Bye bye, bridge

The dispute holding up plans to replace a troubled bridge has been settled

ALBANY — County Legislators agreed to pay the impending costs for moving fiber optic lines that run the length of the former railroad bridge it plans to replace over New Scotland Road in Slingerlands.

Legislators voted unanimously to approve the agreement on Monday, Aug. 8, committing the County to pay up to \$250,000 to have Sprint Communications Company move the lines that now run underneath the Albany County Helderberg-Hudson Rail Trail as it spans across the road.

Charges filed in fatal Sunday night crash

Police: Hannacroix man DWAI, no license in South Bethlehem crash that killed one

SO. BETHLEHEM

— A crash near the intersection of Route 396 and Star Road on Sunday, Aug 14 claimed one life and landed another in jail for DWAI.

Albany County Sheriff's Deputies responded to the head-on, two-vehicle crash. One operator, Samuel Keir, 52, of Hannacroix, was found to be unlicensed and impaired by drugs and alcohol. The driver of the second vehicle died at the scene. The name is being withheld at this time until notification of next of kin.

According to police, Keir had his driving privileges revoked due to previous DWI-related incidents. He was charged

with aggravated unlicensed operation, a felony, DWAI-combination of drugs and alcohol, a misdemeanor and other traffic violations.

Keir was processed, given appearance tickets and released. He is scheduled to appear in Bethlehem Town Court on Tuesday, Sept 20.

Slingerlands man charged in May crash

SLINGERLANDS

 A 58-year-old man was arraigned in New Scotland Town Court on July 28 for charges stemming from an accident on New Scotland Road May 9.

Brian Devane, 58, of Slingerlands, the sole occupant of the vehicle, was injured in the crash and transported to Albany Medical Center Hospital. Devane was not arrested until he turned himself in on July 8 at the Albany County Sheriff's Office in Clarksville.

According to recently obtained reports, Devane was traveling on New Scotland Road at a high rate of speed and struck a mailbox and garbage cans before the car left the roadway and overturned.

First responders found him trapped in the vehicle, but Devane allegedly became uncooperative and began to punch and kick the Emergency personnel and sheriff deputies when they attempted to extricate him.

While at the hospital, a blood draw was done and sent to the lab for analysis. Toxicology reports later returned a 0.346 percent BAC, according to police.

He was charged with aggravated DWI and reckless driving, both

misdemeanors and moving from a lane unsafely, leaving the scene of a property damage accident, excessive speed and drinking alcohol in a motor vehicle, all violations. Devane is a local attorney whose law office advertises it represents those charged with DWI and other traffic violations.

The driver, Stephanie

Newell said she was driving home from her job in Schenectady when her vehicle's brakes failed. The officers observed an odor of an alcoholic beverage emanating from her breath and she had glassy, watery eyes. When asked for photo identification, Newell provided a AAA card.

She was given and failed field sobriety tests, refused to submit to a pre-screening test for breath alcohol and was taken into custody.

At the police station, Newell provided a breath sample that returned a 0.25 percent BAC. An investigation determined she had a prior DWI conviction within 10 years.

She was charged with felony DWI and unsafe lane change, failure to keep right, failure to obey a traffic device, driving left around a traffic island and refusal to take a breath test,

Voters approve sale of two BOCES buildings

ALBANY COUNTY — Capital District voters approved a proposition to sell two Capital Region BOCES buildings on Tuesday, Aug. 9.

The choice to sell the two buildings that have housed the education program's Career & Technical Education and Special Education programs was overwhelming, 874 to 53.

The buildings slated for sale are the former Career & Technical Education, Albany Campus located at 1015 Watervliet-Shaker Road in Albany and Maywood School located at 1979 Central Ave in Albany.

The Career & Technical Education Center, Albany Campus and Maywood Academy will now be located in new, state-of-the-art facilities at 925 Watervliet-Shaker Road in Albany. Their former buildings will no longer be used.

According to an online statement released by BOCES, there is no tax impact from selling the two sites currently under Capital Region BOCES ownership.

Work on the new Career & Technical Education Center and Special Education school began in early 2021. Both schools are complete and opening for learning in September 2022.



The bridge, a 100-yearold relic from the Delaware and Hudson Railroad, has been slated for replacement but litigation has precluded those plans from moving forward.

According to the agreement, Sprint will first suspend the communication lines onto utility poles this fall, allowing the County to proceed with bridge construction next spring. Once the new bridge is constructed, the communications company will secure the fiber optic lines to the outside of the new span.

