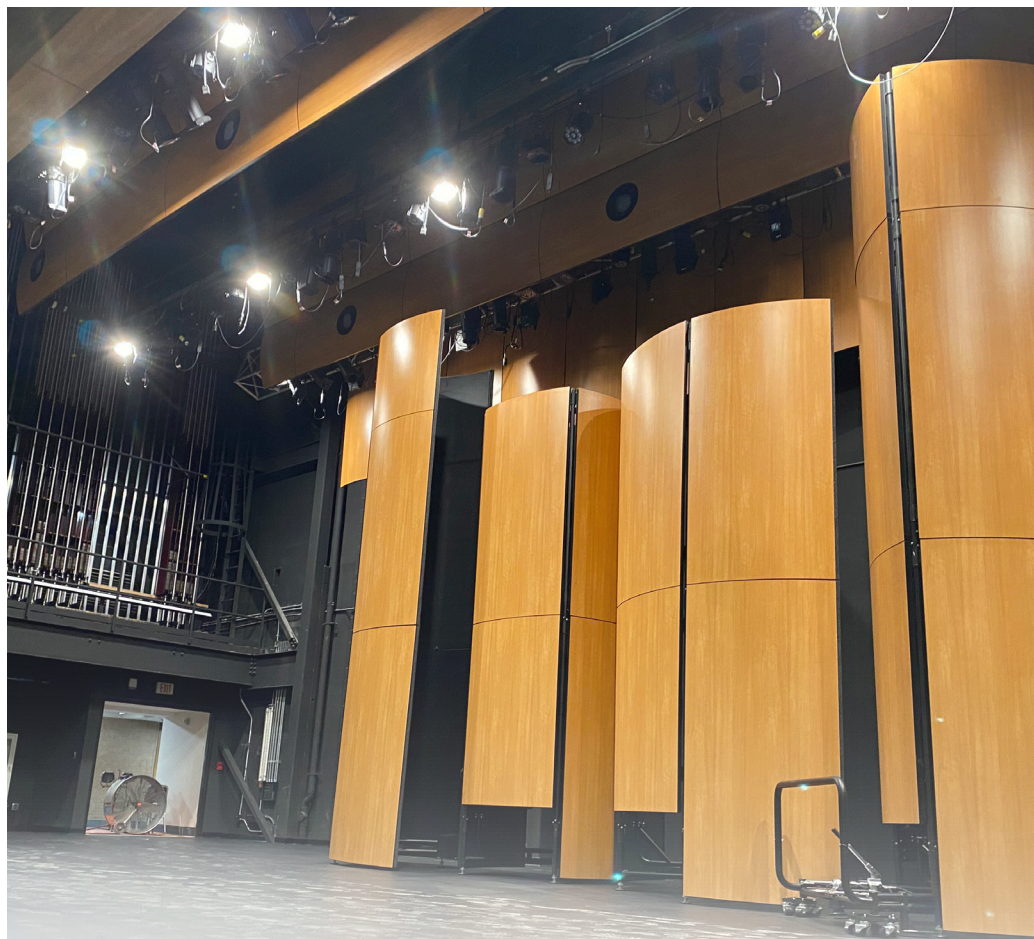

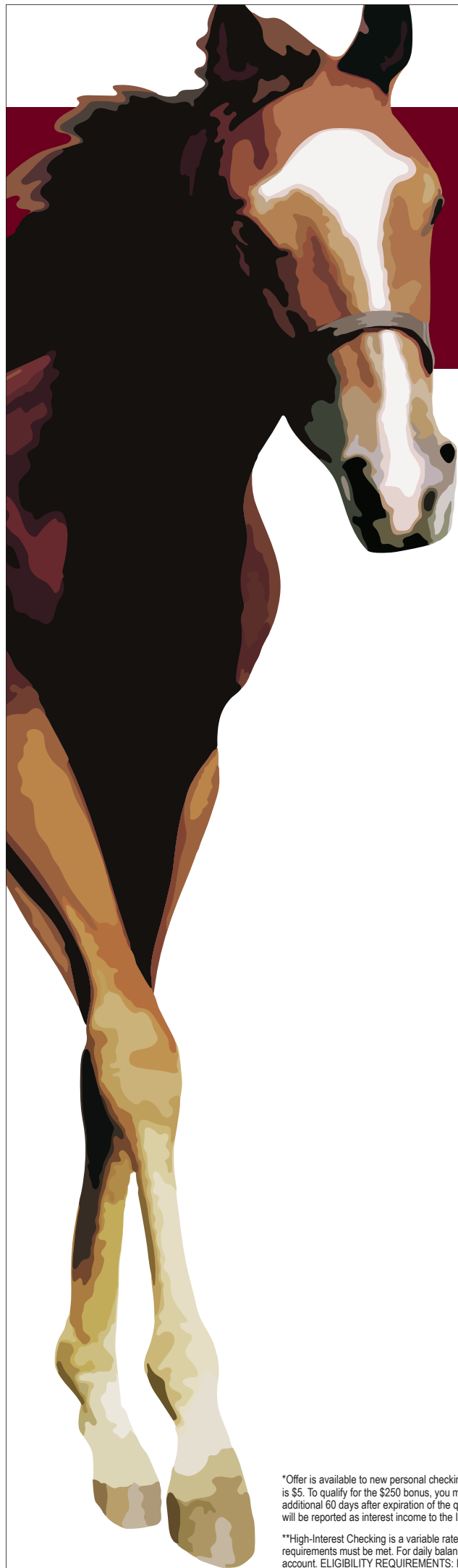

School's first week 'relatively smooth'

'Knock on wood' first days of school ran smoothly: buses, tech, everything in-between

DELMAR — Jody Monroe can often find herself wearing different hats as Bethlehem Central Superintendent. In the first week of school, she found herself holding a sign directing Slingerlands Elementary students to their buses.

"It was really great to see the kids coming into the buildings," Monroe said. "I was over in Eagle [Elementary] one morning, and the kids were getting off the bus with their new backpacks and lunch packs, and everything seems to be going well. I was over at Slingerlands [Elementary] for dismissal. Arrival and dismissal have been quite the undertaking because of our parking lots and not blocking roads, [but] everything went very smoothly."

Bethlehem Central students and administrators stepped off on the right foot to start the 2020-21 year. It was the start of a different academic year defined by facemasks and a hybrid schedule that splits the student body between those in class and those learning from home.

The New York state Department of Health has halved bus capacities, but that alone is not the only factor in deciding who and how many children

are assigned a route. The larger school buses boast a normal seating capacity of 66, with three children in each of a total of 22 bench seats. The confines of a school bus does not allow six feet for social distancing, so face coverings would be required.

The school district had anticipated logistical problems in June with the combination of an underutilized bus fleet and increased car traffic to its seven schools, including five elementary schools.

"And, I've heard nothing but positives from the schools," Monroe said. "The teachers are getting used to the hybrid model, with some of the kids at home and some on site. It's been just really great to have the kids back in the halls and having some activity in our buildings."

School Board President Holly Dellenbaugh had asked how parents could provide feedback to teachers facilitating remote learning. She said community members shared concern with teachers' pace as they pushed too quickly through lessons.

"Knowing that not all classrooms are the same, I would suggest they reach directly out to the teacher," said Assistant Superintendent Dave Hurst. "Every class is going

to be different."

Students and parents juggle with zoom classrooms and additional online tools, but there is an apparent improvement from last school year. Dellenbaugh said she felt the technology has worked well and congratulated Raymond Nardelli and the district's technology department.

