DELMAR — Bethlehem police arrested a 35-year-old man whose alleged threat over the

Michael A Litz Jr, 35, of Albany, was arrested stemming from a phone call he made to St. Thomas the Apostle School, causing both St. Thomas and the Bethlehem Central Middle schools to follow lockout protocols last Wednesday.

Litz Jr. was charged with Making a Terroristic Threat and Aggravated Harassment as a Hate Crime (both felonies). Litz Jr. was arraigned in Town of Bethlehem Court and released under the supervision of Albany County Probation.

Litz Jr., who was already on probation, was held and transported to the Albany County Correctional Facility for violating his conditions of probation. At this time no return court date has been set.

lifted, Bethlehem Central released a robocall alert to district families to warn of delays from bus routes running from the middle school to area elementary schools. The recorded message told parents that the threat was "unfounded" by police. Nonetheless, students who normally walked home from the middle school were assigned to buses.

St. Thomas the Apostle is located less than a quarter-mile from Delmar's Four Corners. The private, Catholic school enrolls approximately 234 students between kindergarten and eighth grade. Bethlehem Central Middle School has approximately 1,000 students enrolled between sixth and eighth grade.

Resiliency is the word for 2021

2020 shapes town's future in both good and challenging ways

BETHLEHEM — Sending 2020 on its way through a State of the Town address promising hope would be a hard sell as the nation continues to linger in a pandemic, but that's what David VanLuven did.

The town supervisor shaped expectations of the coming year with a recap of events from the previous one as those steps made in 2020 continue forward into 2021.

VanLuven, whose expected to run for his third term as town supervisor this year, expressed familiar themes of services and the people who help provide them. On the first night of Black History Month, he added a third theme — resiliency.

"In 2020, we saw a nationwide awakening and rising up against oppression, mistreatment, and inequality," VanLuven said. "This is an important moment, for Bethlehem and our country, and we have a responsibility to recognize the vital role that people of color have in our town and ensure that everyone feels welcomed in our community."

Last year, town board members stepped out with an official proclamation that Black lives matter. It was preceded by a historic demonstration last June when more than 1,500 people gathered at Delmar's Four Corners to protest the murder of George Floyd at the hands of Minneapolis police.

Bethlehem organized a police reform committee last September, following the appointment of its newest police chief, Gina

Cocchiara. Her promotion was heralded as yet another progressive step toward reform. She is the Town's first woman police chief, and only the woman police chief in New York state history. Meanwhile, the results from the committee's deliberations and consultations are expected to structure changes in law enforcement policy. Gov. Andrew Cuomo mandated municipalities complete their respective plan by April.

"I am so grateful to the many community members who have participated in this process over the months," VanLuven said. The supervisor said the Town is on track to meet the governor's deadline.

The push for racial equity across the country defined a year also marred by a raging pandemic. VanLuven held his

annual State of the Town address through video conferencing broadcasted over the internet. It's the same manner in which public meetings have been conducted since last March. COVID-19 has been ever present as the country continues with its mitigation efforts. While a vaccine is currently pushed out, businesses continue to either be closed or operate at reduced capacity, crushing the local economy. From sales tax alone, the Town received nearly \$1 million less revenue than the previous year.

"Our business owners have fought hard to keep their shops and restaurants open despite fewer customers. ... I know that these resilient trends will continue through 2021...," said VanLuven

Infrastructure and capital plan upgrades expected for 2021 include an \$18 million upgrade to the Clapper Road Water Treatment Plant and the completed renovations to the dive pool at Elm Avenue Town Park.

Not mentioned in VanLuven's address was the planned construction of the Glenmont traffic circle for the intersection of Feura Bush Road and Route 9W.

Construction on the \$4.9 million project was to begin last spring. Virus mitigation protocols, however, had slowed plans. The project is funded through the Federal Highway Administration and the New York State Department of Transportation with 80 percent of project costs covered by FHWA. According to the Town's website, construction is planned to begin in 2021.

