Early storm buries region in up to 36 inches of snow

ALBANY — By all accounts, last week's winter storm was a backbreaker.

"That was one heck of a storm," said David VanLuven. Bethlehem's town supervisor said he was under the impression the total snowfall amounted to the area's fourth largest "blizzard" in history.



Backbreaker of a storm

According to the National Weather Service, Delmar was among the worst areas hit within Albany County. Three stations within the hamlet reported totals that varied between 26 and 29 inches. The town of Knox measured 29.5 inches for the two-day storm. Saratoga fielded the brunt of the storm within the Capital District, capturing 36 inches.

VanLuven said his town highway crews worked 18 straight hours starting at 1:30 a.m. Thursday morning as a low pressure front moved north from the Outer Banks of North Carolina. "Then [they] were back in at 3 a.m. [Friday morning] to plow all day," he said. "Another 12 hours."

The weather agency shied away from labeling last week's storm as a blizzard, but the words it used to describe the event in its official summary came close.

"Heavy snow bands of 1 to 2 inches per hour were common with this initial activity," the weather agency stated within its summary. "The heavy snow bands slowed their northward progress and pivoted, resulting in incredible snowfall rates of up to 6 inches per hour after midnight on the 17th through the late morning."


Schoharie, Schenectady, Saratoga, southeast Warren, Washington, and northern Bennington counties were listed among those who suffered through the worst of the storm. Snowfall totals measured between 2 and 3 feet within this band.

Officially, 22.9 inches was measured at Albany International Airport, making this storm the eighth largest snowstorm on record at Albany, and the fourth largest in December. Other snow totals included 28 inches in Colonie, 26.1 in Latham, 24.5 in Boght Corners, 24 in Guilderland and 23 in Selkirk.

By Saturday morning, satellite imagery revealed a white ribbon of snowfall stretching across the Northeast. The southern edge of the band of snow cover appeared near Long Branch, New Jersey. The threshold to the north appeared to end along the southern Adirondack ridge. The thickest of the snowpack covers the areas of both the Mohawk and Hudson valleys.

Snow amounts of 1 to 2 feet were common throughout most places, according to the weather service.

"With massive storms like this, our plow teams will make four or more





passes," VanLuven said, adding that each pass is equal to 180 miles.
"Sidewalks are a huge task too: one plow run is the equivalent of plowing a sidewalk from Delmar to Bennington, Vermont."



Snow shoveling health hazards

ALBANY — The American Heart Association says that for most people, shoveling snow may not lead to any health problems. However, the association warns that the risk of a heart attack during snow shoveling may increase for some, as the combination of colder temperatures and physical exertion increases the workload on the heart.

People who are outdoors in cold weather should avoid sudden exertion, like lifting a heavy shovel full of snow. Even walking through heavy, wet snow or snow drifts can strain a person's heart.

For those who are sedentary, or people with existing heart conditions like heart failure, high blood pressure or cholesterol, the increased workload on the heart from activities such as shoveling of heavy snow, can put them at higher risk for heart attack—where a clot blocks blood flow to a heart artery causing the heart muscle damage or tissue death. This is a life-threatening medical emergency.

To help make snow removal

safer, the American Heart Association has compiled a list of practical tips.

- Give yourself a break. Take frequent rest breaks during shoveling so you don't overstress your heart. Pay attention to how your body feels during those breaks
- Don't eat a heavy meal prior or soon after shoveling. Eating a large meal can put an extra load on your heart.
- Use a small shovel or consider a snow thrower. The act of lifting heavy snow can raise blood pressure acutely during the lift. It is safer to lift smaller amounts more times, than to lug a few huge shovelfuls of snow. When possible, simply push the snow.
- Learn the heart attack warning signs and listen to your body, but remember this: Even if you're not sure it's a heart attack, have it checked out (tell a doctor about your symptoms). Minutes matter! Fast action can save lives maybe your own. Don't wait more than five minutes to call 9-1-1.

• Don't drink alcoholic beverages before or immediately after shoveling. Alcohol may increase a person's sensation of warmth and may cause them to underestimate the extra strain their body is under in the cold.

• Consult a doctor. If you have a medical condition, don't exercise on a regular basis or are middle aged or older, meet with your doctor prior to the first anticipated snowfall.

