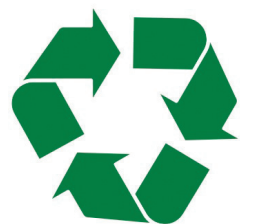
Wayward driving leads to DWI arrests

Rensselaer woman faces nine charges after DWI arrest

GLENMONT — A Rensselaer woman is facing nine criminal charges after allegedly driving while drunk during the early morning hours of Friday, Sept. 24.

Candace Buck told

Bethlehem police she was on her way to see a friend after she was pulled over on Route 9W near the Bethlehem Center intersection at approximately 12:21 a.m. According to the police report, Buck was stopped after the 2002 Honda CRV she was operating was observed driving south in the northbound lane. Police said she nearly struck the patrol car before proceeding south.

Once Buck was stopped, the reporting officer noted a smell of alcohol allegedly coming from inside her car. After allegedly saying she did not know why she was pulled over, the police officer said he observed an opened alcoholic beverage in the center console. When asked if she was drinking, she allegedly said, "not a lot."

As police checked state Department of Motor

Vehicles records, they said her driver's license had been revoked as she allegedly failed to answer a summons. Additionally, the registration on her vehicle was also suspended due to lapsed insurance.

After allegedly failing field sobriety tests, Buck was processed at the Bethlehem Police Department in Delmar, where police later described her as incoherent. She was said to have provided "unclear statements" after being asked to submit to a chemical test.

At one point she allegedly said she would not submit to a test. She ultimately agreed to a test, after having been asked three times. An hour after she was initially pulled over, a chemical test allegedly revealed a 0.24 percent blood alcohol content. She was later released to the care of a friend, who drove

her back home.

Buck faces three driving under the influence charges, including first offense DWI, operating a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content of 0.08 percent or more, and aggravated DWI with blood alcohol content of 0.18 percent or more. Other misdemeanors and infractions include operation of a motor vehicle without insurance, suspended registration, unlicensed driver, 3rd-degree aggravated unlicensed driver, failure to keep right and drinking alcohol in a motor vehicle on a highway.

Buck is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, Oct. 19.

Rolled too far

DELMAR — A Selkirk man initially blamed his truck's standard transmission for causing him to roll back and strike

the car behind him, but police slapped him with driving while intoxicated charges before the evening was through on Saturday, Sept. 25.

According to the police report, Joseph Kempf was returning home from a fundraising event at Albany's Lost and Found before he was stopped at a red light on the corner of Feura Bush Road and Elsmere Avenue. Once the light turned green, his 2004 Nissan 200-SX rolled back and struck the car behind him. When the other motorist got out of his car to confront him, Kempf drove away. The other motorist pursued Kempf, honking his horn as they proceeded down Feura Bush Road. The two stopped shortly afterwards, and a neighbor called the police.

Kempf reportedly told police he didn't realize he

struck another vehicle at the intersection. Because his truck had a standard transmission, he said it sometimes rolls. He was returning home from an afternoon fundraising event, where he said he had two Rum and Cokes. After allegedly failing field sobriety tests, he was processed at the Bethlehem Police Department in Delmar. While at the police station, he agreed to a breath test that allegedly registered a 0.20 percent blood alcohol content.

Kempf faces three driving under the influence charges, including first offense DWI, operating a motor vehicle with a blood alcohol content of 0.08 percent or more, and aggravated DWI with blood alcohol content of 0.18 percent or more.

Kempf is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, Oct. 19.

Friday Night Blackout?

RAVENA — Ravena Coeymans Selkirk was left with the unfortunate option of evacuating Friday night's football game against Hudson Falls when the lights inexplicably went out during the game on Friday, Sept. 24.

At approximately 8:30 p.m. the lights went out on the High School Athletic Field during the varsity football game. Upon inspection by the district's contracted electrician, they determined that a portion of the control center that runs the lights was not working properly and in its current state was not safe to use and would need to be replaced.

The determination was made that the lights could not safely be restored to continue the game. As a result, the field and spectators were evacuated.

"Our primary goal is to have the lights on as soon as possible," the district shared in an online statement. "As a backup, we

have secured light towers for the next two weeks in the event we need them."

To make the repairs, the power has to be shut off by National Grid. District officials are presently working with National Grid to schedule the shutdown as soon as possible.

The next scheduled nighttime event on the field is Wednesday, Oct. 6, at 7 p.m.

Guilderland capital project vote Oct. 7

GUILDERLAND — District voters will decide on a \$21.8M proposed capital improvement project on Thursday, Oct. 7.

