Leg pushes Clean Air Act to McCoy

Lafarge, Norlite mentioned often by public speaking in support of legislation that will curb incineration of waste material

ALBANY — The County is one step closer to getting its Clean Air Act.

Legislators adopted the bill with a 32 to 7 vote on Monday, Aug. 10. The bill now moves on to County Executive Dan McCoy, who is expected to sign it into law. Once signed, the legislation will stop new waste facilities in Albany County and keep existing establishments from burning new waste.

“This is an important point as it does not inhibit present operations of any businesses in the county despite some businesses protestations otherwise,” said Legislator Matt Miller (D-Selkirk). “I’m especially happy for the staff and students in the RCS high school and middle school directly across the street from the Lafarge plant where I have spent the last 27 years of my career coaching, teaching and sending my children to school.”

Opponents of the proposed law expressed concerns over the legislature overextending its responsibilities, usurping state and federal regulations, leading to the threat of future lawsuits from two of the companies it seems to target — LafargeHolcim in Ravena

and Norlite in Cohoes.

In February, Norlite was discovered to have burned controversial firefighter foam it received through a contract with the U.S. Department of Defense. Elements of the PFOA and PFOS chemical compounds, known as “forever chemicals,” were detected by a university-led study of the surrounding community of Cohoes. The kiln stopped burning the compound after the city placed a moratorium on the practice. The company has refrained from comments as it is now facing multiple lawsuits.

LafargeHolcim had received a DEC permit to burn tires at its cement processing plant in Ravena. Before it was to start incinerating shredded tires imported from Connecticut, the Town of Coeymans passed a local law similar to that drafted by Albany County. The company has argued that tire-derived fuel is “environmentally progressive” and is permitted through state and federal regulations.

“It is not stacking up a body count. There’s not a lot of deaths, or evidence that it’s actually been doing something. The evidence is not really there,” said Aaron Kelsey, area environmental manager for Lafarge. “Now, there’s a lot of evidence that has been put around

contaminants from burning tires in the open. But, that is not the case of what Lafarge has been permitted to do.”

Legislator Paul Burgdorf voiced his opposition to the law, saying it was a “classic overreach.”

“I have as much of an interest in clean air in Albany County and New York state as you do,” said the Colonie Republican, “but, I think what you’re doing here today is a classic overreach.” He confirmed Lafarge is permitted to burn tires, and that it was approved by those more qualified than Albany County. “Scientists who do nothing but this every day actually approved and

negotiated that permit.”

Lafarge’s kiln system went through a substantial \$500 million upgrade in 2016. The Switzerland-based company had received approval from the state Department of Environmental Conservation in 2006 to accept up to 4.8 million tires a year. That permit was previously reported to have expired two years ago. A company spokesperson said it still holds a Title V permit through the EPA.

“The reason why Lafarge has made a substantial investment in new scrubbers at their facility is because the EPA sued them, because they were violating the Clear Air Act

in very serious ways for years,” said Judith Enck, former EPA regional administrator.

In 2010, Lafarge and two of its subsidiaries agreed to spend up to \$170 million to install controls that would reduce emissions of nitrogen oxide and sulfur dioxides at their cement plants across the country. In the complaint, the company was accused of modifying one or more of its facilities without first obtaining proper permits and allegedly failed to install pollution control equipment as required by the Clean Air Act.

Similar laws as the one passed by the legislature in Maryland and Pennsylvania

have recently been contested in court leading concerns over future litigation, but the lawyer responsible for guiding those laws said there is no concern.

“I mention these because some of the legal threats being brought by Lafarge are focusing on the notion that they’re Constitutional problems that make them vulnerable. They’re arguing that equal protection and due process are reasons why this can be sued over, and as if they would win,” said Michael Ewall, of Energy Justice Network. “I just want to give folks the confidence that there are not legal concerns as far as that goes.”

More expensive to peddle tobacco

Tobacco sellers will need to obtain a license through Town Hall in Bethlehem

DELMAR — Stores selling tobacco products in Bethlehem will need a town issued license to do so after January 1.

The Board voted 3 to 1 in favor of implementing a new licensing requirement on Wednesday, Aug. 12. It requires vendors obtain a license and pay related fees each year. The mandate applies to any vendor peddling products that contain tobacco leaf or nicotine, including vapor products. Paraphernalia, such as separately-sold cartridges, vaping liquids or pipes, is included.

The new requirement

prevents retailers from selling vapor products within 1,000 feet of schools, but does not limit the sale of other tobacco products.

