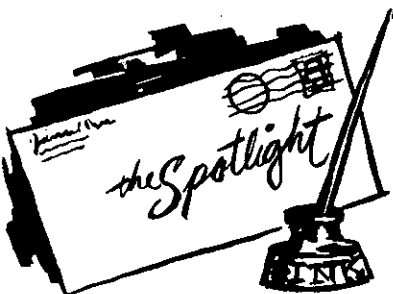

To The Spotlight:

If the Sunday lawn mowing controversy has died down, may I bring up another subject which troubles many Tri-Village parents? Perhaps if enough of your readers express opinions we may achieve some peace of mind. This is the question of children riding bicycles in the road with their backs to traffic. This procedure was prescribed by the Kiwanis Club in their recent bicycle safety drive, as well as the ruling that all children over ten should ride in the street, whether or not there was an existing sidewalk. In this area, as in most suburbs, there are many places where there are no sidewalks, so cycling must be done in the street. However, in such places where sidewalks exist, we modern parents living in the age of countless speeding cars would prefer that our children stay on the sidewalk. In disagreement with the training given them in

BETHLEHEM POLICE ANNOUNCE TRAFFIC ROUTES FOR "BIGGEST PARADE"



On Saturday afternoon, September 12, at 1:00 sharp, the Town of Bethlehem Hudson-Champlain Celebration parade will get under way, with Warren Wilson, Delmar, grand marshal; John M. Oliver, honorary grand marshal, and Otto deHeus, parade chairman.

Here is a preview of what the Bethlehem Police will do to cope with traffic problems during what promises to be, in the words of a seasoned member of the force: "The biggest and best parade you or I will ever see in these parts!"

"The full parade will start at the Delmar Elementary School and proceed down Delaware Ave. to Elsmere Ave., over Elsmere to Kenwood and up Kenwood Ave. disbanding at both the Junior High parking lot and at St. Thomas' School parking lot. The parade will be quite long, with divisions forming on some of the side streets off Delaware Ave. from Cherry Ave. to Rowland Ave. These divisions will be forming at 12:00 with the parade starting at 1:00. Delaware Ave. and the streets with the parade divisions on them will be blocked off at noon. It is requested that all traffic to and from Albany use either New Scotland Road or Feura Bush Road and Route 9-W. As the parade gets to Elsmere Ave., all traffic on Delaware Ave. will be stopped at Elsmere and Delaware.

"Due to the width of the floats in the parade, there is to be no parking on the following streets: Delaware Ave. from Cherry to Adams St., Elsmere Ave. from Delaware to Kenwood and Kenwood from Delaware to Elsmere. There is to be no parking on the following streets where the divisions will

DELMAR BOY WINS TOP 4-H AWARD

One of the most exciting moments at the recent Altamont Fair was on Friday evening, August 21, when William R. O'Bryon, vice president of the National Commercial Bank presented Don Terhune of Delmar with a \$100 scholarship award for excellence in 4-H Club work. This was one of two annual scholarship awards made by the National Commercial Bank to boys and girls who excel in 4-H Clubs in the area.

He will enter the Cornell College of Agriculture this fall.

"No bicycles will be allowed

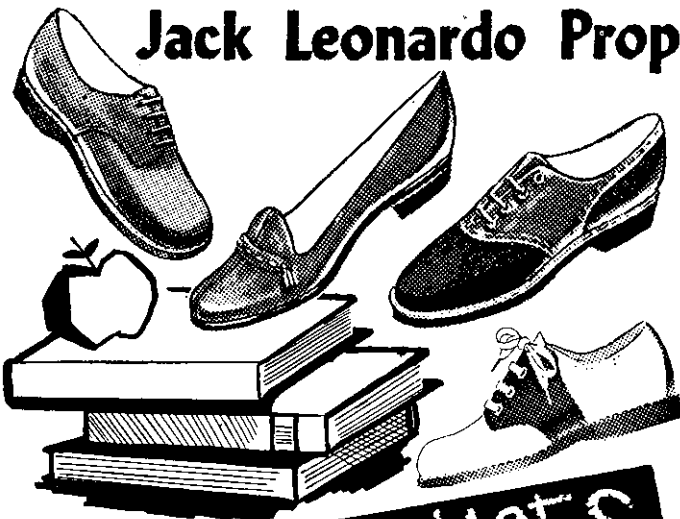

in the parade except in the special section of the fourth division. Any person riding a bicycle in the parade in any other division will be removed from the parade by police officers."

school and by the Kiwanians my husband and I have instructed our children — one pre-teen, one teen — to ride on the sidewalk wherever there is one, and upon meeting a pedestrian (a rare occasion indeed these days) to dismount and push the bicycle past.

Again — and this seems to me the most important item for parents to consider with us in opposition to the prevailing instructions — we have told our children to always ride, when in the road, FACING traffic. This eliminates the possibility of a vehicle coming up behind the child without his hearing it (very easy on our noisy main arteries), eliminates the fright of a horn blown right behind the child (and how many children

react with a perilous wobble of the bike?), and eliminates the child's feeling that HE is the only one on the road.

We told the teachers who were giving out bicycle safety

rules in our school that we were giving our children different rules and they assured us that of course the parents' teaching in this matter should take precedence. However the children

themselves are very uneasy about disobeying "laws." If there are really such laws, aside from the local ones, I think that they are outdated. There was a time (continued on next page.)