The terms of the agreement expire at the end of next year, at which time the \$1.9 million bridge should be complete. According to a letter from County Commissioner of Public Works Lisa Ramundo, the relocation costs will be paid with bond money already tied to the bridge construction.

Over the years, the current bridge has weathered the abuse of time and modern-day traffic. Knarled support beams reveal the scars from misguided commercial trucks ignoring signs indicating the span's height of 11 feet, 2 inches. Crumbling cement has led

the County to close both sidewalks that run adjacent to New Scotland Road.

The County had obtained the bridge in 2008 despite a report that deemed the metal structure and surrounding concrete to be in poor condition. The span has since been incorporated into the popular rail trail, used by pedestrians and bicyclists between Voorheesville and Albany.

The latest agreement is a byproduct of a similar pact made in 2015 after Sprint contested the County's plan to pave the trail. The communications company then said the blacktop would sever access to its fiber optic lines and argued it would cost over \$300,000 to move them. Both parties came to terms before the path was paved under the condition that if there were any changes the two would meet in arbitration.

Two years later, the County was prompted to make temporary repairs following a New York state Department of Transportation report that warned the bridge's "load carrying capacity" was in

The County selected a new, \$1.9 million two-

girder bridge to replace the aging, 42-foot long span in 2019. The proposed project would also raise the structure to 15 feet, 6 inches above the roadway to meet state requirements.

Construction was slated to begin in the summer of 2020; however, the outbreak of COVID-19 that spring halted those plans. Sprint soon followed with a suit against the County, which could not be processed in court with pandemicrelated shutdowns.

In 2019, the County estimated that the bridge was struck nine times over the preceding 11 years. A Queensbury motorist was arrested in 2021 after driving the cement truck he was operating into the bridge. The truck was lodged underneath the bridge for hours, causing the roadway to be closed before the truck could be removed.

The new construction is expected to allow the neighboring Slingerlands Fire District to travel under the bridge, improving response times. The southern sidewalk on New Scotland Road will be removed, allowing for an ADA-compliant sidewalk on the opposite side. The wider roadway should also provide shoulders for cyclists.

Wind, solar projects moving forward

Public Service Commission moves 5 major wind and solar projects forward

ALBANY — The New York State Public Service Commission approved compliance filings for five major wind and solar farms in upstate New York on Thursday, Aug. 11, a crucial step required before the projects could start construction-related activities or become operational.

"These solar and wind farms that are being built are vital to meet the Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act's aggressive carbon reduction and clean energy targets to combat climate change," said Commission Chair Rory M. Christian. "These projects benefit all New Yorkers by reducing our reliance on fossil fuels, boosting clean-energy investment, creating clean-energy jobs, and improving our environment.'

The compliance filings, considered among the last steps before a project becomes

operational, relate to the following projects: Baron Winds, a 242-megawatt (MW) project in the Towns of Cohocton, Dansville, Fremont, and Wayland, Steuben County; East Point, a 50-MW solar farm in the Town of Sharon, Schoharie County; Hecate Albany, a 40-MW solar farm in Town of Coeymans, Albany County; Trelina, an 80-MW solar farm in Town of Waterloo, Seneca County; and Number Three Wind, a 105.8-MW wind farm in the Towns of Harrisburg, Lowville, and Denmark, Lewis

The Baron Winds compliance filings relate to the construction of the operation and maintenance facility, as well as security lighting at the facility's operations and maintenance building site.

The East Point compliance filings will allow the developer to initiate construction of the collection substation, switchyard, and related interconnection

The Hecate Albany compliance filings relate to the

sound and noise modeling that will be utilized during all phases of construction and operation which are necessary as the developer prepares to initiate civil construction activities at the project substations and interconnection facility.

The Trelina Solar compliance filings are necessary as the developer prepares to initiate tree clearing and grading construction activities.

The Number Three Wind compliance filings relate to Federal Aviation Administration exterior lighting requirements and other requirements needed to construct and operate a utilityscale wind farm in Lewis County, near the military facility at Fort

These five projects are among the 17 renewable energy projects approved to date by the Board on Electric Generation Siting and the Environment (Siting Board).

Taken together, solar and wind farm projects approved by the Siting Board will generate more than 2,310 MWs of clean, renewable energy.