The proposal addresses the priorities of improving learning opportunities, enhancing safety and security for students and staff, and

replacing or updating aging infrastructure in the district's seven school buildings. The project focuses on three overarching areas; infrastructure work that was eliminated from the 2018 proposal; outdoor space improvements that include upgrading or replacing playground equipment; and technology replacement and data security that includes improving instructional learning technology.

Other proposed improvements include upgrades or replacement of heating and ventilation systems, bathrooms, classroom cabinetry and storage, roofs, lighting, windows, flooring, lockers, and security systems.

Plans also include the replacement of the high school track along with the addition of a turf field and the addition of outdoor classroom pavilions at each building.

GCSD teacher named diversity director

Matthew Pinchinat has advised high school's Black Student Union and served on Anti-Racism Committee

GUILDERLAND — High school social studies teacher Matthew Pinchinat was named the district's first diversity director.

Pinchinat started his new role as Diversity, Equity and Inclusion on Sept. 20. The newly created position is to help the district promote equity, social justice and anti-racism for its students and community.

"Matt has been a valued educator at Guilderland High School and we are so excited for him to assume this new role," said Superintendent Dr. Marie Wiles. "Our primary DEI objective is to ensure all of our students, families and employees are heard, seen, safe, valued, respected and welcome in our school community and I can't think of anyone more capable to lead this charge."

Pinchinat has served

the past four years as a social studies teacher for Guilderland High School. In addition, he advised the high school's Black Student Union, served on the steering committee of its Anti-Racism Committee and worked with the Diversity, Equity and

Inclusion Committee of the Board of Education.

"I love being a teacher and will miss being in the classroom but this new position will enable me to have a much larger impact and make a broader change with students of all grade

levels," Pinchinat said. "I see this as a real gift. This position aligns with the very reason I became a teacher: to help students see the intrinsic value in themselves. I want to help them celebrate their diverse backgrounds."

Pinchinat's work with the committee gave him a head start on building relationships and collaborating with stakeholders. He served on a subcommittee tasked with creating professional

the relationships he has already established by leaning on the vast "web of experience at my disposal: staff, students, DEI Committee members, board members."

These goals are part of a long-range vision, as Pinchinat said he recognizes lasting change doesn't happen overnight but in small increments. He plans to build on the support in each of the spheres of the GCSD community: Board of

and to connect with other area schools doing strong DEI work to learn best practices. In the long term Matt would like to expand programs such as National Coalition Building Institute (NCBI) and Sources of Strength beyond GHS to other district schools. "I think it's so important to build empathy, because empathy is the way we build bridges to each other." Ultimately, his goal is to have systems in place for older students to interact regularly with younger students, creating stronger bonds within the district.

Pinchinat said he recognizes at the heart of this work is the basic human need to be accepted and to have a place to belong. He believes diversity, equity and inclusion applies to every person.

"I would like all members of the GCSD community to proudly say that everyone has a voice and a place at the table," said Pinchinat. He said his ultimate goal is to elevate the district and have everyone included in this growth. "I do not want to elevate someone while tearing someone else down. I'm all about building up."

Energy bills to go up?

National Grid reaches agreement with commission

ALBANY — National Grid reached a three-year rate agreement for upstate New York electric and gas businesses that is expected to raise the average monthly energy bill by nearly \$2 next year.

If approved, the three-year proposal would take effect Jan. 1, 2022. Under the terms of the agreement, average residential electricity customers who use 600 kwh a month would see a \$1.88 monthly bill increase in the first year, \$1.88 in year two and \$2.23 in year three. Average residential gas bills for customers who use 82 therms a month would increase \$1.51 per month in the first year, \$2.37 in year two and \$2.56 in year three. The New York Public Service Commission is expected to decide on the proposal later this year.

The joint proposal, reached after 11 months of negotiation, was submitted on Monday, Sept. 27 to the New York Public Service Commission for review.

The agreement was proposed along with the Department of Public Service Staff, IBEW Local97, commercial and industrial customers, the New York Power Authority, and other parties. National Grid said the three-year rate agreement “minimizes bill impacts, enhances energy affordability programs, targets key infrastructure investments to promote a cleaner, more resilient energy delivery system, and advances New York’s renewable energy and emissions reductions goals.”

“Our three-year agreement reflects the input of a broad range of stakeholders and is an important step forward in advancing New York’s clean energy future. It maintains a focus on managing customer affordability in response to the economic downturn caused by COVID-19, while funding programs that will modernize our energy networks and promote economic growth in the state,” said National Grid’s New York President Rudy Wynter.

National Grid’s previous gas and electricity rate plans expired March 30, 2021. A proposal for new delivery rates was originally due in April 2020 but, given the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic, the company decided to delay that filing until June 30, 2020, and used that time to refine and reduce the amount of the request.

