

# SPOTLIGHT ON FINANCE **Estate Planning To-Dos**

he biggest misconception people have about estate planning is that "they are not that old and can do it later," say almost half (49%) of advisors in a recent Key Private Bank Advisor Poll on estate planning. Yet, the majority (73%) of advisors say the ideal age to start putting an estate plan in place is before 40—earlier than many people think.

Estate planning can be a sensitive and complex topic for families to address. Poll results confirmed this fact. with 39% of advisors saying adult children stress over a parent's reaction in raising the topic, and one-quarter (24%) saying families are concerned about not knowing where to start from a tactical standpoint.

With potentially significant changes coming to estate and gift tax rules under the Biden administration, now may be a perfect time to enact—or update—your estate plan. Failing to do so could lead to a costly missed opportunity.

If you are unsure where to begin, here are some financial planning to-dos that high-net-worth individuals and their families must tackle for their estate plans. Each of these to-dos were ranked in order of priority by advisors experienced with estate planning.

## Meet with a financial advisor and an estate planning attorney to discuss your wishes

The biggest estate planning mistake is having no plan at all, say four in ten advisors (43%), pointing to an urgent need to proactively start estate planning discussions.

estate planning conversations are financial advisors third (35%) of advisors say raising the topic (29%) and life-altering events, such as a car accident or health crisis.

If you already have a plan in place, remember to regularly connect with your advisor and attorney

to keep it up to date with the changes in your life-60% of advisors say half or fewer than half of their clients have reviewed their plans in the last five years.

## **Designate a financial** and healthcare power of attorney

Estate plans contain multiple components that may overlap, including long-term care plans and powers of attorney, which define who has decision-making power in the event of a medical emergency.

## **Decide on and draft** healthcare directives

According to Key Private Bank's previous Advisor Poll on long-term care planning, six in ten advisors (58%) say fewer than 25% of their clients have a long-term care plan-which could potentially be used to address the client's healthcare directives.

With the cost of care expected to continue to increase, it is important to make your healthcare and long-term care wishes clear now. Work with your advisor to create a financial plan that incorporates your wishes and factors them into your estate plan.

#### Create a will

A will can be considered one of the foundational aspects of estate planning, but Yet, the top triggers for often, it is the only step that people take. More than onethe biggest misconception about estate planning is that a will can oversee the distribution of all assets. While a will remains a necessity, it is critical to think about estate plans holistically—as more than just a will.

of financial planning that can be overlooked in wills and estate plans is digital assets. As more of our personal and financial information goes online, high-net-worth individuals should be taking inventory of digital assets.

#### **Determine and regu**larly update beneficiary designations

As part of estate planning, an advisor can help high-net worth individuals designate beneficiaries for assets. like retirement plans. Contrary to what some may believe, an estate plan—including beneficiaries—can be changed after the plan is initially put in place. In fact, a regular review of estate plans is highly-recommended-35% of advisors say the biggest estate planning mistake is not updating documents.

To further that point, 9% of advisors say the biggest estate planning mistake is having outdated beneficiaries, underscoring the need to review estate plans and designated beneficiaries with advisors and attorneys on a regular basis.

#### **Determine whether to** create a trust

A trust is another foundational, yet optional, component of estate planning. Determining whether a trust is appropriate could be a matter of understanding and exploring your wishes for the next generation.

Four in ten (39%) advisors say half or fewer than half of estate plans capture their clients' values in transferring their wealth to the next generation. Additionally, 60% of advisors recommend clients devote more attention to informing younger generations about caregiving or legacy preferences, according to Kev Private Bank's previous Advisor Poll on generational wealth.

#### Plan asset ownership

Most advisors (77%) say the hardest part of estate planning is navigating interfamily dynamics. These issues can become even more complicated when

One modern aspect dealing with elaborate family structures, like multiple marriages and blended families. Divvying assets along family lines in these instances can often suggest that "equal" does not mean "fair."

> Still, asset ownership is core to estate planning, and advisors are well positioned to help high-net-worth individuals and their families steer the dynamics of doing so.

