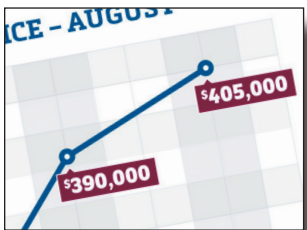

Another chase

Juveniles arrested in third chase over five days in August

GLENMONT — The Bethlehem police arrested two juveniles on Monday, Sept. 19 in connection with a chase that took place on Thursday, Aug. 25. This was the third in a string of car chases that took place in Bethlehem between Aug 20-25.

At approximately 1:17 AM, an officer with the Bethlehem Police Department was in the area of Route 9W and Corning Hill Road when the patrol car's license plate reader alerted the officer that a vehicle reported stolen from Saratoga County had just passed, traveling northbound. The officer attempted to stop the vehicle and the vehicle fled from the officer at a high rate of speed into the City of Albany.

A short time later the vehicle was located unoccupied in the City of Albany. A search of the area was conducted and a 17-year-old juvenile from Albany was taken into custody and charged with criminal possession of stolen property, a felony.

After further investigation into the matter, Bethlehem police detectives identified the driver of the vehicle as a 16-year-old juvenile from Waterford. On Monday, Sept. 19, the juvenile was arrested and charged with criminal possession of stolen property, a felony.

Both of the cases will be heard in the Youth Part of Albany County Family Court.

On Wednesday, Aug 24 at approximately 2:18 p.m., the Bethlehem police responded to a larceny in progress at the Price Chopper supermarket on 329 Glenmont Road in

Glenmont.

Upon arrival, officers observed two suspects fleeing the store on foot and entering a Toyota Camry. As the officers approached the vehicle, the driver of the vehicle accelerated toward the officers, almost hitting one, then crashed into a marked Bethlehem police car.

According to reports, the officers attempted to stop the vehicle, but it fled the scene in a reckless manner at a high rate of speed. The vehicle was found abandoned a short time later in the City of Albany.

After an investigation, police determined that Bishop A. Fraser and Jaquan D. Johnson, both 19 and from Albany entered the store and stole \$1,562.89 worth of merchandise, then fled the scene.

'Multitalented' RCS junior picked for NYSSMA All-Star Fest

Junior Alivia Ortiz excels in class, track and music

RAVENA — Ravena Coeymans Selkirk high school student musician Junior Alivia Ortiz was chosen to perform at the New York State School Music Association Conference All-State Festival in December.

Each year, students from across New York State are notified that they were selected to participate in the NYSSMA Conference All-State music ensembles based on the high scores they earned at the previous spring's NYSSMA solo festivals. This acceptance will also allow her to apply to the National Association for Music Education All-Eastern Festival.

This year's concert is to be held at the Eastman Theater in Rochester following the all-state festival that runs from Thursday, Dec. 1 to Sunday, Dec. 4.

"It was a bit overwhelming at first, but I am so excited to be able to participate in the festival," Ortiz said. "Music is a love of mine, something I really connect with. RCS has been able to provide so many music opportunities during my time here, it is so rewarding for it to all come together."

Ortiz said she dedicated her achievement to her grandmother, who inspired her to sing and to work diligently towards her craft.

"I always used to sing to her in Italian and even got to sing her the NYSSMA solo that got me accepted to the festival before she passed and at her funeral," Ortiz said. "She loved my voice and is a big reason why I continue to sing today."

Ortiz's commitment and determination paid off. She earned a perfect 100 score on her NYSSMA All-State Solo this spring, ranking her one of the top altos in the state. She has since been selected to perform in

the Mixed Chorus during the festival. Outside of the chorus, she is an active member of the RCS community.

Not only did Ortiz end last year with a 101 average, but she is also involved in tennis, track and field (400m and pole vault), and wrestling. She is also Co-President of the RCS Class of 2024, a part of Student Government, in the National Honor Society, and the Students Against Destructive Decisions Club.

Musically, she also participates in Piano Club, is in the High School Band, Jazz Band, Tri-M Music Honor Society, and participates in the drama production. Outside of school, she loves being in nature, hiking, skiing, snowboarding, practicing jujitsu, and more.

