SABIC leak resembles Ohio incident in which 'catastrophic explosion' avoided

SELKIRK — The railcar responsible for leaking styrene gas, forcing authorities to issue evacuation orders and scramble several state and federal agencies into action, had sat at the SABIC plastics plant for more than three months.

When compared to the details surrounding a 2005 incident in Cincinnati, Ohio, that time may have played a factor in the accident.

According to the state Department of Conservation's ongoing investigation, the railcar arrived at SABIC on May 26. The railcar containing approximately 180,000 gallons of liquid styrene monomer had remained at the plastics plant since its arrival.

Styrene monomer is transported by tanker car where temperatures are monitored to prevent spontaneous polymerization. It is flammable and highly volatile, so an inhibitor is used to prevent a reaction from occurring. High temperatures and the passage of time, however, will reduce the effect of the inhibitor as it breaks down.

The DEC continues to investigate the cause of the accident. Falling short of attributing cause, a spokesperson proceeded to describe an "exothermic reaction" and its "potential to result in an explosion" when asked to recount the Sept. 1 incident.

RCS teen charged with terroristic threat

Student allegedly threatened to shoot class, elementary school during class lesson

RAVENA — A Ravena Coeymans Selkirk high school student was arrested at school after he allegedly declared he wanted to "shoot up the school" on Wednesday, Sept. 16.

A Sheriff's School Resource Officer assigned to the Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk High School was notified by a staff member that while class was in session, an unnamed 17-year-old male student had allegedly made a threat to other students and the teacher by saying "I want to shoot up the school and the elementary school."

After a quick investigation, the resource officer placed the juvenile into custody. Sheriff's "The incident of a verbal threat while on school property, regardless of the reason, is a serious violation of the RCS Code of Conduct. The school district has a zerotolerance policy regarding incidents that infringe on the rights and safety of students and staff within our school district."

Investigators and Deputies also searched the student's home which did not reveal any further concerns.

The following day, RCS High School Principal

Lisa Patierne expressed her appreciation for the students and staff member who reported the incident in an email to district parents.

"As always, we are appreciative of the students

and staff member who came forward and their effort in keeping our schools safe," Patierne stated. "The incident of a verbal threat while on school property, regardless of the reason, is a serious

violation of the RCS Code of Conduct. The school district has a zero-tolerance policy regarding incidents that infringe on the rights and safety of students and staff within our school district." Patierne assured parents that appropriate action was taken

The student was charged with a felony count of Making a Terroristic Threat and was later arraigned at County Family Court.

Ring the bells for Selkirk Fire

Selkirk Fire District pitches new station with no tax increase


SELKIRK — The Fire District is proposing a new station across from Lasher Road on Route 9W and renovations to the existing Station 2 in Glenmont, a project that is projected to cost \$11.8 million.

The presented plan includes no tax increase for Selkirk Fire District residents and is aimed at increasing safety and efficiency for the volunteer firefighters that cover the

The vote for the station will take place on Oct. 6, from 1 to 9 p.m., at any three of the Selkirk Fire District stations. For more information on the plan, visit selkirkfire2020.org.

"The ability to pay for this new station was built into the budget in the last five years by the commissioners, who knew a new station was imminent," Daniel Wagoner, capitan of Station 1 in Selkirk, said. "We are using the

"This is for my kids, my grandkids and everyone who will be walking through those doors in the future. A band aid approach will not solve the problem here. This plan will meet the needs of this district going forward."



most conservative financial estimates possible. There is absolutely no tax increase for residents."

Station 3 Captain Rob Messenger showed the proposal to about 40 people last Tuesday. The plan for the new station, which would be located adjacent to A.W. Becker Elementary School, includes a 23,573 square foot building with six drive-through bays. Messenger cited the need for drive-through bays after reading that several



new fire station Modern equipment barely fits inside fire stations built generations ago.

firefighters across the nation have been killed in accidents where drivers do not see the spotters helping to back the trucks in and hits them. Bays will also be taller, allowing for the evolution of firetruck designs and more space for modern equipment. The proposed headquarters scrapped the bunk rooms and museum mentioned in the failed 2018 plan, which residents voted down an \$18 million project with

an average tax increase of

\$100 per resident. The 2020 proposal also scaled down the remaining plans.