Be aware of the dangers of hypothermia. Heart failure causes most deaths in hypothermia. To prevent hypothermia, dress in layers of warm clothing, which traps air between layers forming a protective insulation. Wear a hat because much of your body's heat can be lost through your head.

Heart Attack Signs

Some heart attacks are sudden and intense — the "movie heart attack," where it is clear what's happening. But most heart attacks start slowly, with mild pain or discomfort. Often people affected aren't sure what's wrong and wait too long before getting

help. Here are signs that can mean a heart attack is happening:

- Chest discomfort. Most heart attacks involve discomfort in the center of the chest that lasts more than a few minutes, or that goes away and comes back. It can feel like uncomfortable pressure, squeezing, fullness or pain.
- Discomfort in other areas of the upper body. Symptoms can include pain or discomfort in one or both arms, the back, neck, jaw or stomach.
- Shortness of breath with or without chest discomfort.
- Other signs may include breaking out in a cold sweat, nausea or lightheadedness

As with men, women's most common heart attack symptom is chest pain or discomfort. But women are somewhat more likely than men to experience some of the other common symptoms, particularly shortness of breath, nausea/vomiting, and back or jaw pain.

Call 9-1-1 emergency medical services (EMS) for

rapid transport to the emergency room and treatment when they arrive on the scene. Don't drive yourself--have someone drive you to the hospital right away.

Heart attacks can cause sudden cardiac arrest, where the heart stops beating, or beats irregularly, failing to pump enough blood. If a victim is unresponsive, not breathing or only gasping, quick recognition and fast action are the keys to saving a life.

What You Can Do

Bystanders can help cardiac arrest victims survive, if they act fast. First, call 9-1-1 and start CPR right away. Then, if an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) is available, use it as soon as possible. If two people are available to help, one should begin CPR immediately while the other calls 9-1-1 and finds an AED.

Shop here, get gas

Gas sales permitted at disputed Stewart's location

DELMAR — The town planning board received its answer on how to proceed after a Stewart's Shops proposal briefly stalled earlier this month to revisit what was last agreed upon between the town and the convenience store back in 1998.

The Malta-based store chain introduced its plan to bring gas pumps back to a revamped store model on the corner of Delaware and Elm avenues in June. It was to continue discussing how it's expanded footprint would comply with zoning requirements on Dec. 1. The board tabled the discussion after a local resident challenged that position with evidence suggesting gas pumps were not to be allowed.

The town approved the present-day storefront more than 20 years ago, after Stewart's Shops promised it would go without selling gas. Though the corner lot was previously a gas station more than a decade before that, town planners steered away from bringing a second gas station to the busy intersection.

Since then, a comprehensive plan and a defined convenience store use that permits the sale of gasoline had the store chain flexing its legal right. Justin Harbinger, the town's code enforcement officer agreed.

"As the planning board, my advise to you is, we have to follow the current zoning as it exists," said Mark Sweeney, counsel for the Bethlehem Planning Board. The attorney prefaced his comment by defining Harbinger's role; that of being the one official charged with the responsibility. "There is no exception. There's no requirement here that would prevent you from doing so, nor do you have, as a board, the authority to make an interpretation differently."

The determination brought both sides back to the original scope of last month's meeting, which was how Stewart's Shop could devise a way to fit a 3,975 square-foot gable roof, concrete clapboard building for a new store. It is also pitching for a freestanding, 2,668 square-foot canopy to shelter gas pumps capable of fueling eight cars at a time.

Stewart's has tried to draft schematics that would allow both to fit within the corner lot, factoring buffers, adequate parking and an aesthetic dictated by the town's hamlet designation. None of the three plans it submitted do.

"That's a little bothersome," said board chairman John Smolinsky. "We don't really have a plan to pick and choose from. But, we can at least express a very broad concept... to place a building up near the road."

Stewart's Shop has committed to its gasoline and diesel business in recent years. In January, Stewart's spent \$6.6 million to purchase Polsinello Fuel's wholesale business at the Port of Albany. And, according to the *Albany Business Review*, it stands to acquire Red-Kap wholesale fuel distribution business and convenience stores before the year's end.

Resident Peter M.
Iwanowicz, who emailed the board a copy of the 1998 use variance agreement that prohibited the sale of gas, had previously protested by stating "It would make more sense and be more environmentally sustainable to set up electric vehicle charging stations there."

