

Man arrested with 'BB' gun

Man arrested for stopping traffic with weapon in separate incidents

GLENMONT — Rush hour on Rt 9w had a different feel yesterday as a man wielding a BB gun stopped traffic at the corner of the busy thoroughfare and Corning Hill Road on Monday, July 26.

The man blocked the roadway with his vehicle and pointed the gun, which was a replica AR-15, at motorists at approximately 3:38 pm.

"He then travelled down Kenwood Avenue towards Delmar," Commander James Rexford said. "The second call came in 4 to 5 minutes later when he was in the area of St. Thomas' School."

He then stopped his vehicle again and brandished the weapon towards other motorists. He then fled before police arrived at the second scene.

"Without the tip on the replica, it really looks like a

firearm and it has about the same weight as the real thing," Rexford said. "It looks real."

The car was traced to the residence of Jason M. Belleville, 40, of Glenmont and Bethlehem Police, along with the Albany County Sheriff's Department Emergency Response Team, executed a search warrant at the residence. The imitation firearm and vehicle involved in the incident were seized during the search.

Belleville was charged with Menacing, Criminal

Possession of a Weapon, and Reckless Endangerment (all misdemeanors) and arraigned in Town of Bethlehem Court and released.

Road diet referendum in November



Business owner shares final plea against strictest of road diet plan

DELMAR — Bethlehem Town Board members voted 4-1 to send the \$5.2 million Delaware Avenue Complete Streets and Road Diet referendum to the November polls Tuesday, Nov. 2.

Last Wednesday's vote served as the last step in a two-step process that involved rescinding its original bond resolution from April that had initially passed as a passive referendum.

Unlike previous meetings in which political opponents argued over the board's right to rescind a passive referendum after it was successfully challenged to a public vote by residents, such arguments fell silent. Republican Jim Foster voted against the resolution without comment.

"It was never political," said Jim Giacone, addressing the board as the first speaker during the half-hour public comment section of the meeting. The co-owner of My Place & Company on Delaware Avenue has been a regular voice in Town Hall. On Wednesday, he gave what sounded like a final plea, falling short of an ultimatum.

Giacone said the business owners along Delaware Avenue want all but one of the goals of the proposed Complete Streets project. He voiced support for a 2-1-1 traffic pattern, suggesting three lanes of traffic and a turning lane

The traffic pattern has yet to be decided and won't be until after another engineering assessment is made on the 1.3-mile corridor between the Albany City Line and Elsmere Avenue. In recent meetings, however, a 1-1-1 pattern involving two traffic lanes and a bike lane has been lobbied for by residents who live off the roadway. Giacone asked if the

Town Board would be willing to meet with business owners in an executive session so that the two sides could come to an agreement.

"We could live out in harmony and get on with our lives," he said, adding an accusation that he knew board members were meeting in private.

Town Supervisor David VanLuven said that wasn't true.

"I know there's a community effort, but the Town Board hasn't been involved," he said.

Town, village grab \$10K state grant

New Scotland, Voorheesville will fund Cultural Resources Survey with money

NEW SCOTLAND — The Village of Voorheesville and Town of New Scotland will together receive a \$10,000 Preserve New York grant that will fund a comprehensive survey for all of New Scotland.

Voorheesville and New Scotland are set to launch their Cultural Resources Survey — a tool both governing bodies intend to use as a means of identifying buildings of historic significance and open spaces in need of preservation as they both plan future development.

The area encompassing the village and hamlets spans less than five miles but contains a diversity of historic buildings and rural landscapes, said Voorheesville Mayor Richard Straut and New Scotland Town Supervisor Doug LaGrange. The survey will also help identify the character-defining features of the hamlets and village, and help each to enact laws and implement policies that support smart, sustainable, sensitive development while preserving what makes each area unique.

"We are delighted that the Preservation League will be supporting our Cultural Resources Survey," Straut and LaGrange said in a shared written statement. "This award validates our approach to historic preservation as an important component to improving the quality of life, promoting appropriate development, and maintaining community character through intelligent planning. We look forward to working with the League on a project that will create a resource that will benefit our municipalities and the community at large."

The state grant is funded in part by the Preservation League of New York State and their program partners at the New York State Council on the Arts.