Municipalities with such licensing programs vary between absorbing costs incurred during the process or extending those costs in the form of fees to the businesses which seek them.

Robert Leslie, director of Economic Development and Planning, shared three examples of communities that charge. Town of Manheim, with a population of 3,300 people in Herkimer County, has a \$200 application and \$200 approval fee for a total cost of \$400. The Village of Dolgeville, with a population of 2,200 people in Herkimer County, has only a \$200 application fee. The City of Yonkers also charges a \$200 fee. In comparison, town businesses will pay a \$130 application fee and a \$140

approval fee — a total of \$270.

"We don't want to make this burdensome on our local businesses, and I don't think this is," said Dan Coffey. The town board member said the goal is not to profit through

licensing. "I think the goal is to recapture the amount of time it takes our staff to process this paperwork," he said.

This legislation is an extension of the town's initial effort to curb the sale of vape products

to children. The Board imposed the first of two, six-month moratoriums last June after the town received a building permit application for a vape shop neighboring Elsmere Elementary School on Delaware Avenue.

At the same time, published studies depicting prevalent use of flavored vape products among teenagers initiated legislators to take action. In July, New York became the fourth state in the country to ban the sale of flavored vape products.

Jim Foster, who opposed the new program, questioned the need for it in the presence of new state legislation. He also described the burden of cost associated with processing licenses as "a work by the town's own creation."

"The landscape has changed a lot since this was initially on the table," said Foster, noting the annual costs will pose a "significant impact" for businesses over time. "I think many of the benefits that were hoped to be achieved with the licensing program have essentially been preempted."

Robert Wright sold

Wright family, who owned waste management biz since 1949, will continue to manage business day-to-day for Waste Connections

SLINGERLANDS — Robert Wright Disposal has been owned by the same family since 1949, up until recently.

The Wright family shared with its customers that their business is now a Waste Connections company, the third largest waste management company in North America. The sale took effect on August 1, but as seamlessly as it has appeared to customers, the family said it will continue to be so.

“The change will not affect your service in any way,” Jerry Wright stated in a letter to customers. The Wrights will continue to manage the business, and the truck fleet will continue to bear the family name. Customers will still write checks out to Robert Wright Disposal, Inc. Wright said several factors led to the transfer.

“Over the last few years, I have struggled with increased trucking regulations, insurance requirements, and the nationwide shortage of commercial truck drivers,” Wright said.

Robert Wright Disposal was started by Jerry’s father, Robert shortly after he

returned from fighting in World War II.

“Dad was part of the greatest generation, a WWII veteran who was injured by artillery fire while manning a machine gun in the mountains of Italy,” Jerry said. “Dad... came home and started a business and family in Delmar, the town he was born in.”

Robert Wright Disposal had used transfer stations and recycling facilities owned by Waste Connections in recent years.

Waste Connections mailed Wright’s letter to customers, along with a company statement and a service agreement. Customers were encouraged to sign the new agreement

with a 10 percent reduction in their monthly charge over the next two years, and one free month of service.

Waste Connections is a publicly owned company whose shares sell in both the New York Stock Exchange and the Toronto Stock Exchange. The company employs approximately 16,000 people, with headquarters in both Vaughan, Ontario and The Woodlands, Texas.

Waste Connections operates both the Colonie and Dunn landfills in Cohoes and Rensselaer, respectively. Sierra Processing, in Albany; Troy Transfer; and Clifton Park Transfer are also listed among the company’s operations.

With the merger, Robert Wright Disposal now falls under the same umbrella as County Waste which provides services to Albany, Fulton, Montgomery, Rensselaer, Saratoga, Schenectady and Schoharie counties.

“The Wrights have built their company over the last 71 years with a proud tradition of consistent quality local service; a tradition that we will certainly continue through this transition,” stated a spokesperson from Waste Connections.

Ruthman, Rex Shiels 1942 - 2020

GUILDERLAND — Rex Shiels Ruthman, 78, passed away peacefully at his home in Guilderland on Wednesday, August 12th, 2020. He was married on October 15, 1972, to the love of his life, Elisabeth Anne (née Busuttill), with whom he enjoyed a transcendent partnership at home and at work spanning decades and continents. A proud and committed husband, father, and friend, Rex formed enduring bonds through his unmatched generosity and love that remain unbroken by his passing.