# Communicate with heirs

A majority of advisors say that communicating wishes openly and honestly with family members is one of the most difficult parts of estate planning, at 57%. Additionally, most advisors say only some or hardly any clients are having open conversations about estate plans with children and family members, and only some or hardly any are doing so with their advisors present (81% and 83%, respectively).

Remember, advisors play an essential role in not just estate planning, but also guiding high-net-worth families through challenging financial conversations.

Sometime between the Tuesday night and early Wednesday morning, May 11 and 12, a 400-foot swath of Normanskill clay broke loose behind the neighborhood. No houses were damaged, but the slope that used to roll 40 feet down to a small creek feeding into the Normanskill is now a cliff.

"We were going to put a platform in our backyard so we could enjoy the beautiful view back there," a homeowner, who didn't want their name used, said. "Now I am glad we didn't."

Town engineers are assessing the landscape to determine the stability of the cliffside that now remains.

National Grid crews worked past midnight on Wednesday, severing power lines running along the cliffside to temporary poles erected in front of neighborhood homes. According to the power company, none of the approximate 12 households lost power, but the position of the utility poles was a concern.

"Right now, we're okay,"

said Patrick Stella, public information officer for National Grid. The power company may have to redesign how it runs its power lines through the neighborhood, he said. "We're just going to have to

wait and see."

The cul-de-sac neighborhood has already experienced congestion from curious visitors. With crews working within the neighborhood, the town has asked the public to stay away.

The area around the Normanskill and the streams that feed into it are susceptible to landslides. One of considerable note impacted the community after more than 100,000 cubic feet of hillside crumbled into the ravine in 2000 and closed a portion of Delaware Avenue.

State engineers attributed that landslides' cause to "a massive soil failure." It forced commuters to take alternative routes as the four-lane stretch of Delaware Avenue was reduced to two lanes. It took six months to stabilize and clean up the area at a cost of more than \$25 million.


The road was closed from both directions for about an hour as New York State Police investigated the cause of the crash.

# Petition to drive Road Diet bond to vote



# Group collects nearly 1,500 signatures on petition

**DELMAR** — Residents pushing to drive the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets and Road Diet referendum to a public vote submitted petitions to Town Hall last week.

The Petition for Town Vote Coalition said it submitted a 186-page packet to Town Hall on Wednesday, May 12. The packet included nearly 1,500 signatures, enough to drive the referendum to a public vote..

Steve Peterson, a town resident helping with the coalition, said the process was "witnessed by a few of our citizen volunteers, [and] it was properly and officially delivered and received."

The town has yet to decide how to reline the highway. One option is to convert the existing fourtraffic lanes with a middle two-way left-turn lane. Another is to continue allowing two lanes for inbound traffic from Albany while reducing outbound traffic to one. There is a third option — leave the roadway as is.

Proponents laud the road diet as a means of converting the 1.3mile stretch of roadway between Elsmere Avenue and the Albany City Line as a pedestrianfriendly community street. Opponents, including business owners dependent on that traffic, are concerned motorists will be deterred from visiting their storefronts.

The town first had to pass a \$5.2 million bond resolution to fund the project. The money promised by the state and federal levels — all but \$728,000 of the proposed cost — are paid later to reimburse the town. The Town Board

approved the bond resolution for the project by a 4-1 vote at its meeting last month. However, under finance law, the resolution is subject to permissive referendum, meaning it could go before town residents for a vote, but only if the Town Board received enough petitioned signatures.

According to Section 91 of Bethlehem Town Code, residents had 30 days from April 14 to file a petition with the town clerk and force the issue to a vote.

The petition required 5 per centum of the total vote cast in town for governor in 2018. Based on records from the Albany County Board of Elections, 17,309 residents had cast a vote in the 2018 gubernatorial race. The petition required approximately 866 signatures.

# Normal temps warmer

ALBANY — A new report released last week by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration shows that the United States is getting warmer and parts of it are getting wetter.

NOAA's "new normals" set of data tracks changes in the U.S. climate over a 30-year period. The latest report is based on data from 1991 to 2020 and replaces the 1981 to 2010 report. It shows a small, but noticeable warming trend across much of the country, which is consistent with the majority of NOAA's previous reports over the last 100 years.