At its 2021 meeting, an independent grant panel selected 32 applicants in 25 counties to receive support totaling \$297,995. Each grant supports important arts and cultural initiatives, as well as economic development related to our state's arts and cultural heritage.

address the digital divide, increase access to the state's cultural history and expand student access to digital learning materials, State Education Commissioner Betty A. Rosa announced last week.

"Libraries are critically important to communities, playing a crucial part in New York's recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic," Board of Regents Chancellor Lester W. Young, Jr. said. "There

is a moral and an economic imperative to remove the inequities that stand in the way of success for whole segments of our student population, as highlighted when school buildings were shut down and many students had little or no access to remote learning. Staff at libraries statewide stepped up to help students and families during the crisis and are doing so again by helping to provide more equitable access to digital services.'

"These funds will support collaborative efforts to find real and sustainable solutions to address the digital divide in New York State," Commissioner Rosa said. "This significant investment represents meaningful progress in achieving our vision of digital equity and inclusion for our students and their families. Our libraries will continue to develop bold, creative and critical

ways to serve communities during recovery from the pandemic."

The federal Institute of Museum and Library Services awarded the ARPA funds to the New York State Library to help communities respond directly to the pandemic and related economic and community needs. The funds will be used to help establish equitable approaches to digital inclusion and services from all types of libraries and other cultural institutions.

The State Library will allocate more than \$5.5 million to the nine regional Reference and Research Library Resources Councils to implement three priority programs in their regions: advancing digital inclusion, encouraging library/ museum partnerships, and expanding student access to digital resources. Each library council is required to submit an application

to the State Library demonstrating accordance with IMLS ARPA guidelines.

The regional library councils will collaborate with public library systems, school library systems and other libraries, museums and cultural repositories to address New York's three priority programs and meet federal and state goals. Libraries and systems are strongly encouraged to partner with each other and with other community, education and cultural organizations in their region on collaborative projects.

Visit the State Library's website to see the allocation available for each regional library council. The State Library anticipates issuing detailed guidance, including a timetable and application instructions to the nine regional library councils, by early September. The regional library councils

must complete all project activities by June 30, 2022.

The State Library, State Museum and State Archives will also use \$700,000 to improve and expand access to the Office of Cultural Education's services for all New Yorkers through a range of collaborative initiatives including to build upon the 2021 Digital Equity Summit, partner with public library systems and libraries to conduct a broadband infrastructure needs assessment for small and rural public libraries in New York and collaborate with organizations across the state to create a diversity, equity and inclusion framework and toolkit for libraries, museums and cultural institutions.

In accordance with funding requirements, New York state must expend this \$6.2 million by Sept. 30, 2022.



Albany Med's Light Up the Night raises \$270K

ALBANY — Light Up the Night, the premier gala of the summer, raised \$270,365 for Albany Med's Department of Emergency Medicine

"We are honored that so many people chose to give back to our Emergency Department as we work day-in-and-day-out to care for the emergency medical needs of our wonderful community and region," said Denis Pauze, M.D., chair of the Department of Emergency Medicine at Albany Med. "Their support ensures that we can deliver world-class care close to home to those who rely on us at a moment's notice."

This year's event included a special presentation with grateful patient David Zecchini, president of DZ Restaurants in Saratoga Springs, and a tribute to Vincent P. Verdile, M.D., The Lynne and Mark Groban, M.D., '67 Distinguished Dean of Albany Medical College and Senior Executive Vice President for System Care Delivery, who will retire at the end of this year. The event concluded with fireworks by Santore's World Famous Fireworks, LLC.

More than 460 guests attended Light Up the Night at Saratoga National Golf Club on July 9. Empire BlueCross was the title sponsor.

Proceeds from Light Up the Night are used to purchase state-of-the-art equipment and support educational, training and research opportunities for Emergency Department physicians and

Ellis first in Upstate NY to Offer valves for lungs

SCHENECTADY — Ellis Medicine is the first in Upstate New York to offer a new lung valve treatment for patients with severe COPD/emphysema.

Approved by the Food and Drug Administration under their 'Breakthrough Devices" status, the Zephyr Endobronchial Valve treatment represents a major advancement because it is the first minimally invasive procedure to help emphysema sufferers breathe easier without major surgery. Done through a simple bronchoscopy, the valves improve patients' quality of life by allowing them to breathe easier,

be less short of breath, and be more active and energetic.

