlehem,'" states the unsigned statement. "Shows how viscious [sic] these people are - but I refuse to back down."

"Don't worry folks, I ain't going anywhere. They have just made my flame burn a little brighter."

Wiggand declined to comment on the complaint filed against him, but confirmed he knew about it. He also shared that he had filed a counter-complaint against Lauricella.

Wiggand had previously said his rally was not politically motivated, and that he wanted to show support to local law enforcement. Stephanie Dwyer, the town current Republican Party chairperson, did not show support for the rally.

In a comment highlighted by Bethlehem Resident News, Dwyer pledged full support for local police, but that she refused "to be a part of something that is based on hate, negativity and threats of violence."

Despite the occasional conflict, police were present to quickly quell the tension surrounding the rallies. No arrests were made that day.

"First and foremost, everyone there was treated equally as to ensure their legal and fundamental rights," said Hornick.

neighborhood of Elsmere on Tuesday, July 7. Those calls followed a similar rash in both Old Delmar and Glenmont. Though the number of calls for the year are yet available, Hornick said this year seems "a bit high."

"Thefts from motor vehicles are very common in our time," Hornick said. "Multiple times a year we see a rash of them. This year does seem a bit high, and we are seeing them in many parts of town."

Bethlehem police continue to investigate a

string of larcenies at Deer Run Apartments in the early morning hours of Saturday, June 27.

The person or people absconded with various items from unlocked cars. Loose change, wallets, phone chargers, hand sanitizer and tools were taken, according to one resident. One car reportedly showed evidence of someone attempting to rip out the console from inside.

"It is difficult to say that it is the same group or groups," Hornick said, "as we are seeing an increase in property crimes for many

reasons.

According to the department's annual report, general petit and grand larceny is down since the agency recorded a high of 431 in 2012. The total number has trended downward since with peaks of 389 in 2015 and 373 in 2018.

Break-in that result in nothing stolen are reported as trespassing. Since 2012, trespassing has also ticked down from 46 to a low of 16 in 2016. The most recent report recorded 20 cases of trespassing in 2018.

Hornick said Bethlehem police uses social media to help inform the public of trending incidents.

Family of abandoned student files suit

Bethlehem Central faces litigation after autistic student was left in the cold last April

DELMAR — The family of an autistic student left outside his place of work as wind chill temperatures dipped below freezing has filed suit with the school district.

Michael Seavey, then a 21-year-old student last April at Bethlehem Central, was dropped off by district employees to his employer for a two-hour shift as part of his work-to-school program. According to his parents, Seavey was to be escorted from the bus by an attendant before he was handed off to his employer. On April 1, 2019, that did not happen. The place of business was closed for the day. The site's owner was out of town and one of the employees neglected to

inform the school. When Seavey was dropped off, the bus allegedly left before he attempted to walk into the building. Because the school did not allow him to take his cell phone to work, he was unable to call for help. He was found two hours later where he was dropped off.

News of the lawsuit was reported by the Times Union just prior to a meeting of the district's board of education on Tuesday, July 7. The board went immediately into executive session to speak on the topic of an unnamed lawsuit.

Stephanie Corbett, a 20-year employee of the district, was later tied to the incident when she resigned a few weeks afterwards. According to multiple sources, Corbett was the

bus attendant present when Seavey was transported by bus that morning. According to a source familiar with the situation, Corbett was later involved in another incident which was immediately followed by her resignation. *The Spotlight* previously filed a request for a copy of the termination agreement under state Freedom of Information Law; however, the district said there was

no such agreement. The details of the incident were never disclosed by the district.

The Spotlight obtained an emailed statement from the district that acknowledged it as an isolated incident and that it had taken "immediate action to ensure it would not happen again."

"Something like this should never happen and is absolutely unacceptable," stated Jody Monroe,

Bethlehem Central's superintendent. "We have put in place new transportation protocols for our work program students to make sure this does not happen again. ... Additionally, we are working to improve the communication with our business partners who host our students."

The statement, however, did not elaborate on the nature of the "new

transportation protocols."

According to a weather almanac, the temperatures that morning were above freezing. At the approximate time in which Seavey was dropped off to work, the temperature was 38 degrees, but winds of 18 mph caused wind chill temperatures to fall below 30 degrees.

Tina Seavey, Michael's mother, said she believed her son was neglected and told *The Spotlight* last April how she felt "overwhelmed with fear" for her son. She described her son as traumatized and having suffered through panic attacks as a result of the incident.

"I was scared that he was all alone for two hours," said Tina Seavey. "From a mother's perspective, I don't want this to happen to anyone else. It's heartbreaking and there was nothing Michael could've done in the moment."

