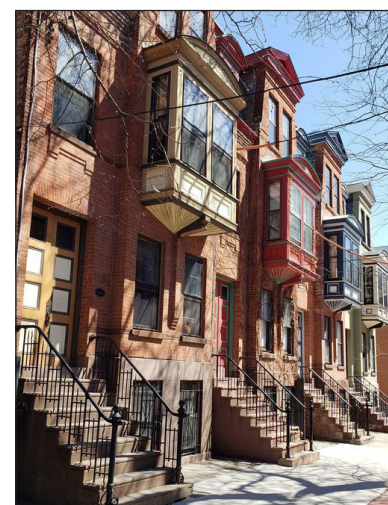

Early morning fire takes a life

Fire ruled not suspicious by authorities

DELMAR — Authorities are investigating the cause of a fire that left one person dead in a Bender Lane residence early Saturday morning, April 17.

The fire claimed the life of resident Michael Jeram. He was 65.

According to a Bethlehem police press release, the cause of the fire is not suspicious.

Bethlehem police received a call of a residential fire at 228 Bender Lane at approximately 3:06 a.m. Several fire departments responded to the scene, at which point the home was

fully involved.

Fire crews from Elsmere, Delmar and Selkirk distinguished the fire. A crew from North Bethlehem responded to provide rehabilitation, and another crew from Coeymans reported to

Selkirk Fire 1 for additional coverage. Also assisting at the scene were Albany County Sheriff Paramedics and Delmar-Bethlehem EMS.

According to a Bethlehem Police Department press release,

one adult was found dead in the house and later removed from the scene by the Albany County Coroner's Office. An autopsy is scheduled for Monday, April 19.

No other details were shared.

Man sentenced for interstate threats

ALBANY — Patris Derville, 22, of Cohoes, was sentenced to 13 months in prison on Thursday April 1, for transmitting an interstate threat to injure another person, announced Acting United States Attorney Antoinette T. Bacon and Thomas F. Relford, Special Agent in Charge of the Albany Field Office of the Federal

Bureau of Investigation.

As part of his previously entered guilty plea, Derville admitted that he used his Facebook account to transmit a Facebook Live video over the internet during which Derville threatened to shoot another person, and that he posted the video for the purpose of communicating that threat to that person.

This case was investigated by the FBI and its Capital District Safe Streets Gang Task Force.

Death investigated in Ravena

RAVENA — The Coeymans Police Department is investigating the death of a village resident found in her home on Wednesday, April 14.

Marilyn Fuentes, 60, was discovered unresponsive at her residence. With the assistance of the New York State Police the investigation remains ongoing. Results are still pending from an autopsy conducted at Ellis Hospital.

State Police advised there is currently no threat to the community.

The Bethlehem Town Board listened to several residents over their opinions regarding the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets and Road Diet Project first proposed in 2017. Many in favor lived on neighborhood streets immediately connected with the busy thoroughfare. Those opposed were the business owners whose storefronts depend on the motorist traffic.

Road diets reduce the number of lanes reserved for motorists to address several more issues surrounding the immediate neighborhood — increase safety, build up aesthetics, or accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists.

The town has yet to decide how to reline the highway. One option is to convert the existing four-lane road to two, opposing traffic lanes with a middle two-way left-turn lane. Another is to continue allowing two lanes for inbound traffic from Albany while reducing

outbound traffic to one. There is a third option — leave the roadway as is.

Proponents laud the road diet as a means of converting the 1.3-mile stretch of roadway between Elsmere Avenue and the Albany City Line as a pedestrian-friendly community street. Opponents, including business owners dependent on that traffic, are concerned motorists will be deterred from visiting their storefronts.

The town first had to pass a \$5.2 million bond resolution to fund the project. The money promised by the state and federal levels — all but \$728,000 of the proposed cost — are paid later to reimburse the town.

The town board approved a bond resolution for the project by a 4-1 vote at its meeting on Wednesday, April 14. By the same vote margin, it also allowed for the design services of CHA Companies in the amount

Construction up ahead

DELMAR — Planning Director Robert Leslie shared that a final decision on the design of the Delaware Avenue road diet won't be decided until next April. A survey study and mapping will, however, start next month.

Regardless of whether or not the town proceeds with reducing traffic lanes on the thoroughfare or leaving it as is, Town Supervisor David VanLuven said there is a need to replace Korean War-era waterline underneath the road, guaranteeing construction.

Delaware Avenue is not the only local roadway in which major roadwork is expected within the next several months.

Glenmont Roundabout: Work on the \$4.9 million traffic circle is expected to begin in late May or early June.

NYS Route 9W/CSX Line: According to the state Department of Transportation, construction is expected on the bridge spanning across the CSX railroad in the fall of 2022. The project is expected to cost \$9.2 million and will be funded by both state and federal monies. — Michael Hallisey

of \$556,000. In terms of any discussion over money relating to the project, Jim Foster, the board's lone Republican, voted no.

The bond resolution, under finance law, is subject to permissive referendum. Foster pushed to have the referendum go before voters. His motion, however, was not supported by a second board member, preventing the board from voting either way. The bond referendum won't go in front of voters unless the town board receives enough petitioned signatures in less than 30 days.

