TOP STORY Regents canceled Albany sees 335 new COVID-19 cases since Nov.1

ALBANY — There have been 335 new cases of COVID-19 in the county since Nov. 1, said County Executive Dan McCoy during a press briefing on Monday, Nov. 9.

For nearly two weeks, the daily number of new cases are rivaling those of this spring as the pandemic was first taking hold in upstate New York. From Sunday to Monday, there were 39 new cases, which followed 55 from Saturday to Sunday and 69 from Friday to

Two more people died over the past week — a woman in her 60s and a woman in her 90s with unknown medical histories — bringing the county death count up to 144.

Driver leaves bang up job at FoCo

Motorist drove away with chained barriers in tow, fled on foot


DELMAR —

Bethlehem police is after a motorist who ripped Four Corners apart before he disappeared on foot on Saturday evening, Nov. 7.

Police said a motorist driving a Jeep Cherokee took a right turn from Delaware Avenue onto Kenwood Avenue before knocking down lights posts, ripping out chained barriers and smashing two storefronts along the way. He then proceeded to strike another vehicle before driving away.

Despite dragging the chained road posts previously affixed to the sidewalk, the motorist was able to drive a few more feet to dump the Jeep behind Peter Harris Clothes.

Police said the man

driving the Jeep was able to run away and disappear.

The accident took place at approximately 6:14 p.m. just hours after President-elect Joe Biden

was announced. Residents feared there was a connection, but Bethlehem police said that is not true.

Fender bender leads to DWI

GLENMONT — A slight fender bender in the Cumberland Farms parking lot led to a DWI arrest on Monday morning, Oct. 19.

Mirinda Staats, 48, of Selkirk, was backing out of the gas pump area when Bethlehem police said the red Chevy Silverado she was driving hit a jeep that was also driving through the lot.

When Bethlehem police proceeded to ask Staats questions, she allegedly smelled of alcohol. According to the police report, she also failed field sobriety tests. Inside the truck sat a young child she said was hers.

Staats was processed at the Bethlehem Police Department with felony charges of DWI and aggravated DWI with a child in the vehicle. The felony charge stemmed from a previous charge. She was released to her father and scheduled to appear in town court on Nov. 4.

Asleep at the wheel

ELSMERE — A Bronx man was apparently asleep at the wheel when Bethlehem police arrived at a welfare call early Sunday morning, Oct. 18.

A witness called concerned over a Toyota Scion stopped in front of Pioneer Bank with a flat tire and the motor still running while in the eastbound lane of Delaware Avenue. When police arrived, they reportedly found Steven Lamont Washington, 56, slumped forward in his seat with only the seat belt preventing him from hitting his head on the

steering wheel. Police also observed that the car remained in drive.

According to the report, reporting officers placed the car in park and turned off the ignition before attempting to wake Washington. Once aroused, he allegedly smelled of alcohol and was observed to have glassy eyes. A tallboy was sitting next to him in the beverage holder and a near empty bottle of brandy was on the passenger side floor.

Washington was arrested on several charges including felony aggravated unlicensed operation of a vehicle, misdemeanor DWI and resisting arrest, and second degree harassment for threatening a police officer. He was scheduled to appear in town court on Nov. 4.

Few surprises in local, regional races

ALBANY COUNTY

— In the wee hours following Election Day, at least local voters went to bed certain as to who won seats in both the state Assembly, Senate, and county District Attorney.

In Albany County, where registered voters are overwhelmingly Democrat, local races were decided well before the stroke of midnight with little surprise.

Incumbent Democrat Paul Tonko successfully defended his congressional seat against Republican newcomer Elizabeth Joy.

Tonko was able to secure his seventh term in office, despite the Glens Falls native garnering the Republican, Conservative and Serve America Movement lines. Nonetheless, Tonko earned a sizable victory with 62.5 percent of the vote.

Neil Breslin will also return to his seat in the state Senate where he has been since 1996. The incumbent Democrat took 60,538 votes to Republican challenger David Yule's 26,536.

