

THE NEWLY INCORPORATED Tri-Village Nursery School will soon be making up its 1958-59 classes, it has been announced by Mrs. Leon B. Kromer, chairman. Anyone who wishes to receive an application blank should call Mrs. F.D. McCandless, the secretary. All application blanks will be sent out together early in May and the children will be accepted or put on the waiting list in the order that the completed forms are returned.

The nursery school, which will be starting its fourteenth year in the fall, enrolls sixteen threeyear-olds, ("chippies"), twenty-four four-year-olds, ("robins") and has a staff of two trained teachers plus a teacher's Classes are held in the Bethlehem Center School where there is also a large fenced play yard. 

Winner of the electric toy boat given by Toy Fair, was Louise Sutliff of Font Grove Road, Slingerlands.

The Boat Show, while never seeming to be crowded, was seen by an estimated 20,000 people who braved cold and wind to look over every popular boat, from a 9-foot row boat to the deluxe 25-foot inboard Pembroke cabin cruiser.

Both Bill Bennetts of Bennett Gun Works, were greeted by the many fisherman who visited their booth.

Most faithful in the boat show attendance were two men from the C.W. Whalen tent and awning firm of Troy, who spent 10 to 12 hours in each 24 working valiantly to keep the 40x80-foot exhibition tent in the air. BICYCLE SAFETY CHAIRMAN, ARTHUR FLEAHMAN, WRITES LETTER OF INVITATION TO FIREMEN TO AID PROGRAM

As you know, the Town of Bethlehem has recently adopted a bicycle ordinance effective July 1, 1958 providing for the licensing of all bicycles in the Town by the Town Clerk or his designees and their inspection by the Chief of Police or his designees.

While the Kiwanis Club of Delmar expects to make its persomel available to work with the Town Clerk and Police Chief, we have actively solicited the help of all the fire companies in assisting in the inspection and licensing of bicycles and the educational road test program to be associated with it. It is not expected or anticipated that any firemen will be called upon to accept or reject any bicycle offered for inspection or act as a designee above referred to.

The Delmar Fire Company has agrees to assist the Town Officials and Kiwanians in a "dry run" or a rehearsal to be held Wednesday evening, May 7 at 7:15 p.m. on the parking lot outside the Delmar fire station. In the event of inclement weather, the event will be held inside the fire house itself. All firemen of other companies who will participate in the program are urged to attend and witness the program as it planned to be officially carried out. Only a few bicycles will be involved. Immediately afterward we will adjourn upstairs either in the fire house or Town Hall for further demonstrations, questions, and answers and, at that time, we will work out the official inspecting and licensing dates in the various areas of the town.




