DWI arrest

FEURA BUSH — On Friday, Feb. 18 State Police responded to Brownrigg Road to investigate a report of a suspicious vehicle parked in the roadway.

Upon arrival, the officer found a vehicle stuck in a snow bank and Eric Oddy, 31, of Selkirk, asleep in the driver's seat.

The trooper woke him up and noticed the smell of an alcoholic beverage emanating from his breath and other signs of intoxication.

Oddy allegedly refused roadside sobriety tests and was taken into custody. Police stated he later refused to submit to a chemical test to determine alcohol content in his blood. He was charged with misdemeanor DWI and released.

He is due back to New Scotland Town Court on March 31.

Felony burglary

DELMAR — Bethlehem police responded to a Delmar home on Sunday, Feb. 27, after a woman called 911 to report an unknown male inside her house.

When officers arrived, the victim was screaming "get him out of my house," referring to a 23-year-old man sitting on her

stairway.

According to reports, the victim was upstairs with her children waiting for a contractor who was scheduled to remove snow from her property when she heard a knock on the front door.

She assumed it was the snow removal crew and opened the door to find Ryan O'Keefe, of Delmar, standing on the porch. In a statement, she said she felt something was wrong and attempted to shut the door, but O'Keefe allegedly put his foot in the door, pushed the door open and forced his way into the residence.

Once inside he was demanding to look for "Sarah," but there was no person with that name at the home. The victim tried to physically force O'Keefe out of the residence, but was unable to do so. She was able to call 911. O'Keefe saw this, sat down on the stairs and waited for police to arrive.

When police interviewed O'Keefe, said he lived at the house and was looking for a woman. He also claimed to be a probation officer and a police officer among other things. All of those claims were not true.

The officers reported that O'Keefe was very incoherent and in an unstable mental state. He

also requested that officers search the residence for "Sarah."

O'Keefe was taken into custody and transported to the police station where he was uncooperative during processing. Officers were not able to obtain his fingerprints.

He was charged with felony burglary, misdemeanor acting in a manner that may injure a child, and a harassment violation.

O'Keefe was arraigned by Bethlehem Town Judge Andrew Kirby and sent to the Albany County jail without bail pending further court action.

Serial gas thief

DELMAR — An Albany man was arrested for stealing gas from one local station six times in seven weeks after an investigation by Bethlehem police.

Elijah Cruz, 20, of Albany, allegedly drove his 2011 BMW 328i to the Stewart's Shops at 309 Delaware Ave. on Saturday, Dec. 18, filled up with \$50.93 of super unleaded gasoline and drove off. He allegedly repeated the crime again five more times in January. Each time he used the same pump and used the pay inside option.

He was charged with multiple counts of petit larceny.

The Russia-Ukraine Crisis: 5 Questions with global expert Nadieszda Kizenko

ALBANY — As an expert in Russian and Ukrainian history and culture, Nadieszda “Nadia” Kizenko was called on to speak about the buildup the current war in Ukraine before Rockefeller College students at the University at Albany on Feb. 23.

A professor and former chair of History and current director of the Religious Studies Program, Kizenko teaches Russian and East European history with a focus on religious and cultural history. Her second book, *Good for the Souls: A History of Confession in the Russian Empire*, was published by Oxford University Press in 2021.

Kizenko’s father was born and grew up in Eastern Ukraine, his mother speaking Russian, his father Ukrainian. Her mother’s parents were from Belarus. (Russia, Ukraine and Belarus began as a 9th century federation, named Rus.)

Both of her parents’ families suffered mightily under the Soviet Union. Kizenko’s mother was born while her parents were doing forced labor in the GULag mines of Yakutia, “part of Stalin’s all-out assault on the peasantry,” she said. Her father’s family went through the 1932-33 Holodomor, a Stalin-induced terror-famine that killed millions of Ukrainians and others



in the USSR’s grain-producing areas.