Sweeney had shared that when the town rezoned the corner lot in 2005 it had the opportunity, but chose against, appending legislation that would have restricted the sale of gas.

A lot of hot air around Real McCoy

Real McCoy's proposed kitchen to move before planning board

DELMAR — The Real McCoy cleared its first hurdle to see its proposed standalone kitchen approved after the Bethlehem Zoning Board of Appeals granted it a use variance on Wednesday, Dec. 16.

What first appeared to be a welcomed idea by the community, subsequent hearings featured pleas from neighboring residents to prevent the nanobrewery's plans. The board said that, despite weighing their concerns over testimony from apparent customers, it saw little reason to prevent the application from moving on to the planning board.

"Hopefully you will see that once this whole process has completed, a lot of your concerns will be taken care of," said board member Jane Barnes.

Owner Michael Bellini was back before the board to pitch his off-set eatery on Wednesday, Dec. 16. A proposal that involves two, 40-foot shipping containers to be modified into a small, commercial kitchen. Each of the "high-cube" containers stand 9-feet and 6-inches tall, measure 8-feet wide and 40-feet long.

The kitchen is a permitted use for where it is proposed. What is at issue is the placement of the kitchen, of which the modified containers already on the property stand in apparent violation of town zoning for a standing structure. Should they remain as storage containers, the board said they are allowed where they

are. Change their use to what has been proposed, a variance is required.

The stand-alone kitchen will sit at the back end of the 20 Hallwood Road property, nosing a property line defined by pine trees, a stockade fence and a 10-foot retaining wall. The kitchen will stand as close as nearly 9 feet from the property line and just over 12 feet from its back neighbor's garage.

The business owner initially presented his 191-page proposal with resounding letters of approval, including from Assemblywoman Patricia Fahy and New York Senator Neil Breslin, but letters of disapproval from neighboring residents have been submitted since last month's public hearing.

Grove Street resident Andrew Morse stated he has welcomed the "laughter, music and seeing our streets active with pedestrians

and bicyclists" in the neighborhood. However, he expressed empathy for the residents around the popular venue.

"With RMB wanting to install a kitchen with the exhaust fan being at practically the same height as the neighbor's yard and houses on Delaware Avenue is concerning," stated Morse, "as I imagine it would be for you who are reading this if it was your own backyard."

Diana Skuza, whose family lives in the Delaware Avenue home behind Real McCoy, expressed concern last month over the fan's noise and the possibility it would blow grease and protein particles into their backyard. The Winn family, who own and once occupied the rental property behind the brewery, also spoke against the prospect of added noise and debris.

Bellini returned before the board with reports it

requested on how the new kitchen would impact local residents. He came back with a scientific review that promised the fan would produce no more than 1.2 decibels above the ambient noise already present. He also included pictures of similar fans present at local businesses.

In particular, Bellini showed a recently renovated Dunkin Donuts on Delaware Avenue that earned approval to expand for a drive-thru service. The expansion required approval as the drive-thru abuts a neighboring

residence. Another photograph featured Perfect Blend, which has two exhaust fans hanging over a pedestrian walkway that connects its rear parking lot to foot traffic from Four Corners.

A Type 1 restaurant exhaust fan, which resembles a kick drum, is designed for appliances that produce grease and smoke from fryers, griddles and ovens. It was originally proposed to face the Skuza family's backyard, to the south of Real McCoy's

Another report

supported by the National Weather Service, suggested winds would not blow exhaust towards Real McCoy's rear neighbor, which resides south. The majority of the time wind moves west to east, or from south to north, but seldom from north to south, he said.

Faced by opposition, Bellini told the board he's willing to erect a stockade fence and change the orientation of his fan to blow towards his establishment.

"We're very confident

that there's no impact," said Bellini, "that's why we're willing to point it at our own building."

Skuza, however, remained unswayed by the revised proposal, continuing to cite her concerns with added noise and air pollution. She quoted from state building code specific to Type 1 exhaust systems, stating such fans can not stand within 10 feet of nearby buildings, nor within the same distance from the ground.

Skuza's property stands

above a retaining wall that divides her backyard from Real McCoy. Though the fan would be outside the 10-foot limit as it relates to her garage, it could stand less than the permitted amount to where the kitchen stands 9-feet away from the property line. The board said the planning board would review those specifics through SEQR review.

