Bethlehem Town Board didn't know highway equipment was already sold when it approved sale

**DELMAR** — When the Bethlehem Town Board granted Highway Superintendent Marc Dorsey permission to sell off surplus equipment from the old Colonial Acres golf course on July 8, board members didn't know he already sold it. The check was already sitting

in Town Hall when board members approved the sale, but that's not how capital assets are supposed to be sold. The sale of equipment needs to be approved by the board before the town can sell it directly to someone. When the town comptroller learned of the \$1,800 check after the June 4 sale, he fired an email off to Dorsey and Town Supervisor David VanLuven.





### **Accident cuts power**

**GLENMONT** — Local residents were without power until the following morning after a Ravena woman drove off the road and severed a utility pole on Tuesday, July 21.

Bethlehem police said Andrea D. Bankston, 55, suffered a medical event while the 2019 Ford she was driving ran off River Road and "sheared off a telephone pole" at approximately 1 p.m. A portion of the pole then came down and struck a 2012 Peterbuilt Tractor.

The Selkirk Fire Department responded and later transported Bankston to Albany Medical Center for further evaluation. No other injuries were reported.

River Road was closed until approximately 1:30 a.m. while National Grid repaired damage from the accident. Local residents reported they were without power and internet until the following morning.

## Troy man arrested in town park on sex charges

**SELKIRK** — A 21-year-old Troy man was arrested after police found him having sexual contact with two underage girls while in a in a car parked in Elm Avenue Park.

According to Cmdr. Adam Hornick, police spotted the occupied vehicle on Thursday, July 23 at around 2:58 a.m. and found Gregory Pruitt and the two girls, both of whom are under the age of 15.

It was determined one of the juveniles was a missing person out of a neighboring jurisdiction and there was an order of protection barring Pruitt of having contact with her. The order stems from sex offense charges from an arrest in Albany in May. That case is still pending and Pruitt was free while under the supervision of probation, Hornick said.

In Bethlehem, Pruitt is charged with

two felony counts of attempted rape, as well as the misdemeanors of endangering the welfare of a child, criminal contempt, sex abuse and the violations of unlicensed operation of a vehicle, operating a motor vehicle without insurance and not having a license plate.

He was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and remanded to the Albany County jail in lieu of \$50,000 cash or bond.

## **Reported gunfire closes Crossgates**

No suspects identified in July 22 incident

Storm clouds swirled overhead as several police agencies held Crossgates Mall under lockdown following reports of gunfire in the late afternoon of Wednesday, July 22.

At approximately 4 p.m., Guilderland police received several calls of gunshots fired from inside the mall outside of the Foot Locker shoe store. No injuries were reported and no details of a suspect were released Wednesday evening.

According to a statement released by Crossgates Mall, the shooting was an "isolated incident" Mall officials stressed that the shooting was not a random act. Instead, it resulted from an altercation that escalated among "known acquaintances." The statement also said the suspected shooter "vacated the property."

One shopper described "a huge mob" running through the mall immediately after the shooting.

'We were headed to

our last store as an officer ran from behind us, passing us," the shopper wrote on Facebook, "and a huge mob of people ran towards us screaming." The shopper said she and a companion took shelter in a neighboring store. Police cleared them to leave approximately 90 minutes later. "I'll never go into a mall without thinking twice now.

"I honestly thought we could possibly die today."

Squad cars severed access to the mall from Western Avenue. More police agencies blocked access to the parking lots facing Washington Avenue. Law enforcement officials stood outside each doorway into the mall. At one point, a team of half a dozen police officers rushed through the first floor entrance near Lord & Taylor, while another officer armed with a rifle stood outside another exit.

The scene outside of the mall was reminiscent of a similar incident outside of the Apple store in November 2016. Several agencies including Colonie, Albany, Albany County Sheriffs and State Police

responded to the scene. Guilderland police continues to investigate the situation. Crossgates Mall said it intends to open for business tomorrow

Bethlehem police said

they arrested an Albany man armed with two large knives after responding to a burglary call on Friday,

## SPOTLIGHT ON FINANCE **How to Navigate Financial Stress from COVID-19**

fyou're feeling stressed these days, know this: You're not alone – particularly when it comes to finances.