Both sets of grandparents fled the Soviet Union during World War II and eventually came to America. Nadieszda grew up in the Northeast. The dominant culture in her home was Orthodox Christian (her father was a priest), not Ukrainian, Russian or Belarusian. Both parents spoke only Russian to her and she started kindergarten not knowing a “single word” of English.

Q. You said, “What I find incredibly interesting is that what Russia has done is make Ukraine much more united.” Would Ukrainian resistance have been so fierce if Russia had only seized the eastern Ukraine oblasts bordering Donetsk and Luhansk, as originally seemed likely?

Putin’s formally recognizing control on the 21st may not have been that significant in itself, but it was significant as a red flag, and people were correct to see it as such. But people — both in Ukraine and outside of it — had kind of tacitly written off the separatist regions (regardless of what they said publicly), and might even (less likely, but possibly) have written off the rest of the oblasts. The reaction, however, was completely different when Russian troops went outside those areas and went into Kharkiv and Sumy oblasts. Those had never been part of the conversation, so to the people who lived there (where my dad’s family is from and where I have several good friends) and to people in the rest of Ukraine, it was a shock.

DEC: Save Hudson River American Shad

Plan highlights restoration progress, remaining challenges for ecologically important species

ALBANY — The New York State Department of Environmental Conservation released the draft Recovery Plan for Hudson River American shad (PDF) for public comment last week and is open to public comment until May 2.

American Shad is an economically and ecologically important migratory fish species that once supported a robust fishery in the Hudson River. Decades of intense fishing pressure coupled with years of low reproduction and non-fishing-related mortality events have further impacted the stock's resilience and exacerbated declines.

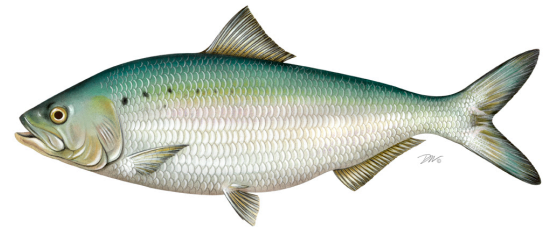
"American Shad is an iconic Hudson River species and I'm proud of DEC's efforts to restore their population," DEC Commissioner Basil Seggos said. "Today's release of DEC's draft Recovery Plan for Hudson River American Shad highlights actions taken to date and outlines a transparent and science-based roadmap to reopening fisheries as the population recovers."

Native and colonial Americans fished for shad for sustenance often smoking the flesh and consuming the roe as a delicacy. American shad continued to be an important recreational and commercial fishery throughout the 20th Century. However, Hudson stock declined, and as a result, all recreational and commercial fisheries for American shad were closed in 2010.

Highlights of the draft recovery plan include; annual monitoring to support an up-to-date understanding of Hudson

River American shad stock status; short- and long-term recovery goals and benchmarks; and fishery reopening thresholds that would prompt the development of a Sustainable Fishery Management Plan.

Since 2010, DEC, federal, and local partners have taken measures to

address the Hudson River American Shad stock including:

- Development of Delaware Basin American Shad Sustainable Fishing Plans in 2016 and 2022;