Born on May 11, 1942 in Highland Park, IL, Rex was raised in Spooner, WI

and San Francisco, CA before arriving in Delmar, NY in 1958. A graduate of Bethlehem Central High School (1960), SUNY Albany (1964), and Albany Law School (1967). Rex's legal career as a standout attorney spanned four decades at prominent Albany, NY firms. These included Carter & Conboy (1967-1969), Tate & Tate (1969-1974), Tate, Tate, Bishko & Ruthman (1974-1984), and Ruthman, Feinberg & Dumas in (1984-1994), which he founded at 1707 Central Avenue with Edward Feinberg, Esq. and Charles Dumas, Esq.

Throughout the course

of his successful legal career, Rex was civically engaged as a member of the Board of Directors of the Legal Aid Society of Northeastern New York (1969-1979), acted as Village Attorney for the Village of Colonie (1969-1979), and was affiliated with numerous professional associations. He was fiercely proud of his alma maters and served on his high school reunion committee, was a Member of the University at Albany Foundation (1989), was Chairman of the Dean's Advisory Council (2005), and could be found judging myriad Albany Law School moot court competitions over the years.

Following a successful career in construction and contract litigation, Rex transitioned into real estate finance, development, and property management with his steadfast business partner of over three decades, Edward Feinberg. Together, they financed and developed several multifamily projects throughout the Capital Region including Adams

Station Apartments in Delmar, NY, where Rex worked seamlessly alongside his beloved wife Elisabeth, who managed the community with passion and empathy for over 2 decades.

With his unique vision, Rex understood that longer lifespans required creation of innovative "active-adult" middle-market communities for the "young old" to age in place with dignity and autonomy, culminating in development of The Spinney at Pond View in Castleton-on-Hudson, NY and The Spinney at Van Dyke in Delmar, NY. Rex took enormous pride in his work, and even greater satisfaction knowing that The Spinney Group would remain a family enterprise stewarded by a second generation of leadership.

A polymath and autodidact of Renaissance Man proportions, Rex immersed himself in his interests with heartfelt passion and intensity, cherishing high and low-brow culture alike. A notorious night-owl, Rex

had a voracious appetite for literature, classical music and film, and could always be found at local theaters catching the latest movie. He was a man of great sensibility whose deepest expressions endure in the many poems he wrote throughout his life. A devoted fan of the NY Giants, he worshipped the ground walked upon by Bill Parcells and was a founding member of the Albany Giants Club, basking in the glory of their 1986 and 1990 Superbowl runs from the stands. Most importantly, he explored the world with his beloved wife, spending magical summers in Menton, France and intimate winters in Saint Augustine, Florida, where they shared their love of each other with family and friends. An anti-fashion icon, his trademarked socks and sandal look carried him on his epic walks along the sunny promenades of the French Riviera, and will now carry him on his long walk into eternity.

Above all, Rex was fervently devoted to his wife, with whom he shared

the deepest possible bond, and his family. Rex was deeply philosophical and reflective, and through his mentorship was an enormous force and influence on so many lives. Although his commanding presence will be missed, the spirit of his brilliance, ideas, generosity and laughter will endure in our hearts. He is survived by his adoring wife of 48 years, Elisabeth, sons Alexander (Lorayne) and Morgan (Dana), grandchildren Charlotte, Orion, Elodie, and Abigail, brothers Steven (Linda) and Alex (Dorothy), sister-in-law Genevieve Blauveau, brother-in-law Georges (Nina) Busuttill and beloved lifelong friends Herbert and Nancy Steele.

The Board conducted the first of three interviews on Wednesday morning. Board members are expected to vet the candidates and present their thoughts to Town Supervisor David VanLuven. VanLuven will appoint the town's newest police chief in 17 years before the board officially approves the selection.

The town is selecting from a list of candidates based on their standings on the current Albany County civil service list. Once the process concludes, either Cmdr. Adam Hornick, Detective Sgt. Gina Cocchiara or Sgt. Jim Rexford will be the town's next police chief.

Town board members sat and listened to residents who called into its monthly meeting Wednesday, Aug. 12, expressing concerns for transparency in the selection process. Some shared their wishes to see the board choose a more progressive person for the helm. The first speaker set the tone for the evening.

"I truly believe that when it comes to hiring a new police chief, and police reform within our town, that it needs to be transparent. I feel community members should be able to at least sit in on interviews if not being able to ask questions directly," said Jennifer Cardamore.