Station 2's upgrades include two new, taller, drive-through bays and a re-work of the existing building to allow for more space for decontamination, including walling off the existing bays. The renovation measures 3,276 square feet. Pierce Communications president Jonathan Pierce said none of Selkirk's three stations currently have a

decontamination zone, or a place where firefighters coming back from a call can strip down from polluted gear and keep it away from common spaces or their homes.

"There is an increased risk of cancer for firefighters due to the number of toxins they are exposed to," Messenger said. "It is imperative we provide areas for dirty turnout gear so we don't stay in it any longer than we have to."

Bob Mitchell, architect for Mitchell Associates Architects in Voorheesville, said move-in day for the new station, if approved, would be around April 2022. If the plan is approved in October, it will take five months for preliminary drawings to be done. After that, the project will go to bid in March. Bidding takes one month, which would put the beginning of construction in April 2021, starting a 12to 14-month build. From completion, it would take about a year for everything to fall into place.

"This is the time to do this," Messenger said. "We know a lot is going on right now in the world, but this upgrade and new station is for the safety of our team."

David DeCancio, a member of a resident committee to help create the proposal, said not approving the plan is "kicking the can down the road," adding recruitment and retaining existing membership will be hard without upgraded equipment.

Highway czar sorry for \$150K overdraft

A \$296K pavement bill pushes budget off balance for Feura Bush Road compost facility

BETHLEHEM —

Marc Dorsey will ask the Town Board if he can take \$150,000 from capital reserve funds when it meets again on Wednesday, Sept. 23. The first-term superintendent of highways exceeded his budget by that amount and extended his apologies while providing board members with an explanation in his memorandum to them.

The overdraft stems from a \$295,722 paving bill Dorsey's department received in August for work done on the town's compost facility on Feura Bush Road. The amount exceeded his budget for the project which was based on a three-year-old estimate.

Town purchasing policy requires unbudgeted projects that are to exceed \$20,000 be first approved by the board.

"I sincerely apologize if my understanding of the rules and requirements in this process was incorrect, and if I therefore inadvertently violated town purchasing policy or other rules or laws," Dorsey stated. "I also sincerely apologize for this unexpected, significant expense at this time when the town's budget is already severely stressed."

Shortly after both the town supervisor and comptroller received the nearly \$296,000 acquisition order, Supervisor David VanLuven ordered Dorsey to provide an explanation. The explanation provided in costs associated with a

his Sept. 16 memorandum uploaded to the town's website Friday evening lists several of his reasons, including the highway foreman's "substantially" low estimate of three years ago, an underestimated need for detailed "hand work," and his predecessors' overall neglect of the project.

The highway czar also surmised that

stormwater pollution plan may not have been included with the dated estimate.

According to town records, the highway department has a \$7.1 million expenditure budget, but it already includes expected costs associated with highway repairs, snow removal, brush pickup and

Dorsey expressed a need to act under concern

the project would fail to qualify for up to \$238,000 in matching funds from the state Department of Environmental Conservation. The town had previously received a one-year extension following the end of last

"Which was necessary due to inaction by my predecessors," Dorsey stated.

Dorsey also explained that, because the town previously awarded New Castle Paving to be its in-place contractor, he thought costs were already approved. The highway department employed the paving company because it possessed the tools the town did not have to complete the job. Dorsey also said, had he anticipated the job would exceed the project's budget, he would have sought the board's approval first.

This is not the first instance in which Dorsey has struggled with town finance regulations since taking leadership of the highway department in January. In July, he struck the town's ire after it was revealed he sold equipment prior to the board's approval. When the board approved him to sell off \$1,800 of surplus equipment, the check was already in hand.

County Leg lays boom down on fireworks

Law banning groundbased fireworks in Albany County awaits Executive's sign off

ALBANY — The crash and boom of fireworks that were ever-present in Albany County this summer may not repeat itself next year.

County Legislators voted 33-5 to adopt Local Law H of 2020 prohibiting the use and sale of sparkling devices defined as groundbased fireworks. It includes cylindrical or cone fountains and wooden sparkler/ dipped sticks.

The local law repeals a local law adopted in 2016 following the legalization of fireworks in New York

"When we adopted the local law in 2016 we were

under the impression that sparkling devices would be the small hand-held sparklers, but what we got was much worse. There are fireworks exploding in the street, creating sounds that remind me of the mortar rounds that kept me awake while I served in Iraq. It's unacceptable," Chairman Andrew Joyce said. "I admit that I made a mistake voting for legal sparklers in 2016 and opting out of the legislation is a good first start in keeping our communities quiet and

residents will be given another tool in the shed that will hopefully keep our neighborhoods quiet and safe," Ricard said. "While at the same time it will help to alleviate the safety hazards associated with the use of these fireworks upon children, along with the PTSD side effects inflicted upon pets and veterans."