Bethlehem won't waiver

Town elects not to overturn planning board's denial to grant waiver to developer protesting moratorium

SELKIRK — An “Old Bethlehem” family was left disappointed once it learned the town wouldn't grant them a waiver to the moratorium that prevents them from moving forward with a proposed housing development.

In February, the planning board voted unanimously against recommending a waiver for Michaels Group Homes' 87-lot Kimmey Pointe subdivision off Selkirk's Elm Avenue. The 57-acre development has been in the town's pipeline since 2017. Any prospect of the project breaking ground

this year was thwarted last December when the town passed a 12-month moratorium on accepting large-scale development proposals.

Michaels Group Homes is no stranger to town. The development firm is responsible for several of the residential developments that have come to fruition over the past several decades. Its portfolio of work includes Colonial Acres, Chadwick Square, Brookhill, Walden Fields, Newell Place and Bender Farms.

Carol Northrup and her brother had divided her family's farmland, with 57 acres set for the Kimmey Pointe subdivision, and another seven acres she would retain to preserve the farm's history. In addition to her family approaching its 100-year anniversary on the land, the homestead has a Dutch barn she said dates back as far as the late 1700s.

Attorney Andy Brick,

representing Michaels, argued that it was “unfair” to include the restraints of the moratorium because the developers were in the midst of two surveys that the town had requested. One survey was to report the effects of water running off of town-owned land. A second survey was a study to assess traffic use for a connector road the town required of the applicant. Both surveys, Brick said, served the town and not the

applicant's benefit.

“Both of those studies delayed the project's ability to get a negative declaration,” he said, “and therefore [to be] on the other side of the application of the moratorium.”

The planning board voted twice on Michaels' waiver request, the last of which was in March. In neither case did the board feel there was any “unnecessary hardship” for it to grant a waiver and allow developers to proceed through the process. It did, however, suggest that the developer proceed with attempting a four-home development — not restricted by the present moratorium.

Michaels showed the planning board that there would be no return of investment, itemizing the cost and expected return on each of the four homes. The group also added the cost of

Throw a graduation party within limits

Gov states guidelines for grad ceremonies

ALBANY — Gov. Andrew Cuomo updated guidance for graduation and commencement ceremonies organized by schools, colleges and universities last week.

Effective Saturday, May 1, indoor and outdoor graduation and commencement ceremonies will be allowed with limited attendee capacity, depending on the event size and the location, such as stadiums, arenas, arts and entertainment venues.

“We’re once again approaching the end of the academic year which means we need strict rules in place to ensure commencement ceremonies are done safely in the context of the ongoing pandemic,” said Cuomo. “With more people getting vaccinated every day, we are so close to

the light at the end of the tunnel, but we all need to continue being vigilant and I am urging everyone to celebrate smart.”

For events that exceed the social gathering limits of 100 people indoors or 200 people outdoors, event organizers and venues must notify the local health department and require attendees to show proof of a recent negative test result or proof of completed immunization prior to entry. These requirements are consistent with the state’s guidance for other congregate commercial and social activities, including catered receptions, performing arts, and sports competitions.

Outdoor Events

- Large-scale ceremonies of over 500 people at outdoor venues will be limited to 20 percent of capacity, applicable to venues with

a total capacity of 2,500 or more.

- Medium-scale ceremonies of 201-500 people at outdoor venues will be limited to 33 percent of capacity.

- Small-scale ceremonies of up to 200 people or 2 attendees per student at outdoor venues will be limited to 50 percent of capacity. Proof of recent negative test result or proof of completed immunization is optional.

Indoor Events

- Large-scale ceremonies of over 150 people at indoor venues will be limited to 10 percent of capacity, applicable to venues with a total capacity of 1,500 or more.

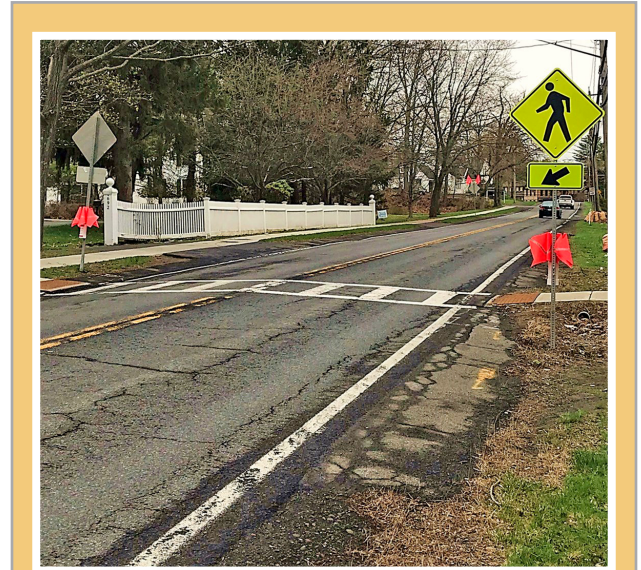
- Medium-scale ceremonies of 101-150 people at indoor venues will be limited to 33 percent of capacity.

