

Bail jumper nabbed

GUILDERLAND —

On Tuesday, Nov. 1, State Police arrested Da-Mir Willis, 26, of Albany in the Town of Guilderland on a warrant issued by the Albany City Court on October 31, 2019, when Willis failed to appear for the court on August 23,

He was transported to State Police barracks in Guilderland for processing on the additional charge of bail jumping, a felony. Willis was turned over to the Warren County Correctional Facility to await arraignment on an additional warrant out of Queensbury Town Court.

Probation for extown employee

DELMAR — A local man convicted of stealing over \$94,000 worth of copper and brass material from the Bethlehem Water Department was sentenced to five years probation and restitution on Thursday, Nov. 16 by Judge Roger D. Mcdonough in Albany County Court after a plea

The plea also included \$94,309.37 in restitution from Matthew Stipe, 33, of Delmar. \$5,000 of the amount is due to the town and the remainder is to the insurance company that reimbursed the town for the loss. At the end of probation, any amounts left unpaid will be converted to a confession of judgment, according to the Albany County District Attorney's office.

On Jan. 11 Bethlehem police arrested Stipe, a Bethlehem Water Department employee, for allegedly stealing what was estimated, at that time, to be worth \$63,481.19 of copper and brass from the town. Further inventory by the town uncovered that he took much more than originally thought.

He was charged with grand larceny, a felony, was arraigned and released at that time.

On Nov. 15, 2021, Water Department staff reported the materials missing from a storage building at 308 Kenwood Ave. to police after staff took inventory of the metals and found a substantial deficit.

According to police, the thefts took place over a long period of time.

Schools ordered to drop 'Indian' mascots

Districts face pulled state funding if they don't comply by end of next year

ALBANY — New York public schools still sporting "Native American symbols or depictions" have been ordered to retire their mascots by the end of the next school year following a court ruling that decided against one school that sued to keep theirs.

Cambridge Central School District is one of approximately 60 school districts in New York that has kept its "Indians" mascot despite a 2001 state education department memorandum ordering schools to drop the offensive name.

"Those school districts that continue to utilize Native American team names, logos, and/or imagery without current approval from a recognized tribe must immediately come

into compliance," stated James N. Baldwin, Senior Deputy Commissioner, in a statement shared on Thursday, Nov. 17. "Should they require guidance, districts may reach out to those districts that successfully retired their mascots or their local Board of Cooperative Education Services."

Ravena Coeymans Selkirk is among those school districts that have continued to carry the Indians name. The image of an arrowhead affixed to a spear is depicted on both the football team's helmet and playing field.

Baldwin said the department is developing regulations and said that should a district fail to commit to replacing its team name, logo, and imagery by the end of the 2022-23 school year, the punishment could include the removal of school officers and the withholding of State Aid.

The Cambridge school district had voted to remove the name in 2020, only to have to decision reversed the following year by newly elected members on the board who didn't agree

with the measure. Community members balked, appealing to the Commissioner of Education under Education Law.

When the commissioner ruled against Cambridge, the school district appealed to the state Supreme Court which affirmed the determination in June. The court stated that the continued use of the 'Indians' nickname and imagery was an "abuse of discretion."

In 2001, former Commissioner of Education Richard P. Mills issued a memorandum "conclud[ing] that the use of Native American symbols or depictions as mascots can become a barrier to building a safe and nurturing school community and improving academic achievement for all students."

The recent decision cited the Dignity for All Students Act, prohibiting "the creation of a hostile environment ... that ... reasonably causes or would reasonably be expected to cause ... emotional harm to a student," a condition that could be created

through the use of Native American mascots.

"Schools are learning environments; students learn as much through observation of their surroundings as they do from direct instruction," Baldwin stated. "In addition to their legal obligations, boards of education that continue to utilize Native American mascots must reflect upon the message their choices convey to students, parents, and their communities."

The education department included additional studies and literature arguing that the continued use of Native American mascots, often portrayed based on stereotypes, was harmful to both Native and non-Native Americans.

"Thus, the court's decision establishes that public school districts are prohibited from utilizing Native American mascots," Baldwin stated. "Arguments that community members support the use of such imagery or that it is 'respectful' to Native Americans are no longer tenable."

Owens Corning advances toward circular economy

TOLEDO, Ohio — Owens Corning took an important step toward reaching its circular economy aspiration with the announcement of enhanced shingle recycling efforts. By 2030, the company intends to recycle two million tons of shingles per year in the U.S.