SPHP earns award for its COVID-19 response

RENSSELAER — The Rensselaer County Legislature passed a resolution in August recognizing the award recipients, who also include United Concierge Medicine Digital Health and Rensselaer County Public Health Director Mary Fran Wachunas, for their COVID-19 response.

The legislature presented the recipients with an engrossed copy of the resolution during a ceremony on September 14. SPHP’s President of Acute Care, Michael Finegan, was in attendance and accepted the honor on SPHP’s behalf.

In the resolution, the Legislature commends SPHP for how it responded to the pandemic.

Whereas, St. Peter’s Health Partners (SPHP) is the recipient of the 2021 Van Rensselaer Corporate Award. SPHP responded to the COVID-19 pandemic by increasing bed capacity and securing personal protective equipment to keep their workers safe. They also expanded their virtual health services to better connect patients with health care providers and offered COVID testing throughout the region. With 170 locations and 12,000 employees, the impact SPHP has had on individuals, families, and communities in the region has been significant.

United Concierge Medicine Digital Health, which SPHP collaborates with for

its TeleSAFE program serving victims of sexual assault, was also honored for using its virtual capabilities to triage patients and treat as needed or direct them to appropriate care.

All award recipients will be honored during the Rensselaer County Regional Chamber of Commerce’s dinner on Oct. 7.

Realtors see a unique autumn ahead

Will cooler weather put the freeze on housing market?

ALBANY — Cooler weather often sparks a buyers market — where the homes for sale outnumber those seeking to buy — but realtors concerned over an inventory dearth foresee a different kind of season this fall.

The Greater Capital Association of Realtors said competition remained strong in August, impacting prices and inventory numbers within the Capital District. Pending sales were 1,177 a 31 percent change from August 2020. Closed sales slowed by 9 percent down to 1,352 from 1,485 a year ago. Sellers contributed 1725 new listings into the mix for busy realtors.

Nationally, the story was the same. “Sales slipped a bit in August as prices rose nationwide,” said Lawrence Yun, National Association of Realtors chief economist. “Although there was a decline in home purchases, potential buyers are out and about searching, but much more measured about their financial limits, and simply waiting for more inventory.”

NAR reported the median existing home price for all housing types in August was \$356,700, up 14.9 percent from August 2020. Though the Greater Capital District’s median price was comparatively lower than the national average, the percentage of increase was nearly the same with a 13.8 percent increase over August 2020.

This most recent report marks nearly a decade of straight, year-over-year gains. Realtors said buyers remain present in

the market, but inventory, affordability, and back-to-school preparations sometimes have a decelerating effect on sales in late summer. Still, sellers received 101.3 percent of the original list price for

their homes.

Realtors assess that without a strong addition of new homes, pricing will most likely continue to rise throughout the fall. August’s inventory declined

by 19.4 percent. Builders’ efforts brought 116 new homes with a median sale price of \$402,379 to the local market last month, a decline of 56 percent from a year ago.

Across the country home builders continue to struggle to meet buyer demand. According to the Commerce Department, housing starts nationwide dropped 7 percent in August. Labor shortages, increased material costs, and supply-chain setbacks continue to challenge builders. Some are temporarily pausing projects due to availability and the cost of materials.

As the region and the rest of the country prepare for cooler weather and more indoor activities, health concerns loom large as summer hits the rearview mirror. Vaccination rates, challenges with new variants and the “new normal” of working at home may continue to impact the Capital District market with the fervor of first-time buyers and renters who want to spend this winter in their own homes.

Times Union declines naming rights at the former Knickerbocker Arena

ALBANY — The name of the Times Union newspaper will no longer appear on the facility that opened as the Knickerbocker Arena in 1990.

In a statement on the newspaper's website, Publisher George Hearst III said the media company will “continue to invest in its journalism by maintaining a robust newsroom staff and growing its geographic region.”

The Times Union recently launched an expansion into the Hudson Valley.

The media company had paid Albany County, which owns the facility, \$350,000 a year for the last 15 years. It had a contract for 10 years with an option to renew for another five, according to the newspaper.

“We're in the midst of an evolution at the Times Union that will deepen our impact across the Capital Region and Hudson Valley and expand our ability to report on the diverse communities we serve,” Hearst said in a statement on the newspaper's website. “With digital subscriptions growing and new hiring in our newsroom, the time has come to open up the opportunity for another company to put their name on the arena as we shift our focus to reaching new audiences in different ways and double down on our commitment to meet our region's need for high-quality, trusted, local journalism.”

ASM Global operates the arena for the county. It is home to such sports teams as the Siena mens basketball team, the Albany Empire arena football team and the Albany Firewolves indoor lacrosse team that will kick off its inaugural season in December.