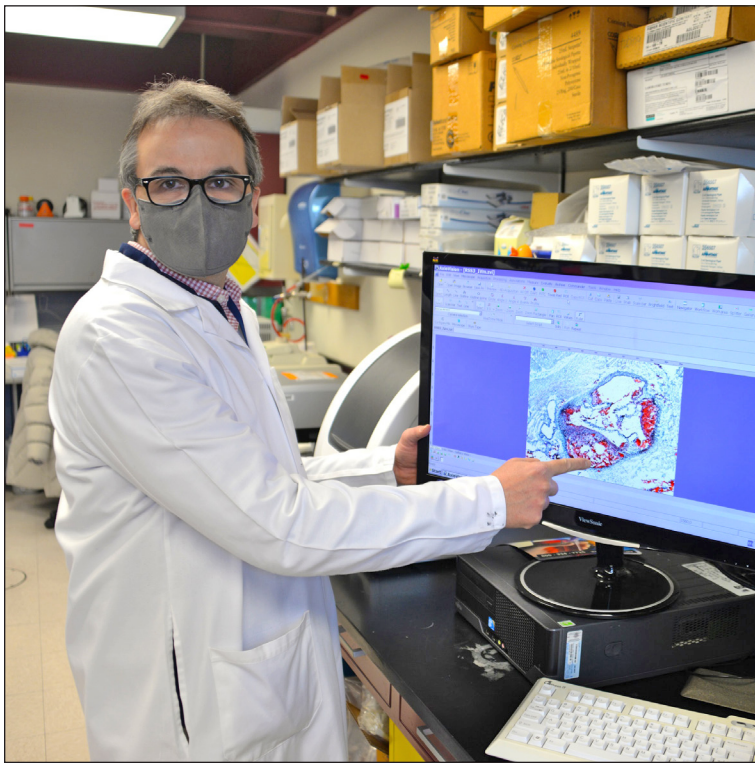
- Initiation of a shad bycatch monitoring project with Cornell University; and

- Reduction of shad mortality at Hudson River water intakes through plant closures and intake improvements.

\$3.2M NIH grant supports Albany Med research on circadian disruption

ALBANY — Albany Medical College scientists are among a multi-institution research team to receive \$3.2 million from the National Institutes of Health (NIH) to study why disruptions in circadian rhythms increase the risk of diabetes and heart disease.

“Millions of essential workers who work night shifts are impacted by circadian disruption, but there are no proven therapies that prevent or lessen its harmful effects,” said Antonio Paul, Ph.D., associate professor in the Department of Molecular and Cellular Physiology at Albany Medical College, one of three scientists leading the study.

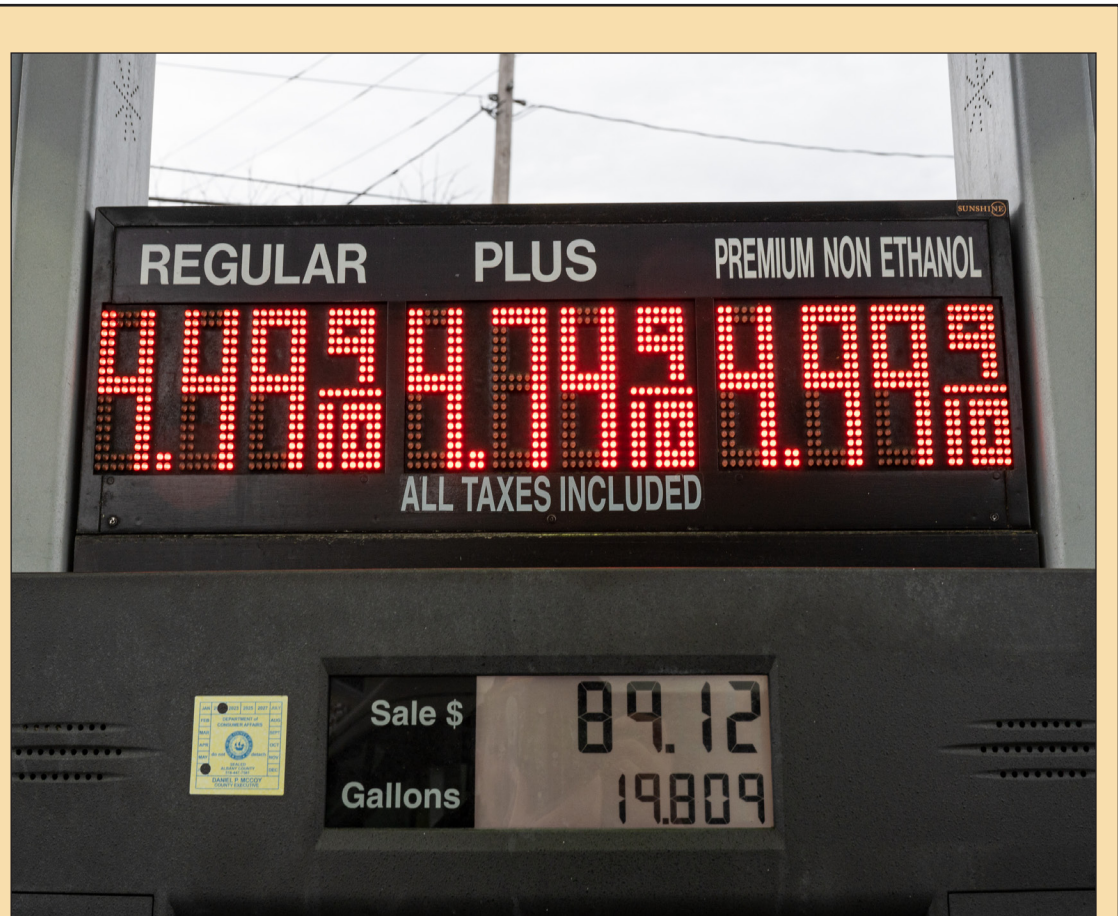
Circadian disruption occurs when the wake and sleep cycles don't align with the time of day, for example when people who work night shifts sleep during the day. While this is known to increase the risk of type 2 diabetes and rates of cardiovascular disease, the reasons why aren't understood.