"Knock on something," Dellenbaugh said, concerned with jinxing the school's good fortune.

"Watch it crash," Monroe said with a laugh.

Willow Baer briefly stepped out of her role as a board member to express her "overwhelming"

gratitude to administrators as a parent.

"I literally wept as I dropped my kids off to school," she said, "because of how safe I felt doing that, and how important that is."

Monroe continued to share that buses have run on schedule and traffic at the schools have been managed well.

She said principals at the middle and senior high schools have developed ways to usher students safely who have been dropped off at the schools too early.

"Other than little things that pop up," Monroe said, "it's been relatively smooth."

Petition wants to boot Megyn Kelly out

Social activists want conservative television anchor kicked off BCHS Hall of Fame

DELMAR — Megyn Kelly's place with Bethlehem Central continues to be abrasive with residents who feel her views fail to embody what young adults should aspire to achieve.

Another petition to boot the former news anchor off the high school's hall of fame started circulating, two years after a similar attempt failed. The latest effort launched online three months ago, gained traction among social activists.

The former Fox News anchor was inducted into the high school's hall of fame five years ago. In 2015, her face graced television screens and magazine covers. Her

journalistic mettle was demonstrated on the national scene, conducting tough interviews with political leaders and going toe-to-toe against a future president. Her opinions, however, drew the condemnation of national viewers and people from home.

Students for Peace and Survival called upon the school district two years ago to remove Kelly from its hall of fame. Those enshrined are represented with plaques hung around the high school's front foyer. Names include authors, justices, a town supervisor, a current Major League Baseball coach and an Academy Award-winning actress - the best of alumni to represent the "Orange and Black." But, when the

news show host attempted to defend blackface to a national audience, residents balked.

"When Ms. Kelly issued an apology for her racist comment about 'blackface' she promised to bring 'more understanding, love, sensitivity and honor' into her commentary, journalism, something our Students for Peace and Survival honed in on in their letter," Delmar resident Judy Abbott wrote to *The Spotlight*. "But she has done none of that."

