Police: Smash and Grab on the rise

DELMAR — The Bethlehem Police Department reported a recent uptick in Felony Lane Gang activity throughout the Capital District.

The police agency reported last week a three-day string in "significant" activity involving vehicles with smashed windows at sporting events, shopping malls and trail heads.

Police said culprits are targeting vehicles to access unattended purses and wallets where they can obtain personal information, financial material, documents, credit cards and banking information. The items are "almost immediately" used at a local bank to cause "potential financial loss" using disguises, police said through a statement.

According to the Federal Bureau of Investigation, the Felony Lane Gang originated in Florida a decade ago, often stealing purses and using identification to commit further crimes, cashing bogus checks or going on shopping sprees with stolen credit cards. The name derives from how the

Police have asked residents to be cautious and only bring what is needed. Law enforcement has asked people to avoid leaving these sensitive items unattended in vehicles.

Six defendants facing federal charges

ALBANY — The U.S. Attorney's office recently announced the following defendants indicted or arrested within the last month for illegally possessing firearms and ammunition in the Capital

Distrct.

Thomas Hendricks, 39, of Schenectady, New York, was arrested on a federal complaint charging him with unlawfully possessing a firearm as a felon. The case is being investigated by the Schenectady Police Department and the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives, and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Emmet O'Hanlon.

Duquan Mcleod, 31, of Rockingham, North Carolina, was indicted for unlawfully possessing a firearm as a felon. The case is being investigated by the Schenectady Police Department and ATF, and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Emmet O'Hanlon.

Justin Micheli, 33, of Schodack, New York, was indicted for possessing a firearm in furtherance of a drug trafficking crime, possessing a firearm as a felon, and possessing and intending to distribute 500 grams or more of cocaine. The case is being investigated by the Drug Enforcement Administration, and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorneys Ashlyn Miranda and Alexander Wentworth-Ping.

Leonard Samuels, 38 of Schenectady, was indicted for unlawfully possessing a firearm as a felon. The case is being investigated by the FBI and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Emmet O'Hanlon.

Frankie Rios, 40, of Troy, New York, was indicted for unlawfully possessing a firearm as a felon, and possessing and intending to distribute cocaine and 28 grams or more of cocaine base. The case is being investigated by the ATF and Troy Police Department, and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Rachel Williams.

Mikal Smith, 27, of Albany, was indicted for unlawfully possessing 20 rounds of ammunition as a felon, and possessing and intending to distribute cocaine. The case is being investigated by the DEA and Albany Police Department, and prosecuted by Assistant United States Attorney Rachel Williams.

These are separate cases brought as part of a larger effort to direct greater resources to prosecuting gun crimes in cities across the Northern District of New York. The charges are merely accusations. The defendants are presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty.

Costco is all but a go

Appellate court rules in favor of Guilderland in suit

GUILDERLAND —

Opponents to the proposed Costco neighboring Crossgates Mall are running out of options.

The state Appellate Division's Third Department ruled unanimously in favor of the Guilderland Planning Board on Thursday, July 8, overturning a November 2020 court decision that criticized the board's assessment of the plan.

According to the court's summary statement, the fivejudge panel said the board's 'hard look" of the proposed plan was evident as it reviewed environmental impact required under state Environmental Quality Review Act.

Pyramid Management Group had set plans in motion for a 160,000-square-foot Costco retail store and an accompanying 222unit apartment complex spread over five buildings along Rapp Road. The plans had garnered support from both The Capital Region and Guilderland chamber of commerce who welcomed additional business to the area.

Those plans, however, were thwarted after a group of residents successfully sued in state Supreme Court. Last November, Judge Peter Lynch ruled in favor four residents and fuel distributor Red-Kap Sales Inc.

Opponents to Pyramid's proposal said the mixed-use property would bring increased traffic, threatening the nearby Albany Pine Bush Preserve and Rapp Road Historic District.

The origins of the Rapp Road Historic District traces back to the early 1930s, during the Great Migration to escape racial segregation backed by Jim Crow laws of the South.

The state Supreme Court had criticized Pyramid for first hiding plans to build a Costco, and found problems with the town's Planning Board's assessment of the project under the state Environmental Quality Review Act. Last week's ruling overturned that decision.

"Examining the project as a whole, a comparison between what was proposed at the start of the two-year SEQRA process and the planning board's mandates in the August 2020 findings statement demonstrates that the planning board's review was proper and thorough and that the mitigation measures that [the developer] was required to implement were appropriate," the appellate court stated in its summary.

The appellate court noted several measures in which the planning board required changes to the proposed site plan, including the addition of a roundabout at the Interstate 87 entrance, dead-ending Rapp Road to divert traffic from cutting through the historic district and conveying five lots to the historic association for open space and a cultural center.

The court's ruling now clears the way for Pyramid to go ahead with the proposal, barring an appeal to the state's highest court, the state Court of Appeals.

In March, Pyramid broke ground on a similar project in Kingston, Massachusetts. The 282-unit residential development falls adjacent to the Kingston

Collection, a mixed-use complex it owns and manages. When completed, the new residential complex is anticipated to bring market-rate rental housing units to the area, while bringing a flood of foot traffic to its shopping mall.

Pyramid said it plans to replicate the strategy throughout its property portfolio as the popularity of "live/work/play" destinations continues to increase among the U.S. population, and especially within the Millennial and Empty Nester demographics. It follows a similar diversification strategy that brought the addition of hospitality to its Destiny USA flagship property in Syracuse, New York, and Crossgates Mall in Albany.