"Dirty, greasy build up is not just unsightly and unsanitary, it can also become a fire hazard," said Skuza. "Especially on rooftops and the existing wooden garage right by the property line."

George Winn, whose family owns a Delaware Avenue rental property, claimed the presence of the containers have reduced the value of his property. He continued his argument from last month, accusing Real McCoy owners of removing trees from his property and being overall disrespectful.

"It's easier to ask for forgiveness than to ask permission, and that's how this whole thing has gone down," Winn said.


O'Keefe, Jane G.

COVID-19 vaccinations reach Albany

Shaker Place residents agree to take the shot

ALBANY — The vast majority of the residents at Shaker Place, the county run nursing home, began receiving COVID-19 vaccinations on Monday, Dec. 21.

County Executive Dan McCoy said of the 172 residents at Shaker Place, 150 have agreed to get vaccinated while the other 22 either are waiting to see the effects or have health care proxies and their caretakers have not yet been contacted.

Of the 200 workers at the nursing home, though, he said only about half are willing to take the shot.

"That was more alarming to me than the residents," he said. "I don't want to mandate anyone get the vaccine but people have to realize if we want to move on in life, and return to any type of normalcy this is the way to go. We have to sit them down and find out what the issues are, but mandating anyone to take the vaccine is not the way to go."

The second shot of a two-shot series will take place in three weeks and it will be at least another three weeks before the impact of the vaccine is seen in the individuals and longer before society as a whole begins to reap the benefits.

The vaccine was being delivered to residents of nursing homes across the county and state, but it is now known what the response rate was among the residents.

Last week, front line hospital health care workers began taking the first of two shots of vaccine produced by Pfizer. The federal Food and Drug Admiration also gave an emergency OK to a vaccine produced by Moderna, which will be available locally in the coming days.

Unlike traditional vaccines, the two available now for use against COVID do not inject a person with the virus. Rather, they use a technology called messenger RNA, or a simulated piece of the protein that attaches the virus to the body to trick the body into thinking the virus is coming and in response, the body produces antibodies.

"Once the body creates that immune response, both the protein and the mRNA are eliminated while the antibodies stick around to protect the person in the future," according to Health.com.

Phase IA of the vaccine rollout in this state is health care workers and

residents of nursing homes. Phase IB is anyone more than 75 years old and Phase IC is anyone 64 to 75 with high risk medical conditions. Phase 2 includes K-12 teachers and staff, critical workers in high risk settings, those with comorbidities and all older adults not included in Phase 1. Phase III includes all young adults and those workers deemed essential but not in high risk settings.

The vaccination roll out comes at a time when positive cases and hospitalizations are skyrocketing across the country, in this state and the eight-county Capital Region district.

From Sunday to
Monday, there were 221
new positive cases in
Albany County bringing
the total to 9,284 since
the pandemic took hold in
March. From Monday, Dec.
14 through Monday Dec.

21, there have been a total of 1.333 new cases.

The number of county residents hospitalized jumped from 86 on Monday, Dec. 14, to 113 a week later, the highest number since May 15, McCoy said.

Over the past week, 13 residents died of COVID bringing the total to 194 as of Dec. 21.

On the plus side of the equation, on Dec. 21, 7,679 people who tested positive recovered, an increase of 1,367.

Dr. Dennis McKenna, CEO at Albany Medical Center Hospital, said the number of admissions continues to go up not only at his hospital but across the eight-county Capital District Region. As of Wednesday, Dec. 16, he said during an appearance on Talk1300 radio, there were 76 at Albany Med with 17 in the ICU. In hospitals across the eight counties,

there were 288. The people who are being admitted, he said, are those older than 70 and those with an underlying health issue like hypertension, obesity, lung disease or diabetes.

"We talk about so many things to prevent the transmission of the virus, it is really important, especially as we head into the winter season, there are things people can do to make themselves healthier," he said. "We can control hypertension and we can control diabetes. People can exercise more. We don't talk enough about taking control of our own health, that is an important part of controlling the virus as well."

Virus shows no sign of slowing

An important message for elementary families from Bethlehem Central Superintendent Jody Monroe.

Dear K-5 Family:

The surge in COVID-19 cases we began seeing in the district leading up to Thanksgiving and in the weeks since shows no sign of slowing. Last Friday, we made the decision to have our students in grades 6-12 switch to remote learning through the holiday break to address a districtwide staffing shortage and to preserve the continuity of instruction for students.