The school district fielded concerns two years ago, and after a special meeting of the Hall of Fame committee, decided to keep Kelly in place. Superintendent Jody Monroe said there was no "formal process" to remove anyone, but that the committee would work on that. Kelly's place is questioned again after she

shared disparaging words directed towards people of color who have died in the hands of law enforcement.

"Just spend a few minutes on Ms. Kelly's Twitter page and you can see gaslighting and racism," Abbott wrote.

Kelly's Rise

Kelly first pursued a career practicing law before setting out as a journalist. After obtaining an undergraduate degree in political science at Syracuse University and later a law degree at Albany Law School, she became an associate at Bickel & Brewer LLP in Chicago. From there, she moved on to be a corporate litigator at Jones Day, where she was for nine years.

Her successful career as a journalist began after a move to Washington, D.C. She started as a general assignment reporter with

a local ABC television affiliate. Her coverage of national news drew attention from CNN and Fox, the latter of which she joined in 2004. From there, she rose the ranks from contributing to legal segments to covering the 2004 presidential race.

She continued to be a rising star within the conservative news outlet, serving as a substitute anchor before hosting her own two-hour show in 2010. In 2014, Time Magazine named her among their 100 most influential people in the world. A year later, she garnered media attention for unexpectedly locking horns with then-Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump as she moderated the Republican Party presidential debate hosted by her network.

"One of the things

people love about you is you speak your mind," she said, "and you don't use a politician's filter. However, that is not without its downsides; in particular, when it comes to women. You've called women you don't like fat pigs, dogs, slobs and disgusting animals. ... Does that sound to you like the temperament of a man we should elect as president?"

Kelly surprised many as she grilled each of the candidates that night. Those expecting to see the apparent Republican-friendly news outlet lob easy questions were amazed as she placed the party's leading candidate on the hot seat. The exchange was among the largest takeaways that evening.

Two months later, Kelly was back at Bethlehem Central to accept her induction into its Hall of Fame.

Kelly's Fall

Bethlehem is predominately white. It's not a newly developed fact. Kelly's family moved to Delmar when she was 9. A peek into the high school's 1970 yearbook, the year in which she was born, shows an ideal suburban lifestyle. One page shows a couple of teenaged girls in plaid skirts flying kites. Another page captures the image of a young man pushing a young woman on a tree swing. It's rural America frozen in black and white as it transitions into the Space Age yet all of the senior portraits are White. It hasn't changed by much over the years. The 2000 U.S. Census recorded 94.74 percent of town residents as White. In today's political climate, defined by Black Lives Matter and police reform, the town's residential makeup has become a talking point.

Kelly's upbringing in the town has also been a talking point on a national scale. She sparked outrage when she told her viewers that Jesus Christ was White in 2013. In the same Slate segment, she said Santa Claus was White, too. She tried to take the comments back two days later by calling them "tongue-and-cheek." Five years later, she sparked more controversy after she attempted to defend Luann de Lesseps' use of blackface while dressing as Diana Ross on an episode of "Real Housewives of New York."

"Political Correctness has gone amok," she said to open a segment about Halloween costumes on her NBC show "Megyn Kelly Today." "This year, the costume police are cracking down like never before." The 2018 segment continued to report how the University of Kent listed cowboys, Native Americans, Mexicans, Catholic nuns and now-convicted sex offender Harvey Weinstein as offensive costumes.

Kelly was joined by President George W. Bush's daughter Jenna Bush Hager, NBC News' Jacob Soborhoff and TV host Melissa Rivers. Each laughed as they all shared memories of dressing as cowboys in their childhood and how Rivers' mother, the late comedian and television personality Joan Rivers, once went as a pregnant bride. It went south after Soborhoff

expressed his gratitude for living in American, having the freedom of expression, to "dress like an idiot, act like an idiot, and actually dress and be racist, then someone should be able to say something to somebody."

"But, what is racist?" Kelly asked. "Truly, you do get in trouble if you are a White person who puts on blackface. ... When I was a kid, that was okay as long as you were dressing up as like a character." When she broached de Lesseps' costume she asked, "who doesn't want to be Diana Ross?"

Soborhoff responded, "I have not seen it, but it sounds kind of racist."

Rivers attempted to deflect the situation by suggesting de Lesseps should have dressed as Michael Jackson, alluding to the late artist's bout with vitiligo.

"Come on. We're all in the deep end," she said. "We'll all fall on me."

Five days later, after a series of apologies including one shared on "Today," NBC canceled Kelly's show. The moderately-liberal news outlet's courtship with the conservative personality came to an abrupt end.

Less than three months later, NBC terminated its contract with her just short of two years.

Today

The former primetime news anchor launched Devil May Care Studios last month. According to the new media network's press release, content will focus on "the latest news, current events, legal and cultural issues with the same tough, fair, smart perspective that has made Kelly one of America's

most respected broadcast journalists."