Drawing on their complementary areas of expertise, the researchers will seek to gain insight into the underlying mechanisms of circadian disruption on diabetes and atherosclerosis, a build-up in the arteries that restricts blood flow and can lead to a stroke or heart attack. Then, using mouse models, the team will test various types of interventions, including modulating light-dark patterns, medications and genetic therapies.

“Our hope is that this research will lead to the development of effective pharmacological and/or environmental therapies,” added Dr. Paul.

The five-year grant was awarded by the NIH's National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases jointly to Dr. Paul and to researchers at the University of Pittsburgh and Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai in New York City.

Price of gas jumps

Average cost at the pump is \$4.24, and climbing

ALBANY — The average price of a gallon of regular in the Capital District jumped by 43 cents over the past week to \$4.24 per gallon, according to a survey of 546 stations by Gas Buddy.

That is 61.1 cents per gallon higher than a month ago and \$1.43 higher than a year ago.

Nationally, the average price of a gallon of regular jumped 41 cents over seven days and surpassed \$4 a gallon late last week for the first time since 2008. As of Sunday, March 6, the average cost of a gallon was just 10 cents lower than the all-time high of \$4.103 per gallon.

“This is a milestone that was hard to imagine happening so quickly, but with bipartisan support of severe sanctions on Russia, is not exactly surprising — it is the cost of choking off Russia from energy revenue,” said Patrick De Haan, head of petroleum analysis for GasBuddy. “As Russia's war on Ukraine continues to evolve and we head into a season where gas prices typically increase, Americans should prepare to pay more for gas than they ever have before.”

The global uncertainty is in addition to seasonal factors — including an increased demand for gas, refinery maintenance and the switch to summer blend gas — that add to the price of gasoline each year.

Some notable dates and numbers, according to GasBuddy:

“There are few words to describe the unprecedented rise in gasoline prices over the last week, with massive spikes coast to coast in both gasoline and diesel prices, as oil prices jump to their highest since 2008,” De Haan said. “Forget the \$4 per gallon mark, the nation will soon set new all-time record highs and we could push closer to a national average of \$4.50 per gallon. California could be heading for \$5.50 per gallon with more stations charging \$6 and beyond.”

Verizon 5G Ultra-Wideband to enable smart drones to navigate weather

NEW YORK — Engineers are exploring how Verizon 5G Ultra-Wideband, mobile edge compute and artificial

intelligence can help drones detect, interpret and respond to changing weather conditions in real-time.