"I had the great pleasure of seeing Alivia in one of her first ensemble concerts at RCS when she was in 5th grade at AWB. I was so very impressed with her talents and preparation even then, as she jumped between vocal and instrumental performances throughout the night. We are incredibly proud to see her many years of hard work and dedication recognized as part of this prestigious festival," said RCS High School Choral Director and K-12 Art and Music Curriculum Content Specialist, Michelle McLoughlin. "This process is extremely competitive, and we could not be more pleased that she will be representing RCS at All-State."

In speaking with Ortiz about her journey to this festival, she shared this piece of advice for students, "Work hard and set priorities, but don't forget to take a step back sometimes to enjoy life and don't be afraid to go to someone for support. It is also important to try to be that support for someone else, to spread kindness. There is always someone you influence with your positivity, even if you don't realize it."

Spreading words of encouragement

BCHS hosts "Rock On, Keep On" event to support mental health

DELMAR — "This was the best idea."

Those were the words of one BCCHS student who took part in the first-of-its-kind "Rock On, Keep On" project in support of mental health.

The event, which took place on Friday, Sept. 23, was hosted by the Bethlehem Central High School Counseling Center and the BCCHS Art Department. Students in grades 9-12 gathered in the school's main foyer during their lunch periods to paint messages of inspiration and perseverance on landscaping rocks that will be placed under trees around the high school campus.

High school counselor

Ryan St. John said he was inspired to create the event after a summer spent reading about how the COVID-19 pandemic was impacting the mental health of adults and especially teens.

St. John said he also wanted the project to take place in September as part of Suicide Prevention Month.

"There are startling and sobering statistics showing 19% of high school students in the U.S. have seriously considered suicide," said St. John. "That is one in five students walking the halls of our high school. It is a statistic that deserves more of our collective attention."

The painting session, set to upbeat rock music and positive energy, allowed students to show support for each other's well-being and mental health while interacting and having fun.

The result was nearly 200 colorful landscape rocks with powerful, inspirational messages meant for students, and written by students. Their messages included:

"You're a star."

"Rise up."

"Friends are here."

"You aren't alone."

"Never give up."

"You can do this."

"The opportunities in life are sky high."

Painting a rock may sound easy, but the process required time, effort and the commitment of students and staff.

Students had to first pick a stone from a bed in the Counseling Center courtyard, then wash the stone to prep it for paint, paint it with a primary color first, dry the first coat of paint with a blow dryer, and then decorate it with their message.

"I hope they can keep up with my directions," said district art department supervisor Melanie Painter, who was responsible for the multiple stations set up as part of the pop-up art studio.

The colorful, inspirational rocks don't have a permanent home yet but St. John said the Counseling Center is working on that.

"This is an opportunity to capture a moment where nature and our human capacity for compassion meet," said St. John. "We want students to be able to see these messages in a place where they gather outdoors and we hope to find the perfect spot."