"The changes in NOAA's new report are only a degree or less but can still have a big impact, especially when much of the past century has seen steadily increasing temperatures, with the most pronounced changes occurring in the past several decades," said Nick Bassill, a meteorologist at the University at Albany.

Bassill is the director of UAlbany's Center of Excellence in Weather & Climate Analytics. He also works closely with the NYS Mesonet, which is headquartered on campus and includes a network of 126 standard weather observation stations across the state.

"The unfortunate thing is that this does not make a bigger splash, even though it's almost universally accepted that the new climate normals were going to come in warmer than the last report," Bassill said. "While some may dispute the exact amount the change is related to climate change vs. natural variability, it's likely that this trend is driven in large part by climate change on a global scale."

This new report will have a direct impact on New York's weather and climate projections, according to Bassill.

"It's likely that our NYS Mesonet stations will see a subtle, yet consistent, increase in expected average temperatures. Warmer temperatures, along with precipitation increases, are generally expected for the northeast U.S."

# DEC campaign urges phosphorus-free fertilizer

ALBANY - New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Commissioner Basil Seggos recently announced the launch of the annual "Look for the Zero" public awareness campaign to encourage homeowners to go phosphorus-free when using lawn fertilizer. DEC is encouraging consumers to review bag labels for phosphorus content when shopping for fertilizer. Fertilizer labels have three numbers and the number in the middle is the percentage of phosphorus in the product, such as: 22-0-15. More than 100 water bodies in New York State cannot be used or enjoyed because of phosphorus overuse.

"Despite some recent winter-like weather, spring is here and property owners are outside working to make sure their lawns look good," said Commissioner Seggos. "But there's more to it than just green grass. We want New Yorkers to look for the zero on the fertilizer bag before bringing it home. Excess phosphorus is a threat to many New York waterbodies, triggering algae blooms and sometimes rendering waters un-swimmable and un-fishable. If New Yorkers implement sustainable lawn care methods, we can help dramatically reduce phosphorus and pesticide use on lawns, which will protect water quality and public health while maintaining healthy backyards."

DEC introduced the Look for the Zero campaign in 2017, with a public service announcement (leaves DEC website) that shows the effects of fertilizer runoff on New York's waterbodies.

New York's nutrient runoff law prohibits the use of phosphorus lawn fertilizers unless a new lawn is being established or a soil test shows the lawn does not have enough phosphorus. Generally, only newly established lawns or those with poor soil need phosphorus.

# Town Board hears an emphatic 'No'

Residents fear affordable housing plan won't succeed at its proposed Selkirk location

**DELMAR** — The overwhelming response against a proposed affordable housing project leaves to question its future, let alone the amendment its developers was hoping for in order to proceed.

That amendment,

however, is all but scrapped. "Honestly, I agree with many of the comments tonight," said Town Board member Maureen Cunningham, adding that she wanted to hear from residents before acting upon her own reservations to the proposed amendment. "I'm just going to come out and say it, I'm a no-vote on this."

The Town Board will vote on the proposed amendment on Wednesday, June 9.

Town Board members spent nearly 90 minutes listening to comments from residents deliberating over a proposed amendment to the town's 12-month development moratorium. The amendment was drafted last month to address a 72-unit affordable housing plan proposed off of Route 9W in Selkirk, within the RCS school district.

Those who spoke out at the Town Board meeting on Wednesday, May 12, often prefaced their opposition to the project by acknowledging the need for affordable housing in town. However, they all pointed to several factors to which they felt the particular proposal appeared inadequate — lack of public transportation, no walkability, and its distance away from grocery stores.

CDTA has provided a "shopping bus" between Ravena and points throughout Albany County. Route 813 is a shuttle that takes customers to Colonie Center and Crossgates Mall each Tuesday. However, as of Monday, May 17, the service is not available. The development, proposed for 939 Route 9W in Selkirk, is on a stretch of road without sidewalks. Even if sidewalks were to be installed, from its location just south of the Jericho Drive In, it would be nearly 3 miles away from the nearest grocery store in Bethlehem Center.

Opposition to the development was profound, both in the meeting and from the letter Town Board members received during the week. Town Board member Dan Coffey said he remained "conflicted" after hearing from the residents. Though he understood the need for affordable housing, "100 percent" of the letters he received before the meeting opposed the idea.

