PAINTINGS BY VIRGINIA GRUBB ON DISPLAY

Award winning Virginia Grubb came to the Delmar Public Library on February 17.

Mrs. Grubb, recognized as one of the region's more sensitive artists, will present her watercolors in another of the series of one-man shows by Tri-Village artists. Her neighbors will see landscapes, still life, and interiors in a style that has won recognition for the Keith Road interpreter.

Watercolors are acknowledged to be one of the most difficult mediums in which to work. Handled by the expert they can become the most charming.

Mrs. Grubb has successfully challenged one of the most difficult tests in that medium, interiors. Her mastery of that challenge will be seen in the hangings at the Library show.


Fellow craftsmen report she has a "special touch" in interiors. These critics point to such details as the quality of wood, the effect of breeze upon window curtains (not easily done), and command of detail and texture.

Mrs. Grubb's talents were recognized many years ago. In 1941 she took top honors at the first show of water colors and oils sponsored by the State of New York in Syracuse.

LETTER

To the Editor of the Spotlight:
Some weeks ago you published a letter from Dr. Robert Alexander in which he intimated that the opposition to fluoridation had "stagnated" and that we were using the same old arguments, the substance of which had been largely exploded by more recent findings showing that fluorides in the drinking water couldn't possibly do any harm to anybody.

I forwarded this article to a dentist of my acquaintance. In replying, he called my attention to several items of recently published research in this field which may be of interest to Dr. Alexander and to your readers in general:

Reuben Feltman, D.D.S. Dental Digest, August 1956 Clinical experiments at Passaic General hospital gave these results: one per cent of the group treated showed allergic reactions to Sodium Fluoride tablets of recommended dosage. This could be interpreted to mean that in a community of 10,000 persons, 100 would be unfavorably affected by taking fluorides in the water. This is an insignificant percentage, statistically speak-ing - unless you happen to be one of the 100.

Ramseger, Smith and McCay Journal of Gerontology, Jan-

uary 1957

"Effect of Sodium Fluoride on body changes in old rats. "Nobody wants to be an "old rat, " I suppose, but the serious fact is that these experiments, which were conducted at Cornell University, were significant because they were "lifespan" studies in which full opportunity was afforded to observe the cumulative effects of fluoride ingestion. Observations on 456 rats thus studied revealed damage to teeth and gums with considerable loss of teeth resulting from low levels of fluoride intake.

P. Wallace-Durban Journal of Dental Research, December, 1954

"The metabolism of fluorine in the rat, using F-18 as a tracer." Tracer studies, using fluorine isotopes showed that fluorine in the most minute doses is cumulative in shortterm experiments.

George Waldbott, M.D. "Incipient chronic fluoride intoxication from drinking

water." Read before the 4th International Congress of Internal Medicine at Madrid, Spain, Sept. 24, 1956

Pub. in Acta Med. Scand., 1956

A report on 52 cases under Dr. Waldbott's observation.

To bring things right up to date: On January 2, 1958, there was published in the "Highland Park News" of Des Moines. Iowa (filed by Des Moines INS Dec. 27, 1957) a statement by Professor J. Earle Galloway of Drake University, opposing the introduction of fluorides in public water supplies. Professor Galloway is a bio-chemist and Head of the Department of Pharmacology at Drake. In his statement, the professor said that the trend of animal experimentation has raised a question as to the possible effects of fluorine accumlation on the growth and development of a child and on the

metabolic cycle, generally.

Thus, it may be said that, contrary to Dr. Alexander's assertion, the opposition to fluoridation is constantly gaining new ammunition from the objective results of laboratory and clinical observations by investigators of the highest calibre and reputation in the scientific com-

munity.







CURRIER AND IVES EXHIBIT AT ALBANY INSTITUTE OF ART

Of interest to printmakers and historians alike is the Currier and Ives exhibit at the Albany Institute of History and Art. It is a document of America as depicted by Nathaniel Currier and the firm of Currier and Ives who called themselves the "Printmakers of the American People. " The exhibit includes the prime prints from the Harry T. Peters Collection owned by the Museum of the City of New York, and loaned to the Institute for the month of February.

Nathaniel Currier's big chance came January 13, 1840, when the Steamship Lexington went up in flames in Long Island Sound. The editor of the New York Sun commissioned the young lithographer to make an illustration of the tragic scene. He employed W.K. Hewitt, an artist, to draw the scene, which the Sun published within three days, Currier had established his lithographic business in 1835 after apprenticeships in Boston and Philadelphia. The partnership with James Ives occurred in 1857 in New York, when he required bookeeping assistance; the firm continued until 1907.

Among the famous artists who painted for the firm were Louis Maurer, Fanny Palmer, Arthur F. Tait and George H. Durrie. The clipperships were done by James Butterworth who came from England and settled in Jersey. It was a fine arrangement for both artists and newspapers, as well as for the Currier firm.

NEW BOOKS AT THE Uelmar Libraru

THE RIGHT OF THE PEOPLE by Justice William O. Douglas of the United States Supreme Court, is his latest expression of what he considers to be our God given rights and priveleges secured by the First Amendment to the Constitution. The context is at one and the same time a chart for human behavior and a basis for seeing and resisting encroachments upon our liberties. This book is well worth the time and effort required to read it.

A SECOND LOOK AT AMERI-CA by General Emilio Aquinaldo and Vincente Pacis is a movingly human account of one man's opinion of us - an opinion which is remarkably objective, coming, as it does, from one who has every reason to be bitter toward us. Aguinaldo is the Phillippine General officer who resisted our forces for over two years at the latter end of the Spanish-Ameri-can War Period. The book abounds with his memories of intrigue and counter intrigue; risks plished; and then, finally, the slick trick which resulted in his capture and the termination of hostilities. This is an adventure story truthfully told and written in a style that will hold your interest.

VERDICT by Michael A. Musmannois an autobiography written by a man who came up the hard way to become a noted Pennsylvania lawyer and judge. Amusing at times, when he kids himself because of his discomfitures before the bar and heart wrenching, at others, when he relates the tragic circumstances of his clients. The story flows on evenly and absorbingly to its natural climax. The author is a sensitive writer with much to say that is of value to the thoughtful reader. The book is favorably recommended by the critics.