"We are very excited to have this new treatment option because emphysema patients are often in poor physical condition, struggling with each breath despite medication therapy. Before the Zephyr Valves the only options for relief were highly invasive treatments including lung surgeries," said Dr. Ahmed Khan of Schenectady Pulmonary & Critical Care Associates who practices at Ellis Medicine. "Being able to offer this minimally invasive procedure has the potential to improve the quality of life for many emphysema sufferers in the Capital Region and beyond."

The one-time procedure is done during a simple bronchoscopy that requires no cutting or incisions. During the procedure, on average 4 tiny valves are placed in the airways to block off the diseased parts of the lungs where air gets trapped. Keeping air from getting trapped in the diseased parts of the lung allows the healthier parts of the lungs to expand and take in more air. This results in patients being able to breathe easier and have less shortness of breath.

"I felt immediate relief from this procedure," said Thomas Murphy, a resident of the Town of Ephratah in Fulton County. Murphy had the valve procedure in early March. "Everything that I loved doing had become so difficult because of my COPD. I couldn't even walk the 40 feet from my garage to my house. I just couldn't get the air into my lungs.'

"But since the treatment," Murphy added, "I am breathing so much better and back to taking walks, doing projects around the house, changing the oil in my car. I went from having no quality of life to having my old life back. I am just so grateful I had this procedure. I feel like a normal person

Emphysema is a progressive and life-threatening lung disease, and a severe form of COPD (chronic pulmonary obstructive disease). There is no cure and patients live with severe shortness of breath that keeps them from doing simple daily activities like walking, or taking a shower, without pausing to catch their breath or resting. This extreme shortness of breath is caused when air becomes trapped in parts of the lung that are damaged by the disease. This trapped air causes the damaged areas of the lungs to get larger, which puts pressure on the healthy parts of the lungs and diaphragm. During this short procedure, on average a physician places four tiny valves in the airways to block off the damage areas of the lungs so air no longer gets trapped there. This allows the healthier parts of the lungs to expand and relieves the pressure on the diaphragm, which decreases shortness of breath and makes breathing easier.

SEFCU, CAP COM agree to merger

Local credit unions will create new \$8B institution

ALBANY — The board of directors for both SEFCU and CAP COM agreed to a "merger of equals," combining two of the largest credit unions in the Capital District to create a new \$8 billion institution.

The merger was announced in a joint statement on Thursday, July 29. Leaders of each credit union said they had "been exploring a potential merger... [and] throughout our discussions, we have found a consistent mission, common purpose, and shared vision that prioritizes our employees, members, and communities."

To that end, the CAP COM and SEFCU Boards of Directors unanimously voted yesterday, July 28, to approve a "merger of equals," creating a Capital Region-headquartered financial and community powerhouse that will become fully integrated next year.

The newly combined entity will be renamed. The merger must first go through the standard due diligence and regulatory approval of both the National Credit Union Administration and the New York state Department of Financial Services. It must also be approved by stakeholders from each side.

Each Board of Directors voted unanimously on the decision the previous day and employees were informed just prior to the public announcement. Both organizations said there will be no layoffs related to the merger. The merger is anticipated to be final by next year.

"We are excited to explore this potential opportunity to become stronger together," said CAP COM President and CEO Chris McKenna. "As like-minded, mission-driven credit unions who share a commitment to

our employees, members, and community - this represents an exciting possibility to continue to expand our award-winning service to members across New York State, while continuing to invest in technology that makes banking more convenient. We look forward to continuing the process, with the intent to merge in 2022."

The combination of the two organizations is expected to create the largest financial institution in the Capital District based on local deposits. It should also emerge as one of the top five credit unions in the state and be among the top 30 credit unions in the nation.

"Along with growing in size, this alignment will allow us to expand our reach and positive impact on our members and the communities we serve," said SEFCU President and CEO Michael Castellana. "CAP COM and SEFCU share similar values, culture, and commitment to community."

AngioDynamics reports fiscal 2021 results


LATHAM — AngioDynamics, Inc., a leading provider of innovative, minimally invasive medical devices for vascular access, peripheral vascular disease, and oncology, recently announced financial results for the fourth quarter and fiscal year 2021, which ended May 31.

