USE OF PLASTIC GARMENT BAGS

One Tri-Village and two Albany area dry cleaning plants are discontinuing use of plastic bags as covers for newly cleaned garments.

Handy Dandy Cleaners, Roxy Cleaners and Dyers chain and Killip Laundering Company have announced that they will stop using the plastic covering as a matter of public safety.

The polyethylene bags have been the cause of a number of accidental suffocations this year. Children suffocated when the clingy thin-gauge material covered their faces in play.

James McGrath, proprietor of Handy Dandy Cleaners, said that because his personnel are the same year after year, and since they know their clientele and those who have small children, his organization has been careful in passing out the plastic coverings. From now on, only those customers who actually request the plastic will receive it. Furthermore Mr. McGrath points out, it was public demand that convinced him that he had to make it available to his cus-

Joseph K. Ross, president of Killip Laundering Company, said plastic manufacturers are at work on a "safe" protective bag. He said his firm hopes to revert to plastic bags as soon as safe ones are developed.

Harry Khachadoorian of Roxy, said it would be nearly two months before his firm received a full supply of paper bags.

The three referred to the plastic manufacturer's crash education and research program aimed at preventing fatalities and saving the 130 million pounds a year retail plastic bag market.

Other area dry cleaning officials said plastics manufacturers are using leaflets and tags to stress the potential dangers of the tissue like transparent bags for pillows and mattress covers.

Chemical Week publication reports that the industry is studying the use of perforated bags, thicker gauge material, a film that is stiffer and tears more easily, and application of anticling compounds of the film.

heavily with precaution! Charcoal has a high tendency toward spontaneous ignition. A hardware store was burned to the ground when charcoal, stored in a humid basement, ignited. Home fires have also sprung from the same source. If charcoal becomes wet and is then dried, it is all the more likely to ignite. Storage should be in a dry, well-ventilated place. Never store it in a damp basement; your garage is better, or some other place outside, your home that is protected from the weather. Take care - don't barbecue your home!