A lot of us are experiencing at least some worry over the impact that the COVID-19 pandemic will have on our financial situations. But by having a plan and proactively managing your finances, you can ease the uncertainties that fuel anxiety and stress

#### **Cause for Concern**

Over the past several months, income changes and concerns about the overall economy have clearly affected purchasing habits: According to the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis, an agency of the commerce department, consumer spending fell by a record 13.6% in April 2020, eclipsing the previous largest-ever decline, a 6.9% change reported one month earlier.

Meanwhile a J.D. Power survey in April found that 72% of consumers say the COVID-19 crisis has hurt their financial situation, and 44% of Americans

expect to use existing savings save. Focus on the basics of or emergency funds to pay for monthly living expenses if they you have a good picture of your can't work.

That same J.D. Power survey asked people about their stress levels and found:

> 91% are somewhat or very worried about the impact of the crisis on their personal financial status

55% are somewhat stressed over their financial situation

27% - more than one in four are very stressed

So, let's talk about stress relief in the form of some simple, deliberate choices you can make and actions you can take.

#### **Examine**, Identify and Plan

Take stock of your income and spending habits. This is your first step. Identify pain points, making note of where and when money causes you stress - and why. Timing of paychecks and bills can make you wince, for instance, if you have several utility payments due in a short span.

Set up a budget and prioritize how you will spend and food, shelter and utilities. Once situation, household needs and spending habits, determine what you can change for the better. Be fully aware of any ben-

efits you may be due. This includes paid work leave, sick leave, disability or unemployment payments. Additionally, pay attention to relief being offered through payment exceptions, postponements or other compensation during this time.

#### **Declutter, Reduce** and Pay Off

Conduct regular check-ins and a thorough review of your bills and other expenses. Categorize them to ensure that you've got a good understanding of the money that's coming in and going out of your household accounts. Automate utility payments to avoid late penalties and reduce the stress of remembering multiple due dates.

Look for ways to reduce spending. Ideas include planning meals ahead of time, cooking at home, using everything in your cupboards and refrigerator and sticking to shopping lists. Consider canceling or suspending subscriptions to services that you don't need or use often, like gym memberships, streaming services or meal kits.

## What Is the 50-30-20 Budget?

udgeting is one of the most powerful ments also fall under this category, along with steps you can take to gain control of your finances. The 50-30-20 budget is an approach that organizes your expenses into three categories: needs, wants, and savings. When using this approach, you allocate 50 percent of your income to your needs, 30 percent to your wants, and 20 percent to savings, investments, and debt repayment. It's a simple way to ensure that you're covering your essentials and making progress toward long-term goals.

As a general guideline, the 50-30-20 approach can help you organize your finances and get clarity on your expenses. But keep in mind that you might need to tailor it to fit your specific circumstances.

#### **Distinguishing Between** Wants and Needs

The category for needs makes up the largest portion of the 50-30-20 budget. But sometimes we mistake wants for needs, and our list of essential expenses grows. Your list of needs should include non-negotiables, such as your mortgage or rent payment; utility bills; recurring medical costs, such as insurance premiums and medications; and commuting expenses. Minimum debt paychildcare expenses and groceries. However, it's important to be mindful of your grocery list. Staple products make the cut but items such as specialty cheeses and coffees should be added to the "wants" category. Be sure that your needs list only includes vital items.

After you've identified your monthly needs, it's time to pinpoint your wants. This category encompasses costs such as dining out, streaming subscriptions, gym memberships, clothing, and leisure travel. You may want to create a hierarchy of wants in case you need to cut some of these expenses for the sake of your budget. Maybe your gym membership is more important to you than your Hulu subscription. If you find you've been living outside of your means, it helps to know which wants are high priority and which you're willing to give up for a while.

Allot the remaining 20 percent of your budget for savings, investments, and additional debt payments. As noted above, you may need to reduce your wants budget so you can put more money toward your debts. The sooner you pay off your credit card and loan balances, the more money you'll have for saving, investing, and indulging in more of those items and activities on your wants list.

Pay off debt. This is key even if you're able to pay only the minimum on credit obligations so you can address basic needs or put money in savings. Develop a strategy for reducing and eliminating debts, and plan to avoid additional debt in the future. You can also seek assistance from a financial advisor or your banker.

Explore alternative sources of income. In addition to addressing expenses, this income – even in smaller amounts – can be a great help in achieving both short- and long-term financial goals. Check for positions with essential businesses, such as grocery stores and delivery companies, or even opportunities to join the gig economy working from home.