Today, we have made the very difficult decision to have our K-5 students switch to remote learning beginning Monday, Dec. 21 for the same reasons. A remote learning schedule will be provided to parents by your child's teachers and all resources and materials for learning will be sent home with your child on Friday, Dec. 18. Students in Skills and Intensive Skills classes will continue to receive daily in-person instruction.

On Friday, Dec. 18, there will be in-person instruction at all elementary schools and remote instruction for students in grades 6-12.

We have made every effort to keep our K-5 students in school for inperson instruction as long as reasonably possible. Now, reason tells us it is time to temporarily suspend



classroom instruction at the elementary level.

Since Dec. 1, there have been 37 cases of COVID-19 reported in the district, with many of these now impacting our elementary schools. As a result of these cases, there are more than 340 BC students - and dozens of staff members – in quarantine. Every day, we are seeing more teachers and staff forced out of the classroom and into quarantine, sometimes as a result of being identified as a contact at school, or often through contact at home. And though we have found ways to be

creative in meeting these staffing challenges while maintaining a safe learning environment, the troubling rise in community spread of COVID-19 allows no room for error.

With the storm jeopardizing access to COVID testing and certainly slowing results, reporting and contact tracing, we see the switch to remote learning for our elementary students as the very best decision at a very difficult time.

We know that this is disappointing news for many families. Our students have done an

amazing job of following health and safety protocols that have allowed us to get to this point, and parents, too, have been responsive, resilient and flexible in helping us keep in-person learning going. Our goal is to resume in-person learning in January with even more mitigation strategies, including access to COVID testing right here in the district, that will help strengthen our ability to deliver in-person learning to students.

As always, I thank you for your continued support for the school district as we navigate this most unusual school year. We could not do it without you. If you have any questions regarding this transition for elementary students, please feel free to email me at jmonroe@ bethlehemschools.org.

Again, K-5 students will be provided with all necessary materials for athome learning when they leave school on Friday, Dec. 18. If your family needs to make other arrangements for picking up these materials, please notify your building's main office.





BalletCollective premiered its Nutcracker to rave reviews earlier this month to intimate crowds of underwriters who helped fund the \$400,000 production. This week, a free, streamed performance will run from Wednesday, Dec. 23 to Saturday, Dec. 26, at http://bit.ly/mouseking.

Schumacher, director of BalletCollective, told *Pointe* Magazine he took in a tour of Wethersfield Estate in Dutchess County when he was struck with the idea of a Nutcracker performance. The neo-Georgian manor home in Amenia is a quiet getaway that features a formal garden and carriage house museum. It was once the family home of Chauncey Stillman, grandson of James Stillman, who was Chairman of the National Bank. Chauncev. a strong advocate for the arts and an avid sportsman who was first lured to the area for its fox hunting, preserved the estate as an escape. The Wethersfield Foundation, which

maintains and manages the Estate, focuses on access to the arts, culture and land conservation.

Schumacher said he was inspired by the architecture of the manor home and the sprawling grounds of the estate. Having already tackled a successful premier of a full ballet performance this summer, he started choreographing a Nutcracker within the rooms and gardens of the estate.

Schumacher, is already an established young choreographer in the ballet world. He is also a soloist for the New York City Ballet, which draws droves of fans each holiday for its performance of the Nutcracker. COVID-19, however, has clamped down performances by the dance company - first felt by upstate fans when its summer residency at Saratoga Performing Arts Center was canceled.

BalletCollective's Nutcracker features 22 dancers from both the City Ballet and American Ballet Theatre, including alternating casts of Sugarplum Fairies and Cavaliers: Sara Mearns and Taylor Stanley in one, and Ashley Laracey (Schumacher's real-life partner) and Tyler Angle in the other.

The Nutcracker at Wethersfield paid attention to safety precautions throughout production, having quarantined dancers and staff for 4 weeks, and requiring them all to live and work in a "quarantine pod." Forced into what they've all taken to call a podlife experience on social media, it's meant that those who spend time with each other on stage often share sleeping arrangements, too.