SABIC, Microsoft to create recycled ocean plastic product

RIYADH, Saudi Arabia

— As part of a new effort to advance the use of recycled ocean plastic, SABIC and Microsoft Corporation collaborated to create The Microsoft Ocean Plastic Mouse.

The mouse is the computer tech company's first consumer electronic product with an exterior shell containing 20 percent recycled ocean plastic.

Ocean plastic is defined as plastic that has been certified by a third party as recovered from any ocean or ocean-feeding waterways or where it washed ashore from these locations. Ocean plastic differs from ocean-bound plastic in that ocean-bound plastic is recovered from ocean-feeding waterways, shorelines, and inland areas within a 50-kilometer radius of the ocean. The two recycled products play complementary roles in helping address the issue of ocean plastic waste.

Microsoft began this project with an objective of creating a plastic resin made from at least 10 percent recycled ocean plastic as part of its commitment to achieve zero waste by 2030. After hearing the initial vision for the project, SABIC joined the effort to source the recycled material and to formulate a resin that satisfied Microsoft's demanding quality standards. The Microsoft design team collaborated with technologists at SABIC to provide feedback on prototypes made with the new resin. This effort resulted in several rounds of reformulation prior to arriving at a final version that exceeded Microsoft's initial 10 percent goal. The final product contains 20 percent recycled ocean plastic by weight in its external casing or "shell."

Albany Symphony prepares for David Alan Miller's 30th season

ALBANY — As David Alan Miller's 30th season as Albany Symphony's Music Director approaches, the conversation leans toward habit, a word he avoids as it perceives complacency.

Talk of habit is brushed aside with confessions of humming along to a James Taylor earworm as he walks into his neighborhood supermarket. He shares that he once developed a routine similar to pro athletes who choose a particular meal before performances; in his case, Japanese food, because he finds it calming. But admitting to developing a habit implies stagnation, and that's not how one would define his career.

"In a way, what I'm most concerned about is that we not fall into habits," Miller said. "Because when you've been somewhere for 30 years, the greatest danger is that, God forbid, it becomes stale... I, and we, are forever fighting against having it be what you'd expect. We want it to be the unexpected."

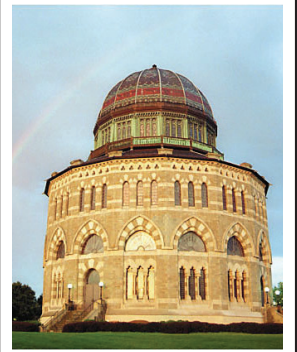

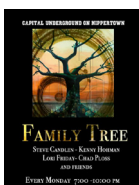

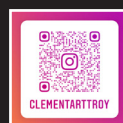

- "Can't Be Beet," a housemade soda, two thirds fruit juice, like all Carmen's sodas, naturally sweet with no added sugar Contains Beet, Cherry, and Black Currant juices among others.
- Sangria Smoothie, using a variety of fresh fruit, including: watermelon, strawberry, banana and yogurt along with wine.

Carmen's is open Saturdays and Sundays, from 9 a.m. to 3

p.m. Dining is available outdoors, weather permitting, and always indoors in the convivial bistro-style interior designed by Lewis, a master carpenter, featuring a counter carved from a huge Ailanthus tree.

Although fully vaccinated and exercising an abundance of caution, Gonzalez tested positive for COVID-19 after caring for a child who also tested positive.

Though CDC guidelines recommend waiting 10 days after symptoms clear, Gonzalez and her partner Jim Lewis decided to keep the restaurant closed to give the space a deep cleaning and touch up the paint.

"This is also a great time for new diners to come down and discover our charming little spot," Lewis said. "Check out the farmers market and then come down to see us."

Troy restaurant collection looks for new culinary talent as Executive Chef Krumanocker departs Clark House Hospitality

TROY — After six years at Clark House Hospitality, and successfully keeping the collection of downtown restaurants, retail, and private event spaces afloat throughout the COVID-19 pandemic, Troy native Zoë Krumanocker, 30, will be stepping down as vice president of culinary on Oct. 30.

In an email to staff sent Tuesday night, Krumanocker wrote: "Working here for the past 6 years with all of you has brought me immense joy and I couldn't have asked for a better group of people to have shared the time with."

She continued: "I know and expect that you will continue to do great things, because I've seen it first hand every day."

"We did some incredible things together," said Vic Christopher, president of Clark House Hospitality. "I can't think of another person who would've done more to help the company make the transitions necessary to survive. But we're OK now, because we created a true team environment and standardized menus with great pizza and pasta."

The company has grown aggressively in recent years, even through the ongoing pandemic, shifting towards an Italian food focus, while opening a neighborhood grocery store.