"The development of a residential complex at our Kingston Collection is really just the beginning of a much broader, portfolio-wide diversification strategy to bring popular, exciting new uses, such as residential, into the mix with our existing assets. We are pleased to be moving forward with other residential projects across our portfolio," said Stephen J. Congel, CEO of Pyramid Management Group. "Staying ahead of the curve is the key to our success and resilience as a company."

Data from the International Council of Shopping Centers confirms that retail destinations located near densely-populated residential buildings tend to benefit from higher levels of foot traffic and sales per square foot. Industry analysts also expect that the addition of new residential developments to existing retail destinations such as open-air, enclosed and strip malls will increase over the next few years.

Board to talk speed on Delaware Ave

VanLuven: Reducing speed limit is already in Delaware Avenue Complete Streets plan

DELMAR — The Bethlehem Town Board won't be reintroducing the Delaware Avenue Complete Streets Referendum when it meets again on Wednesday, July 14. It will, however, discuss the roadway's speed limit.

Much has been discussed over safety concerns regarding the four-lane roadway that runs just more than a mile into Elsmere from the Albany City Line. That same stretch of road has been the subject between two parties arguing over a Complete Streets project that would reduce the lanes from four to two or three traffic lanes, depending upon what design is decided.

The merits of the road diet have been debated through several meetings. The question on whether to reduce Delaware Avenue's speed limit from 45 mph has not asked as often, which prompted Town Board Member Jim Foster to ask that it be added to the

"Any decent person wants safer roads for our pedestrians, cyclists and motorists, alike," said Foster on June 23. "That should be just a given we can all agree to."

Foster proposed reducing the speed limit on Delaware Avenue from the city line to Elsmere Avenue limit last month before resorting to a road diet. He made the suggestion at the board's last meeting on June 23 following a similar plea two weeks before. Van Luven rebuffed the comment at the June 9 meeting. The supervisor said reducing speed is already included in the road diet plan, but he added that speed limits alone won't change driver behavior.

"Personally, my goal is not just lowering the speed limit, it's lowering the speeds," VanLuven said, arguing that changing speed limits don't necessarily change driver behavior. "Changing the signs, that's nifty. ... That's why I personally believe we have to have a more comprehensive approach to safety rather than an overly simplistic approach; which, time and time again, has been demonstrated across the state — and the DOT backs us up doesn't work.'

The plan described in the Crieghton Manning report suggests reducing the speed limit, along with additional crosswalks, relocated bus stops, a gateway feature, raised pedestrian refuge islands and potential rectangular rapid flashing beacons.

Robert Leslie, the town's director of economic development and planning, is expected to attend and assist with the presentation.

St. Peters reported zero COVID-19 inpatients

ALBANY — On June 30, St. Peter's Health Partners reported zero COVID-19 inpatients in its acute care facilities – a first since the pandemic began more than a year ago.

Dr. Steven Hanks, chief clinical officer for St. Peter's Health Partners, has led the health care system's COVID-19 response since the first local cases of COVID-19 were identified in March 2020. He expressed gratitude for the tireless efforts of SPHP's frontline workers during the pandemic and praised vaccination efforts both across the SPHP system of care and throughout the Capital District.

"Despite innumerable challenges, our colleagues never wavered in their dedication to their patients, and to one another," said Hanks. "They persevered and were among the first to roll up their sleeves and get vaccinated to further protect themselves and their community."

While he acknowledged great strides have been made in combating COVID-19, Hanks said the battle against COVID is far from over. He stressed the importance of remaining vigilant, especially with the fast-spreading Delta variant now detected in at least 85 countries around the world, including the United States.

"While we celebrate having no active COVID cases currently in our hospitals, we know that will likely change in the days ahead. I cannot stress enough: If you have not yet gotten vaccinated against COVID-19, now is the time to do so," said Hanks. "We know these vaccines are safe and reduce the chance that you could become seriously ill or end up in one of our hospitals. Having that protection will be critical in the months to come."

On Monday, the New York state Department of Health announced 172 total Delta variant cases in the state to date, including one case in Ulster County. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention labeled the Delta variant a 'variant of concern' due to its high rate of transmissibility.

Albany Med names first Black female chair of surgery

ALBANY — Albany Med has announced the appointment of Dr. KMarie King as chair of the Department of Surgery and Chief of Surgery effective Wednesday, Sept. 1.

King is the first Black female chair of surgery at an academic health science center in the United States.

A fellowship-trained hepatobiliary and pancreas surgeon, King is currently a professor of surgery at Morehouse School of Medicine and chief of surgery and medical director for surgical quality at Grady Memorial Hospital, a 960-bed hospital and Level 1 trauma center in Atlanta. She is recognized for her

commitment to quality and is the surgeon champion for GMH's National Surgical Quality Improvement Program.

"Throughout her distinguished career, Dr. King has positioned herself as a proven leader in all areas of academic medicine, including patient care, medical education, and clinical research," said Dr. Vincent P. Verdile, The Lynne and Mark Groban, M.D., '67 Distinguished Dean of Albany Medical College and Senior Executive Vice President for System Care Delivery at Albany Med. "Her breadth of experience, strong clinical skills, and business acumen, along with her commitment to quality, will serve her well as she leads and advances Albany Med's surgical services."

King completed her fellowship training at Mayo Clinic in Rochester, Minn., where she also earned a master's degree in biomedical science. She completed her residency training in general surgery and a research fellowship in surgery at the University of Pittsburgh and earned her medical degree at Washington University in St. Louis. King also holds a Master of Business Management from Brandeis University. She is a United States Army veteran, having served in Operation Desert Storm.