"Whether you're planting a tree or shrub, or installing a deck or pool, every job requires a call to 811 to know what's below before digging," said Mark Prewitt, Vice President of Pipeline Safety & Gas Compliance at National Grid. "The depth of utility lines can vary for several reasons, such as erosion, previous digging projects, and uneven surfaces. Utility lines need to be properly marked in each location, even one that's previously been marked, to avoid risk. A call to 811 is the best safeguard to preventing strikes on underground utility lines."

A quick phone call to 811 several days before digging connects callers to their local call center, which notifies the appropriate utility companies of their intent to dig. Professional locators then arrive at the digging site to mark the approximate locations of underground lines with flags, spray paint, or both. The service is easy to use, free of charge and is required by law.

Beacon Island will be clean once the dust settles

To the Editor;

We as neighbors are all gathered around the campfire saving the trees from Cabbage Island/Bemis Island. It certainly looks stark now. It also looks that great damage has been done to our environment. But if you look closely at the evidence, clearing is/was the best chance for correcting a long-term ecological disaster.

During the 50s and 60s, sites like this were fenced in and a sign was put up "no trespassing," this is one of those sites. This site has NOT been remediated. The fly ash is set on top of the silt from the river. It is like walking on the moon out there once a few yards away from the river. The fly ash has to be covered before it ends up in the river. There is no digging, washing, burning or anything else that can be done to keep the fly ash out of the river during a flood stage but to cap it off.

I have spent more time than most on the island. The animal population is slim pickings, a few deer near the water and one snake over the past decade are all I have noted. No nutrition here.

The vegetation consists of mostly vines twisted and growing, looking like trees. The stumps now sticking up are from years prior wind storms, with no solid earth base to hang onto. The reeds grow tall enough to mask the fly ash and keep the ash dust down. The light spots seen on an aerial view of the

island are the wood chips covering the otherwise exposed fly ash. From the river, you cannot see the extent of the ash.

Encon has put together a plan that is environmentally sound for this area. They are the experts, AND they represent us in this project. The Port Authority is following all of these permitted changes. Completion dates, season cycles, fencing, wood chips, and emergency barrels are all part of the preparedness given. It is not a hack-and-run job, they are not trying to snowball you or insert any political swing. There is intention. They are protecting the environment as a whole. Cleaning up the mess of the past.

To my friends and neighbors: WE should not miss the importance of capping the island as soon as possible. This is prime. It will be a disaster of epic proportion as the ash will kill all living things in the river. This is our duty.

I live close to the new traffic circle on 9W. The last two years have been dirty, noisy and disruptive at best. For those closer to the island, you certainly will bear the brunt of such a big project. Sorry.

Just remember, in the end the area will be clean and safe your family.



Digging up Earth's climate past

New Paleoclimate lab studies climate history

ALBANY — University at Albany scientists have a new way to uncover clues about the Earth's past climate conditions — from inside the third floor of the ETEC research and development complex.

ETEC's Paleoclimate Lab officially opened its doors this summer, focused on analyzing samples of natural resources, such as coral and lake sediment, to help reconstruct Earth's climate history and determine how it relates to present or future climate trends.

The lab research is led by Sujata Murty and Aubrey Hillman, assistant professors in the Department of Atmospheric and Environmental Sciences (DAES), along with about a dozen undergraduate and graduate student assistants.

By using in-house equipment, data collection can be completed within a week or two, instead of the average six-to-12-month turnaround when relying on an outside lab, according to Murty.

"This is huge for me," said Murty, who studies past changes in ocean and climate systems. "We can now do all our sampling and analysis on campus, which not only saves a lot of time and money, but also gives us more control to ensure our data is robust and accurate."

Murty is an oceanographer who collects

coral samples from reefs in the Indonesian seas, Indian Ocean and the Red Sea. Corals have annual growth layers, similar to tree rings, that can offer valuable information on how environmental conditions have changed over time, along with insight for future climate modeling.

Oceanographers, like Murty, dive into the ocean and drill cores from massive boulder corals, taking care not to harm them. She collects the samples herself and brings them home, now to the Paleoclimate Lab.

Murty's main research instrument at the lab is called an ICP-OES (Inductively Coupled Plasma Optical Emission Spectrometer) which is used to measure trace element concentrations in

the coral slabs. The samples are ground into tiny bits of powder and used to reconstruct past changes in ocean temperature and circulation over the past 200 to 500 years.

"Corals are a lot like tree rings, they grow these annual bands that we use to count backward through time," Murty said. "Each sample we drill represents about a month of coral growth. It is very tedious, but it gives us really high-resolution records of climate where we can look at things like how temperature has changed over the last 400 years, month by month or season by season."