#### Look to the Future

Take care of yourself. Tend to your mental, physical and emotional health - exercise, make a daily schedule, allow yourself relaxation and leisure time. "Why? Because the process is designed to ensure maximum financial benefit for the municipality," wrote Michael Cohen, "and not leave ourselves open to questions both internally and by the public about the process."The comptroller added that these are the procedures the town has followed "without exception" during his 10 years with the town.

"The sale of the equipment by Mr. Dorsey was unfortunate, but I am hopeful that it was by mistake and is an isolated incident that won't be repeated," said Town Boardmember Jim Foster.

Foster had initially joked how he coveted some of the items listed for sale during the board meeting. Those items included a pole saw, a hedge trimmer, a chainsaw, a string trimmer, a walk blower and two walk behind mowers. Also included among the sold items were three ride-on lawn mowers; a 1999 Jacobson Tri-King 1800G, a 2001 Ransome G-Plex mower, and a 1994 National Rotary Tri-Plex mower.

When Foster asked what the procedure was to sell those items, VanLuven said he didn't know, but understood it was a "complex" one. When Foster followed-up his query with Cohen a few days later, he learned how they were already sold.

"I am extremely disappointed... that Supervisor VanLuven did not bring any of this to the Board's attention prior to or during the Town Board meeting on July 8th," he said.

VanLuven said it was a "total oversight on my part" to have the resolution on the agenda. He said he and Cohen were waiting to collect information from the highway department before the board vote.

"We were trying to get the full picture before going to the board," VanLuven said. "We've [since] put together a complete explanation — or

as complete an explanation as I've been able to cobble together — from his various phone conversations and emails on the topic."

The 10 items were sold to Pat Blum, former superintendent of the

Colonial Acres golf course and now with Northeast Turf Inc, of Troy. Cohen said Dorsey sold the items to Northeast Turf only after several other parties deemed the equipment as "obsolete junk." The golf course was closed last year after it was obtained by the town in 2016.

Dorsey took over the town's highway department in January after winning the election over John "Tiger" Anastasi last November. Prior to that, Dorsey had not worked within the highway department. That inexperience may have led to his mistake, Cohen said. In conversation, he said Dorsey didn't think he needed board approval.

Attempts to speak with Dorsey went unanswered before publication. Foster said he has no

reason to doubt the town

## Furstrated over wasted resources

Sheriff fielded 575 complains, some based on pictures seen on Facebook

ALBANY — Everyone knows what they are supposed to do to stop the spread of COVID-19, but enforcement of those not wearing masks and/or gathering in large groups remains an issue.

Sheriff Craig Apple on Monday said his office has fielded 575 complaints, some real and some frivolous, and some which may have been real but by the time deputies got to the site the situation had already changed. For example, he said his office is getting calls about a photo someone saw on Facebook that could have been hours old.

Most of the complaints, he said, are related to restaurants and bars with others coming from



convenience and big box stores. So far, his office has issued six cease and desist orders, and they are only issued if deputies have to return to the scene after issuing a warning. No criminal charges have been filed for not following the state mandates, he said.

He said his office is getting between 10 and 15 complaints a day from across the county. For the last week Gov. "If everyone just wore the damn mask for two weeks and don't go into states that are on the list, or if you do go to quarantine for two weeks, we will get through this."

Andrew Cuomo has been prodding local officials to "do their job" and start enforcing the state regulations.

"A lot of the complaints started out as frivolous and some of these complaints are the best use of resources. You have to remember we have a spike in crime, too," Apple said. "We are going to step up our visits to these establishments. We have officers assigned to the City of Albany but we will shift more resources to these calls. There is only so much we can do, you have to have some personal accountability.

"If everyone just wore the damn mask for two weeks and don't go into states that are on the list, or if you do go to quarantine for two weeks, we will get through this."

The Capital District has seen record number of shooting this year with 79 in the City of Albany alone and two dozen in Troy and Schenectady.

Apple said there are also number of stores who called his office complaining about the customers. Most of the stores, and by extension the employees, are following the rules and have Personal Protection Equipment on hand but it's not always the case with the customers.

"The store's policies are

right. They have signage in place, they have the proper PPE. They are having problems with the customers," he said. "Some people don't believe in it, some people will come in and fight about it. They [employees] have had expletives thrown at them, masks thrown back at them. It really is about personal accountability."