Clark House Hospitality changed the former Peck's Arcade restaurant to Donna's Italian Restaurant in June of 2020, switching the format from vegetable-forward fine dining to Italian-American comfort food with an emphasis on take-out and delivery. Full dinner service at a renovated Donna's Italian Restaurant resumed in June of 2021.

"In times of crisis, there is always a trend back toward comfort food," Christopher said. "Peck's Arcade was a special occasion restaurant -- it may have been the best, but it wasn't working in a pandemic environment. Donna's Italian is an everyday restaurant, with a menu that's relatable to everyone."

In addition to Donna's Italian, Clark House Hospitality's holdings include The Grocery, Lucas Confectionery wine bar, The Tavern Bar, the Twenty-two Second Street natural wine

The Los Angeles native first took the podium in 1992 and has lived in the Capital District for just as long, establishing roots to which Miller and his wife raised three kids — two of whom have pursued a life of music as well. His run with the Albany Symphony represents nearly one-third of its 91-year history. And within that relative short time, he has cultivated its reputation as one of its most innovative orchestras. Along the way, the small city troupe has wrangled two Grammy Awards away from orchestras from Boston and Philadelphia.

Miller has been the nation's leading champion of American symphonic music, continuously marrying classic greats from Brahms, Bach and Beethoven with a world-premiere or recent composition from today's brightest young talents. In each show, Maestro turns to the audience to share anecdotes behind each work. The magic he often wields is how he finds the

common denominator that bridges over the centuries.

"With his creative, thoughtful programming, his tremendous talent as a conductor, and his tireless advocacy for education, inclusion and the Capital Region community, David Alan Miller truly embodies the Albany Symphony's mission," says Symphony Board Chair Jerel Golub. The Albany Symphony returns to the Palace Theatre stage on Saturday, Oct. 9, at 7:30 p.m. for the start of Miller's 30th Anniversary Season. The program features Ludwig van Beethoven's beloved Symphony No. 3, "Eroica," as well as Jean Sibelius' Lemminkäinen Suite, and Coincident Dances, an aural melting pot of city sounds by Jessie Montgomery, a composer who the *New York Times* said is "changing the canon for American orchestras."

Coincident Dances by Jessie Montgomery, a frequent Albany Symphony collaborator who draws from her life experiences in thoughtful and captivating ways.

Montgomery's "Coincident Dances" may just be that bridge that spans from today's world and Beethoven's. The dramatic expression of the German composer is no stranger to dance, whether

in ballet or a New York City disco. As Montgomery describes her work, she drew inspiration from dances across the globe.

"Coincident Dances is inspired by the sounds found in New York's various cultures, capturing the frenetic energy and multicultural aural palette one hears even in a short walk through a New York City neighborhood," Montgomery said. "The

work is a fusion of several different sound-worlds: English consort, samba, mbira dance music from Ghana, swing, and techno."

Saturday night will welcome patrons back to the Albany Palace for the first time since Spring 2020, with extra precautions in place for everyone's health and safety in response to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. The concert, along with all Albany Symphony subscription concerts this season, is also being streamed live online to increase access for patrons who cannot attend in person, or live too far away to come to the concert hall.

Tickets (including livestream access) start at \$20 and are available at albanysymphony.com.

"We are so thrilled to gather again, and to be able to make beautiful music with and for our patrons and friends here in the Capital Region and beyond," Miller said. "This season is a special one for us. The musicians and I can't wait to share this program celebrating heroism, community, and the healing power of great music with you."





New York State Museum Thomas Hart Benton

Study: West Nile cases will increase

Scientists with UAlbany, NYSDOH say global warming usher in more cases to region

ALBANY — Area scientists are predicting that global warming will cause local cases of West Nile virus to increase in future years.

A group of scientists affiliated with the University at Albany and New York State Department of Health published a recent study predicting that the total number of West Nile virus cases will be more geographically widespread across New York and Connecticut due to warming trends.

The scientists, part of the Climate Change and Emerging Infectious Disease working group, created two machine learning-based statistical models that use a combination of observational climate data and current numbers



of human WNV cases to estimate future rates of the virus. A regional version of the model was trained to run simulations using data from each state, with numbers broken down to the county level. An analog version was trained using data from Maryland, Virginia, Washington, D.C., and Delaware as a contiguous region that is expected to be similar in future climate.

Both regional and analog versions of the model predicted significant increases in future WNV cases across both New York and Connecticut, with decreases in some counties, including those in New York City and Long Island, that are currently at the highest risk for the virus. When counties were

grouped by region, eight regions were predicted to see increases in human WNV cases, two regions were predicted to have fewer human WNV cases, and one was predicted to show no change.