The company has launched workstreams focused on two methods of shingle recycling: recycling shingles into new shingles and recycling shingles into asphalt pavement. Both approaches intend to reclaim 100 percent of the shingle to eliminate product waste.

Latham Group reports 3Q financials

LATHAM — Latham Group, Inc., the largest designer, manufacturer and marketer of in-ground residential swimming pools in North America, Australia and New Zealand, today announced financial results for the third quarter of its fiscal year 2022 ended October 1.

Third Quarter Fiscal 2022 highlights net sales of \$189.4 million, up 16.9 percent year-over-year, net income of \$11.9 million versus net loss of \$11.3 million in the prior year period, representing a 6.3 percent net income margin, adjusted EBITDA of \$42.3 million, up 17.0 percent year-over-year, representing a 22.3 percent adjusted EBITDA margin.

Nine Months Fiscal 2022 highlights included net sales of \$587.8 million, up 19.6 percent year-over-year; net income of \$13.3 million versus net loss of \$56.4 million in the prior year period, representing a 2.3 percent net income margin; and an adjusted EBITDA of \$138.9 million, up 23.5 percent year-over-year, representing a 23.6 percent adjusted EBITDA

Net sales for the third quarter of fiscal 2022 increased to \$189.4 million, up \$27.4 million or 16.9 percent, from \$162.0 million in the prior year's third quarter. The increase was primarily attributable to pricing actions to address inflation, partially offset by volume decreases in packaged pools, which were impacted by continued destocking in the wholesale distribution channel.

Gross profit for the third quarter of fiscal 2022 increased to \$58.9 million, up \$7.9 million or 15.5 percent, from \$51.0 million in the prior year's third quarter, primarily due to an increase in net sales and a \$1.2 million decrease in non-cash stock-based compensation expense. Gross margin decreased to 31.1 percent, from 31.5 percent in the prior year period, driven by pricing actions that offset inflation, although not at a magnitude to hold gross margins

year-over-year, and negative fixed cost leverage, partially offset by benefits from the build of inventory to return to normal lead times.

Selling, general, and administrative expenses ("SG&A") decreased to \$26.7 million from \$48.1 million in the third quarter of 2021, driven primarily by a \$19.4 million decrease in non-cash stock-based compensation expense. SG&A as a percentage of net sales decreased to 14.1 percent from 29.7 percent.

Net income was \$11.9 million, or \$0.10 per share compared to a net loss of \$11.3 million, or (\$0.10) per share, for the prior year's third quarter, driven primarily by the reduction in non-cash stock-based compensation. Net income margin was 6.3 percent, compared to a net loss margin of (7.0 percent) for the third quarter of fiscal 2021.

Adjusted EBITDA for the third quarter of fiscal 2022 was \$42.3 million, up \$6.2 million or 17.0 percent, from \$36.1 million in the prior year's third quarter primarily due to the increase in net sales, as well as the other factors described above. Adjusted EBITDA margin was flat year-over-year at 22.3 percent from the prior year period.





The Arts Center announces Public Art Light Festival

TROY — The Arts Center of the Capital Region recently announced the artist commissions for the inaugural presentation of Troy Glow, a five-week public art light festival in downtown Troy during the time of year when there is the least amount of daylight.

Starting Dec. 4, the Troy Glow festival will present six site-specific outdoor installations of light-based art created by regional artists. In addition, eight partner organizations will be participating in various capacities, for a total of 14 Troy Glow sites in a walkable route through historic downtown Troy.

To see every installation, the entire Troy Glow walk will take approximately 25 minutes. Running concurrently with the festival, there will be a Troy Glow exhibition of light art in the Arts Center's Main Gallery featuring work from the ten artist finalists who were selected through the regional public call for art that started the festival's curatorial process this spring.

Troy Glow projects and exhibition will be on view for five weeks: from Sunday, Dec. 4, the night of Troy's 40th Annual Victorian Stroll, through Sunday, Jan. 9.

The installations will officially be lit on Sunday, Dec. 4 at 5 p.m. in coordination with the lighting of the City of Troy's Christmas tree in Monument Square. Each art installation will be lit and on view every night upon sundown at 4:30 through 10 p.m.