One of those voices asking the Town Board to vote no on the proposed amendment was County Legislator Matthew Miller (D-Selkirk).

Miller, who in addition to representing Selkirk on the Legislature is a teacher at RCS High School, seemed almost critical of comments made by Town Planning Board Chairman Brian Gyory, who said it did not matter which school district the plan fell under. The legislator, however, said considerations "really need to be thought about much more deeply."

NRP Group's site plan and subdivision application was under the Planning Board's review when the Town passed the moratorium last December, halting the developer's plans for a full year. Without the prospect of its plan earning approval, the developer stands to lose tax credit financing that can't be extended beyond December.

NRP Group plans to build 72 affordable housing units at 939 Route 9W, south of Jericho Drive-In and across the street from Elmwood Cemetery in Selkirk. The project is to provide housing for households earning incomes in the range of \$20,000 to \$56,000. Rents will range from \$500 to \$1,400 per month for apartments that vary between one and three bedrooms.

The need for affordable housing was identified in a report the town commissioned in 2019. In the report, the Capital District Regional Planning Commission stated how the average county resident would find it difficult to purchase or rent property in Bethlehem.

The town was identified as a housing opportunity area by New York State Office of Homes and Community Renewal due to its high-performing school districts and as an area experiencing economic growth, which attracted the project to locate in the town.

According to Realtor. com, the median list price of homes in Bethlehem was approximately \$336,000 in April, and the price is going up. The real estate website states year-over-year trends have asking prices going up 11.4 percent.

The price for an average home in Bethlehem is high compared to neighboring communities. Asking prices for the average home in Guilderland, Colonie, and Coeymans are \$294,000, \$260,000 and \$150,000. For all of Albany County, a single-family home is on the market for \$249,000.

But, RCS may not be considered among the "high performing" schools described by the state. In a recent U.S. News and World Report ranking, RCS High School was ranked considerably lower than the other two high schools that serve the town.

In the magazine's scoring system which includes college preparedness, math and reading performance, and graduation rates — RCS scored 27.34 out of a possible 100. Bethlehem Central and Guilderland scored 94.95 and 80.8, respectively.

The RCS school district covers nearly half of the

Events start at 9:30 a.m. at the South Bethlehem Cemetery, Currey's final resting place. Another such visit is to follow at 10:30 a.m. at the Bethlehem Cemetery to visit the grave of Nathaniel Adams Blanchard, after whom the American Legion Post is named.

The day concludes with a ceremony commemorating the raising of a new American flag over the Bethlehem Veterans Park off Delaware Avenue in Delmar, at 11:30 a.m.

# FCC launches Emergency Broadband Benefit program

**ALBANY** — The emergence of the COVID-19 pandemic, and the shutdowns that followed, revealed a glaring need for bolstering broadband internet access community-wide.

The program launched on May 12 to allow eligible households to enroll in the Emergency Broadband Benefit Program to receive a monthly discount off the cost of broadband service from an approved provider.

The Emergency Broadband Benefit Program will provide eligible households with discounts of up to \$50 a month for broadband service, and up to \$75 a month if the household is on Tribal lands. It also will provide a one-time discount of up to \$100 on a computer or tablet for eligible households.

# Pioneer in cancer therapy to address Albany Med's Class of 2021

ALBANY — Dr. Carl June, M.D., widely regarded as a pioneer in the field of cancer cell therapy, will deliver the keynote address at Albany Medical College's virtual commencement ceremonies Thursday, May 27.

June currently serves as the Richard W. Vague Professor in Immunotherapy in the Department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at the University of Pennsylvania's Perelman School of Medicine, director of the Center for Cellular Immunotherapies at the Abramson Cancer Center and director of the Parker Institute for Cancer Immunotherapy at Penn.

June, a recipient of the 2018 Albany Medical Center Prize in Medicine and Biomedical Research, will also receive an honorary degree in absentia.