As of Monday, there were 2,229 positive cases in Albany County, up seven from Sunday, with 900 under quarantine. There are 87 active cases in the county. There are four people in the hospital for a rate of 0.17 percent.

Last Monday there were 2,031 and for a time over the past two weeks, the Capital District region had the highest rate of infection in the state. But, hospitalizations remain under control and the county saw just three deaths since June 24. Last week two residents of St. Peter's Nursing and Rehabilitation died — a man in his 70s and one in his 80s with underlying health conditions.

Of the new cases, there is one health care worker, one who travelled out of state, one had close contact with an infected person and Health Department personnel are still tracing four others.

So far there are 39 people tied to a large Fourth of July party on Hudson Avenue in Albany.

"It shows what can happen when you meet in a large group and don't do the right things like wearing a mask, staying six feet apart and coughing into your arm," McCoy said. "The more you do this kind of thing, and don't do the right thing it will set us back, and the last thing we want to do is get set back."



## **Congress must act to save lives**

Dear Friends,

Our nation passed the grave milestone of 4 million COVID-19 cases this week, and federal health officials have estimated that the actual number of cases has been many times greater. Despite our best efforts in New York and other states that have followed science and public health guidance, infections and deaths in other parts of the country continue to grow at truly alarming rates.

Yet in a stunning display, the Senate gaveled out of session this week without advancing legislation that would support millions of Americans who have already been pushed to the brink during this crisis.

Disagreements and infighting between Senate Republicans and the White House have apparently caused a delay in announcing a proposed bill to next week. This lapse ensures that millions of Americans who rely on unemployment insurance will see their benefits expire mere days before rent is due and bills must be paid, with the final week of federal unemployment coverage ending this Sunday (yes, tomorrow).

This benefit is not a gift, it is a lifeline. The amount is not lavish and has been barely enough to keep our neediest families afloat, while also providing valuable infusion of activity for our nation's economy. Economists estimate that,

without this benefit, 5.1 million fewer jobs would be created in the next year.

Still, that benefit and the others we have delivered so far are only the down payment to help America survive this crisis. Until we have a comprehensive, federal response that unites America in the face of the pandemic, our results will remain subpar, and our pain and loss will continue to be far greater than is necessary.

More than two months ago, House Democrats recognized this growing challenge and passed the Heroes Act, a comprehensive rescue plan that delivers criticallyneeded aid for our frontline and essential workers, as well as our struggling families and communities across the nation.

Since then, more than 2.5 million Americans have become infected and 55,000 souls have been lost to this virus. The Senate needs to stop the delay, step up and advance the evidence-based solutions in the Heroes Act including:

• \$75 billion for the testing, tracing and treatment we need to reopen safely and help ensure that every American can access free coronavirus treatment.

 Strong support for our heroes to prevent devastating layoffs and service cuts, with nearly \$1 trillion for state, local, territorial and tribal governments on the

frontlines who desperately need funds to pay the health care workers, firefighters, emergency responders, teachers and other vital workers who keep us safe and are in danger of losing their jobs. The Heroes Act will also establish a \$200 billion Heroes' Fund to ensure that essential workers receive hazard pay.

• Money in the pockets of workers with a second round of direct payments to families up to \$6,000 per household, new payroll protection measures to keep 60 million workers connected with their jobs and extending weekly \$600 federal unemployment payments through next January, and critical supports for renters and homeowners.

• Along with a real, comprehensive rescue plan for the nation, our Heroes Act provides valuable support for our Capital Region including:

• More than \$1.3 billion in crisis-response aid will be allocated to New York's Capital Region and a combined \$49.5 billion to New York State overall.

Also included in the bill is a long overdue fix to the broken Medicare Wage Index formula that unfairly shortchanges local hospitals and providers from receiving earned federal reimbursement. For more than a decade, I have fought alongside our Capital Region hospitals

to change this unfair formula. This vital addition to the Heroes Act would result in \$100 million in new federal funds to our region annually, so that local hospitals can better support patients and our communities.

If the Senate refuses to advance a serious rescue plan that is up to the task, then I ask, how do they intend to pay the far greater costs that will come if we fail? Every day more Americans lose friends and loved ones to this horrible virus, to say nothing of the millions who have lost jobs and suffered setbacks to their health and their livelihoods. During

this unprecedented time, the cost of inaction is so much greater that the cost of action. I implore the Senate and President to come together, just as we came together to advance the CARES Act that has carried us this far.