- Small-scale

ceremonies of up to 100 people or 2 attendees per student at indoor venues will be limited to 50 percent of capacity. Proof of recent negative test result or proof of completed immunization is optional.

This announcement builds on the governor’s recent measures to further re-open the economy amid a steady decline in New York’s COVID-19 positivity and hospitalization rates.

The governor announced that professional sports in large outdoor stadiums that hold 10,000 people or more will be allowed to reopen at 20 percent capacity and smaller, regional sports venues that hold 1,500 people indoors or 2,500 people outdoors can also reopen, with an initial capacity limited to 10 percent indoors and 20 percent outdoors, beginning April 1.

BETHLEHEM — In what has become one of the best rivalries in Section II volleyball, The Eagles, after losing the first two sets, came back to win the next three and beat Shenendehowa on Wednesday, April 14.

Something old, something new

The grand opening of Fred the Butcher reopens a longtime favorite market for locals

NEW SCOTLAND — Fred the Butcher, the meat shop known for loyal fans and excellent cuts of beef in Halfmoon, opened its second location in early March – and the owners and customers couldn't be more pleased.

The New Scotland store, called Fred the Butcher II, is a second generation family business, and it is in the location of the former Falvo's, another family owned butcher business with long ties in the area. Falvo's first opened in 1974 and was owned by butcher Joe Robilotto from 1991 to 2020. The owners of Fred's purchased the building and business from Robilotto in 2020 and began an extensive renovation.

"It was just a good opportunity for all parties involved," said Fred the Butcher's co-owner David MacVane, Jr. Together with his father, David MacVane, Sr., and partner Andy Buonanno (son of the original 'Fred'). "We basically renovated the whole building and created what we wanted to bring to the area. We wanted to give them the Fred the Butcher experience, which is an old-world artisan butchery, and give a quality product to the people."

Something old, something new

With a grocery section, deli counter, bakery section, and produce, the New Scotland shop could be mistaken for a small-town grocery store. But where it stands out is in the meat selection. With a long case that runs the length of the back of the store, customers can see the butchers at work at the equipment and tables behind the counter, cutting steaks bringing them right out to the meat case. Fred's stocks only top-quality Angus and Prime grade beef, which MacVane explains comes from the best 3 percent of all beef produced.

Everything offered in the meat section is made in-house: from the salad, to the sausage, the bacon, the ground beef, and the ham. For true aficionados they offer a dry-aged cooler

and hard-to-find wagyu beef. Even the other meats, such as lamb and pork, are top quality and come from heritage breeds and Amish farms. All of the meat that they sell is butchered and broken down in the shop, meaning that customers can get pieces cut to the specifications they want from the people who know it best. That experience, MacVane said, is key to the business' success.

"[We offer] a high quality product, with very knowledgeable staff, and really great customer service. That's what we pride ourselves on. The customers are getting what food is supposed to be like."

Those interactions, from customers asking about how to best cook a certain cut of meat, to learning about where it comes from



on the animal, to getting to know the men and women who work there, is part of the charm – and the business plan. MacVane and his partners intentionally built the business around the old-school experience.

That approach is what made Falvo's popular for so

many years, and MacVane was glad to be able to build on that reputation. The returning customers, he said, all seem to appreciate the renovations. The building now has a modern farmhouse feel and expanded parking lot. Over \$700,000 went

into the work, MacVane explained, but what customers appreciate most is that it's still a small family business run by people who are passionate about their product. And as an added bonus, butcher Joe Robilotto works there a couple of days a week – keeping his ties with the location and the customers. A true family business, many of the MacVanes (including David's mother and father, wife, and brother) are involved in the day-to-day work of the two locations. David MacVane, Jr. will be primarily working in the new location.

"I think people around the area really appreciate the small independence," MacVane explains. "I just feel like America's kind of gotten away from the whole small family independent [business], but I think it's coming back. People really appreciate that. They know the owners are on the scene."

FROM THE EDITOR'S DESK

Complete Streets not complete

So you say you have an argument to make in this debate over the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets and Road Diet Project? Let's shine a stop light on that for a moment.

Complete Streets has been a discussion topic for urban areas looking to beautify streets that have neglected the neighborhoods they run through. Think for a moment about how cities and towns have been designed over the past century and there is one, overwhelming factor that has played into those plans — motorist traffic.

Delaware Avenue has always served this town

as a commercial road. Before its incorporation into the state's network of highways and routes it was a toll road managed by local stakeholders as the Delaware Turnpike. Just like today, travelers used it to go from Point A to Point B. Delmar grew as it served those travelers with various amenities — hotels, road service, restaurants and taverns. It drove business, and in turn, helped build the community we see today.

The four-lane stretch of Delaware Avenue you see is a result of an expansion project from sixty years ago. Pockets of Bethlehem were booming with residential development. So much so,

the high school and several of the district's elementary schools moved and expanded to accommodate the influx of people moving here. In 30 years, the town population more than doubled from 9,800 people in 1940 to 23,000 in 1970. (Though, part of that was the Baby Boom that followed the end of World War II.)