The City of Albany and Albany Police Department received 895 calls for fireworks this year, mistaken sparkling devices and fireworks for gunshots.

"Since 2016, the notable rise in the use of illegal fireworks and misuse of legal sparkler devices across the county has devalued the quality of life for residents in populated areas subjected throughout the summer months by their use. As fireworks laws differ from the state down to local municipalities, and with law enforcement finding it more difficult to differentiate

our residents," Co-Sponsor Raymond Joyce said.

Any person who uses a sparkling device can be issued a fine up to \$500 and any individual who sells or furnishes a sparkling device to another person can be charged with a misdemeanor, punishable with a fine of \$1,000 and 15 days in jail.

Following the vote, the legislation moves to the County Executive for review and approval.

Bethlehem Central will uphold its decision to limit fall competition to low-risk varsity level sports, but it suggested there will be opportunities next spring for those frozen out from playing this autumn.


To preserve opportunities for student participation in soccer and field hockey – sports classified as moderate-risk by the state — Monroe

SABIC

Early photographs from Albany County Sheriffs showed the railcar hitched to several more tankers as firefighters doused it with water in their effort to cool it down. The DEC would neither confirm how high the temperature reached inside the car nor would it say how many more cars contained the monomer.

After the incident, Bethlehem Town Supervisor David VanLuven shared over social media a picture from inside the emergency response room. The picture appears to show representatives from various agencies observing a thermal image, depicting pockets of yellow and orange spots against a field of purple. A label affixed to a crosshair hovering over the brightest spot on the railcar indicated an apparent temperature of 132.7 degrees. Temperatures above the monomer's flashpoint of 88 degrees cause the liquid to form an explosive vapor.

"Exothermic reactions in a closed system have the potential to result in an explosion unless temperature and pressure are properly managed," said Kevin Frazier, a spokesperson for the DEC. "The design purpose of pressure relief valves is to release elevated heat or pressure."

The early morning gas leak prompted authorities to issue evacuation orders to non-essential businesses within a half-mile of the facility and shelter-in-place notices to residents living within an additional mile of the plant.

Representatives from more than a dozen different agencies responded to the accident. They included members of the state DEC, Homeland Security and Emergency Services, New York National Guard Civil Support Team and the governor's office. As firefighters tended to the tanker at the plant, another fleet of emergency vehicles stood at the ready a mile

away at Elm Avenue Park.

The situation was stabilized overnight, allowing authorities to open roadblocks and to let businesses return the following morning. A representative from SABIC later apologized at a press conference but offered no additional information.

In addition to the DEC, the Occupational Safety and Health Administration is conducting a separate investigation.

In recent years, the DEC has fined SABIC

for various violations. In 2015, the plant was slapped with a \$30,000 fine after open chemical valves were observed to bypass the plant's pollution control system, allowing the release of styrene, xylene, methanol and toluene. That incident

followed a series of previous violations in 2011, 2013 and 2014 in which the company was fined a total of \$257,000.

SABIC's most recent incident resembles another accident that occurred in Cincinnati in 2005.

In August 2005, authorities closed an airport and evacuated residents within a one-mile radius of a railcar that was observed to be leaking styrene gas.

AristaTek, a hazardous material handling specialist in Wyoming, reviewed the case and determined time played a factor in that accident. After investigating the details of the Cincinnati incident, it determined handlers of the railcar had erred by allowing it to sit for nine months.

In the specialist's report, the inhibitor likely depleted after just three months.

"The safety valve did the job it was designed to do, to release excessive pressure buildup slowly avoiding a catastrophic explosion," stated the AristaTek report. "The error was that the rail car was allowed to sit there for nine months, during which time the inhibitor became depleted."

the top of a garage at one of Selkirk's stations. Others show volunteers wedged between the truck and a wall as they perform routine maintenance. Pierce said some trucks are too heavy for the existing infrastructure to support and in foul weather, crews

have to go out and pack down snow or ice to make sure the trucks can clear the shorter bays.