Novus got going in the bottom of the first when Sean Matrose hammered a 2-1 pitch 230 feet to left center. Eleven-year-old Carter Daggett followed with a walk and was driven in by a William Matrose double. Another 11-year-old, Eamon McClain drove him in with a single to right.

In the top of the third Mash singled to center followed by O'Connell lifting the first pitch he saw over the fence in left. Eli Proper hit another hard double down the line and scored on a past ball later in the inning.

If infection rate stays low, schools can open

Districts to present their plans to reopen by July 31

ALBANY — Schools can open this fall provided a region is in Phase IV and the 14-day rolling average infection rate is below 5 percent as of Aug. 1, said Gov. Andrew Cuomo.

If the infection rate spikes above 9 percent after Aug. 1, schools will not be allowed to open. It is not clear what happens if the infection rate spikes after students return to school buildings for their education at the beginning of September.

As of Sunday, July 12, the infection rate across the state was about 1.08 percent. In the eight-district Capital District the infection rate was 0.9 percent. In Albany County, though, there was a spike in cases over the weekend and the infection rate was at 2 percent on Monday, July 13,

which is higher even than the hardest hit New York City, which had an infection rate of 1.1 percent.

Each of the state's some 700-plus school districts will need to submit a specific safety plan by July 31. The state will then, based on the infection rate in the district's given region, give the thumbs up or down by Aug. 7 on whether or not they can reopen the school buildings.

According to the state task force charged with outlining safety protocols for school districts all teachers and students are required to wear masks if they cannot maintain six feet of social distance. In classroom instruction will be a priority, especially for labs, arts and career and technical education, Cuomo said, but the plan encourages a hybrid school week with students spending some days

attending classes from home via computer.

All students and teachers will have to be screened prior to coming into the buildings and provisions must be made to isolate anyone showing signs or symptoms while in a school buildings.

All students and staff will be directed to wash hands frequently and rigorous sanitization protocols will need to be part of the individual districts plan to reopen.

Transportation is an extension of the school building, Cuomo said, and children will be directed to social distance while waiting for and riding on school buses.

"Everyone wants to reopen schools. It's not if we reopen or not, you re-open if it's safe to reopen. How do we know it's safe? We look at the data," Cuomo said during a press briefing on Monday. "You don't hold your finger up and feel

the wind. You don't have a dream. You don't have an emotion. If you have the virus under control you open. If you don't have the virus under control you don't open."

While the districts will need to present their own plan, any decision on accepting the plan or any variations within the same broad outline will likely be on a regional basis rather than by individual school districts.

The state Education Department and the Board of Regents also released a plan on Monday on the educational aspects of elementary and high school education that will work within the safety protocols laid out by the governor's task force. Many of the same standards, like providing meals, transportation and meeting the same education benchmarks in place prior to the pandemic remain in place.

It presents three different scenarios — in house schooling, schooling remotely and a hybrid model. Specific requirements, and those deemed flexible like a required in-house learning and the required delivery of physical education, will be released by the state Board of Education on July 17.

• This framework and the guidance which will follow allows schools to plan for the upcoming school year under three different scenarios that aim to keep our children, educators and school personnel safe and encourages equitable access to high-quality services for all students," said Board of Regents Chancellor Betty A. Rosa.

Andy Pallotta, president of the New York State United Teachers, said parents and school staff must have a seat at the table when discussing reopening school.

Indoor malls are open

Malls with updated air filtration systems in areas already in Phase IV of the state's re-opening plan can allow people in public areas beginning on Friday, July 10.

Crossgates opened on Friday and Colonie Center a day later.

Gov. Andrew Cuomo required malls to install High Efficiency Particulate Air filters with a Minimum Efficiency Reporting Value of at least 11 as a condition on opening the public portions of the establishments, which will allow scores of small businesses to again open their doors. Depending on the mall's size, the MERV required could be as high as 13. A filter's MERV rating is from 1 to 16 with 16 having the ability to remove the smallest of particles

from the air.

When COVID-19 is airborne it is carried by particles as small as 0.13 microns and there are HEPA filters that can filter particles as small as 0.01 microns. To put it into context, a grain of sand is between 100 and 2,000 microns, pollen is between 10 and 50 microns and tobacco smoke is between 0.01 and 3 microns.

The issue is the more you restrict airflow by filtering, the harder the system has to work and older systems may not be powerful enough to work in an efficient manner if at all, especially when they are large enough to accommodate a space the size of a mall.