"The press, of which I've been a part of for many years now, is unlike I've ever seen before." Kelly said at the start of her first episode. "I feel like it has abandoned any semblance of objectivity. ... Most of the media today expresses fealty to one side or the other, to Trump or to destroying Trump. Now, its fealty is to the toxic religion of wokeness. Policing people's words and their thoughts."

As of last week, Kelly's audio podcast appears to be the only show carried by the purported independent network. Devil May Care is supported by Red Seat Ventures, associated with legal commentator and journalist Nancy Ann Grace.


Her social media has vamped up in recent weeks. There are promotions for her podcast. She used Twitter to provide a live critique of the recent presidential debate. Overall, she appeared to stay down the middle with her criticism and praise for both Trump and Joe Biden. She still goes against the grain of mainstream media, sometimes retweeting articles such as those praising Trump's foreign policy.

Other shared items point towards what one OutKick article that blamed "political dishonesty" for the "prevailing sentiment propagandized by BLM that police are intentionally targeting black men is a political ploy."

"Jacob Blake, George Floyd, Eric Garner and Rayshard Brooks are not examples of 'systemic racism,'" wrote Jason Whitlock, not Kelly. "If anything, they're examples of 'systemic resisting arrest.'"

The shared tweet was noticed by local social activists now calling for Kelly to be removed from Bethlehem's hall of fame. The online petition on Change.org currently has more than 300 signatures.

"Megyn Kelly is a terrible representative of what Bethlehem claims to stand for," states Avery Roach after signing the online petition. "If someone is to look up to her that is a problem. BCHS should take its own slogan to heart: Be the change."

Domestic violence results in two dead

Police: Husband had 'order to protect' against him before killing his wife, self last week

SELKIRK — Investigators ruled the deaths of a married couple found dead inside their home in the quiet Haswell Farms neighborhood to be the result of a murder-suicide.

Sarbjit K. and Bhupinder S. Saran were both found dead in their home at 56 Chesterwood Drive late Tuesday afternoon, Sept. 29, after Bethlehem Police responded to a family member's request to check on their welfare.

According to Bethlehem Police Cmdr. Adam Hornick, officers had to force entry into the home shortly after 3:24 p.m. Once they entered, they found both of their lifeless

bodies on separate floors of the two-storied house; Bhupinder on the first floor and Sarbjit on the second. No one else was in the home.

Following autopsies at Ellis Hospital, authorities determined Sarbjit was murdered by her husband, who later killed himself. Bethlehem Police refused to speculate motive but confirmed a history of domestic incidents at the home.

"The true motive here is we have a victim of domestic violence that has fallen to the ultimate act of domestic violence," Hornick said.

There was a current refrain-from order of protection against Bhupinder issued out of Albany County Family Court. The order was

to protect Sarbjit from any "illegal contact" by her husband. It did not, however, prevent him from sharing the home with his wife.

Bethlehem Police obtained a search warrant following the discovery of the two bodies. Though Hornick would not disclose the cause of death, he shared no firearms were used. The New York State Police Troop G Major Crimes Unit, and New York State Police Forensic Identification Unit assisted with the investigation.

Bethlehem Police last responded to a domestic incident call at the Chesterwood home in Sept. 2019. From 2016 to 2019, Hornick said Bethlehem Police responded approximately "a half dozen times."

Police are still trying to determine the time of death. Various members of the family had attempted

to reach the married couple before turning to the police to check on their welfare, Hornick said. Police will continue to investigate to determine a timeline.

"Unfortunately, we try to make something good out of the bad situation and remind people of the services that are out there

for incidents like this," Hornick said. "We never want to go and second guess or blame a victim for something. We always just want people to know of the support that is out there and the services that are available to everybody."

"Acts of domestic violence will not be

tolerated," Hornick said. "At this time, our thoughts and our prayers are with the family who have lost two people, and one is the victim of a homicide."

This is the town's first murder-suicide incident in nearly 40 years.

SELKIRK — In a notice of violation to SABIC officials, the state Department of Environmental Conservation stated the plant's failure to follow its own procedures led to the Sept. 1 gas leak that later triggered evacuation notices.

The DEC placed the plastics plant on notice for violating several environmental laws as a result of the leak, which according to the state's estimation, involved the release of approximately 16,000 pounds of styrene vapor into the air.

The state has ordered SABIC to preserve all records and documents

"relating to or arising from" the incident as it reviews potential action against the company.

The Sept. 24 notice confirmed that the tank car responsible for the leak of styrene monomer was at the Selkirk plant since May 26. On that same day, SABIC personnel observed a frozen valve on the tank car, preventing them from unloading the monomer. It was then moved to the facility's railyard where it allegedly sat unmonitored for more than three months.

"SABIC's failure to properly store and monitor the unloaded tank car shipment resulted in the unauthorized styrene release which caused odor impacts throughout the nearby community," DEC

Regional Engineer Victoria Schmitt stated in her notice.

