### ALBANY SENATORS COACH

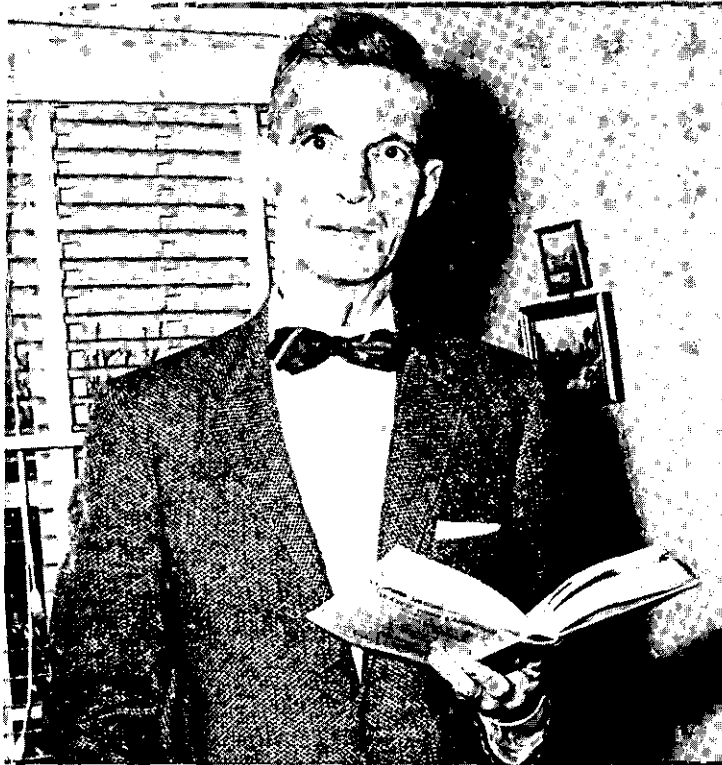

## ROBERT HUNTER'S DEATH SADDENS COMMUNITY



Robert V. Hunter, 51, supervisor of English in Bethlehem Central Schools since 1956, died July 8 in Albany Hospital after a brief illness. His home was at 28 Crannell Avenue in Elsmere.

A graduate of Albany High School, Union College and Albany State Teachers College, he had taught at Mechanicville High School, Albany Academy and at the Albany Evening Division of Russell Sage College. He was chairman of the English Department at Albany High School for 22 years, and was a former president of the Albany Public School Teachers Association.

### A Community Leader

Mr. Hunter was an inspiration to all. A man of kind spirit and thoughtfulness, he was relentless in his striving for knowledge and higher standards of education. He will be remembered and honored by his students, fellow teachers and countless other friends. Here was a man who lived truly and approached his death with courage, "like one who wraps the drapery of his couch about him, and lies down to pleasant dreams."

"We had looked forward to the day when Bob Hunter would teach our children," many Tri-Villagers have already told us. "His stimulating influence was one of the best things this community offered our kids," said a Slingerlands resident.

An active Tri-Villager, Mr. Hunter was a past president of the Elsmere PTA, a leader of Boy Scout Troop 85, a member of the First Methodist Church, and a former president of the Old Philogians.

Surviving are his wife, the former Vivian Snyder; two daughters, Diane E. and Jane L. Hunter; a son, John R. Hunter; a brother, Millard B. Hunter, and a sister, Mrs. Frank Peckham.