Engineers from Creighton Manning drafted a feasibility study in 2017 that supports the argument of putting Delaware Avenue on a road diet. Road diets reduce the number of lanes reserved for motorists to address several more issues surrounding the

immediate neighborhood — increase safety, build up aesthetics, or accommodate pedestrians and bicyclists. It's been a thing of late, and people can see it at work on Albany's Madison Avenue.

Proponents of the Complete Streets concept often point to what Albany did a few years ago with Madison Avenue. The four-lane roadway accommodated motorists running from Point A to Point B but neglected the College of Saint Rose, its students, the residents and all of the businesses along the 1.5-mile stretch of road. It was once a super-highway running through a vibrant community accentuated by high education, Victorian homes, a movie theatre and coffee shops. But, you wouldn't see that buzzing through in your car.

Today, it is a calm, neighborly roadway that conjoins the needs of motorists driving through, and the people stopping in to enjoy the community. As one Elsmere resident claimed in last week's town board meeting, "We don't need the Complete Streets project. We want it."

Well, hold on. Let's pump the breaks on that for a second.

Out of the three options on the table for Delaware Avenue — one of which is to leave it alone — none of them resemble Madison Avenue. Aside from the

fact that none of the options introduce streetside parking, there is a more glaring omission to the \$5.2 million project.

Creighton Manning's 103-page report documents 213 accidents along the 1.3-mile corridor over a five-year period. Seven involved bicyclists, while two included pedestrians. In terms of percentages, 3 percent of these accidents involved those on bikes and another 1 percent included those on foot.

Of those same number of accidents, 37 happened at two traffic signals; 26 at Elsmere Avenue and 11 at Delaware Plaza. These are also the only traffic signals on the stretch of road. That should be important, because they are the only two traffic signals within the corridor study. This is the difference between Madison Avenue and Delaware Avenue.

Those of us who already try to cross the two-laned section of Delaware without the support of traffic signals are fully aware motorists do not yield to pedestrians without a red light. It should happen. It's the law, even. But, it doesn't happen.

The report reads as a marketing tool for the rail trail and that's the driving force behind the proposal. Not by coincidence, Creighton Manning had also assisted Albany County

with previewing the rail trail to town residents in a public workshop less than a month before it's feasibility report went public. It's not a need. It's a want — a want to create a neighborhood around the rail trail, but the proposal is not practical. Not if you neglect to install red lights. Not if you fail to listen to surrounding business owners whose livelihood depends on incoming traffic.

The Complete Streets project is incomplete. Before \$5.2 million is spent on reinventing 1.3 miles of Delaware Avenue, there is a need for more traffic signals. Among all of the changes made on Madison Avenue, Albany officials credited well-timed traffic signals for allowing motorist traffic to flow smoothly. Without them, it won't matter how many lanes you have on Delaware Avenue. You'll still have motorists racing between Delaware Plaza and Elsmere Avenue. With additional crosswalks, that is a dangerous, dangerous thoroughfare. This glaring omission leaves us with little confidence in any proposed change.

Town Hall needs to reopen

Dear Editor:

I recently visited the Town of Bethlehem website to get information regarding services. I was surprised to learn that the offices are still closed and residents are not allowed in the Town Hall building. I knew that Town employees were working from home, but I thought that the office had reopened given that Town offices in neighboring communities are now open. City offices such as Albany, Schenectady and Troy are fully open with staff, as well as smaller town offices such as Colonie, Coeymans, Guilderland, New Scotland, Niskayuna, and Rotterdam being open for residents by appointment.

Having the Town of Bethlehem offices open is of significant psychological benefit to Town residents. Being open gives our Town a return to normal life and easier access to needed services. Having that in-person contact is part of what makes us a community. It is surprising and disheartening that there has not been progress in Bethlehem with reopening our Town offices, especially in light of reduction of COVID infection rates and wider availability of COVID vaccines.

Over the last year that partnership has become even more important, as CDTA and Albany Med have delivered essential services to the community to keep the Capital Region moving throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. The partnership between CDTA and Albany Med has been strengthened by an expanded Universal Access agreement in 2019 that includes free access for all Albany Med employees and students to ride buses and CDPHP Cycle!, now in its fifth year, with just a swipe of their ID badge.

From last September, Albany Med has produced more than 100,000 rides on CDTA buses, or around 20,000 rides per month. Pre-covid numbers were around 30,000 rides per month. CDPHP Cycle! access is proving to be just as productive with nearly 5,000 rides taken during last year's abbreviated season, which ran from June 2020 to November 2020. the connector road. Robert Leslie, the town director of economic development and planning, stated in a letter to the town board that the connector road was beyond scope of determining hardship.

The town board voted 4-0 against granting the waiver to the developer. Town Board Member Jim Foster recused himself from the vote, announcing he was friends with the landowner.

Upon hearing arguments from both the attorney and the developer, Luke Michaels, board members expressed more concern over setting a precedent by overstepping the planning board's decision.

Town Board Member Maureen Cunningham said she has listened to several groups seeking an appeal to the moratorium.

"We made the local law," she said. "It hurts to hear this. It's painful, but we made that local law and I feel we have to live with it."