A prolific researcher, King has received numerous awards for her research in the areas of liver and pancreatic cancers and has authored more than 100 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters. Her professional memberships include the American College of Surgeons, the

Board of Trustees of the Society for Surgery of the Alimentary Tract, and she serves as program chair of both the Society of American Gastrointestinal and Endoscopic Surgeons and the Society of Black Academic Surgeons. She is also an oral examiner for the American Board of Surgery.

King replaces Dr. Steven Stain who served as chair of the department for 15 years. Dr. Lewis W. Britton has served as interim chair since Stain's departure in late 2020

Gun makers now liable for violence

Gov. Cuomo puts manufactuers on notice with new law

NEW YORK CITY — New York State will now hold gun manufacturers liable as a "public nuisance."

Gov. Andrew Cuomo signed a series of bills into law on Tuesday, July 6, targeting firearm sales within the Empire State. The first states gun manufacturers cannot endanger the safety and health of the public through the sale, manufacturing, importing or marketing of the products they sell. The second prohibits the sale, purchase or transfer of firearms to anyone known to have an outstanding warrant for a felony or serious offense.

"Of all the challenges we face every day in New York, few are as difficult to bear as the scourge of gun violence plaguing our communities," Governor

Cuomo said. "The only industry in the United States of America immune from lawsuits are the gun manufacturers, but we will not stand for that any longer."

The state Attorney General and any city corporation counsel can take action on behalf of any locality, as can members of the public, corporations and associations. Since 2005, a federal law called the Protection of Lawful Commerce in Arms Act has shielded bad actor gun manufacturers and dealers from most lawsuits.

The new laws now open opportunities for lawsuits where reasonable controls and procedures are not in place, ensuring that responsible manufacturers and dealers will not be held accountable for the actions of criminal actors. Cuomo cited the move as necessary in order to close an "destructive Trump loophole."

"I am not only signing a new law that does away with this immunity, giving New York the ability to hold them accountable, but also closing the destructive Trump loophole which has allowed people with active warrants to purchase guns for far too long," said the governor. "Now, if you have an active warrant, you cannot buy a gun in the State of New York, period."

SafeWise, a Utah-based security research firm, cited a recent survey in which it states New Yorkers are second only to Illinois over fears of gun violence.

According to SafeWise's State of Safety in America in 2021 survey, 80 percent of New York residents are "highly concerned" about gun violence daily, much higher than the US average of 53 percent. Of those New Yorkers, 73 percent worried a gun violence incident would happen to themthat number is higher than in any other state.

The firm asked over 5,000 Americans nationwide.

In early 2017, the U.S. Department of Justice reinterpreted a gun purchase prohibitor of the National Instant Background Check System to include only those individuals who have fled from one state to another for the purpose of evading prosecution for a crime while subject to an active or imminent arrest warrant versus those subject to any arrest warrant.

"For far too long, most guns recovered from violent crimes and shootings in New York are trafficked in from out-of-state, yet the gun industry in the United States enjoys special protection from civil liability under a 2005 federal law known as PLCAA," said Assemblymember Patricia Fahy (D, Albany). "It will be an effective tool to leverage in the fight against gun violence this year in New York State and shift the national conversation."

The new legislation places added risk on gun manufacturers like Utica-based Remington Arms Company, founded in 1816. The rifles it produces can now be considered a public nuisance even if it did not purposely cause harm to the public. The rifle

company was silent following the governor's announcement last week. Other opponents, however, spoke out before he signed.

Assemblyman Chris Tague (R,C,I-Schoharie) expressed anger and disappointment last month.

"These bills are nothing less than a direct violation of New Yorkers' Second Amendment rights, and a blatant attempt at regulating gun stores in this state out of existence," said Tague. "Make no mistake, if the radical politicians pushing these bills had the capability to, they would scribble over the Second Amendment of our constitution on the very parchment it was written on hundreds of years ago. Given the liability this legislation places on gun dealers in our state, they may as well have done just that, as anyone selling firearms here can now easily be sued out of business.

"Today is a dark day for liberty here in New York."



Trinity Health mandates vaccine

11,000 Capital District employees of St. Peter's Health Partners impacted

ALBANY — One of the Capital District's largest employers is requiring all its workers to get vaccinated for COVID-19.

Locally, Trinity Health, one of the nation's largest Catholic health care systems, owns St. Peter's Health Care Partners, which employs more than 11,000 people at St. Peter's and Samaritan hospitals, Sunnyview Rehabilitation Hospital, the Eddy and other facilities.

Trinity Health, based in Michigan, is mandating "all colleagues, clinical staff, contractors, and those conducting business in its health care facilities be vaccinated against

COVID-19" by Sept. 21. That includes more than 117,00 employees in 22

"Safety is one of our Core Values. We know these vaccines are safe and reduce the chance that members of our community could become seriously ill or end up in one of our hospitals," said Dr. James Reed, president and CEO of SPHP. "We have an obligation to those we serve to provide the very best care. This decision represents the next step in our continuing efforts to do all we can to provide healing, compassionate care, while recognizing our vital role in ending this pandemic."

Other large health care providers in the Capital District, Albany Medical

Center Hospital and Ellis Hospital, do not require employees to get vaccinated but are working towards vaccination policies towards that end.