June's lab conducted the first clinical evaluation of gene-modified T cells, initially

in people with HIV/AIDS and then in patients with advanced leukemia, using chimeric antigen receptor T cell therapy. This cellular therapy, which retrains a patient's own immune cells to attack cancer, was awarded "Breakthrough Therapy" status by the FDA for acute leukemia in children and adults in 2014 and was approved as the first personalized cellular therapy for cancer in 2017. It is now in use for the treatment of pediatric and adult blood cancer patients worldwide.

June is a graduate of the Naval Academy in Annapolis and Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. He completed graduate training in immunology and malaria at the World Health Organization in Geneva, Switzerland, and post-doctoral training in transplantation biology at the Fred Hutchinson Cancer Research Center in Seattle.

Also addressing the graduates will be Vincent Verdile, M.D., The Lynne and Mark Groban, M.D., Distinguished Dean at Albany Medical College, and Maggie Gillis, vice chair of Albany Med's Board of Directors, and student representatives from the class of 2021.

Albany Medical College expects to award more than 200 degrees, including medical degrees, Master of Science degrees in Physician Assistant Studies, Nurse Anesthesiology and Bioethics, and Master of Science and doctoral degrees in Biomedical Science and Bioethics.

# American National announces First Quarter results

**GALVESTON, Texas** — American National Group, Inc. and subsidiaries announced net income for the first quarter of 2021 of \$170.2 million or \$6.33 per diluted share, compared to a net loss of \$220.4 million or \$8.20 loss per diluted share for the same period in 2020.

The increase in net income for the first quarter of 2021 was primarily attributable to an increase in the value of the company's equity security portfolio during the first quarter of 2021 which generated aftertax net gains of \$75.8 million or \$2.82 per diluted share, compared to a loss on equity securities of \$262.7 million or \$9.77 loss per diluted share for the same period in 2020. The after-tax net loss on equity securities in the first quarter of 2020 was driven by the negative impact in financial markets associated with COVID-19.

In addition, net income for the first quarter of 2021 included after-tax net realized investment earnings of \$17.1 million or \$0.64 per diluted share, compared to net realized investment losses of \$26.5 million or \$0.99 per diluted share for the same period in 2020. In the first quarter of 2020, the net realized investment losses were caused by the company's estimated credit loss of \$38.2 million or \$1.42 per diluted share primarily attributable to commercial mortgage loans.

After-tax adjusted net operating income for the first quarter of 2021 was \$77.3 million or \$2.87 per diluted share compared to \$68.8 million or \$2.56 per diluted share for the same period in 2020. The increase in adjusted net operating income reflects an improvement in our annuity and health segment earnings partially offset by higher mortality in our life segment and increased catastrophe claims in our property and casualty segment. For the first quarter of 2021, total life insurance in force increased by \$2.2 billion to \$130.4 billion, and book value per share increased \$1.73 to \$241.93.

# Owens Corning delivered \$1.9B net sales

**TOLEDO, Ohio** — Owens Corning reported consolidated net sales of \$1.9 billion in its first quarter report to shareholders recently, an increase of 20 percent compared with 2020.

First-quarter 2021 net earnings attributable to Owens Corning were \$210 million, or \$1.98 per diluted share, compared with net loss attributable to Owens Corning of \$917 million, or \$8.43 per diluted share, in first-quarter 2020. The company's first-quarter 2020 results included non-cash pre-tax impairment charges of \$987 million driven by the economic uncertainties associated with the COVID-19 pandemic.

# **Charging across U.S.**

National Grid leads effort to ensure EV drivers can access fast charging along major highways

WALTHAM, Mass. – National Grid has just joined seven major utilities in the Electric Highway Coalition, which will enable more electric vehicle charging stations near highways across the United States. With more charging stations, more drivers may adopt EVs and existing EV drivers can travel longer distances without range anxiety.

Each utility within the Coalition is taking steps to provide charging solutions in their service territories and collaborating to ensure accessibility, reliability, and a positive customer experience. This effort will support a network of fast charging stations along major highways from the Atlantic Coast, through the Midwest and South and into the Gulf and Plains regions. Other participating utilities in the Coalition include American Electric Power, Dominion Energy, Duke Energy, Entergy Corporation, Eversource, Southern Co., and the Tennessee Valley Authority.