Crossgates and Colonie Center will implement other safety measures such as increased sanitization stations and sanitization protocols for common spaces, limit capacity to 50

percent and require masks.

Food court seating will be closed, but take-out and delivery will still be available. Other common seating areas will also be closed. Health screenings are required for all employees but not customers.

"With proper precautions in place and health and safety a top priority, we look forward to restoring our centers to their dominant positions as the economic drivers or their respective regions," said Jennifer Smith, the marketing director for Crossgates who works for the umbrella company Pyramid Management Group.

Albany County Executive Dan McCoy, who lobbied to have malls open in Phase III, said there are more than 2,500 jobs at Crossgates alone.

ZBA cancels hearing for National Grid

DELMAR — The public hearing for a proposed substation on Van Dyke Road has been canceled.

National Grid was scheduled to meet before the Bethlehem Zoning Board (today) Wednesday, July 15 to answer questions regarding the \$15 million substation it first proposed in 2014. The company last stood before the board in June. Then, it had answered questions previously presented to the board through an online conference session. Though Zoning Board Chairperson Dave Devaprasad expressed confidence that all information was captured on the town website, he said he was concerned it was spread across several years of meetings.

Because the land is not zoned for a substation, the energy company's plan needs to first obtain a use variance.

The proposal has since gone back and forth with some pauses as National Grid addressed resident concerns. Many of those concerns centered on the introduction of electromagnetic fields at close proximity to Eagle

Elementary, which stands less than half a mile away from the proposed site.

The June meeting was the first for National Grid in front of each of the zoning board members. None of the board members served when the utility company last presented in 2018.

Paving to begin Saturday for Delaware Ave

ELSMERE — The end is soon near for road construction on Delaware Avenue.

The Albany Water Board is expected to complete its paving work near the CDTA Park and Ride lot on Delaware Avenue by the beginning of next week. The construction relates to an on-going water main repair that began last winter.

Starting Saturday, July 18, traffic will be reduced to two lanes on Delaware Avenue between Euclid Avenue and Mason Road during daytime hours. The project is expected to take three days to complete.

GUILDERLAND — Town Supervisor Peter G. Barber reported an "enthusiastic audience" from the Guilderland Performing Arts Center's first concert Friday, July 10.

Your child's health No. 1 priority

Brian Bailey is superintendent of Ravena Coeymans Selkirk School District. His district, and those across New York, are required to submit a plan to the New York state Board of Regents on how to reopen schools next fall. It's a difficult task Bailey describes in this letter to district residents.

Even before the unusual end to our 19-20 school year, RCS began the process of considering how our schools would reopen this fall. There have been many unknowns placed in our path as we strive to find balance in our approach to meeting the needs of our students while protecting everyone's safety. An RCS reopening committee has

been meeting since the end of June. This committee is composed of more than 80 leaders, teachers, support staff, and parents. Their task has been to examine the best way to deliver instruction, operate safely, and support our human resources during this pandemic.

As I mentioned, there are many unknowns as we move into next year. While the governor has indicated that a decision about reopening in the fall will be made in the near future, he has tasked school districts to formulate plans for reopening that would outline expectations for social distancing as well as procedures to promote health and safety. RCS is preparing for a spectrum

of possibilities, including everything from the continuation of remote learning to the full return of all staff and students. After the plan is fully developed, the district will share information, training, and support with all staff and families prior to the reopening of schools. This dynamic and diverse planning will serve us well as we respond to future orders from our governor or the Department of Health. We will be able to adjust our physical presence in our schools while maintaining the best instruction possible.

We want to be back in school. As we plan we will continue to focus on the health and safety of our children. There

are other priorities, but none are as important. We will put protections in place and prepare for every eventuality with a sincere hope that we return to "normal" as soon as possible. That will be the best scenario for all of us. We learned a lot from being forced into remote learning last March and clearly heard the feedback from our community as we completely redefined how teaching and learning were delivered. Moving Schuyler is step in the right direction

Reading the letter from Albany County Legislators Frank Mauriello and Jeff Perlee made me both discouraged and angry. Comparing Albany Mayor Kathy Sheehan's decision to remove the statue of Philip Schuyler to the destruction of artifacts, past and present, is highly divisive rhetoric that, even with my low expectations of our political leaders, somehow still manages to shock

me. If Mr. Mauriello and Mr. Perlee are only able to throw gasoline on fires then I wish they would remove themselves from public service.