Verizon deployed its 5G Ultra Wideband network and edge compute platform at the Caltech Center for Autonomous Systems and Technologies in Pasadena, California.

Researchers are currently

testing how the low latency, high speeds and massive capacity of 5G and edge compute can be used to offload the heavy computing hardware that AI usually requires from a drone to the edge of the network, allowing for near real-time interpretation of weather data and near-instantaneous in-flight adjustments.

To recreate the ever-shifting environmental conditions that drones face in the real world, the lab features a three-story-tall aerodrome with more than 2,500 tiny computer-controlled fans that allow engineers to simulate everything from a light gust to a gale. It can also be tilted 90 degrees to simulate vertical take-offs and landings. The custom

fan wall, designed and built by Caltech graduate students, was also used as the blueprint for building the fan wall that tested the Mars Ingenuity helicopter at JPL, which Caltech manages for NASA. Verizon is providing funding for the one-year drone research project, as well as, several 5G devices and consultation on 5G technology.

From page 1 ... Bus eligibility

The district first proposed changes to school bus eligibility last November as the district attempted to address driver shortages. The changes, if passed, would eliminate four to five bus routes and reduce the need for as many drivers. Middle school and high school students losing eligibility will increase by a half mile, one mile and a mile and a half respectively.

"It's not something anyone wants to do," Board Member Meredith Moriarty said on March 2. "We are in a [transportation] crisis and this is one of the few solutions we have to the problem."

All Bethlehem Central elementary students are currently eligible for bus transportation. However, with the new proposed changes students living within three quarters of a mile from any of the five schools will lose eligibility. These proposed expanded walk zones are in line with New York State's eligibility thresholds for bus transportation.

The board is still open to taking public comment on the proposed changes. On March 16, the board will vote on whether to present the changes to the public and it will be put to public vote on May 17. If the community does not vote to pass the eligibility changes, bus routes will still be consolidated that will increase bus rides to up to an hour or more.

Complaints from community members include parents having to

choose between their jobs or getting their children to school, inclement weather that would impact students' travel, the lack of sidewalks in a lot of the walk zones and most importantly the safety of students walking to and from school.

"This includes during inclement weather such as rain or thunderstorms; snow and icy conditions; and temperatures that drop well below freezing for extended periods of time," Anna Walker, a Hamagrael Elementary parent told the board on Feb. 16. "None of the roads my children would take have sidewalks. Let me repeat that statement, none of the roads my children would have to take currently have sidewalks."

Parents are concerned about the history of pedestrian injuries and car accidents that have occurred along the routes their students will take. On Aug. 23, 2021 a woman was hit with the side-view mirror of a truck while jogging on Kenwood Avenue across from Bethlehem Central Middle School. Where this incident occurred, is on the walk that many middle schoolers would have to take with the approval of the proposed walk zone.

"Pedestrian safety [on Kenwood Avenue] remains a serious concern," Brian Sweeney, a Bethlehem resident and parent of two district students, said last Wednesday. "Many of us fear it may only be a matter of time before a child in our community is injured or worse."

School districts across the country have advertised like this to attract would-be bus drivers. Bethlehem Central recently raised its salaries for added incentive.

Bethlehem Central School District

The eligibility proposal does not address any additional crossing guards stationed in the expanded areas. Crossing guards are not addressed in the proposal because there are shortages similar to the driver shortages the district is already impacted by. This factor in combination with others make parents, like Sweeney, even more opposed to the proposition.

With the change in eligibility, some parents may be forced to pay for after school programs to ensure the safety of their children. The Bethlehem YMCA charges \$305 per child for their after school program, leaving some families to pay an upwards of \$900. If cost isn't the issue, another is that many of the local programs are close to capacity.

"Don't make working families choose between budgeting an additional \$900 for after school care each month to keep their kids off the roads or paying another critical bill," Walker said on March 2.

