In Upper Hudson Exhibit

Delmar is well represented in the Upper Hudson Regional Art Show which opened at the Albany Institute of History and Art last week. Two prize winners, Joseph Todak, 2nd prize in watercolors, and Edwin Becker, Honorable Mention in watercolor, were among 6 artists from the Delmar Area whose paintings now hang at the Institute.

From 608 entries in the Upper Hudson Regional Exhibit to eighty five paintings were chosen to represent the best of that group. Paintings came from as far north as Elizabethtown and from Vermont and Massachuesetts as well as surrounding towns and cities within a hundred mile radius of Albany. Delmar came near to equaling Albany in its number of painters with pictures chosen. There were six to Albany's seven. Edward Cowley of Altamont with his "Altamont Landscape" added a seventh for

Ioseph Todak of Nathaniel Boulevard won his award with a watercolor of a fall Landscape. When asked about his uses of technique he said "watercolors are nearer to the realistic while my oils tend to move closer to the abstract." The second prize winning watercolor was in what would very generally be called "impressionistic" and gave a definite feeling of fall in its color and design.

Edwin Becker who also lives on Nathaniel Boulevard won his Hon-Honorable Mention with a larger water color entitled "Bridge of Dreams. "

SEWER DISTRICT TAXES ARE GOING DOWN FOR 1960

Because Bethlehem was the first town to avail itself of Federal Aid to Sewer Districts, the taxpayers will benefit by a reduction in the 1960 tax.

The Delmar-Elsmere Sewer Commission has announced that through the use of Federal and State Aid in the construction of the new Disposal Plant, the retirement, of a 1938 and 1939 Bond Issue, and the final partial payment of the 30% Grant from the Federal Government. This saving will be passed on to the taxpayer as a saving to offset some of the 1960 Sewer Taxes.

The new, much needed Sewer Disposal Plant is now complete at a cost of \$300,000.00. represents the first major improvement to the Sewerage System since 1938. DESPITE THIS EXPENDITURE THERE WILL BE NO INCREASE IN THE TAX RATE. This is brought about by the retirement of two BOND ISSUES: one of 1938 and one of 1939 which matured this year.



The savings in toll call charges will, in many cases, more than offset the increase of three cents or less a day in basic monthly rates for service, according to C.D. Hubbard, division manager. Another step in the program, he said, is the introduction of Direct Distance Dialing which will enable customers here to dial their station-to-station calls to most telephones in the United States.

The program will bring a new convenience to telephone service, he added,

"We are certain," Mr. Hubbard said, "that this expanded calling feature will meet most of the telephone needs of people here, and we are ready to invest the money to provide it. If our customers want it - and we believe they do - and the Public Service Commission approves it, we are prepared to introduce toll-free service throughout the area in late 1961. Facilities for Direct Distance Dialing will go into operation the following year."

He pointed out that "the continued growth of this area and and the increased community of interest among the cities and villages reflect a definite need for expanded toll-free calling."

Under the local plan, Delmar and South Bethlehem telephone users will be able to call toll-free to at least 275,000 telephones - more than twice the number they can now reach. This will happen because Delmar's present local calling area, which includes Albany, Altamont, Castleton, Clarksville, Colonie, Delmar, East Greenbush, Rensselaer, South Bethlehem, and Voorheesville, will be enlarged under the plan to include also Schenectady and



South Bethlehem's present local calling area, which includes Albany, Clarksville, Delmar, East Greenbush, Rensselaer and South Bethlehem, will be enlarged to include Schenectady, Troy, Castleton, Cohoes, Colonie, Scotia, Waterford and Watervliet.

Company officials estimate that this will eliminate the charges on three out of every four toll calls now made. For this large area with its three central cities and 24 suburban communities, tolls will no longer apply on six-and-quarter million calls a year.

It is expected, however, that the introduction of expanded toll-free calling will increase by several times the number of calls now made between area communities. This, according to the company, has been the experience wherever the toll-free plan has been introduced, indicating that people do want to make more calls over a wider area.

Basic monthly telephone rates, Mr. Hubbard pointed out, will be the same throughout the area. At present levels, new rates, ex-

Residence customers: Individual line - \$6.25; two party-line - \$4.90; four party - \$4.15; multi-party line - \$4.15. These rates allow customers to make and receive any number of calls throughout their expanded local calling area without extra charges.

Business customers: Individual line (message rate) - \$8.25, including a monthly allowance of 75 outgoing local calls and any number of incoming calls; individual line (flat rate) - \$19.00; multi-party line (flat rate) - \$6.45.

The \$9 million program will include the installation of new equipment at every central office building in the area, and building additions in Colonie and other localities. Telephone men must also add new circuits and rearrange others along the 600 mile network of cable which connects the cities and villages here. A substantial amount of old equipment will be replaced in the process.





PROPOSED PLANETARIUM

by Peggy O'Brien

The Space age and the past meet in the stars.

In honoring the explorer of yesterday the Hudson-Champlain Celebration Committee is paving the way for tomorrow's explorer in the proposed Henry Hudson Planetarium.

The Planetarium is dedicated to the man who, guided by the stars, discovered the Hudson River. It offers study opportunities to those who will be our sky explorers of the future.

The Planetarium is a projector, a combination of optical, mechanical and electrical equipment which forms for all intents and purposes a time-and-space machine. It shows the stars on a man made sky and carries audiences through hours, days, months, years and centuries in a matter of seconds. It is as essential to the teaching of science as a physics laboratory or a chemistry laboratory.

The Henry Hudson Planetarium

estimated at \$90,000 will be linked with the Dudley Observatory which through 107 years has served the community and made its contribution in research astronomy.

In 1852 the Dudley Observatory, located not far from the Philip Livingston Junior High School, was erected by public subscription. In 1873 it became associated with Union University which now comprises Union Col-The Albany Medical School, The Albany Law School, The Albany College of Pharmacy and the Dudley Observatory. In 1893, again through public subscription, the Observatory moved to its present site on Lake Avenue. The move was made because the increasing number of trains on the nearby railroad tracks shook the building and made accurate measurements impossible.

The largest job done by the Observatory was completed by Dr. Benjamin Boss and his father

who were the directors from 1876 - 1956. This was the Boss general catalogue of stars which is now used as a basic frame of reference for determining missile paths at Cape Canaveral.

At the present time Dr. Curtis L. Hemenway, director, is engaged in the study of Micrometeorites, more familiarly

known as shooting stars. From collecting stations throughout the world, particles are gathered from boats, from gadgets attached to jet planes, and the hope of the future is to gather them from interspace ships when a way is found to retrieve the data. Their study, through the electron microscope, is important to a better understanding of space environment.

Beside the research which contributes to the knowledge of astronomers throughout the world the Dudley Observatory offers the community valuable opportunities in education as well. Every Tuesday night, weather permitting, the public is welcome to view the stars through its telescopes. There are lectures. films and exhibits which are of constant interest to those who are finding our future in the stars. and the Observatory gives encouragement and space to serious amateurs through the Astronomy Club.