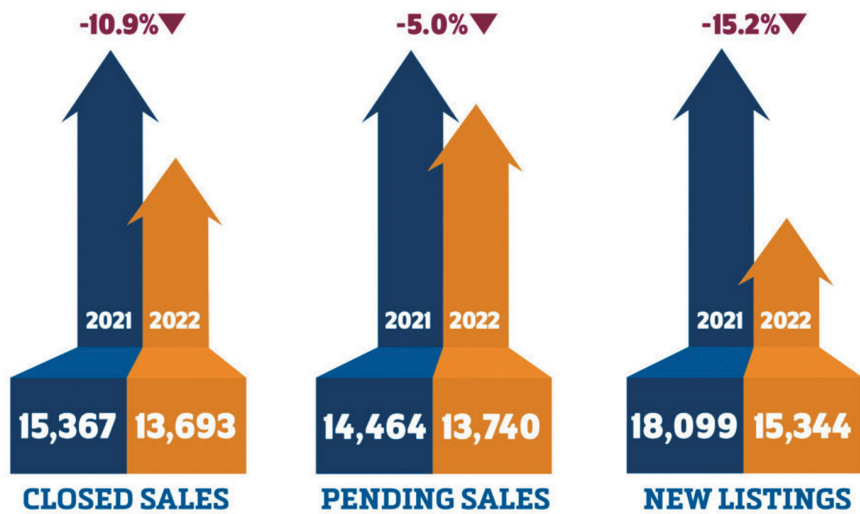

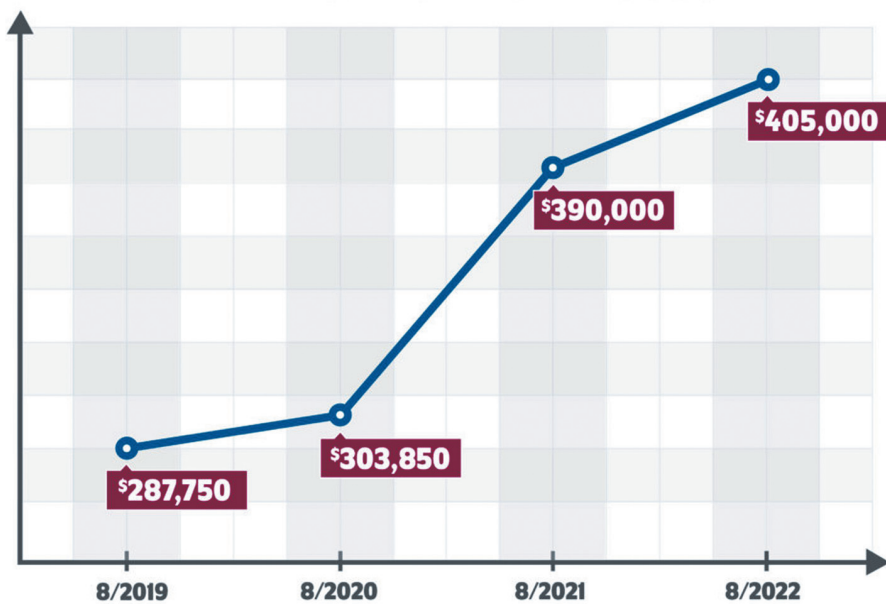

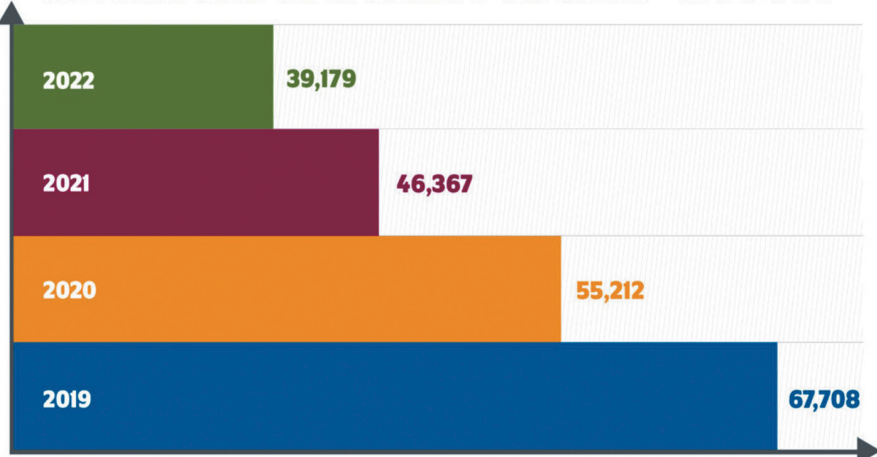
YEARLY COMPARISON FOR AUGUST

Cooler days ahead

Late summer heat keeps market warm

ALBANY — Inflation, higher interest rates, and fears of a possible recession were expected to sideline buyers and sellers this summer but the Greater Capital Association of Realtors said it didn't quite happen that way.

Realtors observed buyers continuing to pay above list price for homes, pushing the median sales price in the region to \$300,000 for the first time on record. Days on the market also continued to drop to a new low of only 19 days from list to sold.

The number of homes for sale was down compared to this time last year. Inventory levels market-wide decreased 37 percent to 2,146 units.

"Sellers who feel they have missed the peak may have underestimated the

demand for homes in the Capital Region despite the cost of rising interest rates. Many local and national economists like NAR Chief Economist Lawrence Yun, believe the worst of inflation may have passed," said Greater Capital Association of Realtors President, Kendal Baker, Broker-Owner of Markers Octagon Realty.

Although sales prices remain up from last year, price growth is expected to moderate in the months ahead as the weather turns cooler causing the market to shift in a more buyer-friendly direction.

More than 1,200 homes closed last month — healthy but a 10+ percent drop over the year-to-year comparison. Months Supply of Homes for Sale held steady at 2 months with only 94 New Construction listings and 68 reported sold.

"With new construction

averaging \$523,000, many buyers are not able to access the new home market causing price pressure on existing homes and yielding the high selling points we're currently seeing," said Laura Burns, GCAR CEO.

