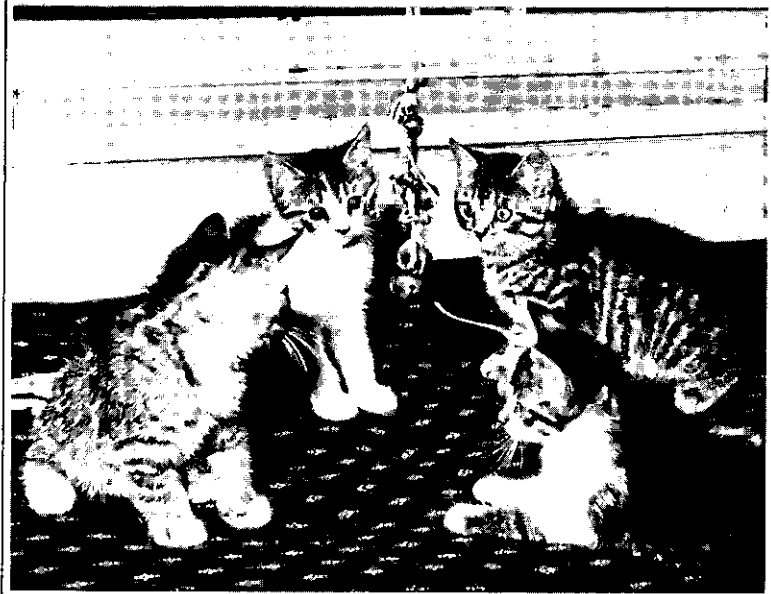

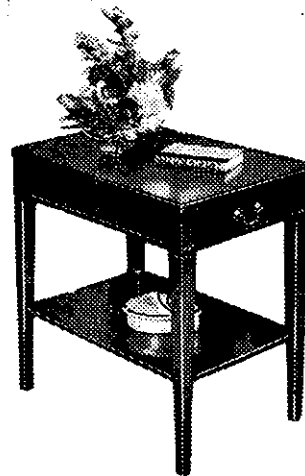

### 20TH CENTURY PAINTINGS AT ALBANY INSTITUTE

An important collection of 20th Century paintings by well known American and European artists is on exhibition at the Albany Institute of History and Art. It is a selection of watercolors from the Ferdinand Howald Collection loaned to the Institute by the Columbus Gallery of Fine Arts, Columbus, Ohio.

Ferdinand Howald, of Columbus, was a patron of the Arts, and a man who encouraged promising young painters throughout his life by purchasing their works, although his full collection is much larger than the 43 at the Institute and includes a few oils as well as watercolors. Two realistic drawings by Pablo Picasso demonstrate what an excellent draughtsman he can be. The "Aperitif" has the linear excitement of a Toulouse-Lautrec.

It has been said that any collection has a personality which reflects the personality of the collector and that to appreciate the quality of the Howald collection one must understand the pleasure and adventure involved in collecting the art which most vividly represents the creative efforts of one's own day.

Included in the exhibition, which runs through January 29, are paintings by Charles Burchfield, Charles Demuth, Preston Dickinson, George Luks, Stanton MacDonald-Wright, John Marin, Jules Pascin, Pablo Picasso, Maurice Prendergast, Paul Signac, Maurice de Vlaminck, Abraham Walkowitz and William Zorach.

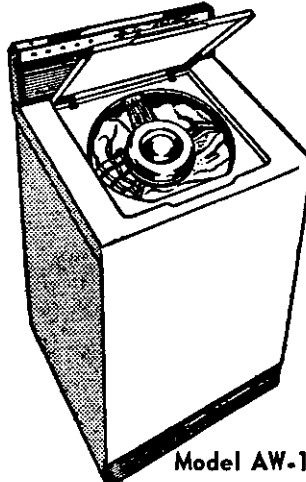

## 'GENTLE' WATERCOLORS BY J. C. HAND AT DELMAR PUBLIC LIBRARY

Trees and quiet rural scenes are dominant in the paintings of J. Coolidge Hand, now on exhibit in the Delmar Public Library.

Mr. Hand's uncluttered watercolors are simple scenes. A covered bridge, a stream and a tree give his calm peaceful effect in one picture; in another a birch tree and its surroundings capture a quiet woodland scene; while another is an empty road with bright autumn trees lining it. A pine tree dominates in one and in another a group of trees are backed by a mountain. They are gentle pictures done with craftsmanship.

Mr. Hand, who lives on Kenwood Avenue in Delmar, considers watercolor painting a hobby. However in East Hampton, Long Island High School he won art awards given by Albert Herter, a summer resident and internationally known mural painter. After graduating from a Commercial Art Course at Pratt Institute in Brooklyn, he worked for several years in the textile field. In addition to this, he assisted Hamilton King with decorative murals for private summer homes and also painted oil landscapes which were displayed and sold at the Guild Hall Gal-

leries in East Hampton.

Now, in the life insurance business, he continues to have a full schedule of extracurricular activities. He is a lay preacher in the Methodist denomination and has conducted some 48 services in the area over the past 2 years. He continues with his interest in painting, preferring watercolor scenes which "depict the beauty of nature around us." However, he has a keen interest in modern art and has many friends among the upstate artists as well as in Long Island. Jackson Pollack, who prior to his death was one of America's leading abstract painters, was a close friend of Mr. Hand.