About 75 percent of the employees at SPHP are already vaccinated, according to a statement by the organization. The federal Center for Disease Control has not determined if a COVID-19 vaccine booster will be required annually. If so, employees of Trinity Health will need to submit proof of the booster as needed.

Employees who do not meet criteria for exemption, and fail to show proof of vaccination, will face termination, according to a statement by Trinity.

It is the first large employer in the area to mandate a vaccine and it has sparked the debate on whether it is legal and/or

ethical to do so. Ethical questions aside, since they are subjective, last month, a federal district court in Texas dismissed a case challenging a hospital's requirement that all employees get vaccinated.

The ruling states the employees "can freely choose to accept or refuse a COVID-19 vaccine; however, if [they] refuse, [they] will simply need to work somewhere else ... Every employment includes limits on the worker's behavior in exchange for his remuneration. This is all part of the bargain," according to the National Law Review.

Privacy protections provided by the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act, or HIPPA, is not applicable since nobody is sharing personal information except the applicant, and the law does not prevent

the employer from asking the question.

"HIPPA does not really apply. Potentially, if you don't want to answer that question, that is fine, but they don't have to employ you either," said Leslie Silva, a partner at the Tully Rinckey Law Firm based in Colonie. "It's a pretty challenging time for employers now. You see them taking their time and trying to make good choices to maintain their business and protect their employees and customers."

Unlike vaccination mandates for K-12 students in this state, Trinity is allowing a religious exemption. The religious exemption for school children in this state, -which is broad and relatively easily obtained so long as the belief is "sincere" - was reversed by the state Legislature in 2019 and upheld by the Court of Appeals, the

state's highest court, in April.

School children are not mandated to get vaccinated, but they have to get vaccinated for iphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, hepatitis, measles, mumps, rubella, polio and chickenpox if they want to attend public or private schools. Middle and high schools are also required to get Tdap vaccine and meningococcal conjugate vaccine while those in day care and pre-K must get haemophilus influenza and pneumococcal conjugate vaccine.

If they choose to not get vaccinated, they can be home schooled. Right now, students are not required to get a COVID-19 vaccination, but the CDC recently said students and teachers who are vaccinated do not have to wear a mask.

BCHS grad returns to head tech

DELMAR — The Bethlehem Central Board of Education appointed Erin Sheevers as the district's new Chief Technology Officer as part of the board's overall organization meeting on Tuesday, July 6.

Sheevers is an educator and experienced leader in K-12 technology having served as technology director at two area school districts for the last 10 years, including her current position as technology director for the Troy City School District.

Superintendent Jody Monroe said she is excited to welcome Sheevers to her administrative leadership team.

"Erin's background is the ideal combination of experienced educator and seasoned technology leader. She has proven she can navigate a large school district through one of the most technologically demanding times in history," said Monroe. "That experience and know-how will be incredibly valuable as we look to make post-COVID teaching and learning at BC the best that it can be."

Sheevers will be a familiar face to many in the district. In 2011-12, she worked as a technology integration specialist in Bethlehem and she is also a 2003 graduate of the high school.

"I know the community," said Sheevers.
"I left, came back, bought a house here and am raising my children here. I love Bethlehem and am ready to make a difference in the community that is my home."

Sheevers is set to begin her new role at BC on Monday, Aug. 9.

In her role, Sheevers will oversee a professional staff of nine and a staff of more than a dozen student interns employed throughout the school year as part of the district's student help desk. The department provides technology hardware, software and infrastructure, data systems, and instructional technology support to 4,300 students and more than 800 faculty and staff districtwide. She is replacing Raymond Nardelli who announced his resignation in June.

Sheevers began her professional career as a high school social studies teacher in Baltimore, Maryland. Her transition from classroom teaching to instructional technology and leadership, she said, was an outgrowth of her interest in professional development while still a teacher. While

in Baltimore, she helped launch a then first-of-its-kind Virtual Learning Lab in partnership with Johns Hopkins University and Lockheed Martin. She wrote curriculum and supported instructional colleagues for the learning lab that in 2009 was the first public-private partnership to introduce the use of games and simulations to improve instruction for high school students.

After returning to the Capital District, Sheevers worked for a year at Bethlehem as a technology integration specialist and technology consultant supporting the district's Special Education and Student Services department. In that role, she coordinated iPad integration for special education students providing teachers and students with an adaptive tool to help promote learning and level the playing field for students with disabilities.

Sheevers received her bachelor's degree from Le Moyne College in Political Science, History and Education. She holds a graduate certificate in Leadership in Technology Integration from Johns Hopkins University. She also holds a master's degree in Instructional Technology and Curriculum Development as well as School Building Leader and School District Leader certificates from the University at Albany.

In looking ahead, Sheevers said she will be focused on applying the lessons learned during COVID to improve instructional technology in the near and distant future.

"Technology has been integral to COVID learning but we need to know where we stand and what our technology needs are going to be moving forward," said Sheevers. "There are definitely things we will want to keep, things we hope to refine and things we never want to see or do again."

She also said COVID has accelerated changes in how we prepare students for college and work life.

"For so long we have been training students to go to work," said Sheevers.
"Now, work is coming to them. The traditional work environment has changed and we need our students to be prepared for a future that suddenly looks very different. The technology we use in school and how we use it can make a huge difference for a student of the 2020s."

CAP COM's Stopera dies of cancer

Former CEO remembered by community leaders as tireless philanthropist

ALBANY — Local leaders recalled Paula Stopera as both a trailblazer and compassionate philanthropist following the news of her death. She died at 64 on Tuesday, July 6, having recently been diagnosed with pancreatic cancer.

