

Greatest tribute ever paid t Dr. Thompson was by Samue Hopkins Adams in an article the Saturday Evening Post son eight years ago. Dr. Thompso has always been handicapped b very poor vision. Forty year ago doctors told him to sto reading and studying so much and conserve his eyesight. Ignoring this, Harold Thompson went on to do all that has been mentioned and more. Adams called him one of the most courageous men I have ever known. Professor Thompson will retire at Comell next June; however, he will continue to ignore the advice of 40 years ago and finish several books for which he just hasn't had time.

In addition, programs for State certification are offered in insurance, real estate, teaching the mentally handicapped, dental hygiene-teacher, school nurse, and school attendence officer. A pre-law program and a credit association award of three-years duration are also included in the fall bulletin now available on request at the division's Albany office at 258 State Street, or at the administration building, Troy campus of Sage.

The capital district and transportation clubs are also sponsoring through the Albany evening division classes in both elementary and advanced traffic with the cooperation of the College of Advanced Traffic, Chicago.

And in this decade, we have the Dutch Elm disease, which is making such heart-breaking inroads on the magnificent old Elm trees.

This disease was introduced into the United States from Europe in 1930 - and it is now known to have appeared in 24 states. It is carried from diseased trees or contaminated elm wood to healthy trees principally by the small European elm bark beetle. Symtoms that a tree may be diseased are the sudden wilting of a branch, the discoloration of outer sapwood, and the yellowing of leaves localized in one or more branches.

If undecided, a call to the New York State Conservation department will bring an expert consultant to help you. Sometimes it is necessary to take a living, wilting specimen to the laboratory for a final check and this they will do readily rather than condemn such beauty carelessly.

In spite of the many claims advanced for a cure, once a tree becomes infected with the disease, there is no treatment known at the present time that can guarantee recovery.

If we hope to see an Elm tree twenty years from now, we must all cooperate to the fullest. The Town of Bethlehem will take down diseased trees which are on its property; the State is constantly checking and removing such trees that are located on State property. If any such trees are not being removed, a call to either the Town Hall or the Conservation department will bring results. For the individual property owner, the cost is considerable. However, to insure the continuance of the elm, it should be borne as soon as possible. And remember for complete sanitation, all elm logs and brush must be completely burned!






