Consummate educator

Former BCMS Principal Fred Burdick remembered

DELMAR — Frederick C. Burdick, a popular educator known best as principal by generations of students at the Bethlehem Central Middle School, died on Friday, Oct. 28, at the age of 91.

His peers described him as a "very traditional guy" while his boss called him a "true elder statesman," yet he was also praised as an innovator and for his flexibility to change.

"I've never worked with a better, more effective principal," then Bethlehem Central Superintendent Leslie Loomis said in 1994, three months shy of Burdick's planned retirement from the school after 37 years with the district. "Fred is a true elder statesman, with complete mastery and awareness of every aspect of principalship.'

Delmar man faces child porn charges

DELMAR — On Thursday, Oct. 27 the Bethlehem Police arrested Michael J. Kaprielian for possessing child pornography. The investigation originated when the U.S. Department of Homeland Security developed information that a subject was file sharing child pornography files on the internet.

The investigation electronically traced the activity back to Kaprielian, 54 of Delmar and he has been charged with promoting a sexual performance by a child and possessing sexual performance by a child, both felonies.

Kaprielian allegedly acquired video in January of very young children performing sexual acts and then reposted the files later

in August.

According to reports, he did not make the videos and the victims were not from this area. Kaprielian was arraigned in Bethlehem Town Court and released. A return date was set for Tuesday, Nov. 15.

Krage named detective

Krage promoted as Bethlehem PD's first female detective

DELMAR — The Bethlehem Police Department promoted Caitlyn Krage to Detective last week and the sevenyear veteran has been a ground breaker.

Krage, 30, is the first woman detective and is also the only person to be promoted directly from the position of Patrol Officer.

"Caitlyn Krage has always been a dedicated, conscientious and hardworking officer, already making a big impact in our community earning two lifesaving awards within two years" Bethlehem Police Chief Gina Cocchiara said. "In 2021 she was transferred from patrol and assigned to the Special Services Division as a Community Services Police Officer and has already begun forging relationships with community members, school staff, children and

Does prop firehouse pass the test?

First order for new Selkirk firehouse will be to overcome zoning regulations

SELKIRK — The fire district recently took its first formal step to seek approval from Town Hall to build its new fire station on Route 9W

Officers from the Selkirk Fire District presented its case last month before members of the Bethlehem Zoning Board, arguing that the benefits of building its proposed 21,800-square-foot fire station at 1160 Route 9W would outweigh the need to adhere to the plot of land's permitted residential zoning.

The proposed fire station is one part of two projects in which the Selkirk Fire District is planning to

update its outdated facilities. District residents overwhelmingly approved two measures with a vote in 2020, allowing for two bonds totaling \$11.8 million for the construction of a new firehouse and the renovation of another

Because the proposed firehouse falls under a public project, it need only to pass what the state has defined as a "balancing of interests" test to deem it exempt from local zoning regulations. A series of nine factors are considered, including the scope of the project, its proposed function and use, and what kind of impact the project would have on legitimate local interests.

The empty plot abuts A.W. Becker Elementary School, just south of Becker's Corners in Selkirk. The fire district purchased the land seven years ago with plans to construct a new facility that would replace their aging buildings. Its most modern facility was built over 50 years ago.

Plans for the plot of land have varied over the years. The fire district first proposed an ambitious plan to replace all three of their current houses with a \$17.8 million, 34,091 square-foot headquarters in 2018. That proposal was rejected by voters. Residents approved the current plan, however, by a 5-to-2 ratio.

The fire district plans to close and sell Selkirk Station No. 1 on Maple Avenue. Built in 1928, fire district officials have said that the station is too small for today's modern equipment and the lack of space poses health and safety issues for firefighters. Volunteers from this house are called on to respond to potential chemical fires at SABIC Innovative Plastics, the CSX Rail Yard and others.

The application was tabled by the zoning board, to be determined first by the Albany County Planning Board.

ECOncrete Tech Ltd., global provider for bioenhancing concrete technology, partnered with Holcim US, the country's leading cement producer. According to a Holcim US statement, the two companies "are redefining offshore scour protection through the development of a novel concrete unit."