The former President and CEO of CAP COM Federal Credit Union had retired from her post in 2019, capping a career that started in 1980. In a news release, the credit union noted how she oversaw the company's growth to 360 employees, 130,000 members and nearly \$1.8 billion in assets while 15 years at the helm.

"Paula's influence on CAP COM is beyond measure," stated CAP COM President and CEO, Chris McKenna. "As the architect of our philanthropic culture and a passionate advocate for our 'every member, every time, every upon hearing of Stopera's passing. He described her straightforward," and never Executive Dan McCoy forgetting "who she was or where she came from."

"I am sad that Paula only had two years of retirement to enjoy," he said, adding that he was surprised to hear of it. "But now in retrospect, I am glad she retired when she did. In retirement, I saw her often and she was happy and enjoyed what she did at CapCom but also was enjoying her newfound freedom.

"Her friendship and love for her community and the impact on those she came into contact with will never be forgotten."

The Capital Region Chamber shared how it had a "front row seat" as it witnessed her impact throughout the region. The chamber's chief executive officer intimated through his own statement.

"She wasn't afraid to challenge the status quo to push others and our community to achieve our potential," he said, adding it was an honor to work with her directly on joint endeavors. "I'll miss her can-do spirit, her mischievous look, and wonderful sense of humor. She instilled values that will live on through [her children]. Paula certainly has earned the rewards of heaven."

Kevin Coffey, Regional Chief Executive Officer of American Red Cross Eastern New York, recalled her urgency to act after the two first met in 2018.

"At our first meeting, she learned the challenges we were experiencing with our biomedical fleet," said Coffey, "she quickly acted and the CAP COM team pledged a \$100,000 donation to the Red Cross to support our local operations that included a new blood transportation vehicle.

"Our thoughts are with her family and the entire CAP COM team."

Albany County was quick to recognize her impact as a "trailblazer" as a woman in local business.

"She was a trailblazer and mentor to women pursuing careers in executive positions," McCoy said, adding how he was pleased to have shared her stories during an Albany County women's history month celebration following her retirement in 2019. "Paula will be missed but her inspirational leadership and legacy will





Goodbye to Sam's

The handwritten sign read: "The restaurant is closed. Thank you for a great 50 years." The same message was captured on the answering machine inside. The intimate dining room held countless stories. A picture of wrestling great Andre the Giant hung just off the bar, as did several more celebrities who had visited. But, they didn't hold a candle to all the first dates and family dinners it hosted through the years.

"I have been enjoying my favorite Italian meals for over 30 years here,"

said Tim Dietz, "and I know my grandparents, Bob and Esther Deitz, will always have their footprint [here]."

The Rappoccio family had just celebrated 50 years on the corner of Southern Boulevard and Kehoe Street. As the old neighborhood stories go, the

family started out selling slices of pizza from their garage.

"It is with heavy hearts that we announce; Sam's Restaurant has closed its doors," another announcement shared on Facebook. Carmela Daubney, 73, and her brother Paul Rappoccio, 71, have owned the restaurant since taking it over from their parents, who opened the restaurant in 1971. The two siblings initially worked for their parents. "After 50 years of serving first slices then serving dishes then drinks to our loyal, endearing customers,

we have decided to close."

The news reached beyond Albany. Ken Ringler, former Bethlehem Town Supervisor, shared his condolences over the restaurant's closure on Facebook.

"Carmella, so sorry to hear this," Ringler stated. "Your family's restaurant is an Albany institution and will be missed! As you know, since Marty and I moved from the area, we have always made Sam's a must visit when we were in town. Best wishes to you and enjoy a well-deserved rest."

The owners cited several factors behind their decision, reasons all too familiar with local eateries that have struggled to survive since the COVID

outbreak. Rising food prices and a depleted workforce forced Daubney and Rappoccio to close their doors.

We did our best to stick it to COVID and stand to our values," they wrote, "amongst other issues have forced our hands."

The online message continued to thank their customers, many of them regulars who they adopted as a "large part of our lives."

"Some of you have been eating our food since before we were a restaurant and were slinging slices to the neighborhood," they wrote. "Others had their first date at Sam's. Still more were born and raised on Sam's food, eating it as far back as they can remember. We thank all of you."

f any credit can be gifted to a social media platform for bringing neighbors closer to the fence, by default it would go to Next Door. But, forgive me if I still want to delete it off my phone.

Next Door does what Facebook fails to do, and that's narrowing the scope of one's news feed by featuring users from your neighborhood. You sign up, declare where you live, and you're communicating with your neighbors within a few minutes.

It's ironic that this is the vehicle by which many of us communicate with people just a few doors down from us. It also suspended the collection of late fees for those tardy returns.

However, that amnesty period was closed as of the start of July. The library's decision was shared to the town it serves by means of its monthly newsletter, website, emails and this newspaper. There was, short of knocking on everyone's door, ample communication.

Somehow, though, this person didn't get the message. Of course, an angry post on social media was necessary. The message within the pixilated letter asked if it was ethical of the library to backcharge fees after it said it would not levy fines for late books. This question over ethics, mind you, is asked without drawing attention to the obvious breach in social contract of one person holding property for several months despite the promise of returning it

within a handful of weeks.

The answer is yes, though it should go without saying. Though the library said it would not charge late fees during a set window of time, it didn't erase the fact that you've held on to those books for far too long. It was an amnesty period, not a waiver of your obligation. The clock started on that date captured in the back of the book. But, don't take our answer for it. It's best that you call the library.