"Firefighters cannot currently get in the truck while it's in the bay because it's too narrow and the exhaust from the truck fills

the bay relatively quickly," Pierce said. "It's an unsafe practice, but they will get hurt if they get in before it moves outside."

Wagoner said construction and the firehouse will have a limited effect on traffic, citing the average of one call per day between all three stations.

"We are not married to the design shown here and we are happy to make changes to it if that's what residents want," Messenger said. "We can absolutely move things around."

Messenger also addressed questions about a fire department being so close to a school, answering Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk School District officials are on board with the project and hope it will be a good place for kids to triage if there is a problem at A.W. Becker and parents need to

pick up their children.

Wagoner concluded it is time for the district to move into the 21st century, asking what future members will think if it's not done now. Selkirk is responsible for the majority of Bethlehem's fire districts, including the Port of Albany and the industrial complex on Creble Road. Panelists cited the recent chemical leak at SABIC as an example of why modern

equipment is needed. As development in Bethlehem continues to prosper, the majority of the open land available is located in South Bethlehem.

"This is for my kids, my grandkids and everyone who will be walking through those doors in the future," DeCancio said. "A band aid approach will not solve the problem here. This plan will meet the needs of this district going forward."

earned his job as Bethlehem's Superintendent of Highways through a vote of confidence from us residents. It's an unusual way compared to how the rest of us interviewed and demonstrated our qualifications. Especially difficult for him was that he never worked for the Town let alone its highway department. But, he had practical experience. More than practical experience, he had leadership qualities honed through a career with the military. This was impressive enough for the public to vote him in over a popular incumbent who was getting the job done.

The 2019 race between Dorsey and Tiger Anastasi is not one you could describe as political. In the case between Dorsey and Tiger, there wasn't much to say. Tiger was an Independent, though he ran on the Republican line, too. Dorsey garnered the Democrats endorsement, and so he appeared on the ballot.

We've heard from many who have run on the Republican line how difficult it is to be

Republican today. Whether you agree or not, you must agree that once you identify yourself as Red or Blue you often welcome yourself to a debate. It's iust how it is. 

A sad goodbye to popular drummer

Josh Bloomfield, drummer of Soul Sky, dies at 41

TROY — Josh

Bloomfield was a man of various interests, but the local music scene knew him best as a fine drummer. He was often found behind the drum kit, keeping the beat in check for Soul Sky. In some cosmic sense, he kept true to his timing; he left this world on the same day of the month he came into it — on his birthday, Sept. 15.

He was 41.

Bloomfield was a smaller guy. His obituary pointed to that fact by describing him as "small in stature." That didn't stop him from playing football and, later, boxing. His first love, however, was music. And

the Troy kid could play.

When news of Bloomfield's passing spread, there were plenty of names sharing their memories of him. The Staynz' Brain Goodman remembered how he allowed him an impromptu chance to see his band play from the crowd during a gig at Troy's Positively Fourth Street.

"Mid song Josh comes over to the drums and grabs some sticks and starts playing with me," Goodman said. "We get a grove going, so I stand up and he sits down. I walk off stage and go to the front to watch my band.

"Buck Malen looks up, sees me and gives the best look ever," Goodman said. "He turns around and Josh is in the driver's seat."

Close confidants choose to remember Bloomfield for his quick wit, salty demeanor and generous heart. He was "a prolific comedian and master of bantering." He was also described as someone who was always concerned about the well-being of others.

"Helluva guy and a salty SOB like myself," Scotty Mac said. "We always got along...helluva drummer, too with the best blues shuffle in town.

"I'm not alone when I

say this killed me inside," he said.

Bloomfield was a graduate of School 14, Troy High School, and some might say Siena College since he spent so much time there with his lifelong friend, Eric Rouleau. He had several jobs over the years. His most recent gig was serving with distinction as a New York State civil servant for the last 15 years.

Family and friends were invited to McLoughlin & Mason Funeral Home and a burial service was held at Eagle Mills Cemetery a few days later.

In lieu of flowers, Bloomfield's family asked people to donate to the cholangiocarcinoma fund.

Bloomfield is survived by his parents Daniel and Susan Bloomfield, his grandmother Emily Hebert, several aunts, uncles, cousins, beloved pet Hank and the love of his life Tiana. "The most wonderful son, friend, and forever partner in crime," said his father, Daniel. "I can't say enough about the best guy in the whole world. I love you so much. My heart is broken beyond repair. I love you son, you'll be with many friends in heaven. I'll never forget you pal. Mom and I will love you for eternity. Goodbye for now. Rest easy Bud."

