HAITIAN DANCERS AT BCHS SATURDAY, APRIL 25

Among the featured performers in the Haitian Dance Group coming to the Bethlehem Central Senior High School on Saturday, April 25, is Alphonse Cimber, famed percussionist known internationally as "Haiti's genii of the drums." Mr. Cimber accompanies the troupe of five dancers, beating out the rhythms on the "mamma and papa" drums with his bare hands, according to custom. A highlight of the program is his solo, "Conversation for Drums."

The dance portion of the program is marked by wide variation in subject matter, fusing as it does the two cultural traditions of Haiti - the African and the French. Jean Leon Destine and his dancers present a program of strange and beautiful folk dances, ranging from a stirring native dance called "Revolt of the Slaves" and the "Witch Doctor Dance" to gay, light-hearted numbers such as "Creole Fantasy" and "Market Scene."

Destine and his company have performed in Mexico, Canada, Europe and the U.S., having starred on major television programs here and in Canada as well as before "live" audiences. Destine has been awarded the rank of Officier in the Legion d'honneur in recognition of his contributions to the artistic world. He and his group are touring under the auspices of the Republic of Haiti.

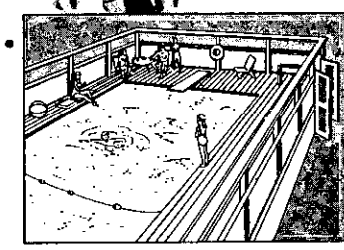

Nursery School Schedules Registrations For Fall

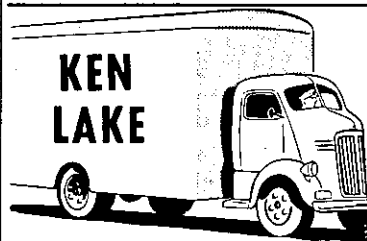
Registration for the 1959-60 sessions of Tri-Village Nursery School will take place in May. Enrollment is restricted to a limited number of children residing in Central School District #6 of the Towns of Bethlehem and New Scotland who will be 3 or 4 years of age on or before December 1, 1959.

Application forms should be requested from Mrs. Sherman A. Gates, 64 Adams Place, Delmar. All requested application forms will be mailed out at the same time early in May.

Next fall there will be two

groups of four-year-olds one in the morning and one in the afternoon - and one group of three year-olds in the morning only. Each mother will be required to participate approximately one half day per month, serving as a teacher aide.

The Tri-Village Nursery School occupies the Bethlehem Center School Building on Route 9-W at Feura Bush Road. The cost of bus transportation is included in the tuition. A cooperative, non-profit educational corporation, the school is chartered by the New York State Board of Regents and is a member of the National Association for Nursery Education.

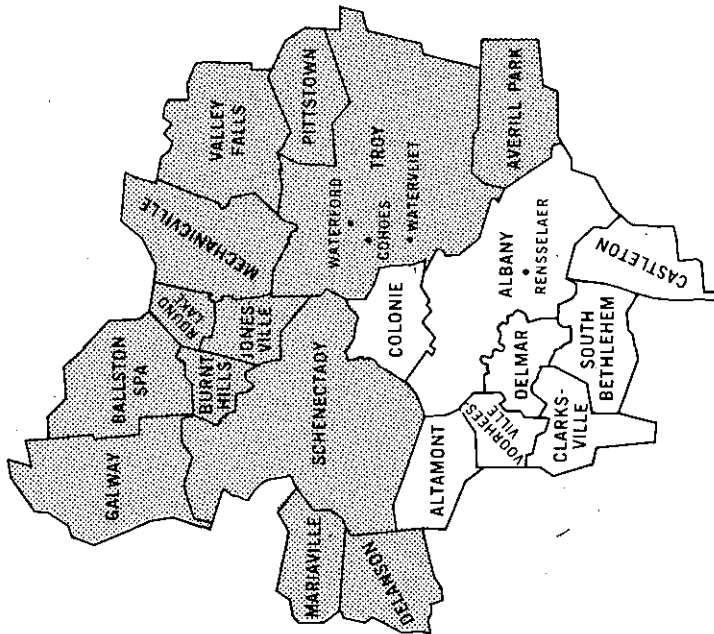

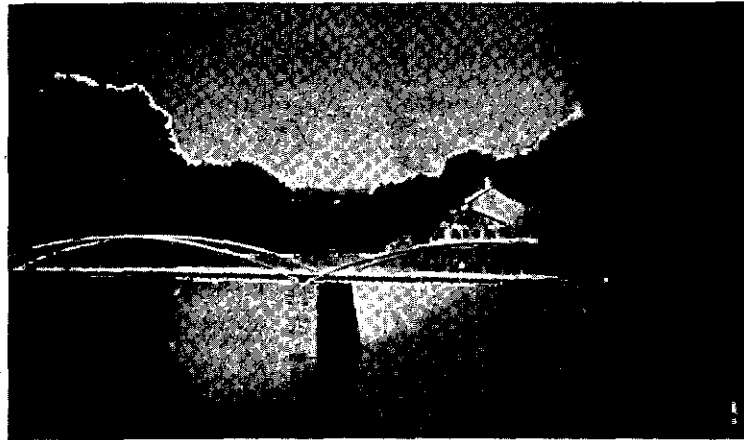