The cast is to include Sara Mearns, Tyler Angle, Ashley Laracey, Taylor Stanley, Mira Nadon, Erica Pereira, Ralph Ippolito, Eliza Blutt, Gabriella Domini, Savannah Durham, Claire Von Enck, Emma Von Enck, Malorie Lundgren, Mary Thomas MacKinnon, Miriam Miller, Davide Riccardo, Kristen Segin, Mary Elizabeth Sell, Mimi Staker, KJ Takashi and Cainan Weber.

Teach them well

Anne O'Brien Carelli uses historical fiction to tell the story

DELMAR — It was fifth grade, in Jan Palmer's class, that I was introduced to the Holocaust.

We were asked to read Lois Lowry's "Number the Stars" and talk about it in groups. Even at 10 years old, I was a voracious reader; I could put down books quicker than any kid in my class. "Number the Stars" was no different. The story of Annemarie and Ellen introduced me to a world where people were murdered for things as harmless as being Jewish or being disabled. Within six months, I had torn apart my school's library looking for any book at all



about the Third Reich, its atrocities and its "mission." Lowry's work of historical fiction lit the spark, and I turned it into an inferno. To this day, the Holocaust is still the one part of history I can't learn enough about.

Anne O'Brien Carelli knows these introductions are critical, as it piques the interest of the children reading them. A fellow World War II history buff, she's always been attached to the French Resistance. As she's progressed in her career, she's made a hobby of perusing primary sources about the resistance and turning it into stories young children can digest. Now, she's branching out into different historical topics, including the Revolutionary

O'Brien Carelli released two more works of historical fiction, "One Light" and "Beneath the Heart," in October and

December respectively. Since the publication of "Skylark and Wallcreeper" in 2018, O'Brien Carelli has found a home in using fiction as a means to teach young readers about otherwise complex topics.

"I want to be able to wrap these facts into a compelling, fast-moving story," O'Brien Carelli said. "If I can get these kids to enjoy the book but also learn from it at the same time, I've done my job."

"One Light" is the story of 12-year-old Eleanor, a member of the French Resistance in World War II. Eleanor is tasked with watching a group of Jewish children hiding in a monastery cellar, where she befriends the spunky Shoshana, one of the refugees. When Shoshana disappears, Eleanor is determined to find her friend by all means necessary.

O'Brien Carelli said the story of Eleanor is extremely similar to what actually happened in the resistance; while Eleanor is a fictional girl, children were heavily involved in the French Resistance and were often tasked with equally dangerous jobs as those given to adult members.

"Beneath the Heart" iumps back a bit further, launching the reader into 1775. Phoebe, also 12, lives with her family in Saratoga, New York. Her farm has become the headquarters of the American Army. Phoebe is tasked with an important mission by a dying soldier while managing the care of her infant sister. Her journey to complete the mission is filled with twists and turns and shows that even the youngest of girls can have influence and independence.

O'Brien Carelli said "Beneath the Heart" was inspired by her own journey. Recently, she learned she is descended from people whose house and barn were used as headquarters by General Horatio Gates in Saratoga. As a transplant from Michigan, O'Brien Carelli was shocked to learn her own blood was so closely tied to the turning point of the American Revolution.

"I want kids to see how your environment can change so quickly," O'Brien Carelli said, "and how situations can have emotional ties to them. In these stories, it's children who are front and center of the story, controlling the narrative. I want children to see how they are able to learn about something, take a stance and contribute to the story somehow."

O'Brien Carelli said writing historical fiction forces her to use multiple skills, as the fiction she creates has to be realistic in the historically-correct time period. She's forced to verify everything about the characters, whether it be the shoes they wear, the cars they ride in or the speech they use.


"People will catch you if something isn't historically accurate," she said. "If I'm writing dialogue and I use a phrase that isn't historically correct, there are people who will catch it. It forces me to really dig deep into my primary sources and use them to support the fiction that's within the pages."

Safety first when canning your own foods

resh fruits and vegetables are full of flavor and can make for wonderful additions to anyone's diet. But as many foodies know, it's not always easy to find your favorite fresh fruits and vegetables at the grocery store.

Various fruits and vegetables are more readily available at certain times of the year when they're considered in-season. Though such foods won't necessarily be unavailable throughout the rest of the year, they might be harder

to find in the offseason. In recognition of that difficulty, many people turn to canning.

The U.S. Food and Drug Administration and the Āmerican Medical Association note that home

canning can be an excellent way to store and preserve various foods, including produce. However, both the FDA and the AMA warn that improperly canned foods can cause botulism. Botulism is a rare, potentially deadly form of food poisoning.