The concern by Mr. Mauriello and Mr. Perlee that "officials across the nation are attempting to systematically erase and rewrite our shared history" confounds me. For centuries "self-righteous, cowering politicians," as well as others with power,

have worked to erase history when it did not fit into their cultural narrative or desire to remain in power. Those "leaders" not only worked to avoid acknowledging contributions from people who did not match their race or gender, they systematically restricted groups of people from being able to participate in government and achieve justice. I am not sure who Mr. Mauriello and

Mr. Perlee are referring to with the line "our shared history" but I don't see the "our" being a fully inclusive group or a group I want to be associated with.

I applaud Mayor Sheehan's decision to move (not destroy) the statue so it can be placed in a setting where appropriate context about Schuyler can be made available. I see this as taking a step back to get a better perspective, something that we all

need to do. By standing on uneven ground for so long, our minds may be tricked into believing that the playing field is level. Mr. Mauriello and Mr. Perlee may not like the shifting ground but I would hope that, especially being community leaders, they would work harder to see a larger picture.

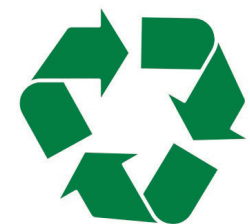

SARATOGA SPRING — “Ever since I was a young boy, I played the silver ball.”

The Who probably best captured how America was once enamored with pinball machines when it released “Pinball Wizard” in 1974. The arcade game was once banned in major cities concerned that it promoted gambling. That changed in the mid-70s, sparking a bit of a revolution that defined how some teenagers spent their days — slapping buttons and listening to music.

Universal Preservation Hall is to open the Rock & Roll Hall of Fame exhibit "Part of the Machine: Rock & Pinball" on Sunday, July 26. The two-month exhibit highlights rock-themed, playable pinball machines and pairs them with artifacts allowing visitors to explore the art displayed on each case. The marriage between pinball and rock was never a mistake.

"Rock and roll and pinball have a lot in common," said Karen Herman, Vice President of Collections and Curatorial Affairs, Rock & Roll Hall of Fame. Loud, colorful and rebellious, it was inevitable that the two would combine to celebrate rock's icons."

Pinball was banned until the mid-1970s in most of America's big cities because it was considered a form of gambling. It eventually became a symbol of youth and rebellion, right along with rock & roll. By 1969, pinball and rock became inextricably linked, thanks to the Who and the group's

opus Tommy, which highlighted the skills of the rock opera's lead character.

"A number of artists and bands have been immortalized in pinball games," said Herman. "It gives fans another way to experience the energy and power of rock and uniquely connect with their favorite artists."

On display, along with the classic "Wizard" and "Tommy" pinball machines, is Pete Townshend of the Who's acoustic guitar used to compose "Pinball Wizard" and several other songs from Tommy.

Making its debut as part of the exhibit is Rock & Roll Hall of Fame Inductee and shock rock pioneer Alice Cooper's newest pinball machine – Alice Cooper's Nightmare Castle. The classic

horror adventure game is narrated by Cooper himself and features a number of songs spanning Cooper's career and a working guillotine set piece.

Cooper's stage shows are always theatrical,

notoriously employing outrageous stage props including nooses and guillotines. An electric chair stage prop that Cooper used in his 1971 tour across North America and Europe is on display in the exhibit.

Fans can also view pioneering pinball machines of their favorite musicians such as Captain Fantastic (1976), based on the album by Elton John and his character in Tommy, and Beat Time (1967), one of the oldest rock and roll tables, which capitalizes on Beatlemania, featuring several mop-topped musicians and a drumhead emblazoned with "The Bootles."

Other rare and sought-after playable machines in the exhibit pay tribute to the Rolling Stones, Dolly Parton, Guns N' Roses, Elvis, Metallica, KISS and AC/DC. From Peter Criss of KISS' drum set to Dolly Parton's dress that inspired the backglass for the DollyParton pinball machine, fans will find other artifacts on display as they learn more about the popular pinball and rock subculture.

Hosting the exhibition at UPH has been in the

works more than a year as the Saratoga venue sought to develop programming that complimented - rather than competed - with Saratoga's live entertainment scene in the summer.

"It wasn't clear when COVID-19 came along that we could hold the event but now that museums are reopening in the state we are proceeding with our plans," said Teddy Foster, director at UPH.

UPH will follow Center for Disease Control and Prevention and New York State safety guidelines in establishing safety protocol for exhibit visitors. Each visitor, staff person and volunteer will be required to bring and wear a face mask and to wear provided gloves while playing the pinball machines. All individuals will also be required to maintaining proper social distancing.

