Noted Artist to Speak at Camera Club Meeting

PAUL DARROW SHOWS PAINTINGS AT LIBRARY

President Taft and Governor Hughes were among his earliest admirers.

Park N. Darrow, whose one-man show is now at the Delmar Public Library, modestly conceals the fact that the chief executives of nation and state hailed his work when he was a young artist in Chatham. Charcoal drawings made of two of the nation's leading political figures, which he exhibited at the Chatham Fair, were sent to the White House and the Executive Mansion by friends of Taft and Hughes. They produced from both places the first warm critical appraisals of the work of the young Columbia County artist.

In High School, Mr. Darrow's interest turned to cartooning. He took a correspondence school course and had cartoons appear in the Chatham Courier. Along with this type of drawing he developed "chalk talks" which in later years he found helpful in business activities and social functions.

A graduate of Juilliard School, Mr. Darrow played the 'cello in the Delmar Orchestra a number of years ago and also in trios in the area.

Within the past 6 years, Mr. Darrow has been unable to follow his usual employment because of an injury. This also prevented him from following his hobby of playing the 'cello. He found himself with many unoccupied hours in the day, and, as a suggestion as to how to meet this situation, his family presented him with a complete set of oil painting equipment. He read many library books on the subject especially those for the beginner.

He discovered that experimenting in color is similar to stringing tone production on a stringed instrument. Drawing a bow over the 'cello strings to produce a beautiful tone, and applying color to a "canvas" with a brush or knife, have many

things in common, both mental and emotional.

Mr. Darrow is constantly experimenting. One of his particular delights seems to be that of the use of light in a picture. Most of his paintings have been made from magazine photographs which he may rearrange completely for his own picture, and from black and white snapshots. In these he enjoys trying to recall and reproduce the coloring of the scene.

His favorite picture is a portrait of his two boys rehearsing a piano duet. This painting was made from a newspaper picture taken when the boys were preparing for a recital. Another painting in the group at the Library is a "still life" loaned for the occasion by his five year old grandson. This painting features "Eddie Elephant," a small orange elephant pitcher greatly loved by all the children who have used it over the years.

Mr. Darrow has never taken any lessons in oil painting. He says, "I don't want to know about it and perhaps spoil the fun of painting."

Mr. Darrow's early training in drawing has aided him in his oil colors, and his experimental and creative approach has given vitality to his work. The delicate uses to which he has put his palette knife is most fascinating. The Library show features landscapes, "still life" works, and the excellent portrait of his sons.

The one-man show will continue until the middle of May.

SYMPHONY TO RETURN

The Albany Symphony Orchestra will play in Delmar again next year, Charles F. Stokes, orchestra president, indicated in announcing that subscriptions for the 1958-59 concert series will be taken during the week beginning April 14.

Doriot Anthony Dwyer, first flutist of the Boston Symphony, will perform the Mozart Concerto for Flute in G with the orchestra at Bethlehem Central High School on February 2, 1959.

Mr. Stokes said that the orchestra was anticipating the largest subscription list on its 28-year history. "Advance subscriptions already exceed 31 per cent of the past season's total membership," he said. "We always get a good many subscriptions for the next year at the final concert of the season, but the response from the capacity audience at this year's final concert in March shattered all records."

ENCOURAGE THEM

Here Are the Facts About School Transportation!

In New York State in the last 30 years there has been a phenomenal growth in pupil transportation. With the improvement of roads and the automobile, together with the development of the rural community, the bonds of rural isolation were broken. Consolidation and centralization of school districts began to spread. It was found more economical to transport pupils reasonable distances to central locations where, provided with larger school plants, teaching staffs, and facilities, pupils could receive all the services that good education can offer. Every year the school bus has undergone constant refinement in the direction of pupil safety, comfort, and economy of operation.

distance are considered to be non-quota pupils and all monies used in transporting these pupils must be provided by the district itself with no state assistance.

Transportation, to be successful, must be a cooperative enterprise and only teamwork will provide the necessary essentials for the safety of this "Priceless Cargo" of children. All members of the Transportation Team must cooperate in order that "not one child shall be injured, maimed or killed." Members of this team and their responsibilities may be defined as follows:

The Pupil - "He is his own best protector." He must recognize his responsibilities in this

In providing or granting transportation for children, sufficient transportation facilities shall be provided for all children who are in need of such transportation because of the remoteness of the school to the child. According to the provisions of the law, however, a school district is not required to furnish transportation to a child who, if a student in an elementary grade, lives less than two miles or, if a student in an academic grade, lives less than three miles from the school which he attends, measured by the nearest available road. There is nothing, however, to prevent a school district from providing transportation for its pupils who live less than the miles described in the provisions of the law except that such transportation policy provided by the school must be fair, uniform and consistent to all children concerned.

matter of self-preservation. He must have pride in the reputation of his school and himself. His conduct on the bus and his respect shall be a good example at all times.