Residents' concerns were shared during the meeting's public comment section. The section allows attendees to speak to the board without debate. Board members do not comment, nor do they answer direct questions. VanLuven, however, later shared how he and board members have listened to residents through email, social media, conversations and demonstrations. He also shared that the town has met with two police chiefs and a local law enforcement professional from different communities to gain insight into department cultures and community relations.

the insights and recommendations from these interactions into a suite of interview questions that drill into issues of racism, Black Lives Matter, guardian vs. warrior culture, implicit bias, de-escalation, department structure, overtime, budgets, community trust, and more," VanLuven stated in a social media post on Friday.

When Louis Corsi retired from his police chief position in late July, it was the second exodus from the department's command team in as many weeks. Deputy Chief Thomas M. Heffernan, Jr. worked his last day a week before. The absence of both Corsi and Heffernan from the department represents nearly 70 years of collective service experience. Hornick, the last remaining officer on the three-man command team, is ranking member

in charge until the town selects a new chief.

Corsi served a 10-day suspension in 2009 for his use of a racial slur during a January 2006 phone conversation. Residents referenced the 2006 incident on Wednesday as proof of racial bias within the police department.

"Our goal is to hire a new chief as soon as possible who can advance positive police reform, build community trust, and ensure all residents and visitors are safe and feel safe," VanLuven said, adding that new chief will be expected to be involved in community forms, a task force and worked towards exposing racism in town. "Black Lives Matter in Bethlehem – in our government, our schools, and our community – and we are committed to achieving greater justice, equity, and fairness."

Some members of the community are not satisfied with that answer, and if that doesn't change, one voice said they have "no choice but to plan a civil disobedience action."

A group of progressive residents under a Facebook group named Bethlehem NY Indivisible demands a forum that would allow all three candidates to answer questions before the public.

"So far, we have been told that the Supervisor cares, and the town board cares, and that they have heard us and that we should now let them do their work," Emily Marynczak, a moderator of the social media page, stated. "To that, we say, no. Our work is to continue to hold our elected officials accountable."

The Facebook group has less than 700 members, however, its voice is evident in local government.

Membership in the private group includes both VanLuven and town board members Joyce Becker, Maureen Cunningham and Dan Coffey. VanLuven and Cunningham both shared they were each members of the group during the board meeting.

The online group is "open to anyone" who is committed to taking action" in four areas: pro-environment, pro-choice, anti-hate and encouraging people to vote.

The police chief race has been of particular interest to the group in recent weeks. Another such concern is how "our town is built on the power structure of white supremacy."

"Together we can make impactful change so that our laws are applied with equity and that all people can one day feel safe in our town," said Marynczak.

What's up for BC's K-5 kids

Dave Hurst is the Assistant Superintendent for Bethlehem Central School District. The following letter to district parents was shared last week to provide insight on what they could expect during the first week of the school year.

Dear K-5 Family:

I have an important update for K-5 families who may be considering the Family Choice Remote Learning option for their child/ren to begin the 2020-21 school year. This is the full-time learn-from-home option for any family who may have health or safety concerns or otherwise feels uncomfortable about an in-person return to school for their student. In-person instruction for all students K-5 is scheduled to begin in September at all five elementary schools as part of the district's reopening plan. There will be a phased-in start to the school year that begins Wednesday, Sept. 9.

We are still finalizing plans for the Remote Learning model that will be in place for the start of school, however, preliminary data collected from the Remote Learning Option Waiver Form indicates we will be able to revise our K-5 Remote Learning Model to provide a greater balance between synchronous and asynchronous learning for these students. This would



mean more direct teacher connection for remote students throughout the day than had been possible with available instructional staff as part of our original reopening plans.

Synchronous learning is an approach where teachers and students are online at the same time with a set schedule. Learning resources and tasks are provided for students to work on during a set class time.

Asynchronous learning is an approach where teachers and students are not online at the same time. Learning resources and tasks are provided for students to work on at a time that works for them and their families.

The summary below is reflective of the information we have [as of] Aug. 12, and some aspects of this revised Remote Learning model could vary as we work to finalize classroom assignments, staffing assignments and schedules. It is also important to note that this revised model will

not impact other elements of our Reopening Plan, including plans for in-person instruction that adhere to strict CDC health and safety guidelines regarding social distancing in our classrooms and smaller cohorts of students.

What would Remote Learning K-5 look like under the revised model?

Grades K-2 (2 - 2½ hours of synchronous instruction)

- Students will log on to their learning device daily (iPads for kindergarten/Chromebooks for grades 1-2).