The board will vote on whether to pass the eligibility proposal on Wednesday, March 16. If the changes and proposal are approved, the public vote on eligibility will take place on Tuesday, May 17.

Changes to eligibility will go into effect in September if they are approved by the community.

From page 3 ... What is happening?

Q. How much of Ukrainians' animus to Russia goes back to its seizure of the Crimea in 2014?

Not so much the Crimea annexation specifically as the general post-Orange Revolution [2004-05, in which Ukrainians protested what many believed was a fixed presidential run-off election] and post-Maidan revolution [2014, in which Russian-backed President Viktor Yanukovich was ousted from office, resulting in Russian military intervention]. But, really, it's because Russia has now invaded peaceful cities who had never shown any desire to be anything other than Ukrainian.

Q. How much did Putin misjudge Ukrainians' desire to be separate from and independent of Russia? What might that say about his mental state?

He 100% misjudged. There is a big difference between general, amorphous cultural affinity and a desire to actually be

under the same political umbrella. Yes, there were many people in Ukraine who before Feb. 21 were fed up with their country's leadership, corruption, etc. But once the attack/invasion began, that was it. Now they have become total patriots.

I do not think Putin is entirely rational. The real problem is that he does not seem the sort of person who backs down even when it's clear that he has blundered, but who doubles down. Unfortunately. Tragically.

Q. You said that "Putin frittered away any sense of the two countries working together." Would Ukrainians still embrace peaceful co-existence and trade with a post-Putin Russia?

Like any normal people, Ukrainians (and most Russians) wanted peaceful coexistence. However, after the Russian invasion, it is hard to imagine that Ukrainians would think this fully possible without a full Russian disavowal and

reparation. It is also hard to imagine that Ukrainians would not be gun-shy for years to come.

Q. Have you ever held out hopes of one day visiting a united Rus — Russia, Belarus and Ukraine, with open borders and shared cultures?

You know, I first visited those countries when I was a child and when they were one umbrella—that of the USSR. Since then, to someone who was for most of her life a fan of all three countries, and who has taught the histories of all three countries, it has been very instructive to see the different directions all three have gone since 1991. The distinct identities they had before have grown even stronger. Of the three, Ukraine has the strongest democratic traditions, and has shown itself most likely to fight for democracy. You can only genuinely want something in a relationship of free equals.

Heating assistance programs available

UPSTATE NEW YORK — National Grid is reminding customers there is still time to take advantage of energy programs that can help them pay and manage their winter energy bills.

One-time, Regular Arrears Supplements are limited-availability grants available to HEAP-eligible customers and are expected to be available through September. These grants cover accumulated past-due utility payments up to \$10,000. Qualification for the Regular Arrears Supplement is based on household size and income, and customers must have past-due utility payments. To apply, contact your HEAP Local District Contact. Customers 60

years of age can apply through their county's Office for the Aging.

Emergency HEAP is scheduled to run through March 15. Qualification is based on household size and income. To apply, customers must be disconnected, disconnect-eligible or have a utility shut-off notice. National Grid customers requiring electricity to operate heating systems can apply for a Domestic Electric Emergency HEAP grant.

Customers must apply by telephone or in person through your HEAP Local District Contact. Customers 60 or older can apply through their county's Office for the Aging.

Customers who receive HEAP funding are automatically enrolled in National Grid's Energy Affordability Program. This program provides monthly bill credits above and beyond what the customer receives from HEAP. SARATOGA SPRINGS — Talisk's Mohsen Amini plays the concertina like a mad man with the Devil in his hands.

The sound of the squeezebox that otherwise conjures visions of tranquil streetside cafes in Paris is anything but calming while in his hands. He damn near wrestles with the thing. 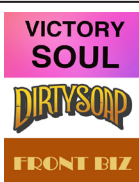

A toast at the movies

Schenectady's Movieland 6 first theater covered by new guidance set by State Liquor Authority

SCHENECTADY – Bow Tie Cinemas announced that Movieland 6 in Schenectady is the first movie theater in New York State to serve beer, wine, and cider under the State Liquor Authority's new guidelines as declared earlier this year.