Net sales for the fourth quarter of fiscal 2021 were \$76.8 million, an increase of 31.7 percent compared to the prior-year quarter. All year-over-year comparisons have been affected by the disruption to procedure volumes resulting from the COVID-19 global pandemic.

U.S. net sales in the fourth quarter of fiscal 2021 were \$63.6 million, an increase of 42.6 percent from \$44.6 million a year ago. International net sales were \$13.2 million, a decrease of 3.6 percent, compared to \$13.7 million a year ago.

Gross margin for the fourth quarter of fiscal 2021 was 55.1 percent, an increase of 330 basis points compared to the fourth quarter of fiscal 2020, primarily due to a reduction in COVID-related costs. During the quarter, gross margin was negatively impacted by macro forces including labor shortages and increased costs for labor, raw materials, and freight. Gross margins also continued to be impacted by Auryon startup costs. During the fourth quarter, inventory was reduced by \$0.4 million when compared to inventory levels on February 28, 2021. During the fiscal year, inventory levels have been reduced by \$11.3 million.

The Company recorded a net loss of \$19.5 million, or a loss per share of \$0.51, in the fourth quarter of fiscal 2021.

County execs push for infrastructure

D.C. — The County Executives of America announced last week its support of a proposed infrastructure package working its way through Congress.

U.S. Senate leaders reached an agreement with the White House last Wednesday, July 28 on details of a bipartisan infrastructure package that would provide \$550 billion in new spending, including investments in roads and bridges, waterways and rural broadband.

The CEA, a national bipartisan coalition of more than 700 elected officials who serve as their county's chief elected executive, said it applauded the work of the senators involved in the negotiations as well as the Biden Administration. In a statement, the organization shared on Friday, July 30

that the deal, "represents agreement on the major issues and now we urge the Senate to move forward on crafting the legislation and bringing it to a vote."

The infrastructure deal includes \$550 billion in new federal spending on investments in clean transportation, including modernizing and expanding rail and public transit networks while reducing greenhouse gas emissions. It's also intended to repair and rebuild roads and bridges with what is touted as "the largest investment since the construction of the interstate highway system."

"The County Executives of America urges its members to reach out to the U.S. Senators in their home states today to signal their support for this infrastructure package, said Dan McCoy, CEA President and Albany County Executive. "[It's] critically important to

county governments everywhere who are directly responsible for maintaining, overseeing and improving the nations roads, parkways, bridges, public transit and county water systems as well as developing and increasing broadband and high speed internet service for our constituents."

The comprehensive package also invests in clean drinking water and wastewater infrastructure, including eliminating lead service lines and pipes, bolstering energy transmission and capacity upgrades. With a focus on green energy, it also seeks alternatives from fossil fuels with the creation of a vast network of electric vehicle charging stations. It also includes a dedicated investment in universal broadband with the ultimate goal of delivering high-speed internet to

Owens Corning reports 20 2021 results

TOLEDO, Ohio — Owens Corning recently reported consolidated net sales of \$2.2 billion in secondquarter 2021, compared with \$1.6 billion in second-quarter 2020, an increase of 38 percent.

Owens Corning also announced that the company entered into an agreement to sell the company's Insulation site in Santa Clara, California, to commercial real estate developer Panattoni.

Beetle mania

New York State Department of Environmental Conservation Commissioner Basil Seggos encouraged swimming pool owners to participate in the DEC's annual Asian Longhorned Beetle Swimming Pool Survey.

During late summer, Asian Longhorned beetles emerge as adults and are active outside of their host tree. The goal of the survey is to locate infestations of these invasive pests before they cause serious damage to the state's forests and street trees.

The wood-boring beetles are about 1.5 inches long, black with white spots, and have black and white antennae. They are native to Asia and were accidentally introduced to the United States through wood-packing materials.

The beetle can be identified by the perfectly round exit holes it leaves in branches and trunks of trees. It creates sawdust-like material called frass that collects on branches and around the base of hardwood trees, including

for an announcement form. maples, birches and willows. They are attributed to the death of hundreds of thousands of trees across the country.

The state Department of Agriculture and Markets has worked diligently to manage infestations in New York, successfully eradicating them from Brooklyn, Staten Island, Manhattan, Islip, and Queens. The beetle is still actively managed in central Long Island, and there are active infestations in Massachusetts, Ohio, and South Carolina.