## Albany Med suspends daycare

Upon learning of positive cases of COVID-19 in the Albany Med Kids daycare, the Medical Center has proactively suspended its program beginning Monday, July 27 through Friday, August 7. One teacher and seven children tested positive for COVID-19. The majority of these cases were asymptomatic and, at this time, they have not required hospitalization. 62 total children were tested. As per our Albany Med policy, daycare staff have followed guidelines set by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, including wearing masks.

Albany Med promptly notified the parents and the Albany County Department of Health of the situation. Albany Med continues working with the county health department and our parents to inform them of any developments. As always, the safety of our children and their families is our top priority.

Children have been asked not to return to the program until after the recommended 14-day incubation period from the last date of possible exposure.

### Scholastic sports delayed

ALBANY — The New York State Public High School Athletic Association (NYSPHSAA) announced last week it will delay the official start date of the Fall 2020 sports season until Sept. 21. The season was originally set to begin Aug. 24.

The association that oversees interscholastic sports in New York State also voted to:

• Cancel fall regional and state

championships

• Waive the seven-day practice rule • Maintain current practice

requirements

• Encourage geographic scheduling for games and contests

Schools would have the option, if permitted by state officials, to offer offseason conditioning workouts.

NYSPHSAA officials said that if the fall sports season continues to be impacted by the COVID-19 public health emergency, a condensed season would be considered to accommodate as many sports as possible after Jan. 1, 2021.

No decisions regarding a return to school in the fall have been made. Those decisions are expected in early August.

If the organization moved to a condensed season, the tentative schedule would be as follows:

Season I (Winter Sports) Dates: Jan. 4-Mar. 13 (Week 27-36) -

10 Weeks

Sports: basketball (girls & boys), bowling (girls & boys), gymnastics, ice hockey (girls & boys) indoor track & field (girls & boys), skiing (girls & boys), swimming (boys), \*wrestling, \*competitive cheer.

\* Because of high risk nature of wrestling and competitive cheer, sports may have to be moved to Season II or season III.

#### Season II (Fall Sports)

Dates: Mar. 1-May 8 (Week 35-44) -10 Weeks

Sports: football, cross country (girls & boys), field hockey, soccer (girls & boys), swimming (girls), volleyball (girls & boys), Unified bowling.

Note: Weather will have an impact upon outdoor sports in some parts of the state in March and potentially early April. Girls Tennis moved to Season III.

#### Season III (Spring Sports)

Dates: Apr. 5-Jun. 12 (Week 40-49) -10 Weeks

Sports: baseball, softball, golf (girls & boys), lacrosse (girls & boys), tennis (girls & boys), outdoor track & field (girls & boys), Unified basketball.

Please note that all dates listed above are tentative. All decisions regarding a return to interscholastic sports require the approval of the New York State Department of Health and the New York State Education Department. The district will continue to update families as new information is made available.



## Music Hall under new management



COHOES — The city has named a new management team to take the reins of its storied music hall on Remsen Street.

Playhouse Stage Company will now manage Cohoes Music Hall supplanting the services of Music Hall Arts Alliance, Inc., which has overseen the venue over nearly three years. The decision, announced at a press conference on Thursday, July 23, closes the curtain on the city's three-month process to select a new management group following Mayor Bill Keeler's recommendation to terminate the contracts it had with both entities.

Playhouse Stage Company emerged out of an initial field of six applicants who submitted proposals for the management position. As of last week, that field was whittled down to three, which pitted the theatre company against Guthrie/ Bell Productions and Music Hall Arts Alliance, Inc.

Playhouse Stage Company is a division of Albany Park Playhouse which has maintained a presence in the region's arts scene for more than 30 years. Earning the city's contract to manage the music hall is yet another accolade for the company born after Park Playhouse moved to Cohoes in 2018. That move was credited

Music Hall Arts Alliance called for the city to pay a management fee of \$90,000. In turn, the city would have received \$2.50 for each ticket sold. Last season, the City Hall received back \$38,000.