A mulligan for a mask

Golfing in the era of social distancing

Golfers enthusiastically look forward to the day when their favorite courses reopen to players each year. That anticipation was even greater in 2020, when social distancing measures forced many courses to stay closed even as the weather warmed up. Thankfully for golfers, golf courses were among the first businesses given the green light to reopen as governments began to lift restrictions.

Golfing in the era of social distancing may not be quite the same as it was prior to the outbreak of COVID-19, but golfers can still have fun as they hit the links. That's especially true when they take steps



to understand just what it means to golf while social distancing prior to teeing off.

- Assess your personal health before going to the golf course. Golf attracts athletes from all age

groups, including some that are more vulnerable to COVID-19 than others. According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, age is a risk factor for COVID-19, as older adults are more vulnerable to severe illness

if they are infected with the virus than younger adults. Social distancing requires a collective effort on the part of everyone to keep vulnerable people safe, and golfers are no exception. Golfers young and old who are under the weather or experiencing even mild symptoms of COVID-19 should avoid golf courses until they feel better. In addition, young golfers can choose tee times when they're less likely to come into contact with older golfers. Early morning tee times tend to be popular among older golfers, but speak with staff at the course to see if they have rules in place to safeguard older golfers. If they do, respect those rules. If they don't, work with staff to choose a tee time when you're less likely to be around older golfers.

- Disinfect clubs before or after playing. Disinfecting clubs and other equipment before and after playing is a simple measure that can reduce golfers' risk of getting the virus or spreading it if they have it but are asymptomatic. Simply wipe down clubs and other equipment with disinfectant or an alcohol-based cleanser that is at least 60 percent alcohol. If playing with a friend, resist the urge to share clubs, no matter how tempting it may be to take your playing partner's new driver for a spin on the first hole.

- Refuse valet service. Many courses have temporarily stopped offering valet services to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Golfers who visit a club that is not taking such precautions can

opt to refuse the service. Doing so decreases the risk of getting or spreading the virus by limiting the number of people with whom you come into direct contact.

- Pack supplies. Contact the course in advance to determine if the dining room is open and if the course is providing hand sanitizer at each tee. At-risk golfers may want to skip dining at the course after their round is over, opting to pack their own lunch or eat when they arrive home after playing. If the course is not offering hand sanitizer at each hole, pack your own as an extra precaution.

Golfing in the era of social distancing may be different, but there's no reason golfers cannot still enjoy a summer on the links.

Homemade ice cream sandwiches



FOOD & VINO

Ice cream sandwiches are comprised of a favorite ice cream flavor nestled between wafer-type cakes or cookies. They're available pre-made in a grocer's freezer, but they're easily made at home with a few ingredients, such as a favorite cookie and homemade ice cream. "Vanilla Ice Cream Infused With Rose Geranium Leaves" from "Simple Soirées" (Stewart, Tabori & Chang) by Peggy Knickerbocker makes for an ideal treat this summer.

Vanilla Ice Cream Infused With Rose Geranium Leaves

Ingredients: serves 6 to 8

- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 2 cups whole milk
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 24 rose geranium leaves or 6 sprigs fresh thyme or 1 small branch lemon verbena
- 6 large egg yolks

Instructions

To make the custard: In a heavy saucepan combine the

cream, milk, 1/2 cup of the sugar, and the geranium leaves. Cook over medium-high heat until the mixture just begins to boil, 3 to 5 minutes. Remove the saucepan from the heat, cover, and let the leaves steep in the milky mixture for about 15 minutes. Then pour the mixture through a fine mesh strainer and discard the leaves or herbs. In a small bowl, whisk together the egg yolks and remaining 1/4 cup of sugar until thick and pale. Add a few tablespoons of the warm milk mixture to the egg mixture, whisking vigorously. Once combined, add the egg mixture back into the milk mixture, whisking continuously. Cook over medium-low heat until the rich custard coats the back of a spoon (run your finger down the bowl of the spoon — if the finger mark remains, it's done). Or use an instant-read thermometer; the custard is done at 175 to 180 F. Do not allow the mixture to boil. Strain the custard again into a glass bowl using a fine mesh sieve. Cover and refrigerate until you are ready to make the ice cream (the custard needs to chill for 30 to 60 minutes). You may place the bowl into a larger bowl of ice to quicken the chilling time. To make the ice cream: Pour the chilled custard into an ice-cream maker and freeze according to the manufacturer's instructions. To make ice cream sandwiches, let the ice cream thaw until spreadable. Place an ample amount on a cookie and top with another cookie. Wrap sandwiches individually in waxed paper and put into the freezer to allow the ice cream to harden again. Use large cookies, which can be homemade or store-bought.
