Working for the money

With looming infrastructure issues, Bethlehem looks to take advantage of state money to fund projects





State funds sought for Delaware

Town forms advisory committee to oversee revitilization effort on Delaware Avenue

ELSMERE — The Town of Bethlehem is jockeying for more state funds — up to \$4.5 million — to help reshape the Delaware Avenue corridor. To do so, it's incorporating buy-in by assembling an advisory committee of local business owners.

The state Department of State launched NY Forward in late July, introducing the new grant program aimed toward invigorating downtowns and town centers by aiding in the redevelopment of existing downtown buildings, façade improvements, park and recreation upgrades and more. Awarded communities stand to receive between \$2.25 and \$4.5 million each to implement its portfolio of proposed projects in the downtown area. Funds and direct technical and consulting assistance will also be provided for awarded communities for a six-month planning process.

As part of the application process, communities are required to assemble an advisory committee to help guide application development and project implementation, if awarded a grant.

John Taylor, the town's senior economic developer, named eight local stakeholders to be appointed to the committee, including Gregg Biche, Quality PM; Terri Egan, Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce; Judi Gabler, Gabler Realty; Jim Giacone, My Place & Co.; Dave Gordon, resident; Mark Kelly, resident; Debbie Nolan Murray, Delaware Plaza; Pete Tryon, Blue House Co.

"The individuals who we've listed there, identify business owners, property owners, and residents who would really cover the entirety of the corridor bring a range of different perspectives and ideas to the project," Taylor said.

The Town Board approved the appointments with a 4-0 vote. Town Board member David DeCancio abstained from the vote to avoid what he described as a potential conflict of interest.

Committee members are anticipated to attend one preliminary committee meeting in early September. If awarded a grant, committee responsibilities would include monthly meetings during development of its strategy plan, a six-month process following the award where the Town and committee would engage with the public to fully develop the vision for the downtown area and describe in detail the specific projects along Delaware Avenue that would receive funding.

Taylor said the Town had to respond quickly to the state, expressing its intent to apply for the grant. The list of names includes a wide gamut of individuals familiar with Town Hall, including those who have voiced opposition against proposed policy.

As the Town wrangled over a proposed road diet for Delaware Avenue, Jim Giacone and Debbie Nolan Murray were among the loudest voices speaking against the plan. And before the Town Board implemented a year-long moratorium on residential development, Judi Gabler warned against it. Those were a few examples Town Board members used to show the proposed committee's diverse perspective. But diversity was nonetheless a concern.

Resident Steve Peterson balked at the list of names, protesting that it lacked a single Republican and failed to feature any people of color. He lobbied directly toward Town Board member Maureen Cunningham, a strong advocate for diversity and inclusion.

"Come on, Maureen. You see it," Peterson said during the meeting's opening public comment section. Town Board members held their comments for the business item later in the meeting.

"You're all gonna laugh," Cunningham said, "But the first thing I thought of when I saw the list was that there is no representation from people of color on this list, that I can tell. I know most of them [on the list]." Taylor had explained that with applications due in September, his staff moved quickly to engage business and community leaders interested in serving on the committee. The list was placed together with help from the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce.

Cunningham said she could name two potential candidates. She cast her approval for the committee but not without advising that amendments be made to include people of color.

Town Supervisor David VanLuven responded to the claim that there were no Republicans on the board, explaining that political affiliations were not reviewed.

"Despite the disparaging comments earlier this evening... this is an incredible opportunity for our community to get funding for business owners to do work on their properties," VanLuven said.

New credit union looks to move in

Hudson Valley Credit Union makes move into upstate

COLONIE - HudsonValley Credit Union is looking to expand its operation upstate by building a new branch at the intersection of Troy Schenectady Road and Utica Avenue.

The project, presented to the Planning Board at its last meeting, would demolish the Carpet One Floor and Home store currently located on the 0.9-acre site and build a 4,600-square-foot bank with a three-lane detached drive thru.

It would be the second branch located outside of four downstate counties -Dutchess, Ulster, Orange and Putnam — and the

first in the Capital District. Last year, there was a

proposal to demolish the carpet store and build a 2,900-square-foot Speedway gas station and mini-mart. That plan did not make it past the initial presentation because of traffic and other concerns at the already congested intersection with the Latham Farms entrance. Across the street, at the Brick House, a Chick-fil-A a bank is an acceptable

restaurant is still on the drawing board. Members of the

Planning Board are concerned with making a proposed "right in and right out" access as full proof as possible to make it difficult for drivers to make a left in or a left out.

use. There is 35 percent greenspace required and this project will have in the neighborhood of 42 percent, according to Charlie Thompson, a representative of HVCU who presented the project along with Sean Farrell, of LaBella Associates, a Latham based engineering firm.

