RICHARD SWARTZ REPORTS ON BOYS' STATE

Richard A. Swartz, son of Dr. and Mrs. David I. Swartz, 44 Douglas Road, Delmar, reported to his sponsors, the membership of the American Legion in Delmar, his experiences while attending Boy's State at Colgate University last June.

Upon arrival Richard was assigned to a city of from 32 to 35 boys; three cities comprise a county and ten counties go to make up the "state." As a member of the "Federalist" party Swartz was elected as the assemblyman from his county.

The 986 boys in attendance elected from their own government officials including a governor and a two house legislature.

Six bills were reported out of committee, debated and passed into "law." Among these bills were the Juvenile Delinquency Act which would, "Provide youth centers to be provided by schools, one for each 2,000 units of juvenile population; start a 'get tough' policy in police departments to reduce attempts at delinquency; inaugurate equality between crime and sentence so that a person would receive a man's punishment for a man's crime;" a Science Revision Act so that seventh and eighth graders would have two years of science before beginning high school; a Driver Education Act which would provide that all high schools offer a course in driving; an act providing for the written re-testing of licensed

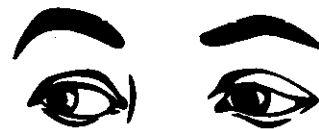
drivers and a periodic mental and road test for licensed drivers over 65.

In the past about two dozen bills passed by the government of Boy's State have subsequently been enacted by the New York state legislature.

Lawrence Appleby, president of the American Manufacturers was the principal speaker at a convocation of the boys at Boy's State. Included among the distinguished speakers were Howard Zeller, Justice of the Supreme Court of the state, Hon. William Calli, assemblyman from the host county, Lt. Charles Curtin of the New York State Police and John F. Keenan, New York Department Commander, American Legion.

Although the members of Boy's State formed a 90 piece band, edited their own newspaper, entered into debates and competed in many sports the basic purpose of Boy's State as initiated by the American Legion 20 years and 17,000 boys ago was summed up by Richard Swartz who told the Delmar legionaires, "Boy's State developed from the idea that youth should be offered a better perspective of the practical operation of government. It was founded on the concept of 'learning by doing,' having the boys themselves go through the steps of state government."

CHAMBER MEETING

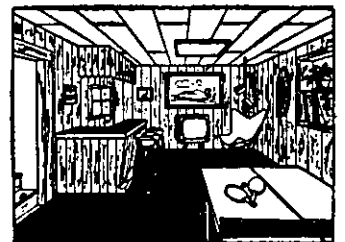

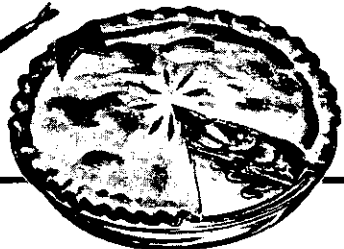

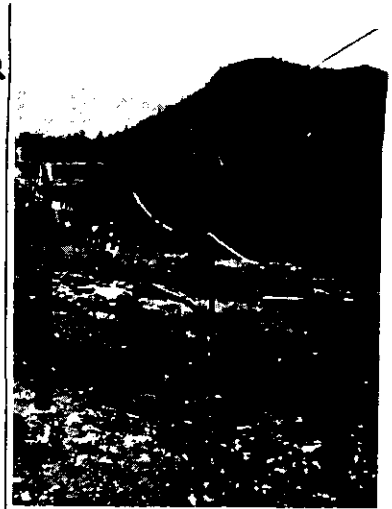

Want to be an arm chair mountain climber? It's easy! Many Delmarites have discovered this summer that part of "skiing" without snow can be thrilling.

Now, in this state, they can float over the steep parts of the mountain, gaze down at the rocky areas, move free and easy up the side of Little Whiteface Mountain, and stand on it's summit without drawing a deep breath or feeling a single aching muscle.

It was not an airplane or helicopter that accomplished this amazing mountain climb. It was the White Mountain Ski Lift.

This tremendous engineering job, built to carry the skiers to the many trails slashed on the side of the mountain, operated most successfully as a summer venture.

It is prepared to carry thousands more people to view the autumnal colors, which are now near their peak.

The two mile-long aerial chair-lift, at the big Adirondack Ski development, between Lake Placid and Wilmington, takes sight-seers to a spur of the main peak of Whiteface Mountain, the 5th highest in the Adirondacks. Two

people get on the lift simply by sitting down on the double-spaced chairs, as the continuously moving cable passes the loading platform. The ride is smooth and quiet with continual and varied views throughout. The vistas to be seen on the ascent are doubly enhanced this fall with the display of color, which Nature has given a final glorious spree to the whole country-side.

By winter, the lift is ready for its' real job of carrying the novice skier to the easy trails; those who have passed the beginner stage to the medium trails; and the skilled to the trails at the very top of Little White Face, which are the most thrilling.

The Whiteface Authority has been a long time in the making. New York skiers were found in all the neighboring states because New York was slow in developing its winter possibilities. However, now that this tremen-

dous project is in operation on a Bond Issue. (not the taxpayer's money), we have an area to match any other in the eastern states. The fees, which pay off the bond issue, are reasonable and are less if one desires to make both trips: to the top of Whiteface by road and to Little Whiteface by mountain-lift.