"The unit's ecological properties mimic natural marine habitats' features while providing the armoring functionality required for scour protection," said Dr. Ido Sella, CEO and Co-Founder at ECOncrete Tech. "Offshore wind projects that integrate nature-inclusive technologies are able to gain ecosystem services not achievable before. The ecological uplift and long term functionality of ecologically sensitive solutions can mitigate some of the associated impacts of offshore infrastructure. The ecological performance will be verified through comprehensive scientific monitoring comparing the bio-enhanced system to the standard rock based scour protection to set new industry standards for responsible construction."

This project provides the first and only structural solution that benefits both foundation resiliency and the local marine ecosystem. In a recent technical report, The Nature Conservancy (TNC) recommended ECOncrete's nature-based design for cable protection and scour protection. ECOncrete technology is also featured in the Wind Energy Monitoring & Mitigation Technologies Tool developed by the International Energy Agency Wind Task 34 (WREN), the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, and the National Renewable Energy Laboratory, as well as in the Dutch government nature inclusive design catalog for offshore wind infrastructure. "The Nature Conservancy believes there is great potential in intentionally designing and constructing materials used in offshore wind energy development in ways that are intended to create habitat for fish and other marine life."

A native of Clinton, just outside of Utica, Burdick earned an undergraduate degree from Hamilton College before proceeding to Albany State Teacher's College to obtain his master's degree.

His teaching career would be put on hold as he went off to serve two years in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict. Once he returned to civilian life, he was hired by Bethlehem Central to be a high school English teacher.

Burdick seldom, if ever, walked the middle school halls without wearing a full suit and tie. He stood tall, with a slender frame, and he had a quiet demeanor about him. Nonetheless, he possessed a deep, baritone voice that would snap everyone at attention whenever a student stepped out of line.

He'd be tasked with wrangling students under control once he was named the high school's first assistant principal In 1957. He'd also be responsible for phasing out the junior high school structure, which instructed grades seven to nine in one building. The current instructional model would be adopted in 1969, a year after he was named principal of the new middle school.

In addition to his role as the school's head administrator, he was the health education training coordinator for eight school districts. As the culture around the country changed around Vietnam War protests and illicit drug use, he spent the early 70s training teachers from fifth to seventh grade on how to impress upon children the dangers of tobacco, alcohol and drug abuse.

Author Beth Anderson turned to him while composing her book on the history of the school district. Like the two generations of students who walked through the school building on Kenwood Avenue, she knew him from her time as a student, then as a substitute teacher.

"He was gracious and informative," she said. She added how he was responsible for introducing a foreign language curriculum to the school, sharing knowledge from her research. "Fred really ran with that mid-1960s middle school trend."

In 1993, just a year before his retirement, Burdick was honored as the Capital Area School Development Association named him Principal of the Year. The award followed a year in which he shepherd a shared decision-making process, restructuring the building's leadership hierarchy that allowed for a collaborative share of authority. What evolved into the School Improvement Team and the Restructuring Task Force produced a new, daily constructional schedule that increased class time by 25 percent.

"He's a very traditional guy, and I thought he'd never give up his authority," Robert Salamone said afterward. "It's unusual to see someone so late in his career grow so much."

Burdick was a well-read man who while in retirement would pen a book of his own. He held varied interests that coincided with his commitment to the community, having served as chief Election Inspector for the Bethlehem Central budget voting and the

"While our time here in the district never overlapped, Fred Burdick's reputation was well-

known to me during my own tenure as principal at the middle school," said Bethlehem Central Superintendent Jody Monroe. "He was wellrespected across the school community having spent his entire career at BC, first as a teacher and then as an administrator. As principal, he oversaw the school's transition from a junior high that served students in grades 7 through 9 to the 6-8 middle school we know today. His leadership and guidance at BCMS helped improve teaching and learning for thousands of students.