Troy Glow was created by partners at the Arts Center of the Capital Region, Troy Cultural Alliance, and the Rensselaer County Chamber of Commerce to bring visitors, shoppers, and diners back to downtown Troy after two years of pandemic precautions, when many people moved to online commerce, frequent take out, and virtual events.

"Like all small cities, Troy really took a hit," says Arts Center CEO Elizabeth Reiss. "We wanted to invite people, through art, to return to Troy and support the restaurants, businesses, and arts intuitions that make it such a rich cultural hub in the Capital Region. And bonus, we can do that by paying artists to make beautiful things."

Troy Glow was curated by Judie Gilmore, the Director of Special Projects & Partnerships at the Arts Center who also created the Troy Master Plan for Public Art in 2016.


children and free meals for children under ten.

Imaginary City- The large-format, abstract paintings of Tomm El-Saieh (b. 1984, Port-au-Prince; lives and works in Miami) teem with dense and dynamic marks that evoke ornament, language, and architecture. By variously layering and erasing his linework, and using vibrant color to optically push or pull his pictures, El-Saieh creates rhythmic, all-over compositions from which larger forms appear to emerge—testing both the limits of our perception and our expectations about abstraction. The exhibition title, which comes from one of the works in the show, refers to a cityscape theme common in Haitian art (Vilaj Imaginé). El-Saieh's paintings, which resemble informal urban plans, likewise develop intuitively, without the use of preparatory studies or outlines. For the artist, who has been unable to return to his birthplace in recent years as a result of the instability there. Port-au-Prince now also exists mainly as a figure in his memory and imagination—a site of joy and trauma, potential and uncertainty.Tomm El-Saieh was born in Haiti and grew up in Miami; he is of Haitian, Palestinian, and Israeli descent. He was the subject of a solo show at the Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA) Miami in 2018 and was included in the New Museum triennial in New York that year. He is partner at the artist-run gallery CENTRAL FINE in Miami and long directed the El-Saieh Gallery in Port-au-Prince, a venue for contemporary Haitian artists that his grandfather established in the 1950s. This yearlong exhibition appears in public spaces around the Clark and is free and open to the public. The Flick

In a run-down movie theater in central Massachusetts, three underpaid employees mop the floors and attend to one of the last 35mm film projectors in the state. Their tiny battles and not-sotiny heartbreaks play out in the empty aisles, becoming more gripping than the lackluster, second-run movies on screen. With keen insight and a finelytuned comic eye, The Flick is a hilarious and heart-rending cry for authenticity in a fast-changing world. Whip up a meal for quick entertaining

Entertaining guests is a labor of love. Much effort goes into preparing a home for the arrival of friends and family, and that includes planning a menu that will accommodate as many people as possible.

Hosts and hostesses who are looking to take some of the work off of their plates can explore recipes that are less laborintensive. Slow cookers are the unsung heroes of the kitchen. While busy families often use them to prepare weeknight



meals, slow cookers also can be used when cooking for crowds. In such instances, they free up time for party hosts to tackle other jobs.

This recipe for "Sweet Southern Slow-

Cooker Ham," courtesy of the National Pork Board and Yummly, utilizes a fully cooked, store-bought ham and some sweet and savory accourtements. The ham can be served on its own, or be used to create delicious sliders. Since it serves 12, it's the perfect meal for a crowd.

Sweet Southern Slow-Cooker Ham

INGREDIENTS: Serves 12

- bone-in fully cooked ham (about 51/2 pounds)
- 1 cup apple cider
- 1/2 cup dark brown sugar
- 1/3 cup bourbon (preferably Kentucky)
- 1/4 cup honey
- 1/4 cup Dijon style mustard

4 sprigs fresh thyme

INSTRUCTIONS

Place the ham in a large slow cooker. Whisk the cider with the brown sugar, bourbon, honey, and mustard. Slowly pour over the ham. Scatter the thyme sprigs into the slow cooker.

Cook on high for 4 hours or on low for 8 hours, or until very tender. Remove ham to rest on a cutting board. Pass the remaining cooking liquid through a fine mesh sieve into a saucepan. Simmer for 10 minutes or until slightly reduced. Cut the ham into chunks or slices. Brush the cut pieces with the cooking liquid before arranging on a platter. Serve warm or at room temperature.

I came late to the party because my father didn't want to invest the \$40 in a converter that would allow me to see "The Mickey Mouse Club,""Walt Disney World," and "Rin Tin-Tin-Tin."