An independent trait-based model based on mosquito and virus responses to temperature changes also predicted a future increase in WNV cases across both states.

The study can be read in the latest edition of *Global Change Biology*.

“Research on West Nile virus and emerging infectious diseases is important to safeguarding public health and safety, especially in the context of climate change,” said Alexander “Sasha” Keyel, the paper’s lead author, and a post-doctoral researcher at the school’s Department of Atmospheric and Environmental Sciences and the NYSDOH Wadsworth Center. “Many of these disease systems can change in complex and non-intuitive ways with changes in climate and land use.”

Warmer nights make for a welcoming environment for ticks, mosquitoes and fleas that carry various viruses, including West Nile, said scientists.

RPI developing tools for space travel

Machine-learning tests abilities of rare-earth phosphates given atmospheric extremes could lead to advancements in aerospace travel

TROY — Materials and mechanical scientists are using machine-learning to rapidly vet combinations of elements that could be used in next-generation environmental barrier coatings needed to protect vehicles traveling in the extreme conditions of aerospace and space environments. The project, led by researchers at

Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute, is supported by the National Science Foundation.

Environmental barrier coatings, or EBCs, are used to seal parts in the engines and structural components of rockets, hypersonic jets, and other space-bound vehicles. The coatings protect parts from harsh operating conditions such as high temperatures, supersonic speeds, intense stress, and severe oxidation and corrosion. Rare earth silicates are the current choice for EBCs used to coat the silicon carbide-based ceramic matrix materials in state-of-the-art jet engines, but these materials are problematic, and subject to performance degradation.

As an alternative, the Rensselaer team proposes EBCs made from multicomponent rare earth phosphates instead of silicates.

“New concepts and innovations are required in order to design next-generation EBCs with transformative performance,” said Jie Lian, a professor in the Department of Mechanical, Aerospace, and Nuclear Engineering and the principal investigator of the grant. “The proposed multicomponent rare-earth phosphates offer unlimited possibilities in designing future EBCs and extending their performance.”

This \$1.8 million NSF grant aims to revolutionize material design and support the methodology development by synergizing high-throughput computation – experimentation and machine-learning for data-driven materials design and discovery. The researchers will use advanced computer algorithms to create combinations of elements in multiple configurations,

determining the most favorable framework for the high-performance EBCs needed for aerospace and space transportation systems of the future.

“The empirical trial-error approach is too expensive and soon becomes impractical for material discovery over a large design space,” said Liping Huang, a co-principal investigator and professor in the Department of Materials Science and Engineering. “We aim at a novel approach that couples physics-based modeling with machine-learning to predict the optimal composition and microstructure of the next generation EBCs.”

Lian, an expert in experimentation and material behavior under extreme environments, and Huang, an expert in high-throughput atomic simulation, are joined in this four-year research

project by Suvranu De, an expert in finite element analysis and director of the Center for Modeling, Simulation, and Imaging in Medicine at Rensselaer, and Lucy Zhang, an expert in machine-learning and a professor in the Department of Mechanical, Aerospace, and Nuclear Engineering.

“Machine-learning models trained on data generated from high-throughput multiscale simulations can speed up the design and optimization of the structure and performance of multicomponent rare earth phosphates as EBCs,” Zhang said.

The Rensselaer team will collaborate with researchers at the General Electric Global Research, a leading industry of EBCs.

Founded in 1824, Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute is America’s first technological research

university. Rensselaer encompasses five schools, 32 research centers, more than 145 academic programs, and a dynamic community made up of more than 7,600 students and over 100,000 living alumni. 

shop, little pecks all-day cafe, and The Bradley, a neighborhood dive bar.

Clark House Hospitality now begins its search for a new executive chef to bring the restaurant group into the future with bold ideas and flavors.

“We’re excited for the next phase of our development and evolution. If the pandemic showed us anything, it’s that moments together with the people we love—friends,

family, neighbors—matter more now. Clark House Hospitality is looking to bring our customers the very best of experiences,” said Paula Patterson, vice president of hospitality. “Whether it’s an outdoor after-work drink with a colleague you’ve only seen on ZOOM for months or a long-overdue engagement party, we’re here as a place for our community to gather, eat, drink and be merry.”

The restaurant industry is also facing a staffing crisis, with many restaurants struggling to maintain previous levels of kitchen staff, due in part to traditionally low wages and

an archaic New York State labor law that prevents front of the house workers from sharing tips with back of the house staff.

Clark House Hospitality pioneered an equitable pay scale for all employees by creating a system where every worker shares job responsibilities, allowing them to pool tips. In the month of August, the lowest paid workers at Clark House earned \$26.90 per hour.

