

'GENTLE' WATERCOLORS BY J. C. HAND AT DELMAR PUBLIC LIBRARY

Trees and quiet rural scenes are dominant in the paintings of J. Coolidge Hand, now on exhibit in the Delmar Public Library.


Mr. Hand's uncluttered watercolors are simple scenes. A covered bridge, a stream and a tree give his calm peaceful effect in one picture; in another a birch tree and its surroundings capture a quiet woodland scene; while another is an empty road with bright autumn trees lining it. A pine tree dominates in one and in another a group of trees are backed by a mountain. They are gentle pictures done with craftmanship.

Mr. Hand, who lives on Kenwood Avenue in Delmar, considers watercolor painting a hobby. However in East Hampton, Long Island High School he won art awards given by Albert Herter, a summer resident and internationally known mural painter. After graduating from a Commercial Art Course at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, he worked for several years in the textile field. In addition to this, he assisted Hamilton King with decorative murals for private summer homes and also painted oil landscapes which were displayed and sold at the Guild Hall Galleading abstract painters, was a close friend of Mr. Hand.