The traffic circle is expected to mitigate traffic congestion within Bethlehem's busiest corridor. The corner of Glenmont was identified in the town's initial comprehensive plan nearly two decades ago. Last year, as the town aims towards amending that plan, the town board voted to place a 12-month moratorium on proposed development.

As mitigation measures continue throughout each facet of the local economy, VanLuven warned of projected shortcomings similar to those witnessed last year. The Town used nearly \$1 million from its reserve fund to cover revenue lost to unrealized sales tax. As the country is slow to recover, the supervisor reflected more on the spirit of his town's residents.

"Bethlehem is a strong, resilient community," said VanLuven. "We have weathered these crises well, and an end is in sight. The hardworking men and women who provide the services, leadership, and support that our Bethlehem residents rely on have stepped up so, so well, and I am grateful to them."

Sports get green light

School districts, parents have the final OK

ALBANY — COVID numbers across the board are down, including the county's seven-day positivity rate, and as of Monday, Feb. 8, "highrisk" sports like basketball, wrestling, cheerleading and hockey can begin again in Albany County.

Last month, Gov. Andrew Cuomo said the sports could begin but then punted and left the final decision to the county health departments. County Executive Dan McCoy and Dr. Elizabeth Whalen, head of the county Health Department, said sports could not begin until the rolling positivity rate was below 4 percent. That decision prompted a protest of students and coaches outside the Albany County office building but it did not change any minds.

"It was based on science and not emotion. It is based on science and not on votes. I'm not here to make

I'm not here to make everyone happy," McCoy said. "As of today, following the science, scrimmage and games can start if the *"I prefer a more cautious approach, but this is the way the guidelines are written and while this can happen today, nobody has a crystal ball."*

schools have submitted what they are supposed to submit to us."

As of Monday, the county's seven-day rolling positivity rate was about 3.9 percent.

"High risk" sports do have the OK at the state and county level, but the individual districts can still opt out. Rensselaer County allowed sports shortly after Cuomo said it was OK but two school districts, Lansingburgh and Hoosick Falls, decided to not begin winter sports. Last fall, while many districts across Albany County and Section II were playing sports like soccer, Bethlehem and Ballston Spa opted to sit out the season and wait until March, when Fall II is supposed to begin.



In Saratoga County, basketball teams have already begun practicing. The North Colonie Board of Education was set to meet on Monday, after this paper went to print, and the South Colonie Board was set to meet on Tuesday.

In addition to the individual school districts giving the final thumbs up, parents must sign a waiver allowing their children to participate in athletics, Whalen said.

To begin play, the districts must submit a plan to the county Health Department outlining protocols such as wearing masks, social distancing, screening and if testing athletes is an option the plans for administration

End vaccine 'Hunger Games'

ALBANY — Problems surrounding eligibility prioritization, excluded essential workers, limited access to available appointments, and more related to the rollout of New York State's COVID-19 vaccine distribution program continue to persist.

Legislatures say an easily accessible, statewide preregistration tool available for every New Yorker's use, would tackle these issues and provide much-needed peace of mind to an increasingly-anxious population.

Assemblymembers Patricia Fahy (D), John McDonald (D), and Carrie Woerner (D) released the following joint statement urging the state to create a pre-registration tool:

"In a year when we have all felt at the end of our proverbial rope, and have struggled to just make a knot and hang on until a coveted vaccine appointment could bring a measure of relief."

The pre-registration registration process would capture an individual's age, occupation, any underlying health conditions, and how they'd like to be contacted. The state would reprioritize the list based on eligibility phases — healthcare, frontline, essential workers first, those with comorbidities, over 75 next, over 65, and so on. As the vaccine arrives in the state, the Department of Health would allocate a number of doses to each county, pharmacy and other providers.

of them and plans for quarantining athletes should an outbreak occur.

Whalen said many other counties in the Capital District region and across the state are following basically the same guidance to begin sports again. Along with that, she said, is the 4 percent positivity rate over seven days and that could vary county to county. As of last month, school districts in at least 35 of the 62 counties in New York state were allowing athletes to participate in high risk winter sports.