The new guidance, the result of a declaratory ruling made by the SLA, allows for movie theaters to serve beer, wine, and cider to theatergoers without having to have a table at every seat. Previously, theaters were restricted to consumption inside a café area adjoining the lobby or if the theater had a full restaurant kitchen, theater staff were only

permitted to bring beverages to a patron at their seat with a fixed table.

"This has been years in the making and we couldn't be more proud that Movieland is the first theater in New York State to be covered by this new guidance by the SLA," said Joe Masher, chief operating officer of Bow Tie Cinemas. "Thanks to Governor Hochul and our longtime legislative champions, Senator Diane Savino and Assemblymember Patricia Fahy, for making this possible this year. Bow Tie Cinemas has an excellent track record of responsible serving of alcoholic beverages, in addition to working with local craft beverage producers such as Druthers Brewing and Nine Pin Cider."

Through this new regulation, movie theaters – which have been longtime anchors for

many Upstate downtowns or commercial corridors – will be able to directly support local craft beverage producers within their communities.

Talisk

“We’ve had one show and 14 disasters,” Amini said, joking the morning following their first stop in Valdez, Alaska. “I like those odds, but it’s been great. It’s been great. ... They’re all selling out and we’re having a brilliant time.”

Talisk is classified as a traditional Scottish folk band, but for Americans, that kind of moniker can be misleading. Whereas the folk label may lead prospective audiences to assume storytelling with musicians playing acoustically from inside a round, Amini, Armstrong on guitar and Morris are together something of a different animal.

First, there is no storytelling.

Second, you’ll be dancing in some way or fashion before the night is through.

The band has ranked highly amongst the most in-demand folk-based groups since it was formed in 2014. Following its critically acclaimed debut,

“Abyss,” Talisk’s sophomore album, “Beyond,” quickly amassed five-star reviews and rose to No.1 in the iTunes world music charts despite a late release in 2018. Since then, the Glasgow trio has stacked major awards for exhibiting an explosively energetic sound. Accolades include Folk Band of the Year at the BBC Alba Scots Trad Music Awards, a BBC Radio 2 Folk Award, and the Belhaven Bursary for Innovation.

Morris, a recipient of the BBC Radio Scotland Young Traditional Musician of the Year, joined the band after founding member Hayley Keenan left the band last September.

“Coming into the band it’s really important that the sound of the band start’s sounding the same,” Morris said. As he continued, he struggled to find the right word on what was next important. (Amini provided a helping hand and said, “[adding] his own flare.”) “Everything fell into place so well, it’s been great so



far.”

Morris came in towards the end of the band’s new album. He came in after they had filmed the band’s first video “Aura,” which still features Keenan on fiddle. Nonetheless, the clip features the band in a spacious studio supporting an up-tempo track that’s an instant toe-tapper. Each seated in line with Amini clad in a black leather jacket and ripped jeans. Everything from their sound to their appearance places Celtic folk firmly in

the 21st century.

The concertina is no stranger to traditional Celtic music, whether from Scotland or Ireland. It originated simultaneously in England and Germany more than a century ago. Amini was introduced to it when he was 10. He told the Henley Standard how he and his sister were attending Irish step dancing classes when a group of musicians. The group shared it with him and he learned enough to play a tune.

“Nobody wanted it, and they just gave me it,” he said, calling it the black sheep of the family. They gifted it to him, and he’s been with one ever since. In 2018, while playing between three bands, he was named Musician of the Year at the annual BBC Radio 2 Folk Awards. “I was stuck with it for ages. But I fell in love with it. I absolutely adore it.”