There was a Republican victory in Albany County Tuesday night. Richard Amedure Jr pulled away with his first political victory in a tight race in the state Senate seat left vacant by Republican George Amedore Jr. — pronounced the same, but different by one vowel.

The newcomer fought off fellow first-time challenger, Democrat Michelle Hinchey in a race of familiar names. Hinchey, the daughter of the late Congressman Maurice Hinchey, fell to Amedure by just over 1,000 votes.

The race was tight throughout the night. Amedure's lead stood by less than 200 votes on the two major party lines. The 1,945 Conservative votes enabled him to secure the win

In the state Assembly, Democrat Patricia Fahy took nearly two-thirds of the vote in the 109th District. It was Robert Porter's second time going up against the incumbent. Despite garnering endorsements from the Republican, Conservative and Libetarian parties, he was unable to overcome Fahy's 35,405 votes.

Phillip Steck will return to his seat next to Fahy in the state Assembly, keeping Republican Dave Feiden down with a 56-44 percent margin in the 110th District.

The race for County District Attorney was practically uncontested as Republicans failed to name a representative for Tuesday night. Matthew Toporowski, who failed to wrangle the Democrat Party's nod from incumbent David Soares, earned 20,966 votes under the Working Families line. That wasn't enough to overtake the 75,096 who voted for Soares.

Safe driving matters in Delmar, too

Trump banner-waving motorist who stopped traffic to harass BLM demonstrators is later arrested, faces reckless driving charge

DELMAR — A large pick-up truck with American flags and a Trump 2020 banner flapping in the breeze halted rush hour traffic, stopping within feet of a small group of demonstrators, in an apparent act of Election Day intimidation.

Members of an online group Bethlehem Indivisible were holding a "Black Lives Matter" banner along the corner of Delaware and Elsmere avenues when a pick-up truck stopped perpendicular to the flow of Delaware Avenue traffic. The brief faceoff was captured on video by one of its members.

The video starts with a dark-colored Dodge pickup truck stopped in the middle of the intersection. The sight is accompanied by the blasts of horns from oncoming motorists unable to pass through. Two American flags flank the bank end of the truck. A Trump 2020 flaps in the wind above the front cab, including the phrase "F*ck Your Feelings.

"We were shaken but not deterred by this bully," said one witness who was with the group Tuesday night. "In the moment, I worried about our safety. What if he chose to accelerate?'

The silhouettes of two individuals appear on both the driver and passenger sides of the truck. A metal cross reflects light as it dangles from the rearview

"Defund the police. Don't call the police," the driver yelled as he leaned out his window. "Stand up for yourselves."

"We are, and others," responded another voice off-camera.

Robert C. Sweet, 53, of Altamont, was arrested the following day after Bethlehem police said they identified him as the driver



of the same Dodge pick-up. off the bridge now.

The video captures approximately one minute of the standoff before it shows the pick-up proceeding to complete a near 360-degree turn, cutting the path of at least two motorists as it continued west down Delaware Avenue. Before the stream cuts off, a voice off-camera can be heard in an assumed phone call to



Police painting job questioned

Police Chief has detectives paint office, Town Super defends choice


ithin 24 of being appointed Bethlehem Chief of Police, Gina Cocchiara had help painting her new office. She said it had gone without a fresh coat since Lou Corsi was sworn in more than 15 years ago.

The new chief used the activity as a team building exercise. The town's first woman and openly gay chief rose up the ranks through a tumultous environment where peers targeted her for being an ambitious career person. When Town Supervisor David VanLuven appointed her to the lead post, he said it was Bethlehem's first step towards police reform.

Four detectives stepped to the task. A review of a police department surveillance video revealed the surreal sight of one walking into the office with a ladder, while another holding a paint tray; each with his service revolver holstered at the waist.