Christopher said that Clark House is working on elevating team members internally into lead roles, and is also accepting applications for the executive chef position. Ideally, these promotions and new hires will be set into motion during the October transitional period.

“Future research on viral evolution under climate change is especially important, as we know these viruses are evolving, but that is not currently reflected in the future projections,” he added.

Improving vector-borne disease prediction

WNV has infected more than 50,000 people and caused more than 2,200 deaths in the last 20 years across

the United States. While numbers fluctuate annually, a CDC report found that diseases caused by tick, mosquito and flea bites more than tripled in the U.S. between 2004 and 2016.

The University at Albany partnered with the NYSDOH Wadsworth Center to form the CCEID working group in 2015. Together, the group has collaborated to better understand how environmental factors increase or decrease human health risk from vector-borne diseases. The group also joined seven other universities, and other state departments, in 2017, to create a \$10 million Northeast Regional Center for Excellence in Vector-Borne Diseases hosted at Cornell University.

The group created a “Random Forest” statistical model

that uses a series of climate-related variables along with other relevant factors, such as a region’s human population, mosquito abundance and presence of wastewater treatment plants, to provide seasonal forecasts for WNV and pinpoint locations with increased risk for the disease.

This latest study adds to their previous findings that indicated low soil moisture and/or warm summer nights are associated with increased WNV numbers. Most human cases of the virus are contracted during the months of July to September.

Other co-authors included Ajay Raghavendra, a recent graduate of the University at Albany’s doctoral program in Atmospheric Sciences and Meteorology, and Alexander Ciota of the NYSDOH Wadsworth Center and the University at Albany’s School of Public Health.

Farm Aid 2021 Unites Musicians, Farmers and Fans in Hartford

HARTFORD, Conn. — Early in the morning on Saturday, I woke up excited like it was Christmas. The summer event I had waited for was finally happening, even though it was after the fall equinox. Farm Aid was here, and I was ready. As a granddaughter of farmers who loves music, this event seemed made for me. The pre-event media information sheets suggested an offering of my favorite music, farm to table eats, and possibly

farm animals in the education tent. For me, this would be bliss. It was hard to wait for Jim to wake up so we could make the two hour trek.

Even in year thirty-six, Farm Aid continues to showcase new and beloved artists in the name of land conservation and local farms. The annual event was held this year in Hartford, Connecticut, and drew crowds from across the country to hear Dave Matthews & Tim Reynolds, John Mellencamp, and of course Willie Nelson while also offering exposure to Lukas Nelson and the Promise of the Real, Tyler Childers, and Margo Price, among others.

If it isn't already clear, Farm Aid is a different

festival in many ways. The founders Bob Dylan, Neil Young, John Mellencamp and Willie Nelson set out to create a festival that not only helped farmers, but raised awareness about how local farmers worked to not only feed our country, but preserve the land in their care. The theme of Farm Aid was stated and restated repeatedly throughout the day both in videos that aired during the brief set changes and also by the artists themselves.

As the sun was crossing the cerulean blue sky, Jamey Johnson then took the stage with a more traditional country sound. His love songs were forlorn and perfectly matched by his guitar playing. He apologized for it not being "too good," which was met with laughter from the crowd at his humility. Johnson's gray bush of a beard covered his face, but his heartbreak was audible in his lyrics as he sang about being left by his lover, and changes over time that have left new generations without the peace that previous ones enjoyed.

Johnson provided the first real country sound of the day, and he was rewarded with cheers from a happy crowd that was growing anxious for some twangy favorites.

The crowd wouldn't have to wait long for more. The next band up, Lukas Nelson and The Promise of the Real, rocked across the stage as they opened with "I Ain't Gonna Die Alone," a release from their newest album "A Few Stars Apart." Nelson worked with the band to write and record this album during the pandemic when he was quarantined with his father, Willie Nelson, brother Micah and mother Annie. Song after song proved the quarantine was good for Nelson's writing. The band's tight sound wrapped around the more mature lyrics of this album, revealing some fun tonal shifts and intensely deep emotions.

Full disclosure: I could write a whole review just on this set alone. Lukas Nelson and The Promise of the Real performed two years ago at SPAC, and while

they caught my ear then, at Farm Aid their growth as a major sound in the country scene could not be ignored. Nelson is a talented guitar player whose lyrics could break the coldest heart. With "Set Me Down on a Cloud," Nelson sang convincingly of a heart broken at the loss of his love. Paired with an aching guitar melody, Nelson clearly gets heartbreak.

Nelson and The Promise of the Real bounced back from such a pensive piece with "Carolina," and it was in that moment the truth emerged: this band has matured both in its compositions and performances of their work. Nelson is a sexy frontman, singing words like "I'll give you lovin' under entirely different stars" with a confidence that the 32-year-old wears well. "Wanna Take a Ride" was the band's last song in their full set, a set well received by the crowd. They provided the stand-out performance of the day.