In August, newly listed homes declined by 21.1 percent compared to the same time last year, a greater rate of decline compared to the previous month's 16.8 percent year-over-year decrease.

The median sales price of homes across New York state escalated 3.8 percent in August, from \$390,000 in 2021 to \$405,000 in 2022. This marks 28 consecutive months in year-over-year comparisons that median sales prices have increased.

According to Realtor.com, moderating buyer demand may hit this fall, spurred by rising interest rates and listing prices close to all-time highs.

CSX promotes national "Rail Safety Week"

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — CSX Corp. joined Operation Lifesaver, Inc. last week for the sixth annual Rail Safety Week, a campaign to educate and empower the public to make safe decisions around trains and railroad tracks.

According to national statistics, each year approximately 2,100 North Americans are killed or seriously injured when engaging in unsafe behavior around tracks and trains. In the U.S. alone, a person or vehicle is hit by a train every three hours.

To further increase awareness of this vital public safety initiative, this year CSX unveiled a new OLI rail safety commemorative locomotive, painted at the railroads locomotive shop in Huntington, West Virginia. The CSXT 4568 engine will travel the company's rail network as a visual reminder for the public to be safe at highway-rail grade crossings and near railroad tracks.

Through public events, digital billboards and social media messages from September 19 to 25, CSX worked to reduce the number of grade crossing and trespass incidents in communities across its 26-state network.

CSX partnered with the Federal Railroad Administration, Amtrak, Class 1 railroads, commuter rail-service providers and law enforcement agencies to improve safety awareness around tracks and trains.

"At CSX, our goal is zero incidents. Rail Safety Week offers the opportunity for us to encourage motorists and pedestrians in communities along our network to remain alert around tracks and to take the necessary precautions to stay safe," said Sean Douris, chief of police, public safety and infrastructure protection.

CSX names new prez, CEO

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. — CSX Corp., one of the nation's leading transportation suppliers, announced last week that

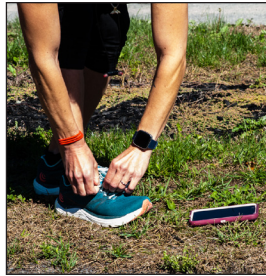
Albany professor pens anthology

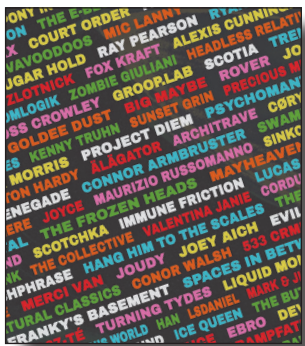

Giving back to school

National Book Award-winner, donates archives to Union College

SCHENECTADY — In 1996, Andrea Barrett was an obscure but gifted writer when she stunned the literary world by winning the National Book Award for fiction for “Ship Fever and Other Stories.”

The author of four novels at that point, Barrett, discouraged by paltry sales and scant reviews, pivoted to short stories. In part by learning how to use her background as a biology major at Union, Barrett began creating stories that combined art and science with copious historical research.

Appearing first in small literary magazines, short stories such as “The Behavior of the Hawkweeds” and “The Littoral Zone” formed the basis of “Ship Fever.” Writing in The New York Times Book Review, Thomas Mallon said that Barrett’s “work stands out for its sheer

intelligence, its painstaking attempt to discern and describe the world’s configuration” and was “quietly dazzling, like looking at handmade paper under a microscope.”

Publishing’s version of the Oscars, the National Book Award (which included a \$10,000 prize) firmly established Barrett as a literary force. In the 25 years since winning the award, Barrett has written five other books, including “Servants of the Map,” a finalist for the 2003 Pulitzer

Prize in Fiction. Her latest collection of stories, “Natural History,” was released this month.

Fans and scholars of Barrett’s work soon will be able to get a sense of the author’s creative process and the evolution of each of her books. Barrett, 68, recently donated her archives to Union. A dozen boxes stored in the basement of the home in New York’s Champlain Valley she shares with her husband of 43 years, Barry Goldstein, now have a permanent home in Special Collections.

“It seemed like the right time,” Barrett said of giving her papers to her alma mater. “When I finished this book (“Natural History”), I thought, ‘What am I doing?’ These boxes are sitting in my basement. The mice are going to get them. I was ready to let them go to a place where others may want to go through them.”