"In the Northeast, only 2-3 percent of all new vehicle sales are electric today. We need 100 percent of vehicle sales to be electric in the states we serve by 2035 if we are going to reach our ambition of net zero," said Badar Khan, US President of National Grid. "That means millions of EVs and the buildout of thousands of chargers. It's an understatement to say we have a lot of work to do. Over the next decade, we will work with other utilities, charging stations providers, automakers, policymakers, regulators, and our customers to put more EVs and charging stations on our streets."

National Grid is providing charging ports for the stations across its territories (MA, NY, and RI), which is the necessary infrastructure needed to connect the station to the grid. National Grid has already deployed 1,400 charging ports with 16,000 on the way, one of the largest EV charging programs outside of California. Many of these ports are in environmental justice communities, so that all customers of varying incomes have access.

Approximately 40 percent of the Northeast's GHG emissions are from transportation, making it a larger source of emissions than any other sector. National Grid has committed to electrifying their entire light duty fleet by 2030 and exploring zero carbon alternatives for medium and heavy-duty vehicles. The Company is also helping put electric city and school buses on the road and are one of two companies in the US to adopt electric backhoes.

The Electric Highway Coalition will provide DC fast chargers that will allow drivers to charge and be back behind the wheel in up to 30 minutes. It is designed to coordinate EV charging station planning, so EV drivers will have the tools they need to drive electric with convenience.

# Gasprices hit \$3 Per Gallon

**BOSTON, Mass.** — The national average price of gasoline today has passed the \$3 per gallon mark, according to GasBuddy, the travel and navigation app used by more North American drivers to save money on gas. This is a milestone not seen since David Letterman still hosted Late Night, Pharell's hat was introduced to the world, and Kim and Kanye got hitched.

GasBuddy previously prognosticated that gas prices may escalate past the key barrier in its 2021 Fuel Outlook released in January of this year. While many Americans are pointing fingers, they should be pointing at the same factor GasBuddy mentioned months ago: COVID-19 related recovery is pushing things back to normal and leading to rising gasoline demand.

"While this is not a milestone anyone wants to celebrate, it's a sign that things are slowly returning to normal," said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis at GasBuddy. "In this case, rising gas prices are a sign Americans are getting back out into the world — attending baseball games, going to concerts, taking a road trip — basically staying anywhere but at home. This summer may see some blockbuster demand for fuel as well, as Americans find it very challenging to travel internationally, leading many to stay in the confines of U.S. borders, boosting some weeks to potentially record gasoline demand."

GasBuddy expects summer gas prices not to set records, but settle down to levels more similar to 2018: the national average briefly rising above \$3/gallon but eventually falling back under and remaining in the upper \$2 to low \$3 per gallon range. Should any major refinery issues develop in the midst of the summer travel season, gas prices could become impacted in a large way, especially if the economy continues to see solid recovery and demand for fuels increases.

# My hat's off to you, Frank

The author is the managing editor of Spotlight Newspapers and current editor-at-large for Family Now magazine, where he was previously its editor under its Senior Spotlight flag. He writes about the recent passing of Frank DeSorbo. DeSorbo was a contributing columnist for Senior Spotlight, and would frequent the Spotlight office to pick up a copy of the magazine, and start up conversations about baseball and life in general. He was always up to talk about his favorite team, the Brooklyn Dodgers. However, most recently, he was most excited for Opening Day at Albany's Twilight League, under which he served many years as an umpire.

eath, taxes, and baseball debates without true resolutions — these are life's absolute constants.

My Saturday morning started by engaging in one of those impossible arguments. Someone posed the question, had Ted Williams not lost five in a half seasons to serving in World War II and the Korean War, would he be considered the best that ever was? Frank DeSorbo would have loved it. Frank would have tackled the debate from

two angles; the first of which may not have solved anything other than satisfying his own passion for sharing stories of war veterans. He shared those stories on the pages of our Senior Spotlight magazine.

Frank's monthly column would often place personal stories of local veterans within proper, historical context. They were often brief anecdotes, but always poignant. Though he never served in the military, he earned the respect of many veterans — talking and listening to their stories on many Patriot Flight events to which he'd lead the charge as president of the organization. He wrote like he spoke, too. He'd often throw two or three veterans into each of his columns, running over the amount of copy space we had set aside for his column.