- The day will begin with the morning meeting/community building activities, attendance will be taken.

- Students will receive direct instruction in reading, writing, mathematics, science, and social studies. In most cases, this synchronous instruction would not be delivered consecutively, but in periods throughout the school day.

- Instruction in all other

curricular areas will be asynchronous.

- Students will be connected with a teacher/class for approximately 2 to 2 ½ hours each day.

Grades 3-5 (2½ - 3 hours of synchronous instruction)

- Students will log on to their Chromebooks.

- The day will begin with the morning meeting/community building activities, attendance will be taken.

- Students will receive direct instruction in reading, writing, mathematics, science, and social studies. In most cases, this synchronous instruction would not be delivered consecutively, but in periods throughout the school day.

- Instruction in all other curricular areas will be asynchronous.

- Students will be connected with a teacher/class for approximately 2 ½ to 3 hours each day.

For those families who choose K-5 Remote

Learning, please be aware that students who return to in-person instruction mid-year are not guaranteed a spot at their home school. Teacher and building placements will be determined by available teaching staff and sections, student demand and most importantly, by the health and safety measures that are governed by CDC guidelines.

If you are interested in enrolling your student in Remote Learning for the 2020-21 school year, please fill out this form and read carefully before submitting. Students in Remote Learning will not be able to return to in-person instruction until the start of a new quarter, which is Nov. 16, for those students who begin the school year enrolled in Remote Learning.

Families can verify their remote learning selection in Aspen. Instructions on how to do this can be found here. Please allow at least 24 hours after filling out the form to check your status in Aspen.

Plans to re-open

At their August meeting, the library's Board of Trustees discussed how to begin phasing in additional library services, including in-person library browsing. Although library staff have worked hard to get actual books, DVDs and Library of Things items into your hands through curbside pickup, Book Bundles and the Pop-Up Library, we know that the experience of looking through the shelves for something that catches your eye is hard to replicate.

As staff and trustees continue to work out the details and timing involved in bringing back this in-library service, please know that it remains our highest priority to protect the health of our community. We will continue to follow strict safety standards when handling library materials and interacting with you.

That means that when we do open our doors, your library experience is going to look a little different than pre-pandemic times. You'll be able to "shop" for your books, but there will be limits on the number of people in the building at one time. Public meeting spaces will not be available, as well as access to computers and other



in-house library technology. Children's toys and library seating have been removed, and patrons will be asked to wear masks and limit their time inside the library to selecting and checking out their materials.

This will be a big change for all of us who have come to see the library as a place to gather with friends and neighbors.

Fine waiver extension

Throughout the library's closure, we have been waiving late fees on overdue materials. The last thing we wanted anyone to worry about was getting charged for items they were unable to return. Recently, the Upper Hudson Library System resumed sending out overdue notices, but with everyday life and schedules still far from normal, we will continue

waiving late fees through the end of October.

If you have items that you are ready to return, you can bring them to the library 24/7 and use the numbered drop-off sheds in our parking lot. Library materials are quarantined for 96 hours and may not show up as checked in for up to a week.