The threat posed by improper canning is significant, and the FDA and AMA offer the following tips to help people safety and properly can their own produce.

• Use the right canner. When canning foods, use a canner manufactured for canning and not just pressure cooking. When choosing a canner, make sure it's the right size, as the FDA notes that canners that are too small can lead to undercooking. Canning low-acid

vegetables, which includes green beans and corn, as well as meats, fish and poultry requires the use of a pressure canner. Boiling water canners should not be used for low-acid foods, as such products cannot protect against botulism.

• Clean your pressure canner regularly. Maintaining a pressure canner also is vital to avoid food poisoning. If the

canner has a rubber gasket, make sure it is flexible and soft and not brittle, sticky or cracked. Routinely clean openings on small pipes or vents to ensure these parts do not contain any debris. Air should be vented from the canner for 10 minutes before the canner is pressurized.

• Discard foods if you're concerned about safety. The FDA and

AMA recommend home canners adopt the "when in doubt, throw it out" mantra. Home-canned foods can be contaminated even if they look, smell or taste normal. Inspect jars carefully when opening home-canned foods. Leaking, bulging or swollen containers may contain contaminated foods. Food also may be contaminated if containers

are damaged or cracked or if they spurt liquid or foam upon being opened. Contaminated foods may be discolored, moldy or smell bad.

Canning foods at home can be a great way to enjoy your favorite foods even when they're not in-season. But safety should be the utmost priority when canning foods at home.



Formica goes original with acoustic set

Performing an acoustic set of rock music takes guts.



Hearty soup makes the meal


very home chef should have a rich and filling soup recipe in his or her repertoire. These hearty meals are perfect for cold days spent shoveling snow or after coasting downhill on a sled.

Baked potato soup is a creamy soup that is reminiscent of a loaded baked potato. For those who are

For those who are avoiding inflammatory foods, such as those in the nightsh white potatoes are included, a potatory foods.

foods, such as those in the nightshade variety, of which white potatoes are included, a potato soup may be harder to come by. This version of "Loaded Baked Potato Soup" from "Eat What You Love" (Ten Speed Press) by Danielle Walker is a delicious alternative that can satisfy potato soup cravings.





Loaded Baked Potato Soup

INGREDIENTS: Serves 6

- 6 slices thick bacon, coarsely chopped
- 1 yellow onion, diced
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 pounds Hannah sweet potatoes, peeled and diced
- 10 ounces cauliflower, cut into florets
- 41/2 cups chicken bone broth
- 1 cup cashew milk
- 31/2 teaspoons fine sea salt
- 1/2 teaspoon smoked paprika
- 1/2 teaspoon apple cider vinegar
- 1/2 teaspoon freshly squeezed lemon juice Chopped fresh chives, for serving (optional) Dairy-free sour cream (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS

Line a plate with paper towels. In a stockpot, cook the bacon over medium heat until the fat is rendered and the bacon is crisp, about 8 minutes. Using a slotted spoon, remove the bacon from the pot and set it on the prepared

plate to drain. Pour off most of the grease, reserving about 2 tablespoons in the pot.

Return the pot to medium-high heat, add the onion and garlic, and sauté for 2 minutes, until fragrant. Add half of the sweet potatoes and all of the cauliflower and cook for 5 minutes, stirring frequently. Add the bone broth, bring it to a gentle boil, and cook for 10 minutes, until the potatoes and cauliflower are tender.

Using an immersion blender, or working in batches in a blender, blend the soup until smooth. (If using a blender, remove the cap in the blender top and place a kitchen towel over the top to allow steam from the hot liquid to release while you blend.) Return the purée to the stockpot. Add the remaining sweet potatoes, the cashew milk, salt, paprika, vinegar, and lemon juice. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat, then turn the heat to low and simmer for 12 to 15 minutes, stirring frequently, until the sweet potatoes are tender and the cashew milk has thickened the soup.

Ladle the soup into bowls and top with the reserved bacon, chives, and dollop of sour cream. Serve immediately.

Store leftover soup in an airtight container in the refrigerator for 5 days, or in the freezer for 6 months. Defrost overnight in the refrigerator. Reheat in a saucepan over medium heat, stirring frequently, for 10 minutes.
