DELMAR FIRE COMPANY SCHEDULES CARNIVAL

THE DELMAR FIRE Department will hold it's Annual Carnival and Field Day on June 4, 5, 6, and 7, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday. Carnival activities will start each evening at 7 and on Saturday the booths will open directly after the parade. The features of this year's Carnival will include the Circus Train for the kiddies, an excellent selection of prizes to delight all ages, and something new for the Teen-agers, a booth filled with the most popular records.



Poor old "mackerel sky" didn't have a chance to tell us about "never long wet, never long dry," because the first bit of the prophecy had been so untrue. But the "mare's tails" (whose high clouds that streak in the sky like a running horse's tail) have a quicker result in relating their message: "its going to rain soon." At rare moments in the night when the lower clouds parted their message could be read.


Then there is the moon. There are many, many messages that can be read by the moon but the one many veterans hold by, is that we won't change until the

new moon. The new moon for May was the 18th. It wasn't an instantaneous process but we can't say it changed for the worse.

The Farmers' Almanac, which is printed in the fall, referred to the past winter as "a real humdinger." There are few who will dispute this sage remark. As to May of this year the Almanac is full of such expressions as "wind and rain," "cool with rain" and "seasonable storms." It could be a little confusing which of the storms were "seasonable" and which were not, but generally speaking the report was on the right track.

In their opinion June seems to hold a good deal of what June usually brings: "hot," and showers, and clearing.

As to the summer and what it will bring for vacations, sports and outdoor activities the Farmers' Almanac predicts that the first part of July is of the hot and dry variety generally and the storms should arrive in the latter part of the month. August has much of the same except that the storms are likely to come in the middle.

Other seers report that there is no question that with a long cold winter with much snow (that we've had!) and a wet spring (that we've had!) we will have a dry hot summer. Then there are those who shake their heads and report that there has never been a year like this one, and, that water will continue to be with us despite all usual signs of a drought.

You can take your choice: be a pessimist and assume this year is like no other, or, be an optimist and hope. Of course it's possible to straddle them both and enjoy what comes.