But the sun kept moving across the sky, and Bettye Lavette's bluesy sound

bubbled out of her tiny spry body as she took the stage next to sing old and new songs about love, luck, and fairness. Her rendition of McCartney's "Blackbird" was a poignant moment where she acknowledged the pain of being a black woman in America. "He wrote that song, and it was for me," she nodded.

At this point in the day, the air was chilling as the sun was nearing the horizon and Nathaniel Rateliffe took the stage with his band The Night Sweats. The addition of the horns in the first song signaled to the audience that this rock-a-billy band was equal parts rock and country. Rateliffe moseyed on the stage with his mouth harp and recognizable voice, crooning out "Shoe Boot." The crowd went bananas, dancing and singing along as the wall of sound produced by the full band vibrated every cell in the place. Even my tiring eyes were shook awake as this group's high energy pushed through one fast

paced song after another.

Lukas Nelson joined the band for a cover of The Band's "The Shape I'm In," and it was clear these younger artists' admiration of earlier performers bore some weight in the present work. After Nelson left the stage, Rateliff and The Night Sweats finished off their full set with "Love Don't."

Next up was scheduled to be Sturgill Simpson, but his lost voice opened up an opportunity for Tyler Childers to do us all a favor and join Farm Aid. He started with a cover of Hank Williams's "The Old Country Church" that brought fans to their feet. His original song "Hounds to Heaven" followed, and he had me hooked with his flat affect and fun sense of humor. Even as he told jokes, Childers was the straight man.

Backed by good ole boys who looked like they were just as ready to go fishing as they were to play instruments, Childers's

earnest appearance was quickly defied by his rich and detailed lyrics. "Country Squire" made me want to move south and develop the land. His twangy voice in "Creeker" paired with the details of living in a small town grew empathy in me for wanting to run away from such a dream suggested in the song. Thoughtful, deep, and musically talented, Childers' voice covered Kenny Loggin's "Tulsa Turnaround" in a way that made my heart weep. He followed it up with his original song "House Fire," and he proved himself able to get the crowd up and moving after dark.

At this point in the festival, it seemed nothing else could possibly impress me. But I was wrong. The talented Margo Price took the stage, and while I recently reviewed her at Outlaw Fest as flat and somewhat disinterested, tonight would prove Price not only has passion but elation in her performances. Price played many of the

same songs, but they came off totally different than they had at SPAC.

Price was happy. Newly elected to the Farm Aid board of directors, Price seemed energized and ready to rock. Her rockabilly vibe combined with her clear vocals in "Tennessee Song" captured me. When joined by Lukas and Micah Nelson to cover Neil

Young's "Homegrown," her smile was contagious. And then her cover of "You Don't Own Me" revealed it: she was empowered.

Price's original song "A Little Pain" has quickly become my favorite of the night. Starting with a manic pace, and then slowing in the mid-section with a sexy guitar, only to return to the earlier tempo, Price's talent owned the

stage. She ended her set throwing roses to her fans, smiling and waving as a true queen should.

Dave Matthews was up next with guitarist Tim Reynolds, and the stage was set simply for them. The two men entered and sat, blanketed in blue light, as the crowd's energy intensified. Matthews was who many came to see, and even after our recent show in Saratoga, I must admit I was longing for more Dave.

This was a totally different setting, sound and performance than the one at SPAC a week prior. It was truly a showcase of Reynolds's mind blowing guitar skills. Opening with "Bartender," Matthews' vocals were as impressive as always. Reynolds can make sounds come from a guitar that just doesn't seem possible, going high in pitch and teasing the strings to create hypnotizing solos.

Matthews made his jokes as always, charming the crowd when he explained his shame that he is not trusted by his technician to plug in his own guitar. With "Save Me," Matthews pulled back from his microphone

to sing, creating a sound like he had backup singers, while still coming forward with the main lyrics. It was mesmerizing, the combination of his vocals with Reynolds's slide guitar and strumming. At times it could be described as jazz, while at other times sounding like Spanish guitar, the music was familiar and unique all at the same time.

The duo finished with "Ants Marching," their sixth song of the night. It was strange, really, to have such a short set from such a prolific artist. I was comforted by the fact that I would surely see Dave again next summer, but still a little sad when he left the stage.

I wouldn't stay sad for long, as Mr. John Mellencamp would shortly follow and completely distract me with his unconventional behaviors. Mellencamp was a favorite of mine when I was younger, and when he entered the stage I was shocked at how much he still looked like a rock star.