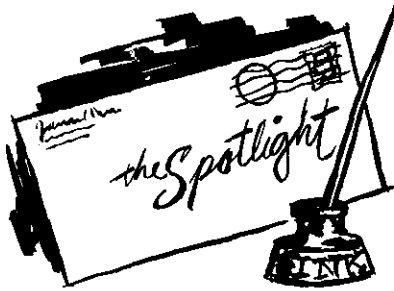

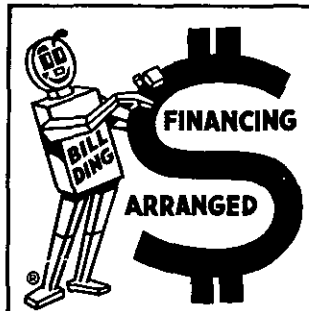

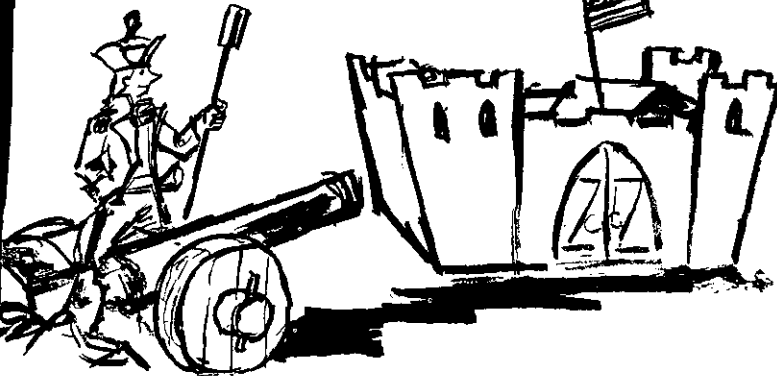

**LIKE TO SEE FORT NIAGARA REENACT OLD BATTLE?**

Tri-Villagers on vacation next week can drive westward a few hours and have a chance to watch British troops and Indians take Old Fort Niagara from the French!

The original battle occurred on July 25, 1759. A reenactment, July 23-26, is part of Niagara County's contribution to New York State's "Year of History" celebration.

Old Fort Niagara was built first by LaSalle in 1679 and

called Fort Conti. Chaussagras de Lery rebuilt the fort in 1725-1726 and named it Fort Niagara. In 1756-57, during the French and Indian War, it was extensively improved by Captain Francois Pouchot.

The English took the fort in 1759, holding it until after the Revolution when it was turned over to the United States.

Organizing a day camp for children was not enough for her so she took on a summer stock company. This means feeding all hands, hiring the actors, directors, choosing plays, planning menus, developing publicity, tripping to the printer, locating costumes, developing the facilities and buildings. It takes all that to produce 10 shows in 10 weeks.

Shirley has been moving rapidly all her life and wouldn't enjoy life as much if she slowed down. Born in Albany, she went to New York by herself to study at the age of 13. There she tackled dancing and acting and attended Professional Children's School. Getting an early break she went to Hollywood for a year to do a part in the movie "Give Us This Day." Acting in "Sandra" off Broadway, playing the dance lead in "Finian's Rainbow" in stock and continuing in

further stock in New Jersey, she added modeling with Conover to her lines of Achievement.

Her marriage to Dr. Jesse Kaye, a practicing psychiatrist in Albany, put an end to this particular period of her life. However her enthusiasms and interests in stage and the dance field came right along with her when she came back to Albany to live.

In 1955 she and her husband bought a farm. The barns were much too enticing to let sit idle and Shirley decided to start a Children's Day Camp where sports and dramatics could both play a part. Today, 100 children make use of the large swimming pool, a soccer field and a full-sized Little League baseball diamond as well as other buildings which offer facilities for art and dramatics.

The following year a dream that had been in the making for some time came into being: The Shelley Players, a full-fledged summer theatre. And Shirley continues to have both hands in both ventures. Not satisfied with them, running them and attending to the many details involved, she has often taken a turn at acting in the plays.

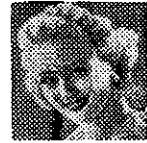

## A reader writes

Here is a letter from one of the area's oldest residents. Can you recognize him in the picture above?

I am 80 years old. Was born July 1st, 1879 and started school in this building (Slingerlands Grade School) in 1885. I had a mile and a half to walk; sometimes

had 2 to 3 feet of snow to wallow through, as they had no equipment for opening roads then. It would sometimes be 3 or 4 days before they were opened up enough to get through. No automobiles then. The first year, they had only one teacher, a Mr. George Quay from Knox. There were 60 scholars and 8 grades on the register; he taught all the classes, from 9 to 4 P.M. Our studies were Reading, Spelling, Arithmetic, Writing, History and Physiology, with Drawing twice a week. Not all this other stuff they have now. When we wanted to take a bath or swim, we would use a wash tub or go to the creek. We did not need any gym exercise; we got all that walking to school and most of the children had chores to do after they got home in the afternoon. I had nearly a mile to go down in the woods after cows every night.

After Mr. Quay, there was a Miss Cary for 2 years, then Miss Katherine Wilson. We all got to class every day and there never, in the 8 years I was there, was any juvenile delinquency. My father would pay the school taxes of \$4 to \$7 and the children were taught common sense, not all the foolishness of nowadays.