The materials include manuscripts and multiple drafts of most of her books, numerous notebooks filled with ideas,

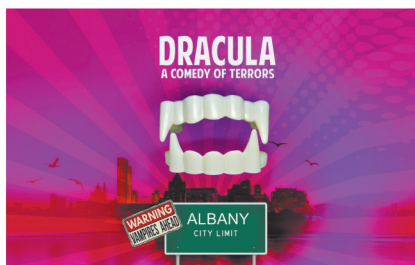

"Wild in the Trees is our way of paying homage to all efforts made to raise money to build the Lake George Skate Plaza while embracing all the incredible musical talent regionally and beyond," Cavone said.

Local skateboarders approached Lake George with the idea of erecting a skate park in town in 2008. After several town board meetings that included testimonies from skaters, family members and community leaders, the town encouraged advocates to start raising funds.

Through coin drops, spaghetti dinners, benefit concerts and grant writing, skateboarders raised nearly \$100,000 before a skate park was designed in 2014. Construction on the Lake George Skate Plaza began a year later.

Back in 2008, local skateboarders in Lake George, brought to the town's attention the need to have a skate park. Through various town board meetings and the creation of a skateboarding committee put together by skaters, family members and community leaders, it was time to raise money to make the dream come true.

Addenda- Custodians of archives wield great power and responsibility in considering who might be left out, disempowered or silenced in the creation of a specific narrative by those who use their records. Addenda centers interpretation and augmentation of past and present through the archive in an effort to construct a fuller future. The three contemporary artists featured in this exhibition, Gina Adams, Merritt Johnson and Sonya Kelliher-Combs,

draw on history, cultural traditions, and archives, along with a strong belief in seeking alternative narratives to create artworks that exist dually, as both physical constructions and as a record of unconsidered perspectives and often unrecognized pasts. Exhibit is on going until June 12th.

The singer/songwriter first found success with his 2017 single "Cringe," then topped Billboard's Alternative Songs chart with "Hallucinogenics" from his 2019 debut album, Bank On the Funeral. Over the next two years, Maeson focused on collaborations, and in 2021 formed the project USERx with producer Rozwell. In 2022, he returned to his solo work with the single "Blood Runs Red." Maeson took to music early, learning drums and guitar at a young age and eventually touring as part of his father's prison ministry. Already a budding songwriter struggling through a rebellious period in his late teens, the experience of performing at high-security prisons and various other dark corners of society made a lasting impression on Maeson and helped realign his focus on his career as a singer/songwriter. Melding bluesy indie folk and modern production, he began posting tracks online and eventually caught the ear of Atlantic affiliate Neon Gold Records, which signed him in 2016. Maeson embarked on his first headlining tour that summer, which was presented by Communion, the music organization founded by Mumford & Sons' Ben Lovett. and kinetic extreme metal. Commencing with 2001's self-released Isle of Disenchantment, the group went on to share stages with whiplash-inducing contemporaries like Cannibal Corpse and Aborted, and issue a string of well-received slabs of discord and fury with highlights arriving via 2008's Nuclear Blast-issued Ob(Servant), and 2018's versatile As the Kingdom Drowns. Hailing from the remote Australian island state of Tasmania,

Scarypoolparty

The stage name of Los Angeles-based artist Alejandro Aranda, Scarypoolparty first turned heads in 2018 after appearing on season 17 of American Idol. He made it all the way to the finals but eventually lost to season 17 winner Laine Hardy. "Out Loud," the first and final song he performed on American Idol, became his debut single. In 2019, Aranda inked a deal with Hollywood Records and began working on his debut album. Later that year he issued the singles "Tonight" and "Cholo Love," both of which saw him collaborating with songwriter and producer Twin Shadow. Musician and horror aficionado Joseph Poole embarked on his career in music in 1992 with Maniac Spider Trash. He left the group in 1996 and formed Frankenstein Drag Queens from Planet 13 with fellow "Spider Trashers" Abby Normal and Sicko Zero. The band managed to release five full-length albums and six EPs over the span of five years before calling it

quits in 2003 as a result of Poole's rising success with his Murderdolls side project. In 2004, Poole began recording under the moniker Wednesday 13, releasing the EP 6 Years, 6 Feet Under the Influence. It was followed in 2005 by the full-length Transylvania 90210: Songs of Death, Dying, and the Dead. In May 2006, Wednesday 13 put out a six-CD/DVD box set called Little Box of Horrors, followed by Fang Bang later that September. The significantly heavier and darker Skeletons dropped in 2008, followed by the equally brooding Calling All Corpses in 2011. The Dixie Dead, the project's fifth studio long-player, arrived in 2013, followed by Monsters of the Universe: Come Out and Plague (2015) and Condolences (2017), the latter of which was the group's first outing for Nuclear Blast. Wolf Alice