Northrup said she was

Albany's Madison Avenue went through a similar transformation proposed for Bethlehem. Four lanes of traffic were reduced to two. A central turning lane was installed, as were bike lanes, from South Allen Street to Lark Street. ADA-compliant pedestrian crossings were added, along with walk singles displaying countdown times.

At the time Albany finished the project in 2018, similar projects were planned throughout the Capital District. Gunderland, Menands and Schenectady each were preparing or working towards similar traffic calming measures. Madison Avenue, however, continues to be used as the preeminent example.

The current four-lane stretch of Delaware Avenue is a result of an expansion project from sixty years ago.

Pockets of Bethlehem were booming with residential development. At the same time, the high school and several of the district's elementary schools moved and expanded to accommodate the influx of people. In 30 years, the town population more than doubled from 9,800 people in 1940 to 23,000 in 1970.

Crieghton Manning's 103-paged report documents 213 accidents along the 1.3-mile corridor over a five-year period. Seven involved bicyclists, while two included pedestrians. In terms of percentages, 3 percent of these accidents involved those on bikes and another 1 percent included those on foot. Of those same number of accidents, 37 happened at two traffic signals; 26 at Elsmere Avenue and 11 at Delaware Plaza.

The engineer's report suggests Delaware Avenue has an 80 percent higher accident rate than the similar roads across the state

— a point former deputy commissioner for the state's transportation department made in public comment.

"These are real engineering facts, not alternative facts," said Henry Peyrebrune, who retired from the state's transportation department after 33 years. Through the data collected from the feasibility report, and from the Federal Highway Administration, he said a full road diet could reduce the accident rate by 26 percent.

"It's my experience that just these facts alone — just the accident reduction — would justify moving ahead with this project. Not only should you, you must, I believe, in order to protect public safety."

Several supporters of the road diet shared stories of neighbors suffering automobile accidents, while others spoke of worrisome school day walks with their children to Elsmere Elementary School.

Resident Jeremy Snyder said he appreciates store owners's concerns, but he supports the full road diet.

"So why do we need the complete streets project?" Snyder asked rhetorically.

"Well, we don't need it. We want it."

Jim Giacone, owner of My Place & Company on Delaware Avenue, said he's thankful the town continues to entertain the third option. Last March, he helped organize a meeting between business owners and town officials. Several worried a road diet would choke business.

Other business owners complained they received no communication from the town about the road diet. The town has argued that after passing a complete streets resolution in 2016, it has hosted several public meetings, sent approximately 800 mailings to residents, and that the topic was covered by local newspapers including The Spotlight.

Soon after the meeting, the pandemic hit. Shutdowns and reduced foot traffic, according to the New York State Association of Counties, caused the 57 counties outside of New York City to lose more than \$720 million from lower sales and hotel occupancy taxes, and lost gaming revenues. Now, Giacone said, the idea of introducing

a road diet after 2020, "it's more troublesome and we're more nervous."

Store owners warned the road diet could lead to an exodus of business along the Delaware Avenue corridor, which would trickle down to less support going to community organizations.

Deborah Nolan Murray, managing director of Delaware Plaza, recalled how the 2000 Normanskill Landslide that led to Delaware Avenue being closed between the Albany City Line and the plaza affected businesses. In the six months the road was closed, businesses reported losses between 40 to 60 percent. Her family, who has owned the plaza for more than 40 years, is "very concerned" with the full road diet.

"I wonder if it affects all these businesses, are you going to be okay sharing that tax burden with everybody also in the town of Bethlehem?" she asked. "I know what we pay for property tax, and school tax. So, is that going to shift as well? When you shift the whole community of Delmar, and where we shop, and how we get there?"

Something old, something new

The grand opening of Fred the Butcher reopens a longtime favorite market for locals

NEW SCOTLAND — Fred the Butcher, the meat shop known for loyal fans and excellent cuts of beef in Halfmoon, opened its second location in early March – and the owners and customers couldn't be more pleased.

The New Scotland store, called Fred the Butcher II, is a second generation family business, and it is in the location of the former Falvo's, another family owned butcher business with long ties in the area. Falvo's first opened in 1974 and was owned by butcher Joe Robilotto from 1991 to 2020. The owners of Fred's purchased the building and business from Robilotto in 2020 and began an extensive renovation.

"It was just a good opportunity for all parties involved," said Fred the Butcher's co-owner David MacVane, Jr. Together with his father, David MacVane, Sr., and partner Andy Buonanno (son of the original 'Fred'). "We basically renovated the whole building and created what we wanted to bring to the area. We wanted to give them the Fred the Butcher experience, which is an old-world artisan butchery, and give a quality product to the people."

Something old, something new

With a grocery section, deli counter, bakery section, and produce, the New Scotland shop could be mistaken for a small-town grocery store. But where it stands out is in the meat selection. With a long case that runs the length of the back of the store, customers can see the butchers at work at the equipment and tables behind the counter, cutting steaks bringing them right out to the meat case. Fred's stocks only top-quality Angus and Prime grade beef, which MacVane explains comes from the best 3 percent of all beef produced.