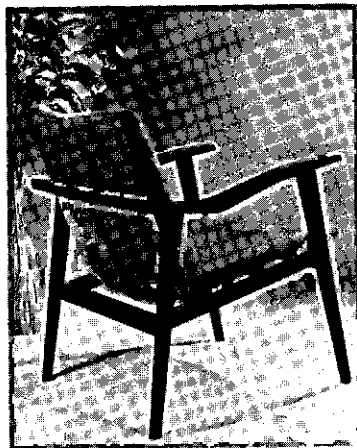
The Parent - "These are your children." Cooperation of the parent is vital to the success of the school's safety program. Parental obligations begin with the establishment of right attitudes of the child. Punctuality at a bus stop is most important. Don't expect a change in the schedules to suit your personal convenience. Don't expect service in keeping with the weather. If the pupil walks on good days he should expect to walk on bad days. The schedules are tight as regards time and equipment. In line with safety and economy you should help to keep it so. Parents are responsible for seeing to it that the pupils are at the scheduled stops on time. Time is a very important factor in the service. They also have the responsibility for seeing to it that the pupils are on good behavior on the buses and that they assist in every way possible in making the work of the drivers a success.

For the purpose of assisting those districts which are required to provide such transportation, a transportation quota is paid by the State of New York for pupils who are transported but only those who live more than one and one-half miles from the school attended. Therefore, it must be kept in mind that all pupils transported who live less than this one and one-half mile

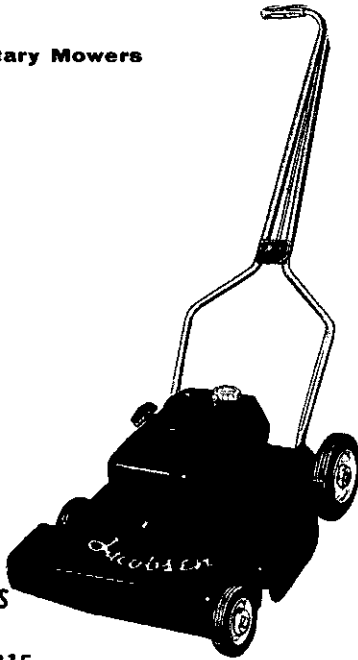

school safety program becomes effective in proportion to the degree in which people become safety conscious. It is the task of the teacher to develop this consciousness. Children must be drilled in safe school bus procedure from the first day of school.

The Board of Education - "You have accepted the responsibility." The school transportation policy established is of utmost importance. The establishment of sound requirements for the selection of school bus drivers, their appointment, their training, the equipment and the garaging is all the responsibility of the Board of Education.

The School Administrator - "Yours is the Operating Responsibility." Larger school units have created new responsibilities for the school administrator. Adoption of policies relating to transportation requires that such policies must be understood by bus drivers, teachers and pupils, if effective observance is to result.

The School Bus Driver - "These children are in your care." School bus drivers must be skilled in their work, love children, careful with their equipment, observe all rules and regulations relating to schedules, loading and unloading, loyal to their fellow members of the school staff, respect all traffic laws and cooperate with all members of the Transportation Team. They are the schools' representatives wherever their duties may take them.

Bethlehem Central School can be justly proud of its transportation program. This has been made possible only through careful planning, organization and supervision and the fact that people do work together. Good scheduling in this District makes it possible for one bus to do the work of three, thereby greatly reducing cost. Cooperation and Teamwork do pay big dividends.



...the Plaza parking lot where the Boat Show will open next Monday, April 21, was always flooded at this time of year and any attempt to cross it would have been by boat?

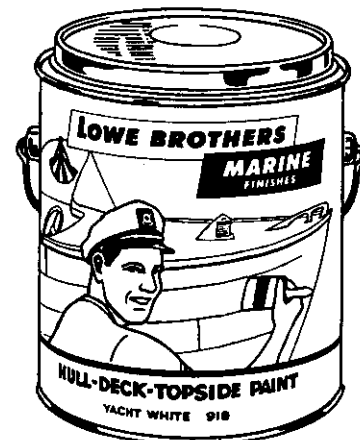