"The best opportunity to eradicate and limit the spread of invasive species is by finding infestations early, when populations are low," said Seggos. 'Swimming pool monitoring is a simple, economical approach to surveying for these pests and gives New Yorkers the chance to take an active role in protecting their communities.'

From now until swimming pools are closed for the season, the DEC is asking pool owners to periodically check their filters for insects that resemble the beetle, and report suspects either by emailing photos to foresthealth@ dec.ny.gov or mailing insects to DEC's Forest Health Diagnostics Lab at 108 Game Farm Road, Delmar, NY 12054, Attn: Liam

Even people without swimming pools can help the effort by reporting signs of the beetle in their communities.

Free Home Lead Inspections

ALBANY — The county Department of Health, in conjunction with Cornell Cooperative Extension, offers free home lead visits. In addition to the lead inspection, free educational materials and cleaning supplies are provided.

The greatest exposure to lead in our current environment is the lead-based paint found in older homes. Before 1978, household paint often contained lead, especially the paints used for trim areas such as windows, doors, and railings. As the paint ages, it can chip or crumble into dust. Remodeling projects also increase the amount of exposure as the paint is disturbed. See also other sources of lead.

Lead poisoning occurs when an individual breathes or ingests the lead. The lead then enters the blood and accumulates in the body over time. Continual exposure causes the levels of lead in the body to increase causing symptoms of lead poisoning to develop gradually. By the time physical symptoms are visible the amount of lead in the body has reached a dangerous level.

Lead is highly toxic and exposure to it can be dangerous, especially for children who are 6 or younger. Young children are at particular risk of lead poisoning because their bodies are developing rapidly and they frequently place their hands, toys, and other objects in their

Lead poisoning is not easy to detect. Sometimes no symptoms occur, and sometimes the early symptoms are the same as those of more common illnesses.

If not detected early, children with high levels of lead in their bodies can suffer from damage to the brain and nervous system, behavior and learning problems, such as hyperactivity, slowed growth, hearing problems, and headaches. In rare cases of acute lead poisoning from ingestion of lead, children can suffer seizures, coma and even







'Michelangelo - A Different View' brings Sistine Chapel's paintings to Albany



ALBANY — The Sistine Chapel, as a part of the Vatican Museum, shut its doors to visitors in March 2020 for nearly three months due to COVID-19. The hands of Adam and God extended over an empty room, the Last Judgement adjourned.

The chapel reopened to the public for about five months before it shut down again the following November for another three months, succeeded by yet another three month closer after a brief reopening in February.

It was unprecedented and devastating.





Michelangelo

In a normal year, the chapel would welcome some five million people. But following the longest closure since 1943, the museum was left in a state of uncertainty. Michelangelo's famous frescoes became a daydream for tourists and art lovers alike.

Even with the reopening of the museum, the Sistine Chapel isn't a common day trip for most, and so it remains a distant wish. But what if a visit to Rome isn't needed to see these awe-inspiring paintings?

The Albany Capital
Center is featuring the exhibit
"Michelangelo — A Different
View." The exhibit opened
Thursday, July 29, and runs to
Monday, Aug. 23. The traveling
exhibit is the only display of the
Sistine Chapel's paintings to be
certified by the Vatican. Images
captured on photo slides between
1982 and 1994 of the chapel were
used to create reproductions that
were then transferred onto fabric
webs.

The experience of stepping into the Sistine Chapel will never be able to be replicated, but this exhibit allows for it to be enjoyed up close. There is no rush, but more importantly, there is no

Michelangelo's appreciation for the beauty of form is apparent with a close view of his frescos. As seen in "The Libica," he captures movement in his depictions of the human body's strength and grace.

distance between the viewer and the art. The ability to stand just a few feet from the paintings allows for a different kind of appreciation.

It becomes even more impressive when each fresco can be looked at as an individual work of art, rather than as a part of the whole. To highlight each story that Michelangelo tells through his paintings, the exhibit features an audio tour that explains exactly what each frame is depicting. Though most people know the

general story behind the Sistine Chapel's ceiling and walls, the audio provides a much deeper history that demonstrates the level of thought put into each

Every inch, especially in "The Last Judgement" is so intricately designed that it would have taken some painters a lifetime to pull off, but Michelangelo did it all in just four years.