Everything offered in the meat section is made in-house: from the salad, to the sausage, the bacon, the ground beef, and the ham. For true aficionados they offer a dry-aged cooler

and hard-to-find wagyu beef. Even the other meats, such as lamb and pork, are top quality and come from heritage breeds and Amish farms. All of the meat that they sell is butchered and broken down in the shop, meaning that customers can get pieces cut to the specifications they want from the people who know it best. That experience, MacVane said, is key to the business' success.

"[We offer] a high quality product, with very knowledgeable staff, and really great customer service. That's what we pride ourselves on. The customers are getting what food is supposed to be like."

Those interactions, from customers asking about how to best cook a certain cut of meat, to learning about where it comes from



on the animal, to getting to know the men and women who work there, is part of the charm – and the business plan. MacVane and his partners intentionally built the business around the old-school experience.

That approach is what made Falvo's popular for so

many years, and MacVane was glad to be able to build on that reputation. The returning customers, he said, all seem to appreciate the renovations. The building now has a modern farmhouse feel and expanded parking lot. Over \$700,000 went

into the work, MacVane explained, but what customers appreciate most is that it's still a small family business run by people who are passionate about their product. And as an added bonus, butcher Joe Robilotto works there a couple of days a week – keeping his ties with the location and the customers. A true family business, many of the MacVanes (including David's mother and father, wife, and brother) are involved in the day-to-day work of the two locations. David MacVane, Jr. will be primarily working in the new location.

"I think people around the area really appreciate the small independence," MacVane explains. "I just feel like America's kind of gotten away from the whole small family independent [business], but I think it's coming back. People really appreciate that. They know the owners are on the scene."

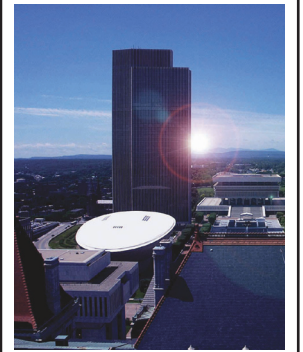

ALTAMONT — Meadowdale Farm Winery is less than 10 years old and it's already achieved more than many wineries do in centuries of business.

The quaint farm is located off of Fryer Lane, right off of Route 155. While the business is small, the wine inside is mighty and considered creme of the crop, or in wine terms, the top shelf of the products you find at your liquor store.

Meadowdale brought home eight medals in 2020; awards were earned from both the New York International Competition in Manhattan and New York Wine Classic in the Finger Lakes.

rating of 95 in the 2020 New York International Wine Competition in Manhattan," said Meadowdale's Bernard Melewski in a press release. "Those judges also named us New York Ice Cider Winery of the Year and rated our White Blossom a 90."

White Blossom also won a bronze medal at the 2021 New York Wine Classic, where it won the highest honors of any New York apple wine.

Other awards earned in 2020 included ones for White Egret traminette, a dry, spicy white hybrid grape wine; 1736 Birch Wine; historic recipe made with white birch sap; and Corot Noir; a fruity, medium-bodied red hybrid grape wine.

Meadowdale vintner John Sheehan said he continues to be blown away by the awards the winery earns. In its first year of business, the winery submitted some of its product to a competition, which won gold. When

the company missed the deadline for the 2019 competition, Sheehan said they received a note from the judges asking why their product wasn't in the running.

business. While those who try the wines and ciders are usually moved to purchase, Sheehan said the hardest part of marketing wine is getting people past the cork.


"We actually would put the bottles out and ask people to take them home," Sheehan said.

Sheehan credits the support of the Guilderland Chamber of Commerce and customers for keeping Meadowdale's recipes churning. The business has been moving products at the Guilderland Farmers Market and has made some changes to the tasting

room, meaning they are no longer limited by weather conditions and how cold the room gets.

Smith and his moderators, who include Teresa Sarles, Barb Cole Miller and Nessa Slater, host a weekly competition where the photo that gets the most likes from that week will be the group's header photo. In most cases, the photos that win are by amateurs who snap a quick photo from their smartphones; while Smith said he appreciates the work of professional photographers, he wants to make sure the group doesn't become overridden with advertisements and promotions.

"We don't allow

watermarks on the photos because it can come across as advertising, and that's not the point of our group," Smith said. "We love having as many people as possible post, but we've found when the group is full of professionals, a lot of the members don't feel their photos are good enough to put up."

This policy goes as far as what pages can be posted from; all members must post their photos from their personal pages. No posting from a business page is allowed. Again, Smith said the decision comes back to advertising. Allowing professionals to post from a professional standpoint also made the group

cluttered with technical talk about cameras, lenses and technology that most people don't have any use for.

"Every decision we make, we throw it to the members to decide," Smith said, "and we found 90 percent of our members did not want the watermarks or the advertising."

While only members can post, anyone can search Looking Good, Albany! and browse the photos. Smith said he and his three moderators screen every single person that requests to join the group to make sure they have some affiliation to Albany.

As the group continues to expand, with some photos tracking in thousands of engagements, Smith said the longevity of the group has become clearer than ever.

"This group has allowed me to see parts of Albany I had never seen," Smith concluded. "Because we have such a positive, welcoming culture about us and we are almost universally praised, it really allows everyone to come in and show their own slice of our city."

Can you hear what we're saying?