The proposed branch will operate Monday through Friday from 8:30

a.m. to 7 p.m. and Saturday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. and have about 15 employees. The site is projected to generate about 46 trips during one hour of a weekday peak travel time and 97 trips during one hour of the afternoon peak travel time. On Saturday, it is expected to generate 122 trips during one hour of peak travel time.

A traffic study was to be commissioned by the developers of the Chickfil-A and the Speedway but it is not clear where that stands now that Speedway withdrew its project from consideration.

There was discussion about the proposed sidewalk along Route 7.

"My concern is if it a sidewalk to nowhere," said Planning Board member Craig Shamlian. "Who is going to be responsible for cleaning it off? The town going to have to do that. Is there somewhere else in

town where a 300-foot of sidewalk would be more beneficial?"

Thompson said the company would gladly install the sidewalks or not install them. The project is in the Airport GEIS and as such mitigation fees would be associated and they could be used to build sidewalks somewhere else in town...

There is a sidewalk from the circle east to just past Utica Avenue allowing pedestrians to get to a cross walk should they want to get into Latham Farms.

HVCU began in Poughkeepsie as a federal credit union for IBM employees in 1963. It currently has 20 branches located in the four counties mentioned above.

The project will need to come before the Planning Board at least twice more before construction can begin.

United States flag facts, etiquette

The United States flag was first imagined after the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. The Continental Congress authorized creation of the first national flag on June 14, 1777. It was decided that the flag should have 13 stripes, alternating red and white, to represent the original 13 colonies, and that the new union be represented by 13 white stars in a blue field to signify a "new constellation." Francis Hopkinson, one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence, is most often credited with the original design.

Today there are 50 stars on the flag to represent the 50 states, while the 13 stripes still represent the 13 British colonies that became the first states. While this may be common knowledge, Public Law 94-344, known as the Federal Flag Code, may not be as widely known. The code dictates that the flag is to be

treated with respect and proper etiquette. The code is extensive, but the following guidelines can help private individuals interested in displaying their flags do so in accordance with the law.

• Flags should only be displayed in public from sunrise to sunset, unless the flag can be properly illuminated during darkness. In this instance, it may be displayed at all times.

• When displayed with other flags, such as on a single staff or lanyard, the U.S. flag should be

above all other flags. If flags are displayed in a row, the U.S. flag goes to the observer's left. • State and local flags are

traditionally flown lower than the American flag.

• A flag in poor condition should be destroyed with dignity, preferably by burning. Most American Legion posts and local Boy Scouts troops will have the resources to retire flags accordingly. Many will host annual flag retirement ceremonies on Flag Day.

Imaginary City- The large-format, abstract paintings of Tomm El-Saieh (b. 1984, Port-au-Prince; lives and works in Miami) teem with dense and dynamic marks that evoke ornament, language, and architecture. By variously layering and erasing his linework, and using vibrant color to optically push or pull his pictures, El-Saieh creates rhythmic, all-over compositions from which larger forms appear to emerge—testing both the limits of our perception and our expectations about abstraction. The exhibition title, which comes from one of the works in the show, refers to a cityscape theme common in Haitian art (Vilai Imaginé). El-Saieh's paintings, which resemble informal urban plans, likewise develop intuitively, without the use of preparatory studies or outlines. New Museum triennial in New York that year. He is partner at the artist-run gallery CENTRAL FINE in Miami and long directed the El-Saieh Gallery in Port-au-Prince, a venue for contemporary Haitian

artists that his grandfather established in the 1950s. This yearlong exhibition appears in public spaces around the Clark and is free and open to the public. 


Overcast

Stir up dinner quickly

he lazy days of summer have started to fade away, and individuals and families will once again be beholden to more rigid schedules packed with activities. When time is of the essence, finding opportunity to cook delicious meals at home can seem challenging. But there are plenty of recipes that whip up in no time and won't disappoint hungry families.

This recipe for "Speedy Beef Stir-Fry with Chunky Vegetables" from "300 Stir-Fry Recipes" (Robert Rose) by Nancie McDermott is one such meal. It evokes the tastes of a favorite Asian restaurant without the need to order takeout.

Speedy Beef Stir-Fry with Chunky Vegetables

INGREDIENTS: Serves 4

- tablespoon ary snerry or Shaoxing rice wine
- 1 tablespoon water 1/2 teaspoon soy sauce, optional
- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- ounces lean boneless beef, 8 thinly sliced
- tablespoons chicken stock 3
- 2 teaspoons soy sauce

- 1/2 teaspoon granulated sugar 1/2
- teaspoon salt or to taste 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 2 teaspoons chopped garlic
- 2 teaspoons finely chopped
- fresh gingerroot
- 11/2 cups baby corn
- 1/2 cup sliced water chestnuts 1/2 cup frozen tiny peas

INSTRUCTIONS

1. In a bowl, combine sherry, water, dark soy sauce, if using, and cornstarch and stir well into a smooth paste. Add beef and stir to coat well. Set aside for 10 minutes.