In retirement, he worked at Capital Region BOCES, helping in the regional scoring process for the fourth, sixth, and eighthgrade New York State ELA Tests. He also remained active within the church just down the street, St. Thomas the Apostle. There, served as a communicant and Eucharistic Minister of the Church of St. Thomas the Apostle, and as the Pastoral Council with the St. Thomas School Board. He also involved himself in committees of finance, buildings and grounds, auditing and more recently on the Diocese of Albany Pastoral Council.

Burdick was predeceased

by his wife and best friend of 60 years, Patricia Curry Burdick, and by his older brother and sister, H. Blake and Diane. He is survived by their four children, Mary, Peter, Melissa and Thomas; his brother Daniel; eight grandchildren and several nieces and nephews. His life was celebrated in a Mass of Christian Burial at St. Thomas the Apostle Church, 35 Adams Place, Delmar, NY on Monday, Nov. 7. Calling hours were held on Sunday, Nov. 6. at the Daniel Keenan Funeral Home, Inc., 490 Delaware Ave. Albany.

Burial will be at the convenience of the family. In lieu of flowers, donations may be made to Capital City Rescue Mission, 259 S. Pearl St., Albany, NY 12202 or the Hospice Inn at St. Peter's Hospital, 315 So. Manning Blvd., Albany, NY 12208.

"The good values of Bethlehem students and parents have been a constant," Burdick told The Spotlight before he left the school. "I will miss the students, the faculty and the many parents who were most helpful, particularly in the last 10 years.



Recently rebranded as The Collaborative School of the Arts, Proctors's education programming works as a part of a collaborative effort across the region.

"It's for Proctors, Capital Repertory Theatre in Albany and Universal Preservation Hall in Saratoga," explained Sheehan. "It's all our education programming wrapped up into a school."

Freddy Ramirez is a performer, choreographer, and teacher. He teaches for Proctors and Capital Repertory,

as well as his own classes. Currently, he is choreographing Capital Repetory's upcoming performance of The Wizard of Oz. "I kind of piecemeal my work. That's how I became a teacher."

Originally from the Bronx, Ramirez was a Broadway performer. He toured the United States and Europe in productions of West Side Story, A Chorus Line, Grease, Cabaret, The King and I, Peter Pan, Oliver, Kiss Me Kate and more.

"The second chapter of my life is to be an instructor," he explained. "Up here in Upstate New York, there's not really a lot of opportunities for a Hispanic male dancer to be working in shows in the area."

"A lot of what we talk about here at Proctors is the creative economy," said Sheehan. "Many of our skilled students in the area, when they come to college here, then they leave the area. What we want to do is train and retain these innovative artists so that they can work in the area and find it a wonderful place to live."

"The business of arts and performance up here is very tricky," said Ramirez. "There are opportunities, but it's not consistent throughout the entire year. You won't be able to really support yourself, your family, or your lifestyle up here. That's why I got into teaching."

"There are a lot of passionate kids out there who may not have access to what they really want to do with their lives," he added.

"There are over 30,000 jobs in the creative sector in this region," said Sheehan, "but many students don't have the understanding or training to access them. Part of our mission is so they understand that they understand there are these opportunities, and the other part is to train them in those opportunities."

School within a school

"Theatre is a passion-driven career," said Ramierz. "Most people don't realize that you can make a living out of the arts, even though it's hard."

Proctors has made it their mission to train students for careers both on and off the stage. "A lot of what we do is prepare students for off-stage careers," said Sheehan.

"A lot of kids don't understand the many administrative careers that are also available in the performing or creative arts arenas. We try to make sure that the students understand that there are a wide number of opportunities across the industry for them if they don't want to be onstage."

"We have classes going on all through the day, into the evening. We have after-school programs. Hundreds of kids come to school here throughout the day," she described.

"We provide an exposure experience to the arts. We let them see performances," said Sheehan. "The engagement part is where we start to cultivate smaller class sizes in career-based programming."

Proctors provides a wide variety of classes. Broadway Tech

assists students in networking with major companies, such as Disney Theatrical Productions.