With their distinctive blend of vintage '90s indie rock, folk, electronic, and dream pop, Wolf Alice are one of the most eclectic bands of the 2010s and 2020s. They're also one of the most acclaimed: The North London group's 2015 debut album My Love Is Cool -- which highlighted the delicacy and ferocity of Ellie Rowsell's vocals and lyrics -- counted Grammy Award and Mercury Prize nominations among its many accolades. With 2021's anthemic yet atmospheric Blue Weekend, Wolf Alice's ambitions and horizons continued to grow, garnering them a third consecutive Mercury Prize nomination and winning them the 2022 Brit Award for Group of the Year. Wolf Alice formed in 2010, when

singer/songwriter Ellie Rowsell and guitarist Joff Oddie began playing as an acoustic duo and took their name from a short story by Angela Carter. After issuing a self-titled EP, the group expanded into a quartet with the addition of drummer Joel Amey and bassist Theo Ellis. This fleshed-out, electrified incarnation of the band released their debut single "Fluffy" in February 2013 on the Chess Club label, with "Bros" following in May. Wolf Alice's official debut EP, Blush, appeared that October and garnered positive reviews, with some critics comparing the group to Elastica, Garbage, the Duke Spirit, and Pixies. The best pumpkins for pie (and more)

Beginning in early fall, pumpkins begin to arrive at farmer's markets, supermarkets, nurseries, and fall harvest festivals.

Pumpkins are versatile in that they make colorful fall home decorations, but also can be utilized in all sorts of recipes. In fact, pumpkins are a type of winter squash.

While some people may be quick to think that the larger the pumpkin the better it is for baking up delicious treats, that's actually not the case. Once you've selected your perfect cooking pumpkins, it's time to whip up a

pumpkin pie. Enjoy this recipe, courtesy of McCormick, which can be served anytime from Halloween through Christmas.

Classic Pumpkin Pie

INGREDIENTS: Serves 8

- Pastry for 9-inch pie crust**
- 2 eggs, well beaten
 - 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar
 - 2 teaspoons McCormick Pumpkin Pie Spice
 - 1 tablespoon flour
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt

research notes, essays about writing and lectures given at writing conferences. The drafts contain margin notes, wholesale edits and other changes that demonstrate how much the work evolved over time.

“Sometimes I’ll look at pieces of an old novel and what I thought was the beginning is now the end,” she said. “I started in a first person voice, but the final novel is in the third person voice. I start out with someone who is a central character, and that person ends up being a minor character. The changes are not line edits like in

a newspaper story where they might fix your lede. They are often wholesale reconstructions, a complete new way of telling a story, which is common for many writers. Writers in training don’t always know that.”

The new collection also features some of Barrett’s earliest work, including a high school paper and two papers she wrote as a senior at Union. One was a series of essays about images of diatoms, or single-cell organisms, she took with the college’s new electron microscope.

“A perceptive

introduction to a highly sensitive and thoughtful series of little essays,” Professor George Smith wrote. He gave her an A.

In addition to the National Book Award, Barrett has received recognition with a Guggenheim Fellowship and a MacArthur Fellowship, or genius grant, which carries a prize of \$500,000.

Yet her papers clearly show that the path to success was never certain. The collection includes numerous rejection slips of her stories from magazines such as Esquire, The New Yorker and Good Housekeeping. Cosmopolitan passed on one of her submissions, noting it was “quite nice

but just a tad too quiet for Cosmo.”

Barrett understands that rejection and failure are part of a writer’s life. That is why she hopes opening the window into her creative process will help others.

“I always found it useful as a writer to look at other writers’ early drafts and see their processes,” she said. “When we are reading a book between covers, it seems like it always was that way, that it just came fully-formed out of the writer’s head. That is discouraging when you are a young writer just starting out. Instead, if you can look at the work of a writer you’ve read and see all the false starts and the mistakes and the four, eight or 12 drafts, you can see that other people struggle, too.”