If social media does one thing well, it provides a platform for people to voice out their grievances and welcomes other to join in on their crusade. Whether or not that crusade is worthy of a following is judged by those who read it, and not often too well.

Before 1978, household paint often contained lead, especially the paints used for trim areas such as windows, doors, and railings. As the paint ages, it can chip or crumble into dust. Remodeling projects also increase the amount of exposure as the paint is disturbed. See also other sources of lead.

Lead poisoning occurs when an individual breathes or ingests the lead. The lead then enters the blood and accumulates in the body over time.



When Ferris Bueller goes shopping

The oh-so-radical Trapper Kepper returns to stores

hey say what's good usually comes back around; ex-girlfriends being the lone exception.

While the Gen-X clan peruses through the Back to School ads this summer, they may find glimpses of an old friend. The Trapper Keeper is back.


Fashion trends run on a cyclical pattern. Oftentimes the younger generation catches on to something found in a dust-covered truck in the far corners of the attic, and they claim it for their new look. Last week, we ran an article proclaiming chokers and cropped cardigans are coming back from the 90s — proofpositive you can trust the 30-and-older crowd to introduce kids to what's truly hip.

Those with an affinity towards school supplies each summer can remember the Trapper Keeper. Aside from being an ecological nightmare, the plastic portable filing cabinet was both pragmatic and stylish.

Mead introduced the Trapper Kepper to the mass market in 1981. The all-plastic, three-ringed binder featured a flap fastened by Velcro. It added additional security for the pocket folders stored inside. The accessories that followed turned it into a giant success, and by the time the paper company introduced its Designer Series in 1988, it took over store shelves.

The hyper popularity of the product waned through the 90s— it was more hip to carry school supplies in a backpack slung over one shoulder. But, Mead's contribution to academia left an indelible on pop culture.

"Family Guy" and "Stranger Things," two shows that heavily tug at Generation X's heartstrings, have dropped mention of the binder in recent years. Mead relaunched the binder to a tepid response in 2014, after it had acquired



uber popular "Hello, Kitty" and "Star Wars" trademarks. Today, consumers are sharing TikTok videos from inside stores as if on a wild safari, capturing images of Trapper Keepers on shelves again.

One online shopper shared his testimonial on Walmart's website. It was a hybrid of sorts between a product review and an ode to his childhood.

"I thought it was cool because it reminded me of my old Trapper Keeper. When it came in I was surprised to find it is not just inspired by the old Trapper Keeper; but that it was a dang clone of the original," wrote the parent. "It's as if Mead found a warehouse full of old Trapper Keepers and shipped them out."

There are a few changes that distinguish the old from the new, but not much. Parents will notice the three-ring clasp is metal instead of the plastic that, over time, would break. So, too, is there a metal clamp to hold a

notebook where once a plastic one was attached. Otherwise, the same Trapper folders are available with various colors and patterns. The binder is priced at \$13 on Mead.com.

"The pattern is a little different from my original but still a great 80s look," wrote the online dad. "[It] brought back lots of great memories and according to my son it's still very cool. The only downside? Now I have to order one for his brother."



Van Gogh

New York City is currently offering two of these interactive exhibits. The first, which I attended, is "Immersive Van Gogh Exhibit New York" and is located at Pier 36. The second is "Van Gogh: The Immersive Experience," located in Lower Manhattan at 300 Vesey St. The Pier 36 installation is much more reliant on the artist's paintings and visual elements, whereas the Vesey St. location provides a broader context around the artist with letters between Van Gogh and his brother, sketches, and VR experiences.

As someone with pre-existing

knowledge surrounding the artist, the Pier 36 exhibit was perfect for me, although I wouldn't have opposed a letter or two. But for those who don't know as much about Van Gogh's life or his work, it may be beneficial to attend the alternative exhibition. However, if you are looking for a beautiful visual display and don't care much for the history, Pier 36 is stunningly crafted, with design elements by David Korins, the award-winning set designer behind the sets of "Hamilton," "Dear Evan Hansen" and "Beetlejuice."


The installation is broken into three separate rooms, all fitted with reflective elements that bounce the bright strokes of color across the space. I arrived when the previous show was still going, so I caught the ending before the beginning. I sat on the floor (on a sunflower cushion I was not supposed to have, thank you cushion man) and took in the room more than the paintings. I did find that although the set work was beautiful, it could be a bit distracting when trying to focus on the paintings themselves, but for a first watch that was fine by me.

Once the first show ended,

time. They were being seen how they were painted, as living and breathing representations of a notso-colorful world. When the blues and yellows swept across the wall, it was as if my eyes were following a paint brush. Scene shocked by loss of 'kind soul'

Millington's Bintz, dies at 28

CHATHAM — Hearts from both the local music and academic scenes were broken upon learning the news of Jonathan Bintz's death on Friday, July 2. The popular musician and teacher was 28.

Bintz spent his days as a music teacher for Chatham Central School District. His time outside of the classroom was perhaps most noted as the trombone player for the pop-punk-ska band, share with him. Millington.

Brian Chiappinelli expressed his shock online with an initial, "Damn," before sharing his respect for Bintz. The artist

manager and Bad Mothers drummer said Bintz inspired him — a confession he didn't get to

"Jon [was] a kind, hilarious and talented soul," Chiappinelli said. "It was always a treat watching and hearing you perform. You may not have

known it but your musicianship always kept me inspired and motivated to get better."

Bintz died unexpectedly that Friday morning. The news circulated quickly within both of his social circles. By the following morning, Chatham Central was hosting grief support for students and staff.