Bloomfield played for several more bands throughout the years. In his last show, he played drums for for Soul Serenade at Powers Park last month. Sitting down, he snapped a picture from behind the drum kit. Symbols and tom drums shining under the lights. The Lansingburgh crowd hidden from view under a dark, summer night. It's one of the last photos on his Facebook page.


"Love this view," Bloomfield wrote.

This time of year reminds me of weekend drives up north with a car stuffed with the life essentials a 20-something needs for college life in the dorms. The two-plus hour drive was marked by apple trees. Just as we grew tired of the mountains, we'd be greeted by hundreds of apple trees after descending from the Adirondacks. It was always the harbinger of a new year, new experiences. When the north wind breaks through the last of the summer heat, these are the days I remember. The next best thing is spending time on one of our local apple orchards.

Pittsburgh babies are born with a Steelers' "Terrible Towel." New Yorkers are born with an apple. Our Hudson Valley is ripe for apple lovers. When Johnny Appleseed went walking through the valleys, as evident by the abundance of orchards in our neighborhood, he spent most of his time here. Only Washington produces more apples. According to the U.S. Department of Agriculture, New York produces nearly 30 million bushels each year, grown on 55,000 acres across the Empire State.

The Capital District is blessed with a healthy balance between

the urban and rural that allows us all to take a short drive to reconnect with the country. That means, we're never too far from a good place to pick apples. But, there's more to it than just walking through the rows of trees with a bag in hand. Many of these places feature plenty of other activities in which families can partake.

Hayrides, corn mazes, petting zoos, hard cider bars and live music — have become staple activities to expect at any one of these locations. However, with the world still in the grip of a pandemic, some of these activities are either limited or postponed. Nonetheless, if you can exhibit safe social distancing and follow the respective rules of these establishments, I'm certain they would welcome your business and support.

As one of the owners of this family-run orchard told me, this place was built from love.

Jim Abbruzzese's mother, Ellen, gave his father, Joe, an ultimatum more than 50 years ago. If he didn't sell his bar, she wouldn't marry him. It wasn't just a bar, it had the first television in town. It was making money.

"She wasn't going to marry a drunk — or a guy who served drunks," he said with a laugh. And, as it turns out, his father sold the bar and married his mother. "That's love," he said.


The history of this land, located at the base of the Helderberg Escarpment outside of Altamont, goes back to Stephen Van Rensselaer in the 1700s. An ambitious doctor named Daniel Cook turned it into an apple orchard a hundred years ago. Now it's a place for banquets, golfing, marketing and apple picking.

Golden Harvest is a required stop for antique pickers driving south on Route 9 to Hudson. On any given day, you're likely to see a balloon tethered to the farm, marking its place along your journey long before you realize what you see.

The roadstand has been around since 1957. It's a place apple lovers can stop to pick up a quick bushel before returning home from the road. The bakery



has been popping out cider doughnuts since 1988. Douglas Grout started doing that with just one machine and a mixer. Today, John Henry has the bakery humming to the tune of five doughnut making machines. There's also five convection ovens kicking out muffins, cookies and pies.

Come November, the bakery takes advance pie orders for Thanksgiving, when it traditionally dishes out hundreds of pies.

Just a note, there is no pick your own apples available this year, according to the farm's website.

Tower. Growing up here, you also recognize it as the direction to go to visit Indian Ladder Farms.

It's a family tradition to make this trip. There are trails and various animals for kids to feed. Rosie, the farm's beloved Scottish Highland cow, had been a welcome sight for families. Sadly, she passed away, but the farm continues to remember her by offering a plush toy at their market. The farm allows visitors to pick apples, berries and

pumpkins, too.

Indian Ladder Farms has been around for a century, but it's been hip to recent trends over the years. WEQX had often broadcast radio shows from the barn. It's been hosting a bit of the nightlife with live music and hard cider beverages from the Indian Ladder Farms Cidery & Brewery tasting room.

The market is front-and-center once you park the car. It's where you're going to find all the goods you don't dare try to bake yourself — if you're like me. You can pick up your fresh fruits and vegetables here, but I'm talking about the baked goods. The pies. Or — if you're not like me — you can get out into the fields and pick up the ingredients to make your own pie. OK. Can we change the subject now, please?