"Regrettably, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic it has not been possible to have performances at the Music Hall since March, and will not be for the foreseeable future," Keeler said in a statement. "However, I am planning for the time,

perhaps 2021, hopefully sooner, when the lights are back on and the seats are filled. I envision an eclectic mix of professional and community programs - theater, music, comedy, dance – that will appeal to people of all ages and interests. None of that would be possible if we did not take the actions we are taking now."

Theatres across New York closed their doors to the public in mid-March amid state-mandated novel coronavirus-related

shutdowns. The shutdowns meant to mitigate the spread of the virus have caused a strain on the economy as it has limited public access to only businesses deemed essential.

Brown said her management company maintained the Music Hall off an annual budget of approximately \$450,000, 20 percent of which was from the city. The city agreed to those terms prior to Keeler taking office in January.

Kelly Kavanaugh, a Colonie resident, lost her father during the pandemic. She is still grappling with the loss of her father and the lack of a proper funeral to honor his life.

"It's the last thing you can do for them and you can't do it the right way," Kavanaugh said. Her father was in a nursing home, so she had not seen him since March. About a month later, he took a turn for the worse.

The nursing home would only allow his wife to see him for an hour on the day of his death. "She was begging them to let her stay," Kavanaugh said. However, his wife was forced to leave. He died four hours later of complications of Parkinson's. Kavanaugh said that she still struggles with the fact that he had to be alone at his death.

For Kavanaugh, this was only the beginning of her heartbreak. She could not have a wake or a mass, and the funeral was limited to 10 people. "I never had closure. I never saw him after the nursing home mandate," she said. Family members who live far away, like Kavanaugh's brother, could not attend the funeral.

But Kavanaugh said she also lost the ability to reminisce about her father's life. She spoke about the loss of sharing funny stories and anecdotes about her father with others as a way to find peace. "It was like it didn't even happen," she said. Today, Kavanaugh is

still mourning the loss of her father, his solitary death and the lack of a customary funeral. This is a common burden those who lost loved ones during the pandemic are facing.

For religious leaders, it has also been challenging trying to adapt traditions to meet health guidelines. For Rabbi Robert Kasman from Temple Beth El of Troy, Zoom has become a tool in officiating funerals from afar. So far, Kasman has performed three Zoom funerals during the pandemic. However, several other

speaking of her father who died alone because virus-related mandates restricted visits. His subsequent funeral was limited to 10 people, and family members traveling from out of town could not attend.

Jewish traditions have been modified.

It is customary for Jews to bury someone as soon as possible after the time of death. However, Kasman spoke of new challenges faced when family passes away in a different state and there is a 14-day quarantine mandate. "If you are a culture that relies on burying as soon as possible, you can understand how strange it is to wait 14 days," Kasman said.

Kasman also spoke of the difficulties with the reception at some cemeteries inhibiting the ability to properly perform the funeral service. "Everybody is feeling rushed," he said, saying people are doing what they can to honor their loved ones.

In the Catholic sect, services are also feeling the urgency. Father David Berberian, the priest for St. Thomas the Apostle Church, said obstacles arise when someone needs a holy service, like an anointment, within a day or two and the church is left to organize everything. Typically, services like anointments are reserved about a week in advance.

The constant changes are only exacerbating confusion, with the church only able to accommodate 20 percent of its capacity, or 150 people, at a time. St. Thomas, a congregation with 1,400 regular parishioners, has been forced to scale down its services for the grieving and regular mass.

"Obviously now, there is no holy water and no draping of the cloth over the casket," Berberian said. "We can have communion but everyone must be masked, social distancing and following certain rules."

As you enter St. Thomas, you sign a visitor's form and fill out a questionnaire of potential COVID-19 symptoms. After a squirt of hand sanitizer, you can enter the common areas.

"We're allowed to have a service here now, as opposed to early in the pandemic when we would be graveside or at the funeral home," Berberian said. The "We've been on weekly calls with our resources learning about the different restrictions in place and what that means for us."

funeral home arranges for religious instruction at a burial service.

Despite the proverbial roadblocks of the pandemic, clergy and employees are still providing families with the comforts needed post-death. St. Thomas offers a pastoral care team, which provides grieving families with whatever is needed in the following days.

"We really try to keep in touch as people navigate the difficulty of grief," Berberian concluded. "If you are faced with a situation like this, don't hesitate to reach out. Don't go through it alone."