Across the state, sports like bowling, gymnastics and swimming are well into their seasons. Most are competing at their home venues and comparing scores or times with other teams after the fact to prevent intermingling and help prevent the spread of COVID.

While all numbers associated with COVID-19 are on a downward trend, the positivity rate is just below the 4 percent threshold and it would not take many new cases to elevate it past that benchmark.

"Schools can wait if they decide. We don't want to be disruptive. We don't want to say you are on again today, but off again tomorrow," Whalen said. "I prefer a more cautious approach, but this is the way the guidelines are written and while this can happen today, nobody has a crystal ball."

Vaccinations

Last week, Gov. Andrew Cuomo said he would open up vaccinations to restaurant workers and livery drivers but left the final decision to the counties. McCoy said he would not extend the very limited supply of vaccination to those workers until the most vulnerable are immunized.

Also, Cuomo said people with underlying health conditions can qualify for vaccines beginning later this month. "Despite some of the lingering effects from the holiday surge, we're seeing our overall data continue to move in the right direction,"

The numbers

Every indicator has been positive over the last week. On Monday, Feb. 8, there were 75 new reported cases and 174 people who tested positive had recovered.

As of Monday, there were 19,111 total cases since the pandemic took hold in March, 2020, an increase of 698 from the



previous Monday. The death toll on Monday, Feb. 8, stood at 334, an increase of 17 from the week before.

On Monday, Feb. 8, there were 97 residents in the hospital, the lowest number since November, while there were 15 patients in the ICU.

"Despite some of the lingering effects from the holiday surge, we're seeing our overall data continue to move in the right direction. Hospitalizations are coming down and our 7-day average of percent positive rates has now dropped to 3.9 percent," McCoy said. "Now we need everyone to do their part to build on this momentum and keep the spread of the virus under control."

Brown's among best

Vinepair magazine names a Brown's beer as one of its top 50 beers in U.S.

TROY — Brown's Brewing had one of its beers named among the best beers around by one magazine staff devoted to covering all things spirits.

Vinepair named Brown's Brewing Calavera Imperial Stout in its annual list of The 50 Best Beers. The New York City-based magazine has dubbed itself "the fastest growing media company about wine, beer and spirits for Millennials," since first publishing in 2014.

The list covers the spectrum for all beer lovers, from lagers to stouts, IPAs and more. As one may expect, Brooklyn is well represented in the list. Nine of the 50 beers are brewed out of Brooklyn. However, the magazine staff shares full disclosure that it faced substantial obstacles due to the pandemic. Nonetheless, beers from New England, Colorado, Texas and California also made the list, giving readers a glimpse of what's available throughout the country.

"Brown's has been a bright spot on our radar this year," wrote the Vinepair staff, who placed Brown's stout up at No. 6 on the list. "The family-owned and -operated brewery produces a wide range of approachable styles, such pale ales and IPAs named for family members (Carla and Joann, we're looking at you). But it was Calavera that stopped us in our tracks. This imperial stout is aged with ancho chile, vanilla, cinnamon, allspice, and cacao nibs. Our panel appreciated

its use of adjuncts without barrel aging, which allows each ingredient to stand out. Moreover, it does so without the syrupsticky mouthfeel that tends to accompany so many 'pastry stouts.'

"Calavera is fresh on the palate, and velvety-smooth — it's a wonderful Covid-era beer to sip outside by a fire."

In all, Vinepair named a dozen beers from the Empire State on

upstate New York were bestowed with top honors. Hudson Valley, out of Beacon, made the list at No. 16 with its Incandenza Sour IPA. Arrowood Farm, out of Accord, had its Lion's Tooth 2019 farmhouse ale named at No. 24.

Brown's Brewing operates two taprooms often featuring limited runs of their crafted beers in both Troy and North Hoosick. Calavera is not listed among the beers available at either location.

Ray Jung died

Accomplished guitarist shared studio and played with Phil Collins, Jeff Berlin

SCHENECTADY — The music industry has lost a very special, talented, and accomplished musician, Raymond John Jung. He died on Monday, Feb. 1.