The decibel levels of common noises

Noise is everywhere. Though some noise can be very harmful, many noises are associated with something positive. For example, for many people the sound of birds chirping marks the arrival of spring, while others may instantly associate the sound of waves crashing on a shore with the relaxing spirit of summer. But not all noises should be welcomed with open arms, especially by people who are not protecting themselves from noise.

The Environmental Protection Agency notes that noise is often expressed in decibels, a unit of measurement that indicates the volume of sound. The greater the number of decibels, the louder the noise and the more harmful that noise is to a person's ears. And



no one is immune to the side effects of exposure to excessive levels of noise, which include hearing loss. For example, the Hearing Loss Association of America estimates that one in five teenagers in the United States experience some degree of hearing loss. That's unfortunate, as hearing loss can have negative short- and long-term consequences. For example, the HLAA reports that even mild hearing loss can cause a child to miss as much as 50 percent of classroom discussion. The long-term consequences also are significant, especially for those who don't seek treatment for hearing loss. According to the HLAA, people with unaided hearing loss earned an average of \$20,000 less per year than people who used hearing aids or cochlear implants.

Many people suffer hearing loss after attending

rock concerts or special events like fireworks shows. But various other noises also can have an adverse effect on a person's hearing. The experts at Johns Hopkins Medicine report that normal conversation is usually around 60 decibels. These noises often measure at much higher decibels than normal conversation, potentially putting people's hearing in jeopardy.

- Jet plane, siren, jackhammer: No one wants to walk past a jackhammer in use, and for good reason. Jackhammers measure at roughly 120 to 130 decibels, putting them on par with noises made by jet planes and sirens. Johns Hopkins notes that unprotected exposure to these noises can contribute to permanent hearing loss.

- Personal music players: Maximum volume on some personal music players, including smartphones, is 10 times as loud as recommended listening

settings. That's concerning for everyone, but especially for parents of young people who grew up listening to music primarily through personal music players. Decibel levels on personal music players at their loudest levels average around 110, putting them on par with chain saws and radio-controlled airplanes. Few people would put chain saws or radio-controlled airplanes directly next to their ears, and the same principle should apply when using personal music players. Exposure to noises around 110 decibels can lead to permanent hearing loss.

- Motorcycle: Many people have waited next to motorcycles at stoplights. When the light turns green, the sound from motorcycles as they speed off can be especially loud, averaging about 90 decibels. That can contribute to gradual hearing loss over time.

Victory Soul Orchestra reopens hall with set

ALBANY — It has been a year since Jim and I have wandered around Albany seeking coffee, music, and food. Like everyone else in the country, we've been sequestered home resigned to entertain ourselves with books, home cooking, live streams, and for me, time with dogs and chickens (yes, chickens...that's a story for another day). COVID-19 frightened me just enough to give me pause, holding those I love most dearly from me, including the musicians and artists of Albany.

So it was with some excitement that Jim and I planned a night out this weekend. Victory Soul Orchestra hosted by Lark Hall was the centerpiece of the night, the reason for the

work date. But we decided to make a whole event of it, starting with a stroll around the park, coffee at Stacks Espresso Bar, and dinner at Savoy Taproom.

A bit drizzly, the Saturday afternoon still held promise for us. We wandered around Washington Park's Moses fountain praising budding tulips, encouraging them to keep growing. Jim photographed the tiny promises of color and we guessed what would burst forth in coming weeks, stopping only to admire dogs walking owners around the lush green lawns.

My head was hammering a bit (most likely due to allergies, don't worry, not COVID), so we decided caffeine would be a solution next. Stacks fit the bill, although the server at the counter seemed to struggle a bit to understand us under our masks; we both had coffee

and shared a kitchen sink cookie. We sat outside on busy Lark Street watching people far younger than us laugh, stroll and breathe in life. People were together in small groups, but the energy was familiar and upbeat, hopeful about the future.

After a walk to reflect on the architecture on Lark and surrounding side streets, we settled into Savoy Tap room for food and drinks. We've been on an empanada hunt lately, including trying to cook them at home with mixed results as I refuse to fry things. Savoy's beef and cheese empanadas were neither greasy or heavy, but instead were the right mix of flavor and texture. Covered with a sprinkling of semolina flour, they won our fast approval. Dinner followed with Jim enjoying the Mississippi Chicken sandwich, a spicy mix of fried chicken and peppers. I ordered a filet with

asparagus; a bit too rare for me, I ate some of it but devoured the grilled greens.

We could barely wait for the doors to open at historic Lark Hall and were among the first patrons to arrive. Staff politely asked about our health, following the Department of Health's scripted questions, before taking our temperatures. Then we went upstairs to the Hall's open and colorfully lit space. With hushed voices usually reserved for church, Jim and I shared musings about our return to normal, still sated from the afternoon of activities but somehow giddy for what remained on our agenda: live music.