Amini’s setup has his concertina tethered to various effect boxes by two lavalier microphones used

more often with concert pianos. The effect boxes at his feet are what you’d see any guitarist using at a club, including a sampler and synth box to manipulate the octaves. With the right combinations of buttons, he can have his handheld instrument sounding like a church pipe organ.

Armstrong has bounced back and forth but has been with the band through most of its years. He admits to having every guitarist dream, playing guitar for a rock and roll band. His first mention was The Beatles.

“It hasn’t always been my jam,” he said. “But for the majority of my life, it’s been my thing. But I still play all the classics. I have a strat at home and I love playing it.” His electric guitar is featured often on this album. Some of the tracks even sound like something you’d hear at Webster Hall in New York City’s East Village. Give the album’s last track “Dystopia, Pt. 2” a listen and hear for yourself.

“Trad music’s been my thing forever,” Armstrong said. “But there’s still the rock star in me, waiting to come out.”

Hue & Cry: French Printmaking and the Debate Over Colors - Brightly colored prints and posters are synonymous with Paris in the 1890s—a period known as the Belle Époque (beautiful age). Yet their extraordinary popular appeal both then and now masks the fact that, for a very long time, color in print was an outlier phenomenon. Not only was printed color difficult and expensive to achieve, it was also frowned upon as a matter of taste. 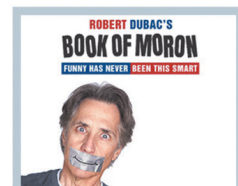

CONCERT REVIEW

Cowboy Junkies at The Egg

ALBANY — Margo Timmins casually walked onto the stage looking down as if she were in a field searching for four-leaf clovers. She casually addressed the microphone. Was it superfluous to her performance? She began speaking almost as if she were talking to herself, but as she got closer to the microphone, she clicked into performance mode. Her two brothers, Michael sitting perched over his guitar and Peter on drums, locked into her voice. Alan Anton, Michael's friend since kindergarten in 1959, stood stark still supplying the bass line.

Live, the Cowboy Junkies take their fans into trance mode, but their performance Sunday night at the Swyer Theater at The Egg was more organic and more solidly grounded than their recordings. Unlike a band such as the Moody

Blues who take their three-dimensional spacy songs into a high-tech virtual journey that escapes gravity, The Junkies relied heavily on Margo's vocals and solid musicianship to accomplish liftoff.

Michael's electric guitar made almost constant use of a foot pedal. Alan's bass was basic and Peter's drumming was at times perfunctory. It was Jeff Bird who was the salt on the steak. Not officially a member of the band and never appearing in group photos, he played lap steel guitar, mandolin, harmonica, and even background vocal enhancements to a couple of Margo's vocals.

In an advance interview, Michael admitted that the band through almost four decades has taken songs by other artists and made them their own. They closed the night with Patsy Cline's "After Midnight" which is Shelly's and my song. I wouldn't have recognized it were it not for the title repeated in the vocals. They likewise

"covered" "Dreaming My Dreams with You" from their breakout 1988 album Trinity Sessions. It was the best song of the first set highlighted by Jeff Bird's ethereal mandolin. It's an Allen Reynolds song and the title number of a 1975 Waylon Jennings album, but it certainly didn't sound like outlaw country in this redo. These two songs were so evolved that if the band had claimed writing credits, Waylon and Patsy's descendants might have trouble proving in court that the songs weren't Junkie originals.

On the other hand, The Rolling Stones' "No Expectations" from the Cowboy Junkie's brand-new Songs of The Recollection album and "Sweet Jane" by Lou Reed from his Velvet Underground late '60s period captured the tone, mood, and implied danger of both Mick and Lou. "Sweet Jane" was the single from the Trinity Sessions album that caught the ear of alt-rock fans in the '80s.

Margo is the undisputed centerpiece of the band.

Nippertown writer Mike Stampalia said that "at 21 years old [she] has been demonstrating her talent and precociousness for over night eras on the national stage."