In the days leading to her swearing in ceremony, Cocchiara described her promotion as a relief of pressure despite public criticism over the process that led to her appointment. She's fielded questions over her personnel file — as recently as last month after an August request from District Attorney David Soares was reported in local newspapers. Advocacy groups protested the lack of inclusion in selecting the new chief. And, there's the global push for reform that has had all police agencies answering to angry barbs.

Since taking her post in August, Cocchiara describes the morale in the department as good.

"I think it's sad that rather than support a fine police officer who has been given an opportunity to *lead, change and evolve* the culture in this police department she is just being relentlessly torn down by people who would prefer to have not seen her promoted."

There are at least a few within the agency who have said otherwise. Days after her office was painted, The Spotlight received an anonymous letter describing the date and times of the exercise, alluding to something improper.

Cocchiara's appointment

to chief was the first of several advancements within the department. Where the agency started the year with a chief, a deputy chief and a commander, the town was left with having to address the vacancy of its top two positions by July. Officers Chad Ferraro and James Corrigan were each promoted to sergeant in November. Officer Michael Berben rose to detective. Michael Cozzy and James Rexford were each named commanders a month before. The shift in personnel could factor into possible turmoil.

"Nobody was on overtime for painting," Cocchiara said. "This is team building. We're trying to make everybodys' offices new, fresh. ... Get people comfortable in their spaces and work together."

According to time and attendance records

Real McCoy eyes expansion or move

Brewery wants to add a small kitchen, patio

DELMAR — The Real McCoy Beer Company may explore other options if the town's zoning board nixes its latest idea to expand.

The town Zoning Board of Appeals will host a public hearing on that expansion plan when it meets again on Wednesday, Nov. 18.

The nano-craft brewery has helped generate a modest nightlife in the center of Delmar since it first opened in 2016. In its four years it has expanded to accommodate a bar and seating area that has cultivated sports viewings and live music entertainment.

What has been missing for consumers is food service. Owner Michael Bellini has invited food trucks to collaborate on an overall experience. In October, he submitted an idea to the Zoning Board of Appeals that would expand the brewery's footprint towards that same direction.

Bellini wants to modify two, 40-foot shipping containers into a small, commercial kitchen. The renderings of the plan shows a continuation of the modern industrial look present in the town's warehouse district of Hallwood Road.

Each of the "high-cube" containers stand 9-feet and 6-inches tall, measure

8-feet wide and 40-feet long. The metal containers, often seen on cargo ships and freight trains, would be cut and modified with large, glass doors accented by black lattice. The interior would appear to include dark wood flooring with a large, granite counter top for patrons facing an open kitchen complete with stainless steel appliances. In addition to indoor seating space, the plan includes a patio-like dining area with umbrellas, just outside of it.

At issue would be the placement of the kitchen, which is proposed to sit at the back end of the 20 Hallwood Road property, nosing a property line defined by pine trees, a stockade fence and a 10-foot retaining wall. The kitchen will stand as close as nearly 9 feet from the property line and just over 12 feet from its back

neighbor's garage.

"We would like to continue to grow our business and the addition of food service for our brewery is a large part of our business plan," Bellini stated in his application. "We do not own the property so we are utilizing the shipping containers as a way to invest in assets owned by the brewery."

Bellini said he has explored options to expand his business through other means, including buying out Brewtus Roasting from its neighboring storefront or purchasing the 20 Hallwood Road property from his landlord.

Bellini said he has also pursued buying the 343

Delaware Ave. property left vacant by TD Bank. But, he said, the negotiations for that purchase had stalled after virus-related restrictions limited indoor seating for restaurants.

"Short of moving our brewery to an entirely different location alltogether we have run out of options," Bellini said.

Bellini's 191-page application is full of support from local residents and patrons, including strong words of encouragement from state Senator Neil Breslin and state Assemblywoman Pat Fahy.

"This is exactly the kind of innovative pivoting and expanding that we need to nurture in today's tumultuous economy," Fahy stated. "We need to support these kinds of small business that provide the quality of life our communities depend on for our economic health."