Victory Soul Orchestra filed on stage a bit after 8 pm, and the full stage of 11 performers filled every cranny of stage space with talent. If you haven't heard the group, think Chicago but more contemporary to today's pop in vibe. Lead singer "JB" John Brown raps

along with baritone and alto saxes who are matched with a trombone and trumpet. Round out the full wall of sound with two percussionists, a keys player, bassist and guitarist, and you have the orchestra. On their website they refer to themselves as "a hometown horn funk favorite," and it is clear their brass section is a highlight of their band. Joined by Dali Solo, their female vocalist, the band pulls off a jazz and rap show that clearly could only emerge today. It reminds me of the sound pop musicians want to create, but are limited by their studio sizes.

Set one was marked by all original songs by the group. Dali struggled to be heard amongst the strong talent, but in the moments she peaked through it was like sunshine bursting from behind heavy cloud cover. Bright, sweet and smooth, her voice has a female quality that complements

the orchestra. She requested more volume throughout set one, but even when added she seemed limited by her own breathe; listening, I wished her greater confidence in her diaphragm.

By set two, though, she seemed to have found her groove, and the rest of the orchestra returned also in a more savvy, funky groove. Patrons danced, staying in their own designated areas, arms up, heads swaying like heavy flower buds pulled by gravity. The band's return after their set break was like a whole new game, with performances highlighting their bass and percussionists too.

JB has a commanding presence that is matched in confidence by band leader/trumpet player Joel Yannuzzi. When talking with the crowd of 60, it felt more like we were in a venue for 500; the shouts of excitement and exuberance were so familiar

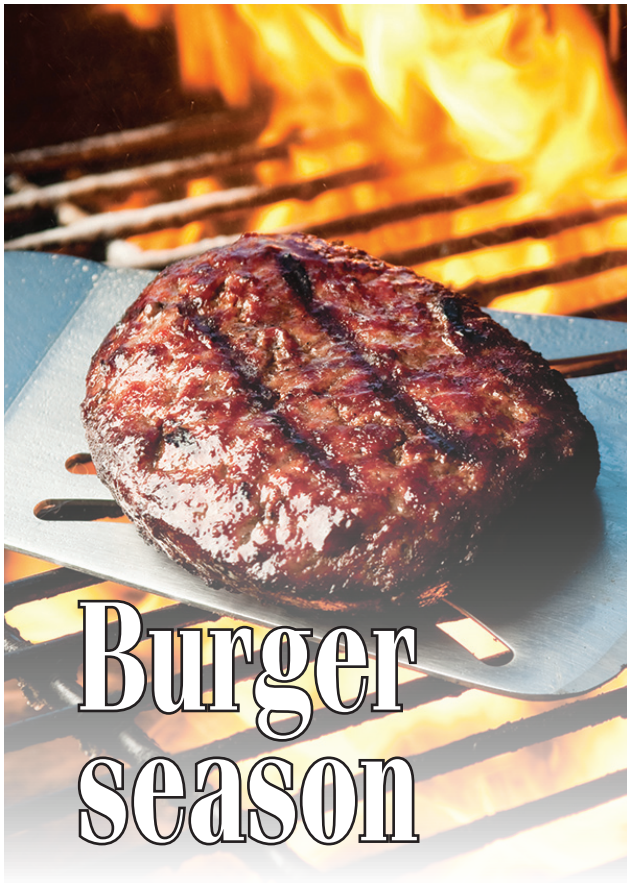

FOOD and VINO

As the mercury rises, the opportunities to cook a greater number of meals on the grill increases. For many people, there's nothing like the smoke-kissed flavor of meats, poultry and vegetables seared over an open flame.

Hamburgers are a grilling staple in many households. Burger flavors and toppings are only limited by a home cook's imagination.

For those who may need a little burger inspiration, this recipe for "Barbecue Chipotle Burgers" courtesy of the Iowa Beef Council features a beer-based homemade barbecue sauce and is best served on Texas Toast for an extra burst of flavor.

Barbecue Chipotle Burgers

INGREDIENTS: Serves 4

- 1 pound ground beef (93 percent lean or leaner)
- 1/2 cup beer
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 1 tablespoon minced chipotle peppers in adobo sauce
- 1 tablespoon Worcestershire sauce
- 4 slices frozen Texas Toast
- 2 spears pickled okra, sliced

INSTRUCTIONS

To prepare barbecue sauce, combine beer, brown sugar, ketchup, chipotle peppers, and Worcestershire sauce in saucepan; bring to a boil. Simmer 8 to 10 minutes until sauce is thickened; set aside.

Lightly shape ground beef into four 1/2-inch thick patties. Place patties on grid over medium, ash-covered coals. Grill, covered, 8 to 10 minutes (over medium heat on preheated gas grill, covered, 7 to 9 minutes) until instant-read thermometer inserted horizontally into center registers 160 F, turning occasionally. (Cooking times are for fresh or thoroughly thawed ground beef. Ground beef should be cooked to an internal temperature of 160 F. Color is not a reliable indicator of ground beef doneness.)

Meanwhile, prepare Texas Toast according to package directions. Cut each piece of toast in half. Fresh Texas toast, buttered, may be used instead of frozen product.

For each sandwich, spread 1 tablespoon barbecue sauce over one toast half. Top with burger, another tablespoon sauce and okra slices. Close sandwich.

Cook's Tip: Dill pickle chips or pickled jalapeño peppers may be substituted for pickled okra.