Chubby Checker brought back memories cemented into our cerebellums that reminded us of the wonder of "The Mickey Mouse Club," on Monday through Friday at 5 p.m. for an hour, and he reminded us that it was followed by the not-sowonderful news on TV stations around the country.

Chubby Checker's hour and 20-minute performance at Saturday's Rock and Roll Doo Wop Spectacular at Proctors Theatre in Schenectady was a call and response love fest with fans he embraced with "The Twist," a number one Billboard pop hit in 1960, and a dance that even nerds like me could do. A dance that allowed both men and women to enjoy emerging sexual freedom. A dance that Chubby calls "a strip tease with clothes

Never mind that at 81, Chubby can no longer whip his torso around in swivel hips, abandoned in a dance that forced Dick Clark to go off his standard game and book a relatively unknown African American artist. Pat Boone never did beat "The Twist" to the top of the charts, as he had with Little Richard's "Tutti Frutti" and other

potential R&B million sellers.

Never mind that Saturday night Chubby mostly eschewed the other dance songs like "The Fly" and "The Pony" that made him a star in 1960, in favor of renditions of other pops songs of the day like Bill Haley's "Rock Around The Clock," Jerry Lee Lewis's "Whole Lotta Shakin' Goin' On," Buddy Holly's "Peggy Sue" complete with its patented hiccup, The Beatles' "I Saw Her Standing There" and the novelty song "Soda Cracker" that he





admitted was stupid.

He was all about audience participation. He went deep into the crowd, pulling women out of their seats. "Get up," he ordered, demanding they abandon their arthritic pains and dance for us. He even grabbed one woman's cane, raising it in the air like a flag of freedom. He seemed to purposely go for women who were not fundamentally energetic or svelte. Pushed by his attention to them, to a person these women threw caution to the wind and swivel-hipped to abandon

with Chubby Checker versions of the old folks' boogie.

He ended the set, a culmination of four hours and five different acts with a statement that he's had a wonderful life and he told us all to remember God loves the people.

In an advanced interview, he said that at 81, "I just take one day at a time and enjoy the moment, and I realized that I have moments and I enjoy them. I have ups and downs, but when I look at the full picture, I also look at the glass being half full,

and not half empty."

Well, what is it that's in that glass I asked him because he's obviously a multi-millionaire? He doesn't have to do this. What is it that still turns him on? "The excitement of being Chubby. The excitement of being Chubby. There's only one Chubby, and I really would like more people to know about Chubby.

Like another teen idol, Dion, he's been married to the same woman for more than four decades. Dion's wife doesn't care about his music. She only cares that he carries out the garbage and does the dishes.

"He's got the right idea," said a humble Chubby Checker. "I don't get caught

up in my stardom. And I don't get caught up in my career. I keep it stupid. You come around my house and I'm on my tractor, cutting bushes or planting flowers. When it's time for the music, I'm there. When the music is over, there are other things to do, and I do that, too That's what I do."

There were three surprises of the night. The first was the impassioned and nuanced delivery of four songs by Trish Anderson. A greatgrandmother who looks like she might need an I.D. to get into any bar, she is best known locally for her work with The Bluz House Rockers. Here, she was supported by the Duprees backup band, one of three

crack groups that were the wind beneath the wings of each act Saturday night. Joining her on vocals was Trez Gregory, former backup singer for Brooks and Dunn. While the unstated goal of most acts on classic oldies concerts is to deliver each song as close to the original as possible, Trish offered interpretations that made me believe she'd written each number and was delivering it for the first time.

The second surprise was a stunning performance by The Doo Wop Project, five Broadway stars from "Jersey Boys" and "Motown: The Musical." I admit to having a prejudice against the artifice of Broadway

musicals, but these guys performing for the first time as part of an oldies package made up in their relatively young age and explosive energy for the other much older acts. They did Frankie Valli and Smokey Robinson so expressively that it made me believe that doo-wop will never die.

The third surprise was the chaos of going almost head-to-head with the annual Schenectady Christmas parade. Finding a parking space caused Magic Radio's host Van Patton to quip that he had to park in Colonie. The crunch caused promoter Jim Anderson to decide



"Empty Signs" by artist Adam Frelin.

Location: Donna's Italian Restaurant, Broadway & Franklin Alley

Troy Glow's signature project was created by artist, Troy resident, and Troy Glow Artistic and Technical Director, Adam Frelin. 