Staycation cinema

We have dozens of themed binge boxes to check out, available at our Pop-Up Library and to request for curbside pickup. With binge boxes, you can choose from themes like "Don't Mess with Denzel" or "You'll Ugly Cry" and you'll get a pre-selected set of 4-6 films that fit the bill. 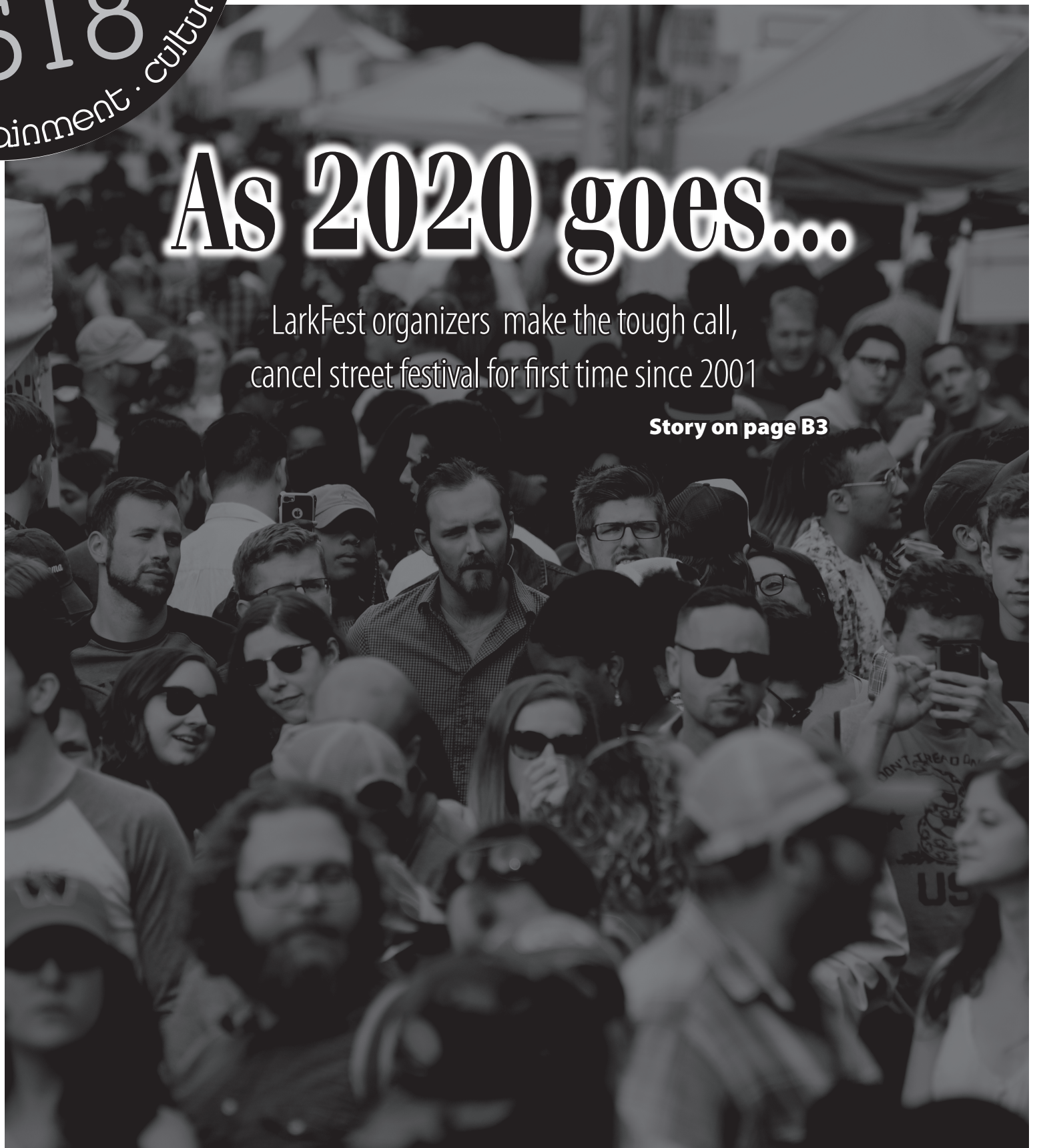