The college will begin cataloging and organizing the Barrett collection to make it publicly available.

“I’m ecstatic that Andrea Barrett has

decided to entrust Union with her archive,” said Sarah Schmidt, director of Special Collections and Archives. “Andrea is a wonderful example of the strength of Union College: a biology major who went on to be an award-winning author. It is the perfect blend of science and humanities. I look forward to faculty and students engaging with her collection and can imagine these papers being used by students in a number of English classes, particularly Nature and Environmental Writing taught by Professor Katherine Lynes.”

Barrett said she and her husband, Barry, a biophysicist and photographer, are grateful

Geoffrey Keezer Trio with Gillian Margot at A Place For Jazz

SCHENECTADY — The nip of autumn weather was in the air as the Geoffrey Keezer Trio took to the stage on Friday, Sept. 23.

The opener was a cover. The origin of the tune was from an unexpected source though; Jimi Hendrix's "May This Be Love."

"You won't be able to recognize it", Geoff quipped as the trio

started the performance.

The original was on Jimi's debut album and, being one of the more obscure cuts, is an unusual choice to cover.

The tune indeed was barely recognizable if it all, especially without the benefit of hearing the beautiful lyrics: "Waterfall / Nothing can harm me

at all / My worries seem so small..." The tone was set for the rest of the concert — a mixture of the familiar with creative interpretations. A more familiar jazz standard, "All the Things You Are," followed with similar characteristics. Gillian Margot was then introduced to the stage and sang with the band for the remainder of the concert.

Margot and Keezer often sang and played in unison, Keezer's piano acrobatics and Margot's vocal acrobatics in parallel with Margot's contralto clear lyrical delivery were a treat to hear. They were still apparent with the ballad "Autumn Nocturne" and the low-down blues of "Blues in the Night."

The rest of the trio was equally adept and creative.

Bassist Hannah Marks swung like crazy and was given plenty of solo space to express her talents. Drummer Jon Wikan showed a true understanding of dynamics in music, swinging where appropriate and quietly providing accents in the proper places.

Outlaw Music Festival 2022 at SPAC

SARATOGA SPRINGS — Willie Nelson rolled into Saratoga Springs Performing Arts Center for the final Live Nation concert at the venue for the season, bringing with him family and a talented crew of younger musicians whose summer country vibe heated up the scene on this damp September Sunday, Sept. 18.

Nelson's Outlaw Music Festival has become a staple at SPAC in the last six years, bringing a tradition of country music that crosses genres into blues, rock, and gospel. Sunday night kept to this tradition hosting Larkin Poe, Billy Strings, and the Avett Brothers before Nelson graced the stage accompanied by his youngest son Micah.

Larkin Poe earned a new fan base as the

women rocked through a bluesy set with slide guitar prominently seducing the crowd. Sisters Rebecca and Megan Lovell put a spell on the crowd with their smooth vocals and technical guitar riffs as they swayed through "Bad Spell," feeling as close to sexy as music gets. They had the soaking wet crowd clapping along before launching into "I'm a Wanted Woman," which they dedicated to the women in the crowd. The vocals reflected a variety of styles, flexing talent and winning over new fans.

Billy Strings followed with a contrasting lush opening sound produced from the lead guitar with a standing bass for support. When the band added in banjo, the crowd erupted into wild dancing and applause. Strings himself is a hurricane, playing with a technique featuring fast fingers and bluegrass sounds that blended old-time country music with beachy music vibes. Baby-faced Strings had women screaming from the crowd, but so did his fiddle player

whose featured parts had people gyrating like they were at an Elvis concert. Bluegrass is back for young folks as evidenced by the huge crowd of fans enjoying the light show accompanying his music.

Fun to note: Strings' set list spelled out with the first letters of each song a thank you to Willie Nelson. This small effort was a clever nod to many who came before him using set lists to communicate a larger message, and in this case, a tone of gratitude to Nelson.

The rains were pouring down as the Avett Brothers took the stage next. We saw them at Ommegang, and frankly, it was one of the summer's best concerts, so they would have to top themselves to impress me. Their performance was so different from what they did at Ommegang, I was instantly shocked. Opening with "Laundry Room," the band romanced the crowd with lyrics "every chorus was your name" while quietly plucking strings, a contrast to the large sound produced prior by Strings.