Styrene monomer is transported by tanker car where temperatures

are monitored to prevent spontaneous polymerization. It is flammable and highly volatile, so an inhibitor is used to keep a reaction from occurring. High

temperatures and the passage of time, however, will reduce the effect of the inhibitor as it breaks down.

Two weeks ago, a DEC spokesperson described an

"exothermic reaction" and its "potential to result in an explosion" when describing the incident.

Early photographs from Albany County Sheriff's showed the railcar hitched to several more tankers as firefighters doused it with water in their effort to cool it down. The DEC has yet to confirm how high temperatures reached inside the car. A picture later shared by the Town of Bethlehem revealed a temperature that placed the monomer well beyond its flashpoint, which would cause the liquid to form an explosive vapor.

The early morning gas leak prompted authorities to issue evacuation within a half-mile of the facility and shelter-in-place notices to residents living within an additional mile of the plant.

Representatives from more than a dozen different agencies responded to the accident.

New names for Dems

Matt Clyne opts out as BOE commissioner

ALBANY — Jacob Crawford, the Guilderland Democratic Party chairman, was elected as the party's county chair at its organizational meeting last week.

And, the party has a new Board of Elections commissioner. Matt Clyne opted not to seek another four-year term and the party recommended the Legislature appoint Kathy Donovan to the position.

"The biggest plan we have right now is to bring more money into the party and strengthening and unifying the party," Crawford said. "We have had some tough primaries over the past four or five years, and we are going to build up stronger candidates and win more

Albany County areas, particularly in the suburbs and the hilltowns."

At the meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 30, the Democrats also elected Kelly Kimbrough, a City of Albany councilman, as first vice chair; Laura Weed, of Colonie, as second vice chair; Owusu Anane, a City of Albany councilman, as secretary; and Nana Clark, of Cohoes, as treasurer.

Crawford has been a county committeeman for 13 years and has chaired the Guilderland committee for the last four. He said he has not seen the political climate as nasty, locally and at the national level.

"Politics is a civic duty and public service, and I would hope we can get back to that and not continue the current tone it is taking on," he said.

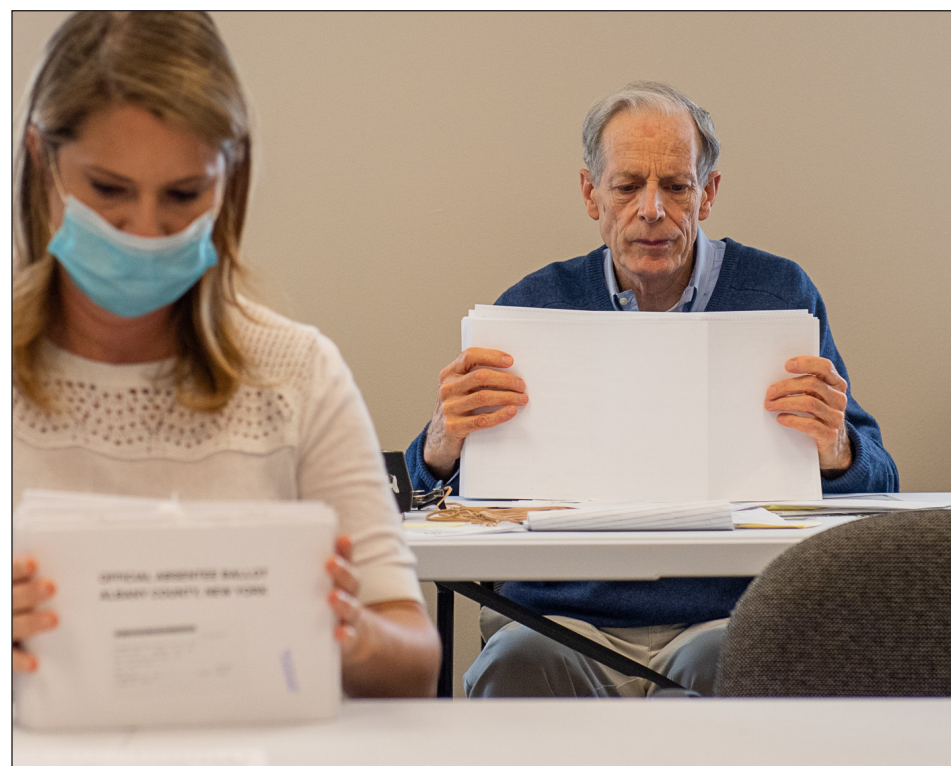
Clyne, of Bethlehem,

was first appointed as a Board of Elections commissioner in 2008. He has not endeared himself to many party faithful in the position that is half governmental, ensuring fair and open elections, and half political, helping candidates with the mechanics behind getting elected.

He most recently came under fire for refusing to wear a mask while counting absentees during the Democratic Party primary featuring District Attorney David Soares and challenger Matt Toporowski.