The highlight of the exhibit lies in the main room of the

Capital Center, since it is where Michelangelo's ceiling is displayed on the floor. Walking along either side offers a different story, and a different perspective. It is one thing to look up at "The Creation of Adam," but it is another to be able to see the individual brush strokes in God's beard or Adam's fingertips as you look down toward them.

The opportunity to view these frescoes at such a close distance is one that doesn't come around often and might not come around

again once this exhibit closes its doors. Learn the stories behind the frescoes of Delphica, and Esaias, and Libica.

Tickets cost between \$8 and \$17, and can be purchased at albanycapitalcenter.com.

Take a bow, Uncle Sam

Federal grants promise new life for area venues, organizations

hose venues and organizations receiving relief from the Shuttered Venue Operators Grant recently learned just how much they could expect to receive.

The Shuttered Venue Operators Grant program was established by the Economic Aid to Hard-Hit Small Businesses, Nonprofits, and Venues Act, and amended by the American Rescue Plan Act.

Over \$16 billion in grant money was awarded to shuttered venues, nonprofits and small businesses hit hard by pandemic-related shutdowns. Grant awards ranged from \$527 to a live venue promoter in Berea, Kentucky, to \$10 million awarded to more than 100 different organizations across the country.

The Small Business Association's Office of Disaster Assistance awarded approximately \$42.1 million to 58 organizations within the Capital District. Applicants qualified for grants equal to 45 percent of their gross earned revenue, with the maximum amount available for a single grant award of \$10 million.

A job worth doing

Community leaders push to bring more job opportunities for direct support professionals

SCHENECTADY — On a day-to-day basis, direct support professionals are expected to perform a host of tasks: administering medication, preparing food, assisting with laundry, accompanying clients on outings and appointments, administering insulin injections, and forming relationships with those they support. Though it's a field that attracts dedicated

workers fueled by their passion and commitment, the paycheck of \$12.50 an hour has made it an impossible career for many New York DSPs.


On Thursday, July 29, Schenectady ARC and New York state Assemblyman Angelo Santabarbara partnered to host a rally to raise awareness for the direct support workforce crisis and how to best recruit and retain such professionals. Speakers included parents, DSPs, and state legislators like Santabarbara and New York state Senator Jim Tedisco.

For Cindy Barkowski, a mother whose 27-year-old son has received services from ARC since 1999, the labor shortage is both disheartening and devastating to families and workers alike.

"One mom got up there and spoke yesterday — her son is in a residence — but she said the turnover is so bad that he calls the people 'lady' and 'sir' because he can't keep track... they're coming and going so quickly," said Barkowski.

This is consistent with state vacancies as reported in the July 2021 New York Disability Advocates Report. From "prepandemic" through Jan 1, 2021-April 1, 2021, there was a 74.3 percent increase in the staff vacancy rate statewide. The reported staff turnover rate is 11.90 percent.

"It limits their lives," said Schenectady ARC Executive Director Kirk Lewis. "They have to get to know new people they have to basically train new people into who they are, and

what they need, and how they want to be supported."

The work shortages and high turnover rates means that the remaining staff needs to put in extra hours that they wouldn't have otherwise been responsible for. Barkowski shared that her son's Community Habilitation Worker had to cancel the Friday after the rally because she had maxed out her hours for the week with other clients.

"The staff obviously hasn't been able to be here because they're working 60 hours a week and they don't have the time to come in... they need to go where the need is greater so I understand that completely," said Barkowski. However, she continued on to say that her fear going forward is that her son will get less and less time with his DSPs.

This devaluation of DSP work remains the root of the issue, Lewis pointed out, and he noted that it further perpetuates the oppression of two groups. Firstly, it continues the historic discrimination that those with disabilities are faced with. Secondly, it specifically devalues women, particularly women of color, who are frequently seen in DSP roles. Lewis noted that "an overwhelming majority are women and probably a disproportionate number are women of color."

Lewis directed his message to

the legislature and the governor, "Recognize our people. Recognize the people we support. Recognize the great work that our direct support professionals do," he said.