Jung was born at Bellevue Hospital in Niskayuna, NY on December 27, 1956 to Lenwood T. Jung and Juana-Fong Jung. His enthusiasm for the music industry began when he received his first guitar at the age of 4 and he began playing it around the neighborhood.

Jung began school at age 4 at St. Columbus Catholic School and went on to the Bishop Gibbons High School, both in Schenectady, New York. Ray's passion for music was evident as he was accepted early into the Berklee College of Music in Boston, MA on a scholarship program. His guitar teacher at Berklee was none other than the legendary musician, Pat Metheny.

Jung was originally trained as a classically trained guitarist, however, he learned to play a variety of music styles such as Jazz, Rock, R & B, and more. As he progressed through his musical career, his instrument of choice became the electric fretless bass. He had a gift for teaching others music and began his journey as an instructor for Drome Sound at age 18. His love for music took him across the country and abroad.

Throughout the years, Jung was a regular performer in New York City and Woodstock. In his travels to Europe, he performed with the Group, Renaissance. While in England, he played with the likes of Jeff Berlin and Phil Collins on the studio sets.

Jung was also a gifted performer and worked as a studio musician on Dance Fever Television Series in California. Locally, he produced and played original music for the Saratoga Jazz Festival. He was an instructor and faculty member at The National Guitar Workshop Seminars, Adjunct Music Professor at Union College and guitar/ bass teacher at Drome Sound in Schenectady.

Jung worked with some famous and inspirational musicians in the field, many of whom were in the Who's Who of the Music Industry - Robert Fripp from King Crimson, Robert Fripp and the Crafty Guitarists, Emmett Chapman inventor of the Chapman Stick and many others. His bass was sampled for the 30th Anniversary Sound Library for the Mellotron (Streetly Electronics) with several other artists.

Jung was a devout Christian who performed and frequently led the Music Ministry. He was involved with various Worship Ministry teams and projects, including: Hope Chapel in Valatie, NY, Calvary Tabernacle in Schenectady, and Life Church in the Tri-City area.

Jung was a very happy, optimistic person, a great friend and family member, who was generous, kind, and always offered a helping hand to those in need. He always said his favorite foods were his mom's home cooking, sushi and Indian food.

Let's have a cheers to youth

Albany Symphony hosting'young' program

ALBANY — Universal Preservation Hall is about to experience the power of young virtuosos in music.

The Grammy Awardwinning orchestra will perform three works, one of them commissioned from 20-year-old Tyson Davis, on Saturday, Feb. 13, at 7:30 p.m. The show will be streamed live from https:// www.albanysymphony. com/. There will be a preshow talk at 7 p.m. and a post-concert Q&A for members. "We are so excited to perform Tyson's piece, as he's such a skilled expert," Albany Symphony music director David Alan Miller said. "The work, named 'Distances,' is a tortured, expressive, introspective piece that serves as a metaphor of Tyson's experiences looking out over Manhattan through the pandemic."

Davis is a prodigy in his own right. He started composing music at 8 years old and is a graduate of The Juilliard School. Prior to entering The Juilliard School, Davis studied at the University of North Carolina School of the Arts with Lawrence Dillon. He took advantage of numerous opportunities at the school, writing for Eighth Blackbird, the Attacca String Quartet, **UNCSA** Cantata Singers and the UNCSA Symphony Orchestra. In the summer of 2019, Tyson worked with the National Youth Orchestra of the United States of America (NYO-USA) and Antonio Pappano to premiere his work, "Delicate Tension," a piece that was commissioned by the American Embassy in Berlin for the 30th anniversary of the fall of the Berlin Wall.

"I recall, when I was sketching this work, that I had taken a trip to Roosevelt Island, which is just across from Manhattan, where my dorm is at Juilliard," Davis said in a press release. "I remember thinking, as I looked across the East River, how close, yet how far, Manhattan was from this island. It was poetically metaphorical for what was happening and is still happening in our world. As we know, society at the current time is experiencing deep and dark wounds dealing with the pandemic and civil unrest."