COVID on the rise

"Our positive numbers continue to go up as do our hospitalizations and those in the ICU," McCoy said. "If we don't follow the guidance to stop the spread, the numbers will continue to head in the wrong direction."

While he does not foresee universal shutdowns like this spring and into the summer, he does see a zoned approach at controlling the virus having an impact on local businesses. For example, if the infection rate in an area within a region reaches a certain point, there will be restrictions put in place for just that area. He said Boston just initiated a mask mandate whenever anyone is in public regardless of if they are alone or not and bars and restaurants must now close at 9 p.m.

As of Monday, the total number of positive cases in Albany County jumped to 3,950, up from 3,645 a week ago. Most of the new cases over the last month are from close contact

with someone who has the virus, people traveling out of state and those living in congregate settings. There is no clear source of infection for about half the new cases.

Hospitalizations are also on the rise. As of Monday there were 32 residents in the hospital, up from 23 a week ago, for a rate of 0.81 percent. There were four county residents in the ICU, up from one a week ago.

The numbers are indicative of a much feared and anticipated second wave of the virus that is ripping through Europe and other parts of the world. It is coming along with the holiday season and officials are already warning people to avoid gatherings of all sizes outside the immediate household.

"It's the time now to double down on the preventative measure instead of loosening the restrictions," said Dr. Elizabeth Whalen, head of the county Health "Throughout the pandemic our priority has been the health and wellbeing of our students and educators. • The January regents exams are cancelled, said Interim State Education Commissioner Betty Rosa last week, and will propose modifications to the assessment requirements students must meet in order to earn high school diplomas.

"The COVID pandemic has stopped our local economy in its tracks so it is critical to provide the tools and make the investments needed for recovery and growth," said Andrew Joyce, chairman of the Albany County Legislature.

• As the abbreviated fall athletic season nears its end, school districts and athletes are waiting on guidance from the state regarding the winter season. The winter season is more difficult to navigate given most contests take place inside and most involve close contact between competitors.

Guidance on sports like basketball, hockey and wrestling could come as early as this week but likely no later than next week.

Unlike high risk fall sports like football and cheer that will compete to some degree during what is called "Fall Two" in March, if winter sports are cancelled there is no alternative plans being discussed.

Painting job

obtained by *The Spotlight*, at least two of the detectives who painted Cocchiara's office were on duty when painting took place on Aug. 27. Although Cocchiara said no overtime was used, one of the four detectives finished the pay period with at least 50 hours. The annual base salary for a first-year detective in Bethlehem is \$78,716, exceeding the \$46,145 annual salary of the average Delmar resident according to BestPlaces. net. The town board is also scrambling to make up for a dearth in collected sales tax. Its proposed budget for next year will take \$1 million from reserves to compensate while freezing built-in raises for non-union employees.

"What's below payscale?" asked a dismissive VanLuven. "If I see a piece of garbage on the floor, do I not pick it up because it's below my payscale? No. I'd scrub the bathrooms if there was the need."

With Town Hall closed due to the pandemic, VanLuven said he couldn't excuse hiring an outside vendor to do the job. He said the town has a three-person maintenance staff, but with security clearance requirements to enter the police station, only one could have been used.

"There are a lot of allusions to mythical improprieties that have been flying around for awhile now," VanLuven said. He commended his police chief for using the opportunity as a team building exercise. He said he was not concerned with on-duty employees painting the office. Employees often paint town facilities, he said. The Department of Public Works had recently done the same.

"I think it's sad that rather than support a fine police officer who has been given an opportunity to lead, change and evolve the culture in this police department she is just being relentlessly torn down by people who would prefer to have not seen her promoted," VanLuven said.

"It saddens me."





he Albany Symphony Orchestra is back, and this time it's dabbling in current affairs.