Despite the years that separated us, I spent more time than I could afford talking with him about his days umpiring in the Twilight League, or trying to trump one another on baseball trivia. When he moved on from Patriot Flight, we worked on changing his column to mirror our conversations. His memories of the games he played while growing up in Albany, how they built character and later helped develop his life in sports, provided a few lessons in life but more insight into

a man who I learned to respect.

As I write this, Frank died just a few days ago. Before learning of the news, I observed a few quirky occurrences in my own behavior. I picked up our Baseball Guide, in which Frank submitted a piece about locals who went on to play Major League Baseball. He was behind the plate for some of those kids, and he was excited about the research that led to the article — which is why I couldn't tell him we'd already passed the deadline. I made room for him. I always did. I went from our book, to David Halberstam's "Summer of '49," and then to my baseball cards. It was the most baseball I consumed in one morning since I could last remember. In retrospect, I think Frank had a hand in it.

Frank rooted for the wrong team, but over time, I found myself developing into a Brooklyn Dodgers fan, too. I confessed that point in our last conversation together. I emailed a few of my most recent acquisitions to my baseball card collection. A few beat up cards of Roy Campenella and Sandy Koufax. He picked up the phone and I told him I would have had a Duke Snider, too, had I not missed out on a recent auction. "I know someone

who may have a few Sniders lying around," he said. Once the pandemic settled down, he said he'd introduce me to a few more old-time baseball friends of his in Schenectady.

I didn't get a chance to tell him I finally grabbed a Snider for myself, though I'd trade it away to have Frank back.

Frank A. "Jig" DeSorbo, passed away suddenly and peacefully on Thursday, May 6, 2021 in his home. Born in Albany on October 9, 1947. He was the son of Joseph and Rose (Garufi) DeSorbo. Frank graduated from Vincentian High School and received his Master Degree in Business Administration from SUNY Albany.

He is survived by his wife of 51 years, Dawn (Jones) DeSorbo, children Michael (Sharon Fischer) and Stephanie (Michael Paonessa), grandchildren Michael DeSorbo, Michaella, Alex, Nicholas, and Ryan Paonessa; and siblings Joseph, John, Rose, and Mary Catherine DeSorbo.

He worked for the Albany City School District and later, became Assistant Superintendent for business at Catskill Central School District for many years. Although Frank was not a military veteran himself he was very supportive of all U.S. military personnel past and

present. Frank founded and was President of the D-Day Revisited Organization and was the past-President of the Capital District Patriot Flight Inc. Frank greatly enjoyed all sports, watching horse races, card games with friends and family, boating and fishing with his grandchildren, and handing out Christmas IOUs. He enjoyed over 20 years of traveling to Aruba with his Wife and Family. His sense of humor will be greatly missed.



# Avoid those late fees



Death Cafe Albany starts the conversation on the inevitable

**ALBANY** — The fear of death is everywhere in our society. Some people are so afraid of dying, they forget to live.

Even talking about death — wills, funeral arrangements, burial plots or cremation plans — is often shrugged off until the last minute, sometimes leaving grieving family members with more of a task than they bargained for.

The hesitation to talk about death is everywhere. But when we think about it, death is inevitable. It will happen to all of us, whether we like it or not. We've all experienced death in our

Death Cafe is a global movement where strangers sit down together, whether in person or virtually, eat cake, drink tea and talk about death. No filler, no dancing around the subject; they just talk about their experiences and ponder questions about the next phase of life's cycle.

The objective of Death Cafe is "to increase awareness of death with a view to helping people make the most of their (finite) lives." We only have so many years on this planet, so why waste those fearing something that will happen, but nobody is sure when?

"The biggest thing about Death Cafe is it's not a support group or bereavement group," said Kate Murray, one of the Albany hosts of the local movement, said. "This is a place for people to talk about their experiences and be able to voice things without an agenda, objective or theme."

Death Cafes are simple. Crowds of between 12 and 30 people typically attend, where hosts will have attendees break into smaller subgroups, each hosting at least one

experienced cafe member. From there, attendees are free to discuss for the majority of the session. For the last 15 minutes, the group reconvenes as a whole and members recap what the group talked about. Sometimes it's more broad topics, while others, people will recap their own experiences with death. For now, the group has been virtual due to COVID-19 restrictions, but the group's format is normally inperson meetings.