Donovan, of Cohoes, worked in the Board of Elections for some 35 years before retiring. She is coming back for another four-year term, provided the Legislature approves the recommendation, which is expected.

Crawford will take the reins from Jack Flynn, who served as chair since 2016.

“We’re pretty much done with [the auditorium],” Bethlehem Central Superintendent Jody Monroe said. The auditorium is the “cornerstone project” for 111 separate projects districtwide funded by a \$32.2 million bond voters approved in November 2016. “We started training with the new electronics that are in there.”

The capital improvements throughout the district included building renovations, structural improvements, paving and drainage, asbestos abatement, electrical and plumbing and security upgrades.

The superintendent’s bittersweet presentation allowed the district to peek at improvements envisioned four years ago. One picture revealed the middle school’s shiny new gymnasium floor, while another showed a brightly colored swimming area — only the water was missing from the pool. The current pandemic, however, makes it impossible for anyone to enjoy these new amenities.

Construction continues for several more projects that include the district’s business office, the high school’s front vestibule, the middle school pool,

drainage and paving at the high school, and the high school’s Library Media Center. The outstanding work will be done after classroom hours, Monroe said.

The high school auditorium was once a trip back into the past for residents who returned to the school for student productions. It was original to the school, which dates back to 1952. Monroe’s latest picture of the theatre shows a sleek and modern room that resembles something out of the mind of modern artist Alexander Calder with asymmetric shapes hanging above the audience, presumably designed to manage acoustics. The renovation reconfigured both the seating and stage footprint. The stage’s proscenium has expanded, and the seating has pushed back into the front foyer, enlarging the room’s seating capacity for future productions. Not revealed in the picture is a new sound and lighting system.

This is the first renovation project for the Library Media Center in nearly 25 years, which was first used in 1967 and later enlarged in 1996. It will now include more space for teaching and studying,

Bethlehem Central alumni will not recognize the newly renovated high school auditorium, which went relatively untouched since the school first opened in 1952. It is the “cornerstone project” to the district’s comprehensive capital improvement project, and it stands ready to be used.

a welcoming central seating area, makerspaces interactive classrooms, and a new entrance to the Information Technology Helpdesk.

Monroe said work will finish by the end of the year, allowing the district to take advantage of state aid previously promised toward the project.

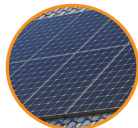

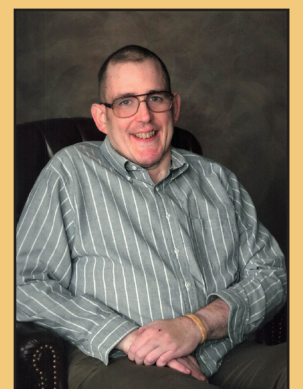

Remove Kelly from Hall of Fame

Dear District and High School Leaders,

In 2015, before our Homecoming football game, Megyn Kelly was bestowed the prestigious honor of being recognized in Bethlehem Central (BC) High School's Alumni Hall of Fame. According to BC's website, this award is given to a High School alum who embodies "the knowledge, character, and values of BC and attained distinguished achievements in their professional or personal lives." Megyn Kelly has a history of racist remarks and "gaslights" her consumers. Unfortunately, a quick perusal of her Twitter account makes it clear, she does not embody the level of 'knowledge, character and values' that we, community members,

expect from BC graduates that receive this honor.

On October 28, 2018, our Students for Peace and Survival at Bethlehem Central High School were so concerned about Megyn Kelly's 'blackface' comment that they wrote a thoughtful open letter to Ms. Kelly's employer, MSNBC: <https://www.nbcnews.com/think/opinion/megyn-kelly-went-our-high-school-no-blackface-was-t-ncna925101>.

Students and concerned community members also expressed concerns to the District administration and the Board of Education. The District responded with a November 5, 2018 statement found here: <https://www.bethlehemschools.org/statement-requests-remove-megyn-kelly-bc-hall-fame/>.

Which reads in part: "The goal for the committee in the coming months is to create a uniform procedure under which a petition for review and/or removal of a Hall of Fame member, as well as a subsequent appeals process, could be applied in situations where a member's actions are called into question.

Once such a plan is in place, the requests to remove Ms. Kelly will be reconsidered and another vote will be undertaken by the committee using a standard methodology that would be fair and equitable to any of our Alumni Hall of Fame members."

In the two years that have passed since the release of this statement, has the District created a procedure to remove a Hall of Fame member and has the request to remove Ms. Kelly been reconsidered? If yes, please update me on the actions taken to date. If no, please explain why BC dropped this important issue and re-initiate the process.

When Ms. Kelly issued an apology for her racist comment about 'blackface' she promised to bring "more understanding, love, sensitivity and honor" into her commentary/journalism, something our Students for Peace and Survival honed in on in their letter. But she has done none of that; most recently in the context of

Jacob Blake's death – just spend a few minutes on Ms. Kelly's Twitter page and you can see gaslighting and racism.