The Avett Brothers shifted gears quickly at the end of the song, blending one song into the next as they jumped across the stage to "Satan Pulls the Strings" before slowing into a graceful and carefully paced harmony for which they are beloved. Their talent is reflected in their ability to control pace and volume, moving between love ballads and intense pieces with ease. The Avett Brothers have mastered the art of telling a story accompanied by fiddle in a way that is both fun and philosophical.

Mickey Raphael, Nelson's harmonica player, joined the band on stage to create some especially unique sounds to remind us we were still at a country concert. But shortly after, the band's song was led by the cellist with an intro. The variety of genres represented so much more than we typically classify as "country."

And that's what makes them outlaws. With jam-like transitions, the brothers pushed through a set that defied category.

My favorite moment of the night was when the brothers introduced their sister Bonnie Avett Rini, who had been playing piano on stage throughout their set, to join them on the gospel song "In the Garden."

Shortly after, there was an elongated drum solo that included looped rhythms that seemed to offer the musicians respite, with both lying on stage while their colleague pounded out an oddly satisfying five-minute solo.

They followed this with "No Hard Feelings" before ending with a joyful, upbeat "Ain't No Man." The bipolar set had emotions going all over the place but chose wisely to end with a lovely upbeat message of hope that is consistent with the band's usual messaging.

Throughout their set, it was hard to miss that the sound was unbalanced and just displeasing at times. Sound at SPAC has been hard this summer, but in this case, it was blaringly hard to tolerate as the Avett Brothers are known for their sweet sounds, not dissonance. When we walked outside, the sound improved some, which made me question if they just had everyone playing too loud overall.

Willie Nelson came on last to a very joyful crowd, many of whom were gray-haired admirers who couldn't wait to finally see the star for whom they'd been waiting.

Joined by his youngest child Micah, Nelson seemed to lean heavily on him for lyrics initially. As they got moving, though, Nelson's memory seemed to improve. His fingers recalled the right strings with consistency over Trigger, his famous guitar.

The music has changed a bit for Nelson, but so has life — for Nelson and the rest of us. He's created a legacy, though, both in his family's musical talent and by extending that love to up-and-coming bands along the way. With "Will the Circle Be Unbroken," the answer is clear: Nelson has left his mark on the outlaw music scene. Forever blending bluegrass, jazz, rock, and traditional country, Outlaw Fest is a celebration of how all genres fit together to synergistically lift us all.

Jim and I worry every time we see Nelson it will be the last, as his age is progressing and no one would begrudge the man a season of rest. We left SPAC realizing that even without Nelson, Outlaw Fest will continue and carry his message of inclusion forward. We will come again, year after year, in pilgrimage to this legend, and we hope you'll join us on the crusade as it passes through again next year.



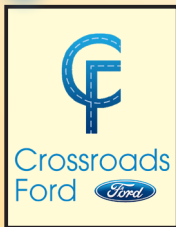

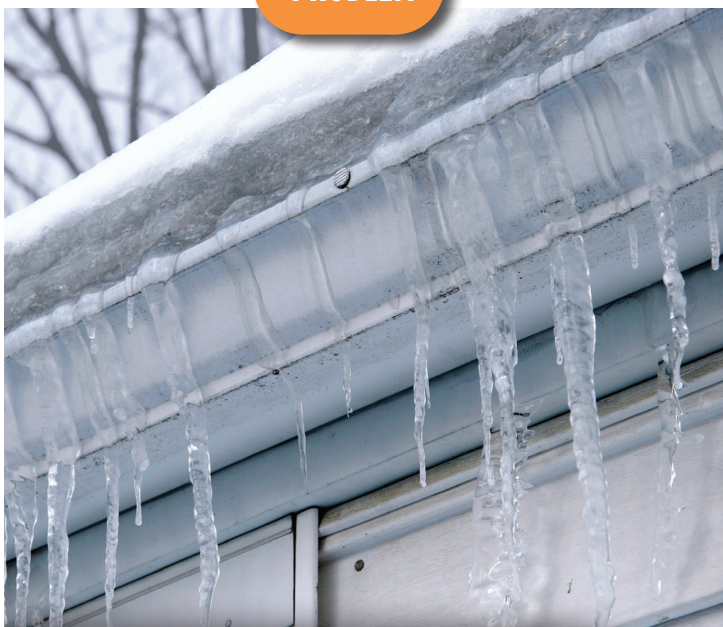