Accompanying Davis' "Distances" is William Walton's "Facade," which Miller said was written when Walton was 23 years old. Walton composed "Facade" while he was living with the Sitwells, an English family known for its love of culture and the arts. Walton's work can sometimes be found under Edith Sitwell's poetry, and it encompasses all types of music, from folk songs to sea shanties and vaudeville tunes.

The program also features one of Johannes Brahms' earliest works, "Serenade No. 1 in D Major," which Miller said will be performed in a way almost unheard of. Brahms released the piece at 25 years old. The composition went through several changes; it was originally four movements and Brahms later added two. Miller said the orchestra will perform the original four movements and is utilizing an arrangement as close to Brahms' first draft as possible.

"This Brahms work came at a point where he was trying to figure out his sound and was capitalizing on the success Beethoven had with his symphonies," Miller said. "It's his first orchestral piece and his dabble into what would be a model for his later work."

Miller said the orchestra, which was nominated for its fifth Grammy in December, is excited to work with Davis and embrace the music that came from the younger years of some of music's most prolific composers.

"The beautiful thing about Tyson is he knows what he wants and we are so honored to be performing this piece," Miller concluded.

Despite the many factors that our nation finds dividing us, students from Brown School have joined forces with The Outer Loop Theater Experience to demonstrate how the past year's turmoil has affected them and how we can be better at reaching out to one another. It poses the question, "Can we, through theater, inspire empathy and reconnect to our shared humanity?"The project benefited the Schenectady Community Action Program (SCAP); tickets to the virtual viewing quickly sold out and a donation of over \$1,200 was made to SCAP.

The Empathy Project was filmed at the school on Jan. 31. During taping, "we gathered stories from Brown School students and faculty," the event page said. "Then, through words, music, dance, poetry, film and visual art, we curated, devised and assembled this live theatrical experience. The production includes both live and pre-recorded performances of stories from students and faculty, all surrounding their experiences of the crises we've faced together throughout 2020."

Program creator Rachael Yoder, who is also the managing director of The Outer Loop, said she and her husband, The Outer Loop founder and artistic director Michael Herman, were compelled to team up with Brown School after researching its website. A native of Niskayuna, Yoder is currently in another state for her education but was drawn to the Schenectady private school because of its mentions of diversity on its website. Right in the "about us" section, school staff describe Brown School as a place where anyone, regardless of race, gender, orientation or identity can feel accepted and valued. As tensions have spiked over racial strife and the rights around the LBGTQ+ community, Yoder said she was impressed with how baked in the idea of diversity is at the school. "I've known the head

of Brown School for a while and after two other installments of this project, I knew Brown School was going to be a wonderful fit," Yoder said. "Theater is a powerful form of storytelling and since the subject matter is around something so personal, it helps students take a mindful approach to express empathy and the different struggles they've faced."



Will McLeron and Maya Coons, both sophomores at Brown School, found the project as a cathartic way to visit some of the tougher topics in society. Coons and a friend centered their presentation around the societal differences and double standards between men and women; the students wanted to show how each gender was treated differently in a similar circumstance. McLeron took a recent event and made it hit home; he filmed different scenes from "Battlefield 1," a video game, and used them to demonstrate the riot at the United States Capitol on Jan. 6, when supporters of former President Donald Trump unsuccessfully tried to interrupt the certification of electoral college votes from the November election. Eggs are eggceptional

ggs are a topic of conversation each spring, largely because of their relationship to the Christian celebration of Easter. Brightly colored Easter eggs are on display, chocolate eggs line store shelves and egg-lined birds nests in trees and bushes dot spring landscapes.

Eggs take center stage in early spring, but they're more than just novelties to include in Easter celebrations.

• Eggs are nutritious. Eggs are loaded with vitamins A, D and B12 and the nutrient choline. They're also an excellent protein source in a small package. At 72 calories and packing six grams of protein, eggs can make for a great, filling meal at any time of day.

• Eggs boost brain health. The choline in eggs is a crucial nutrient for memory, mood and muscle



control, according to the University of Missouri Health Care system. Choline also is essential in fetal brain development and can help prevent birth defects.

• Eggs don't always have to be refrigerated.