Bintz joined the school district staff in 2017. Within his short time there, the district pointed towards the accolades he helped orchestrate as its band director.

"He was both respected and admired by those he taught and those he worked alongside," the district shared in a statement released on July 2. "In his time here, he helped bring the performance of our ensembles and individual students alike to

new levels of achievement, which earned Chatham regional and national recognition."

In April, Chatham Central was named as a 2021 Best Communities for Music

Education by the NAMM Foundation. The foundation awards districts that demonstrate outstanding achivement by offering access to music education to all its students.

"We offer our deepest condolences to Mr. Bintz's family, friends, colleagues, and students. He will be greatly missed."

A mother of one of his students shared how his encouragement helped inspire her son's love for music.

"My son had him for the first time this year," said Mary Gearing, "and he had never played an instrument before this year. [Bintz] was very kind and caring. Without Mr. Bintz's encouragement and understanding I don't know how we would have made it through

this year."

A friend and fellow educator at the school district described Bintz as "respectful, thoughtful and intellectual."

"There was no member of the Chatham CSD community that I more enjoyed sparring verbally with than Bintz," said Jen Dilorio. "We agreed on 90 percent of everything, but the 10 percent we didn't agree on was fun - really spirited and passionate and fun. ... He made me think and reconsider and think again. And that is the great gift he gave to me again and again."

Dilorio, who had an established career in the financial world before earning her teacher's degree, joined the school district around the same time as Bintz. Despite the years that separated the two friends, she said he was able to bridge that gap.

"That, I am sure, is what made him an amazing educator, and human," she said. "It took many forms with many different people, but he made all of us, colleagues, students, and I imagine personal family and friends better for having him intertwined in our lives.

"I am sorry not only for all that knew him and loved him, but for those students and colleagues and family that will never have the chance. There is just nothing right about this."

Jonathan Edward Bintz of Albany, NY passed away on the morning of July 2, 2021 at Albany Medical Center. He was 28 years old.

Born on Nov. 24, 1992 at Albany Medical Center, Jonathan was the youngest with two older sisters. From an early age he loved to learn, explore, celebrate, bring joy and above all make music. He graduated with honors from Guilderland Central High Bass Trombone as his principal instrument of study and went on to build performance skills in virtually all orchestral instrumental families.

Jonathan earned dual undergraduate degrees at the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam in 2015. He was heavily involved in symphonic orchestras and bands, wind and cultural ensembles, chamber groups, live assistant-ship position in the department. Jonathan graduated Summa Cum Laude in 2017 with a Masters of Music degree.

INSTRUCTIONS

Fire up your smoker to 225 F with a good smoke rolling and get ready for battle. The meat will have a big fat cap on it, and you should trim that down to a thin layer. The meat contains a large amount of fat throughout, so don't worry about it drying out; it will be plenty moist. Then, you need to focus on the money muscle, trimming the meat

to look like a log, which exposes as much money muscle as possible for seasoning, smoke, and bark.

Once you have trimmed the meat, it's time to inject. After you have loaded it up, make sure to pat the meat dry with paper towels. Then, cover liberally in Meat Mitch Competition WHOMP! Rub and let it sit for about 30 minutes to sweat.

With your meat ready and your smoker rolling at 225 F, place your meat inside the smoker. Feed the fire with some unlit charcoal and chunks of pecan and cherry. Close it up and make sure you have plenty of charcoal and pecan and cherry wood. You'll be smoking for approximately 6 hours.

Every 30 minutes, open up the smoker and spray the meat with apple juice. (Put about 1/2 cup of apple juice in a spray bottle for this.) After about 6 hours, check the meat to see if you've achieved that mahogany bark.

When this bark is achieved, lay the pork on a big sheet of aluminum foil. Pour the Stubbs Pork Marinade around the base of the meat, close up the foil, and return the meat to the smoker. This step essentially steams the meat and breaks it down to achieve the tenderness you want; keep the smoker at 225 F. This stage usually lasts 3 hours, but it can always vary. At the end of the cook, you are watching for internal temperature to reach the target

goal of 197 F. You don't want it so tender that the money muscle falls apart. Remove the meat from the pit and open up the foil to let out the steam. Then, close it back up and place it in a dry cooler to rest for at least an hour. (I have let it rest for up to 4 hours, and it was great.)

Next, doctor up your barbecue sauce. Take a bottle of Meat Mitch WHOMP! Naked BBQ Sauce and pour it into a pan along with enough apple juice and honey to thin the sauce and make it slightly sweeter. Also, the honey adds to the shine. Remember, judges eat with their eyes first. Heat the pan on the back of the smoker box, making sure to stir frequently so it does not burn.

Finally, it's time to break down the meat. Carefully carve out the money muscle, keeping it as a perfectly shaped loaf, move it to a separate pan, and cover it with foil to keep it warm. It's time to remove the bone. It should slide out easily and clean — if so, job well done! Chunk the remaining meat, paying close attention to the bark, trying to capture the best pieces. Separate the meat into nice barky chunks and tubes and then pull and slightly shred the remaining pork. Lightly glaze the meat with sauce, making sure not to add too much. Cover the pan with foil and set aside.

Turn your attention to the money muscle. Brush the muscle with sauce; add just a light coating. It should glisten with the honey in the sauce. Next, carefully slice it into even pieces, but make sure to keep the loaf shape intact

To assemble, start with the arranged greens in a serving box. Then, place the money muscle slices along the back of the box and fill in the front of the box with chunks on one side and pulled pork on the other side. If you're serving it in your backyard, drop it on the picnic table and watch your neighbors fight it out.