Murray has been hosting Death Cafes for three years. As a hospice volunteer for over 20 years, she's intimately familiar with all things death and the end of life processes people often embark on. She first found out about the groups through her volunteer spot and it immediately peaked her interest.

Murray's parents died when she was a teenager. Because of her close experiences with death, she's always been one to talk about it and ponder. While her siblings aren't necessarily as forthcoming about it as she is, she soon realized going to these gatherings was allowing her to broach topics that she couldn't with other people in her life.

"I had been to a couple when the host of the one I was attending announced she was moving away and needed someone to take over the cafe," Murray said. "The host knew me because we both traveled in similar circles in the hospice world.


"She basically cornered me and another member and asked us to keep it going," Murray continued. "Come to find out, the other member was a friend of Lizzy Miles, who was the first person to host a Death Cafe in the United States."

Murray and her friend met with Miles via video chat, where Miles walked them through the process of holding a Death Cafe. What makes Death Cafe so special is despite its very open-ended structure, the guidelines to host a gathering are strict. Hosts cannot charge for admission, there cannot be any themes and there cannot be any money collected. Also, only official Death Cafe events can be advertised on the Death Cafe website; Murray said she once had a speaker coming whose topics were pretty close to the group's purpose, but because having the speaker was not compliant with the rules, the post on the website was removed.


"We always hear about how positive of an experience people have when they attend," Murray said. "One of our hosts is an anthropology major and had her students attend for class. She said their finals all came back with emphasis on how much they enjoyed the experience. Some even hosted their own cafes, which was really cool to see."

Murray said her time involved with Death Cafe has helped her become more of who she is, especially since her parents' deaths shaped so much of her life.

"These conversations remind me that we only have so many moments in our lives," Murray concluded, "and I try to live each moment as hard as I can because today could be it."

Chiapinnelli sent some demos from the next album to Barnes, hoping for a reply but not prepared for anything to come of it. What came next was beyond Bad Mothers' wildest dreams.

Jennings, Barnes and the team loved Bad Mothers. Soon, the ink was final.

"I'm excited to see what we can do with different resources," Chiapinnelli said. "Black Country Rock has way more in the tool box than we do, so it's a rewarding feeling to hear that people who are so established in the industry are willing to work with us."

The use of social media in the music industry to key up fans, particularly with hashtags and show photography, is often what can ultimately turn a show from one night to something that lasts beyond the date on the ticket.

# Don't let the sun strip your color away

# Tips to master a video job interview

he adage "there's a first time for everything" has certainly rang true throughout the COVID-19 pandemic. Life as the world knew it changed during the pandemic, and as a result many people found themselves in unfamiliar positions and settings.





- 11/2 cups cubed cooked chicken
- 1 cup milk
- 1 cup water
- 1 cup frozen peas
- 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 2 tablespoons snipped fresh basil leaves or 1 teaspoon dried basil leaves

## Crumb topping

- 1 ounce grated fresh Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons butter or margarine, melted
- *1 cup fresh bread crumbs*

# **INSTRUCTIONS**

Preheat oven to 400 F. For pasta mixture, chop onion. In a 4-quart casserole, heat oil over medium-high heat; add onion and garlic pressed with a garlic press. Cook and stir 2 to 3 minutes or until onion is tender. Stir in pasta sauce, tortellini, chicken, milk, water, peas, and black pepper. Heat until mixture just comes to a boil; remove from heat. Stir basil into pasta mixture.

Meanwhile, for crumb topping, grate Parmesan cheese. Place butter in a small microwave-safe dish, microwave on high 30-45 seconds or until melted. Stir in bread crumbs and cheese; mix well.

Spoon pasta mixture into a baking dish; sprinkle with crumb topping. Bake 15-20 minutes or until edges are bubbly and topping is golden brown.

Tip: Alfredo sauce in a jar can be found in the pasta sauce section of the supermarket. Do not substitute refrigerated Alfredo sauce; it may separate and curdle during baking.

Production on a new batch of podcast episodes is currently underway.