"Students have the opportunity to come here and take sessions from those industry professionals and also learn from the designers and technical crew of a Broadway show," said Sheehan. "They'll also be able to observe backstage when that happens."

Students are able to study every aspect of "costuming, wardrobe, lighting, and sound." Sheehan added, "Sometimes even the producer will be able to come talk with them."

Having established artists and companies, such as Disney Theatrical, become acquainted with the students and give workshops is one way Proctors helps students network for future careers.

"We will help students network to make sure they do what's needed," said Sheehan. "We continue to be a support and a mentor to them to help them understand about working in the industry."

In Saratoga, Rock Camp is a summer training program appealing to aspiring young musicians. Broadway Camp is for



students interested in pursuing theatre. Ramierz is a teacher at Broadway Camp.

"Broadway Camp is where we produce a full-scale musical on our main stage and offer free professional-level training for actors, musicians, and production students," explained Sheehan.

"Come to see everything that's presented, because from where

According to The Collaborative, there are 30,000 jobs available in the arts in this region alone. The school helps each student understand not only the responsibilities for those jobs, but how to access them.

we start to where we end up, it's a magical journey," encourages Ramierz. "We're always very proud of the productions that we present. It's always a magical experience when we get to the final product."

"Proctors has so much that they offer for kids to learn and experience, from the tech aspect, the lighting, and costuming, to singing, dancing, and acting," said Ramierz. "It's a wonderful opportunity for people, however old they are, whether they are teenagers or adults."

What Ramierz loves most is "the impact that it has on my students." Some of his students have moved on to do theatre work. "It's great to be a part of their progression into the world of theatre."

"I'm very lucky to still be dancing and to pass the torch, as it were, to my wonderful students and still get that joy of performing, whether I'm teaching class, performing, or choreographing," he said.

"Cultural organizations like Proctors and others across the region can offer a great deal to train and retain artists," commented Sheehan. "We're all collaborators in a higher mission to make sure that the entertainment industry stays vibrant."

Imaginary City- The large-format, abstract paintings of Tomm El-Saieh (b. 1984, Port-au-Prince: lives and works in Miami) teem with dense and dynamic marks that evoke ornament, language, and architecture. By variously layering and erasing his linework, and using vibrant color to optically push or pull his pictures, El-Saieh creates rhythmic, forms appear to emerge—testing both the limits of our perception and our expectations about abstraction. The exhibition title, which comes from one of the works in the show, refers to a cityscape theme common in Haitian art (Vilaj Imaginé). El-Saieh's paintings, which resemble informal urban plans, likewise develop intuitively, without the use of preparatory studies or outlines. For the artist, who has been unable to return to his birthplace in recent years as a result of the instability there. Port-au-Prince now also exists mainly as a figure in his memory and imagination—a site of joy and trauma, potential and uncertainty.Tomm El-Saieh was born in Haiti and grew up in Miami: he is of Haitian, Palestinian, and Israeli descent. He was the subject of a solo show at the Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA) Miami in 2018 and was included in the New Museum triennial in New York that year. He is partner at the artist-run gallery CENTRAL FINE in Miami and long directed the El-Saieh Gallery in Port-au-Prince, a venue for contemporary Haitian artists that his grandfather established in the 1950s. This yearlong exhibition appears in public spaces around the Clark and is free and open to the public. It is organized by the Clark Art Institute and curated by Robert Wiesenberger, associate curator of contemporary projects. This exhibit goes from January 29th through December 31st. 

Office Culture / Gary's Dream / **Domestic Drafts**

Brooklyn band Office Culture is made up of four longtime collaborators: singer and songwriter Winston Cook-Wilson (Winston C.W., vocals/keyboards), lan Wayne (guitar), Charlie Kaplan (bass), and Pat Kelly(drums). Following the electronic avant-pop of their 2017 debut album I Did the Best I Could, the band's acclaimed sophomore LP-2019's A Life of Crime—unveiled a lush, jazz-inflected sound that Pitchfork described as "sleek music for a cursed place, opulent like a ritzy hotel lounge." 




