Silk and Wool Fabrics

Wool and silk fabrics are very popular in dresses, suits, and coats. It is predicted that these fabrics will come into greater fashion importance. The majority of them contain approximately 86% wool and 14% silk. These fabrics are made with a pure silk dye yarn in the lengthwise direction of the fabric, and a yarn-dyed wool yarn in the crosswise direction. The fine silk yarns are almost invisible, and the heavy wool yarns, which are predominantly on the surface of the fabric, give it a wool-like feel. There are variations of color, weave, and proportion of silk to wool yarns in this class of fabrics.⁷¹⁷⁹

Mr. Clay Hardin, Chief Analyst of the Textile Analysis Department of the National Institute of Drycleaning, states that there have been many failures of these fabrics in wear, resulting in customer complaints even before garments reach the drycleaner. The complaints fall into six classifications.

The silk yarns have a very low tensile strength and break in areas where the garment is subjected to strain during wear. Some of these fabrics show yarn slippage or shifting. This occurs where the garment has been darted, tucked, or seamed. Some of these fabrics have a tendency to fray badly, which causes bound buttonholes to look ragged with a short period of wear. Seams that are cut too narrow may fray or ravel badly too.

In some fabrics, the wool fiber works to the surface. The fabric looks and feels as though it has grown a beard. In others, the wool fibers work to the surface in little "pills" or "balls." There have been a few cases where the customer has complained of shrinkage. The latter is impossible to predict because of the inherent characteristics of fabric construction and the finishing methods employed by textile mills.