This recognition from the government will be demonstrated through funding. Lewis, Barkowski, and Assemblyman Santabarbara all echoed the same sentiment. The issue cannot be fixed with one-time funding, but instead requires a long-term

Assemblyman Santabarbara, whose 19-year-old son has autism, expressed his disapproval of Gov. Cuomo's "nonexistent" record in increasing funding to

The assemblyman also pointed to the federal government, particularly to the Better Care Better Jobs Act. This bill would provide funding to states for direct care, as well as allow for the funding to then go toward specific organizations like Schenectady ARC.

"This is an investment in people, this is about community, so I don't know what the governor's reasoning can be that he wouldn't want to invest in this," said Santabarbara.

Coming out of the pandemic, workforce issues were augmented across the country in nearly every field. For organizations like ARC, however, it has become

more challenging to incentivize minimum wage pay for a highly demanding job. And leaders like Lewis know that their workers deserve better.

"What was a challenging, bad situation before the pandemic has turned into a crisis in the pandemic," said Lewis.

"It's about giving people new opportunities, independence, and I've seen it first-hand," said Santabarbara. "It's invaluable work, you almost can't put a price on it, and the fact that they're getting paid right around minimum wage is just unacceptable and it's embarrassing for the state."

Darlingside fills Caffé Lena

SARATOGA SPRINGS — Indie-folk band Darlingside filled Caffe Lena's seats to capacity Friday night in two sold out shows at the historic listening room. The lush sounding band can fill The Egg, and instead spent the evening with Caffe Lena fans in an intimate setting sharing favorite songs, charming humor, and lyrics that make everyone feel a little bit less lonely.

It was the first time since the pandemic that Caffe Lena has been at full capacity, and the staff did so mindfully. Audience members were asked to produce proof of vaccine and almost all wore masks as they stood in line to enter the hall. There was an excited hush about the group, many of whom shifted from foot to foot while waiting for the doors to open for the second show, Excelsior passes cued on phones, sweaters draping

shoulders on the chilly summer night.

initially at Williams College. Clearly deep thinkers from their lyrics, their chatter also reveals a goofy self awareness that they are really ordinary guys. Auyon Mukharji's introductions of each band member followed his story of recently enjoying an ice cream sandwich. "It was special because it was exceptional...but it was also a surprise." Somehow Mukharji turned this into an opportunity to talk about what food he imagined each band member could be surprised with, moving from Don Mitchell's love of ice cream to David Senft's enjoyment of coffee and finally landing with Harris Paseltiner's love of breakfast sandwiches with crispy edges.

The juxtaposition of their normalcy with the magic of their sound increases the awareness for this writer at least that Darlingside has somehow bridged loneliness with music. During "Green and Evergreen," the opening words "Through the oak and poison ivy/ As the lemon light was alkalining/ I was growing, I was dying/ Growing I was dying" caught me off guard. The beauty of the image and yet the depth of the reality that we all are, in fact, dying pulled me in deeper for a good listen.

Another spellbinding moment of the night was a gorgeous version of "Whippoorwill," complete with a dramatic pause after "All your favorite time it comes from me." The historic listening room was filled with people of all ages who were singing along, nodding and knowing the words, knowing the message.

Paseltiner added the cello to the band's sound for the last few songs, including a mesmerizing "Orion" that recalled both chamber orchestra vibes with roots. The room could feel the band's crescendo, rocking forward to the conclusion of the night that we hoped would never come.

After a climatic "Ancestor," the band thanked the venue and crowd, which was on its feet clapping until they returned for a high energy "Blow the House Down." The encore gave Paseltiner and Mukharji the opportunity to show they can really jam, and the band left on a high note of excitement.

I listen to Darlingside often; usually it is alone in my office while typing notes, or while resting after yoga. The experience of listening to them live with other human


beings was more than simply synergistic, as we often reflect in these reviews. My sadness has been palpable recently, and often as is the case with sadness, I was wrongly believing I was alone in the experiences of dreading change, grieving losses, and wistfully wishing for something I can't quite name. Darlingside and Caffe Lena reminded us all through the community of music that we are all yearning, stretching through pensive interiors and trying to reach out.

Darlingside's magic goes beyond its lush sound. It goes beyond its tremendous talent on string instruments, and poetic lyrics. It is their connection to one another, their long friendship of awkward pauses, humility in owning mistakes, and clear love for being human that reawakens its listeners to life.