2. In a small bowl, combine chicken stock, soy sauce, sugar and salt and stir well.


3. Heat a wok or a large deep skillet over high heat. Add oil and swirl to coat pan. Add garlic and ginger and toss well until tragrant, about 15 seconds. Add beet mixture and spread into a single layer. Cook, undisturbed, until edges change color, about 1 minute. Toss well.

4. Add chicken stock mixture, baby corn and water chestnuts. Cook, tossing occasionally, until beef is cooked through., about 2 minutes more. Add peas and cook, tossing once for 1 minute more. Transfer to a serving plate. Serve hot or warm.

Saratoga Performing Arts Center's lone hip-hop concert of 2022 took place as Wiz Khalifa and Logic rolled up into town as part of their "Vinyl Verse" Summer Tour on Tuesday, Aug. 23. This marked Khalifa's third time in the Spa City, having previously opened for Fall Out Boy in 2015, before coheadlining with Snoop Dogg a year later.

As for Logic, this was his first time performing in Saratoga.

With thunderstorms and continuous showers that evening

the gates were delayed by an hour, however, the show began as scheduled. Troy Dance Factory's Full Out Fest By KATIE CUSACK nippertown.com

TROY — It's always exciting to see a locally organized event make a strong return. It's entirely more satisfying to see something like Troy Dance Factory's Full Out Fest take its place as a summer event staple. The August 14th, sold-out, outdoor festival at Troy's Riverfront Park showcasing the dancers of TDF brought in hundreds of community members and fans who were excited to relive the energy of last year-or, for the newbies, hop on a chance to experience the dense hotspot of art and community.

They bested the parking challenges presented by street shutdowns for the filming of HBO's "The Gilded Age" and a strong, hot sun that followed a few deceptively breezy summer days. They filled the concrete amphitheater armed with decorated posters, refreshments and umbrellas—maybe stopping at the maker's market to purchase a cool new hat for some shade. They buzzed with excitement and screamed for the performers on stage, running to meet them with hugs and flowers.

All in all, this year included 21 unique dances, seven musical acts, a market of thirty makers and community organizations, a food court of a half dozen Troy establishments and a breezy riverfront lounge area, illuminated by neon lights with Whiskey Pickle serving up refreshing sangrias for parched guests.

Full Out Fest organizer and TDF owner Nadine Medina managed to make a safe and comfortable space for community members to take in some dance and music in the sun, stroll along to learn about the hard-working orgs such as Soul Fire Farm, Free Food Fridge, Troy YWCA or More Music, Less Violence and peruse vintage finds, handcrafted textiles, jewelry, pottery and art. So much coming out of a little space, it will almost overwhelm you.

In a beautiful way, Full Out Fest uses the close-knit nature of downtown Troy industries to introduce more people to dance and the incredible power and effort that goes into mere minutes of a performance. An excited passer-by looking to spend the day outside at the park had an opportunity to nab some flavorful bibimbap from Cafe Euphoria, one of Primo Botanica's iced chocolate drinks and walk along the grassy ridge of the park amphitheater to watch the seamless stream of performances (an organizational feat of choreography in itself). Maybe they even circled right back to the market's edge to pick up their favorite artist's merch and snap a photo.

Meanwhile, ticket holders who nabbed seats early got set up at cushy tables front and center, with brightly lit centerpieces set with bottles provided by 22 Second St. Wine Co. Its a prime spot for family and friends to get the best angle for the evening's choreography—courtesy of Nadine Medina, Dorrie Boyce, Sydney Kurzejeski as well as a few classes (choreo composition) who created their own works, with help from TDF facilitators.

Between dances, musical performers took over the park's side stage and DJ Intell

Hayesfield kept the energy high all day and night as emceecomplete with hilarious and on-point commentary about the dances, reading the thrill right out of the audience member's minds. Sydney Worthley played an unreleased track "Anaheim" during her set of bright, poppy rock songs, solo artist Lewna performed a warm, sexy set with a full band featuring her single "Falling" and rapper OHZHE's set was clean and crisp, showcasing the performer's unique prowess behind the mic.

Later, singer emhasleftthebuilding made her stunning Capital District debut with support from The Age, Spotify hitmakers Freedom Stratton and B. Chaps kept the crowd jumping and Pink Nois shared a rework of his