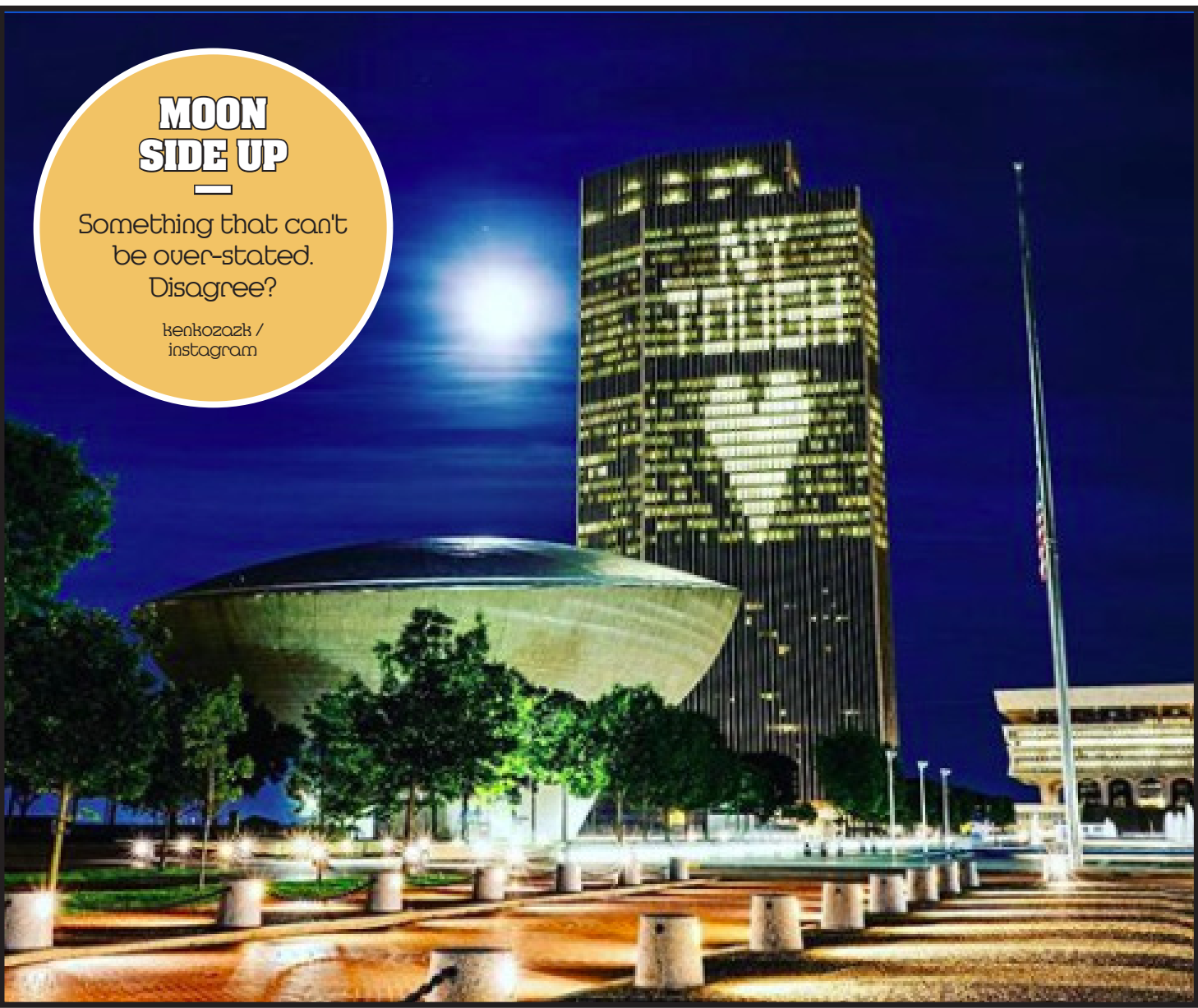

LarkFest knocked out by the bug

Annual street festival canceled for first time since 2001

ALBANY — As 2020 goes, so does LarkFest.

Organizers of the annual street festival made it official late last week. A statement from the Lark Street BID shared what the rest of the Capital District had already assumed. No live music. No street vendors. No LarkFest for 2020.

Touted as the largest one-day street festival in New York, LarkFest features top-tier local musicians on stages that bookend street vendors peddling a variety of exotic foods, arts and services. It highlights the diverse character of Lark Street that often draws comparisons to New York City.

“To us, LarkFest is a celebration of everything unique and exciting about Lark Street, and the creative culture of the greater Capital Region of New York,” Lark Street BID said in a statement last Friday. “This year, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we are unable to hold this event we so dearly cherish.”

It’s the first time LarkFest has been canceled since 2001. The festival was canceled shortly after the terrorist attacks of 9/11.

Since state-mandated shutdowns were enforced in March, establishments have slowly opened back for

business. However, CDC suggestions have molded a new overall experience defined by masks, social distancing and limited crowd sizes.

Farmers Markets, like the one in Washington Park, have been allowed

to reopen through Gov. Andrew Cuomo’s tiered opening schedule. Those require vendors wear masks, and several more markets aid customers by marking the ground to encourage social distancing. LarkFest, which commonly

packs the block each year, would not have maintained safe distancing.

“The safety of our community always has been, and will continue to be, our highest priority,” said Lark Street BID.

Student entrepreneurs having an impact upon their community before graduating college

Recently, Namkoong has started to take clothes around her house that were about to be donated and sew them for sale. "I found I really enjoyed taking old things and making them new," she said.

Half of Namkoong's proceeds go toward the Black Trans Travel Fund, an organization that provides safe transportation for Black trans women in New York and New Jersey to prevent assaults on public transportation. Namkoong said, "I felt really good about giving to an organization where you can see the local effects of your donations." So far, Namkoong has raised over \$1,000 for the Black Trans Travel Fund from LivThread.

Namkoong's best friend, Dahlia Earleywine, also started a business to raise donations. Earleywine is currently fundraising for the Equal Justice Initiative to end mass incarceration and excessive punishment. Earleywine creates earrings to sell locally and donates 100 percent of her profits.