Picking season starts in June at Kristy's Barn, where visitors can walk away with their choice of strawberries. The season transitions from strawberries to raspberries in July, then to peaches before September brings apples, tomatoes and pumpkins. On a nice day, you're bound to enjoy a pleasant hayride or start up a conversation with one of their goats. Live music can often be had from just outside the market, too. So, there's more to the experience than what was parodied by Saturday Night Live last year. Disregard what they did.

But, that skit's funny, though, right?



izza is beloved by people from all cultures and backgrounds. It's certainly easy to call a favorite pizzeria and order a pie with all your favorite toppings. But homemade pizza is easier than one might imagine. Invest some time into making "The Artisan" grilled pizza from "Grilled Pizzas and Piadinas" (DK) by Craig W. Priebe with Dianne Jacob.

The Artisan(Roasted Vegetables With Creamy Garlic Cheese)

Ingredients: 12 x 12 inch pizza

- 1/4 fennel bulb, trimmed and thinly sliced, lengthwise
- 1/2 red bell pepper, sliced into thin strips
- 1 carrot, peeled and sliced 1/4 inch thick on the diagonal

- 1/2 cup sliced red onions
- 1/2 cup broccoli florets
- 1 portobello mushroom cap, sliced 1/2
- tablespoon fresh rosemary, roughly chopped, or 1 teaspoon dried
- 1/2 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 grilled pizza crust (see below)
- 1 tablespoon grated parmesan
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella
- 1 package boursin cheese


Instructions

Preheat the oven to 400° F. To make the roasted vegetables, toss of all of the ingredients with 1 tablespoon of the olive oil in a shallow baking dish. Roast until the vegetables are tender and lightly browned,

about 25 minutes.

Brush the grilled side of the pizza crust with the remaining olive oil. Dust with the parmesan and sprinkle with the mozzarella. Spoon the boursin on top, without spreading it. Pile the roasted vegetables over the pizza.

The grill should still be hot from grilling the crust. Cook the pizza over medium heat or indirect heat for around 5 to 8 minutes. Check it after 1 minute by gently lifting up an edge of the crust with tongs or a spatula. If it is turning dark quickly, your fire is too hot. Move the pizza around the grill to get away from the heat. When the pizza is done, the crust will be crispy.

Before serving, garnish with the fennel tops.

Basic Grilled Pizza Dough

Ingredients: two 12-inch crusts

3/4 cup warm water

- 1 packet active dry yeast (about 21/4 teaspoons)
- 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- 11/2 cups unbleached flour
- 1/4 cup whole wheat flour
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 2 tablespoons cornmeal, preferably white, plus additional for the pan
- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil, plus 1/4 teaspoon

for the bowl

Instructions

Pour the warm water into a small bowl or measuring cup. Add the yeast and sugar and stir until the yeast dissolves into a smooth beige color. Let it stand on your counter for about 5 minutes to prove that the yeasted water is active. A thin layer of foam will appear at the top, indicating the batch is good.

Measure the flours, salt and cornmeal into a large bowl. Add the yeasted water and the 2 tablespoons of olive oil. Mix well, stirring with a strong spoon. Lightly flour a clean, dry countertop. Form a ball of dough, place it on the counter, and press down with the palm of your hand. Fold the dough over itself and press again. Continue to roll and press the dough for about 8 minutes until the dough is smooth. Add only enough flour to prevent it from sticking.

Put the remaining 1/4 teaspoon of olive oil in a medium bowl. The dough will be sticky, so flour your hands before picking it up, and place it in the bowl. Turn over several times until it is coated in oil. This prevents a crust from forming on its surface.

Cover with plastic wrap, and place in a draft-free, warm place, for 2 hours, until it rises to almost double in appearance.


Chill the dough in the refrigerator overnight, or for 1 hour to firm up. Since this dough is slightly sticky, chilling

the dough makes it easier to roll out.

Roll half of the dough out to about 12×12 inches. (This recipe makes two crusts)

Grill the dough on an inside or outside grill that has reached around 400° F. The dough should take about 3 minutes to cook. Watch for bubbles. To check whether your crust is done, lift the underside. It should be an even light brown with brown grill marks. A charred crust adds to the flavor.

Pick up the crust from the middle, using tongs, and place it on a cookie sheet. Flip it over so the grilled side is face up. This browned side becomes the top of your pizza.




