

25 years ago, Mrs. Brin opened a small "specialty shop" in the living room of her home on Delaware Avenue near Second Avenue in Albany. It was the sort of shop so many women toy with the idea of running, little dainty things, a tinkle bell on the door to herald a customer's arrival that put an end to whatever household chore was in the doing. From this innocent beginning mushroomed a real "little department store." Like Topsy, it "just growed," except that growing is inevitably a bit painful and more than a bit of work.

First, when the walls were bulging with stock, the entire flat where the Brin family lived became store and the family moved upstairs. Mr. Brin gave up his own business and pitched in. Then the back yard was taken in, and eventually the building next door. The whole family was pressed into service,




