Sacandaga Theatre is about an hour from the Tri-Villages on the Thruway to Amsterdam then via Route 30.

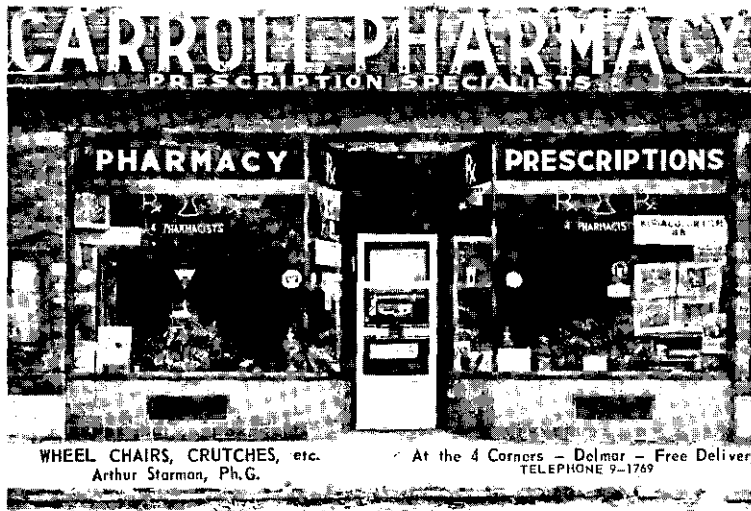

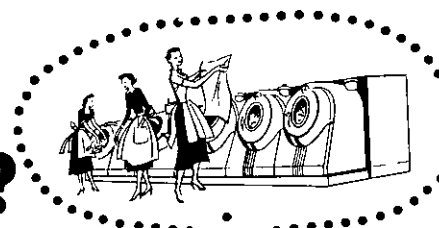
**Dr. and Mrs. Kowitz Authors


ABC Completes First Year of IBM Accounting Instruction