"It allows us to figure out how we, as humans, are modifying climate and we can project how climate is going to change in the future."

Digging For Climate History

Hillman is an environmental scientist who reconstructs both natural and human-induced climate variability recorded over the last 10,000 years through lake sediment, also

known as mud.

Like Murty, Hillman and her team collect their own samples. Just last month, they spent 10 days on a research boat in the Lake Placid region. The samples are collected using a UWITEC coring device which lowers a long tube to the bottom of the lake and fills it with sediment cores. That tube is then brought home, preserved and analyzed.

Once in the lab, the tube sample is sliced into thin intervals. Each slice represents an interval of time. From there, several grams of sediment are placed together into a freeze drier which removes all the water and preps them for data collection.

"Everything that I do is dependent on lab work," Hillman said. "During the pandemic, it was really difficult to generate data. We are still working through a backlog of samples now from 2019."

"Having a facility like this available on campus is going to be key to continuing to move our research forward."

Along with the researchers, student

assistants in the Paleoclimate Lab are getting their own hands-on experience.

Sumar Hart, a spring 2022 DAES graduate, spent her last semester on Hillman's research team and has continued this summer as an instructional support assistant, working with both Hillman and Murty.

"I've really enjoyed working in the lab," Hart said. "As a student, all you have to do is take a little bit of an initial step and inquire to see if there's anyone doing research that you might be interested in, who is looking for help."

DAES graduate student Daliza Rivera is also working in the lab this summer.

"After I finished my undergraduate degree, I knew that I had an interest in atmospheric science and climate change research," Rivera said. "Continuing my education at UAlbany, and joining the lab team, has been a great next step for me."

Learning the lay of the land

For a six-week long duration, 1,200 area students participate in non-traditional programs. The classes include fossil hunting, blacksmithing and weaving. Participants are educated by professional instructors, artisans and subject matter experts. Classrooms are located within 32 lean-tos, a large multi-unit pavilion, a theater building and outdoor stage, a working blacksmith shop, an archery building, a puppet stage, a half-size Iroquois Longhouse and a tepee.

In the spring and fall months, Heldeberg Workshop offers weekend classes to children, adults, and families. They support the use of the property by area scouting and 4H groups, environmental and historical organizations, college classes and students working on independent research projects.

Currently under construction at Heldeberg Workshop is a Sugar Shack. Once completed, it will be used to show and educate the community about how Maple syrup is made using Sugar Maple trees located on the Workshop's property.

The Preservation League of New York State's \$8,000 grant to fund a Historic Landscape Report of the property from 1750 to the present day will only further enrich the exploration and education at this historic property.

"This report will shed light on the history of life beneath the Heldeberg Escarpment," said Dorothy Matthews, the Workshop's Development Committee Chair. "That knowledge will enrich our classes and generate interest among amateur and professional historians and archaeologists."

Visitors can also enjoy the landscape that makes up 237 acres. There are 20 miles of hiking trails to explore. The property teems with wildlife, as there are diverse ecological and geological sources on the land. A pond, a wetland,

a waterfall, meadows, and the slope of the escarpment carve out a picturesque scene in the natural setting.

Not only is the property rich with nature, the property itself also has its own distinctive history. Visitors of The Heldeberg Workshop can see how the property contains foundations of a pre-1767 homestead and a possible barn, as well as remains of an abandoned road, and an 1850s-era cemetery.

The unique background of the property tells the story of a rebel Tory attack occurring at the homestead in 1779. This resulted in a visit to the property by patriot commissioners for Detecting and Defeating

Conspiracies, a legal body formed in Albany in 1779 for the purpose of ferreting out traitors to the American cause. It is additionally the site of a farm owned by Captain Henry Crounse, a Civil War Army officer.

"The Preserve New York program ensures arts and culture organizations continue to be beacons of New York's rich history. By preserving significant spaces and sites, we promote vitality and drive economic activity across our great state," said New York State Council on the Arts (NYSCA) Executive Director, Mara Manus.

Since 1993, Preserve New York has been providing funds to municipalities and nonprofit organizations that need technical, professional assistance to guide a variety of preservation projects. The historic structure reports, building condition reports, cultural landscape reports, and cultural resource surveys funded through this program lead to positive outcomes across New York's 62 counties.

"The projects funded by Preserve New York exemplify the excellent preservation planning work being done throughout our state," said Katie Comeau, Vice President for Policy and Preservation and the Preservation League. "With each of these grants, a meaningful historic place takes a significant step toward a more secure future."