Ms. Kelly's actions and words are divisive and racist. Her journalist credentials are questionable and her moral lapses are obvious. She is not someone our District should celebrate nor is she a person that our children should emulate. Please remove her from our Hall of Fame expeditiously.

Leave Megyn Kelly on the BC Hall of Fame

Megyn Kelly and I walked the same hallways at Bethlehem Central. She graduated a few years before me, and I can't say I remember her. Her career since leaving Delmar has taken an amazing trajectory, even if it was with a broadcasting team I don't respect. Under anyone's barometer she's done well. It's when she interjects her opinion she

finds herself in trouble.

Her conversation over blackface slapped her star down. In this issue, I recapped how it went south for her. In the past two years, she's remembered for that perhaps more than Luann de Lesseps, the woman who actually wore blackface. In this town, the conversation stings

because when she recalled acceptance of the act from her childhood, it reflected upon our community. That's how it was taken, and that's not how it should be.

What was socially acceptable in the past will make you cringe today. C. Thomas Howell's "Soul Man" was released in 1986. It was a popular

movie featuring Howell in blackface. It was in constant circulation on cable television. Kelly and I were in high school. Today, I'm not sure you'll find it. It's because we continue to open up, ask questions and accept where we were once wrong.

When we were kids, blackface was in mainstream media. It

I don't often agree with Kelly, but I don't see her as a racist.

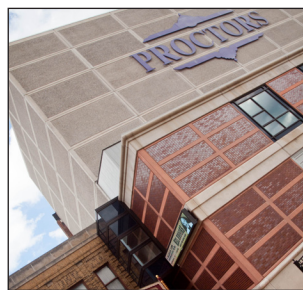

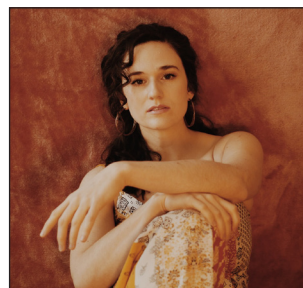

ALBANY — Dora Philip walked through the dark of her basement with only the flashlight on her cell phone wedging a beam to light her path. The Hollow had been closed. She purposely kept the lights off. She didn't even turn them on to use the bathroom. While in the dark, the century-old building began to play tricks on her.

Whatever wasn't being used was unplugged. Dora and her husband Mike were doing their best to keep the bills down while the restaurant remained closed for business. Though they weren't taking in customers, Dora Philip kept walking through the doors of North Pearl and Columbia streets.

Staying home would have just made her crazy, she said.

In the dank, she imagined she was inside the hull of the sunken Titanic. Dark, secluded — in the basement, she seemed as far away as the bottom of the Atlantic. In the quiet, she could hear the clatter of silverware and the banging of plates, though there was no one in the kitchen upstairs. She swore she could hear the shuffle of feet.

And, music.

"It was like the ghost of once was," she said.

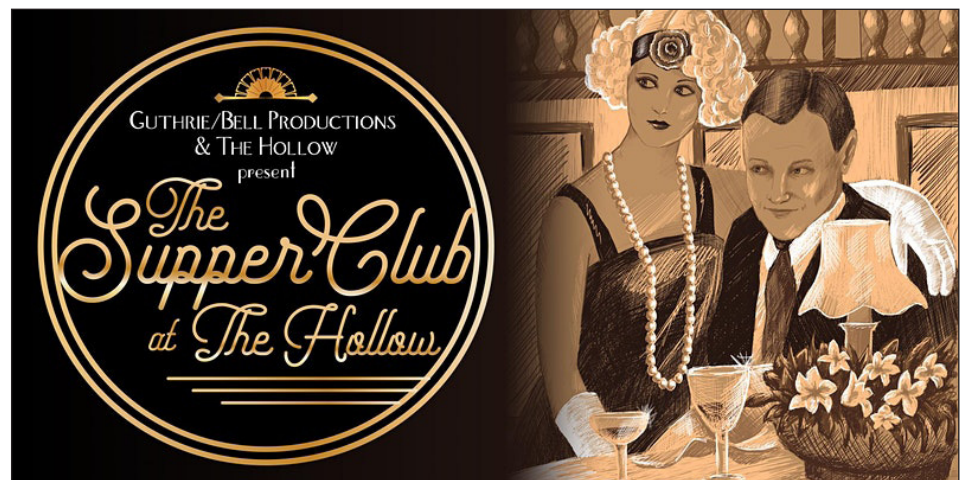

“She’s beginning to understand the toll these workers take when they go to work each day and perform what can be thankless jobs,” Villa said. “When we make deliveries, she is able to articulate what she’s seeing.”