Taking Wall Street's bull by the horns

As finance continues its rapid transformation into the digital era, Rensselaer and Stevens are leaders in guiding the field into a high-tech, big data world

TROY — Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute and Stevens Institute of Technology announced today that they have been awarded the first-ever National Science Foundation grant to create an industryuniversity cooperative research center devoted specifically to financial technology and science.

at Rensselaer. "Rensselaer's culture of highly interdisciplinary research, innovative spirit, and a rich technological research portfolio are the most attractive assets for CRAFT."

Together, Rensselaer and Stevens will bring together

Rensselaer industry and academic partners, and policy makers involved in high-impact research efforts, to conduct research that is relevant for industry and has potential for commercialization. CRAFT is expected to receive approximately \$1 million in funding in the initial year of operation, with \$300,000 provided by the NSF annually over the five-year grant

period and the remainder funded by its industry members. Stevens will serve as the administrative lead institution in compliance with NSF's newly issued rules of designating a lead institution for all industry-university cooperative research centers.

Already, 18 financial services organizations, including global leaders of the industry,

have pledged their support for CRAFT. As advanced technologies are rapidly shaping financial services and systems and impacting society at-large, commitment from industry partners and policy makers will help drive innovation in fintech, address the challenges impacting the finance industry, and help

develop a diverse, exceptionally skilled hightech workforce.

"The federal government's investment in CRAFT demonstrates the critical need for collaborative fintech research and policy initiatives to guide the industry in this high-tech transformation," said Yang, who led the grant proposal from its inception. "Stevens' location in Hoboken, N.J., and expertise in both technology and business, coupled with our strong relationships with financial firms, make us wellpositioned to be a true partner in applied research

to corporations as we look to grow the number of university and industry partners."

Among the initial research areas of focus will be cybersecurity; high-frequency automated markets; technology risk and regulation; commercialization; and applications of blockchain, quantum computing, natural language processing, artificial intelligence, and machine learning. Much of the work on the CRAFT research projects will be carried out by students at the participating universities, providing an essential training ground

for the future fintech workforce.

The Hanlon Financial Systems Center, which includes two gamechanging financial analytics labs, challenges students in Stevens' fintech-related bachelor's and master's degree programs to apply fintech solutions to realworld business problems. This resource, paired with Rensselaer's specialized master's degree program in Quantitative Finance and Risk Analytics and other key fintech assets and programs, will be key to advancing the CRAFT



Opera Saratoga's 'La Manca' brings hope

Live theatre returns with SPAC performance

SARATOGA SPRINGS —

Windmills turn into giants, inns to castles, shaving basins to golden helmets, and Aldonza to Dulcinea in the idealist world of "Man of La Mancha." And with a bit of imagination and a whole lot of talent, Cervantes and his fellow prisoners transform an audience into a sea of dreamers.

The musical was part of Opera Saratoga's Don Quixote-themed summer festival, which concluded with a show on Saturday, July 10.

"Man of La Mancha" tells the story of Miguel de Cervantes, the author of "Don Quixote." After his imprisonment for taxing the church during the Spanish Inquisition, the other prisoners raid his belongings, where they find his prized manuscript. They put him on trial, after establishing that he will be found guilty regardless, for the chance to save his writing. As his defense, Cervantes brings his novel to life

by putting on a play where he becomes "knight" Don Quixote. It begs the prisoners — and the audience — to dream the impossible dream, to see the world as something far more beautiful than realism allows.

The cast — comprised of Zachary James, Kelly Glyptis, and 16 of Opera Saratoga's 2021 Young Artists — gave stunning performances that breathed an operatic note into the musical.

Although not written as an opera, "Man of La Mancha" is a show that requires powerhouse vocals, whether it's the baritone Cervantes, tenor Sancho, or soprano Aldonza, and the cast's training in opera complimented each song beautifully.

In a previous interview, Director Lawrence Edelson said, "When you hear Zachary James sing 'The Impossible Dream' at SPAC this summer, you will understand why Opera Saratoga is producing a musical!" Having heard James' performance, he was absolutely right.

The part of Cervantes played to James' impressive range and booming voice. But as much as his vocal performance told a story, his acting was just as moving. James expressed his vision of making his narration a take on theatre-in-the-round by bringing the audience into the prison with the rest of the characters. This, combined with the open-air theatre and frame narration, made the show feel like a classical comedy.

James, having been on Broadway and in operas across the globe, was unsurprisingly great. His monologues were captivating, and his voice was powerful. It was no surprise that the rest of the cast was equally talented, but what was impressive was that every single actor or actress held their own on stage. Ensemble members who may have only had a few solo lines shined, and together, they brought the themes of the show to fruition.

Brian Yeakley, playing
Cervantes' servant/Sancho, was
a favorite of the evening. His
comedic timing was almost
as excellent as his voice, and
his performance of "I Really
Like Him" garnered laughs and
applause throughout. Both in
Cervantes' world and Quixote's,
Yeakley conveys the authenticity,
loyalty, and wit of his character
wonderfully.

It would be remiss not to mention Kelly Glyptis, who captured the conflict, pain, and struggle of Aldonza, all while belting out song after song.

She provided one of the most moving scenes of the show with her performance of "Aldonza," and again gave a stunning performance in the finale sequence.

The show marks the return to live theatre following the pandemic with the best message: live beautifully, live for what is to come, live with hope and optimism and strength.