"If I was making a profit, it would be a matter of a couple of hundred dollars, and I realized that I don't need that," she said.

Earleywine said that she feels she has been successful. "If my initial goal was to raise money as a hobby for a good cause, then yes, I would

say I am successful," she said. Earleywine said she is proud of her and the other Instagram businesses because they are "healthy for the community."

Modish Mango, the business started by Preller, is also a sustainable business that helps the community and charities.

Like the other accounts, Preller started hers about a month ago. "I was thinking of what I've always loved: art and fashion. And as a public health major, I've always been interested in social issues," she said. For Preller, starting a business to raise money for the Black Trans Femmes in the Arts Collective seemed like a natural next step.

Preller makes clothing that is completely sustainable and environmentally friendly. Prior to starting Modish Mango, she designed tote bags that raised over \$300 for charity. "Everyone can give in some way," she said. And for Preller, Modish Mango has been her way of giving back.

These three gifted women have created an opportunity for sustainable and ethical fashion in Bethlehem. Each of them spoke about the desire to help others, uplift Black voices, and remain environmentally conscious. Their impact can be seen through their success as the accounts continue to grow.

Pack extra clothing

Extra clothing is vital on a remote hiking excursion for a number of reasons. In addition, extra clothing can help hikers stay warm if they suffer an injury while hiking and need to camp overnight once the sun goes down.

Remote hiking trails provide perfect opportunities to experience

remote areas as extra clothing. Extra food can make emergency situations more manageable, helping people avoid hunger if they need to camp overnight or simply keep their energy up on long hikes. Trail mix tends to be high in calories and full of protein, making it an ideal, easily packed food to bring along on a hiking trip.

Don't go it alone

Solo hiking can be a great way to connect with nature, but it's always best to hike remote areas with at least one other person. Hiking in pairs ensures someone is there to seek help if a hiker is injured and rendered immobile while out on the trails.

Let others know where you are

If going on a solo hike or even with a partner, share your location and intended hiking route with a loved one who is not coming along for the hike. Let this person know

when you intend to return and that you will call them when you safely make it back to your vehicle. If the call never comes, your loved one can then alert the appropriate authorities and share detailed information about where you are hiking.

Bring maps

Pack a road map showing the way to the trail and a map of the park itself. Remote areas may not have the best internet connections, rendering car GPS systems useless. And a printed map of the park can help hikers reduce their risk of getting lost once inside the park. Pick up or order a map of the park in the days prior to your trip. Don't wait until you arrive at the park to get a map, as the park may not have any on hand.

Hiking remote areas is an ideal activity in the age of social distancing. But safety must be a priority on such trips.

How to hike safely in remote areas

Many people have rediscovered the great outdoors in the wake of the COVID-19 outbreak. Social distancing measures have greatly restricted indoor gatherings, but outdoor activities,

After the lazy days of summer, fall often arrives with packed schedules and everyone getting back on track, whether for work or school. Busy families may not have much time to spend in the kitchen these days, but they don't need to devote hours to cooking. Even quick meals can serve up significant flavor.

In the time it takes to boil rice, this recipe for "Creamy Rice With Roasted Shrimp and Tomatoes," courtesy of "Real Simple Dinner Tonight: Done" (Time Home Entertainment) from the editors of Real Simple, can be put on the table. Arborio rice makes this dish creamy, but if it's unavailable, long-grain rice also can be used — just follow the package directions for cooking.

Creamy Rice With Roasted Shrimp and Tomatoes

Ingredients: Serves 4

- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- 1 onion, finely chopped
- 1 cup Arborio rice
- 1 cup dry white wine

Kosher salt and black pepper

- 1 pound peeled and deveined medium shrimp
- 2 pints grape tomatoes
- 8 sprigs fresh thyme
- 2 cloves garlic

Instructions

Heat oven to 400 F. Heat 1 tablespoon of the oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the onion and cook until soft, 5 to 7 minutes. Add the rice and wine and cook, stirring, until the wine is absorbed, 1 to 2 minutes.

Add 2 cups water and 1/4 teaspoon each salt and pepper to the saucepan. Simmer, covered, until the water is absorbed and the rice is tender, 18 to 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, on a rimmed baking sheet, toss the shrimp, tomatoes, thyme, and garlic with the remaining tablespoon of oil and 1/2 teaspoon each salt and pepper. Roast until the shrimp are opaque throughout, 15 to 20 minutes. Serve over the rice.