In countries outside of the United States and Canada, eggs may not be refrigerated and do not have to be chilled. Also, outside of North America eggs are not washed prior to commercial production. However, according to the food resource TheKichn, power-washing eggs removes a protective coating and makes the eggs porous and vulnerable to contamination. A synthetic coating is put on washed eggs.

Shell color does not

matter. The color of the eggshell doesn't indicate taste, nutritional value or even egg quality. The color of the eggshell reflects the breed of hen that laid the egg. Red-feathered hens tend to lay brown eggs, while hens with white features lay white eggs. Similarly, the shade of yolk is representative of what the chicken is eating. A dark, yellow yolk means the hen was probably fed green vegetables. Lighter yolks coordinate to corn and grain diets.

• All eggs are "hormonefree." The term "hormonefree" on egg cartons does not signify anything special. It's like advertising that snow is cold. The United States Food & Drug Administration banned the use of hormones in all poultry production in the 1950s. All eggs are hormone-free.

• Size and eggshell thickness indicates the

age of the hen. Eggs come in different sizes, such as medium, large and jumbo. The age of the chicken determines the size, with older hens producing larger eggs. Age also affects shell thickness, with younger hens laying thicker-shelled eggs, says Eat This, Not That!

• Eggs won't hatch. Eggs sold for consumption are not fertilized. Hens that have laid them haven't mated.

• Many birds lay eggs. Kiwis lay the largest egg in relation to their body size of any species of bird in the world. However, the ostrich, emu and cassowary lay the biggest eggs.

• The sink or swim test can say a lot about an egg. Eggs become more porous as they age. You can tell if an egg is old by putting it in a glass of water. If it sinks, it is fresh. If it floats, it is an older egg.

Where photogs find focus

Central Studio is the photography studio you'd never expect to find with equipment so easily accessible

ALBANY — Finding an accessible studio that meets a photographer's needs is hard to come by in the Capital District, which makes Central Studio a must look.

The Albany-based studio at 1095 Central Avenue is a professional workspace for photographers and filmmakers, alike.

Photographers don't take pictures, they make images. A photograph is a combination of factors that involves inspiration, calculation and manipulation. The ability to handle all three in the controlled environment of a studio has perhaps never been as easy.

"After initially booking the space for a few hours it was immediately clear to me that they had created an environment that offers the sophistication of a major city studio," said photographer Kevin Greene. "Central Studio has all the professional styling, amenities and equipment found in rental studios in New York City and L.A."

Owner Adam Grogin combined his own experience as a photographer with extensive market research to devise an ideal workspace. In addressing the needs of anyone who walks through the door, he sized up the scene from every angle; from the photographer to the model, and everyone else in between.

Its expansive 1200foot workspace provides ample room for creativity to unfurl. It houses both strobe and constant LED lighting to accommodate both mediums, including a 40-foot long ceiling rail system.

The studio was designed specifically as a communal

space, which is clearly exemplified by grips, stands, tripods and other tools being left on display for easy access.

The centerpiece of the studio features a 20-by-20-foot white cycloramic wall. Otherwise known as an infinity cove, it lends various opportunities with every shoot — whether focusing in on the subject without distractions or setting the canvas for postop work on the computer. There are also over 50 different backgrounds and backdrops to choose from.

Away from the camera lens stands a neighboring lounge area. The comforts of a sofa and chaise lounge are complemented with a minifridge, watercooler, microwave oven and a Keurig machine. You're welcome to use them as props for your shot, too.

Models and make-up artists are also provided a vanity station with running

water — and a clean bathroom.

Providing a sense of ease was important. The idea was not to just give professionals a feeling of familiarity, but also to allow beginners to come in without the intimidation of learning something new. Even if someone has never used studio lighting before, the staff can be there to help set up the shoot. The studio's business slogan is "your space to create" with an emphasis on supporting the creative vision of the renter and achieving their artistic goals.

In addition to the rental space, Central Studio has offered workshops featuring guest educators lending tips on lighting equipment, techniques, effects and more. Once virus-related restrictions subside, there are plans to invite group shoots to come in, too.