Although the grass at her father's grave has not grown in yet, Kavanaugh said that she still needs to move forward for her children. "There's a loneliness that comes from losing a parent, but I try not to get upset in front of my kids," she said. "I have to continue to put one foot in front of the other."

While people like Kavanaugh are forced to process their grief without normal channels, the places that serve the grieving are also affected by the most prolific worldwide health crisis in recent history.

the different restrictions in place and what that means for us."

The restrictions? Well, while funeral homes were deemed essential businesses, funerals themselves were not. Churches closed down, making it hard to find religious services. Funeral homes were reduced to providing private services, meaning only immediate family could attend. However, no instructions were given as to what constituted "immediate family" or the number of people that could accommodate. While the funeral

home is still offering all of its services and has had no problems with purchasing merchandise needed for it, the circumstances changed. Even cemeteries regulated the amount of people graveside, despite it being outdoors.

Rutski mentioned how the quick shutdown left heads spinning for many families in the weeks after COVID-19 first spiked. Rutski and Applebee were providing services for a burial at Saratoga National Cemetery. That Thursday, everything was already starting to shut down. By the time the service was over, an employee of the cemetery approached Applebee and Rutski and told them they wouldn't be able to come back for a service scheduled the following Tuesday, as the cemetery was closing that afternoon.

"We need the death certificate and permits to be able to provide the service, and when everything is closed, it becomes difficult," Applebee said. The state implemented an electronic death certificate database, speeding up the process between the doctors, the courts and the funeral homes immediately after the decedent dies. But, the small decrease in time came at a big price for the families.

time came at a big price for the families. "Because we couldn't have people flying in for the funerals, the process from death to burial has been expedited into about two days," Rutski said. "Normally, we'd be waiting up to a week

sometimes for family." The funeral home has also shortened calling hours, Applebee said, resulting in less

traffic. What was once a sidewalk full of people along Kenwood Avenue whenever a service took place is now a slow stream, with those who are permitted under state guidelines paying respects and leaving quicker than a traditional wake. Applebee and Rutski also noted those attending services must be masked inside and

practice social distancing. "You can't advertise the services are happening because it can't be public," Rutski said, with Applebee adding many people are looking to the funeral home's website for information on deaths and services. In almost all obituaries, families mention public memorials will be taking place after the pandemic, a time society still can't predict, especially with restrictions varying on an almost-daily basis.

"One of the things I see us keeping around after this is tons of hand sanitizer," Applebee said. "People are going to be so used to cleaning their hands, and will still be on edge, that I intend to keep it around."

Kavanaugh noted the amended services are understandable but added there are certain things in life you can't reschedule. "He deserved more than this... he deserved to have people remember the good about him," Kavanaugh said.

"I know we're not alone," she concluded. "There are many people who died during this time who didn't die of [COVID-19.] It just doesn't make it any easier."





## Common signs of mental health, substance abuse

oung adulthood is a period of incredible transition marked by personal growth and a newfound sense of independence. Many young adults confront that transition while simultaneously dealing with a mental health issue or substance abuse disorder. According to the Substance Abuse and Mental Health

Learning to recognize these common signs may compel young adults to seek treatment, while loved ones who notice any of the following signs can encourage men and women to seek treatment.

- Trouble sleeping or oversleeping
- Loss of interest in hobbies and friends
- Feelings of anxiousness
- Changes in overall energy levels
- Changes in appetite and weight
- Feelings of hopelessness
- Difficulty in daily functioning
- Extreme mood changes
- Thoughts of suicide

Services Administration, young adults between the ages of 18 and 25 had a higher prevalence of serious mental illness when compared to adults between the ages of 26 and 49 and adults age 50 and older. In addition, SAMHSA notes that more than five million young adults report having a substance use disorder. Such issues can make the transition from teenager to young adult more challenging, potentially compromising young people's ability to live full and independent lives. Treatment is vital

when confronted by mental health or substance use disorders, and far too many young adults report receiving no treatment at all. For example, SAMHSA notes that 87 percent of young adults with substance use disorders report receiving no treatment for their conditions.

The National Institutes of Health urges anyone concerned with their mental health to bring those concerns to the attention of their primary care providers. The NIH notes that people with mental health conditions

can be at risk for other medical conditions, including heart disease and diabetes. In addition, the National Institute on Drug Abuse notes that addiction can increase a person's risk for various diseases, including cancer and HIV/ AIDS.