Villa has had Mia as a sous chef since she was 8 months old, when she was tall enough to see the counter on a stool. When COVID-19 shut down the Capital District, Villa, a stay-at-home mom, was looking for ways to keep her children involved in the world. Knowing Mia’s

favorite food is chocolate chip cookies, mom and daughter decided to deliver some fresh baked cookies to essential workers.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month & FALL HEALTH

Women's health and breast cancer awareness are issues we all care about.

A key to beating cancer is early detection. For screening sites, contact your local department of health.

Take charge of your health and get screened this October.

Breast cancer signs & symptoms

Breast cancer is a formidable foe. According to the World Health Organization, an estimated 627,000 women lost their lives to breast cancer in 2018. But women are not helpless in the fight against breast cancer, as the WHO notes early detection is critical and could potentially save thousands of lives each year.

A proactive approach is a key component of protecting oneself against breast cancer. While the National Breast Cancer Foundation, Inc.® notes that many breast cancer symptoms are invisible and not noticeable without a professional cancer screening, women can keep

an eye out for certain signs of breast cancer they might be able to detect on their own. Monthly self-exams can help women more easily identify changes in their breasts. During such self-exams, women can look for the following signs and symptoms and are advised to report any abnormalities they discover to their physicians immediately.

- Changes in how the breast or nipple feels: The NBCF says nipple tenderness or a lump or thickening in or near the breast or underarm could indicate the presence of breast cancer. Some women may notice changes in the skin texture or an enlargement of the pores in the skin of their breast. In

many instances, skin texture has been described as being similar to the texture of an orange peel. Lumps in the breast also may indicate breast cancer, though not all lumps are cancerous.

- Change in appearance of the breast or nipple: Unexplained changes in the size or shape of the breast; dimpling anywhere on the breast; unexplained swelling or shrinking of the breast, particularly when the shrinking or swelling is exclusive to one side only; and a nipple that is turned slightly inward or inverted are some signs and symptoms of breast cancer that can affect the appearance of the breast or nipple. It is common for women's breasts to be

asymmetrical, but sudden asymmetry should be brought to the attention of a physician.



- Discharge from the nipple: The NBCF notes that any discharge from the nipple, but particularly a clear or bloody discharge, could be a sign of breast cancer. The NBCF also advises women that a milky discharge when they are not breastfeeding is not linked to breast cancer but should be discussed with a physician.

Learning to recognize the signs and symptoms of breast cancer can increase the likelihood of early diagnosis, which greatly improves women's chances of surviving this disease.

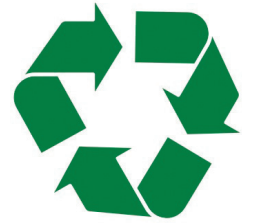

Entertaining opportunities abound during the holiday season. Whether you are hosting a small group at home or have been invited to someone's house to socialize, offering a homemade treat can show others how much you care.

Few people can resist the combination of chocolate and nuts, and that's what dessert lovers will get in this recipe for "Chocolate Crumble Pie," which features toasted pecans along with amaretti cookies in the topping. Enjoy, courtesy of "Chocolate" (Love Food) by the editors at Parragon Books Ltd.

Chocolate Crumble Pie

Ingredients: Serves 8

Pie Dough

- Scant 1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour*
- 1 teaspoon baking powder*
- 1/2 cup unsalted butter, cut into small pieces*
- 1/4 cup superfine sugar*
- 1 egg yolk*
- 1 to 2 teaspoons cold water*

Filling

- 2/3 cup heavy cream*
- 2/3 cup milk*
- 8 ounces semisweet chocolate, chopped*
- 2 eggs*

Crumble Topping

- 1/2 cup packed brown sugar*
- 3/4 cup toasted pecans*
- 4 ounces semisweet chocolate*
- 3 ounces amaretti cookies*
- 1 teaspoon unsweetened cocoa*

Instructions

To make the pie dough, sift the flour and baking powder into a large bowl, rub in the butter, and stir in the sugar, then add the egg and a little water to bring the dough together. Turn the dough out, and knead briefly. Wrap the dough in plastic wrap and let chill in the refrigerator for 30 minutes.

Preheat the oven to 375 F. Roll out the pie dough and use to line a 9-inch loose-button tart pan. Prick the pastry shell with a fork. Line with parchment paper and fill with dried beans or baking beans. Bake in the oven for 15 minutes. Remove from the oven and take out the paper and beans. Reduce the oven temperature to 350 F.

To make the filling, bring the cream and milk to a boil in a saucepan, immediately remove from the heat, and add the chocolate. Stir until melted and smooth. Beat the eggs and add to the chocolate mixture, mix thoroughly and pour into the shell. Bake for 15 minutes, remove from the oven, and let rest for 1 hour.

When you are ready to serve the pie, place the topping ingredients in a food processor and pulse to chop. (If you do not have a processor, place the sugar in a large bowl, chop the nuts and chocolate with a large knife, and crush the cookies, then add to the bowl with the cocoa and mix well.) Sprinkle over the pie, then serve it in slices.