The group, which is down to 15 members for this performance, will perform "Black and Alive" by Andre Myers, Debussy's "Prelude to the Afternoon of a Faun" and Mahler's "Symphony No. 4." RPI develops model to predict COVID spread



Rensselear team contributing diseasespread forecast to CDC ensemble model

COVID-19 transmission model inspired ■by gas-phase chemistry is helping the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) forecast COVID-19 deaths across the country.

Developed by Yunfeng Shi, an associate professor of materials science and engineering at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, and Jeff Ban, a professor of civil engineering at the University of Washington, the model uses fatality data collected by Johns Hopkins University and mobility data collected by Google to predict disease spread based on how much a population is moving within its community.

The researchers' tested

their model against data from 20 of the hardest hit counties in the United States and found it to be valid. Their findings are available in preprint on medRxiv, an online repository of papers that have been screened but not peer-reviewed.

The team has also been able to show how the forecasts change as schools open, communities lockdown, and masks are mandated. The researchers' website, which illustrates those forecasts, was developed by Tanooj Shah, a graduate student in Shi's group.

"There's no mystery as to why there's an outbreak," Shi said. "There's no mystery to how we control it. The science is absolutely there. We want to use the model to give the local government some concrete predictive insight to implement certain policies."

Shi is a computational materials scientist who was curious about how simple chemical reaction analogs could be applied

to forecasting COVID-19 transmission. Combined with Ban's expertise in transportation and mobility, the two have developed a straightforward model that has been accurately predicting disease transmission. They are now sharing their unique approach to forecasting COVID-19 spread with the CDC on a weekly basis, along with a collective of other research teams made up of infectious disease specialists, machine learning experts, and modelers from across

the nation. Combined, the models form an ensemble forecast from a multitude of perspectives. "The novelty of the model lies in the integration of physical modeling and data-driven approaches, which can bring useful insights about the infection and outbreak of COVID-19," said Jeff Ban, a professor of civil and environmental engineering at the University of Washington. "The findings of the research, such as the critical relative mobility indicator, can be used by policy makers for making informed decisions about when and how to reopen local economies."

The engineers plan to continue sharing their model results each week for the duration of the pandemic.





"What is remarkable about this model is its simplicity, from the perspective of cause and effects, indicating that societal mobility is the major factor controlling the spread of COVID-19,"

said Pawel Keblinksi, the head of the Department of Materials Science and Engineering at Rensselaer. "This is an example of 'the minimalist' approach that Professor Shi used successfully to model complex physical reactive processes, including polymer or complex crystal growth."




The Perfect Snow

to deform.

When you create a snowball, you are using pressure to condense those individual snowflakes into a new shape.

"You want the snow to be within 5 degrees of the freezing point, but obviously not over the 32 degree temperature so it stays as a solid," Jennifer Fisk-Jaskolka, a seventhgrade science teacher at Ravena-Coeymans-Selkirk Middle School, said. "What you do when you create a snowball is use pressure, not temperature, to convert the snow to a liquid for a split second so it freezes back to a solid mass. This process is called sintering.'

Fisk-Jaskolka noted the snow being right below the freezing point gives the snowball a better chance of sticking together. If you try to form a snowball with a freezing cold ball of snow, the pressure will not be enough to condense the molecules. Chances are, if the snow is too cold, you will end up with a semi-formed ball that will fall apart if you look at it wrong.

"The reason it relates to ice skating is that when you skate, your body weight is concentrated on this very thin sliver of metal, which becomes extremely sharp," Fisk-Jaskolka said. "As you skate along, the pressure of your skate forcibly creates a thin separation in the ice and you're skating on molecular water. This is why any divots in the ice look kind of glazed over."

Pressure is the makeor-break component of the perfect snowball because the molecules need to heat up enough to form together. Without really packing that snow into your gloves, you will end up with snowflakes all over your jeans.

So, when you make that snowball, make sure to squeeze as hard as possible.

Mountain Views



them tested to make sure they won't be putting anyone in danger should they decide to volunteer.






